## HEALTH (MEAT INSPECTION AND BRANDING) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (No. 3) 1981.

With reference to section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954-1979, you are required to carry out fire prevention work on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

This work must be carried out by 22 December 1981, and kept maintained throughout the summer months until 12 April 1982.

## Townsites:

This work must be carried out by 1 December, 1981, and kept maintained throughout the summer months until 12 April 1982.

An inspection of firebreaks and hazard removal will be carried out in all areas of the Shire by an authorised officer (Townsites, after 1 December 1981; Rural, after 22 December 1981).

Persons who fail to comply with the requirements of this order may be issued with an infringement notice (Penalty \$40) or prosecuted with an increased penalty, and additionally, Council may carry out the required work at cost to the owner or occupier.

## (a) Rural Land.

1. A firebreak not less than 2 metres wide must be constructed inside and within 100 metres of the boundary of each property where the boundary is adjacent to or adjoins a constructed or used surveyed road. (Firebreaks constructed on road verges do not constitute a legal firebreak under the Bush Fires Act and Council approval is required prior to construction of additional firebreaks on roadside verges.)
2. A firebreak not less than 2 metres wide must be constructed within a perimeter of 20 metres of all homesteads, buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas on the land.
3. Where uncleared land abuts a boundary, a firebreak not less than 2 metres wide must be constructed inside and within 100 metres of such boundaries.

## (b) Special Rural Land:

1. The owners of all existing small rural holdings zoned as Special Rural in town planning schemes must construct a firebreak not less than two (2) metres wide, adjacent to and inside all boundaries.
2. A firebreak not less than 2 metres wide must be constructed within a perimeter of 20 metres of all homesteads, buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas on the land.

(c) Pine Plantations: Firebreaks not less than 10 metres wide around the perimeter of land on which pines are planted. Not less than 10 metres in width along those portions of pine plantations which enjoy a common boundary with road reserve and not less than 10 metres in width in such positions that no part or compartment of a pine plantation shall exceed 28 hectares in area.

(d) Townsites (including Molloy Island): in respect of land owned or occupied by you within any townsite or any area subdivided for other purposes, you shall:

1. Where the area of land is 2 024 m<sup>2</sup> (approximately  $\frac{1}{2}$  acre) or less, remove all flammable material on the land except living standing trees, from the whole of the land, and
2. Where the area of land exceeds 2 024 m<sup>2</sup> ( $\frac{1}{2}$  acre) clear of flammable materials, firebreaks of at least 2 metres wide, immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

(e) Fuel and/or Gas Depots: In respect of land owned or occupied by you on which is situated any container normally used to contain liquids or gas fuel, including the land on which any ramp or support is constructed, you shall have the land clear of all flammable materials.

If it is considered impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks or remove flammable materials from the land as required by this Notice you may make written application to the Council not later than 15 November 1981, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. This application must be countersigned by the Bush Fire Control Officer for the area

in which the land is situated to signify his agreement to the variation. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

- (1) Inside and along the whole of the external boundaries of the property or properties owned or occupied by you.
- (2) Around all paddocks under crop.
- (3) Where buildings or haystacks are situated on property additional firebreaks not less than two metres in width must be provided within 1.5 metres of the perimeter of such buildings or haystacks, in such a manner as to completely encircle the building or haystacks. (b) Any aerial landing ground used as the motor start up, refueling and maintenance area to be completely cleared of inflammable materials for a radius of 18 metres and;

4. Maintain clear of all inflammable materials all townsite blocks and;

5. Where the bush or land has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether intended to burn the bush or not) provide a firebreak of not less than 20 metres wide immediately inside the external boundaries of the land so prepared. If you become owner or occupier of land after the 1st day of November 1981 the requirements of this notice are varied so as to require you to comply with the terms of this notice within 14 days of the date of your becoming owner or occupier of such land, instead of on or before 1 November 1981. The firebreaks required by this notice are to be maintained clear of inflammable materials up to and including the 31st day of March, 1982.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by the notice you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine, not exceeding Four Hundred Dollars (\$400) and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier before the date required by this notice.

Where there are buildings on the land, additional firebreaks three metres in width shall be cleared immediately surrounding each building.

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks or remove flammable material as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised Officer not later than 15 October 1981, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or take alternative action to remove or abate fire hazards. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised Officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

"Flammable material" does not include green growing trees or green growing plants in gardens.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning shall comply with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

By-laws Relating to Firebreaks.

IN pursuance of the power conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 21 May 1981 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

## (1) Definitions: In these by-laws—

"Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Ravensthorpe.

"Townsite Land" means all land within the boundaries of Ravensthorpe, Hopetoun, Jerdacuttup, Munglinup, Fitzgerald, Desmond and Kundip townsites.

"Rural Land" means all land within the Ravensthorpe Shire District not defined as townsite land.

"Fire Break Period" on townsite and rural land means the 31st day of October in any year until the 31st March in the following year with the exception of bush on any land which has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning then it means the 31st day of October in any year until the 31st May in the following year.

"Firebreak" means ground from which inflammable material has been removed and in which no inflammable material is permitted during the firebreak period.

(2) All owners or occupiers of land within the Shire of Ravensthorpe shall have firebreaks during the firebreak period of the dimensions prescribed within these by-laws.

## (a) Rural land—

- (i) Firebreaks of at least three metres in width immediately inside and along all external boundaries of that part of land which is cleared or partly cleared.
- (ii) Firebreaks of at least three metres in width in such positions as to divide cleared or partly cleared land of more than 400 hectares into separate sections of no more than 400 hectares completely surrounded by a firebreak of at least three metres in width.

- (iii) Firebreaks of at least three metres in width within 200 metres of the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel tanks/drum ramps or groups of buildings, haystacks and fuel tanks/drum ramps in such a manner as to completely encircle the buildings, haystacks and fuel tanks/drum ramps.
- (iv) Firebreaks of at least 20 metres in width immediately inside all external boundaries of that land on which bush has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning.
- (v) Firebreaks of at least 20 metres in width in such positions as to divide land of more than 400 hectares on which bush has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning into separate sections of no more than 400 hectares completely surrounded by a firebreak of at least 20 metres in width.
- (vi) Firebreak to completely cover the whole of the land on which fuel drums whether full or empty are stored.

## (b) Townsites—

- (i) Completely clear of inflammable material all townsite lots.

(3) (a) If it is considered impracticable or undesirable to provide firebreaks as required by these by-laws, the approval of Council must be obtained for any variation. Approval will only be granted up to the 8th day of October in any year and will not be obtained unless the prior consent of the appropriate Fire Control Officer has been obtained.

(b) If after two years bush which has been bulldozed, chained or cleared in any similar manner for burning, has not been burnt, then subject to the approval of the Bush Fire Control Officer prior to the 8th October in any year, the twenty (20) metre firebreak need not be maintained unless and until it is proposed to burn the bush.

(4) Failure to comply with these by-laws shall be an offence and shall subject the offender to the penalties prescribed in the Bush Fire Act 1954—as amended.
