PURSUANT to section 13 of the Mining Act 1904 (as amended), I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, constitute the lands described in the schedule to this proclamation to be a mineral field.

Schedule.

Warburton Mineral Field.

The whole of the area bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the 129th meridian of east longitude and the southern coast of Western Australia thence northerly along the Western Australia and South Australia border to its intersection with the Tropic of Capricorn (23° 26½' south latitude) thence westerly along the Tropic of Capricorn (being the southern boundaries of the Kimberley and Pilbara Goldfields) to its intersection with the Number One Rabbit Proof Fence thence southerly along the said fence (being the eastern boundary of the Peak Hill Goldfield) to its intersection with the 26th parallel of south latitude thence east along that parallel (being the northern boundaries of the East Murchison and Mount Margaret Goldfields) to its intersection with the 125th meridian of east longitude thence south along that meridian (being the eastern boundaries of the Mount Margaret and North East Coolgardie Goldfields) to a point situated due east of 50 Mile Rock near the Eyre Highway thence west to the 123rd meridian of east longitude (being the southern boundary of the North East Coolgardie Goldfield) thence south along that meridian to the

coast (being the east boundary of the Dundas Goldfield) thence generally easterly along the coast to the starting point and including all offshore islands adjacent to that area.

LAND TAX ASSESSMENT ACT 1976.

State Land Tax—Annual Returns
Due by 31 July 1981 for Land Owned on 30 June 1981.

NOTICE TO ALL OWNERS OF LAND OR PROPERTY IN W.A. INCLUDING THE FOLLOWING CATEGORIES:

- (a) VACANT LAND—including that which may be intended for a future residence.
NOTE: NEWLY COMPLETED RESIDENCES—owners who have occupied such land since 30 June 1980, are requested to advise the Commissioner to avoid assessment.
- (b) COMMERCIAL OR INDUSTRIAL PROPERTIES—for example shops, factories, offices etc.
- (c) PROPERTIES WHICH ARE OR MAY BE LEASED OUT OR RENTED TO TENANTS—for example—houses, duplexes, flats, units, factories etc.
- (d) HOUSES WHICH ARE NOT THE PRINCIPAL PLACE OF RESIDENCE OF THE OWNER—for example—beach houses or rented houses.
- (e) LAND LEASED FROM THE CROWN—from statutory bodies or Local Authorities and used for commercial purposes.

- (f) LAND IN THE METROPOLITAN REGION—or in an operative country town planning scheme EVEN THOUGH IT IS USED IN A DEFINED BUSINESS OF PRIMARY PRODUCTION, where that land has not been specifically exempted by the Commissioner since 1 July 1976.

YOU MUST LODGE A LAND TAX RETURN BY 31 JULY 1981 as required by the Land Tax Assessment Act 1976, if you were the owner of any such land or were responsible for furnishing a return for an owner in any representative capacity as at midnight on 30 June 1981.

RETURNS ARE NOT REQUIRED.

- (1) WHERE LAND HOLDINGS HAVE NOT CHANGED—if a return was completed based on ownership of land on 30 June 1980 and the land holdings remain the same, no return is required.
- (2) FOR LAND USED AS THE RESIDENCE OF THE OWNER—any lot or parcel of land which is used solely or principally as the ordinary place

of residence of the owner(s), is not subject to tax and no return is necessary (N.B. see (a) above).

- (3) FOR FARMING LAND SITUATED OUTSIDE THE METROPOLITAN REGION—land which is situated outside the Metropolitan Region where that land is exempt as used in a defined business of primary production, need not be returned.

IMPORTANT: If in doubt as to your liability for lodgement of a return, contact the State Taxation Department at the address below.

Return forms are available at all Post Offices in W.A. and the State Taxation Department, Perth.

Penalties are provided in the law for failure to lodge a return by 31 July 1981.

REGULATIONS.

Citation. 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Food and Drug Amendment Regulations 1981.

(2) In these regulations the Food and Drug Regulations 1961*, as amended, are referred to as the principal regulations.

Commence- 2. (1) These regulations, except regulation 5, operate on and from 16 November 1981.

