and whereas I, the said Governor, propose to absent  
myself temporarily from the seat of Government: Now,  
therefore, I, the said Governor, by virtue and in  
exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, do by  
this instrument under the Public Seal of the State  
constitute and appoint you the said Sir Francis Theodore  
Page Burt as from the date of my departure upon the  
said absence and during such absence to be my deputy,  
and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute  
for and on my behalf, as such Governor, all the powers  
and authorities vested in me by the said Letters Patent.

THE Minister for Fisheries and Wildlife acting under sections 10 and 23A of the Fisheries Act 1905-1979, hereby gives notice as follows—

1. Unless taken by hand, the species of fish known as *Panulirus cygnus* (Western Rock Lobster) shall be taken only by means of a device known as a rock lobster pot that conforms to the provisions of this notice.
2. Every rock lobster pot shall have only one entrance or neck which shall be positioned on the upper surface of the pot, having the mouth or entrance parallel to the base of the pot.
3. Every rock lobster pot other than a batten rock lobster pot shall have inserted therein a device that—
  - (a) creates an escape gap that is as nearly as practicable rectangular in shape and measures not less than 305 millimetres in length and not less than 54 millimetres in width;
  - (b) is constructed of either steel rod having a diameter of not less than 9.5 millimetres, or of steel flat-bar having a width of not less than 19 millimetres and a depth of not less than 4.7 millimetres; and
  - (c) is positioned on a side, other than the base, or on the upper surface of the pot so that the longer sides of the gap that it creates are generally parallel to the base of the pot.
4. Every batten rock lobster pot shall have therein an escape gap that—
  - (a) is as nearly as practicable rectangular in shape and measures not less than 305 millimetres in length and not less than 54 millimetres in width; and
  - (b) is positioned on a side, other than the base, or on the upper surface of the pot so that the longer sides of the gap are generally parallel to the base of the pot.
5. A batten rock lobster pot shall not exceed one metre in length when measured internally and parallel to the side of greatest length, and at the greatest length of that side, on a plane parallel to the base.
6. A rock lobster pot other than a batten rock lobster pot shall not exceed one metre when measured internally along the line of greatest length on a plane parallel to the base.
7. A rock lobster pot shall not have any obstruction positioned in such a way as to restrict the movement of rock lobsters through the escape gap or to reduce the internal measurement of the escape gap. Provided that in the case of a rock lobster pot other than a batten rock lobster one wire only may pass perpendicularly across the escape gap and then only across its narrowest measurement.

Firebreak Order 1981-1982.

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land.

PURSUANT to section 33 of the Bush Fires Act, all owners and occupiers of land within the Shire of Boyup Brook are hereby required on or before 30 November 1981, to establish firebreaks clear of all flammable materials and thereafter maintain such firebreaks clear of all flammable materials until 15 April 1982, in the following positions on land owned or occupied by them:—

Rural Lands—

- (a) A firebreak not less than 2.5 metres wide must be constructed within 100 metres of the boundary of each property, i.e. cleared or part cleared land, where the boundary is adjacent to or adjoins a constructed or used surveyed/gazetted road. Any person wishing to vary this requirement will require the approval of the Brigade Fire Control Officer, Council to be informed by the landholder before 1 October 1981, of the alternate positioning agreed to, the notification must contain the signature of the Fire Control Officer and all variations must be applied for annually.
- (b) Firebreaks are to be installed within 100 metres of the crop perimeter, by using either of the following three methods, when crops are to be harvested for grain:—
  - (1) A 3 metre firebreak inside the crop paddock.
  - (2) A 2 metre firebreak plus a 2 metre mown strip inside the crop paddock.
  - (3) A 2 metre firebreak in the adjoining paddock.

(3) A 2 metre firebreak in the adjoining paddock.

Persons not intending to harvest crops must notify the Council Office in writing, by 30 November 1981.

- (c) A firebreak 3 metres wide shall be cleared not less than 20 metres and not more than 100 metres from the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks, homesteads and fuel storage areas by 30 November 1981, and the area between the firebreaks and the building or haystack cleared of all flammable material by 15 December 1981.

Private Pine Plantations—Any pines planted for commercial purposes constitutes a pine plantation and you are hereby required to clear of all flammable materials, firebreaks not less than 50 metres wide around the perimeter of each plantation, and any plantation exceeding 50 hectares will also require a subdivisional firebreak of 50 metres in width for each 50 hectares.

Townsites—On or before 15 December 1981, all town lots under 4 000 square metres in area and all fuel depots within the Shire are required to be cleared of all debris or flammable material. A break of not less than one metre is to be cleared around the boundaries of all occupied and unoccupied lots. Lots of 4 000 square metres and over are to have minimum 2.5 metre firebreak installed around all external boundaries.

General—Provided that if, for any reason, it is impracticable to complete the clearing of firebreaks by the dates required by this notice, application must be made in writing to the Boyup Brook Shire Council not later than 30 November 1981 for permission to complete breaks by a later date. Owners or occupiers with land adjacent to Crown or Forest land may place their firebreaks in that land, with the permission of the appropriate Department, provided that the Council is notified accordingly by 30 November 1981.

