AT a Meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber at Perth on the 15th day of April, 1981, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Liquor Act 1970-1979.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council under section 176.

Whereas it is provided, *inter alia*, by section 176 of the Liquor Act 1970-1979, that upon the application of an owner of premises that have been licensed premises under any Act prior to that Act regulating the sale of liquor, the Governor may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* declare those premises to be an historic inn if he is satisfied that the premises or any substantial part of them, are or is of national, special, historic or architectural interest, and should be preserved for the benefit of the public, generally; and whereas an application has been made by Ian Alastair McKechnie,

being the owner of premises that have been licensed premises under an Act prior to the Liquor Act 1970-1979, and known as "Hampton Arms Inn", more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, for a declaration that those premises be an historic inn; and whereas His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, is satisfied that the premises are of historic and architectural interest and should be preserved for the benefit of the public, generally: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the premises known as "Hampton Arms Inn" more particularly described in the Schedule hereto to be an historic inn for the purposes of the Liquor Act 1970-1979.

Workers' Compensation Act 1912-1979.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act 1912-1979 that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer or group of employers proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer or group of employers has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer or group of employers from the operation of that section:

And whereas Chamberlain John Deere Pty. Ltd. of Welshpool Road, Welshpool, being an employer within the meaning of the section has duly, in accordance with the Act, and the regulations made hereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, a bond for the value of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50 000.00) charged with all payments to become due under the said liability:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt Chamberlain John Deere Pty. Ltd. from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act 1912-1979 for a period expiring on 31 December 1982.

INDUSTRY (ADVANCES) ACT 1947-1980.

INTERPRETATION ACT 1918-1975.

INDUSTRY (ADVANCES) REGULATIONS 1981.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Industry (Advances) Regulations 1981.
- Commencement. 2. These regulations shall come into operation on the day on which the Industry (Advances) Amendment Act 1980 comes into operation.
- Interpretation. 3. In these regulations—
“the Act” means the Industry (Advances) Act 1947.
- Decentralized locations. 4. For the purposes of the definition of “decentralized location” in section 2 of the Act—
(a) the distance referred to in paragraph (a) of that definition is a distance of 100 kilometres; and
(b) the areas referred to in paragraph (b) of that definition which are special regions are those areas which are within a radius of 8 kilometres of the main or only post office, as the case requires, at Mandurah, Northam, Pinjarra, Toodyay and York, respectively.
- Certificate. 5. The form of certificate set out in the Schedule to these regulations is prescribed for the purposes of section 3 (3) of the Act.
- Revocation. 6. The Industry (Advances) Act Regulation 1948* is revoked.

4. The annual fee for the licence shall be the same annual fee as would be payable if the licence were a restaurant licence, but subject to the foregoing, the provisions of Part VIII of the Act, other than section 165 apply to and in relation to the licence and any renewal thereof.

1. Re-numbering Clauses 1.6, 1.7 and 1.8 as Clauses 1.7, 1.8 and 1.9 respectively.

2. Inserting a new clause numbered Clause 1.6 as follows:—

“The term “practical completion” shall mean the completion of the Scheme Works to the satisfaction of the Shire Engineer and the Shire Planner and acceptance of their reports by the Council.

The term “Scheme Costs” shall mean and include the costs or estimated costs referred to in Clause 3.1 of the Scheme Text and any other costs from time to time necessarily incurred or authorised by the Council pursuant to or for the purpose of implementing the Scheme.

The term “Scheme Works” shall mean and include the works referred to in Clauses 1.9 and 1.10 of the Scheme Text and any other works from time to time necessarily carried out or authorised by the Council pursuant to or for the purpose of implementing the Scheme.

The term “the Valuer” shall mean the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department of Western Australia or a person or persons nominated by him to act as a Valuer or at the option of the Council an independent Valuer being an Associate or Fellow of the Australian Institute of Valuers (Incorporated) appointed by the Council.”

3. Inserting in paragraph (d) of the clause re-numbered Clause 1.7 the words “and any controlled access highway” after the word “roads”.

4. Amending the clause re-numbered Clause 1.9 as follows:—

(a) Inserting after the word “roads” in paragraph (a) the words “any controlled access highway”;

(b) Deleting paragraph (b);

(c) Re-numbering paragraph (i) as paragraph (j);

(d) Inserting new paragraphs (b) and (i) as follows:—

“(b) The lands shown as Public Open Space on the Scheme Proposals Map shall be set aside for public recreation.”

