LIQUOR AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (No. 2) 1981.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation and reference to principal regulations.

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Liquor Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1981.

(2) In these regulations the Liquor Regulations 1970*, as amended, are referred to as the principal regulations.

(iv) his proposed day of departure; and

(v) the day and time of his actual departure; ".

WILDLIFE CONSERVATION ACT 1950.

F. & W. 49/48.

THE Minister for Fisheries and Wildlife, pursuant to the powers conferred by section 14 and 17B of the Wild-life Conservation Act 1950, does hereby declare as follows:

- (1) That the period from six o'clock in the forenoon of Sunday, 10 January 1982 until one
 minute before midnight in the afternoon of
 Sunday, 7 February 1982, shall be an open
 season in respect of those species of wild
 duck in the Second Schedule and the Third
 Schedule hereto in those parts of the State
 which lie within the boundaries of the South
 West Division and Fuela Division as defined West Division and Eucla Division, as defined in section 28 of the Land Act 1933 with the exception of those areas defined in the First Schedule hereto.
- That the species of wild duck in the Second Schedule and the Third Schedule hereto are game species in all parts of the State in respect of which an open season on those species is declared by paragraph (1) of this notice.
- (3) That a person shall not take any wild duck of a species declared to be a game species under the Second Schedule and the Third Schedule hereto unless he has been granted a license under Regulation 21 of the Wildlife Conservation Regulations.
- (4) That a person shall not take any wild duck or the egg of any wild duck for the purpose of keeping it in captivity, or for the purpose of aviculture or for the purpose of sale.
- (5) That a person shall not sell any wild duck.
- That a person shall not take any wild duck by any means other than a shotgun licensed pursuant to the Firearms Act 1973, and having a calibre of less than thirty-one fortieths of an inch of internal diameter (ten gauge).
- (7) That a person shall not take or attempt to take wild ducks from any boat, raft, launch or other type of boat which is powered by any type of motor or engine or which is propelled or towed by any means other than by hand.
- (8) That a person shall not take or attempt to take more than five wild ducks of a species in the Second Schedule hereto in any one day of the open season.
- (9) That a person shall not have under his control or in his possession or keep in any cold store or any freezing chambers or other premises at any one time-
 - (a) on opening day of the season, more than five wild ducks of a species in the Second Schedule hereto;

- (b) on any day other than opening day of the open season, more than ten wild ducks of a species in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (10) That a person shall not possess or transport a wild duck unless at least one fully feathered wing is attached to the bird, and that the wing and plumage may be removed from the duck—
 - (a) when the duck is prepared for immediate cooking, and
 - (b) after the duck is taken to the residence of its owner for preservation.
- (11) That a person shall not take or attempt to take wild ducks of a species in the Second Schedule and the Third Schedule hereto between the hours of 7.00 p.m. and 5.00 a.m. in those areas defined in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

First Schedule.

General Areas.

- (1) All nature reserves except those which may have been classified as shooting or hunting areas pursuant to the provisions of section 12A of the Wildlife Conservation Act 1950.
- (2) All cities and towns which lie within all municipal districts, within the meaning of the Local Government Act 1960.
- (3) All national parks, State forests, Crown land, timber reserves, town reservoirs and other areas where shooting is prohibited under the provisions of any other Act, Regulation or By-law.
- (4) The whole of the area within a radius of thirty-two kilometres of the General Post Office, Perth.
- (5) The whole of the municipal district of Rockingham.

Specific Areas.

Town of Albany.

The whole of the waters of Lake Seppings and all land within 400 metres of its shores.

Albany Shire.

The whole of the waters of Nanarup (or Taylor) Inlet and all land within 400 metres of its shores.

The whole of the waters of the King and Kalgan Rivers and all land within 400 metres of their banks.

The whole of the waters of Oyster and Princess Royal Harbours and all land within 400 metres of their shores.

The whole of Reserve 27157 adjoining the water catchment area in Cheyne Road.

The whole of the waters of Lake Powell (Grassmere) and all land within 400 metres of its shores.

Armadale-Kelmscott Shire.

The whole of Reserve A24781 (Lake Forrestdale).

Boyup Brook Shire.

The whole of the area within a radius of 4 kilometres of the Post Office at Boyup Brook.

Busselton Shire.

The whole of the waters of Vasse and Wonnerup Estuaries and all land within 400 metres of their shores.

The whole of the waters of the Vasse River and all land within 400 metres of its banks.

The whole of Reserve 27080 in the Broadwater.

Capel Shire.

All that portion of the Capel River between the Capel and Stirling bridges and all land within 400 metres of the river's bank.

Chittering Shire.

The whole of the waters of Lakes Needoonga and Chittering, and all land within 400 metres of their shores (Reserve 29538).

Corrigin Shire.

The whole of Reserves 12899 and 12900 (Paper Bark) at Nambadilling.

The whole of Reserve 30324 (Lake Kunenbutten).

Dandaragan Shire.

The whole of Caro Swamp and all land within 1.6 kilometres of its shores.

Dardanup Shire.

The whole of the waters of that section of the Collie River from the junction of the Collie and Brunswick Rivers to a line drawn in a northerly direction across the river from the northeastern corner of Wellington Location 424 and including all land within twenty metres of the river between these points.

Denmark Shire.

All that part of Wilson Inlet situated between the low water mark at Ratcliffe Bay (Southern Ocean) and a line joining the southernmost extremity of Reserve 12344 and northeastern corner of Plantagenet Location 1828.

Donnybrook-Balingup Shire.

The whole of the area within a radius of 2.4 kilometres from the Post Office at Balingup.

Dumbleyung Shire.

All that portion of the Coblinine River downstream from the eastern side of the bridge at the junction of Road 3375 and Road 323 (Oxley Road) to the prolongation eastwards of the southern boundary of Kojonup Location 3928 and all land within 400 metres of that part of the river's banks.

Gingin Shire.

The whole of the waters of Lake Nambung, Bambun and Mungala and all land within 400 metres of their shores (Reserve 24257).

The whole of Reserve 26756 including Wallering Swamp.

The whole of the waters of Lake Wannamal north of the easterly prolongation of the southern boundary of Location 2150 (Swan).

Gnowangerup Shire.

The whole of the land and waters contained within Reserves 21646 and 21647 in the Wellstead and Beaufort Estuaries respectively.

Harvey Shire.

All those waters of the Leschenault Inlet extending southwards from a line drawn southeast from Waterloo Head (Belvedere), on the west foreshore to a point on the opposite foreshore and all land within 400 metres of the included foreshores.

EDUCATION ACT 1928-1981.

Declaration of School Boundaries Pursuant to Paragraph (a) of Subsection (2) of Section 21.

THE Hon. Minister for Education has declared that the boundaries for the schools listed hereunder shall be as stated in this notice. Children who live within the areas and boundaries stated shall attend the schools to which such boundaries apply unless directed other-wise or unless an option is provided. Children who live outside the areas and boundaries shall not attend the schools to which such boundaries apply unless written approval for such admission is obtained from the undersigned.

School Boundaries.

1. Bull Creek, Leeming, Bateman Area:

With the opening of the Leeming Primary School in 1982, the redefinition of boundaries of some of the schools in the area has become necessary, as follows:—

(a) Leeming Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

From the intersection of the Kwinana Freeway and South Street, east and southeast along South Street to the intersection with the proposed Roe Freeway, southwest and west along the alignment of the proposed Roe Freeway to the intersection with the proposed extension of the Kwinana Freeway and north along the proposed extension way, and north along the proposed extension of the Kwinana Freeway to South Street.

The boundary parts of South Street (south side), the proposed Roe Freeway (north side) and the proposed extension of the Kwinana Freeway (east side) are included within the area for the Leeming Primary School.

