 the date of my departure upon the said absence and  
 during such absence to be my deputy, and in that  
 capacity to exercise, perform, and execute for and on  
 my behalf, as such Governor, all the powers and  
 authorities vested in me by the said Letters Patent.

Constitution Act 1889–1980.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Town of Cockburn.

Bibra Lake Main Sewer—*in situ* Lining Field Trial.

Within the Town of Cockburn and the locality of Bibra Lake. The construction of a two thousand two hundred and fifty millimetre nominal diameter reinforced concrete pipe sewer approximately seventy six metres in length, together with a manhole and all apparatus connected therewith, commencing at a point in part Cockburn Sound Location 21 approximately two metres south of Lot 20 and seventy three metres east of the northeastern alignment of Forrest Road and proceeding easterly parallel to the southern boundary of Lot 20 and terminating at a point approximately fifty-two metres east of the eastern boundary of Lot 20, as shown on plan M.W.B. 17447.

Burns Beach Main Sewer Section 6—Parts 2 and 3.

Within the Shire of Wanneroo and the locality of Heathridge. The construction of a one thousand and fifty millimetre nominal diameter reinforced concrete plastic lined pipe sewer together with manholes and all apparatus connected therewith, approximately five hundred and twenty eight metres in length. Commencing at an existing manhole N755 situated within Part Lot 1005 Swan Location 1370 approximately twenty five metres west of the western boundary of Lot 653 Lysander Drive and five metres north of the northern boundary of the said Lot 653 and proceeding in a northwesterly direction for a distance of approximately two hundred and fifteen metres to a point approximately one metre east of the eastern alignment and three metres south of the northern alignment of Centaur Gardens, thence in a general westerly direction across Centaur Gardens and the said Part Lot 1005 for a distance of approximately two hundred and forty eight metres to a point situated within Location 9974 approximately twenty six metres north of the southern boundary and one hundred and thirty metres west of the eastern boundary of the said Location 9974, thence in a general northerly direction for a distance of approximately sixty four metres of the southern boundary and one hundred and twenty metres west of the eastern boundary of the said Location 9974, as shown on plan M.W.B. 17462.

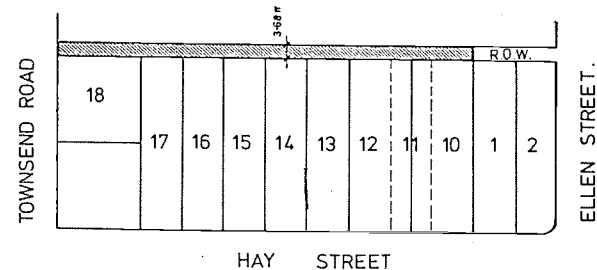

## SHIRE OF KALAMUNDA (VALUATION AND RATING) ORDER 1981.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor under section 533 of the Local Government Act.

- Citation. 1. This Order may be cited as the Shire of Kalamunda (Valuation and Rating) Order 1981.
- Commencement. 2. This Order shall take effect on and after 1 July 1981.
- Authorisation of use of gross rental values. 3. The Council of the Shire of Kalamunda is authorised to use valuations on gross rental value of rateable property in all areas of the district as specified in the attached schedules.

thence northeasterly, southeasterly and again northeasterly along boundaries of Location 579 to the southern corner of Location 2151; thence northwesterly and northeasterly along southwestern and northwestern boundaries of that location to the northeastern corner of Location 2604; thence generally northeasterly along the southeastern boundaries of that lot and Lots 110 to 108 inclusive to the eastern corner of the last mentioned lot; thence northerly to the southwestern corner of Lot 23 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 8566; thence northerly along the western boundary of that lot to the southern boundary of Location 222; thence easterly and northerly along boundaries of that location and onwards to the southwestern corner of Location 422; thence northerly and easterly along western and northern boundaries of that location to the easternmost southeastern corner of Location 1244; thence northerly, westerly and again northerly along boundaries of that location to the southeastern side of Pipers Place; ## LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960-1980.

The Municipality of the City of Belmont.

## By-laws Relating to Street Lawns and Gardens.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 9th day of March, 1981, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:

1. The existing by-laws of the City of Belmont in relation to Street Lawns and Gardens as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 29th August, 1963 and subsequently amended by notices published in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th September, 1972 and the 5th September 1975 are hereby revoked and the following by-laws are substituted in lieu thereof—

2. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires—

“carriageway” means a portion of a road that is improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular traffic and includes the shoulders and areas including embayments at the side or centre of the road used for the standing or parking of vehicles but does not include a lane, right of way or driveway.

