In this Order "practicable" means reasonably practicable having regard, among other things, to local conditions and circumstances, to the current state of technical knowledge and to the financial implications, and "practical means" include the design, installation, maintenance and manner of operation of plant and machinery, and the design, construction and maintenance of acoustic screens and structures and acoustic damping techniques applies to the piling; provided that the test of "practicable means" and the application of any limitation as to the times at which operations are carried out are applied only so far as compatible with any duty imposed by law and only so far as compatible with safety and safe working conditions, and with the exigencies of any emergency or unforeseeable circumstances.

Holding of over 3 500 m²—the number of horses to be kept at the discretion of Council.

(v) Notwithstanding the provisions of by-law 3 (iii) the Council may declare certain areas as areas where stables cannot be located and registered. Such areas are defined by Schedule "A" of these by-laws.

By-law 4. Amend by adding the words "or paddock" after the word stable in line two.

By-law 6. Amend by adding the words "or paddock" after the word stable in line one and five.

By-law 8. Amend by adding the words "or paddock" after the word stable in line four.

By-law 9. Amend by adding the words "or paddock" after the word stable in line five.

Delete By-law 10 and substitute the following:-

- 10. For every such registration and for every renewal thereof shall be paid to the Council by the person for whom the registration is made the sum of \$5.00.
- Add a new by-law 13 and renumber the present 13 and 14 to 14 and 15.
- 13. Any paddock registered by Council for the keeping of horses shall be suitably fenced and shall be kept in such a state as to prevent any nuisance arising.



1. These regulations may be cited as the Local Government Electoral Regulations 1981.

 - (a) Local Government (Absent Voting) Regulations, published in the Government Gazette on 25 March 1970;
 - (b) Local Government (Electoral Officers' Fees) Regulations 1975 published in the Government Gazette on 14 February 1975;
 - (c) Local Government Polls Regulations 1961, published in the Government Gazette on 22 June 1961; and
 - (d) Prescribed forms numbered 32 to 38 published in the Government Gazette on 14 July 1961 and form number 41 so published on 15 April 1965.

3. The forms set out in the Schedule to these regulations are required by Part IV of the Act to be prescribed in respect of the matters specified

Maximum fee for copies of rolls.

The maximum fee prescribed for the purposes of section 58 is \$10.00 for each copy.

- 5. In accordance with section 138 (2) the Minister shall cause notice—

- (3) At any poll each person entitled to vote shall only be entitled to cast the number of votes that he would, under section 94, be entitled to cast if the poll were an election.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960-1981.

The Municipality of the City of Melville.

By-Laws Relating to Use of Public Jetties.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the above mentioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the above mentioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 10 February 1981 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following By-Laws:-

Definition.

- 1. These By-laws shall be cited as the City of Melville By-Laws relating to the Use of Public Jetties.
 - In these By-Laws unless the context otherwise requires—
 - "Authorised Officer" means an Officer of the Council authorised by the Council to perform duties in accordance with these By-Laws.
 - "Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the City of Melville.
 - "Jetty" means any Jetty, pier, wharf or landing place, whether in or adjacent to a river, and under the Care, Control and Management of the Council.
 - "Owner" means that person who is the lawful owner or that person legally entitled to possession of any Vessel, vehicle, cargo, property or Chattel. "Town Clerk" means the Town Clerk of the City of Melville. "Vessel" includes any ship or boat, or any other description of vessel used in

 - navigation.

Application.

3. These By-Laws apply in relation to all persons in on or about a Jetty, and to all persons in on or using navigable waters in or about the Raffles Jetty, specified in the first schedule of these By-Laws.

Use of Jetties.

- 4. No person shall-
 - (a) land at, use or enter a Jetty except in accordance with these By-Laws.
 - (b) land at, use or enter a Jetty which is under construction or under repair, or is closed under section 6 of the Jetties Act 1926 unless such person is engaged in the construction or repair of that Jetty, and then only with the written consent of the Town Clerk.
 - (c) use a Jetty for any purpose other than that for which the Jetty is designated.

Moored Vessels to Jetties.

5. Subject to the provisions of these by-Laws, no person in control of a Vessel shall moor or make fast any Vessel to a Jetty, or any part thereof except to such mooring piles, ring bolts or other fastenings as are provided and no person in control of a Vessel shall permit a Vessel to remain alongside a Jetty unless such Vessel is so moored or fastened.

Vehicles on Jetties.

- 6. No person shall—
 - (a) drive or allow a vehicle to remain on a Jetty without written permission of the Town Clerk.
 - (b) ride or permit to remain on a Jetty any bicycle.