Children attending Government Schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1982, and living within the boundary for Leeming

Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Leeming Primary School, except as follows:—

- (i) Children in Year 7 in 1982, who are currently (1981) enrolled at either the Bull Creek Primary School or the Oberthur Primary School, shall have the option of completing their primary education at their present (1981) school or of transferring to the new Leeming Primary School.
- (ii) Children from the Leeming area who attended the Bull Creek Primary School in 1978 and who were directed to attend the Oberthur Primary School in 1979, shall have the option of completing their primary education at the Oberthur Primary School or of transferring to the new Leeming Primary School.
- (iii) Children from the northeast Leeming area, that is, the area bounded on the north by South Street, on the west by Karel Avenue, and on the south and east by Beasley Road, if they attended the Oberthur Primary School in 1981, shall have the option of continuing their primary education at the Oberthur Primary School or of transferring to the new Leeming Primary School.

(Note: See also item on Bibra Lake area.)

(b) Bull Creek Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementionend school is as follows:—

From the intersection of the Kwinana Freeway and Leach Highway, south along the Kwinana Freeway to South Street, east along South Street to Wheatley Drive, north along Wheatley Drive to Parry Avenue, west along Parry Avenue to Camm Avenue, north along Camm Avenue to Ewing Avenue, northeast and north along Ewing Avenue to the junction with Brockman Avenue, due north from this point to Leach Highway, and west along Leach Highway to the Kwinana Freeway.

The boundary parts of the Kwinana Free

The boundary parts of the Kwinana Freeway (east side), South Street (north side), Parry Avenue (south side), Camm Avenue (both sides) and Ewing Avenue (both sides) are included within the area for the Bull Creek Primary School. The boundary street of Wheatley Drive (west side only) is optional between the Bull Creek Primary School and the Oberthur Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1982, and living within the boundary for the Bull Creek Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Bull Creek Primary School, except that children from the optional area designated above may attend either of the schools so designated.

(c) Oberthur Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

From the intersection of Karel Avenue and South Street, west along South Street to Wheatley Drive, north along Wheatley drive to Parry Avenue, west along Parry Avenue to Camm Avenue, north along Camm Avenue to Ewing Avenue, northeast and north along Ewing Avenue to the junction with Brockman Avenue, due north from this point to Leach Highway, northeast along Leach Highway to Keith Road, east along Keith Road to Karel Avenue, and south along Karel Avenue to South Street.

The boundary parts of South Street (north side), Parry Avenue (north side), Leach Highway (south side), and Karel Avenue

(west side), are included within the area for the Oberthur Primary School while the boundary parts of Camm Avenue (both sides), and Ewing Avenue (both sides) and the boundary street of Keith Road (both sides) are excluded from the area for the Oberthur Primary School. In the case of the boundary street of Wheatley Drive the west side only is optional between Oberthur Primary School and Bull Creek Primary School while the east side is in the area for the Oberthur Primary School.

Children attending Government Schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1982, and living within the boundary for the Oberthur Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Oberthur Primary School, except as follows:—

- (i) Children from the Leeming area who attended the Bull Creek Primary School in 1978 and who were directed to attend the Oberthur Primary School in 1979, shall have the option of completing their primary education at the Oberthur Primary School or of transferring to the new Leeming Primary School.
- (ii) Children from the north-east Leeming area, that is, the area bounded on the north by South Street, on the west by Karel Avenue, and on the south and east by Beasley Road, if they attended the Oberthur Primary School in 1981, shall have the option of continuing their primary education at the Oberthur Primary School or of transferring to the new Leeming Primary School.
- (iii) Children living in Wheatley Drive (west side only) may attend either Oberthur Primary School or Bull Creek Primary School.

(d) Bateman Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:—

From the junction of Leach Highway and the proposed Murdoch Drive, east along Leach Highway to the Kwinana Freeway, south along the Kwinana Freeway to South Street, west along South Street to Murdoch Drive, and in a general northerly direction along the future alignment of Murdoch Drive to Leach Highway.

The boundary parts of Leach Highway (south side), Kwinana Freeway (west side), South Street (north side), and Murdoch Drive (east side) are included within the area for the Bateman Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1982, and living within the boundary for the Bateman Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Bateman Primary School.

(Note: See also item on Bibra Lake area.)

2. Bibra Lake Area:

With the opening of the Leeming Primary School in February 1982, and until such time as a Government primary school is established in the locality of Bibra Lake, the direction of children, for primary schooling, from the eastern part of Bibra Lake, that is, within the area bounded on the north by the alignment of the Roe Freeway, on the east by the alignment of the Kwinana Freeway, on the south by the railway, and on the West by Forrest Road and North Lake Road, shall be that may attend any one of the following schools:—North Lake Primary, Koorilla Primary, Jandakot Primary, Bateman Primary, Leeming Primary (new 1982); but that they shall not attend Kardinya Primary School.

3. Hawker Park Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

From the junction of Badrick Street and Beach Road, north and northeast along Badrick Street to Dorchester Avenue, northwest along Dorchester Avenue to Ballantine Road, northeast and north along Ballantine Road to Warwick Road, southwest along Warwick Road to the alignment of the proposed Mitchell Freeway, southeast along the alignment of the proposed Mitchell Freeway to Beach Road, and east along Beach Road to Badrick Street.

The boundary parts of Warwick Road (south side), proposed Mitchell Freeway (east side) and Beach Road (north side) are included within the area for the Hawker Park Primary School. The boundary part of Dorchester Avenue (both sides) and the boundary streets of Ballantine Road and Badrick Street (both sides in each case) are optional between the Hawker Park Primary School and the Warwick Primary School.

- Children attending Government Schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1982, and living within the boundary for the Hawker Park Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Hawker Park Primary School, except at follows:
 - (i) Children in Year 7 in 1982, who currently (1981) attend the Warwick Primary School, shall have the option of completing their primary education at the Warwick Primary School or of transferring to the new Hawker Park Primary School.
 - (ii) Children living in the boundary part of Dorchester Avenue and the boundary streets of Ballantine Road and Badrick Street (both sides in all cases) may attend either the Hawker Park Primary School or the Warwick Primary School.

4. Warwick Primary School:

With the opening of the Hawker Park Primary School in 1982, it has become necessary to redefine the boundary for the Warwick Primary School as follows:—

From the junction of Beach Road and Badrick Street, east and northeast along Beach Road to Wanneroo Road, north along Wanneroo Road to Warwick Road, west along Warwick Road to Ballantine Road, south and southwest along Ballantine Road to Dorchester Avenue, southeast along Dorchester Avenue to Badrick Street, and southwest and south along Badrick Street to Beach Road.

The boundary parts of Beach Road (north side), Wanneroo Road (west side) and Warwick Road (south side) are included within the area for the Warwick Primary School. The boundary part of Dorchester Avenue (both sides) and the boundary street of Ballantine Road and Badrick Street (both sides in each case) are optional between the Warwick Primary School and the Hawker Park Primary School.

children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1982, and living within the area for the Warwick Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Warwick Primary School, except that children living in the boundary part of Dorchester Avenue and the boundary strees of Ballantine Road and Badrick Street (both sides in all cases) may attend either the Warwick Primary School or the Hawker Park Primary School.

5. Yangebup Primary School:

The boundary of the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

From the junction of Forrest Road and Christie Avenue, northwest along Forrest Road to the railway line, southwest along the railway line to Miguel Road, south along Miguel Road to Yangebup Road, southwest along Yangebup Road to Tindal Avenue,

south along Tindal Avenue to Fancote Avenue, east along Fancote Avenue to the junction with Henderson Road, east from this point to the junction of Lorimer Road and Wedge Road, and east from that point along Wedge Road to the southwest extremity of Kogolup Lake.

The boundary parts of Forrest Road (southwest side), Miguel Road (east side), Yangebup Road (south side), Fancote Avenue (north side) and Wedge Road, (both sides), and the boundary street of Tindal Avenue (east side) are included in the area for the Yangebup Primary School.

