CITY of Subiaco being a local authority under the provisions of the abovementioned Act, does hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Act and all other powers enabling it make and publish the following by-laws:

1. In these by-laws the Model by-laws Series "A" as amended from time to time adopted by the City of Subiaco by resolution published in the *Government Gazette* of 15 October 1964 are referred to as "the principal by-laws".

2. The principal by-laws are amended by inserting after by-law 28 of Part I the following heading and by-law—

Keeping of Cats.

28A. (1) A person shall not keep more than three cats over the age of three months within the district of the City of Subiaco—

- (a) without the written approval of the Council; and
- (b) unless he complies with sub-by-law (2) of this by-law.

(2) A person who keeps more than three cats over the age of three months within the district shall—

- (a) register the premises at or on which the cats are kept or to be kept with the Council and renew the registration on or before the 1st day of July in each year;
- (b) pay to the Council an annual registration fee of \$5.00;
- (c) provide for each cat kept at or on the premises a properly constructed shelter with an enclosure complying with the following—
 - (i) each shelter shall have a floor area of not less than 0.5 m² for each cat over the age of three months kept or to be kept therein; and

- (ii) the area of the enclosure appurtenant to each shelter shall be not less than three times the area of the shelter.
- (iii) a shelter or an enclosure shall be situated at a distance of not less than 2 m from the boundary of any lot not owned or occupied by the person by whom the cats are kept, of 10 m from any dwelling, church, school room, hall or premises in which food is manufactured, packed or prepared for human consumption;
- (d) keep all shelters, enclosures, yards and grounds in which cats are kept in a clean condition and free from vermin at all times and clean, disinfect or otherwise deal with them as directed by a health surveyor from time to time.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act 1911-1979, as amended, a Local Authority may make or adopt By-laws and may alter, amend or repeal any By-laws so adopted: Now therefore the Town of Kwinana, being a Local Authority within the meaning of the Act and, having adopted the Model By-laws described a Series "A" as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act 1954, in the *Government Gazette* of 17 July 1963 doth hereby resolve and determine that the said adopted By-law be amended as follows:—

Part 1—By-law 26 Stables

The whole of this By-law is repealed and replaced by the following:

The occupier of any premises whereon a horse is kept shall provide a stable which shall comply with the following conditions:—

1. It shall not be at any less distance than sixteen metres (16 m) from any dwelling house, milking shed, or milk room of any dairy or any place where food is stored or prepared.

2. (a) It shall have walls to a number and height and thickness approved by a Health Surveyor of the Local Authority and such walls shall be constructed of brick, stone, concrete, masonry or metal or timber framed with new impervious sheeting wall cladding.

(b) It shall have a roof constructed of impervious material.

(c) Ventilation—There shall be where practicable, a continuous clear space of at least 150 mm between the wall and roof.

(d) Where an impervious surface is provided to the floor of the stable, it shall be raised 75 mm or more above the surface of the surrounding ground. It shall have a fall of one in one hundred to a constructed drain.

3. (a) Every stable shall have a receptacle for the storage of manure. The receptacle shall be, of brick construction with granolithic rendered internal walls, or other approved material. It shall be provided with a tight fitting lid to render it as fly proof as practicable. The receptacle shall be emptied at least once every seven days.

(b) All manure shall be collected daily from stables and yards and placed in the receptacle for manure.

(c) The stable shall be maintained in a clean condition and shall be cleansed, disinfected and treated with insecticide when directed by a Health Surveyor of the Local Authority.

4 (a) All stables shall be licensed annually and the fee shall be five dollars (\$5) per stall. The Council may withdraw the licence at any time if the structural condition deteriorates, is unsightly or is considered by a Health Surveyor of the Local Authority, to be detrimental or dangerous to health. The licence shall be effective from the First of January to the Thirty First Day of December of each year.

(b) No lot:

(i) of less than fifteen hundred square metres (1 500 m²)
or

(ii) that is not zoned rural or special rural in the Town of Kwinana Town Planning Scheme.

shall be licensed for stables.

(c) No lot shall be licensed if boundary setbacks of buildings do not conform with the Town of Kwinana Town Planning Scheme.

(d) Licensing requirements of this By-law shall not apply to premises where the lot area exceeds one (1) hectare.

(e) The owner of every stable shall live on the property, unless otherwise approved by Council.

5. Any person operating an unlicensed stable shall be liable to a penalty of forty dollars (\$40) plus four dollars (\$4) a day for every day of non-compliance from the date of conviction.

6. All existing stables shall conform with these By-laws by the 1st day of March, 1982.

This notice shall have effect until revoked and is issued subject to the following specified conditions:

Wyalkatchem rubbish disposal site, Reserve No. 29600.

Specified Conditions.

1. That the dump be surrounded by a netting fence having apertures no larger than 9 cm and being not less than two metres in height and that the fence be maintained in good order at all times.
2. That the area surrounding the rubbish site be maintained clear of flammable material.
3. That warning signs be erected and maintained in good condition at the site entrance, warning "Unauthorised lighting of fires Prohibited, Offenders Prosecuted".
4. That the lighting of fires to burn rubbish be carried out only by persons authorised by the Shire Clerk to do so.
5. That a fire unit filled with not less than 900 litres of water be present at the site during the time that the fire is alight and that the fire be extinguished with water before the site is left unattended.
6. No fire is to be lit on land subject to this suspension on a day for which the fire danger forecast issued by the Bureau of Meteorology in Perth in respect of the locality is "very high" or "extreme".

Part I—Preliminary.

1.1 Citation: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Shire of Swan Town Planning Scheme No. 8—Malaga Industrial Development Scheme (hereinafter called "the Scheme").

1.2 Responsible Authority: The Authority responsible for enforcing the observance of the Scheme is the Shire of Swan (hereinafter called "the Council").

1.3 Maps.

1.3.1 The following maps are attached to and form part of the Scheme:—

Land Use Map.

Scheme Map.

Development Guide Map.

1.4 Scheme Area: The Scheme applies to the whole of the land contained within the inner edge of the broken black line on the Land Use Map (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area").