Fishing from Jetties.

- 7. No person shall-
- (a) fish from any Jetty so as to obstruct or interfere with the free movement of a Vessel approaching or leaving the Jetty or so as to cause a nuisance on the Jetty.
 - (b) hang or spread a fishing net from on or over any part of a Jetty.

Nuisance on Jetties.

- 8. No person shall—
 - (a) without the written consent of the Town Clerk offer goods for sale on a Jetty;
 - (b) by any means tout or solicit anyone to proceed as a passenger on any Vessel or vehicle;
 - (c) without the written consent of the Town Clerk display any sign or advertisement or use any loud speaking device on a Jetty;
 - (d) conduct himself so as to interfere with free movement of persons entering upon or leaving a Jetty.

Material not to be Removed.

9. No person shall remove or cause to be removed from a Jetty or from the approaches thereto any gravel, stone, timber, trees, shrubs, grasses or other material without the written permission of the Town Clerk.

Damage to Jetties.

10. Where damage is caused to a Jetty by a Vessel or a vehicle the Council may repair such damage and the costs of such repair shall be a debt due to the Council and payable by the person responsible for the control of such Vessel or vehicle and such debt may be recovered in a Court of Competent Jurisdiction.

Cargo or Property on Jetties.

- 11. No person shall store or place on a Jetty any property intended for shipment on to a Vessel unless and until the Vessel is alongside the Jetty, and such property shall be removed from the Jetty as soon as practicable after being placed thereon.
- 12. Any person unloading property from a Vessel on to a Jetty shall cause it to be removed from the Jetty as soon as practicable or upon demand by an Authorised Officer and in any event not later than 6.00 p.m. on the day on which it was so placed.
- 13. An Authorised Officer may direct the removal of property which remains on a Jetty contrary to these By-Laws and the cost of removal and of any subsequent storage of the property shall be a debt to the Council by the Owner of the property and such debt may be recovered by action in a Court of Competent Jurisdiction.

Bulk Cargoes on Jetties.

- 14. No person shall tip or deposit bulk cargo from a vehicle or Vessel on to a Jetty: Provided that this By-Law shall not apply to the tipping or depositing of sand, stone, gravel, soil or manure which is tipped or deposited by permission, in writing, of the Town Clerk.
- 15. No person shall tip or deposit onto a Jetty any property or thing so as to cause damage to a Jetty or to pollute the surrounding area.

Vessels not to Remain at Jetties.

- 16. A person in control of a Vessel shall remove the Vessel fastened to or alongside a Jetty forthwith when so ordered by an Authorised Officer.
- 17. Subject to By-Laws 16, 20 and 26 of these By-Laws, no person in control of a Vessel shall permit the Vessel to remain fastened to or alongside any Jetty unless the embarking or disembarking of passengers or the loading or unloading of cargo is in progress.
- 18. No person in control of a Vessel shall permit a Vessel to load or discharge cargo or come alongside or be fastened to any Jetty until such cargo is ready to be loaded or discharged, as the case may be.
- 19. Except with the written permission of the Town Clerk, no person in control of a Vessel shall permit it to remain alongside a Jetty for the purpose of loading or discharging cargo between 6.00 p.m. and 6.00 a.m. the next day.
- 20. The Owner or person in control of a Vessel moored at a Jetty in accordance with these By-Laws, and requiring to so remain for a period in excess of four hours, shall obtain written permission from the Town Clerk and shall be charged a fee as specified in the second schedule hereto. In the event of permission having been granted the duration shall not exceed seven days.

Obstruction of Jetties or Officer.

21. No person shall cause to obstruct, or place, or cause to be placed on a Jetty any obstruction, without the written permission of the Town Clerk.

- 22. No person shall obstruct or hinder any representative, officer or workman engaged in constructing, repairing, adding to, or working on any Jetty, or any Authorised Officer engaged in enforcing these By-Laws.
- 23. No person shall cause any obstruction on or to any public steps or landing place for passengers on or at a Jetty or impede the free passage of other persons on or along such steps or places.

General.