“(i) The demolition of any building structure erection or property whatsoever and generally the removal of any thing obstructing or hindering the implementation of the Scheme.”

5. Inserting a new clause numbered Clause 1.10 as follows:—

“Those roads and rights-of-way which are shown on the Land Use Map but are not shown on the Scheme Proposals Map or are shown thereon as closed roads and closed rights-of-way shall be closed and the land used for the purpose shown on the Scheme Map.”

6. Deleting Clause 3.1 and substituting the following:—

“3.1 The costs or estimated costs of the following items are Scheme Costs:—

(a) The administration costs of the Scheme including an amount to reimburse the Council for overhead and supervision costs incurred in the implementation of the Scheme and all legal costs planning costs payments to planning consultants engineers and other professional consultants management costs and valuation costs;

(b) The cost of the Scheme Works;

(c) Interest on money borrowed for the purpose of the Scheme;

(d) All costs including legal expenses incurred by the Council with respect to the acquisition of land within the Scheme Area by resumption or otherwise;

(e) All compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation under any provision of the Scheme Text;

(f) The costs of and incidental to the preparation, execution, stamping and registering of transfers easements and other documents where the same are payable or paid by the Council;

(g) The costs of and incidental to the preparation of the Scheme;

(h) The costs of repairing and upgrading drainage works outside the Scheme Area necessary for the proper drainage of the Scheme Area;

(i) The costs of sewerage and water supply headworks pumping stations and other works outside the Scheme Area necessary for those services within the Scheme Area;

(j) The costs of extension of water mains and any contribution paid or payable to the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board in respect of sewerage and drainage works;

(k) The cost of altering existing electricity water sewerage drainage or telephone services;

(l) Subject to the agreement by owners to the installation of underground residential distribution of power Council may arrange for the provision and recovery of the cost of an underground power supply to service the lots within the Scheme Area which cost shall be a Scheme cost.”

7. Re-numbering Clause 4.4 as Clause 4.7 and amending the word and figures “Clause 4.3” appearing therein to read “Clause 4.4” and after the words “Scheme and” in the second line of that clause inserting the words “in this and the next Clause only”.

8. Re-numbering Clause 4.5 as Clause 4.8 and amending the word and figures “Clause 4.3” appearing therein to read “Clause 4.4”.

9. Deleting the whole of Clauses 4.1, 4.2 and 4.3 and substituting the following:—

“4.1 The old lots and part lots within the Scheme Area shall be valued by the Valuer as at the date of the resolution by the Council to adopt the Scheme. Such values ascertained in accordance with the terms of the Scheme Text are herein referred to as “before values”.

4.2.1 The values to be made under the preceding Clause shall be the capital amount that an unencumbered estate in fee simple in the land might reasonably be expected to realise upon sale, assuming that all improvements thereon (except site improvements) the benefit of which is exhausted at the time of valuation, had not been made.

4.2.2 In subclause 4.2.1 the term “site improvements” means reclamation of land by draining or filling, the construction of a retaining wall or other structures or works appertaining thereto, the excavation, grading and levelling of land, the removal of rocks, stones, sand or soil and the clearing of timber, scrub and other vegetation.

owner's interest in the Scheme is that percentage to the nearest three places of decimals of the net profits of the Scheme which the before value of that owner's land bears to the total of the before values of all privately owned land within the Scheme Area, the owners of which have accepted the offers provided for in Part V.

4.5 If an owner shall object to the before value placed on his lot he shall give notice of such objection to the Council within 28 days after having been served with notice of the said value or within 28 days after the publication in the *Government Gazette* of the amendment incorporating this provision in the Scheme if he has been served with notice of the said value prior to such publication. - (a) be made in writing in accordance with the form in Schedule I hereto;
- (b) describe the old part lot, lot or lots of the owner with which the offer is concerned;
- (c) specify the before value of each such old part lot or lot;
- (d) contain a statement of the extent of the owner's interest if he becomes a Participating Owner;
- (e) specify a time within which the offer may be accepted.

5.3 Every First Offer shall be subject to the owner to whom the offer is made accepting the same in full satisfaction of any claim he may have against the Council for compensation in respect of the transfer to or the resumption by the Council of the old part lot, lot or lots in respect of which the offer is made or otherwise in respect of the making or operation of this Scheme and in full satisfaction of all moneys which otherwise would have been payable to him in respect of such transfer or resumption.