1.5 Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme Text is divided into the following Parts:—

Part I—Preliminary.

Part II—Objects.

Part III—Subdivision and Development.

Part IV—Roads and Ways.

Part V—Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage.

Part VI—Additional Works.

Part VII—Finance and Administration.

Part VIII—General.

Part II—Objects.

2.1 General Objects: The General Objects of the Scheme are:—

- (a) To plan, facilitate and encourage the progressive subdivision and development of the land within the Scheme Area for industrial and other purposes;
- (b) To co-ordinate and control development in the Scheme Area;
- (c) To plan and make provision for suitable roads and ways within the Scheme Area;
- (d) To make provision for the upgrading of the portion of Alexander Drive within the Scheme Area;
- (e) To make provision for and ensure the proper drainage of the roads and all other parts of the Scheme Area which require drainage;
- (f) To make provision for the creation of sewerage and drainage reserves and easements within the Scheme Area;
- (g) To make provision for the reticulated supply of water and all works and matters incidental thereto within the Scheme Area;
- (h) To make provision for reticulated deep sewerage and all works and matters incidental thereto within the Scheme Area;
- (i) To make provision for power supply within the Scheme Area;
- (j) To make provision for land to be used for recreation, Local Authority and Scheme purposes, and for the development thereof within the Scheme Area;
- (k) To make provision for landscaping and beautification of the land surrounding any compensating basin or drainage sump within the Scheme Area or any compensating basin or drainage sump acquired or used outside the Scheme Area for the purpose of the Scheme;
- (l) To establish some standards for the development of land within the Scheme Area;
- (m) To make provision within the Scheme Area for such of those matters set out in the First Schedule of the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended) (hereinafter called "the Act") as are necessary or incidental to the good and effective planning, subdivision and development of an industrial development scheme;
- (n) To improve and secure the amenity, health and convenience of the Scheme Area and to make provision for works calculated to achieve those ends.

Part III—Subdivision and Development.

3.1 Scheme Map and Development Guide Map: As and when an owner of land within the Scheme Area ("Owner") subdivides or develops his land such subdivision or development shall be in accordance with and consistent with the Scheme Map and the Development Guide Map respectively.

3.2 Scheme Map: The Scheme Map forms a basis for the development of the Scheme Area showing the proposed approximate location of roads and ways, main drains, compensating basins and drainage sumps, sewage pumping stations, raising mains, and main sewer lines, and areas, works or installations required for the servicing or effective planning of the Scheme Area, but does not show areas of cut and fill, the proposed location of main water supply works and installations, or any installations necessary for power supply. The Council may permit alterations to the Scheme Map provided that any public authority whose interests are affected by any proposed alteration agrees to it.

3.3 Development Guide Map: The development Guide Map indicates an acceptable method of subdivision of the Scheme Area and building setbacks. There shall be no departure or variation from the subdivision pattern in the Development Guide Map except minor variations which, however, shall require the approval of the Town Planning Board on the recommendation of the Council.

3.4 Developer to Submit Plans: An Owner who desires to develop his land either alone or in conjunction with other Owners shall submit a plan of the proposed development to the Council and if the proposals involve subdivision he shall submit to the Town Planning Board a plan of subdivision in conformity with the Development Guide Map with such minor variations (if any) as are recommended by the Council as provided in Clause 3.3. No development shall be commenced unless and until the Council has approved the same in accordance with the relevant provisions of its Town Planning Scheme No. 1 (as amended) or any town planning scheme amending or replacing it. No development involving subdivision shall be commenced unless and until the Town Planning Board has considered the proposal and specified conditions pursuant to Clause 9 of the Town Planning Board Regulations 1962 (as amended) requiring *inter alia* compliance with the terms of the Scheme.

3.5 Survey: Each Owner shall upon the approval of the plan of subdivision of his land arrange for the survey of his land in conformity with the approved plan of subdivision and shall pay the costs of such survey.

Part IV—Roads and Ways.

4.1 Definition of "Way": In this Scheme the Term "way" shall mean and include every pedestrian accessway, cycleway, alley, court or other right-of-way which the public are allowed to use.

4.2 Construction by Owners.

4.2.1 This clause shall apply only in relation to those roads and ways within the Scheme Area which are not outlined in red on the Scheme Map, and shall not apply to any portion of Alexander Drive within the Scheme Area.

4.2.2 Every new road or way to which this clause applied shall be constructed and drained by and at the expense of the Owners of the lands which abut such road or way in the Scheme Map. Each such Owner shall at the time of subdividing his land make available the land required for the road or way and shall at that time carry out the construction and drainage of such road or way or make his appropriate contribution to the cost of such work carried out by other Owners.

4.2.3 If any Owner seeks approval to commence any development or use on his land without or before subdividing the same the Council may on receipt of the application for such approval require that Owner to carry out or contribute to the cost of construction of a road or way to which this clause applies and make available the land required for it and may stipulate a time for doing those things as one of the conditions of any approval it issues or may in its discretion refuse approval until such time as those things have been done.

4.2.4 If an Owner desires to construct a new road or way to which this clause applies but another Owner of land within the Scheme Area which abuts the new road or way in the Scheme Map does not wish at that time to subdivide or commence any development or use on his land, the Council may require that other Owner to make available that part of his land for the new road or way and may resume that part of his land if he is unwilling to make it available.

4.2.5 In cases where the situation of a new road or way is such that in the opinion of the Council it would be fair and equitable that the Owners of adjoining or other land within the Scheme Area should each contribute to the cost of the construction and drainage of that road or way and apportion the value of the land made available for such road or way and such Owners are unable to agree upon the proportion of the costs payable by each of them the amount (if any) payable by each such Owner shall be determined by the Council.

4.2.6 The Council will not be responsible for the costs of construction and drainage of or the provision of land for the section of any road or way in the Scheme Area which abuts Public Open Space or Regional Open Space within or outside the Scheme Area. The Owners shall be liable for such costs and land in accordance with the provisions of this clause.