- 24. No person shall on any Jetty-
 - (a) except in a receptacle provided for that purpose, deposit any litter;
 - (b) light, place or keep a fire upon or so near as to endanger any jetty;
 - (c) throw, or impel any stone, or other missile onto or therefrom, except for the express purpose of fishing;
 - (d) permit an animal to remain thereon;
 - (e) be in a state of intoxication or in possession of any intoxicating substance unless such intoxicating substance is cargo or medical supply carried for lawful purpose;
 - (f) do anything which may destroy, damage or deface a Jetty or any part thereof;
 - (g) behave in a disorderly manner, or create or take part in any disturbance or use any foul or indecent language or commit any act of indecency;
 - (h) throw, place or deposit any offensive, noxious or dangerous substances from, or near or onto a Jetty; or
 - (i) post, stick, paint or write or cause to be posted, stuck, painted or writter any placard, bill, advertisement, sign or other matter.
- 25. No person shall launch or permit the launching of a Vessel from or over any Jetty before receiving the written consent of the Town Clerk and paying to the Council a fee as specified in the second schedule hereto provided that no consent shall be given to launch or permit the launching of a Vessel in excess of 8 tonnes gross from or over a Jetty.
- 26. No person shall moor a Vessel to a Jetty for the purpose of effecting repairs to the Vessel, other than a Vessel in distress and then only to effect the minimum repairs necessary to enable the Vessel to be moved elsewhere.
- 27. No person shall moor a Vessel to a Jetty for the purpose of effecting maintenance to that or any other Vessel.
- 28. Every person who by any act or omission fails in any respect to observe, perform, or comply with any provisions or requirement of any of the foregoing By-Laws commits an offence against these By-Laws and shall on conviction be liable—

The Municipality of the City of Stirling.

By-laws Relating to Part IV-Officers and Employees.

IN pursunace of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 7 July 1981 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws: The by-laws of the City of Stirling published in the Government Gazette of 12 May 1971 and amended from time to time are hereby amended in the following manner:

By-laws 166 to 183, the headings preceding By-law 197, and By-laws 197 to 240 are revoked and re-enacted in the following amended form:

- 166. Subject to the Act the appointment and dismissal of the following officers shall be by the Council—
 - (a) The Town Clerk
 - (b) The Assistant Town Clerk
 - (c) The Director of City Planning and City Planner
 - (d) The Director of Technical Services and City Engineer
 - (e) The Director of Finance and City Treasurer
 - (f) The Director of Community Services
 - (g) The Superintendent of Parks
 - (h) The Chief Health Surveyor (subject also to the requirements of the Health Act)
 - (i) The Building Surveyor
 - (j) The Principal Librarian
 - (k) The Executive Secretary to the Mayor
 - (1) All other officers and employees whom the Act requires to be appointed and dismissed by the Council.
- 167. The Town Clerk has power to appoint and dismiss all employees other than those mentioned in By-law 166, subject to such directions as may from time to time be given by the Council, and subject to permanent appointments being within the limits of the establishment approved by Council.
- 168. All appointments and dismissals not made by Council shall be reported to the Finance and Administration Committee of the Council.
 - 169. All appointments are probationary for a period of three months.
- 170. The Mayor may suspend an officer referred to in By-law 166 other than the Town Clerk if in the opinion of the Mayor such officer has been guilty of misconduct justifying immediate dismissal. Any suspension so made shall be considered by the Council at its next meeting.

The Town Clerk.

171. The Town Clerk is responsible for the execution and carrying into effect of the resolutions, decisions and polices of the Council and the administration of the Municipality, except to the extent that this Act or another Act require that any particular act, matter or thing be undertaken, carried out, executed or done by another Officer of the Council.

- 172. The Town Clerk may, and if directed by Council shall, delegate specific authority to an officer or such officers as the Town Clerk appoints, or Council resolves and the authority delegated shall be stated in the Policy Manual.
- 173. Subject to any direction which may from time to time be given by the Council, the duties of all employees are those as may from time to time be specified and approved by the Town Clerk.

Absence of the Town Clerk.

- 174. (1) The Council may appoint a person to be Acting Town Clerk to undertake the duties of the Town Clerk during the absence of the Town Clerk at any time during the period of the appointment of the Acting Town Clerk.
- (2) The appointment of a person as Acting Town Clerk pursuant to sub-bylaw (1) hereof remains in force until:—
 - (a) the date of the next meeting of the Council at which the Mayor and Deputy Mayor are elected and Committees are appointed;
 - (b) it is rescinded by the Council;
 - (c) the date upon which the person so appointed resigns as an officer or his employment is otherwise terminated;
- (d) the date of expiration of the period of the appointment if any, specified in the resolution appointing that person; whichever first occurs.

- 2. Deleting from sub-bylaw (1) of by-law 11 the words "or falling into a bad state of repair".
- 3. Deleting from by-law 12 the phrase "a fence which is dangerous or in bad condition and repair," and inserting in lieu thereof the words "a dangerous fence".