The following area, previously optional between Newton Primary School and Spearwood Primary School, shall now be optional between Yangebup Primary School, Newton Primary School and Spearwood Primary School:—

From the intersection of Stock Road and Yangebup Road, northeast along Yangebup Road to Miguel Road, north and northwest along Miguel Road and its continuation into Spearwood Avenue, northwest along Spearwood Avenue to Stock Road, and southwest, south and southwest along Stock Road to Yangebup Road.

The boundary parts of Yangebup Road (north side), Spearwood Avenue (west side) and Stock Road (east side), and the boundary street of Miguel Road (west side) are included in the optional area.

- Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1982, and living within the area for the Yangebup Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Yangebup Primary School, except as follows:—
 - (i) Children in Year 7 in 1982, who are currently (1981) enrolled at any other primary school in the area, shall have the option of completing their primary education at their present (1981) school or of transferring to the new Yangebup Primary School.
 - (ii) Children living in the optional area designated above may attend the Yangebup Primary School, the Newton Primary School or the Spearwood Primary School.

(Note: See also item on Bibra Lake area.)

6. Mandurah:

With the opening of the North Mandurah Primary School in 1982, and the creation of an optional area between the Mandurah and Dudley Park Primary Schools, it has become necessary to redefine the boundaries for various schools in the area as follows:—

(a) North Mandurah Primary School: The eastern and southern boundary for the North Mandurah Primary School is as follows:—

From the intersection of Lake Road and Gordon Road, south and southwest along Lake Road to Allnutt Street, west along Allnutt Street to Park Road, north along Park Road to Wyeree Road, west along Wyeree Road to Anstruther Road, northwest along Anstruther Road to and across Fremantle Road to Henson Street, and northwest along Henson Street and its extension to the Indian Ocean.

The boundary part of Wyeree Road (both sides) is included within the area for the North Mandurah Primary School while the boundary parts of Lake Road (both sides), Allnutt Street (both sides), Park Road (both sides), Anstruther Road (both sides), and the boundary street of Henson Street (both sides), are excluded from the area for the North Mandurah Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1982, and living within the area for the North Mandurah Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the North Mandurah Primary School, except as follows:—

- (i) Children in Year 7 in 1982, who are currently (1981) enrolled at any other primary school in the area, shall have the option of completing their primary education at their present (1981) school or of transferring to the new North Mandurah Primary School.
- (ii) Children who attended the Dudley Park Primary School in 1981 shall have the option of completing their primary education at the Dudley Park Primary School or of transferring to the new North Mandurah Primary School.

(b) Mandurah Primary School: The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:

From the Indian Ocean at the north-westerly extension of Henson Street, southeast to and along Henson Street to Fremantle Road, across Fremantle Road to Anstruther Road, southeast along Anstruther Road to Wyeree Road, east along Wyeree Road to Park Road, south along Park Road to Allnutt Street, east along Allnutt Street to Dower Street, south along Dower Street to Pinjarra Road, west along Pinjarra Road to the bridge crossing the Pinjarra Road to the bridge crossing the entrance to the Peel Inlet, and in a general northwesterly direction along the entrance to Peel Inlet to the Indian Ocean.

The boundary parts of Anstruther Road (both sides), Park Road (both sides), Allnutt Street (both sides), Pinjarra Road (north side) and the boundary street of Henson Street (both sides) are included within the area for the Mandurah Primary School, while the boundary part of Wyeree Road (both sides) and the boundary street of Dower Street (both sides) are excluded from the area for the Mandurah Primary School.

The following has been declared as an optional area between the Mandurah Primary School and the Dudley Park Primary School:—

From the junction of Dower Street and Allnutt Street, south along Dower Street to Pinjarra Road, east along Pinjarra Road to Lake Road, northeast along Lake Road to Allnutt Street, and west along Allnutt Street to Dower Street.

Children attending Government Schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1982 and living within the area for the Mandurah Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Mandurah Primary School, except that children living within the optional area designated above may attend either the Mandurah Primary School or the Dudley Park Primary School.

(c) Dudley Park Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:

From the junction of Lake Road and Gordon Road, south and southwest along Lake Road to Pinjarra Road, west along Pinjarra Road to the bridge crossing the entrance to the Peel Inlet, south to the southernmost part of the entrance to the Peel Inlet, east along the shoreline to the entrance to the Serpentine River, and in a general northerly direction along the Ser-pentine River to Goegrup Lake.

The boundary parts of Lake Road (both sides) and Pinjarra Road (south side) are included within the area for the Dudley Park Primary School.

The following has been declared as an optional area between the Dudley Park Primary School and the Mandurah Primary School:-

> From the junction of Pinjarra Road and Dower Street, east along Pinjarra Road to Lake Road, northeast along Lake Road to

Allnutt Street, west along Allnutt Street to Dower Street, and south along Dower Street to Pinjarra Road.

The boundary parts of Pinjarra Road (north side), Allnutt Street (both sides) and the boundary street of Dower Street (both sides) are included within the optional area, as provided above, while the boundary part of Lake Road (both sides) is excluded from the optional area.

Children attending Government Schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1982, and living within the area for the Dudley Park Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Dudley Park Primary School, except as follows:

- (i) Children living within the optional area designated above may attend either the Dudley Park Primary School or the Mandurah Primary School,
- Children from the area designated for the North Mandurah Primary School who attended the Dudley Park Primary School in 1981 shall have the option of completing their primary education at the Dudley Park Primary School or of transferring to the new North Mandurah Primary School.

7. Craigie Area:

With the extension of residential development in the east of the locality of Craigie, it has become necessary to re-define the boundaries for the Camberwarra and Craigie Primary Schools.

(a) Camberwarra Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:

From the intersection of Ocean Reef Road From the intersection of Ocean Reef Road and the proposed Mitchell Freeway, northwest along Ocean Reef Road to Craigie Drive, southwest along Craigie Drive to Marmion Avenue, south along Marmion Avenue to Albion Street, east along Albion Street to Camberwarra Drive, north along Camberwarra Drive to Arawa Place, east along Arawa Place and its easterly extension to Camberwarra Drive, north along Camber to Camberwarra Drive, north along Camberwarra Drive to Corima Place, east along Corima Place to Delcomyn Place, south along Delcomyn Place to the Public access way through to Eddystone Avenue, east along the public access way to Eddystone Avenue, south along Eddystone Avenue to the public access way through to Ben Close, east along the public access way to Ben Close, southeast along Ben Close to Allambie Drive, northeast along Allambie Drive to Chadstone Road, north along Chadstone Road to Spicer Court, east along Spicer Court, and Spicer Court, east along Spicer Court and its extension to the proposed Mitchell Freeway, and north along the alignment of the proposed Mitchell Freeway to Ocean Reef Road.

The boundary parts of Ocean Reef Road (south side), Craigie Drive (south side), Marmion Avenue (east side), Camberwarra Drive, western arm (west side) and the eastern arm (west side), Eddystone Avenue (east side), Chadstone Road (west side) and the bandary extent of Science Court (1st). the boundary street of Spicer Court (both sides) are included within the area for the Camberwarra Primary School, while the boundary parts of Delcomyn Place (both sides) and Allambie Drive (both sides), and the boundary streets of Albion Street (both sides), Arawa Place (both sides), Corima Place (both sides) and Ben Close (both sides) are excluded from the area for the Camberwarra Primary School Camberwarra Primary School.

Children attending Government Schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1982, and living within the boundary for the Camberwarra Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Camberwarra Primary School.

