Workers' Compensation Act 1912-1979.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act 1912-1979, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a Policy of Insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the Act to all workers employed by him but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of that section; and whereas The Colonial Mutual Life Assurance Society Limited of 256 Adelaide Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the Section has duly, in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury securities to wit \$25 000.00 5% Commonwealth Inscribed Stock 15/9/1985, charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt The Colonial Mutual Life Assurance Society Limited from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act 1912-1979 for a period terminating on 15 September, 1983.

Pty. Ltd. from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act 1912-1979 for a period terminating on 15 September, 1983.

FEES FOR LICENSES TO EXPORT FAUNA

1. No fee is payable in respect of the export of any live fauna which the Conservator of Wildlife considers has been legally held in conformity with these Regulations as a family pet, and where the family concerned is leaving the State.

2. Subject to paragraph 1 of this Schedule, the fees for licenses to export live fauna shall be as calculated in accordance with the following table:—

APPLICATIONS are invited under section 45A of the Land Act 1933, for the purchase in fee simple of the Cervantes lots shown in the Schedule for “Residential and Storage Purposes Associated with the Fishing Industry” at the purchase prices shown in the said Schedule and subject to the following conditions:

Conditions—

- (a) The purchaser shall erect on the lot purchased a residence to comply with Local Authority by-laws within four (4) years from the due date of the first instalment. If this condition has not been complied with in the

time prescribed, the land may be absolutely forfeited together with all purchase money and fees that may have been paid. However, freehold title to the land may be applied for when a residence has been erected to “top plate height” stage, and is not less than 50% completed to the satisfaction of the Minister for Lands.

On payment of the first instalment of purchase money a licence will be available, upon which a mortgage can be registered. A Crown Grant (freehold) will not issue until the purchaser has complied with the building condition. A holder of a licence may apply to the Minister for Lands for permission to transfer a licence.

- (b) A deposit of 10% of the purchase price is payable on application and the balance of purchase money shall be paid within twenty-four months of the date of approval of application by eight (8) equal quarterly instalments on the first days of January, April, July and October in each year. The first instalment of purchase money shall become due and payable on the first day of the quarter next following the date of approval of application, the Crown Grant fee being payable with the last instalment of purchase money: Provided that amounts paid during the twelve months commencing on the first day of the quarter next following the date of approval of application shall be interest free but all moneys outstanding after that period shall be subject to interest at a rate of 10% per annum calculated at quarterly rests on the balance outstanding at the end of the previous quarter. Important Information Relating to Your Responsibility as a Landholder in the Shire of Busselton.

WITH reference to section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, you are required to carry out fire prevention work on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the provisions of this order.

This work must be carried out by 22 December 1981, and kept maintained throughout the summer months until 12 April 1982.

An inspection of firebreaks and hazard removal will be carried out in all areas of the Shire by an Authorised Officer on or after 22 December 1981.

Persons who fail to comply with the requirements of this Order may be issued with an infringement notice (Penalty \$40) or prosecuted with an increased penalty, and additionally, Council may carry out the required work at cost to the owner or occupier.

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks as required by this Notice or natural features render firebreaks unnecessary, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 8th day of December 1981, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land, if permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice. If the requirements of this Notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

1. You shall clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least 2 metres wide;

- (a) Within 100 metres inside all boundaries of land and also immediately surrounding all buildings, haystacks, and fuel installations situated on the land; (Firebreaks constructed on road verges do not constitute a legal firebreak under the Bush Fires Act); and
- (b) Not more than 100 metres and not less than 20 metres from the perimeter of all buildings and/or haystacks or groups of buildings and/or haystacks situated on the land; and
- (c) Where the area of the land exceeds 121 hectares (approx. 300 acres) additional firebreaks so as to divide the land into areas of not more than 121 hectares (approx. 300 acres) which are completely surrounded with a firebreak.

B. Special Rural Land: The owners of all existing small rural holdings zoned as Special Rural under Town Planning Schemes must maintain clear of all inflammable material a firebreak not less than two (2) metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land.

C. Urban Land: (Residential, Commercial and Industrial land within a townsite or within any area subdivided for residential purposes).

1. Where the area of land is 2 024 sq m (approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ acre) or less, remove all flammable material on the land except living trees, shrubs and plants, from the whole of the land, and
2. Where the area of land exceeds 2 024 sq m (approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ acre) clear of all flammable materials firebreaks of at least 2 metres wide, immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

D. Fuel and/or gas depots: In respect of land owned or occupied by you on which is situated any container normally used to contain liquid or gas fuel, including the land on which any ramp or supports are constructed, you shall maintain the land clear of all flammable materials.

E. Pine Plantations: Firebreaks not less than 10 metres in width around the perimeter of land on which pines are planted; not less than 10 metres in width along those portions of pine plantations which enjoy a common boundary with a road reserve. And not less than 10 metres in width in such positions that no part or compartment of a pine plantation shall exceed 28 hectares in an area.

Special Notice to Land Owners and Occupiers.

The Council forwards a copy of this Firebreak Order with rate assessments each year. The notice is also published in the Busselton-Margaret Times.

The aim of the Council is to eliminate destructive bush fires and to this aim, some areas of the Shire are subject to a District Fire Protection Plan where large-scale hazard removal and roadside burning is carried out by the Shire's Bush Fire Brigades and Council workforce.

The requirements of this order are considered to be the minimum standard of fire prevention work required to protect not only individual properties but the district generally. In addition to the requirements of this Order, Council may issue separate special orders on owners or occupiers if hazard removal is considered necessary in some specific areas.

BUSH FIRE PRECAUTIONS.

Prohibited Burning Time.

The Prohibited Burning Time within this Shire is: 15th December, 1981 to 28th February, 1982.

Restricted Burning Times.

The Restricted Burning Times are: 2nd November, 1981 to 14th December, 1981 and 1st March, 1982 to 12th April, 1982.

These dates are subject to slight variation according to seasonal conditions but any alterations will be advertised locally.

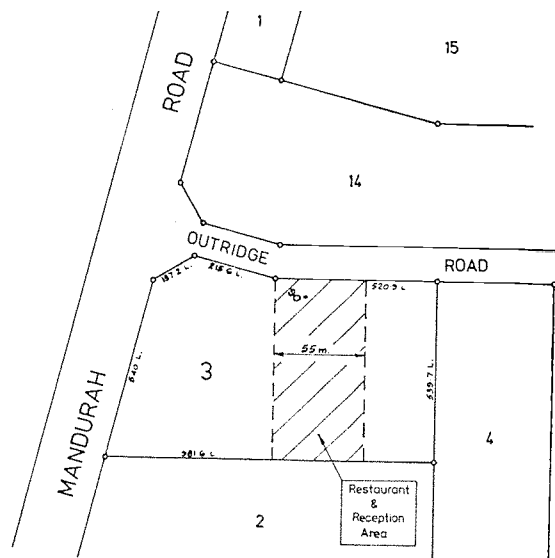