The Municipality of the Shire of Kalamunda.

By-laws Relating to Parking Facilities.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 22 September 1980 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:-

- 1. These By-laws may be cited as the Shire of Kalamunda By-laws Relating to Parking Facilities.
- The By-laws of the Shire of Kalamunda Relating to Parking Facilities published in the Government Gazette of the 10th day of December, 1976 and amended on the 30th day of March 1979; and the By-laws of the Shire of Kalamunda Relating to Parking of Vehicles on Street Verges published in the Government Gazette on 14 July 1978 and amended on the 28th day of September 1979 are hereby revoked.
- In these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the following terms have the meanings set against them hereunder respectively:—
 "Built-up area" means the territory contiguous to and including any road—

- (a) on which there is provision for lighting by means of street lamps; or (b) which is built up with structures devoted to business, industry, or
- dwelling houses at intervals of less than 100 metres for a distance of one half kilometre or more;
- "Bus" means an omnibus within the meaning of the First Schedule to the Traffic Act;
- "By-law" means one of these by-laws; and "these by-laws" means the By-laws Relating to Parking Facilities;
- "Carriageway" means a portion of a road that is improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular traffic; and includes the shoulders and areas, including embayments at the side or centre of the carriageway, used for the standing or parking of vehicles; and where a road has two or more of those portions divided by a median strip, the expression means each of those portions, separately;
- "Commercial Vehicle" means a vehicle which comes within the description of a motor wagon as set out in the First Schedule to the Traffic Act;
- "Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Kalamunda;

"Driver" means any person driving or in control of a vehicle;

"Footway" includes every footpath, lane, or other place intended for the use of pedestrians only, or habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicles;

"Form" means a form in the Third Schedule to these by-laws;

- "Inspector" means a parking inspector appointed by the Council under these by-laws and includes a chief parking inspector and an assistant parking inspector;
- "Municipality" means the Municipality of the Shire of Kalamunda;
- "No Parking Area" means a portion of a carriageway that lies-
 - (a) Between two consecutive white signs inscribed with the words, "No Parking", in red lettering, and each with an arrow pointing generally towards the other of them; or
 - (b) Between a white sign inscribed with the words, "No Standing" in red lettering, and a dead end or an area in which standing is prohibited and that lies in the general direction indicated by an arrow inscribed on the sign;
- "No Standing Area" means a portion of a carriageway that lies-
 - (a) Between two consecutive white signs inscribed with the words, "No Standing", in red lettering, and each with an arrow pointing generally towards the other of them; or
 - (b) Between a white sign inscribed with the words, "No Standing" in red lettering, and a dead end or an area in which standing is prohibited and that lies in the general direction indicated by an arrow inscribed on the sign:
- "Notice" means a notice in the form of Form No. 1 or Form No. 2 issued pursuant to by-law 35;
- "Owner" in relation to a vehicle, means the person who is the holder of the requisite vehicle license under the Traffic Act in respect of the vehicle, or, if the vehicle is not licensed under that Act, the person who owns the vehicle or is entitled to the possession of the vehicle;
- "Park" means to permit a vehicle, whether attended or not, to remain stationary; except for the purpose of avoiding conflict with other traffic, of complying with provisions of any law, or of immediately taking up or setting down persons or goods; and "parking" has a correlative meaning;
- "Parking Area" means a portion of a carriageway that-
 - (a) Lies between two consecutive white signs inscribed with the word, "Parking", in green lettering, and each with an arrow pointing generally towards the other of them; or
 - (b) Extends, from a white sign inscribed with the word "Parking", in green lettering, in the general direction indicated by an arrow inscribed on the sign, to any other sign inscribed with the words, "No Parking", or "No Standing", in red lettering, or to a dead end or an area in which the parking or standing of vehicles is prohibited;

"Parking Facilities" includes land, buildings, shelters, parking stalls and other facilities open to the public generally for the parking of vehicles with or without charge, and signs, notices, and facilities used in connection therewith;

"Parking Region" means that portion of the district of the Municipality that is constituted a parking region pursuant to these by-laws;

"Parking Stall" means a section or part of a street, or of a parking station, which is marked or defined by painted lines or by metallic studs or by similar devices for the purpose of indicating where a vehicle may stand or be parked whether on payment of a fee or charge or otherwise;

"Parking Station" means any land, building or other structure provided for the purpose of accommodating vehicles with or without charge but does not include a private garage;

"Property Line" means the boundary between the land comprising a street and the land that abuts thereon;