(b) Craigie Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:—

From the intersection of Marmion Avenue and Whitford Avenue, north along Marmion Avenue to Albion Street, east along Albion Street to Camberwarra Drive, north along Camberwarra Drive to Arawa Place, east along Arawa Place and its easterly extension to Camberwarra Drive, north along Camberwarra Drive to Corima Place, east along Corima Place to Delcomyn Place, south along Delcomyn Place to the public access way through to Eddystone Avenue, east along the public access way to Eddystone Avenue south, along Eddystone Avenue to the public access way to Ben Close, southeast along Ben Close to Allambie Drive, northeast along Allambie Drive to Chadstone Road, north along Chadstone Road to Spicer Court, east along Spicer Court and its extension to the proposed Mitchell Freeway, south along the alignment of the proposed Mitchell Freeway, south along the alignment of the proposed Mitchell Freeway to Whitford Avenue, and in a general westerly direction along Whitford Avenue to Marmion Avenue.

The boundary parts of Marmion Avenue (east side). Camberwarra Drive, western arm (east side) and eastern arm (east side), Delcomyn Place (both sides), Eddystone Avenue (west side), Allambie Drive (both sides), Chadstone Road (east side), the proposed Mitchell Freeway (west side), Whitford Avenue (north side), and the boundary streets of Albion Street (both sides), Arawa Place (both sides), Corima Place (both sides) and Ben Close (both sides) are included within the area for the Craigie Primary School while the boundary street of Spicer Court (both sides) is excluded from the area for the Craigie Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1982, and living within the boundary for the Craigie Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Craigie Primary School.

8. Morley Area:

The creation of an optional area from what was previously part of the catchment area for the West Morley Primary School has necessitated redefining the boundaries for some of the schools in the area as follows:—

(a) West Morley Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

From the junction of Lennard Street and Morley Drive, southeast along Lennard Street to Walter Road, northeast along Walter Road to Light Street, northwest along Light Street to Smith Street, northeast along Smith Street to Wellington Road, northwest along Wellington Road to Morley Drive, and west, southwest and west along Morley Drive to Lennard Street.

The boundary parts of Walter Road (northwest side), Light Street (both sides), Wellington Road (southwest side) and Morley Drive (south side), and the boundary street of Smith Street (both sides) are included within the area for the West Morley Primary School, while the boundary street of Lennard Street (both sides) is excluded from the area for the West Morley Primary School.

The following area is optional between the West
Morley Primary School and the Morley Primary School:—

From the junction of Walter Road and Light Street, northwest along Light Street to Smith Street, northeast along Smith Street to Russell Street, southeast along Russell Street to Walter Road, and southwest along Walter Road to Light Street.

The boundary parts of Russell Street (both sides) and Walter Road (northwest side) are included within the optional area, as provided above, while the boundary parts of Light Street (both sides) and Smith Street (both sides) are excluded from the optional area.

The following area has been declared an optional area between the West Morley Primary School and the North Morley Primary School:—

From the intersection of Camboon Road, Morley Drive and Wellington Road, north along Camboon Road to Lincoln Road, west along Lincoln Road to Wellington Road, northwest along Wellington Road to Cheviot Place, southwest along Cheviot Place to Cheviot Street, northwest along Cheviot Street to Lyndhurst Street, southwest along Lyndhurst Street to Light Street, southeast along Light Street to Morley Drive, and in a general northeasterly direction along Morley Drive to Camboon Road.

The boundary parts of Camboon Road (west side), Lincoln Road (both sides), Cheviot Street (both sides), Light Street (both sides) and Morley Drive (north side), and the boundary street of Cheviot Place (both sides) are included within the optional area, as provided above, while the boundary part of Wellington Road (both sides) and the boundary street of Lyndhurst Street (both sides) are excluded from the optional area.

Children attending Government Schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1982, and living within the area for the West Morley Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the West Morley Primary School, except as follows:—

- Children from the first-mentioned optional area, referred to above, may attend either the West Morley Primary School or the Morley Primary School.
- (ii) Children from the second optional area, referred to above may attend either the West Morley Primary School or the North Morley Primary School.

(b) North Morley Primary School: The boundary for the abovementioned school

From the junction of Light Street and Yirrigan Drive, southeast along Light Street to Lyndhurst Street, northeast along Lyndhurst Street to Cheviot Street, southeast along Cheviot Street to Cheviot Place, northeast along Cheviot Place to Wellington Road, southeast along Wellington Road to Lincoln Road, east along Lincoln Road to Camboon Road, north along Camboon Road to Wolseley Road, west along Wolseley Road to Hookwood Street, north along Hookwood Street to Noranda Avenue, southwest and west along Noranda Avenue to a point due south of a line between Hayden Close on the west and Sunderland Place on the east, north and northwest along this line between Hayden Close, Farmer Court, Monk Place and Callaghan Way on the west and Sunderland Place, Hepworth Way and Newell Way on the east, to Bramwell Road, east along Bramwell Road to the eastern boundary of the Morley Senior High School site to Widgee Road, west along Widgee Road to the northwestern corner of the Morley Senior High School site, and then due north along a line between Bohemia Place on the west and Luderman Road and Ing Place on the east, to the proposed alignment of the North Perimeter Highway.

The boundary parts of Light Street (both sides). Wellington Road (both sides), Camboon Road (west side) and Noranda Avenue (both sides), and the boundary street of Lyndhurst Street (both sides) are included

within the area for the North Morley Primary School, while the boundary parts of Cheviot Street (both sides), Lincoln Road (both sides), Wolseley Road (both sides), Bramwell Road (both sides), and Widges Road (both sides), and the boundary streets of Cheviot Place (both sides) and Hookwood Street (both sides) are excluded from the area for the North Morley Primary School.

The following area has been declared an optional area between the North Morley Primary School and the West Morley Primary School:—

From the intersection of Camboon Road, Morley Drive and Wellington Road, north along Camboon Road to Lincoln Road, west along Lincoln Road to Wellington Road, northwest along Wellington Road to Cheviot Place. southwest along Cheviot Place to Cheviot Street, northwest along Cheviot Street to Lyndhurst Street, southwest along Lyndhurst Street to Light Street, southeast along Light Street to Morley Drive and in a general northeasterly direction along Morley Drive to Camboon Road.

The boundary parts of Camboon Road (west side), Lincoln Road (both sides), and Morley Drive (north side), and the boundary street of Cheviot Place (both sides) are included within the optional area, as provided above, while the boundary part of Wellington Road (both sides) and the boundary street of Lyndhurst Street (both sides) are excluded from the optional area.

children attending Government Schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1982, and living within the area for the North Morley Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the North Morley Primary School, except that children from the optional area designated above may attend either the North Morley Primary School or the West Morley Primary School.

9. Rossmoyne and Shelley Primary Schools:

The boundaries for the Rossmoyne and Shelley Primary Schools remain the same as previously gazetted, except as follows:—

The area bounded by Fifth Avenue, Leach Highway, Beatrice Avenue and Riverton Drive North is to be optional between the two schools. The boundary parts of Leach Highway (north side) and Riverton Drive North (both sides) and the boundary street of Beatrice Avenue (both sides) are included in this optional area while the boundary street of Fifth Avenue (both sides) is excluded from this optional area.

10. Rossmoyne and Willetton Primary Schools:

The boundaries for the Rossmoyne and Willetton Primary Schools remain the same as previously gazetted, except as follows:— The area bounded by Leach Highway, Karel Avenue and Keith Road is to be optional between the two schools. The boundary part of Leach Highway (south side) and Karel Avenue (west side) and the boundary street of Keith Road (north side) are included in the optional area.

11. Katanning:

The creation of an optional area from what was previously part of the catchment area for the Braeside Primary School has necessitated re-defining the boundary for the Braeside Primary School as follows:

Braeside Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:—

From the junction of Marmion Street and Carew Street, southeast along Carew Street to Cove Street, northeast along Cove Street to Conroy Street, southeast along Conroy Street to Clive Street, northeast along Clive Street to Park Street, southeast along Park Street to Park Street, northeast along Park Street to Adam Street, southeast along Park Street to Round Drive, and northeast and north along Round Drive.