4.2.7 If in the opinion of the Council the failure or unwillingness of an Owner to commence or complete the construction and drainage of a new road or way to which this clause applies or any portion thereof will unduly delay the completion of the Scheme or any stage thereof or unduly prejudice the Scheme or any other Owner the Council may give notice to the first mentioned Owner calling upon him to commence or complete the construction and drainage within ninety (90) days or such other period as to the Council shall seem appropriate. If at the expiration of the period there has not been substantial compliance with the notice the Council may carry out or complete the construction and drainage and may resume any land required for that purpose if the owner thereof fails or refuses to make it available.

4.2.8 Any costs incurred by the Council pursuant to subclauses 4.2.4 or 4.2.7 including compensation if it is claimed for any land resumed, and any interest paid or payable by the Council on moneys borrowed for any of the purposes in those subclauses shall be paid to the Council by the Owners who pursuant to subclauses 4.2.2 and 4.2.5 would have been liable to pay or contribute to such costs or to make land available, or to carry out any of the work carried out by the Council. The Council may recover those costs from those Owners as if they were Scheme Costs and for that purpose the provisions of subclauses 7.1.3 to 7.1.6 inclusive and 7.1.9 and clauses 7.5, 7.7 and 8.1, shall apply to the recovery by Council of those costs.

4.3 Construction by Council:

4.3.1 The Council shall carry out:—

- (a) The construction and drainage of any new road or way outlined in red on the Scheme Map;
- (b) The construction, improvement, widening or drainage and all necessary earthworks of any road outlined in red on the Scheme Map which has been dedicated prior to the coming into operation of the Scheme, but is unmade or in the opinion of the Council requires improvement, widening, drainage or other works; and
- (c) The upgrading of any portion of Alexander Drive within the Scheme Area.

4.3.2 The following land shall be made available when required by the Council:—

- (a) The land required for any new road or way to which subclause 4.3.1 applies; and
- (b) The whole or any portion of the land required for roadwidening within the Scheme Area being roadwidening to which subclause 4.3.1 applies.

4.3.3 The Council may resume land referred to in the preceding subclause from any Owner who fails or is unwilling to make it available.

4.3.4 The costs of the construction and drainage of any new road and the construction, improvement, widening or drainage or the upgrading of any existing road and in each case being a road to which subclause 4.3.1 applies and all compensation and other costs (if any) consequent upon the resumption or other acquisition of the land therefor shall be Scheme costs and shall be paid to the Council by each respective Owner in accordance with the provisions herein for contribution to Scheme costs.

4.4 Closure of Roads: The roads shown on the Scheme Map as roads to be closed shall be closed as the development of the Scheme Area proceeds and as such roads are no longer required. When the said roads have been closed the land comprising the closed roads shall be used for the purposes shown on the Scheme Map and if such land is to be used for industrial or other development it shall vest in the Council in fee simple. Land so vested in the Council may not be sold or used by the Council for any purpose until the provisions of section 29 of the Public Works Act 1902 (as amended) have been complied with.

Part V—Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage.

5.1 Water Supply.

5.1.1 Such local water supply works as are in the opinion of the Council necessary for the proper servicing of the Scheme Area and the connection of the land therein to water mains including if necessary, the installation of mains and pumping stations outside the Scheme Area shall at the appropriate times be carried out by the Council if it elects. Each Owner shall be responsible for the works within his land required for connection to the water supply system. Any said works shall be carried out in accordance with the requirements and the standards of the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage Board.

5.1.2 The Council may resume or otherwise acquire such land as it considers necessary for water supply services.

5.1.3 The costs of the works referred to in subclause 5.1.1 and other costs consequent upon the resumption or other acquisition of the land therefor shall be Scheme Costs and shall be paid to the Council by each respective Owner in accordance with the provisions herein for contribution to Scheme Costs.

5.2 Sewerage.

5.2.1 The Council may if it so elects provide sewage collection, treatment and disposal facilities or any of them throughout the Scheme Area and set aside land for sewage pumping stations.

5.2.2 Where necessary for the purpose of the Scheme the Council may instal or contribute to the cost of installing mains and pumping stations outside the Scheme Area.

5.2.3 The Council may resume or otherwise acquire such land or any interest in or over land within the Scheme Area, and may acquire such land or interest in or over land outside the Scheme Area, as it considers necessary for the works referred to in subclauses 5.2.1 and 5.2.2.

5.2.4 The costs of the works referred to in subclauses 5.2.1 and 5.2.2 and other costs consequent upon the resumption or other acquisition of land or any interest in or over land therefor shall be Scheme Costs and shall be paid to the Council by each respective Owner in accordance with the provisions herein for contribution to Scheme Costs.

5.2.5 If at the time an Owner develops his land the sewerage works proposed in the Scheme Map to service that land have been carried out then no new building constructed on that land shall be occupied until connection to the sewers has been effected. Where a building on land in the Scheme Area is lawfully occupied before the sewerage works proposed to service that land have been carried out, connection to the sewers shall be effected within six (6) months of the completion of the relevant sewerage works. An Owner who fails to connect any development on his land to the sewers within ninety (90) days of receiving notice from the Council calling upon him to do so shall be in contravention of the provisions of this Scheme for the purpose of proceedings under Section 10 of the Act.

5.3 Drainage.

5.3.1 The Council shall carry out all such local drainage works as are in the opinion of the Council necessary for the proper servicing of the Scheme Area and the connection of the land therein to main drains and the setting aside of land for drainage sumps and compensating basins.

5.3.2 The Council may:—

- (a) Resume or otherwise acquire such land as it considers necessary within the Scheme Area for drainage sumps and compensating basins and within the Scheme Area may resume or otherwise acquire any interest in or over land for drainage purposes; and

- (b) Acquire such land as it considers necessary outside the Scheme Area for drainage sumps and compensating basins to serve any part of the Scheme Area and may contribute to the cost of acquisition of such land by any other person or authority.

5.3.3 The costs of any works carried out pursuant to the power in subclause 5.3.1 and the other costs consequent upon the resumption or other acquisition of land or any interest in or over the land pursuant to subclause 5.3.2 shall be Scheme Costs and shall be paid to the Council by each respective Owner in accordance with the provisions herein for contribution to Scheme Costs.