5.4 Any owner who accepts a First Offer shall be and hereinafter is referred to as a "Participating Owner".

5.5 In the case of each Participating Owner there shall be at least one but from time to time may be more than one further offer ("New Lot Offer") which shall:—

- (a) be made in writing in accordance with the form in Schedule II hereto;

5.7.3 In the event that a Participating Owner receiving an offer of the alternatives referred to in sub-clause 5.7.1. elects to contribute the extra money to make up the value of a new lot, his new lot entitlement shall be increased accordingly.

5.7.4 A Participating Owner receiving an offer of the alternatives referred to in sub-clause 5.7.1 shall make his election in writing in his notice of acceptance of the appropriate New Lot Offer and in the event that he fails so to elect he shall be deemed to have elected the alternative in paragraph (b) of sub-clause 5.7.1."

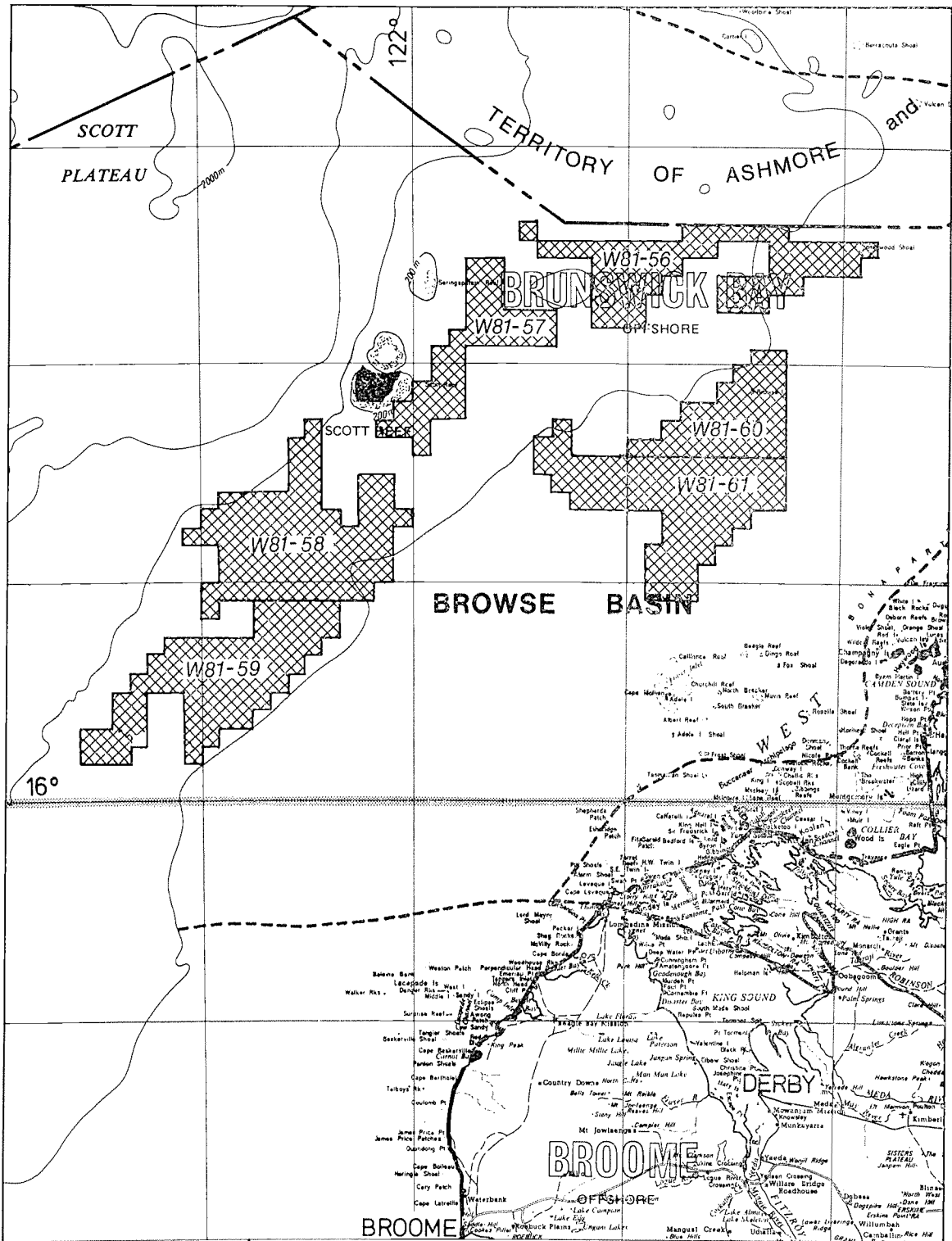

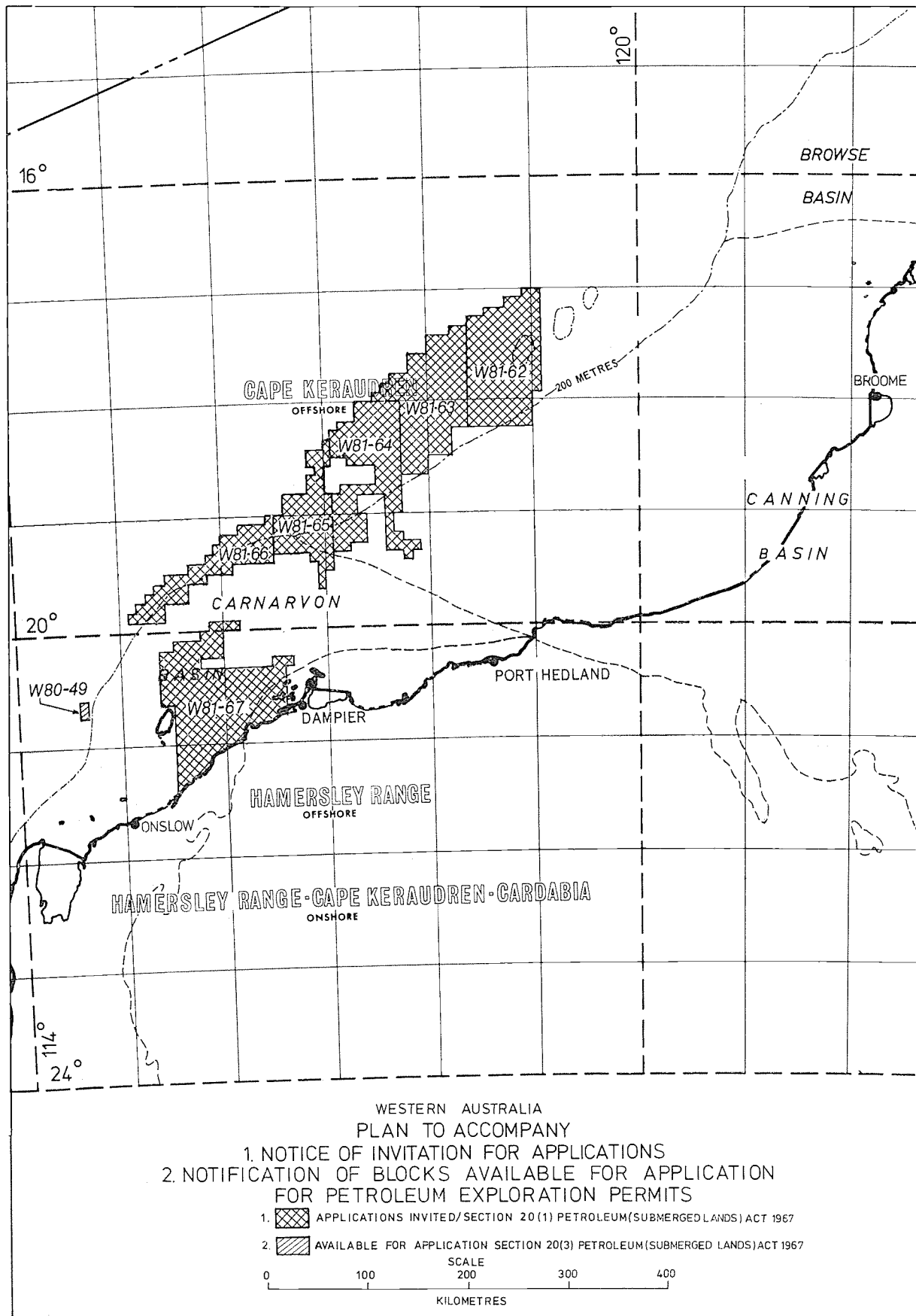