(2) Regulation 5 of these regulations operates on and from the day on which these regulations are published in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Regulation A.01 of the principal regulations is amended—
- “ (a) in subregulation A.01.001, by inserting, in their appropriate alphabetical positions, the following definitions—
- “component” means any substance including a food additive used in the manufacture or preparation of an ingredient and present in the final product in a primary or modified form;
- “ingredient” means any substance including a food additive used in the manufacture or preparation of a food and present in the final product in a primary or modified form; ;
- (b) in subregulation A.01.002, by deleting subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (b) and substituting the following subparagraph—
- “ (iii) any statement of ingredients or components required by this regulation; ” ; and
- (c) by inserting after subregulation A.01.002 the following subregulations and headings—
- “ **A.01.002A. Date Marking of Packaged Foods.**
For the purposes of this subregulation and subregulations A.01.002B to A.01.002F—
- “date of packaging” means the date on which food is placed in the immediate container in which it will be sold;
- “longer life foods” means foods with a minimum durable life of not less than 90 days but less than 2 years;
- “minimum durable life” means that period beginning on the date of packaging, during which a packaged food, when stored under any conditions stated on the label in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (g) and (h) of subregulation A.01.002D, can reasonably be expected to retain, without any appreciable deterioration, its normal wholesomeness, nature, substance, and quality;
- “packaged food” means any food that is packed or enclosed in a package for sale as a single item and includes food packaged from bulk at the place where food is retailed but does not include food weighed, counted or measured and wrapped in the presence of the purchaser
- “short life foods” means those foods with a minimum durable life of less than 90 days;
- “the “use by” date”, in relation to a packaged food, means the date which signifies the end of the minimum durable life of that food.
- A.01.002B. Date Marking of Short Life Foods.**
- (a) Subject to the provisions of this subregulation, the label of every package of short life foods shall include one or both of the following—
- (i) date of packaging;
- (ii) the “use by” date.
- (b) The date marking requirements of those short life foods listed in column 1 of Schedule 1 to this subregulation shall be modified by the insertion of the date statement set out opposite in column 2 using the form of expression of the date set out opposite in column 3.
- (c) The date to be included in the label of short life foods in accordance with paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subregulation shall be expressed in the following manner—
- (i) the day of the month shall be first and shall be expressed as two digit figures (the first nine days of the month being preceded by a zero);
- (ii) the month shall be shown in figures after the day; or in the first three letters of the month, either before or after the day;
- (iii) where the year is shown it shall be last and shall be expressed in figures by at least the last two numerals of the year.
- (d) Where the date of packaging is the sole date applied to short life food it shall be accompanied by a statement of the minimum durable life of the packaged food in the following form:
- “ MINIMUM DURABLE LIFE (and here insert the number of days, weeks or months). ” .
- (e) This subregulation does not apply to the short life foods set out in Schedule 2 to this subregulation.

SHORT LIFE FOODS.

Schedule 2.

SHORT LIFE FOODS EXEMPT FROM DATE MARKING REQUIREMENTS.

1. Meat products in unprinted edible casing not further packaged.
2. Alcoholic beverages other than wine sold in a package containing a collapsible plastic liner.
3. Fresh fruit or vegetables in packages which do not obscure the nature and quality of the fruit and vegetables.
4. Packaged sandwiches and filled bread rolls for sale on day of preparation.
5. Food in packages of surface area less than 50 square centimetres.
6. Carbonated soft drinks.
7. Icecream and related products less than 200 millilitres in volume.

A.01.002C. Date Marking of Longer Life Foods.

(a) The label of every package of longer life food shall include one or both of the following—

- (i) date of packaging;
- (ii) the "use by" date.

(b) The date to be included in the label of longer life foods in accordance with paragraph (a) of this subregulation shall be expressed in the following manner—

- (i) the month shall be shown first either in figures or in the first three letters of the month;
- (ii) the year shall be shown after the month and shall be expressed in figures by at least the last two numerals of the year; and
- (iii) the day of the month may be shown.

(c) Where the date of packaging is the sole date applied to longer life food it may be accompanied by a statement of the minimum durable life of the packaged food in the following form:

" MINIMUM DURABLE LIFE (and here insert the number of days, weeks or months). "

A.01.002D. Date Marking-Labeling.

(a) Subject to paragraph (b) of this subregulation date marking statements in the label of a packaged food shall be in distinct colour contrast to the ground and in boldface sans serif capital letters with a face depth of not less than 3 mm.

(b) Where date marking statements are embossed or impressed and are not in colour contrast to the ground the statement shall be in boldface sans serif capital letters with a face depth of not less than 4.5 mm.

(c) The date of packaging in the label of a packaged food shall be in conformity with one of the following statements:

- " PACKAGING DATE (with the relevant date added). " ;
 " PACKED ON (with the relevant date added). " ; or
 " Pkd (with the relevant date added). "

(d) The "use by" date in the label of a packaged food shall be in conformity with the following statement:

" USE BY (with the relevant date added). "

(e) A person shall not use date marking statements in the labelling of a packaged food or in advertising a packaged food other than those statements prescribed by this regulation, but those provisions do not preclude the addition of a manufacturer's or packer's code.

