**AMENDMENT OF THE NON-CONTENTIOUS PROBATE

1. (1) These rules shall come into operation on the day on which they are published in the *Government Gazette*.
- (2) The amendments to the principal rules made by these rules apply in relation to applications for grants or to reseal grants made outside Western Australia where the instructions for the application are given on or after that day.
- Citation.
2. In these rules the Non-contentious Probate Rules 1967 reprinted in the *Government Gazette* on 7th August 1973 pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act 1954 and amended by rules published in the *Government Gazette* on 7th December 1973, 7th October 1977, 14th December 1979 and 1st August 1980, are referred to as the principal rules.

3. The Probate (Non-contentious Costs) Rules 1949-1976, reprinted in the *Government Gazette* on 18th July 1972 pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act 1954 and amended by rules published in the *Government Gazette* on 16th May 1975 and 30th April 1976, are revoked.

4. Subrule (2) of rule 2 of the principal rules is amended by adding after the word "the" in line 2, the word "first".

5. The principal rules are amended by adding after rule 43A. the following rule:

- 43B. (1) Subject to this rule, solicitors are entitled to charge and shall be allowed out of the estates of deceased persons the fees set forth in the second schedule to these rules in respect of the matters referred to in that schedule; and higher fees shall not be allowed except as otherwise provided in this rule.
- (2) The fees prescribed by the second schedule to these rules do not include any proper disbursements necessarily made or incurred.
- (3) The fees prescribed by item 1 of the second schedule to these rules do not include the costs of preparation of the statement required by rule 9B. of these rules; and those costs shall be regulated by item 9 of the Solicitors Remuneration Order 1976, as amended from time to time.
- (4) The fees prescribed by item 2 of the second schedule to these rules are allowable only where it is necessary or desirable for a country solicitor to employ a Perth agent in connexion with an application for a grant or to reseal a grant.
- (5) Where an application for a grant or to reseal a grant is unusually complex, or involves an unusually high degree of skill or urgency, the solicitor shall be entitled to charge and shall be allowed out of the estate of the deceased person such further fee as is reasonable in the circumstances.
- (6) The costs incurred in relation to the administration of estates of deceased persons, not being the costs of an application for a grant or to reseal a grant, shall be regulated by the Solicitors Remuneration Order 1976, as amended from time to time.

(c) All other uses not mentioned under (a) and (b) are not permitted (X).

(3) No dwelling unit of a lesser area than 110 m² under the main roof shall be constructed.

(4) No building shall be constructed within the zone of material which in the opinion of the Council is undesirable for the locality.

(5) No dwelling unit shall be constructed or approved for construction unless a minimum of 90 000 litre storage tank is incorporated in the approved plans and no dwelling unit shall be considered fit for human habitation unless such a tank has been installed and is operating.

(b) Where a lot fronts Great Northern Highway no building shall be constructed closer than 30 m to it.

4.