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the City of Belmont.

“footpath” includes that part of a road set apart or constructed for the use of pedestrians and every established footway, pavement, lane, thoroughfare or any other part of a road set apart for the use of pedestrians and where any part of a road is not so set apart or constructed that portion on both sides of a road three metres in width measured from the property line and extending alongside such road.

“garden” means an area within a road reserve which is developed or treated with plants and materials other than lawn grass.

“intersection” includes the area comprised within imaginary straight lines joining in succession the points of transection of the property lines of two or more roads that meet each other except that where the property lines are curved at any corner the point of transection of the property lines shall be regarded as the point on the curve nearest to the point at which those property lines if extended in straight lines from each end of the curve would meet.

“junction” includes that part of a road lying between imaginary straight lines at right angles to the road commencing from the points of transection formed by its own property lines with the property lines of a road which abuts thereon except that where the property lines are curved at any corner the point of transection formed by the property lines shall be determined in the same manner as is provided in the definition of “intersection”.

“lawn” means an area within a road reserve which is planted with grass and which may include within its area one or more trees or shrubs planted by the Council or by the landowner immediately adjacent with the approval of the Council.

“property line” means the boundary between the land comprising a street and the land that abuts thereon.

3. Where before the coming into operation of these by-laws a lawn or garden has been planted in a street, that lawn or garden shall comply with the provisions of these by-laws but the owner or occupier of the land that abuts on the portion of the street in which that lawn or garden is planted is not required to obtain a permit pursuant to these by-laws.

4. (1) A person shall not plant a garden in a street except pursuant to a permit issued by the Council, and then only in conformity with these by-laws.

(2) The Council shall not issue a permit for the planting of a garden in any portion of a street except on the application of the owner or occupier of the land that abuts on that portion of the street.

(3) A person requiring a permit to plant a garden in a street shall submit to the Council a sketch plan setting out details of the proposed garden and the positions of the proposed garden beds and shrubs in relation to the frontage and the carriageway.

(4) The Council may issue a permit under these by-laws subject to such conditions as it sees fit to impose and a person who plants a garden otherwise than in compliance with those conditions commits an offence.

(5) A person who is an owner or occupier of land that abuts a portion of a street may plant a lawn in that portion of the street without obtaining a permit to do so if such lawn is not part of a garden.

5. A person shall not plant a lawn or garden in a street—

(a) so that it extends on either side of the frontage of the land that abuts the area owned or occupied by the person responsible for planting.

(b) so that it encroaches on the pavement of a carriageway or on a made footpath.

(c) that does not comply with any levels and grades established by Council or specially authorised by Council in the terms of the application and conditions of approval.

(d) that contains shrubs which are thorny or which are otherwise of a hazardous nature.