The boundary parts of Carew Street, Cove Street, Conroy Street, Clive Street, Piesse Street, Park Street, Adam Street and Round Drive (both sides in each case) are excluded from the area for the Braeside Primary School.

The following area is to be optional between the Braeside Primary School and the Katanning Primary School:

From the northern end of the north/south alignment of Round Drive, south and southwest along Round Drive to Adam Street, south-east along Adam Street to its junction with Drove Street, and east from this point along the Nyabing Road.

The boundary part of Round Drive (both sides) is included within the optional area, while the boundary parts of Adam Street and the Nyabing Road (both sides in each case) are excluded from the optional area.

Children attending Government Schools and in Years 1 to 5 in 1982 (Years 1 to 6 in 1983, Years 1 to 7 in 1984), and living in the area to the north of the boundary for the Braeside Primary School, as defined above, shall attend the Braeside Primary School. Children from the optional area referred to above and in Years 1 to 5 in 1982 (Years 1 to 6 in 1983, Years 1 to 7 in 1984) may attend either the Braeside Primary School or the Katanning Primary School. Children travelling on the Bullock Hills, Cartmeticup, Kwobrup and Warren Road buses and in Years 1 to 5 in 1982 (Years 1 to 6 in 1983, Years 1 to 7 in 1984) may attend the Braeside Primary School or the Katanning Primary School or the Katanning Primary School.

COLLEGES ACT 1978-1980.

PURSUANT to section 26 (1) of the Colleges Act 1978-1980, the Interim Council of the Western Australian College of Advanced Education hereby makes the Statutes set out in the Schedule hereto and authorises the affixing of the Seal thereto.

Schedule.

Statute No. 1.

Interpretation.

1.0 In any Statute including a by-law or rule made under the Statute or in any by-law made under the Colleges Act 1978-1980, unless the contrary intention appears—

"Academic Staff" means those members of the staff of the College who have been appointed to the full time academic staff and shall include the Director.

"Authorised Sealing Officer" means an officer authorised by the Council to attest the Common seal in conjunction with the Chairman or member presiding and the Director.

"By-law" means a by-law made pursuant to section 29 (3) of the Act.

- "Candidate" means a member of staff or an enrolled student nominated for election to the Council in the manner prescribed for that purpose.
- "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Council appointed or elected pursuant to section 16 of the Act.
- "College" means the Western Australian College of Advanced Education established under the Act.
- "Deputy Chairman" means the Deputy Chairman of the Council elected pursuant to section 16 of the Act.
- "Director" means the person appointed to be the Chief Executive Officer of the College pursuant to section 30 of the Act and includes a person appointed as Acting Director.
- "Enrolled Student" means a student enrolled at the College.
- "Minister" means Minister for Education of the State of Western Australia.
- "Other staff" means those members of the staff of the College who have been appointed to the full-time salaried staff other than the academic staff.
- "Rule" means any rule or by-law made under a Statute pursuant to section 26 (7) of the Act.
- "Sealed" means sealed with the Seal.
- "Section" means a section of the Statute in which the word is used.
- "Statute" means a Statute of the College made pursuant to section 26 of the Act.
- "The Act" means the Colleges Act 1978-1980.
- "The Seal" means the Common Seal of the College.
- 2.0 The Interpretation Act 1918-1962, applies to the Statutes and to by-laws or rules made under the Statutes as if they were by-laws or rules made under the Colleges Act 1978-1980.
- 3.0 In any Statute, by-law or rule, unless the contrary intention appears, a reference to a member of the Council, a member of the staff or an officer or functionary of the College, or to such a person by the name of his office includes a reference to every person for the time being duly acting in the place of such a person or in such an office or duly discharging the duties of such a person or such an office.

Statute No. 2.

Common Seal.

- 1.0 In this Statute, unless the content otherwise requires "Common Seal" means the Common Seal of the College described in Section 2.
 - 2.0 Common Seal.
 - 2.1 The form of the Seal of the College is



- 2.2 The Director shall keep the Seal in strict custody.
- 2.3 Authorisation.
- 2.3.1 The seal shall not be affixed to any document except by authority of a resolution of the Council or as authorised by sub-section 2.3.2 of this section.
- 2.3.2 Where a document required to be sealed relates to matters which in the opinion of the Chairman or in his absence, the Deputy Chairman.
 - (i) do not require prior consideration by the Council; or
- (ii) are of a specially urgent nature, the Chairman, or Deputy Chairman (as the case may be) may direct that the Seal be affixed to that document.

Statute No. 4.

Rules of the College.

- 1. The Council may make rules not inconsistent with the Act or with any statute with respect to:
 - (a) the management, good government and discipline of the College;
 - (b) the use and custody of the Common Seal of the College, and the functions of the Council that may be exercised without the use of the common seal for that purpose;
 - (c) the organisation and supervision of the teaching of enrolled students.
 - (d) the academic and other staff, officers and employees of the College and its branches:
 - (e) the manner and time of convening, holding and adjourning the meetings of the Council, the manner of voting at those meetings, the powers and duties of the Chairman, the conduct and record of business, the appointment of committees of the Council and the quorum, powers and duties of those committees:
 - (f) the entrance standard for students;
 - (g) the granting of appropriate degrees, diplomas and certificates or honorary awards by the Council;
 - (h) the granting of scholarships, exhibitions, bursaries and prizes;
 - (i) the fees to be charged for courses of study or instruction, examinations, degrees, diplomas and certificates of the Council and for such other facilities or privileges of the College as are prescribed;
 - (j) the admission of graduates and students of other educational institutions to any corresponding status in the College without examination;
 - (k) the recognition, instead of or for the purpose of any examination or course of study, of any course of study completed or examination passed in any educational institution;
 - (1) the establishment by the Council of hostels, and halls of residence for enrolled students and the management, control and closing of any of those hostels and halls;
 - (m) the government of Colleges, hostels and halls of residence that are under the control of the Council, the affiliation of Colleges, hostels and halls of residence that are not under the control of the Council and the licensing and supervision of boarding houses catering for enrolled students and for the revocation of the licensing thereof; and
 - (n) the control, management and investment of the property of the College.
 - 2. A Rule made by resolution of the Council shall be sealed with the Seal.
- 3. The Council may by resolution, revoke or amend the whole or any part of a Rule. A Rule shall not be revoked or amended unless notice of the intention to move such a motion is placed on the agenda of a meeting of the Council.
- A Rule, the amendment of a Rule or the revocation of a Rule shall be published at the College by posting a copy of it on a notice board in or outside that part of the College building or buildings containing the administration offices of the College or as directed and authorised by the Council.
- 5. A Rule shall take effect from the date upon which it is so published or from a later date to be specified in the Rule.

Statute No. 5.

The Council.

- 1.0 In this Statute unless the contrary intention appears "meeting" means a meeting of the Council.
 - 2.0 Council to meet.
- 2.1 The Council shall hold such meetings as are necessary for the exercise of its functions.
 - The Chairman may at any time convene a meeting of the Council.
- 2.3 Upon the written request of any four (4) members of the Council, the Chairman shall convene a special meeting of the Council to be held within fourteen (14) days of the request. The written request shall set forth the object or objects for which the meeting is required.
 - 3.0 Quorum.
- 3.1 At a meeting of the Council not less than one-half of the total number of members for the time being shall constitute a quorum.
- 3.2 In the event of a quorum not being present within half-an-hour after the time appointed for a meeting, the meeting shall be adjourned to a time not later than fourteen (14) days after the date of such adjournment.
 - 4.0 Passage of Resolutions-At a meeting of the Council:
- 4.1 all motions shall be passed on the basis of a majority of the valid votes of members present;
 - the Chairman shall have a deliberative vote only;
- 4.3 when any question voted upon by the Council results in an equal number for and against, the Chairman shall declare the question lost.
 - 5.0 Rescinding of a Resolution.