"Road" means any highway, road, street, lane, thoroughfare, or similar place open to, or used by the public and includes every carriageway, footway, reservation, median strip, traffic island, or similar place thereon which is within the parking region;

"Schedule" means a schedule to these by-laws;

"Stand", in relation to a vehicle, means to stop the vehicle and permit it to remain stationary, except for the purpose of avoiding conflict with other traffic or of complying with the provisions of any law; and "standing" has a correlative meaning;

"Street" has the same meaning as road;

"Taxi" means a taxi-car within the meaning of section 5 of the Traffic Act;

"The Act" means the Local Government Act 1960 (as amended);

"Traffic Act" means the Road Traffic Act (1974) (as amended);

"Vehicle" means every means of conveyance not being a train, vessel or aircraft, and every object capable of being propelled or drawn, on wheels or tracks, by any means, and where the context permits, an animal being driven or ridden:

- 4. (1) These by-laws apply to the parking region and all parking stations, and parking facilities in the parking region other than a parking facility or parking station that—
 - (a) is not under the ownership, control, or management of the Council; or
 - (b) is owned by the Council but is leased to another person

(2) Any sign that—

- (a) was erected by the Commissioner of Main Roads within the Municipality prior to the coming into operation of these by-laws; and
- (b) relates to the parking or standing of vehicles within the parking region, shall be deemed, for the purposes of these by-laws, to have been erected by the Council under the authority of these by-laws.
 - 5. For the purposes of these by-laws vehicles are divided into classes as follows;
 - (a) Buses
 - (b) Commercial vehicles
 - (c) Motor bicycles and bicycles
 - (d) Taxis
 - (e) All other vehicles not otherwise classified.
- 6. Where under these by-laws the standing or parking of vehicles in a street is controlled by a sign, that sign shall be read as applying to the part of the street which—
 - (a) Lies beyond the sign;
 - (b) Lies between the sign and the next sign beyond that sign; and
 - (c) Is that side of the carriageway of the street nearest to the sign.
- 7. The portion of the district of the Municipality that is defined in the First Schedule is hereby constituted as a parking region to which these by-laws shall apply.

Parking Stalls and Parking Stations.

- 8. (1) Subject to these by-laws, to subsection (3) of Section 231 of The Act, and to any regulations for the time being in force under the Traffic Act, the Council may constitute, determine, and vary, and also indicate by signs, from time to time—
 - (a) Parking stalls;
 - (b) Parking stations;
 - (c) Permitted times and conditions of parking in parking stalls and parking stations depending on and varying with locality;
 - (d) Permitted classes of vehicles to park in parking stalls and parking stations;
 - (e) The manner of parking in parking stalls and parking stations.
- (2) No person shall stand a vehicle in a parking stall in a street otherwise than parallel to the kerb and as close thereto as practicable and wholly within such stall and headed in the direction of the movement of traffic on the side of the street on which the stall is situated, provided that where a parking stall is set out otherwise than parallel to the kerb the provisions of this by-law other than the provision that a vehicle shall stand wholly within such space, shall not apply.

- 9. Subject to by-law 11-
 - (a) A person sall not park a vehicle or permit a vehicle to remain parked in any of the parking stations specified in the Second Schedule between the hours specified in that Schedule unless—
 - (i) In the case of a parking station having an inspector on duty, the appropriate fee is paid when demanded;
 - (ii) In the case of a parking station equipped with meters, the appropriate fee is inserted in the meter; or
 - (iii) In the case of a parking station equipped with a ticket issuing machine, the appropriate fee is inserted in the machine; and
 - (b) A person shall not park a vehicle or permit a vehicle to remain parked in any of the parking stations specified in the Second Schedule if the parking station is in that Schedule declared to be set aside for vehicles of a different class.
- (1) No person shall insert or cause to be inserted or attempt to insert into the coin slot of a ticket issuing machine anything other than the prescribed coin or coins.
- (2) For the purpose of this by-law the following coins and none other shall be prescribed coins, namely:—

Five cents (5c), ten cents (10c), and twenty cents (20c).

