Workers' Compensation Act 1912-1979.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the provisions of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act 1912-1979, the group of employers specified in the Schedule to this Order having proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that such group of employers has established a fund for insurance against the full amount of its liability to pay compensation under that Act to all workers employed by them and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability; His Excellency the Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and under the powers conferred by section 13 of the Act, doth hereby exempt, subject to subsection 8 of that Section, the group of employers specified in the Schedule to this Order from the operation of that section for the period ending on the 12th February, 1983.

 “ (a) seven officers holding either rank of Chief Superintendent or Superintendent; ” .
- Reg. 911 amended. 5. Regulation 911 of the principal regulations is amended in subregulation (1) by deleting “Superintendent—one star surmounted by a crown, silvered metal. Gorget made of silvered pressed metal in an oak leaf pattern with a silvered metal button on a royal blue velvet background;” and substituting the following—
 “ Senior Chief Superintendent—three small stars surmounted by a crown, silvered metal. Gorget made of silvered pressed metal in an oak leaf pattern with a silvered metal button on a royal blue velvet background;
 Chief Superintendent—two stars surmounted by a crown, silvered metal. Gorget is to be identical with the one worn by the Senior Chief Superintendent;
 Superintendent—one star surmounted by a crown, silvered metal. Gorget is to be identical with the one worn by the Senior Chief Superintendent; ” .
- Second Schedule amended. 6. The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is amended—
 (a) by deleting item 3 under the heading “DESCRIPTION OF UNIFORMS—COMMISSIONED OFFICERS. UNIFORM” and substituting the following—
 “ 3. Caps:
 Black material with chequered band and badge of a type approved by the Commissioner.
 Superintendent’s, Senior Inspector’s and Inspector’s cap peaks to have a single row of silver embroidery 19 mm wide.
 Senior Chief Superintendent’s and Chief Superintendent’s cap peak to have a single row of silver embroidered oak leaf pattern 19 mm wide at the top and a single row of silver embroidery 19 mm wide below.
 Assistant Commissioner’s cap peak to have a single silver embroidered row of oak leaf pattern 19 mm wide.
 Commissioner’s and Senior Assistant Commissioner’s cap peak to have two rows of silver embroidered oak leaf pattern 19 mm wide. ” ; and
 (b) by deleting “Senior Assistant Commissioner and Assistant Commissioners—” under the heading “CEREMONIAL DRESS” and substituting the following—
 “ Senior Assistant Commissioner, Assistant Commissioner, Senior Chief Superintendent and Chief Superintendent— ” .