5.4 Works carried out by Others.

5.4.1 Works which the Council is empowered to carry out but which it elects not to carry out may be carried out by the Owners and the costs thereof shall be contributed by all of the Owners within the Scheme or the stage in which such works are contained as if they were Scheme Costs and any Owner funding such works shall be reimbursed as contributions are received from the other Owners.

5.4.2 Interest shall be paid to an Owner who funds such works and the rate of interest shall be the same as that provided in subclause 7.1.4 for interest on outstanding contributions to Scheme Costs. Such interest shall be payable from the date the Owner provides the funds until the date the same are repaid to him and the interest shall be compounded annually. In the event that the funds are provided or repaid by more than one payment, interest shall be calculated on the monthly balance, but notwithstanding that interest shall be compounded annually.

5.4.3 Owners within the Scheme or the stage in which such funding occurs shall make to the Council their contributions to the costs of the works and interest thereon as soon as possible, but in any event, upon receiving from the Council notice of the amount due or at that time required.

Part VI—Additional Works.

6.1 To be carried out by Council.

6.1.1 The Council shall carry out the following works unless in any particular case it elects otherwise:—

- (a) The lands shown as public open space (if any) on the Scheme Map or the Development guide Map shall be set aside for public recreation.
- (b) The levelling, grading, planting and reticulation of any public open space and the landscaping and beautification of the area surrounding any drainage sump or compensating basin within or outside the Scheme Area.
- (c) All necessary earthworks including levelling and filling of land in any part of the Scheme Area. Levelling and filling within the land of any Owner if carried out by the Council shall be at the expense of that Owner unless it is ancillary to or necessary for the carrying out by the Council of any roadworks, sewerage or drainage works serving the Scheme Area.
- (d) Any other works the council considers necessary to achieve the General Objects of the Scheme.

6.1.2 The Council may resume or otherwise acquire such land or any interest in or over land within the Scheme Area as it considers necessary for the works referred to in subclause 6.1.1.

6.1.3 The costs of the works referred to in subclause 6.1.1 and other costs consequent upon the resumption or other acquisition of land or any interest in or over land therefor shall be Scheme Costs and shall be paid to the Council by each respective Owner in accordance with the provisions herein for contribution to Scheme Costs.

Part VII—Finance and Administration.

7.1 Provisions for Contribution to Scheme Costs.

7.1.1 The following costs shall be Scheme Costs and shall be paid by the Owners in accordance with the provisions for contribution set out in this clause:—

- (a) The administration costs of the Scheme including an amount to reimburse the Council for such overhead and supervision costs as

may be incurred in the implementation of the Scheme. The term "Administration Costs" shall include all legal costs, planning costs, payment to planning consultants, engineers and other professional consultants, management costs and valuation costs, in each case whether incurred before or after the coming into effect of the Scheme and reimbursement to the Council for the recorded time spent by its Project Officer and any other officer, employee or agent of the Shire insofar as that time was spent in connection with the Scheme and including time spent prior to the coming into operation of the Scheme at rates reasonably related to the rates from time to time charged by a professional person carrying out similar work and as determined by the Council. In the case of supervision of road and drainage works whether at the time of subdivision of an Owner's land or otherwise the Council may charge as an administrative cost a fee equal to one and one half per centum (1½%) of the cost or value of such works in lieu of the reimbursement for recorded time of its officers, employees or agents carrying out such supervision.

- (b) The costs referred to in subclauses 4.3.4, 5.1.3, 5.2.4, 5.3.3, 6.1.3, 7.1.11 and 7.1.12 and clause 5.4. Where land is acquired for any drainage sump or compensating basin outside the Scheme Area which is used or likely to be used to drain land outside the Scheme Area, the Council shall estimate the proportion of the cost of acquisition to be charged to the Scheme.
- (c) Interest on money borrowed by Council for the purpose of the Scheme and interest of municipal funds advanced by the Council to carry out any works provided for by the Scheme at the rate obtained or available to Council at the time of the advance on permitted trustee investments for a twelve month term.
All compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation and any payment for damage or injurious affection arising out of the Scheme.
- (e) The costs of acquisition of any land within the Scheme Area in the event of such land being acquired other than by resumption.
- (f) The costs of repairing and upgrading drainage works outside the Scheme Area necessary for the proper drainage of the Scheme Area.
- (g) The costs of sewerage and water supply headworks, pumping stations and other works incidental to water supply and sewerage outside the Scheme Area necessary for those services within the Scheme Area.
- (h) The costs of extension of water mains and any contribution paid or payable to the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage Board in respect of headworks charges and generally in respect of water supply sewerage and drainage works carried out by the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage Board in or to serve the Scheme Area.
- (i) The costs of altering existing electricity, water sewerage, drainage or telephone services or of providing exceptional services rendered necessary by the Scheme to the extent to which and in cases where the Council considers the cost justified.
- (j) The costs of carrying out surveys pursuant to paragraph (c) of subclause 7.1.7.
- (k) Any interest payable pursuant to subclauses 5.4.2, 7.1.11 and 7.1.12.
- (l) The cost of any insurance premiums or any insurance whatsoever against risks incurred by the Council its servants, agents and consultants employed or engaged in the Scheme works or the preparation of the Scheme and without limiting the generality of the foregoing all public risk insurance premiums.
- (m) All legal costs and fees whatsoever incurred by the Council in or in contemplation of any

arbitration arising out of or concerning the Scheme or any appeal against a decision or determination of the Council exercising a power conferred by or arising out of the Scheme or any litigation whatsoever concerning or arising out of the Scheme, and the fees and expenses of any witness expert of consultant for which the Council becomes liable in connection with any proceedings referred to in this paragraph and any costs ordered to be paid by the Council or payable pursuant to any settlement negotiated by the Council in such proceedings.