- (3) The insertion of a prescribed coin or coins into any ticket issuing machine shall be effected only in accordance with the instructions printed on that particular machine.
- 11. The Council may by resolution declare that the provisions of by-law 12 do not apply during periods on particular days specified in such resolution.
- 12. No person shall permit a vehicle to remain parked in a parking station after the expiration of the period for which the prescribed fee has been paid and during a period for which a fee is prescribed.
- 13. No person shall remove a vehicle which has been parked in a parking station until there has been paid the fee appropriate to the period for which the vehicle has been parked.
- 14. A person paying a fee at a parking station shall be entitled to receive a receipt showing the period of parking covered by such payment.
- 15. A driver of a vehicle in a parking station which is equipped with a ticket issuing machine shall on purchasing from the machine a ticket or tickets for a period or periods of parking, place such ticket or tickets inside his vehicle in such a position that the time of issue printed on the ticket or tickets by the machine shall be clearly visible and legible to an inspector examining the ticket or tickets from outside the vehicle.
- 16. A driver of a vehicle in a parking station not equipped with meters shall, on demand, produce to an inspector a receipt showing that the appropriate parking fee has been paid in respect of that vehicle.
- 17. Unless otherwise directed by an inspector, no person shall park a vehicle in a parking station otherwise than wholly within a parking stall.
- 18. No person shall stand a vehicle so as to obstruct an entrance to, an exit from, or a roadway within, a parking station or beyond the limts of any defined row within a parking station.
- 19. No person shall stand a vehicle except with the permission of the Council or an inspector on any part of a parking station, whether or not such part be marked as a parking stall, if a sign is exhibited prohibiting the standing of vehicles thereon.
- 20. No person shall permit a vehicle to stand on any part of a parking station, whether or not that part is marked as a parking stall, if an inspector directs the driver of such vehicle to move the vehicle.
- 21. No person shall stand or attempt to stand a vehicle in a parking stall in which another vehicle is standing.
- 22. (1) No person shall permit a vehicle to stand in a parking stall which is at the time set aside for use by commercial vehicles unless—
 - (a) The vehicle is a commercial vehicle; and
 - (b) Some person is actively engaged in loading or unloading goods to or from the vehicle;

and in any case, for more than a period of thirty minutes.

- (2) In this by-law "goods" means an article or collection of articles, weighing at least fourteen kilograms of which the content is at least 0.2 cubic metres.
- (3) A parking stall is set aside for use by commercial vehicles if there is a sign thereon or adjacent thereto marked "Loading Zone".

Standing and Parking Generally.

- 23. The Council may, subject to these by-laws constitute, determine, and vary and also indicate by signs, from time to time, prohibitions, regulations and restrictions of parking and standing of vehicles of a specified class or of specified classes in all streets or specified streets or in specified parts of streets in the parking region at all times or at specified times.
- 24. (1) A person shall not stand a vehicle in a parking stall, whether that parking stall is situated in a parking station or in a street, if that parking stall is by any sign thereon or adjacent or referable thereto—
 - (a) set apart for the standing of vehicles of a different class;

