1. These regulations may be cited as the Food and Drug Amendment Regulations (No. 3) 1981.

2. In these regulations the Food and Drug Regulations 1961*, as amended, are referred to as the principal regulations.

 - (a) by deleting subregulation A.04.003 and substituting the following subregulation—
 - " A.04.003

The addition of any colouring matter as prescribed by subregulation A.04.005, based on 100% dry active dye in proportion shall not exceed—

- (a) 70 mg per litre in drinks as consumed;
- (b) 130 mg per litre in cordials;
- (c) 290 mg per kg in any solid food when the food is sold ready for consumption or when the food is prepared for consumption in accordance with the directions on the label. ";
- (b) by deleting subregulation A.04.005 and substituting the following subregulation—

A.04.005

The following substances shall be permitted colouring matters within the meaning and for the purpose of these regulations—

(a) Natural colouring substances:-

Alkanet, Alkannin, Annatto, Anthocyanin, Beet Red, Beta-apo-8'-carotenal, Beta-apo-8'-carotenoic acid, -methyl or ethyl ester, Betanin, Bixin, Canthaxanthin, Carotenes, Carminic Acid, Chlorophyll, Cochineal, Crocetin, Crocin, Curcumin, Norbixin, Riboflavin, Saffron, Turmeric, Xanthophylls;

- (b) Caramel;
- (c) Calcined iron oxide in fish paste only, in amount not exceeding 0.05%;
- (d) Carbon Black prepared from vegetable sources and free from any polycylic hydrocarbons when determined by the prescribed method as in subregulation A.04.010.

It shall not be prepared from coal tar or petroleum products;

- (e) Synthetic colouring substances (including their aluminium and calcium lakes (salts)) as follows:-

- (vi) Black Shade CI 28440 Brilliant Black B.N.,

and for the purposes of this subregulation a synthetic regetable colouring chemically the same as a natural vegetable colouring, shall be regarded as a natural vegetable colouring and the numbers quoted in paragraph (e) are those given in the Society of Dyers and Colourists Colour Index 2nd Edition 1956. ";

(c) by deleting subregulation A.04.007 and substituting the following subregulation-

A.04.007

- (a) In this subregulation-
 - "B.S." means Standards of the British Standards Institution:
 - "F.A.O. Vol. 2" means specifications for Identity and Purity of Food Additives F.A.O. Vol. 2;
 - "F.A.O." means Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations;
 - "Report No. 38.B" means specifications for Identity and Purity and Toxicological Evaluation of Food Colours (F.A.O./W.H.O.) F.A.O. Nutrition Meetings Report No. 38B/1964;
 - "W.H.O." means World Health Organization of the United Nations.
- (b) Any prescribed colouring substances used or intended to be used for the colouring of food shall be manufactured, distributed and sold in accordance with good commercial practice. Prescribed colourings which are included in the B.S. or the Report No. 38.B or F.A.O. Vol. 2 shall conform with the limits for lead, arsenic, and other metals prescribed for them. They shall contain no other toxic substances or toxic intermediates.
- (c) Wherever a prescribed colouring is included in the B.S. and the Report No. 38.B or the F.A.O. Vol. 2, the Standard of the B.S. shall prevail, and wherever a prescribed colouring is included in the Report No. 38.B and the F.A.O. Vol. 2 but not in the B.S. the Standard of the Report No. 38.B shall prevail.
- (d) Where a prescribed colouring is not included in either the B.S., the Report No. 38.B or the F.A.O. Vol. 2, it shall
 - (i) more than 10 milligrams of lead per kilogram of dry active dye;
 - (ii) more than 1.5 milligrams of arsenic, calculated as As₂ O₃, per kilogram of dry active dye;
 - (iii) more than 100 milligrams of heavy metals, other than lead, calculated as the respective metals, per kilogram of dry active dye;

- (iv) toxic substances or toxic intermediates.
- (e) Where a dyestuff is sold admixed with any diluent for use as a prescribed colouring in foods the diluted preparation shall conform with the requirements of this subregulation.
- (d) by deleting subregulation A.04.008 and substituting the following subregulations-

" A.04.008

Smoke Essence and Imitation Smoke Essence.