Penalty not less than forty dollars nor more than four hundred dollars, in addition to which the Council may have the work carried out and recover the cost of such work from the owner and/or occupier.

- (b) within 20 metres of the perimeter of all buildings or hay stacks or groups thereof in such a manner so as to completely surround the buildings and hay stacks, and
- (c) immediately alongside all railways bounding or intersecting the land, and
- (d) in such additional or alternative positions as instructed in writing from any person authorised by the Shire of Dardanup.

## Requirements in Respect of Industrial Land.

On all land owned or occupied by you within an industrial area, you must on or before 15 November 1981 have clear of all inflammable matter and all bush as defined in the Bush Fires Act, save standing live trees, firebreaks according to the following requirements:—

- (a) where the area of land is 2 023 square metres or less and the land is not used for agriculture or grazing purposes, all inflammable matter and all bush as defined in the Bush Fires Act shall be removed from the whole of the land, or
- (b) where the area of the land is in excess of 2 023 square metres, or is used for agriculture or grazing purposes, firebreaks at least 2

metres wide shall be cleared immediately inside all the external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

## Requirements in Respect of Urban Land.

On all land owned or occupied by you within a townsite you must on or before 15 December 1981 have clear of all inflammable matter and all bush as defined in the Bush Fires Act, save standing live trees, firebreaks according to the following requirements:—

- (a) where the area of the land is 2 023 square metres or less and the land is not used for agriculture or grazing purposes, all inflammable matter and all bush as defined in the Bush Fires Act, save standing live trees, shall be removed from the whole of the land, or
- (b) where the land is used for agriculture or grazing purposes or is more than 2 023 square metres in area, firebreaks at least 2 metres wide shall be cleared of all inflammable matter and all bush as defined in the Bush Fires Act, save standing live trees, immediately inside all the external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

## Requirements in Respect of Fuel Storage on Rural and Urban Land.

On all land owned or occupied by you upon which there is situated any drum or drums which are normally used for the storage of automotive fuel or any ramp or other structure used for the purpose of storing such drums you must on or before 15 November 1981 have clear of all inflammable matter and all bush as defined in the Bush Fires Act, firebreaks at least 6 metres wide immediately surrounding all such drums, ramps or structures.

## Application to Vary Above Requirements.

If it is considered for any reason to be impracticable to clear firebreaks as required by this Notice, you must apply to the Council for permission to provide firebreaks in an alternative position or by an alternative date, or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council, or its duly authorised Officer, you must comply with the requirements of this Notice.

## Burning.

If the requirements of this Notice are to be complied with by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

- (iii) Requirements of section 18 of Bush Fires Act to be complied with during restricted burning period.

(b) All Other Lands—Rural and Small Holdings: Sunday burning is not permitted inclusive of townsite Lots in excess of .405 ha (1 acre).

(c) Public Holidays—Bush Fires Act 1954-1979—“Bushfire Regulations”: In accordance with the provisions of Regulation 15 C (2) of the Bushfires Regulations, burning is prohibited during the prohibited and restricted periods in Zones 6 and 8 on the following declared Public Holidays:—

Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Labour Day, Anzac Day and applicable to Easter Friday, Saturday, Sunday, Monday and Tuesday should Easter fall within the restricted burning period for respective zones as declared in this notice.

Notice to Owners and/or Occupiers of Land.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before 30 November 1981, and thereafter up to and including 15 March 1982, to have a firebreak, clear of all inflammable material at least 1.8 m (6 ft.) wide (or such other width as is specified hereunder) in the positions as set out hereunder.

1. Rural Land—(All land other than in a Townsite):

1.1 Immediately inside all boundaries of all land owned or occupied by you. No breaks are permitted to be constructed on a road reserve outside a property boundary, unless by burning referred under "Road Reserves".

1.2 Within 100 m (5 chains) of the perimeter of all buildings and/or haystacks situated on the land.

Notation: The area within the perimeter firebreak shall be cleared of all inflammable material, and maintained in such condition until the end of the restricted burning season in 1982.

2.3 N.B.—Islands in River Systems:

Owners and/or occupiers of Island Locations are required on or before 30 November 1981 and thereafter up to and including 15 March 1982 to have a firebreak clear of all inflammable material at least 1.8 m (6 ft) wide immediately inside all boundaries of land.

2.3 (b) Canal System Locations:

The requirements of section 2.2 (Townsites) will not be enforced by Council subject to owners and/or occupiers complying with the undermentioned conditions:—

(i) Land to be mowed or slashed to a level of 20 mm of growth and inflammable material raked to one specific area on location, removed or burnt.

"signalling" means the International Code of Signals and Morse Code. "

" (1) " ; and

(b) after the existing regulation, the following subregulation—

" (2) Notwithstanding anything in subregulation (1) of this regulation, a candidate offering himself for examination only in signalling as defined by regulation 7A (2), 11A (3), 15A (3) or 18A (3), as the case requires, of these regulations shall pay to the Department a fee of \$10.00 in respect of each such offer. "

#### WESTERN AUSTRALIAN MARINE ACT 1948-1980.

#### NAVIGABLE WATERS AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (No. 5) 1981.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Navigable Waters Amendment Regulations (No. 5) 1981.