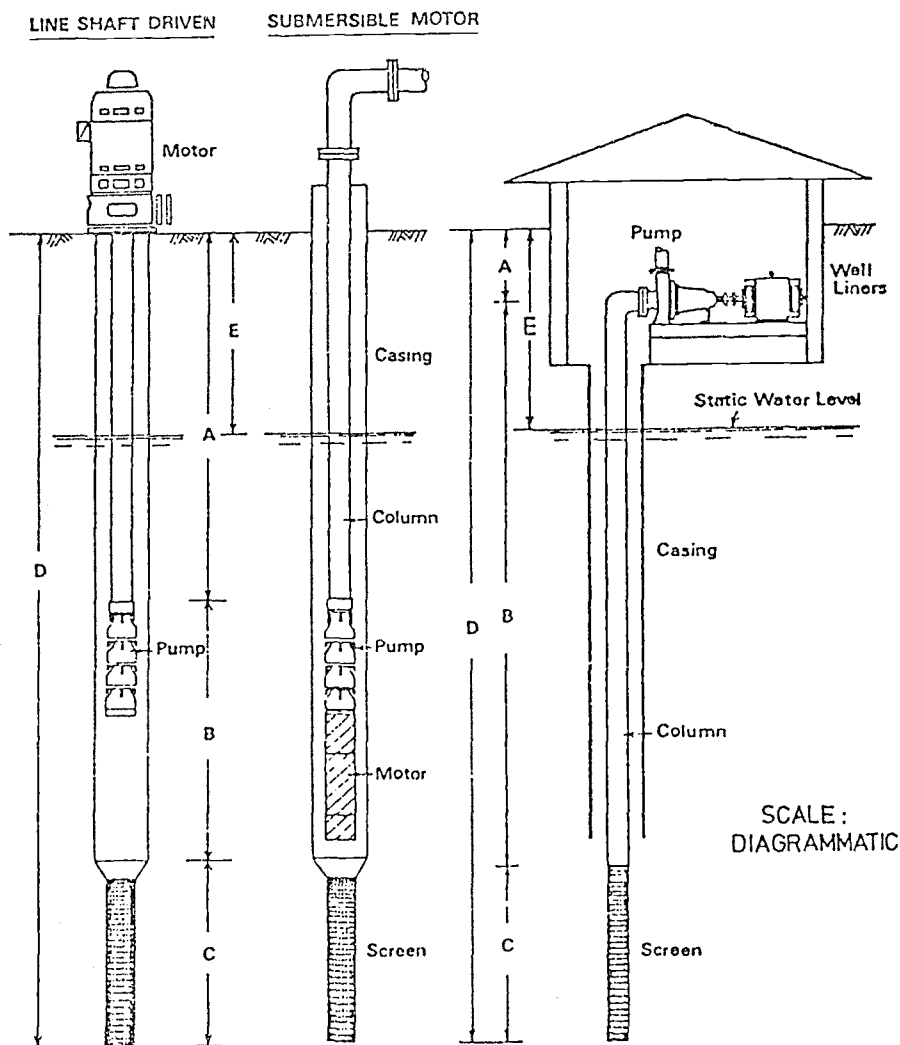

EDUCATION ACT AMENDMENT REGULATIONS
(No. 11) 1981.

MADE by the Minister for Education.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Education Act Amendment Regulations (No. 11) 1981.

2. In these regulations the Education Act Regulations 1960*, as amended, are referred to as the principal regulations.

3. Regulation 94 of the principal regulations is amended by repealing subregulation (1) and substituting the following subregulations—

“ (1) Promotion lists shall apply in respect of promotions to the positions of—

(a) principal in schools of the following classification, namely—

- (i) Class III primary school;
- (ii) Class III junior primary school;
- (iii) Class II primary school;
- (iv) Class II junior primary school;
- (v) Class I primary school;
- (vi) Class I junior primary school; and
- (vii) Class IA primary school; and

(b) deputy principal in schools classified as Class IA primary schools.

(1a) Promotions to take effect on or after 1 January 1982 to the positions referred to in paragraph (a) of subregulation (1) of this regulation shall be made from the following promotion lists, namely—

- (a) Class III Primary Schools Principals Promotion List;
- (b) Class II Primary Schools Principals Promotion List;
- (c) Class I Primary Schools Principals Promotion List; and
- (d) Class IA Primary Schools Principals Promotion List.

(1b) The promotion lists that have been compiled pursuant to subregulation (2) of this regulation for 30 April 1981 in relation to the positions referred to in subregulation (1) (a) of this regulation shall be integrated by the Primary Schools Appointments Board constituted under regulation 91 so that the promotion lists for the positions specified in column 1 of the Table to this subregulation are integrated into the composite promotion list specified in column 2 of that Table opposite and corresponding to the positions specified in column 1 of the Table and the lists so integrated shall be the promotion lists for the positions of principals in primary schools specified therein for the year 1982.

- (b) the order in which the names of eligible persons are to be listed on a promotion list; and
- (c) the date of appointment of a person whose name appears on a promotion list to the position held by him at the time that the composite list is being integrated.

(1d) Where in any year it appears to the Primary Schools Appointments Board that a position of principal of a Class IA primary school will not be filled by reason that the persons who are eligible to be promoted or transferred to such a position will decline to apply for the position the Board may compile

a Class IA Primary Schools Principals Supplementary Promotion List for those positions containing the names of those persons who it expects will complete the requirements prescribed in these regulations for eligibility for the Class IA Primary Schools Principals Promotion List in the year next following and any such positions may be filled by persons whose names appear on that list but in the order indicated by that list. ”

4. Regulation 102D of the principal regulations is amended by inserting after subregulation (2a) the following subregulation—

“ (2b) Notwithstanding subregulations (1), (2) and (2a) of this regulation but otherwise subject to these regulations, where in any year it appears to the Secondary Schools Appointments Board that a position of principal of a Class I district high school will not be filled by reason that the persons who are eligible to be promoted or transferred to such a position will decline to apply for the position the Board may compile a supplementary Class I District High Schools Principals Promotion List containing the names of those persons who it expects will complete the requirements prescribed by the regulations for the Class I District High Schools Principals Promotion List in the year next following and any such position may be filled by a person whose name appears on that list but in the order indicated in that list. ”

5. Regulation 97 of the principal regulations is amended by inserting in subregulation (1) after paragraph (j) the following paragraph—

“ (k) A principal of a Class I junior primary school is not eligible to have his name placed on the promotion list for a Class IA primary school. ”