7.1.2 Each Owner shall pay his appropriate proportion of the Scheme Costs:—

- (a) at the time of subdividing his land and before the Council gives a clearance to the Town Planning Board prior to the Town Planning Board endorsing its approval pursuant to Regulation 10 of the Town Planning Board Regulations 1962 (as amended) on the diagram or plan of survey of the subdivision, or
- (b) at the time of carrying out any development or commencing any use on his land, or
- (c) at the time of applying to the Council or the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority for approval of or to commence any use or development on his land, or
- (d) when called upon by the Council to make payment as provided hereafter in this clause,

whichever first occurs.

7.1.3 Whether or not an Owner has reached the stage of subdividing or carrying out any use or development on his land he shall be liable to pay to the Council his appropriate proportion of the Scheme Costs or such part thereof as the Council from time to time requires as from the date of posting to him by or on behalf of the Council by prepaid post addressed to his last address known to the Council of a notice informing him of the amount of his appropriate proportion or the part then required and calling upon him to make payment.

7.1.4 Each owner shall be liable to pay to the Council interest upon the amount of his appropriate proportion of the Scheme Costs or the part then required from him. The rate of interest shall be three (3) per centum per annum above the loan rate applicable to Local Government Loans established by the Australian Loans Council from time to time, or three (3) per centum per annum above the interest rate actually paid or payable by the Council on borrowings for the purposes of the Scheme, whichever rate is the greater, and such interest shall be compounded annually. No interest shall be payable by an owner who pays the sum required of him within thirty (30) days from the date of posting of the notice referred to in the preceding subclause, but otherwise Owners shall be liable to pay interest as from that date which is forty eight (48) hours after the posting of the notice.

7.1.5 Within ninety (90) days of the posting to an Owner of the notice referred to in subclause 7.1.3 that Owner shall pay the sum required of him together with any interest accrued due to the date of payment.

7.1.6 Whether or not he has received a notice in accordance with subclause 7.1.3 an owner shall not pursuant to clause 10 of the Town Planning Board Regulations, 1962 (as amended) submit to the Town Planning Board, or request that the approval of the Board be endorsed on, a Diagram or Plan of Survey for the subdivision of any land within the Scheme Area until he has paid or made arrangements satisfactory to the Council for payment of his appropriate proportion of any costs and interest hereinbefore referred to.

7.1.7 (a) The appropriate proportion of the Scheme Costs payable by any Owner shall be that sum which bears the same proportion to the total Scheme Costs as the subdivisible land of that Owner bears to the total subdivisible land of all Owners.

(b) The subdivisible land of an Owner shall for the purpose of this subclause be the total area of land of that Owner within the Scheme Area excluding any land shown in the Scheme Map as being required for any new road or way or for roadwidening or any other purpose in respect of which compensation:

- (i) is not payable, or
 - (ii) though payable, has not been claimed within 6 months of the Scheme coming into operation, or
 - (iii) has been waived
- upon the land being made available for that purpose and excluding any land shown in the Scheme Map as being required for any drainage reserve whether compensation has been or is payable in respect of the same or not. The subdivisible land of an Owner shall include any land required for any road or roadwidening or for any other purpose connected with the provision of water or power supply, sewerage or drainage services within the Scheme Area where compensation has been paid or claimed upon the land being taken or made available for that purpose, and shall include land which vests in the Council pursuant to Clause 4.4.

(c) The Council as soon as practicable shall cause to be carried out such surveys within the Scheme Area as shall be necessary to ascertain the area of the subdivisible land of each Owner. If an Owner objects to the area so ascertained as his subdivisible land, he may give notice of such objection to the Council within twenty eight (28) days after having received notice of his area so ascertained. If the Council does not agree to change the area in the manner and to an extent acceptable to the Owner, the area shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with the provisions for arbitration hereinafter contained. The subdivisible land of an Owner may be varied pursuant to the provisions of the next succeeding subclause but otherwise after the expiration of the twenty eight (28) days referred to in this paragraph there shall be no variation or.

7.1.8 If an Owner claims or receives compensation by reason of the acquisition or resumption from him of any land for any road or roadwidening such compensation shall be a Scheme Cost. In assessing such compensation consideration shall be given to the provisions of subclause 7.1.7 and the following shall apply:

- (a) If the claim for or payment of compensation is made after the calculation of that Owner's subdivisible land pursuant to subclause 7.1.7 but before he has made any contribution to Scheme Costs, then his subdivisible land shall be recalculated to include the land in respect of which compensation is claimed, and the portion of Scheme Costs and any interest thereon shall be revised accordingly.
- (b) If the claim for or payment of compensation is made after the calculation of that Owner's subdivisible land and after he has made a contribution to Scheme Costs, then his subdivisible land shall be re-calculated as provided in paragraph (a) for the purpose of calculating any further contributions of Scheme Costs by that Owner.
- (c) In respect of any contribution to Scheme Costs already made by that Owner, the difference shall be calculated between the amount he in fact has paid and the amount he would have paid had his contribution been calculated on the basis of the larger area of subdivisible land including the land for which he has claimed compensation.
- (d) Interest calculated in accordance with and at the rate provided in subclause 7.1.4 shall be calculated upon the difference referred to in paragraph (c) from the date of payment of any contribution to Scheme Costs by the Owner claiming compensation to the date of his claim for compensation.
- (e) The sum of all differences calculated in accordance with paragraph (d) shall be deducted from the compensation payable to an Owner to whom this subclause applies.

Any compensation paid to an Owner by reason of the acquisition or resumption from him of any land for any road or roadwidening within the Scheme Area shall be repaid by him to the Council when and if he applies for approval to subdivide his land or applies for approval to commence any development or use on his land together with interest thereon at the rate referred to in paragraph (c) of subclause 7.1.1 from the date of payment of the compensation to that Owner to the date of repayment in accordance with this subclause.

7.1.9 The Council may from time to time estimate the appropriate proportion of the costs payable by any Owner prior to the determination of the final costs referred to in subclause 7.1.1. The costs required by the Council pursuant to subclause 7.1.1 may be the estimated costs provided that upon the determination of the final costs the Council shall make appropriate adjustments and recover from or repay to the Owners any difference between the estimated and the final costs. An estimate may be revised from time to time.