Principal regulations. 2. In these regulations, the Navigable Waters Regulations\*, as amended, are referred to as the principal regulations.

Reg. 52CA inserted. 3. After regulation 52C of the principal regulations, the following regulation is inserted—

" 52CA. (1) A provision of regulations 52A, 52B and 52C of these regulations does not apply to a vessel while it is taking part in any race or regatta for which permission has been granted by the Department under regulation 51C if—

(a) a written exemption has been granted by the department under subregulation (2) of this regulation from that provision, for that vessel or description of vessel during that race or regatta; and

(b) the owner and the person in charge of the vessel comply with the terms and conditions of the exemption imposed on them respectively by the department.

(2) The department may, upon written application, grant an exemption described in subregulation (1) (a) of this regulation if it is satisfied that the safety of competitors in the race or regatta will not be endangered by the grant of the exemption; and may impose conditions on the owners and persons in charge of vessels taking part therein and on the person or persons by whom the race or regatta is organised.

(3) Without limiting the other grounds on which the department may refuse to grant an exemption under subregulation (2) of this regulation, it shall not grant an exemption unless it is satisfied that—

(a) the race or regatta is to commence after sunrise and be completed before sunset; and

(b) a sufficient number of suitable rescue craft will be available throughout the duration of the event. ”

4. Regulation 53 of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) by inserting after the regulation designation “53.” the subregulation designation “(1)”; and

(b) by inserting the following subregulations—

“ (2) Every person who by act or omission fails to comply with any condition imposed on him under regulation 52CA (2) commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars.

(3) It is a defence to a complaint of an offence against subregulation (2) of this regulation for an owner or a person in charge of a vessel who is charged with the offence to show that he did not know, and could not reasonably be expected to have known, of the condition imposed under regulation 52CA (2). ”