A resolution of the Council shall not be rescinded unless notice of the intention to propose such rescission is placed on the agenda of a meeting.

- Committees of the Council.
- The Council from time to time may:
 - (i) appoint Committees either for general or specific purposes;
 - (ii) require a Committee to advise the Council in respect of any matter or class
- 6.2 The membership of Committees appointed by the Council shall be determined by the Council and may include persons who are not members of the Council.
- 6.3 The Director shall be an ex officio member of all Committees established by the Council except when specifically excluded by resolution of the Council.
 - 7.0 Delegation of Power.

The Director shall cause an appropriate officer of the Council to establish and maintain a register of all resolutions of the Council passed pursuant to section 25 of the Act delegating all or any of the Council's powers, authorities, duties and functions under the Act and all resolutions revoking any such delegation.

8.0 Rules of Debate.

Subject to the provisions of this Statute, the Chairman shall regulate the procedings of all meetings of the Council.

Statute No. 6.

Chief Executive Officer.

- The person for the time being appointed as the Chief Executive Officer of the College is the Director of the College.
- 2. Subject to the Act, the Statutes, By-laws and Rules of the College, and resolutions of the Council, the Director is responsible for the academic, administrative and other affairs of the College.
- . The Director shall promote the interests and further the development of the College.

- The Director shall from time to time report to the Council on the affairs of the College.
 - 5. The Director has all such powers and duties as may be-
 - (a) necessary or convenient to enable him to carry out his responsibilities;
 - (b) conferred on him by the Act, Statutes, By-laws and Rules of the College; or
 - (c) delegated to or conferred on him by a resolution of the Council.
- 6. Without limiting the generality of the Director's power under Section 5, he has the power to exercise general supervision over the activities and welfare of the staff and students of the College.
- 7. Unless otherwise prescribed, the Director may delegate any of his powers and duties to any person or Committee of persons.
 - (1) The Director may-
 - (a) if he considers it desirable, preside at any meeting of any such Committee, excluding Council Committees unless so appointed by the Council;
 - (b) appoint a person to represent him on any such Committee.

COLLEGES ACT 1978-1980.

WESTERN AUSTRALIAN COLLEGE OF ADVANCED EDUCATION COLLEGE BY-LAWS.

BY-LAWS made under section 29 sub-section 3 of this Act.

Part 1-General Provisions.

- 1. (1) These By-laws may be cited as the Western Australian College of Advanced Education By-laws and shall come into force when approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette.
 - (2) In these By-laws unless the context otherwise requires-
 - "Act" means the Colleges Act 1978-1980 as amended from time to time;
 - "authorised" means authorised by the Director or an authorised officer, or the Council, and "without authority" means without the authority of the Director, an authorised officer, or the Council;
 - "authorised officer" means a member of the staff of the College authorised by the Director to act under and for the purposes of these By-laws or, where the case expressly requires, a member of the staff of the College authorised by the Council;
 - "Council" means the Council of the College;
 - "College" means the Western Australian College of Advanced Education as constituted by the Act;
 - "College lands" has the same meaning as defined in the Act;
 - "Director" means the Director of the College;
 - "park" or "parking" includes leaving a vehicle standing or waiting whether it is occupied or not;
 - "parking permit" means a permit to park a vehicle issued in accordance with these By-laws;
 - "permit" means a permit in accordance with these By-laws;
 - "roadway" means any part of the College lands designed and established for the carriage or parking of vehicles;
 - "student" means a student enrolled in the College;
 - "traffic sign" means an authorised marking, notice or sign to regulate or guide traffic or the parking of vehicles or to prescribe maximum speed limits;
 - "vehicle" includes car, truck, bus, motor cycle, motor scooter, bicycle, semi-trailer or caravan and any other form of conveyance, or trailer however ridden, driven or propelled.
 - These By-laws shall apply—
 - (a) within the boundaries of the College lands, and to every part of the College lands; and
 - (b) to every person who is at any time on the College lands.

- 3. The Council may delegate any function, power or duty conferred or imposed on it by these By-laws in accordance with the Act and the Council or its delegate may by writing authorise any person to act under and for the purposes of these By-laws.
- 4. The Director may from time to time declare that a particular area or areas within the College lands—
 - (a) shall be open to members of the public or any specified section of the public subject to such conditions as may be specified in the declaration;
 - (b) may be used for specified activities by members of named clubs or organizations or other persons referred to in the declaration subject to compliance with such conditions as may be specified in the declaration; and no person shall use any such area unless he is a member of the named club or organisation or is one of the persons or class of persons to which the declaration refers, and the use is for the specified activity, and in accordance with the specified conditions (if any).

Any declaration by the Director under this By-law may be modified or revoked by him at any time and without notice.

- 5. (1) Every application for a permit under these By-laws shall be made to the Director or an authorised officer.
- (2) The Director may prescribe such categories of parking permit as he thinks fit. A parking permit shall have effect as described in By-law 37.
- (3) The Director or an authorised officer to whom an application for a permit or parking permit is made may either issue the permit or parking permit to the applicant or refuse the application or issue the permit or parking permit subject to such conditions (including the payment of a fee) in each case as he shall in his discretion decide.
- (4) The Director or an authorised officer may vary, suspend or revoke any permit issued to any person who has committed a breach of these By-laws.
- (5) It shall be deemed to be a condition of every permit issued (whether gratuitious or otherwise) that the holder of the permit or any person or category of persons specified in the permit does the act authorised by the permit at his own risk and a condition of every parking permit issued that the College is not and shall not be liable or responsible in any way for the safe custody of a vehicle or its contents.

Part II-Land By-Laws.

- 6. (1) Any of the following persons may enter and remain on College lands—
 - (a) A person who is a member of the Council, a member of the staff of the College other than a person employed on a casual basis, a graduate of the College or a student, a member of the staff of the Student Council, or an employee of a business lawfully conducted on the College lands;
 - (b) a member of the Western Australian Post-Secondary Education Commission or staff of the Commission;
 - (c) a person attending a course of study at the College or other authorised activities at the College, during such times and in respect of such areas within the College lands as are appropriate for the purposes of such activities;
 - (d) a person who holds a permit or in relation to whom a permit has been issued authorising him to enter or remain on the College lands and who observes all conditions of the permit;
 - (e) a person who enters or remains on the College lands in good faith for the purpose of transacting lawful business or having lawful dealings with the College or with a person lawfully on the College lands unless the business or other dealing has been prohibited by the Director; or
 - (f) a person to whom a declaration by the Director under By-law 4 applies, in relation only to that area that is the subject of the declaration and during the hours specified in the declaration.

No other person may enter or remain in the College lands without authority.

- (2) A person described in paragraphs 1 (a) to (f) inclusive of this By-law shall not, without authority, enter or remain on any part of the College lands which is not customarily open to entry by him or to which the Director has forbidden entry.
- 7. No person shall throw or leave rubbish, refuse, paper, bottles, glass (broken or otherwise) or litter of any kind except in receptacles provided for the purpose.
 - 8. No person shall-
 - (a) assault or attempt to threaten to assault any other person;
 - (b) use abusive or insulting language or do or engage in any offensive, indecent, or improper act, conduct or behaviour; or
 - (c) otherwise act in such a way as to cause or be likely to cause a nuisance or annoyance to other persons on or in the vicinity of the College lands.
- 9. No person shall write, draw, print, publish, record, broadcast, distribute, or otherwise disseminate any indecent or obscene matter of any kind or perform any indecent or obscene act of any kind.
 - 10. No person shall, without authority-
 - (a) post, paint or otherwise affix to any building, structure or tree on the College lands or publish or distribute within the College lands any placard, paper, notice or advertisement or other written, printed or graphic matter; or
 - (b) write, draw or paint on or deface any building, structure or tree on the College lands.