6. (1) Any water pipes laid to a lawn or garden in a street shall:
- be laid beneath the surface of the street at a depth of not more than 30 centimetres nor less than 15 centimetres and so that any fitting connected to them does not project above the surface of the lawn or garden.
  - if connected to a public water supply be laid to comply with the requirements of the body constituted for and having the control of that supply under the Act.
  - if connected to a private supply, where passing under road, pavements, made footpaths or crossings, be of galvanised, wrought iron, or P.V.C., or copper; and
  - have approved valves located within the property where they are connected to the supply and fitted so as to give complete control of the flow of water from the supply.
- (2) Where a person in the course of laying pipes pursuant to these by-laws causes damage to any road, pavement, footpath, or crossing, to any water, gas or sewerage pipes, to any power or telephone cables or to a fire hydrant, that damage may be made good by the authority having control of the thing damaged at the expense of that person or of the person on whose behalf the pipes were laid and the amount of that expense may be recovered in any court of competent jurisdiction.
7. A person shall not water a street lawn or garden in such manner as will or may occasion inconvenience or obstruction to persons using the adjoining carriageway or footpath.
8. (1) A person planting a lawn or garden in a street may do all things reasonably necessary to maintain that lawn or garden and shall make good any damage thereby occasioned to the street and shall keep the lawn mowed to a reasonable height.
- (2) Nothing in these by-laws authorises a person to place or erect any fence, enclosure or other obstruction on or about a lawn or garden in a street.
- (3) A person shall not plant any tree or shrub that is grown or is of a variety likely to grow to a height exceeding 0.75 metres or permit any tree to be of a height exceeding 0.75 metres, in a lawn or garden in a street, if in either case such tree or shrub is situated within 12 metres of a junction or intersection.
9. The Council may at any time by notice in writing to the owner or occupier of land that abuts upon that part of a street wherein a lawn or garden is planted require that owner or occupier to remove any tree shrub or water piping or fitting and may, where the owner or occupier does not comply within the time stipulated in the notice remove the tree, shrub, piping or fitting at the expense of the owner or occupier and any expense incurred by the Council pursuant to this by-law may be recovered in any court of competent jurisdiction.
10. (1) The Council or any other authority empowered by law to dig up a street may without being liable to compensate any person therefore, dig up all or any part of a lawn or garden in a street for the purposes of carrying out any authorised works and may also regrade or reshape the area between the pavement and the property line or footpath as part of such works.
- (2) A person employed by the Council or other authority acting pursuant to this by-law shall not disturb a lawn or garden or damage any pipes laid under it or on them to any greater extent than is reasonably necessary for the purpose of carrying out any authorised works and shall upon the completion of the works reinstate the lawn or garden as far as is reasonably practicable.
11. (1) Where the Council or any other authority authorised by law to dig up a street for the purpose of carrying out authorised works is of the opinion that the carrying out of those works may be impeded by the existence of piping under a lawn or garden in a street, it may give notice to the owner or occupier of the land abutting on the lawn or garden to remove the piping until the completion of the works and may, where the owner or occupier does not comply with the notice, remove the piping at the expense of the owner or occupier and any expense incurred by the Council or authority pursuant to this by-law may be recovered in any court of competent jurisdiction.
- (2) The Council or other authority is not liable for damage to piping under a lawn or garden in a street occasioned either in the course of the removal of the piping under the provisions of sub-by-law (1) of this by-law or of carrying out authorised works.
12. (1) A person not being the occupier of the land abutting on that lawn or garden shall not, without the consent of the occupier, drive or stand a vehicle or animal upon a lawn or garden planted in a street pursuant to these by-laws.
- (2) Where a complaint brought under this by-law is in respect of the driving of a vehicle upon a lawn or garden, if the pavement of the carriageway adjoining the lawn or garden does not exceed 5.5 metres in width, it is a sufficient defence to the complaint to show that:
- the wheels of one side only of the vehicle passed over the lawn or garden; and
  - it was necessary to drive upon the lawn or garden in order to pass another vehicle then being driven or standing on the pavement of the carriageway.
- (3) A notice served under subsection (2) of section 669C of the Act in respect of an offence against this by-law shall be in or to the effect of Form 1 in the Schedule to these by-laws.
- (4) Subject to sub-by-law (5) of this by-law an infringement notice served under section 669D of the Act in respect of an offence against this by-law shall be in or to the effect of Form 2 in the Schedule to these by-laws.
- (5) An infringement notice served under subsection (2) of section 669D of the Act in respect of an offence against this by-law shall be in or to the effect of Form 3 in the Schedule to these by-laws.

(6) A notice sent under subsection (5) of section 669D of the Act withdrawing an infringement notice served under that section in respect of an offence against this by-law shall be in or to the effect of Form 4 in the Schedule to these by-laws.

13. The modified penalty for an offence against by-law 12 of these by-laws if dealt with under section 669D of the Act, is \$30 (thirty dollars).

14. A penalty for an offence against these by-laws (not being a modified penalty) may be recovered by the Council by taking proceedings against the alleged offender in a Court of Petty Sessions.

15. The Council shall cause adequate records to be kept of all infringement notices served and modified penalties received, under section 669D of the Act in respect of offences against by-law 12 of these by-laws.

16. (a) A person who proposes to plant and maintain a street tree in the road verge shall make written application for Council consent. The application shall state the nature of the tree and the place where it is intended that it be planted.

(b) If the Council grants consent it may do so subject to specifying a different type of tree or a different location in the road verge.

(c) A tree planted with Council approval shall be located so that it will not cause interference with any overhead or underground public utility service.

(d) A person planting any tree in the terms of these by-laws shall be wholly responsible for the watering and maintenance of the tree.

17. Any person wishing to place within a road verge any garden treatment of a substance or material other than lawn or garden plants shall submit to Council a sketch plan setting out the location of the treatment and details of the materials to be used.

18. The application shall be considered by the Council who shall have the authority to approve, disapprove or modify the submission, taking into account its location, design and other influencing factors.