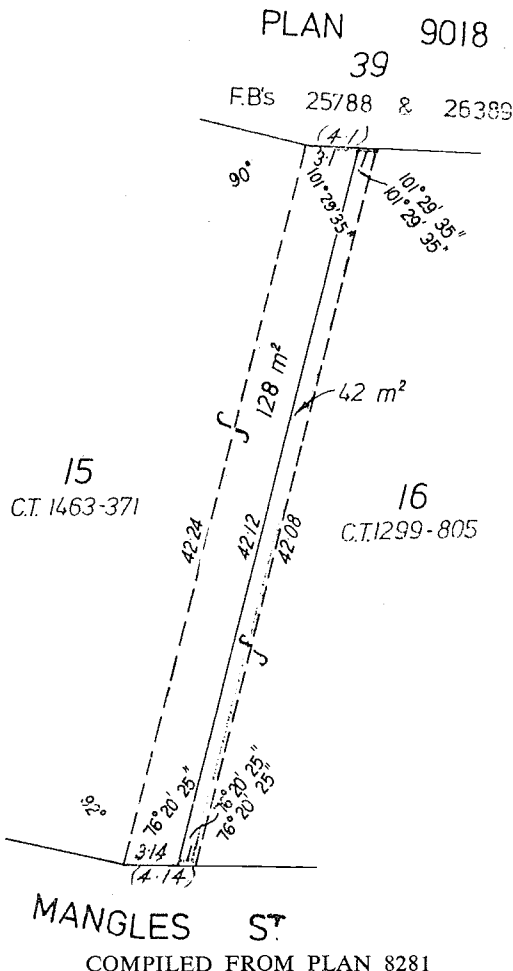

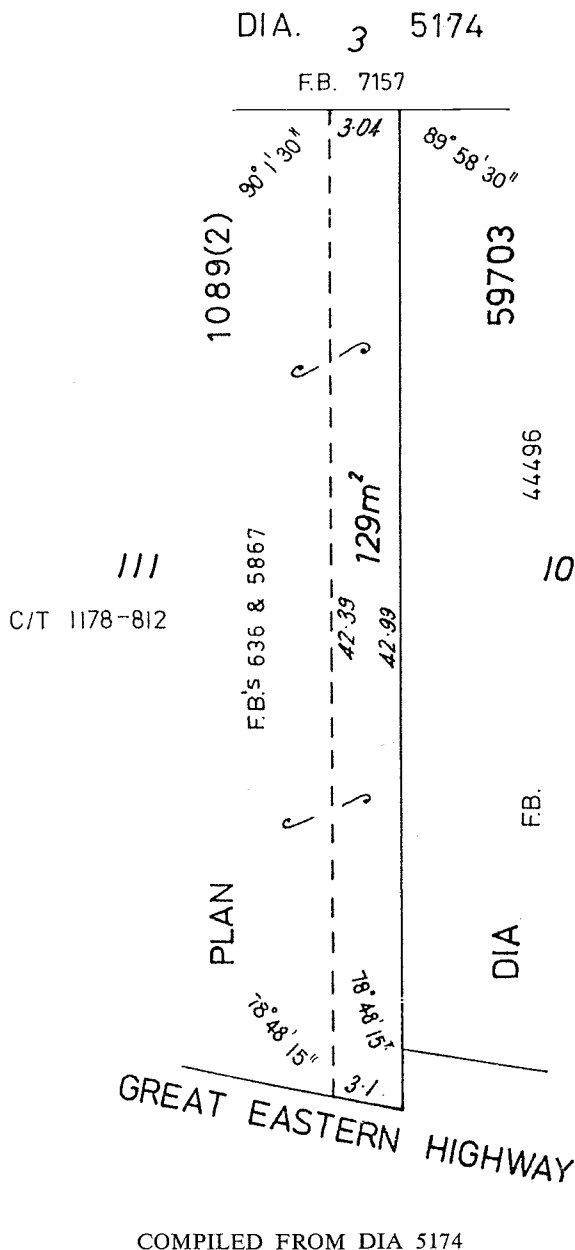

## By-Law Relating to Stalls.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on 18 February 1980 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-law:—

1. In this By-law:
  - “Authorised Assistant” means a person to whom a permit has been issued under clause 9 of this By-law;
  - “Clerk” means the Town Clerk of the City of Fremantle;
  - “Council” means the Council of the City of Fremantle;
  - “Stall” means a movable or temporarily fixed barrow or cart for the sale of goods, wares, merchandise or services;
  - “Stallholder” means a person in charge of a stall to whom a licence has been issued under this By-law;
  - “Stand” means a position in a place where a stall may be set up.
2. A person shall not set up a stall or conduct business at a stall or any part of a street unless:—
  - (a) that part of a street is a stand; and
  - (b) that person is the stallholder to whom a licence for that stand has been issued by the Council.
3. Every application for a licence shall be in respect of a particular stand for the sale of specified goods and shall:
  - (a) be in writing in the form set out in the First Schedule to this By-law;
  - (b) be accompanied by a plan of the proposed stall including its dimensions and a statement of the materials of which the stall is or is to be constructed;
  - (c) be accompanied by two character references in respect of the stallholder;
  - (d) where the applicant is a corporation the application shall specify the name of a person who is to be the stallholder;
  - (e) state the proposed number of assistants;
  - (f) state the proposed hours of operation.
4. (1) The Council shall not issue a licence if:
  - (a) the provisions of Clause 3 have not been complied with;
  - (b) it is not satisfied that the applicant is reputable and of good character;
  - (c) the prescribed fee has not been paid;
  - (d) a current licence exists for the stand with respect to which the application is made.(2) The Council may refuse to issue a licence to any person for any stall, and shall not be required to state its reasons for such refusal.
5. A licence shall specify:
  - (a) the name and address of the stallholder;
  - (b) the location and number of the stand;
  - (c) the number of assistants (if any) who may assist the stallholder in the conduct of business at the stall;
  - (d) particulars of the goods which may be sold from the stall;
  - (e) particulars of the stall approved of by the Council;
  - (f) the hours of business operation of the stall.
6. Where a licence is issued under this By-law the stallholder named in the licence or a transferee approved of under this By-law and the number of assistants (if any) specified in the licence, and no other person, has the right to set up and conduct business at a stall on the stand with respect to which the licence has been issued.
7. (a) The fee payable for the issue of a licence is \$100.  
(b) The fee payable for the transfer of a licence is \$20.
8. (1) A Stallholder shall:
  - (a) not:
    - (i) employ or use in the conduct of business at a stall more than the number of assistants specified in the licence;
    - (ii) transfer assign or otherwise dispose of the licence except to a transferee approved of under this By-law;
    - (iii) sell from the stall any goods other than those specified in the licence;
    - (iv) cause or permit or suffer any nuisance to exist or continue on or adjacent to the stand specified in the licence;
    - (v) place any advertisement placard poster streamers or sign or signboards, other than price tickets not exceeding 200 sq cm in area, on the stall or any part of the street in which the stand is located;