7.1.10 Where any costs of the kind referred to in paragraph (a) of subclause 7.1.1 have been incurred wholly in relation to one or more Owners or their land in such circumstances that in the opinion of the Council they should not be Scheme Costs then those costs may be charged to the Owner or Owners in relation to whom or to whose land they were incurred in such proportions as to the Council seem fit and may be recovered from any such Owner as if they were part of the Scheme Costs payable by that Owner.

7.1.11 If an Owner pre-funds the Scheme by paying any sum of money to the Council before he becomes liable to make such payment pursuant to subclauses 7.1.2 and 7.1.3 the Council may pay interest upon such sum at the rate referred to in subclause 7.1.4 or such other rate as to the Council shall seem proper in the circumstances and any such interest paid to an Owner shall be a Scheme Cost.

7.1.12 If at the time the Scheme comes into effect the portion of Alexander Drive within the Scheme Area has already been upgraded by another to a standard acceptable to the Council the Council shall reimburse to that other the cost of such work together with interest thereon from the date the whole of those costs had been ascertained and paid to the date of reimbursement by the Council at the Bank of New South Wales overdraft rate from time to time applicable to such sums during that period.

7.1.13 If at the time the Scheme comes into operation any land within the Scheme Area already is connected to a water supply scheme of the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage Board ("MWB"), and if the MWB exempts such land from any headworks charges payable by the Council on behalf of the Owners as Scheme Costs pursuant to subclause 7.1.1 then the Council may in its discretion allow to the Owner of that land a corresponding credit against the proportion of Scheme Costs which otherwise would have been payable by him. In and for the purposes of this Scheme, the term "headworks" means all installations for and relating to water supply, sewerage and drainage other than reticulation and house services and without limiting the foregoing shall include all pressure mains, major feeding pipes of diameter greater than reticulation pipes, pump stations and high level tanks. Reticulation pipes in relation to water supply are those which are not greater than 220 millimetres diameter, and in relation to sewerage are those pipes which are not greater than 300 millimetres diameter.

7.2 Staging.

7.2.1 Any works which by this Scheme the Council is required or permitted to do may be carried out in stages including the resumption or other acquisition of land.

7.2.2 If the Scheme is implemented in stages the provisions of the Scheme shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to any stage as though the land in that stage was the Scheme Area.

7.2.3 Subject to the provisions of subclause 7.6.1 the Council may in its discretion permit an Owner within any stage to carry out any works ahead of the Council's works within the stage if it is satisfied the Scheme and the other Owners will not be prejudiced thereby and may do all such things and make such requirements of that Owner as appear necessary to avoid such prejudice.

7.3 Moneys received by Council: All moneys received by the Council pursuant to the provisions of this Scheme other than from the sale of land acquired by it as a Scheme Owner or pursuant to clause 4.4, but including interest earned on the investment of moneys raised or received for the purpose of or pursuant to the Scheme shall be applied in payment of the Scheme Costs. Moneys received by the Council after completion of the works the Council is required or empowered by this Scheme to carry out and after all Scheme Costs

have been paid, shall be reimbursed by the Council to the Scheme Owners in the same proportions as those Owners contributed to the Scheme Costs.

7.4 Powers and Authorities of Council.

7.4.1 In carrying out the provisions of this Scheme, the Council in addition to any other powers and authorities conferred on it herein shall have the following powers and authorities:—

- (a) To enter and inspect any land within the Scheme Area;
- (b) To enter into agreement with the Owners or Occupiers of any land within the Scheme Area or with persons outside the Scheme Area for the purpose of realising the objectives of the Scheme and carrying out any works which the Council is required or may under the terms of the Scheme elect to carry out;
- (c) To enter into agreements with purchasers or prospective purchasers or prospective occupiers of land within the Scheme Area;
- (d) To enter into agreements with any person or government instrumentality for the purpose of carrying out any of the works provided for in the Scheme or otherwise for the purpose of the Scheme, including works provided to be carried out outside the Scheme Area and for the purpose of adjusting liability for costs of works carried out pursuant to the Scheme but benefiting persons or land outside the Scheme Area;
- (e) To extend the time within which payments have to be made to the Council and to agree to the securing of such payments and the payment of interest thereon where appropriate;
- (f) To exercise any rights and powers vested in the Council to borrow money for the purpose of the Scheme;
- (g) To postpone the carrying out of any works which under the Scheme the Council is required or may elect to carry out for such period as it thinks fit, or to implement the Scheme in stages dealing with portions of the Scheme Area from time to time as the Council considers proper in the circumstances;
- (h) To resume any land or interest in land within the Scheme Area for public or local authority purposes, or in order to make it available for any of the purposes for which the Council by the provisions of this Scheme is empowered to acquire land in cases where the Owner thereof will not agree to make the land available for that purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme;
- (i) To dispose of any land to which it becomes entitled whether under any of the provisions of this subclause or otherwise upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit and without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the Council may sell the land in the form it was acquired or in lots after subdivision and may carry out improvements before sale;
- (j) To transfer any land acquired by it in pursuance of this Scheme as compensation or part compensation and to enter into agreements relating to the determination and settling of compensation.

7.4.2 The Council may at any time exercise the powers conferred by section 13 of the Act.

7.5 Charge: The contribution or estimated contribution of an Owner to Scheme Costs and any interest thereon shall be a charge upon the land of that Owner and Council may lodge a Caveat in respect of that charge against any Owner's title as from the time of the Scheme coming into operation.

7.6 Development Prior to the Scheme.

7.6.1 The Council may in accordance with this clause permit an Owner or a group of Owners to develop land prior to the implementation of the Scheme in respect of such land. If the Council does so agree, the Owner or Owners shall enter into an agreement agreeing:—

- (a) To subdivide and develop the land according to the Scheme within a time limited.

- (b) That the works shall be carried out under the supervision of the Council's officers and consultants and to pay all fees incurred in so doing.
- (c) To pay their proportion of all costs provided by the Scheme to be paid by Owners.
- (d) To mortgage or charge specified lands to secure payment of any moneys payable to the Council.
- (e) To release the Council from all or any specific claims for compensation in respect of the Scheme.