19. Each application will be considered on its merits, having consideration for the desire of the applicant to minimise water consumption and various forms of ground cover will be approved in order to permit flexibility of treatment. The proposed use of plastic sheeting, wood chips, pine bark, sawdust or similar forms of soft material to be used as ground cover shall be specified in the application as prescribed in by-law 17 hereof, with descriptions of any garden plants to be incorporated.

20. In the special treatment of road verges under these by-laws, a person shall not;

(a) use any materials for paving other than blocks, bricks, pre-cast concrete slabs or other materials approved by the Council;

(b) use, for the purpose of landscaping, pebble stones, blue metal, gravel, limestone, broken rock or similar hard materials of a size which can be easily scattered;

(c) plant a garden, landscape, pave or maintain an area in place of a street lawn so that such treatment exceeds one third of the area of the road reserve between the paved carriageway and the front property line of the abutting land, but excluding the area of a constructed crossing place and where there is no paved footway, a condition of approval shall be that a strip of land 2 metres wide, parallel and adjacent to the front boundary of the property shall be provided and maintained in a condition sufficiently stable and unobstructed to permit the passage of pedestrians.

21. Irrespective of the method of treatment of a road verge it shall not necessarily be a condition of approval that an even grading of the lawn, garden or other form of treatment be required and a limited amount of contouring will therefore be permitted at the discretion of the Council.

22. Except as provided in these by-laws a person other than the owner or occupier of the land which abuts upon the portion of the road reserve in which a garden, landscaping or pavement is planted or placed, or a person authorised by that owner or occupier, shall not remove any flower, plant, shrub, pavement or item of landscaping from such area.

23. (1) The Council shall not be liable for any damage sustained by a person by reason of or arising out of the planting, placement, or existence of a lawn, garden landscaping or pavement in a street.

(2) A person shall in his application for a permit;

(a) if he is the owner of the land which abuts the road verge, indemnify the Council against liability in respect of any injury or damage caused to any person or property by the paving, landscaping or planting of a lawn, garden, shrubs or trees in a road verge;

(b) if he is the occupier of the land which abuts the road verge, include the written consent of the owner of that land together with a statement from the owner indemnifying the Council against liability as prescribed in the preceding clause of this by-law.

24. Any person who fails to comply with or contravenes any of these by-laws or any part thereof commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200) and in addition to a daily penalty during the breach, not exceeding twenty dollars (\$20) per day.

## LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960-1980.

The Municipality of the City of Melville.

By-laws Relating to the Control and Management of  
Community Recreation Centres.IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of  
all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby  
records having resolved on the 28th day of February, 1978, to make and submit  
for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.1. In these By-laws, unless the context otherwise implies, the following terms  
shall apply:—“Committee” shall mean a committee of management appointed by the Council  
to manage a centre, and if there be no committee of management appointed,  
the Council shall fulfill that capacity.“Centre” shall mean a Community Recreation Centre and shall include all  
associated buildings, sporting grounds and parking areas within the lot  
or lots set aside for the purpose of a centre and under the Care, Control  
and Management of the Council.

“Council” shall mean the Council of the Municipality of the City of Melville.

“Equipment” shall mean all equipment used for sport and recreation which is  
the property of the Council.2. Any person, or group who wishes to hire any portion of a Centre or any  
property or equipment for use in association therewith shall make written application  
to the Committee and shall state the purpose for which the facility, property or  
Equipment is required.

3. No booking shall be accepted more than twelve months in advance.



4. Annual or seasonal bookings may be accepted subject to Council reserving the right to cancel the bookings and by giving adequate notice in writing to that hirer to enable meetings or functions which in the opinion of the Council will be beneficial or of importance to the district.

5. The Committee may refuse to let a Centre or any part thereof to any applicant, and it shall be the discretion of the Committee whether or not to assign any reason for such refusal.

6. No person shall—

- (a) deface or damage any building, wall or structure in or about a Centre.
- (b) place any nails, pins, screws, or other such fixing device in or on any part of a Centre without the written consent of the Committee.
- (c) deface or damage any chattels or Equipment which is the property of the Council;
- (d) without the written consent of the Committee remove, replace or alter any electrical fitting in a Centre;
- (e) without the written consent of the Committee remove from a Centre any chattels or Equipment which is the property of the Council;
- (f) bring, or consume any alcoholic beverage, in or about a Centre without the express written permission of the Committee on each occasion.