- (vi) permit any loudhailer microphone or other method of making noise whether of the same kind or not to be used on his stand or elsewhere in relation to his stand;
  - (vii) permit any record tape or radio to be played on his stand or elsewhere in relation to his stand;
  - (viii) use any flap shelf or other device on this stall whereby the dimensions thereof are increased beyond those specified in the licence.
  - (ix) without the prior approval of the Council make any alteration or addition to the stall as approved by the Council.
- (b) ensure that his name and stall number is painted or displayed in a conspicuous place on the stall in letters and figures of not less than 5 cm in height;
- (c) subject to clause 9 personally attend at his stall so long as that stall is in operation;
- (d) keep his stall clean in good repair and properly painted;
- (e) ensure that the stand is kept entirely free from trade and other refuse and rubbish;
- (f) produce his licence to any officer or member of the Council or any police officer when demanded.
8. (2) All provisions of subclause (1) of this clause except paragraph (f) shall be observed by an Authorised Assistant who in the absence of the stallholder from the stand occupies that stand.
- (3) An Authorised Assistant shall produce the permit issued to him under clause 9 to any officer or member of the Council or any police officer when demanded.
9. Where a stallholder by reason of illness, accident or other cause is unable to comply with clause 8 (1) (c) of this By-law the Clerk may issued a permit in writing authorising a person named in the permit to occupy and manage the staff during the hours that the stall is in operation.
10. With the consent of the Council a licence may be transferred to a person approved of by the Council not being a person who is the holder of a current licence. Application for the transfer of a licence shall be made in writing shall be accompanied by two character references relating to the transferee and the Council shall not approve of the transfer if it is not satisfied that the transferee is reputable and of good character.
11. A licence shall be valid for a period of 12 months from the date of issue of the licence. The holder of a licence may apply for a renewal of that licence for a further period of 12 months. Upon application being made for renewal of a licence the holder of the licence shall pay to the Council a fee of \$100 for that renewal.
12. The Council may at any time revoke the licence if in the opinion of the Council the stallholder, an Authorised Assistant or any of his assistants;
- (a) commits an offence against this by-law while conducting business at the stall;
  - (b) is guilty of offensive or unbecoming conduct or behaviour on or near his stand;
  - (c) does not keep the stand on which the stall is set up, the stall or any of its receptacles or fittings clean and tidy;
  - (d) is not at all times clean in habit and appearance while on the stand.
13. Where a licence is revoked under clause 12 the right to occupy the stand and to set up and occupy the stall thereon thereupon ceases and the stallholder shall not be entitled to any refund of fees paid to the Council.
14. A person who fails to comply with any provision of this By-law commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$100.

## The Municipality of the Shire of Esperance.

## By-laws Relating to the Management and Control of the Esperance Youth and Community Centre.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 19 July 1980 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

1. In these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the following terms shall have the meaning set against them hereunder respectively:—

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Esperance.

“Attendant” means an officer or employee of the Council duly authorised to perform duties in connection with The Esperance Youth and Community Centre.

“Centre Director” means the person for the time being employed by the Council to control and to manage The Esperance Youth and Community Centre and includes his assistant or deputy.

“The Esperance Youth and Community Centre” (hereinafter referred to as the Centre) means and includes the swimming pool, buildings, structures, facilities, machinery, chattels, furniture, equipment, garden, and parking area erected on Reserve 29727 Corner of Black and Padbury Streets, Esperance.

“Shire Clerk” means the Shire Clerk of the Shire of Esperance.

“The Swimming Pool Section” shall mean the swimming pool, concourse surrounds, walls enclosing same and observation room.

2. (a) The Centre shall be open for admission of the public during such hours and periods as the Council may from time to time determine.

(b) The Centre or any part thereof may, at any time at the discretion of the Centre Director be set aside for the use of certain persons to the exclusion of others, except that the swimming pool section may only be so set aside with the written approval of the Shire Clerk endorsed by Council.

3. (a) Any part of the Centre may be hired during times that the Centre is not to be attended by the Centre Director or an Attendant.

(b) Such hire shall be subject to compliance with the terms and conditions specified by the Council.

(c) The hirer shall be responsible for opening and securing the building. Keys may be collected from the Centre during normal opening hours prior to the function, so long as there are no other bookings, and keys must be returned on the first day the Centre is open for business following the hiring.

(d) At the time of picking up the key the hirer shall pay a key deposit of \$10.00 to be refundable after the return of the key to the Centre.

(e) The hirer shall maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour and shall be solely and entirely responsible for the carrying out of these by-laws and for any damage done to the Centre, and shall pay such damages as shall be assessed by the Council.

(f) The hirer shall, before such time as the Centre is next to be attended by the Centre Director or an Attendant, or by such extended time as may be approved in writing in advance by the Centre Director.

(i) leave the Centre in a clean and tidy condition after the term of hiring;

(ii) remove and place all rubbish in the places so provided within the Centre except decoration materials which shall be carted away.

Any expense incurred by the Council in these respects through neglect of the hirer to comply with this by-law shall be a direct charge against the hirer and such expense shall be paid immediately on demand.

4. The Council may refuse any person admission to the Centre at any time and children under the age of six (6) years shall be refused admission to the swimming pool section unless accompanied by a responsible person over the age of fourteen (14) years.

5. Every person entering the Centre does so at his or her own risk.

6. Every person using the Centre shall obey all reasonable directions of the Centre Director or Attendant with regard to such use.

7. The Centre Director or Attendant may temporarily suspend admission to, or remove from the Centre or any part thereof, any person if, in his opinion, such action is necessary or desirable.

8. If a person shall appear in public and in the opinion of the Centre Director or Attendant, be indecently or insufficiently clad, the Centre Director or Attendant shall direct that person forthwith to resume his or her ordinary clothing and such person shall forthwith comply with that direction.

9. (a) It shall be the duty of the Centre Director or Attendant, who is hereby empowered and directed to refuse admission to or remove, or cause to be removed from the Centre any person who, in the opinion of the Centre Director or Attendant:

(i) is guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws; or

(ii) is by his past, or present conduct within or about the Centre undesirable; or

(iii) is under, or apparently under the influence of alcoholic liquor;

(b) It shall be the duty of the Centre Director or Attendant, who is hereby so empowered and directed, to refuse admission to or remove, or cause to be removed from the swimming pool section any person who, in the opinion of the Centre Director or Attendant:—

- (i) is a child under the age of six (6) years and is unaccompanied by a responsible person over the age of fourteen (14) years; or
- (ii) is apparently suffering from any contagious, infectious, offensive disease or skin complaint.