7.6.2 The agreement shall contain such other clauses as the Council acting on the advice of its solicitors shall require.

7.6.3 No Owner shall carry out any development on his land prior to the provision to his land of the services provided for by this Scheme unless and until the Council is satisfied that temporary services provided by the Owners to his land are satisfactory.

7.7 Contributions in Land.

7.7.1 If an Owner fails to make payment in accordance with clause 7.1 of any contribution due by him or interest accrued due thereon, the Council forthwith or after giving such notices as to the Council shall seem appropriate in the circumstances, may resume the whole or a portion of that Owner's land within the Scheme Area and sell the same and after deducting from the proceeds of sale all contributions which have accrued due by that Owner and the payment of such moneys as shall be due under any encumbrance notified on the title to the land prior to the Scheme coming into operation, the Council may put aside a sufficient sum to provide for any future contributions by that Owner under the Scheme and the Council shall pay any balance to that Owner or recover from him any amount by which the balance of the proceeds of sale falls short of his appropriate contributions. For the purpose of this subclause the Council may with the approval of the Town Planning Board subdivide the Owner's land and resume only such portion as shall seem to the Council necessary to discharge the liabilities of the Owner under the Scheme and the Council may transfer back to that Owner any land not required. The costs of resumption, subdivision and transfer shall be added to the liability of the Owner under the Scheme.

7.7.2 In the event of the Council exercising its powers under the preceding subclause, it shall have all the powers of an Owner in the subdivision, development and disposal of the land.

Part VIII—General.

8.1 *Enforcement:* If within the 90 days stipulated in subclause 7.1.5 of the posting to an Owner of the notice referred to in subclause 7.1.3 or within 90 days of an Owner becoming liable to make any payment to the Council pursuant to any other provision of the Scheme, the Owner fails to make such payment then the Council in addition to any other method of enforcement or other action available to it under the Scheme or otherwise, may do either or both of the following—

- (a) Take action in any Court of competent jurisdiction to recover the payment as a debt; or
- (b) Commence proceedings by way of complaint in a Court of Petty Sessions pursuant to subsection (4) of S.10 of the Act and for the purpose of that subsection, the non payment within the time specified shall be a contravention or failure to comply with the provisions of this Scheme.

8.2 Valuation.

8.2.1 If it is necessary for the purpose of the Scheme to ascertain the value of any land, such value shall be determined by a Licensed Valuer, nominated by the President for the time being of the Australian Institute of Valuers (Inc.). If an Owner shall object to the value so determined, he may give notice of such objection to the Council within twenty-eight (28) days after having been informed of the said value or the revised value. If the valuer does not agree to change the value to a figure acceptable to the Owner, the value shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained.

8.2.2 The value placed upon the land of any Owner may be revised from time to time by a valuer appointed in accordance with the provisions of the preceding subclause, provided that if it is necessary as a result of such revision, the valuer may reconsider the values placed on other land and make such revisions as he considers just and equitable.

8.2.3 If a valuation made by the valuer shall be changed as a result of an objection, the valuer may reconsider the values placed on other lands and make such revaluations as he considers just and equitable.

8.2.4 In assessing the value of land for compensation purposes, the value shall be the capital amount that an unencumbered estate in fee simple of the land in *in globo* might reasonably be expected to realise upon sale assuming that all improvements thereon (except site improvements the benefit of which are unexhausted at the time of valuation) had not been made. The time of valuation shall be the date Council serves notice on the Owners in the Scheme or any stage that Council proposes to commence work in that stage or the Scheme if there are no stages and of its intention to resume any land required to be resumed at that time. In this clause the term "site improvement" means reclamation of land by drainage or filling, the construction of a retaining wall or other structures or walls appertaining thereto, the excavation, grading and levelling of land, the removal of rock, stones, sand and soil and the clearing of timber, scrub or other vegetation.

8.3 Claims for Compensation.

8.3.1 The time within which a person may make a claim for compensation pursuant to section 11 of the Act is six months of the Scheme coming into operation.

8.3.2 If an Owner claims compensation for any of the matters referred to in Parts IV, V and VI, there shall be set off against the amount of compensation payable to him the amount by which the value of the remainder of his land has been or will be increased by the carrying out of works or provision of services for which that land was resumed from that Owner.

8.3.3 Compensation shall be paid as and when the land resumed is required for the purpose for which it was resumed or otherwise acquired and when the funds become available to the Council.

8.4 Arbitration: Any dispute or difference between the Owners as to their respective rights under the Scheme, or as to the value of any land, or between any Owner and the Council as to any matter for which no other provision for resolving the dispute has been made by the terms of the Scheme, or in respect of any other matter pursuant to the Scheme, may be determined by arbitration in the manner provided by the Arbitration Act 1895, or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force.

8.5 Appeal: Where an Owner is aggrieved by any decision made by the Council in the exercise of any discretion conferred by any provision of the Scheme and where no other provision for appeal has been made herein in respect of that decision, then that person may within sixty days after the decision is communicated to him, appeal to the Minister responsible to hear appeals under the provisions of the Act.

8.6 Notice: Twenty-eight (28) days written notice is hereby prescribed as the notice to be given pursuant to section 10 of the Act. Any expenses incurred by the Council under the said section may be recovered from the person in default as a simple contract debt in such Court of Civil Jurisdiction as is competent to deal with the amount of claim.

8.7 State Energy Commission: It is the intention of the State Energy Commission not to subdivide or carry out any industrial commercial or residential development on its land within the Scheme Area. Consequently the State Energy Commission shall not be required to contribute to Scheme Costs in accordance with the Scheme but shall contribute as follows:

- (a) The provision of land or the cost of acquisition of land for half the road reserve and half the cost of road construction thereon of that portion of Truganina Road which abuts the land of the State Energy Commission; and

- (b) A proportion of the cost of upgrading any portion of Alexander Drive within the Scheme Area. The appropriate proportion of that cost shall be a sum which bears the same proportion to the total of such upgrading cost as the subdivisible land of the State Energy Commission within the Scheme Area bears to the subdivisible land of all Owners. For the purpose of this clause, the term "subdivisible land" shall have the same meaning as the term has in subclause 7.1.7.