- (b) if by such a sign the standing of vehicles in that parking stall is prohibited or restricted during any period or periods, during such a period or periods; or
- (c) if by such a sign the standing of vehicles in that parking stall is permitted for a specified time, for longer than that time.
- (2) A person shall not stand a vehicle--
 - (a) In a no standing area;
 - (b) In a parking area, except in a manner indicated by the inscription on the sign or signs, associated with the parking area and where the parking area includes parking stalls, except as in these by-laws provided, with reference to such parking stall;
 - (c) In a parking area contrary to any limitation in respect of time, days, periods of the day classes of persons, or classes of vehicles indicated by the inscription on the sign or signs associated with the area; or
 - (d) In a defined area marked "M/C" unless it is a motor bicycle without a side-car, or bicycle.
- (3) A person shall not stand a vehicle in a loading zone unless it is-
 - (a) A commercial vehicle engaged in the picking up or setting down of goods; or
 - (b) A motor vehicle taking up or setting down passengers; and then only if it does not have a trailer attached.
- (4) A person shall not park a vehicle-
 - (a) in a no parking area.
 - (b) If that vehicle, or any combination of vehicles that together with any projection on or load carried by the vehicle or combination of vehicles, is more than 8 (eight) metres in length, on a carriageway, in a built-up area for any period of time exceeding 1 (one) hour.
- (5) A person shall not park a vehicle on any portion of a street-
 - (a) for the purpose of effecting repairs to it, other than the minimum repairs necessary to enable the vehicle to be moved to a place other than a road.
 - (b) If the vehicle is exposed for sale.
 - (c) To service that vehicle.
 - (d) If that vehicle is unlicensed.
- 25. Subject to the provisions of by-law 24, a person standing a vehicle on a carriageway shall stand it—
 - (a) On a two-way carriageway, so that it is as near as practicable to, and parallel with, the left boundary of the carriageway and headed in the direction of the movement of traffic on the side of the road on which the vehicle is standing;
 - (b) On a one-way carriageway, so that it is as near as practicable to, and parallel with, either boundary of the carriageway and headed in the direction of the movement of traffic on the side of the road on which the vehicle is standing;
 - (c) So that it is not less than 1.2 (one point two) metres from any other vehicle, except a motor bicycle or a bicycle parked in accordance with these by-laws;
 - (d) So that at least 3 (three) metres of the width of the carriageway between the vehicle and the farther boundary of the carriageway, or between it and a vehicle standing on the far side of the carriageway, is available for the passage of other vehicles;
 - (e) So that it does not cause undue obstruction on the carriageway; and
 - (f) So that it is entirely within the confines of any parking stall marked on the carriageway.
- 26. (1) A person shall not stand a vehicle partly within and partly outside a parking area.
- (2) Where the traffic sign or signs, associated with a parking area are not inscribed with the words "Angle Parking", then—
 - (a) Where the parking area is adjacent to the boundary of a carriageway a person standing a vehicle in the parking area shall stand it as near as practicable to, and parallel with, that boundary; and
 - (b) Where the parking area is at or near the centre of the carriageway, a person standing a vehicle in that parking area shall stand it approximately at right angles to the centre of the carriageway, unless a sign associated with the parking area indicates, or marks on the carriageway indicate, that vehicles are to stand in a different position.
- (3) Where a traffic sign associated with a parking area is inscribed with the words "Angle Parking" a person standing a vehicle in the parking area shall stand the vehicle at an angle of approximately 45 degrees to the centre of the carriageway, unless otherwise indicated by the inscription on the parking sign or by marks on the carriageway surface.
- (4) Sub-bylaw (3) of this by-law does not apply to a person standing a motor bicycle or a bicycle in a parking area.
- 27. (1) A person shall not stand a vehicle so that any portion of the vehicle is-
 - (a) Between any other standing vehicle and the centre of the carriageway;
 - (b) Adjacent to a median strip;
 - (c) In front of a right-of-way, passage, or private drive or so close thereto as to deny any vehicle reasonable access to, or egress from, the right-of-way, passage, or private drive;

- (d) In front of a footway constructed across a reservation;
- (e) Alongside, or opposite, any excavation in, or obstruction, on, the carriageway, if the vehicle would thereby obstruct traffic;
- (f) On, or within 9 (nine) metres of any portion of a carriageway bounded on one or both sides by a traffic island;
- (g) On any footway or pedestrian crossing;
- (h) Upon a bridge or other elevated structure or within a tunnel or underpass;
- (i) Between the boundaries of a carriageway and any double longitudinal line consisting of two continuous lines or between a double longitudinal line consisting of a continuous line and a broken or dotted line and the boundary of the carriageway near to the continuous line, unless there is a distance of at least 3 (three) metres clear between the vehicle and the double longitudinal line; or
- (j) Upon an intersection, except adjacent to a carriageway boundary that is not broken by an intersecting carriageway.
- (2) The provisions of paragraph (c), (f), and (h) of sub-bylaw (1) of this by-law do not apply to a vehicle that stands in a bus stand marked on the carriageway, for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers.
 - (3) A person shall not stand a vehicle so that any portion of the vehicle is—
 - (a) Within 1 (one) metre of a fire hydrant or fire plug, or of any sign or mark indicating the existence of a fire hydrant or fire plug; or
 - (b) Within 3 (three) metres of a public letter pillar box, unless the vehicle is being used for the purpose of collecting postal articles from the pillar box.
- (4) A person shall not stand a vehicle so that any portion of the vehicle is within 6 (six) metres of the nearer property line of any road intersecting the road on the side on which the vehicle is standing.
- (5) A person shall not stand a vehicle so that any portion of the vehicle is within 9 (nine) metres of the departure side of—
 - (a) A sign inscribed with the words "Bus Stop", or "Hail Bus Here", unless the vehicle is a bus stopped to take up or set down passengers; or
 - (b) A children's crossing established on a two-way carriageway.
- (6) A person shall not stand a vehicle so that any portion of the vehicle is within 18 (eighteen) metres of—
 - (a) The approach side of a sign inscribed with the words "Bus Stop" or "Hail Bus Here", unless the vehicle is a bus stopped to take up or set down passengers;
 - (b) The approach side of a pedestrian crossing or children's crossing; or
 - (c) The nearest rail of a railway level crossing.
- (7) The provisions of sub-bylaws (1) to (6) (inclusive) of this by-law do not apply to a vehicle standing in a parking stall established by the Council, nor to a bicycle standing in a bicycle rack established by the Council.
- (8) A person shall not park a commercial vehicle or trailer or caravan so that any portion of that commercial vehicle or trailer or caravan is between the edge of the carriageway and the street alignment nearest to that edge unless—
 - (a) He is the occupier of the land abutting on the street alignment nearest to that edge; or
 - (b) He proves that he has the consent of such occupier.
- (9) Where a commercial vehicle or trailer or caravan has been parked so that any portion of that commercial vehicle or trailer or caravan is between the edge of the carriageway and the street alignment nearest that edge—
 - (a) It shall not be parked for a period of time exceeding 2 (two) consecutive hours.
 - (b) It shall not be moved to any other position within 50 (fifty) metres of the first mentioned place.
- (10) The provisions of sub-bylaws (8) and (9) of this by-law do not apply to the class of motor vehicles known by the trade name "Station Sedan" or "Station Wagon".
- (11) (a) Council may set aside a public reserve, or a portion of a public reserve upon which a person may drive or bring, park, or stand a vehicle.
- (b) A person shall not drive or bring, park, or stand a vehicle on any reserve or part thereof that has not been set aside for that purpose pursuant to paragraph (a) of sub-bylaw 11 of this by-law.
- 28. A person shall not permit a vehicle to stand in any part of a street if an inspector or a member of the Police Force of Western Australia directs the driver of such vehicle to move it.
- 29. An inspector may mark the tyres of a parked vehicle with chalk or any other non-indelible substance for any purpose connected with or arising out of his duties and powers and no person shall remove a mark made by an inspector so that the purpose of affixing of such mark is defeated or likely to be defeated.
- 30. Where a vehicle has been parked in a street in an area where by any sign the standing of vehicles is permitted for a limited time, a person shall not—
 - . (a) Move it to any position within the same parking area; or
 - (b) By arrangement with any person either exchange the space used by the vehicle for space in the same or another area previously occupied by another vehicle,