- (a) Smoke Flavour-
 - (i) Smoke flavour is a flavour produced by the controlled burning of hardwood and the absorption of the smoke in water, ethyl citrate or edible oils, or by other processes of smoke condensation;
 - (ii) Smoke flavour shall be free from any polycyclic hydrocarbons;
- (b) Imitation Smoke Essence-Imitation smoke essence is an essence prepared from oil of cade;
 - - (i) The word "SMOKE" shall not be used in the label of food flavoured with smoke flavour unless followed immediately by the words "FLAVOURED" or "FLAVOUR";
 - (ii) The words "SMOKED", "SMOKE FLAVOURED" or other words indicating that the food is smoked or smoke flavoured shall not be included in the label of a food flavoured with imitation smoke essence.

A.04.009

Flavour Enhancers.

- (a) Monosodium glutamate may be used as a flavour enhancer in food.
 - (b) Prohibition-

Monosodium glutamate shall not be added to baby food.

(c) Ethyl maltol may be used in flavours and essences provided that in soft drinks the concentration of ethyl maltol does not exceed 15 mg/kg.

NOISE ABATEMENT ACT 1972-1981. INTERPRETATION ACT 1918-1981.

NOISE ABATEMENT (NOISE ABATEMENT DIRECTIONS) REGULATIONS 1981.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Noise Abatement (Noise Abatement Directions) Regulations 1981.

5. Local Inspectors and State Inspectors are persons prescribed for the purposes of section 33B (2) (b) of the Act.

Prescribed persons, bodies and activities. (s. 33E (1)) 6. (1) The persons and bodies specified in Schedule I to these regulations are prescribed for the purposes of section 33E (1) (a) of the Act. (2) Activities of the classes or descriptions specified in Schedule II to these regulations are prescribed for the purposes of section 33E (1) (b) of the Act.

SCHEDULE I (Regulation 6 (1).)

PRESCRIBED PERSONS AND BODIES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 17 March 1981 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:-

The By-laws of the City of Stirling published in the Government Gazette of 12 May 1971 and amended from time to time are hereby amended in the following manner:-

- By-laws 668 to 682 inclusive and 684 to 686R are hereby revoked.
- 2. By-law 683 is renumbered as By-law 669.
- The following additional by-laws are made:-
 - 668 In by-laws 668 to 683 unless the context otherwise required "Act" means the Dog Act 1976. Expressions used in By-laws 669 to 683 have the meanings given to them by the Act.
 - 670 A person liable for the control of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:-
 - (a) A public building;
 - (b) A theatre or picture gardens;
 - (c) A house of Worship;
 - (d) A school or school ground;
 - (e) A shop or other public business premises not being a shop where dogs are sold or treated for illness;
 - (f) Any of the beaches specified hereunder:-

Those portions of Reserve No. 12992 on the Indian Ocean foreshore as detailed hereunder:-

- (i) Extending northwards from the prolongation of a line west of the northern side of Brighton Road to the prolongation of a line west of the southern side of Kathleen Street;
- (ii) Extending northwards from the prolongation of a line west of the northern side of Bennion Street to the prolongation of a line west of the southern side of Castle Street;
- (iii) Extending northwards from the prolongation of a line west of the northern side of Ada Street to the northern boundary of the district.
- 671 A person who permits a dog, the control for which he is liable, to excrete on any street or public place or on any land within the District of the City of Stirling without the consent of the occupier commits an offence unless the excreta is removed forthwith and disposed of either on private land with the occupier's consent or in such other manner as the Council may approve.