"(2) The Standing Committee shall be comprised as follows:

Finance and General Purposes, Four Councillors Works, Health and Buildings, Three Councillors Town Planning & Newman Normalisation, Three Councillors."

No. 5 Delete paragraph (a) and (b) of clause 89 (1) and replace as follows:

"(a) Finance and General Purposes Committee the following duties and responsibilities—

(i) To oversee the management of the Councils finances, the collection of revenue, the expenditure of moneys, payment of accounts, and insurance premiums and the accounting for the Councils finances and the protection of the assets of the Council.

- (ii) To recommend policies to the Council with respect to the day to day implementation of all or any of the matters of which the Committee has the oversight.
 - (iii) To collate the yearly estimates of receipts and expenditures of the various Committees and to prepare for submission to the Council the annual budgets for the municipal and other funds of the Council and to make submissions to the Council on the striking of rates and the levying of other charges.
 - (iv) To consider and make recommendations to the Council on proposals by the various Committees for the borrowing of funds by loan or overdraft and to prepare for submission to the Council the Annual loan programme.
 - (v) To oversee and make submissions to the Council with respect to the administration of personnel, rates of salaries and wages, superannuation, awards and agreements, the appointment of officers, staff training and development, disciplinary measures, general conditions of employment, provided that any other Committee may make a recommendation to the Finance Committee concerning an officer whose principal duties pertain to the business of such committee.
 - (vi) To make recommendations to the Council with respect to the sale, lease or rental of Council property.
 - (vii) To make recommendations to the Council with respect to requests for donations.
 - (viii) To make recommendations to the Council with respect to the purchase, sale, replacement and maintenance of office equipment.
 - (ix) From time to time to review progress of plans, objectives and programmes and on the operation of individual services of which the Committee has the oversight.
 - (x) To oversee and make recommendations to the Council with respect to the provisions, establishment, design construction, maintenance and management of parks, reserves, playgrounds, recreational and civic amenities and facilities.
 - (xi) To make recommendations to the Town Planning Committee with respect to the requirements of and locations for parks, reserves, playgrounds, recreational and civic amenities and facilities for leisure time opportunities for the Community.
 - (xii) To oversee the design of buildings on parks, reserves, playgrounds, recreation and civic amenities and facilities for leisure time opportunities for the community subject to reference to the Health and Building Committee.
 - (xiii) To make recommendations to the Council with respect to the establishment, control and management of aquatic centres, swimming pools, civic centres and community halls and the letting and hiring hereof.
 - (xiv) To oversee and make recommendations to the Council with respect to the establishment, control and management of library services.
 - (xv) To arrange civic functions and control the conduct thereof.
 - (xvi) To prepare and submit to the Council by-laws with respect to the matters of which the Committee has the oversight.
- (b) Works, Health and Buildings Committee the following duties and responsibilities—
- (i) To oversee the care, control and management of works in streets, ways and other public places and the construction and maintenance of such works including the design, alignment, levels, drainage, widening, relocation and protection thereof.
 - (ii) To recommend policies to the Council with respect to the day to day implementation of all or any of the matters of which the Committee has the oversight.
 - (iii) To oversee the control and maintenance of street verges, planning and maintenance of street trees, and the cleaning of streets.
 - (iv) To make recommendations to the Council with respect to applications to establish, maintain and register street lawns.
 - (v) To oversee the construction and maintenance of signs, street shelters, street furniture, footpaths and lighting of streets, ways, reserves and other public places, parking facilities and parking stations.
 - (vi) To make recommendations to the Council with respect to the purchase, sale, replacement, maintenance, operations and control of plant and equipment and the procurement of materials required for carrying out works.
 - (vii) To prepare and submit to the Council By-Laws relating to matters with respect to which the Committee is responsible.
 - (viii) From time to time to review progress of plans, objectives and programmes and on the operation of individual services of which the Committee has the oversight.
 - (ix) To oversee and make recommendations to the Council with respect to the protection of health and like of the community including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing immunisation, social welfare and health education and the control of building operations and the construction and repair of buildings.

- (x) To oversee the administration of the Health Act 1911 and the by-laws and regulations made thereunder.
 - (xi) To oversee the sanitary provisions for the collection and disposal of sewerage, refuse and liquid wastes and the control of nuisances, offensive trades, insects and pests, the distribution and sale of foods and drugs to the public.
 - (xii) To make recommendations to the Town Planning Committee with respect to the location of Aged Persons Centres, Rest and Welfare Centres, Child Health Centres, Child Minding Centres and similar facilities.
 - (xiii) To oversee in conjunction with such other Committees as may be appropriate the provision, supervision and cleaning of public conveniences in parks, reserves, car parks and other public places.
 - (xiv) To oversee and make recommendations to the Council with respect to the control of itinerant vendors of foods, hawkers and street vending, the control and impounding of stray dogs and cattle.
 - (xv) To oversee and make recommendations to the Council with respect to the administration of Part XV of the Local Government Act 1960, the Uniform Building By-laws and any other by-laws relating to matters with respect to which the Committee has the oversight.
 - (xvi) To make reports and recommendations to the Council with respect to dangerous, neglected and dilapidated buildings and to give effect to any orders made by the Council with respect to the demolition or repair thereof.
 - (xvii) To oversee the control of the erection, location and upkeep of verandahs, signs, hoardings, billposting and fencing, including the fencing of vacant lands, the storage of inflammable materials, and the construction and maintenance and repair of all municipal buildings.
- (c) Town Planning and Newman Normalisation Committee the following duties and responsibilities—
- (i) To oversee the regulations and use of land pursuant to the provisions of the Interim Development Order, Planning and Development Act, the shires Town Planning Scheme, and Town Planning and Zoning by-laws and any other schemes, orders, by-laws or regulations made under any of such Act.
 - (ii) To prepare Town Planning Schemes for submission to Council and to oversee the operation of such schemes.