(f) The date marking statement in the label of a packaged food prescribed by this regulation shall not be removed, altered, erased or superimposed.

(g) Subject to paragraph (h) of this subregulation and Schedules 1 and 2 to subregulation A.01.002B the label of packaged short life food shall clearly and legibly state the conditions of storage required to ensure that the minimum durable life or the "use by" date of the packaged food is that stated on the label.

(h) A storage statement is not necessary on packaged food when specific storage conditions are not required to achieve the stated minimum durable life of the food.

(j) A person who sells packaged food to which this regulation applies shall store such food in accordance with the storage conditions on the label.

A.01.002E. Ingredient Labelling.

There shall be written in the label on or attached to every package of food in addition to any other prescribed labelling requirements in these regulations, a statement of the ingredients or components, or both, of the packaged food in the following form—

- (a) Subject to paragraph (b) of this subregulation, all the ingredients and where required by this regulation, the components of a packaged food shall be declared in a statement on the label by the use of common names in descending order of their relative proportions.
- (b) The following modified labelling requirements apply to certain packaged foods—

Schedule 2—*continued.*

- (i) where the food contains an ingredient in a dehydrated or concentrated form the position of that ingredient in the ingredient list shall be determined by its reconstituted mass as present in that food;
- (ii) where any dehydrated or concentrated food is intended to be reconstituted according to the directions stated in the label, the ingredients and components may be listed in descending order or proportion in the reconstituted food provided that the list is headed by the statement:
“INGREDIENTS WHEN RECONSTITUTED”;
- (iii) where the common name of the food is the same as the statement of ingredients, the common name shall satisfy the requirements for ingredient labelling;
- (iv) the following categories of packaged foods are deemed to be exempted from ingredient labelling requirements—
- (I) alcoholic beverages;
 - (II) cheese other than processed cheese, cheese spread, club cheese, potted cheese, luncheon cheese, cheese paste or cheese mixture;
 - (III) essences, in so far as flavour components are concerned;
 - (IV) soft drinks in glass bottles where there is no other label required than a crown seal;
 - (V) where the package containing the food has a total surface area of less than 100 square centimetres.
- (c) Where the common name of an ingredient or component adequately describes that ingredient or component, the common name shall satisfy the requirement for ingredient labelling.
- (d) Where an ingredient of a food has more than one component the statement of ingredients shall include the common names of the components and the names of the components shall appear in the statement of ingredients in the order of the proportions of the components present in the food, but when the ingredient of a food is standardised by regulation, the components of that food need not be stated (except in the case where that food is of the kind made in conformity with regulation A.12. Foods Not Elsewhere Standardised).
- (e) The following names may be used in place of the equivalent common name to identify ingredients or components—
- animal fats (provided that lard and pork fat are declared separately);
 - animal oils;
 - broth;
 - fruit;
 - herbs;
 - milk fat;
 - mixed dried fruit;
 - pectin;
 - spices;
 - starches (except modified starches);
 - total milk solids non-fat;
 - vegetables;
 - vegetable fats;
 - vegetable oils,
- and these names may be preceded by a suitable word to further specify the ingredient or component.
- (f) Where an ingredient of a food is a food additive, that ingredient shall be identified in the list of ingredients by the use of the appropriate functional class name listed hereunder—
- anti-caking agent(s);
 - antioxidant(s);
 - bleaching agent(s);
 - colour(s);
 - emulsifier(s);

Wires—ten S.W.G. high tensile galvanised (or bonded plastic equivalent to the satisfaction of the Town Engineer). 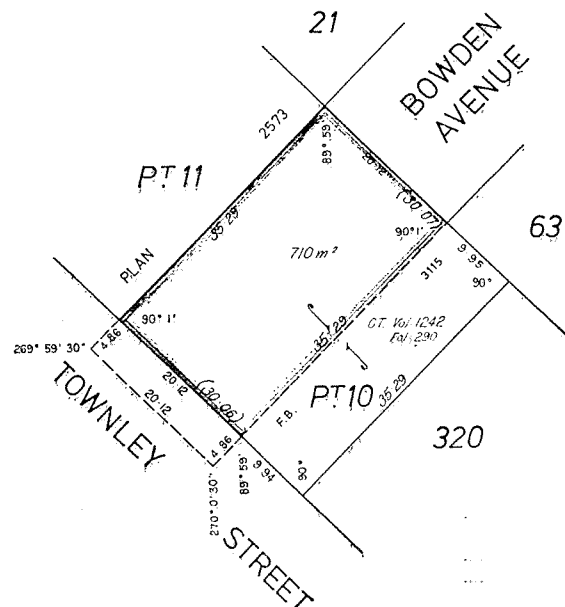