7. No person shall, in or about a Centre—

- (a) behave in a disorderly or offensive manner;
- (b) use any profane or indecent language;
- (c) be in an intoxicated condition;
- (d) create or take part in any disturbance;
- (e) smoke in any area where signs indicate that smoking is prohibited.

8. The hirer of a Centre or any part thereof shall—

- (a) maintain law and order and decent behaviour by all in attendance within a Centre;
- (b) make good any damage to a Centre for any loss or damage to the property and Equipment hired therewith or situated therein and so caused during the term of the hiring; or at the option of the Council pay to the Council the costs of repair or replacement of any property or Equipment so damaged;
- (c) permit any person authorised by the Council to have free ingress to a Centre for the purpose of an inspection, or enforcement of any provisions of these By-laws;
- (d) leave a Centre in a clean and tidy condition after the term of the hiring;
- (e) place all refuse and litter in the receptacles so provided in a Centre premises;
- (f) report any damage or defacement to Centre Manager.

9. Acceptance of the provisions of these By-laws shall be deemed to be a condition of the hiring.

10. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of these By-laws commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding two hundred dollars.

## DOG ACT 1976-1977.

The Municipality of the Town of Northam.

By-laws Relating to Dogs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 16th day of December, 1980 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws:—

## Interpretation.

1. In these by-laws the term "Council" shall mean the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Northam.
2. For the purpose of these by-laws an owner is defined as meaning the owner of any dog and also any person having a dog within his possession and control.
3. All previous by-laws relating to dogs as were published in the *Government Gazette* of July, 19th, 1974 are hereby repealed.

## PART I—IMPOUNDING OF DOGS.

4. If the owner or persons apparently acting on behalf of the owner of the dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog then upon payment of the fees specified in the first Schedule hereto the dog shall be released to such person.
5. The poundkeeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such time and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.
6. If the Council shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not the owner shall pay to the Council the fee specified in the First Schedule.
7. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of liability to a penalty under any provisions of the Dog Act 1976-1977, Dog Regulations 1976-1977 or these by-laws.
8. A person shall not keep or permit or suffer to be kept more than two dogs on any premises within the district of the Town of Northam unless such premises are licensed as an approved kennel establishment pursuant to Part II of these by-laws. (Note—exemption to this by-law may be sought under the provision of section 26 (3) of the Dog Act 1979).

## PART II—KEEPING OF DOGS.

9. An application for a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in writing and shall be in or substantially in the form of the Second Schedule.
10. The fee payable for the issue of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment is that specified in the First Schedule.
11. A licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in or substantially in the form of the Third Schedule.
12. The fee payable for the renewal of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment is that specified in the First Schedule.
13. The occupier of premises licensed as an approved kennel establishment shall ensure that the dogs in that establishment are kept in kennels and yards appropriate to the breed or kind in question, sited and maintained in accordance with the requirements of the Public Health, sufficiently secured and having specifications of a standard not less than the following:—
- (a) each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto;
  - (b) each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance of not less than 5 metres from the boundaries of the land in the occupation of the occupier;
  - (c) each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance of not less than 30 metres from the front road or street;
  - (d) each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance of not less than 15 metres from any dwelling house, church, schoolroom, hall or factory;
  - (e) the walls shall be constructed of concrete, brick, stone, wood, asbestos, ceelite or galvanised iron;
  - (f) the roof shall be constructed of impervious material or other material approved by the Council;
  - (g) all external surfaces of galvanised iron, wood or asbestos material shall be painted and kept painted with good quality paint.
  - (h) the lowest internal height shall be at least 2 metres from the floor;
  - (i) each yard shall be securely fenced and kept securely fenced with a fence of not less than 2 metres in height constructed of galvanised iron, wood, galvanised link mesh or netting;
  - (j) all gates shall be provided with proper catches or means of fastening;
  - (k) the upper surface of the floor of each kennel shall be set at least 100 mm above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a smooth surface and have a fall of not less than 1 in 100, the entire yard shall be surrounded by a drain which shall be properly laid, ventilated and trapped, all floor washing shall pass through the drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the health requirements of the Council.
  - (l) the floor of any yard which is floored shall be constructed in the same manner as the floor of any kennel and as provided in the last preceding paragraph;
  - (m) for each dog kept therein every kennel shall have not less than 2 square metres of floor space and every yard not less than 2.3 square metres;
  - (n) all kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels shall be maintained in a clean condition and cleansed and disinfected when so ordered by an Officer of the Council.
14. A person shall not erect a kennel unless and until plans and specifications of and a location plan showing the proposed site of the kennel and of the yard appurtenant thereto have been approved by the Council.
15. Council may not approve or register a kennel establishment until the occupier of the premises has advertised in a public newspaper his intention to establish a kennel upon the premises and Council has considered any objections raised to the maintenance of the kennel upon the premises.
16. Approved kennel establishments shall be registered by the Council on receipt of the fee prescribed in the First Schedule.
17. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—
- (a) A public building;
  - (b) A theatre or picture garden;
  - (c) A house of worship;
  - (d) A public business premises;
18. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:—
- (a) A sports ground;
  - (b) An area set aside for public recreation;
  - (c) A car park;
  - (d) Any land vested in or under control of the Council (not being a road, street, or undeveloped land within the Town).
  - (e) A fauna reserve.
19. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of these by-laws shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100).