(c) Any such person shall, upon the request of the Centre Director or Attendant to withdraw from the pool premises, quietly and peaceably, do so immediately.

10. Any person who has been refused admission to the Centre or has been requested to leave the Centre and who feels aggrieved by the action of the Centre Director or an Attendant, may appeal to the Council, by letter addressed to the Shire Clerk, against such action. The Council shall consider the objection and give such direction in the matter as it thinks fit. The right of appeal given by this by-law shall not imply any right of action for damages or other remedy against the Council or Centre Director or an Attendant arising out of such refusal of admission or direction to leave the Centre.

11. A person shall not for profit, teach, coach or train any person in the Centre unless with the prior written approval of the Council. Such approval may be subject to conditions and may be withdrawn by the Council at any time.

12. (a) A person, club organiser or association shall not conduct swimming or diving events, carnivals or competitions in the swimming pool section without the prior written approval of the Council.

(b) The Council may grant such approval subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may, at any time, withdraw such consent.

13. A person, club, association or organisation conducting any carnival or activity at the Centre shall be responsible for the conduct of persons in attendance and shall prevent overcrowding and ensure that no damage is done to the Centre and that these by-laws are observed by persons in attendance.

14. Every person finding, within the Centre, any article which may have been left or lost therein, shall immediately deliver it to the Centre Director or Attendant who shall thereupon register a description of such article and all particulars relating thereto in a book which shall be kept for that purpose, and any person claiming the article, who satisfies the Centre Director or Attendant that he is the lawful owner of the article, shall upon signing a receipt for it, have the article returned to him.

15. All articles left in the Centre and not claimed within a period of three (3) calendar months, shall be disposed of by the Council in any manner acceptable at common law.

16. (a) No male person shall enter any portion of the Centre set apart for females, and no female person shall enter upon any portion of the Centre set apart for males.

(b) No person in the Centre shall, in any way, interfere with any other person therein or with any other person's use thereof nor throw or push, or attempt to throw or push any person into the swimming pool or throw any matter or thing to the annoyance of any person using the Centre.

(c) No person or group of persons shall play any ball games or take any action whatsoever which shall in any way limit the enjoyment of the users of the swimming pool except that this by-law shall not apply to the playing of any games or aquatic sports organised and conducted in the swimming pool section by any Club, association or organisation or other person at such time and in such manner as shall be approved by the Council.

(d) No person liable for the control of an animal shall cause or permit such animal to enter or remain in or about the Centre.

17. No person shall:—

- (a) Obstruct the Centre Director or Attendant in carrying out his duties.
- (b) Enter or depart from any part of the Centre except by means of the respective entrances or exits set apart for that purpose.
- (c) Dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume except in a dressing room enclosure provided for that purpose.
- (d) Appear in public unless properly attired in a costume of such nature as to preserve public decency and to cover the body so as to prevent indecent exposure of the person.
- (e) Enter or be in the Centre while in an intoxicated condition induced by liquor.
- (f) Take into the swimming pool section or have in his possession therein, any intoxicating liquor.
- (g) Use any soap in any part of the swimming pool section.
- (h) Climb up or upon any roof, fence, wall or partition of the Centre.
- (i) In any part of the Centre behave in an unseemly, improper, disorderly, riotous or indecent manner; swear or use any indecent, obscene, offensive or abusive language or misconduct himself or herself.
- (j) Deposit any filth or rubbish in any part of the Centre except in places set aside for that purpose.

- (k) Smoke, consume foodstuffs or drinks in any specific area in which smoking or consumption is prohibited by notice.
- (l) Wastefully use the water or leave any taps dripping in the dressing rooms or elsewhere in the Centre.
- (m) Spit or expectorate in the swimming pool or in any part of the Centre or in any way commit any nuisance on or in any part of such Centre.
- (n) Use any substance or preparation whereby the water of the swimming pool may become discoloured or rendered turbid or otherwise unfit for the proper use of bathers.
- (o) Foul or pollute water in any shower, bath or in the swimming pool, or soil, damage, destroy, use improperly, disfigure or write in or upon any part of the Centre or any furniture or other article of equipment therein.
- (p) Damage, improperly use or interfere with any tap, valve, locker or other fitting or appliance in or about the Centre or bring or deposit any filth or rubbish onto or in the Centre.
- (q) Erect decoration for any function unless attached to the fittings provided in such a manner that damage does/not result.
- (r) Whilst suffering from any contagious or cutaneous disease, or whilst in an unclean condition, enter or use or attempt to enter or use the swimming pool or the Centre or any part thereof.
- (s) Soil or defile or damage any towel or bathing costume.
- (t) Break, damage or destroy any life saving or other equipment or any locker key or any property of the Council. Any person who does permits or suffers to be done any damage in contravention of the by-laws 17 (o), 17 (p) or 17 (q) above shall be liable to pay the cost of all such damages in addition to any penalty imposed by these by-laws.