- (a) Each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto;
- (b) Each kennel shall have an internal height of not less than 2 metres and width sufficient to permit the dog or dogs to move inside without restriction:
- (c) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 1.5 metres from the side or rear boundaries of the lot;

- (d) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be kept at a distance not less than 18 metres from any dwelling-house church schoolroom hall shop or factory, not less than 24 metres from the street to which the lot has a frontage, not less than 7.5 metres from any street adjoining the side or rear of the lot, and not less than 60 metres from a dwelling other than a dwelling on that lot;
- (e) The walls shall be constructed of concrete brick stone or wood framing sheeted with asbestos or galvanised iron internally and externally;
- (f) The roof shall be constructed of some impervious material;
- (g) Each yard shall be securely fenced and kept securely with a fence not less than 2 metres in height constructed of galvanised iron, wood or galvanised link mesh;
- (h) 'All gates shall be provided with efficient catches or means of fastening;
- (i) The upper surface of the floor of each kennel shall be set at least 100 millimetres above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a smooth surface and shall have a fall of not less than 1 in 100 to a drain which shall be properly laid ventilated and trapped. The floor shall have a coved upstand at the junction of the floor and the internal wall surface. In the case of a wooden framed building the bottom plate shall rest on a coved concrete upstand 75 millimetres above the floor level and the internal wall sheeting shall finish a minimum of 25 millimetres below the bottom of the floor plate. All floor washings shall pass through this drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the health requirements of the Council;
- (j) The floor of any yard which is floored shall be constructed in the same manner as the floor of any kennel and as provided in paragraph (i);

- 679 A person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$100.00.
- 680 A person who does not contest an allegation that he committed an offence against by-law 670, 671 or 672 may subject to the provisions of these by-laws pay to the Council within the time hereinafter prescribed the modified penalty of \$15.00 and the due payment of a modified penalty is a defence to a charge of the offence in respect of which that modified penalty was paid.
- 681 Where the Council is of the opinion that an alleged offence cannot be adequately punished by the payment of the modified penalty the Council may refrain from accepting the modified penalty and may instead take proceedings against the alleged offender.
- 682 (1) The modified penalty may be imposed and collected by the Council in the way specified in this by-law.
 - (2) Where an authorised person has reason to believe that a person has committed any offence against one or more of the by-laws referred to in By-law 680 he may serve on that person a notice in the form of Form 7 in the First Schedule of the Dog Act Regulations 1976 (in this by-law called "an infringement notice") informing the person that, if he does not wish to have a complaint of the alleged offence heard and determined by a court, he may pay to the Council, within the time specified, the amount prescribed as the modified penalty.
 - (3) An infringement notice may be served on an alleged offender personally or by posting it to his address as ascertained from him, at the time of or immediately following the occurrence giving rise to the allegation of the offence, or as recorded by the Council pursuant to the Act.
 - (4) Where a person who receives an infringement notice fails to pay the prescribed modified penalty within the time specified in the notice, or within such further time as may in any particular case be allowed, he is deemed to have declined to have the allegation dealt with by way of a modified penalty.

- (5) An alleged offender on whom an infringement notice has been served may, within the time specified in that notice or such further time as may in any particular case be allowed, send or deliver to the Council specified in that notice the amount of the prescribed penalty, with or without a reply as to the circumstances giving rise to the allegation, and the Council may thereupon—



By-Laws Relating to: Safety, Decency, Convenience and Comfort of Persons on Beaches and Other Reserves.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 29 January 1980, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws:

- 1. These by-laws may be cited as the Shire of Harvey By-laws relating to Safety, Decency, Convenience and Comfort of Persons on Beaches and Other Reserves.
- 2. These by-laws apply to the rivers, water courses, tidal and non-tidal waters in or outside but adjoining the district of the municipality, the area between high water mark and low water mark, and in the sea adjoining the district for a distance of 200 metres seaward from the shores of the Indian Ocean, together with all land that is vested in or under the care, control and management of the Council.
- Interpretation: For the purpose of these by-laws, unless the context otherwise indicates or requires, the following terms shall have the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say:-

"authorised person"—A Ranger or Inspector, or Honorary Inspector of the Council appointed as such.

"bathing"-The term includes entry into the sea and emerging therefrom; it also includes the use of bathing appliances.

"bathing appliances—A float of any material, surf ski, surf board, kick board, malibu board, boat or any other device of any description used or for use in bathing.

"bathing area"—That part of the defined area which is from time to time set aside pursuant to By-law 4 of these by-laws as a bathing area.

"boat"—Any craft, structure or vessel whether propelled manually or by the wind or power, made or used to float upon or travel under the sea.