- 11. No person shall without authority bring or keep or cause to be brought or kept or consume intoxicating liquor on any part of the College lands.
- 12. No person shall without authority bring on or keep or cause to be brought or kept or consume any deleterious, addictive, noxious or hallucinatory drug or substance or any implement or devices designed or used to administer such drugs or substances on any part of the College lands.
 - 13. No person shall without authority—
 - (a) cut, break, deface, pick, injure, destroy or remove any tree, shrub, plant, flower, garden or lawns;
 - (b) damage, remove or interfere with any stake or label on or near any tree, shrub, plant, flower, garden or lawns;
 - (c) walk on or cause damage to any bed containing or being prepared for shrubs or flowers;
 - (d) enter or remain in any pond, lake, or ornamental water;
 - (e) enter an area which is temporarily enclosed and on or by which is a notice prohibiting entry; or
 - (f) damage, interfere with or move any part of the College lands or any fixed or movable article on the College lands.
 - 14. No person shall without authority-
 - (a) carry or discharge a firearm or other offensive weapon;
 - (b) light a fire except where fireplaces are provided;
 - (c) throw or release a stone or other missile or any dangerous material of any kind;
 - (d) create or discharge any offensive or dangerous gas, smoke, smell or noise;
 - (e) bring on to or allow to be brought on to the College lands or make any bomb or other explosive device.
- 15. No person shall without authority disturb, frighten, shoot at or throw missiles at, or otherwise attempt to capture or kill any bird, fish or animal.
- 16. No person shall without authority sell or hire, expose or offer for sale or hire, or solicit orders for the purchase or hire of any goods or services, or solicit donations for charity or beg.
 - 17. No person shall without authority bring any animal on to College lands.
 - 18. (1) No person shall without authority, arrange, advertise or take part in:
 - (a) any fete, picnic or concert or other performance; or
 - (b) any public speaking or preaching;
- but this By-law does not apply to any activity exempted either generally or specifically by the Director or any activity specified in a declaration by the Director under By-law 4.
- (2) Subject to these By-laws, meetings of associations of academic staff, other salaried staff and students which, in the opinion of the Director, are being conducted in an orderly manner, may be held on College lands.
 - 19. No person shall without authority-
 - (a) bet or offer to bet or accept a bet;
 - (b) sell, purchase or offer for sale or purchase any ticket or coupon for or which purports to be for a sweep, horse race or other lottery; or
 - (c) play cards for money or engage in any other form of gambling.
- 20. No person shall do or engage in any act or behave in any manner that is declared by an authorised sign to be prohibited or not allowed.
 - 21. No person shall obstruct-
 - (a) any member of the Police Force or member of the staff of the College in the discharge of his duty; or
 - (b) any person in the exercise and enjoyment by him of any lawful activity.
- 22. No child apparently under the age of fifteen years may enter or be taken into or allowed to remain on the College lands unless at all times in the charge of an adult person.
- 23. A person shall, if and when required to do so by a member of the Police Force or an authorised officer who reasonably believes that the person is on the College lands in breach of a By-law or that he has otherwise committed a breach of a By-law, give his name and address and if required by the member of the Police Force or authorised officer, leave the College lands or such part of the College lands as may be specified by the member of the Police Force or authorised officer.
- 24. A member of the Police Force or authorised officer may remove from the College lands a person whom the member of the Police Force or authorised officer reasonably believes is causing an annoyance or inconvenience, or is using any obscene, blasphemous or indecent language.
- 25. A person shall, if and when required to do so by a member of the Police Force or an authorised officer, remove any vehicle, animal or other thing of whatever kind over which he has control or which he owns from the College lands.
- 26. (1) The Director may notify in writing any person whose presence on the College lands is in the opinion of the Director detrimental to the welfare of the College, that he is forbidden to enter or remain on the College lands or any specified

part thereof and after receipt of such notification, notwithstanding any other provision of these By-laws, the person notified shall not enter or remain or attempt to enter or remain on the College lands or the specified part, and if he should do so or attempt to do so he shall commit a breach of these By-laws.

- (2) The Director may in writing direct that a specified part of the College lands be forthwith cleared and closed and that all persons then or thereafter in or on that part of the College lands (other than authorised officers) shall forthwith leave and disperse. If any person fails to leave the specified part of the College lands as directed he shall commit a breach of these By-laws.
- (3) If a person shall commit a breach of any of these By-laws, an authorised officer may give to the person a notice, in a form approved by the Director, which notice shall—
 - (a) be identified by a serial number;
 - (b) if the name of the person is known to the authorised officer be addressed by name to the person;
 - (c) state that it is alleged that a breach of a by-law has been committed and in general terms the breach which it is alleged has been committed;
 - (d) state that the breach will be reported and that further action may be taken unless within the time and manner stated in the notice—
 - (i) the modified penalty specified in By-law 52 (3) and indicated on the notice be paid; or
 - (ii) within seven days an explanation in writing addressed to the Director is given for the breach in which case further notice will be given either that the explanation is accepted or that the explanation is not accepted and further action will be taken failing payment of the modified penalty indicated on the notice within fourteen days after the date on the further notice;
 - (e) state the modified penalty payable.
- (4) If the authorised officer is unable to give the notice to the person by handing it to him, it may be given by posting it to the person at his last known place of abode.
- (5) If the person to whom notice under paragraph (1) of this By-law is given, gives a written explanation to the Director in accordance with the terms of the notice, the Director may either accept the explanation or not accept it and he may give the person a further notice stating that further action may be taken if the modified penalty indicated on the notice is not paid within fourteen days after the date of the further notice.

Part III-Traffic By-laws.

- 27. A person who brings a vehicle upon the College lands does so at his own risk and the College is not and shall not be liable or responsible in any way for the safe custody of a vehicle or its contents.
- 28. No person shall without authority drive, or bring a vehicle on the College lands except on the roadways or parking areas.
- 29. No person shall drive a vehicle on the College lands in a dangerous or careless manner or without all reasonable consideration for other persons and vehicles in the vicinity.
- 30. No person shall drive a vehicle at a speed exceeding 25 kilometres an hour or such lower maximum speed as may be specified by a traffic sign with respect to a particular area or stretch of roadway.
- 31. A person who is about to drive or is driving a vehicle into or out of a parking area shall give way to all other vehicles passing along a roadway.
- 32. A person driving or in charge of a vehicle shall obey every signal, order or direction addressed to him by a member of the Police Force or an authorised officer in relation to the movement or control of traffic.
- 33. A person driving a vehicle shall comply with all directions relating to traffic shown on traffic signs.
- 34. No person driving or in charge of a vehicle on a roadway shall commit or do any act which would be a breach of any Act or Regulation of the State of Western Australia if such roadway were a "road" for purposes of the Road Traffic Act 1974.
- 35. (1) The Director or an authorised officer may set apart a place or places as a parking area for vehicles, and may by a traffic sign displayed on or near a parking area specify the hours during which it may be used for parking, the kinds of vehicles that may be parked there, the persons who are entitled to use it, the length of time a vehicle is permitted to be parked there, or otherwise regulate its use.
- (2) A person shall not park a vehicle except in a parking area so set apart for parking by him and during permitted hours.
- 36. An authorised officer may by an authorised sign placed on or near a parking bay in a parking area, reserve that parking bay for a specific purpose or a specified person or class of persons.
- 37. A parking permit shall be issued with respect to a particular vehicle in such form as may be approved by the Director from time to time, signed by the Director or an authorised officer and unless the permit is varied, suspended or revoked it shall be current until the date of expiry specified in the permit.