## The Municipality of the Shire of Boyup Brook.

## Swimming Pool By-laws.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on the 10th day of April, 1981, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following by-laws:—

1. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires the following terms shall have the meaning set against them hereunder respectively:—

“Council” means the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Boyup Brook.

“Shire Clerk” means the person for the time being employed by the Council as the Shire Clerk or any Acting Shire Clerk, his deputy or any officer authorised by the Council.

“Pool Manager” means the Manager or other person appointed for the time being by the Council to have control and management of the Pool Premises and such term shall include the Assistant Manager.

“Attendant” means an employee of the Council or a person authorised by Council performing any duties on or in connection with the Pool Premises.

“Spectator” means any person admitted to the Pool Premises for the sole purpose of viewing the swimming or other activities conducted therein.

“Swimming Coach” means any person licensed by the Council to enter the Pool Premises for the purpose of teaching swimming.

“Pool Premises” means the Boyup Brook Swimming Pool and includes all buildings, structures, fittings, fixtures, machinery, chattels, furniture and equipment forming part of such swimming pool or used in connection therewith.

2. The Pool Premises shall be open for use of the public during such hours and periods as the Council may from time to time by resolution appoint; the Council reserving to itself the right to refuse admission to any person at any time. No person under the age of six shall be permitted to enter or remain at the Pool Premises unless that person is and continues to be under the care and control of a person over the age of fourteen years. No person shall leave a person under the age of six years at the Pool Premises otherwise than under the care and control of a person over the age of fourteen years.

3. The Pool Manager may temporarily suspend admittances or clear the Pool Premises or any part thereof of any person or persons if in his opinion such action is necessary or desirable.

4. Every person using the Pool Premises shall obey all reasonable directions of the Pool Manager with regard to such use.

5. It shall be the duty of the Pool Manager (who is hereby so empowered and directed) to refuse admission to or remove or cause to be removed from the Pool Premises any person who, in the opinion of the Pool Manager, is guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws who, by his past or present conduct, is deemed undesirable and any such person shall, upon the request of the Pool Manager to withdraw from the Pool Premises quietly and peaceably do so as soon as possible.

6. Any person who has been refused admission to the Pool Premises or who feels aggrieved by the action of the Pool Manager may appeal to the Council by letter addressed to the Shire Clerk, against such action and the Council may give such direction in the matter as is thought fit provided that such right of appeal shall not imply any right of action for damages or other remedy against the Pool Manager or Council arising out of such refusal of admission.

7. No male above the age of four years shall trespass upon any part of the Pool Premises set apart for the exclusive use of females and no female shall trespass upon any part of the Pool Premises set apart for exclusive use of males.

8. The Pool Manager may prohibit any person approaching or entering or remaining in a pool who in his opinion is dirty or unfit to use such pool and the Pool Manager may require such person to thoroughly cleanse and wash himself.

9. (a) No person, Club or Association or organisation shall conduct a carnival at the Pool Premises unless with the prior consent of the Council.

(b) The Council may grant such consent subject to such conditions it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such consent.

(c) A person, Club or Association or organisation conducting any carnival held at the Pool Premises shall be responsible for the conduct of the competitors and spectators during the carnival and shall prevent overcrowding and ensure that no damage is done to buildings or fencing or any other portion of the Pool Premises and that these by-laws are observed by all competitors, officials and spectators attending the carnival.

10. (a) No person shall for profit teach, coach or train any other person in the pool unless with the prior written permission of the Council.

