# Land Act 1933. ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act 1933, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any person or persons to be named in the Order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of leasing: and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

File No. 1699/15.—That Reserve No. 16403 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Collie in trust for the purpose of "Recreation".

- 2. Since our previous Determination on 6 July 1981, the basic salaries of Members of the Queensland, Federal, Northern Territory, Victorian and New South Wales Parliaments have all been increased to the amounts shown in the above table. In the light of these higher rates we have decided to lift the basic salary of a Member of the Western Australian Parliament by 10% to \$31 935 per annum with effect on and from 1 January 1982.
- 3. The additional salaries payable to Ministers of the Crown, Officers of Parliament and the Parliamentary Secretary of the Cabinet are also to be increased by 10% on and from 1 January 1982.

### ELECTORATE ALLOWANCES

4. Costs incurred by Members in discharging their parliamentary duties continue to rise particularly in the operation, maintenance and replacement of motor vehicles. Local and shorter-distance S.T.D. telephone calls are also to cost more from 25 January 1982. These and other increased costs have been taken into account in determining the allowances which are to apply on and from 1 January 1982.

# OFFICERS IN THE SPECIAL DIVISION OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE AND PERSONS HOLDING PRESCRIBED OFFICES

- 5. On 14 January 1982 the Public Service Arbitrator awarded salary increases with effect from 18 December 1981, to persons in the administrative and clerical divisions of the W.A. Public Service. As a result, the salary attached to the top class in these divisions (A-I-11) is now \$5 058 per annum in excess of the rate prescribed by the Tribunal for Class 1 Special Division officers who previously received \$1 812 per annum more in salary than a person classified A-I-11. In this situation we have no option than to "flow-on" salary increases of a similar magnitude, to the public servants and statutory office holders within our jurisdiction.
- 6. We have also decided to vary the salary structure by reducing the number of classes from seven to five. Annual salary rates which are to apply on and from 1 January 1982 are:

#### HEALTH ACT 1911.

#### Shire of Wanneroo.

By-laws.

P.H.D. 864/70, Ex. Co. 0388.

SHIRE of Wanneroo being a local authority under the provisions of the abovementioned Act and having adopted the Model By-laws Series "A" made under the Act does hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Act and all other powers enabling it make and publish the following by-laws—