18. Neither the Council nor the Centre Director or Attendant or officers or employees of the Council shall in any way be responsible for any articles or money lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the Centre or for any articles damaged or destroyed whilst in or about the Centre.

19. A person who infringes any of the provisions of these by-laws or shall attempt any breach thereof may be summarily removed from the Centre or any part thereof by the Centre Director or an Attendant, and if committing a breach of these by-laws, may be arrested by the Centre Director or an Attendant and given into the custody of a police officer.

20. (a) The Centre Director or an Attendant may refuse to admit to the Centre any person who shall have been convicted of a breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws until such time as the Council may decide that such person shall be admitted.

(b) The Council may issue a written direction to the Centre Director that any person named in such direction shall not be admitted to the Centre and whilst such direction remains in force the Centre Director or an Attendant shall not admit such person to the Centre or permit him to be therein and such person shall not, with the knowledge that such direction is in force, enter or attempt to enter the Centre.

21. Any person who shall commit a breach of these by-laws shall be liable to:—

- (a) a maximum penalty of \$100.
- (b) a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$10 per day.

## By-Laws Relating to Signs, Hoardings and Billposting.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 26 June 1981, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following By-laws:

The By-laws of the Shire of Greenough Relating to Signs, Hoardings and Billposting published in the *Government Gazette* on 13 July 1967 and amended in the *Government Gazette* on 10 April 1981, are hereby amended by:—

## 1. Amend By-law 2 by—

(i) inserting after the interpretation of "residential area" the following:

"rural producer sign" means a sign advertising for sale the produce grown on a farm;

(ii) inserting after the interpretation of "sale sign" the following:

"sandwich board sign" means a sign consisting of two sign boards attached to each other end to end by hinges or other means.

2. Amend By-law 3 (2) (c) by deleting the passage "occupation." in line 3 and substituting the passage "occupation; and", and by adding a new sub-by-law designated:

"(d) a sign erected by the Council of the Shire of Greenough on land under the care, control and management of the Council."

## 3. Add after By-law 20 the following By-laws:

## "Rural Producer Signs.

20A. A rural producer sign shall—

- (a) not indicate or display any matter otherwise than for the purpose of advertising the sale of produce grown on the land on which the sign is erected;
- (b) be erected within the boundaries of the land on which the produce offered for sale was grown;
- (c) not exceed 0.6 square metres in area; and
- (d) not be of a height of more than 2 metres from the natural ground level.

## Sandwich Board Signs.

20B. 1. A sandwich board sign shall—

- (a) not exceed 900 mm in height;
- (b) not exceed 0.8 square metres in area on each side;
- (c) not indicate or display any matter other than the name of the owner or occupier of the premises to which it relates and the nature of the business carried on therein;
- (d) contain the word "open"; and
- (e) not contain any letter of a size less than 120 mm.

2. A person shall not erect a sandwich board sign in any position other than adjacent to the building to which the sign relates.

3. A person shall not erect more than one sandwich board sign in relation to the one building.

4. A person who erects a sandwich board sign shall remove it at the close of business each day and shall not erect it again until the commencement of business on the following or a subsequent day."

## 4. Amend By-law 37 by adding after the expression "\$100" in line 2 the following:

"and where the offence is one of a continuing nature, a daily penalty not exceeding \$10."

## DOG ACT 1976-1977.

Shire of Tammin.  
By-laws Relating to Dogs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 16 January 1981, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws relating to Dogs.

## Part I—Preliminary.

1. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires:—

“Act” means the Dog Act 1976-1977.

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Tammin.

“Form” means a form contained in the Second Schedule.

“Schedule” means a schedule to these by-laws.

Expressions used in these by-laws have the meanings given to them by the Act.

2. The by-laws of the Shire of Tammin relating to dogs published in the *Government Gazette* of 28 February 1975, are hereby revoked.

3. Part III of these by-laws—Keeping of Dogs—is applicable only to the Townsite of Tammin.

## Part II—Impounding of Dogs.

4. The poundkeeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such time and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.

5. If the owner, or person apparently acting on behalf of the owner, of a dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog then upon payment of the fees specified in the First Schedule hereto the dog shall be released to such person.

6. If the Council shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner, whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not, the owner shall pay to the Council the fee specified in the First Schedule hereto.

## Part III—Keeping of Dogs.

7. The occupier of premises situated within the Townsite of Tammin shall not, unless the premises are licensed as an approved kennel establishment under Section 27 of the Act, or have been granted exemption pursuant to Section 26 (3) of the Act, keep or permit to be kept on those premises more than two dogs over the age of three months and the young of those dogs under that age.

8. An application for a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in writing and shall be in or substantially in the form of Form 1 of the Second Schedule.

9. A licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in or substantially in the form of Form 2 of the Second Schedule.

10. The fees payable for both the issue and renewal of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment are those specified in the First Schedule.