- 38. A parking permit affixed to a vehicle in accordance with these By-laws entitles the holder to park the vehicle during the currency of the permit in an unreserved parking bay in that section of any parking area set aside for such persons or categories or classes of persons unless such permit is varied, suspended or revoked.
- 39. (1) If the holder of a parking permit changes the vehicle or the registration number of the vehicle in respect of which the permit has been issued, he shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Director or as he shall from time to time direct.
 - (2) Parking permits shall not be transferable.
- 40. Except as provided in By-law 42, no person shall park a vehicle unless he holds a parking permit or parks a vehicle on behalf of a person who holds a permit. The holder of a parking permit or a person who parks a vehicle on behalf of a person who holds a parking permit shall not park a vehicle except in accordance with the terms of the permit.
- 41. The holder of a parking permit shall affix the permit to the vehicle for which it was issued in such manner as shall be required by the permit.
- 42. A visitor to the College, which expression shall include the persons specified in By-law 6 (1) paragraphs (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f), may park a vehicle in an unreserved parking bay in an area marked by a traffic sign as a visitor's car park.
 - 43. (1) This By-law applies whenever-
 - (a) a vehicle is parked in a manner that is in breach of these By-laws;
 - (b) a vehicle is driven by a person in a manner that is in breach of these By-laws; or
 - (c) there is otherwise a breach of these By-laws with respect to a vehicle.
- (2) If a permit has been issued with respect to the vehicle which is current, the permit holder shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these By-laws described in paragraph (1) of this By-law. If no permit has been issued which is current, or the permit holder is not residing at the address on the permit at the time of the breach of these By-laws, the owner of the vehicle (for the purposes of the Road Traffic Act 1974) shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these By-laws.
- (3) It shall be a defence to a charge under this By-law that the permit holder or owner of the vehicle (as the case may require) has satisfied an authorised officer that the vehicle was stolen or was being unlawfully used at the time of the alleged breach.
- (4) If the permit holder or owner of the vehicle did not himself park or drive the vehicle in the manner that is in breach of these By-laws, the person who did so park or drive the vehicle in breach of these By-laws shall also have committed the breach of these By-laws (whether or not paragraph (3) of this By-law applies).
- (5) The driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall, upon being required by a member of the Police Force or an authorised officer who reasonably believes he has committed a breach of these By-laws, furnish that officer with his full name and address.
 - 44. No person shall without authority—
 - (a) park a vehicle in a no parking area, or in a loading bay or other place reserved by an authorised sign for a particular purpose, except in accordance with that purpose;
 - (b) park a vehicle other than wholly within the marked boundary of any parking bay marked on a parking area;
 - (c) park a vehicle in such a position as to interfere with traffic or obstruct other vehicles;
 - (d) park a motor cycle, motor scooter, or bicycle on any roadway or other area on which there are marked parking bays of an area appropriate for the parking of four-wheel vehicles.
- 45. (1) A vehicle parked in breach of these By-laws or in such a position as to interfere with traffic or obstruct other vehicles, or apparently abandoned, may be removed under the authority of the Director, a member of the Police Force or an authorised officer to such a place whether on or off the College lands as the Director, a member of the Police Force or authorised officer may determine.
- (2) A person removing a vehicle under the authority of this By-law is entitled to take such action whether by way of unlocking, entering by any means, driving or towing the vehicle or otherwise as may be reasonably necessary for the purpose of effecting the removal.
- (3) The owner of a vehicle so removed shall pay all costs and expenses incurred by the College in moving it and neither the College nor any officer, employee or agent of the College shall be liable to the owner of any vehicle so removed for any loss or damage suffered by him arising out of or in consequence of the vehicle being so removed.
- (4) The College may retain possession of a vehicle so removed until any amount payable under paragraph (3) of this By-law is paid.
- 46. (1) If a person drives a vehicle in a manner that is in breach of these By-laws or there is otherwise a breach of these By-laws with respect to a vehicle, an authorised officer may affix on the vehicle or give to the driver or person in charge of the vehicle a notice, in a form approved by the Director, which notice shall—
 - (a) be identified by a serial number;
 - (b) if the name of the person driving the vehicle, or the holder of a permit issued with respect to the vehicle or the owner of the vehicle is known to the authorised officer, be addressed by name to the driver, holder of the permit or owner or otherwise be addressed to the driver, holder of the permit or owner by the registration number of the vehicle;

- (c) describe the vehicle by make and registration number;
- (d) state that it is alleged that a breach of a By-law with regard to the driving or parking, or otherwise with respect to the vehicle has been committed and in general terms the breach which it is alleged has been committed;
- (e) state that the breach will be reported and that further action may be taken unless within the time and manner stated in the notice—
 - (i) the modified penalty specified in By-law 52 (3) and indicated on the notice is paid; or
 - (ii) within seven days an explanation (in writing) addressed to the Director is given for the breach in which case further notice will be given either that the explanation is accepted or that the explanation is not accepted and further action will be taken failing payment of the modified penalty indicated on the notice within fourteen days after the date of the further notice;
- (f) state the modified penalty payable.
- (2) If the authorised officer is unable to affix the notice to the vehicle or to give it to the driver or person in charge of the vehicle by handing it to him, it may be given by posting it to the holder of the permit issued with respect to the vehicle or to the owner of the vehicle at his last known place of abode.
- (3) If the person to whom a notice under paragraph (1) of this By-law is given, gives a written explanation to the Director in accordance with the terms of the notice, the Director may either accept the explanation or not accept it and he may give the person a further notice stating that further action may be taken if the modified penalty indicated on the notice is not paid within fourteen days after the date of the further notice.
- 47. On such days or nights and during such time or times as the Director may direct, members of the Police Force and authorised officers shall have complete control over all traffic within the College lands, whereupon ever person in charge of any vehicle or animal within the College lands shall obey every order and direction of any member of the Police Force or authorised officer relating to the movement or control of such traffic, and shall stop or proceed or park in such manner and direction as the member of the Police Force or authorised officer may from time to time order. This By-law shall apply notwithstanding the terms of any issued permit.
- 48. The Council may from time to time prescribe parking fees to be paid by applicants for parking permits or by persons parking vehicles, whether holders of a permit or not, in specified parking bays or areas set aside for parking.

Part IV-Offences and Penalties.

- 49. A person who commits a breach of these By-laws shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty not exceeding the amount from time to time prescribed by the Act as the maximum penalty that may be imposed for any breach of a By-law and to pay compensation for any damage done by him to College property.
- 50. Proceedings may be taken in any court of summary jurisdiction in accordance with the Justices Act 1902, in respect of any offence committed under these By-laws, and any penalty imposed or compensation made payable may be recovered in a summary manner in accordance with the Act.
- 51. Proceedings may be taken by any authorised person or by any member of the Police Force who shall be reimbursed out of the funds of the College for all costs, charges, expenses or damages which he may incur or become liable by reason of taking proceedings.
- 52. (1) A person who does not contest an allegation that he has committed a breach of these By-laws may pay to the Director or an authorised officer within the time prescribed by a notice given under By-law 26 (3) or By-law 46, the modified penalty prescribed for that breach by paragraph (3) of this By-law. The production of an acknowledgement from the Director or the authorised officer of the payment of the modified penalty shall be a defence to a charge of the breach in respect of which the modified penalty is paid.
- (2) If it appears to the Director or the authorised officer that an alleged breach of these By-laws cannot be adequately punished by the payment of a modified penalty, the Director may refuse to accept payment of the modified penalty and may take proceedings against the alleged offender. A breach of a By-law by a student is a disciplinary offence for which a complaint may be brought, heard and determined under disciplinary rules of the College instead of before a court of summary jurisdiction.
 - (3) For any breach of these By-laws the modified penalty shall be \$10.00.