- 1. In these by-laws the Model By-laws Series "A" as amended from time to time adopted by the Shire of Wanneroo by resolution published in the *Government Gazette* of 4 June 1970 and amended from time to time are referred to as "the principal by-laws".
- 2. The principal by-laws are amended by deleting by-law 19 of Part I and substituting the following—
  - 19. (1) In this by-law unless the context requires otherwise-
    - "building line" has the meaning given to it in and for the purposes of the Local Government Act 1960;
    - "cattle" has the meaning given to it in and for the purposes of the Local Government Act 1960;
  - "general bulk refuse" means refuse and rubbish from a dwelling house, dwelling unit, flat or other premises used for residential purposes and which is of a dry and bulky nature and includes lawn and tree cuttings, leaves, branches and rubble but does not include trade refuse, industrial refuse, liquid wastes or swill;
  - "house refuse" means food scraps, food wrappings, food containers, paper, plastic, glass, cardboard, fabric, dirt, dust, ash and other refuse and rubbish from a dwelling house, dwelling unit, flat or other premises used for residential purposes, but does not include trade refuse, general bulk refuse, industrial refuse, liquid wastes or swill;
  - "industrial refuse" means refuse and rubbish from industries and includes timber and metal offcuts, metal shavings and punchings, shredded tyres, plastics and other synthetics, wire, glass, paper, packaging, earth and rubble but does not include tailings, scourings, effluents, radioactive wastes or wastes associated with abattoirs, chemical works or refineries, liquid wastes or swill;
  - "light industry" has the meaning given to it in and for the purpose of Shire of Wanneroo Town Planning Scheme No. 1 published in the Government Gazette of 13 September 1972 and amended from time to time or other town planning schemes or by-laws for the time being in force whereby the district or any part thereof is zoned or classified;
  - "liquid wastes" includes septic tank effluents, sullage, grease trap wastes, slurry, solvents, acids, alkalines, detergents, oils, scourings and any other liquid wastes requiring tankerage to special disposal areas;
  - "site" means a site vested in or under the care, control or management of the local authority and set aside or used for the disposal of refuse and rubbish;
  - "street alignment" has the meaning given to it in and for the purposes of the Local Government Act 1960;
  - "swill" means pig swill as defined by the Act;
  - "trade refuse" means refuse and rubbish from shops, offices and light industries but does not include swill;
  - "work" means the removal of house and trade refuse from premises.
  - (2) The local authority having undertaken or contracted for the efficient execution of the work within its district, a person shall not execute or undertake the execution of any of the work undertaken or contracted for within the district so long as the local authority or its contractor executes or continues the execution of the work or is prepared and willing to execute or continue the execution of the work.
  - (3) The owner or occupier of a dwelling house, dwelling unit, flat or other premises used for residential purposes shall—
    - (a) not deposit in the receptacle provided pursuant to by-law 12 of this Part any rubbish or refuse other than house refuse;
    - (b) at or before 7 a.m. on the day in each week on which the receptacle is to be emptied place each receptacle between the building line and the street alignment so that it is visible from the street and in a position where it is accessible.
  - (4) A person, other than an authorised officer or employee of the local authority or a person authorised in writing by the local authority, shall not enter or remain on a site except for the purpose of depositing refuse or rubbish and after payment of the prescribed fee.
    - (5) A person shall not in or upon a site-
      - (a) deposit any refuse or rubbish other than at a position or within a building designated by an officer or employee of the local authority or as indicated by signs erected thereon;
      - (b) interfere with or remove any material or thing unless he has been authorised to do so by the local authority;

- (c) light a fire or cause to be burnt any refuse or rubbish without the approval of the local authority and in compliance with any conditions it imposes;
- (d) deposit a disused motor vehicle, motor vehicle body, old machinery or other material not easily compressed except at a place set aside for the purpose by the local authority and in the manner directed by an officer or employee of the local authority;
- (e) deposit any refuse, rubbish or material which is of a dangerous or hazardous nature or which the local authority or an officer or employee of the local authority considers would be deleterious to the operation of the site and directs him not to deposit it thereon;
- (f) exceed any speed limit designated by a sign erected thereon.
- (5) The following fees are hereby prescribed for admission to and the deposit of trade refuse, general bulk refuse, industrial refuse, liquid wastes, or swill on a site:
  - All vehicles other than compactors—\$1.00 per 1 000 kg or part thereof of licensed aggregate up to 10 000 kg plus 75c per 1 000 kg or part thereof over 10 000 kg of licensed aggregate.

Compactors— capacity 15 m³ or less capacity more than 15 m³	  \$25.00. \$35.00.
Disused motor vehicle, motor vehicle machinery	\$5.00.
Liquid wastes and swill	 \$1.00 per 200 litres.
Animal carcasses— cattle small domestic animals	 \$5.00 per carcass. \$2.00 per carcass.
Tyres— motor car truck and tractor	 40c each. \$1.50 each.

- (6) A person who is convicted of an offence against this by-law is liable to a maximum penalty of \$200.00 and a maximum daily penalty of \$4.00 for each day during which the offence continues.
- 3. The by-laws relating to removal of refuse and rubbish published in the Government Gazette of 20 July 1979 are hereby revoked.

By-law No. 60-Care, Control and Management of Parking Facilities.

By-law Relating to Parking Facilities.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the fourteenth day of December, 1981 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following amendments to By-law No. 60:—

- 1. That Clause 15(A) be amended by:
  - (a) inserting before the definition "pre-paid parking voucher" in sub-clause (1) the following definition:—



- (a) by deleting words "covered by this specification" in Clause 1.2 thereof;