"building or structure"—Means anything erected or placed on land unless in the circumstances of a particular case, a Court required to decide the case declares otherwise, but in any case includes a fence erected in a townsite and also includes all plumbing, electrical installations, fittings, fixtures and all furniture or other contents of a building and all structures in the open air such as notices, signs, seats, fences, walls, drains, showers, road, footpaths, memorials, and the like, erected by or with the consent of the Council.

"Council"—The Council of the municipality of the Shire of Harvey.

[&]quot;defined area"—The area set out in By-law 2 of these by-laws.

- "Honorary Inspector"—A person appointed as such under these by-laws.
- "Inspector"—A person appointed as such under these by-laws.
- "person"—An individual or individuals of either sex and includes in the plural a group, club, association, or other body of persons.
- "Ranger"—A person appointed as such under these by-laws.
- "watercraft"—Any bathing appliance or boat and the equipment thereof used or intended for use by a member of a Life Saving Club or patrol for life saving purposes.
- 4. For the purpose of ensuring the safety, comfort and convenience of bathers, and to regulate the conduct of bathers and others, the Council or an authorised officer may set aside within the defined area, and by exhibiting signs which clearly designate:
 - (a) Areas in which bathing is permitted at all times and areas in which bathing is restricted;
 - (b) Areas or sites from which boats may be launched or taken up from the river or sea and areas within which the launching or taking up of boats from the river or sea is prohibited;
 - (c) Areas which may be designated as roads and turning areas in connection with launching sites;
 - (d) Areas within which the playing of games on the beach is prohibited and areas within which the playing of games is permitted;
 - (e) Areas within which the sale of goods and services is permitted and areas within which the sale of goods and services is prohibited;
 - (f) Areas within which fishing is permitted and areas within which fishing is prohibited, or is restricted to fishing in a partcular manner;
 - (g) Areas in which fires may be lighted for barbecues;
 - (h) Areas within which bathing appliances, either generally or of a particular class may be used or prohibited.

If an authorised person appointed by Council considers that a person is using a bathing appliance in such a way as to cause danger, injury, or annoyance to any other person, he may by verbal order prohibit the use of such an appliance within the defined area.

- 5. A person shall not -
 - (a) Bathe in an area in which bathing is prohibited;
 - (b) Play games in an area in which the playing of games is prohibited;
 - (c) Sell goods or services in an area in which their sale is prohibited.
 - (d) Launch a boat from a site or area in which the launching of boats is prohibited.
 - (e) Fish in an area in which fishing is prohibited.
- 6. Within the defined area a person shall not-
 - (a) Create or commit any nuisance or behave in a disorderly or offensive manner or use indecent or improper language;
 - (b) Enter, pry or look into or loiter outside any lavatory, dressing shed or other building or portion of a building expressly reserved for the use of the opposite sex.
 - (c) Dress or undress or remove or disarrange any part of his or her bathing costume in any place open to public view or in any building save those specifically set aside by the Council for the purpose, provided this shall not prevent any person already clad in proper bathing costume from doffing or donning another garment or garments worn over such bathing costume;
 - (d) Unless he be a Ranger or Inspector or Honorary Inspector acting in the course of his duty, climb on or over any building or structure;
 - (e) Enter any place which has been fenced off or otherwise closed to the public;
 - (f) Alter, cut, mutilate, deface or disfigure or otherwise damage any building or structure or expectorate or throw lighted matches thereon;
 - (g) Injure, cut, break, deface, pull up, pick, remove or destroy any tree, shrub, flowers, grass or plant of any kind or description or, without the consent of the Council, plant any such or sow any seed;
 - (h) Without the written consent of the Council, cut, collect or remove any timber, firewood, stone, sand or other material except seaweed;
 - (i) (1) consume any intoxicating liquor except—
 - (a) on a portion of the reserve leased by the Council on such conditions as will permit the consumption of intoxicating liquor thereon; or
 - (b) on a portion of the reserve in respect of which the Council has given approval for the consumption of intoxicating liquor, but only in accordance with any conditions laid down by the Council;
 - (2) Enter or remain visibly under the influence of intoxicating liquor and if found in the defined area visibly under the influence of intoxicating liquor, such person shall depart from the defined area on being ordered to do so by a Ranger or Inspector or Honorary Inspector of the Council;
 - (j) Unless he be a servant of the Council or a member of a life saving club acting in the course of his duty as such or a person authorised in writing by Council to do so—carry or discharge any firearm, air gun, or other missile discharging device (other than a speargun) or throw or discharge any firework, stone, spear or other missile;
 - (k) Load or discharge any speargun except when such gun is under water and fifty yards or more from any swimmer other than a companion spear fisherman:
 - (1) Drive any mechanically propelled vehicle (other than a boat) except upon a roadway, turning place or parking place constructed for such purposes; unless