(b) The Council may grant such permission subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such permission without being under any obligation to assign a reason for doing so and without being liable to pay compensation.

11. Any person who finds any article or money which has been left in the Pool Premises and not his property shall forthwith deliver it to the Pool Manager or an Attendant.

12. Neither the Council nor the Pool Manager or Attendant or Officer or Employee of the Council shall be in any way responsible for any article or money lost or stolen from any person whilst in the Pool Premises or for any article damaged or destroyed whilst in or about the Pool Premises

13. If requested, season tickets shall be offered for inspection to the attendant when used to obtain admission to the Pool. Season tickets are not transferrable and such ticket may be used only by the person in whose name the same is issued. The attendant shall refuse admission to a person seeking the same and using such ticket if the attendant reasonably believes that the person so seeking admission is not the person to whom such ticket was issued.

14. No person shall—

- (a) not being an officer, attendant or employee of the Council in the course of his duties enter the Pool Premises without having first paid to the Pool Manager or an attendant the proper charge for admission.
- (b) obstruct the Pool Manager or an Attendant in carrying out his duties.
- (c) enter or depart from any part of the Pool Premises except by means of the respective entrances or exits set apart for that purpose.
- (d) enter or attempt to enter any bathroom or dressing enclosure that is already occupied without the consent of the occupier.
- (e) dress or undress or remove any part of his or her costume or bathing costume except in a dressing enclosure provided for the purpose.
- (f) appear in public unless properly attired in a costume of such nature as to preserve decency and to cover the body so as to prevent indecent exposure of the person.
- (g) enter or be in the Pool Premises whilst in an intoxicated condition.
- (h) take into the Pool Premises or have in his possession therein any intoxicating liquor or drugs.
- (i) enter or remain in the Pool Premises if he or she is affected by or suffering from any infectious or offensive disease.
- (j) deposit any filth or rubbish in any part of the Pool Premises except in places set aside for the purpose.
- (k) eat in or take into any part of the Pool Premises other than areas set aside for the purpose any food, drinks or confectionery of any kind whatsoever.
- (l) smoke any tobacco or other substances in any portion of the Pool Premises where smoking is prohibited by Notices displayed therein.
- (m) damage or disfigure or write upon any part of the Pool Premises.
- (n) interfere with or improperly use any portion of the Pool Premises.
- (o) break, injure, damage or destroy any life saving equipment or any property of the Council.
- (p) behave in an unseemly, improper, disorderly or riotous manner or push or throw any person into the pool or run around the concourse or surrounds of the pool.
- (q) swear or use any indecent, obscene or abusive language on any part of the pool premises.
- (r) gamble on the Pool Premises.
- (s) climb upon any fence, wall, partition or roof of the Pool Premises.
- (t) waste or wastefully use water or leave any water tap dripping or running.
- (u) expectorate or commit a nuisance in any part of the Pool Premises.
- (v) annoy or interfere with any person in the Pool.
- (w) bring any animal into the Pool Premises or being the person in control of such animal permit such animal to remain in any part of the Pool Premises.
- (x) approach or enter any swimming pool until he or she has thoroughly cleansed and washed himself or herself.
- (y) use any soap in any part of the Pool Premises other than in the showerbaths or toilet facilities.
- (z) use any oil, detergent or any other substance or preparation whereby the water in the pool may be or become discoloured, contaminated or rendered turbid.
- (za) foul or pollute the water in the pool or shower.
- (zb) throw any sticks or stones or other objects in the pool or anywhere in the Pool Premises.
- (zc) soil or defile or damage any towel or bathing costume.

15. Any person committing a breach of or an offence against any of the provisions of these by-laws shall for every such breach or offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100).

#### DOG ACT 1976-1977.

The Municipality of the Shire of Cranbrook.

By-laws Relating to Dogs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 19th day of December, 1980 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws regarding the Control of Dogs in the Shire of Cranbrook.

##### Interpretation.

1. In these by-laws the term "Council" shall mean the Council of the Shire of Cranbrook.
2. All previous by-laws of the Shire of Cranbrook relating to dogs are hereby repealed.
3. Part II of these By-laws—Regulation of Dog Kennels are only applicable to the Townsites of Cranbrook and Frankland.