so that the total time for which that first mentioned vehicle is parked within that parking area exceeds the maximum time allowed for parking in the space first occupied by that first mentioned vehicle.

31. The Council may:-

- (a) Permit a person who requires the use of a parking space for a longer period or periods than prescribed as the maximum period for which the space is to be used in order to carry out urgent and/or essential works, to use that space for such a longer period or periods; and
- (b) Prohibit the standing of any other vehicle in that space during the period or periods in which the space is set aside pursuant to paragraph (a) of this by-law.

Miscellaneous.

- 32. Every inspector shall be furnished with a certificate of his appointment in a form as may be determined from time to time by the Council.
- 33. A person who is not an inspector shall not in any way assume the duties of an inspector.
- 34. No person shall in any way obstruct or hinder an inspector in the execution of his duty.
- 35. (1) A notice served under subsection (2) of Section 669C of The Act in respect of an offence alleged to have been committed against one of these by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 1.
- (2) Subject to sub-bylaw (3) of this by-law an Infringement Notice served under Section 669D of The Act in respect of an offence alleged to have been committed against one of these by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 2.
- (3) An infringement Notice served under subsection (2) of Section 669D of The Act in respect of an offence against one of these by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 3.
- (4) A notice sent under subsection (5) of Section 669D of The Act withdrawing an Infringement Notice served under that section in respect of an offence alleged to have been committed against one of these by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 4.
- 36. No person shall, without the authority of the Council, mark, set up or exhibit any sign purporting to be or resembling a sign marked, set up or exhibited by the Council under the authority of these by-laws.
- 37. No person shall remove, damage, deface, or misuse any parking station or any part thereof.
- 38. No person shall, without the permission of the Council, affix any board, sign placard, notice, or other thing to, or paint or write upon any part of a parking station
 - 39. An inspector is authorised-
 - (a) To carry into effect the provisions of these by-laws;
 - (b) To report to the Council when so instructed on the working effectiveness and functioning of these by-laws;
 - (c) To institute and conduct prosecutions as directed by the Council or the Clerk from time to time.

Penalties.

- 40. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Eighty Dollars (\$80.00).
- 41. The modified penalty for an offence against these by-laws if dealt with under section 669D of The Act is \$10.00.
- 42. A penalty for an offence against these by-laws (not being a modified penalty) may be recovered by the Council by taking proceedings against the alleged offender in a Court of Petty Sessions.
- 43. The Council shall cause adequate records to be kept of all Infringement Notices served and modified penalties received under Section 669D of The Act in respect of offences against these by-laws.