- otherwise authorised under the provisions of the Control of Vehicles (Off-road) Areas) Act 1978;
- (m) Light any fire, except in an area set aside for barbecues;
- (n) Leave a fire unattended unless that fire is properly extinguished;
- (o) Drive a boat into an area where bathing is taking place in such a way as to cause annoyance or injury to any person bathing or offering to bathe;
- (p) Ski into any place where bathers are congregated together to the danger or annoyance of those bathers;
- Play games in such a way as to cause inconvenience and annoyance to persons bathing or using the beach;
- Conduct sport, recreational or other activities in such a way as to cause any danger, annoyance or inconvenience to persons bathing or using the beach.
- A person shall not, within the defined area, unless he shall have first obtained the consent of the Council in writing-
 - (a) Engage in any public speaking or conduct any meeting, entertainment or competition of an athletic or natatorial nature, provided however, that this by-law shall not apply to the normal competitive or training activity of a life saving club or to meetings of such a club convened and held in accordance with its constitution;
 - (b) sell or hire or offer for sale or hire any equipment, goods, produce or merchandise:
 - (c) operate any broadcasting or public address system or apparatus other than those employed or used by a life saving club or a Ranger or Inspector or Honorary Inspector in the performance of his functions as such;
 - (d) advertise by any means anything whatsoever nor display or distribute any notice, pamphlet or document;
 - (e) operate any radio, record player, tape recorder, radiogram or any noise producing appliance at such volume as to cause annoyance to other users of the defined area.
- (a) A person shall not, without the permission of the Council, allow any animal or bird under his control to enter the defined area.
- (b) Notwithstanding the foregoing, a person may bring a dog on to the beach where this is permitted by by-laws made under the Dog Act 1976.
- (c) The Council may permit a horse or a donkey to be in the defined area, subject to such conditions as the Council imposes.
- (d) Any animal or bird found in the defined area in contravention of this by-law may be removed and dealt with according to the Dog Act or any other law relating to the impounding of animals.
- (a) Where the Council sets aside areas in which fishing is prohibited, it shall exhibit signs indicating that fishing is prohibited between the signs.
- (b) Where fishing is permitted, no person fishing or about to fish shall at any place within the defined area, and whether that place is one in which fishing is permitted or
 - (i) clean fish or cut bait on any seat or handrail;
 - (ii) leave or deposit fish offal anywhere on land at any time or in the sea within 200 metres of any portion of the beach at which people are swimming or are likely to swim within twelve hours after such disposal;
 - (iii) without written permission of the Council, fish for sharks by use of set or buoyed lines or use blood or any other lure for the purpose of attracting sharks.
- A person shall not within a defined area release or discharge into the water effluent, rubbish, refuse or litter of any kind from any boat, ship or vessel.
- 11. (a) The Council may set aside an area in which boats may be left or parked and no boat may be left on the beach other than in an area so set aside.
- (b) A person using a car or other vehicle to tow a boat to a launching site shall use the road set aside for the purpose and after launching he shall withdraw the vehicle from the road to an area set aside for parking in the defined area or if there is no such area set aside, he shall remove the vehicle to the public road or to a parking area.
- 12. Unless written permission of the Council to do so has been obtained at least twenty-four hours in advance, no person shall within the defined area—
 - (a) Camp or lodge at night in or occupy as sleeping quarters any stall, building, tent or structure of any kind;
 - (b) Erect any tent, camp, hut or other structure except a beach shade or wind-break for use during daylight and erected, dismantled and removed during the hours of daylight on the day of use.
- (i) Any person over four years of age bathing within the defined area in water
- exposed to the public view or using the beach for sunbathing to the public view, shall in order to secure the observance of decency, be properly and adequately clad.