#### PART I—IMPOUNDING OF DOGS.

4. If the owner or persons apparently acting on behalf of the owner of a dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog then upon payment of the fee specified in the First Schedule hereto the dog shall be released to such person.
5. The pound keeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such time and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.
6. If the Council shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not the owner shall pay to the Council the fees specified in the First Schedule hereto.
7. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of the dog from liability to a penalty under any of the provisions of the Dog Act 1976-1977, Dog Act Regulations 1976-1977 or these by-laws.

#### PART II—REGULATION OF DOG KENNELS.

8. A person shall not keep or permit or suffer to be kept more than two dogs over the age of three months and the young of those dogs under that age on any premises within the townsites of Cranbrook and Frankland unless such premises are licensed as an approved kennel establishment pursuant to Part II of these by-laws.

(Note:—Notwithstanding the provisions of By-law 8 a person wishing to keep more than two dogs but not greater than six dogs on any premises may seek exemption for these premises under the provisions of section 26 (3) of the Dog Act 1976-1977.)

9. An application for a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in writing and shall be in or substantially in the form of Form 1 of the Second Schedule and shall be supported by evidence that due notice of the proposed use of the land has been given to persons in the locality.

10. A licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in or substantially in the form of Form 2 of the Second Schedule.

11. The fee payable for the issue or renewal of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment is that specified in the First Schedule.

12. The occupier of any premises licensed as an approved kennel establishment shall provide a kennel or kennels which shall comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) Each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto.
- (b) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof, shall not be at any less distance than 6 metres from the boundaries of the land in the occupation of the occupier.
- (c) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be any less distance than 24 metres from any road or street constituting the front boundary or not less than 10 metres from any road or street constituting a side or rear boundary.
- (d) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be any less distance than 10 metres from any dwelling, house, church, school-room, hall or factory.
- (e) The walls shall be rigid, impervious and structurally sound.
- (f) The roof shall be constructed of some impervious material approved of by Council.
- (g) All external surfaces of material shall be painted and kept painted with good quality paint.
- (h) The lowest internal height shall be at least two metres from the floor.
- (i) Each yard shall be securely fenced and kept securely fenced with a fence not less than two metres in height constructed of galvanized iron, wood, galvanized link mesh or netting or other material approved of by Council.
- (j) All gates shall be provided with proper catches or means of fastening.
- (k) The upper surface of the floor of each kennel shall be set at least 100 millimetres above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a smooth surface. It shall have a fall of not less than 1 to 100. The entire yard shall be surrounded by a drain which shall be properly laid, ventilated and trapped. All floor washings shall pass through this drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the health requirements of the Council.
- (l) The floor of any yard which is floored shall be constructed in the same manner as the floor of any kennel and as provided in by-law 12 (k).
- (m) For each dog kept therein every kennel shall have not less than two square metres of floor space and every yard not less than three square metres.
- (n) All kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels shall be maintained in a clean condition and cleaned and disinfected when so ordered by an officer of the Council.

13. Council shall not permit the establishment or maintenance of a kennel establishment in any area if in the opinion of the Council such kennel establishment would adversely affect the environment, be a nuisance to other residents or in any way otherwise be detrimental or prejudicial.

14. No kennel shall be erected unless and until plans, specifications and a location plan showing the proposed site for such kennel and of the yard appurtenant thereto have been approved by the Council.

15. Council may not approve or licence a kennel establishment until the occupier of the premises has advertised in a newspaper circulating in the district his intention to establish a kennel establishment upon the premises and Council has considered any objections raised within 21 days of the advertisement, to the maintenance of the kennel establishment upon the premises.

### PART III—GENERAL.

16. The owner or occupier of premises within the townsites of Cranbrook and Frankland on which a dog is kept, shall cause portion of the premises to be fenced in a manner capable of confining the dog.

17. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—

- (a) A public building.
- (b) A theatre or picture garden.
- (c) A house of worship.
- (d) The Cranbrook Memorial Sports Ground and Airstrip.
- (e) Cranbrook Caravan Park.
- (f) Lake Poorrarecup Reserve No. 24853.
- (g) Lake Nunijup Reserve No. 29175.

18. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:—

- (a) A sports ground.
- (b) An area set aside for public recreation.
- (c) A car park.
- (d) Any land vested in or under the control of the Council and not being a road, street, or undeveloped land within the Shire.

19. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of these by-laws shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100).

20. Dogs used in the droving, tending or in the management of livestock under the control of the owner or employee shall not be deemed to come within the provisions of by-law 18 (d) of this Part.

21. The dog pound for the Shire of Cranbrook is situated on Lot 58 Climie Street, Cranbrook (Shire Depot).