11. The occupier of any premises which have been licensed by the Council as an approved kennel establishment shall provide kennels and yards sited and maintained in accordance with specifications of a standard not less than the following:—

- (a) Each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto.
- (b) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 10 metres from the boundaries of the land in the occupation of the occupier.
- (c) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 24 metres from any road or street constituting the front boundary or not less than 10 metres from any road or street constituting a side boundary.
- (d) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be any less distance than 20 metres from any dwelling, shop, church, school room, hall or factory.
- (e) The walls shall be constructed of concrete, brick, stone, wood, asbestos, ceelite or galvanised iron.
- (f) The roof shall be constructed of impervious material or other material approved by the Council.
- (g) All external surfaces of galvanised iron, wood or asbestos material shall be painted and kept painted with good quality paint.
- (h) The lowest internal height shall be at least 1.8 metres from the floor.
- (i) Each yard shall be securely fenced and kept securely fenced with a fence not less than 1.8 metres in height constructed of galvanised iron, wood, galvanised link mesh, netting or other material approved by the Council.
- (j) All gates shall be provided with proper catches or means of fastening.
- (k) The upper surfaces of the floor of each kennel shall be set at least 100 mm above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a smooth surface and have a fall of not less than 1 in 100; the entire yard shall be surrounded by a drain which shall be properly laid, ventilated and trapped; all floor washings shall pass through the drain and shall be disposed for in accordance with the health requirements of the Council.

## LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960-1981.

The Municipality of the Shire of Waroona.

## By-laws Relating to Control and Management of Halls.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 20 November 1980, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws:—

1. The existing By-laws relating to the Control and Management of Halls which were published in the *Government Gazette* on 14 March 1980 are hereby revoked.
2. In these By-laws:—
  - “Hall” means any hall or halls or any part or portion thereof which is or are on land vested in or under the care control or management of Council.
  - “Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Waroona.
  - “Hall Committee” means a committee of management appointed by the Council to manage a hall.
  - “Clerk” means the Shire Clerk of the Shire of Waroona or any person from time to time acting in his place.
3. Council may appoint a hall committee to manage and control any hall within the Shire.
4. Application for the hire of a hall or any portion thereof or equipment or property under the control of the Council shall be made to the respective hall committee not less than 24 hours before the hour at which hiring is desired. Where there is no hall committee in respect of a hall, application shall be made to Council.
5. Council or a hall committee may at any time cancel the hiring of a hall or any part thereof.
6. In the event of two or more applications being received for the hire of any hall for the same time and date Council or the hall committee may without considering priority of application determine to which applicant the hall hiring shall be granted.
7. Subject to the provisions of the Liquor Act no spiritous liquors wine ale or spirits shall be brought into or consumed at any hall except when permitted in writing by Council or the hall committee.
8. No plant furniture fittings and other contents of any kind shall be hired loaned or removed from a hall without permission in writing from Council or a hall committee.
9. No person shall erect any internal or external decoration or place cause or allow to be placed any nails or screws in any part of a hall except with prior permission in writing of Council or the hall committee which permission shall be conditional upon the removal of all such decoration nails and screws by 10.00 a.m. on the day following the hiring.
10. No person shall enter or remain upon or be permitted to enter or remain upon a hall or part thereof while intoxicated.



11. Any person who uses any profane or improper language in a hall or who damages or marks or defaces or permits to be damaged marked or defaced a hall commits an offence. Any damage mark or defacement may be repaired by Council or the hall committee and the cost thereof recovered by Council from the hirer or any other person responsible in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

12. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons or anything deemed likely to produce disturbances riot or breaches of the peace shall be permitted within a hall.

13. The hirer of a hall or any part thereof shall keep and maintain good order and behaviour and shall be personally responsible for compliance with these by-laws.

14. Food shall not be served or consumed in a hall without the permission in writing of Council or the hall committee being first obtained.

15. Officers of Council and other persons, authorised by Council or the hall committee may enter a hall or part thereof at any time.

16. Photographs shall not be taken in a hall without the permission of the hirer. Films of above 16 mm in size shall not be shown in a hall without the permission in writing of Council or the hall committee being first obtained.

17. The hirer of a hall shall indemnify Council and the hall committee from any claim for breach of copyright arising out of music played by the hirer or other persons within a hall during that hiring.

18. Council or a hall committee shall not accept bookings of a hall more than 12 months in advance.

19. Any person who does permits or suffers an act or matter or thing contrary to any of the By-laws or commits or permits any breach or neglects compliance therewith commits an offence against these By-laws and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$200.00 for every such offence.

- (b) to any person other than the holder of a milk vendor licence or a milk distributor licence,
- except under the authority of a milk wholesaler licence in Form DD for each district in which the milk is to be retailed, issued by the Authority permitting him to do so. ”

 “ persons to whom a milk vendor or milk distributor may deliver milk within an area or district, the vendor or distributor ” ; and  
 (ii) by deleting “, shop or customer”; and  
 (h) in subregulation (11)—  
 (i) by deleting “(vehicle)” and substituting the following—  
 “ licence or milk distributor ” ; and  
 (ii) by inserting after “sold” the following—  
 “ or distributed ” .

An order may issue in the absence of the registered holder, but should he desire to object to such order he must, before the date mentioned, lodge at the Warden's Office an objection containing the grounds of such objection, and, on the date mentioned, the Warden will proceed to hear and determine the same, in accordance with the evidence then submitted.