 (ii) If a Ranger or Inspector or Honorary Inspector appointed by Council considered that the costume or other clothing of any person using the defined area is not proper and adequate to secure decency, the Officer or Inspector may order that person to don adequate clothing, and if that person refuses to do so, he may be removed from the defined area by that Officer or Inspector.
 - 14. No person shall within the defined area-
 - (a) Swim out to sea to such a distance that, in the event of such person becoming in danger or difficulty, the life of anyone attempting to rescue such person shall be endangered;
 - (b) Bathe in any place which has, by notice erected by the Council or by an authorised person, been declared as-
 - (i) Closed to bathing.

- (ii) Dangerous.
- (iii) Reserved for the launching and beaching of boats and surf boards operated by a life saving club.
- (c) Use a bathing appliance (either generally or of a particular class) in a bathing area where the use of such appliances has been prohibited, either by notice or the verbal order of an authorised person or use a bathing appliance in such a way as to cause danger, injury or annoyance to any other person;
- (d) Fail to leave the water during the course of a rescue when so required by an authorised person;
- (e) Fail to leave the water within the bathing area after a shark alarm has been given;
- (f) Bathe within a bathing area after a shark alarm has been given and before the signal of "all clear" has been given;
- (g) Assist or attempt to assist in the use of any life saving gear or appliance or in any way interfere with its use unless requested or authorised to do so by an authorised person or a member of a life saving patrol or except in cases of emergency.
- (h) Interfere with, damage, or destroy any notices, life saving gear or appliance;
- (i) Place any clothing, towel or any other object matter or things on any notice, life saving gear or appliance;
- (j) Encroach upon any area in which any life saving gear or appliance is located or is being used or in which life saving or first aid treatment is being administered to any person;
- (k) Obstruct any authorised person or member of a life saving patrol providing life saving services;
- (1) Refuse to remove any beach umbrella, sunshade, beach coat or any thing in his control which will impair the view of the bathing area from a roped enclosure set aside for the exclusive use of members of a life saving patrol;
- (m) Unless he is an Inspector or Ranger appointed by the Council pursuant to these by-laws, wear a badge bearing the words "Beach Inspector" or "Ranger";
- (n) Interfere in any way with any other person in the defined area.
- 15. (a) The Council may appoint any of its members, or employees to be an Inspector, Ranger or Honorary Inspector under these by-laws;
- (b) The Council may also appoint any other person as an Honorary Inspector under these by-laws, provided that a member so appointed shall not prosecute any person for a breach of any provisions of these by-laws, but shall report such breach to the Council for action by it;
- (c) Any person appointed Ranger, Inspector or Honorary Inspector as provided in the two preceding paragraphs, shall be given a Certificate of his appointment and shall have issued to him a badge either bearing the words "Beach Inspector" or "Ranger".

The wearing of such badge or the production of it or of the authority certificate of his appointment when exercising his authority under these by-laws, shall be prima facie evidence of the appointment and authority of the person producing the same;

- (d) Every member of the Western Australian Police Force shall have the power of an authorised person under these by-laws;
- (e) A person who gives or is suspected of giving a false name or place of abode or refuses to state his name and place of abode to the person making the demand, may without other warrant than these by-laws, be apprehended by the person making the demand and taken before a Justice and dealt with according to the law.
- 16. Nothing in these by-laws shall derogate from the effect of the Navigable Waters Regulations or any regulations made by virtue of the Waterways Conservation Act, and to the extent that there is any inconsistency between the provisions of these by-laws and any such regulations, the provisions of the latter shall prevail.
- 17. Any person who fails to do anything required under these by-laws to be done or who does or attempts to do anything prohibited under these by-laws commits an offence.
- 18. The penalty upon conviction of an offence under or against these by-laws shall be a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200).


