# ROYAL COMMISSION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Rear-Admiral Sir Richard John
To Wit:

TO BARRY ROY BLAIKIE, HYWEL DAVID EVANS, JAMES McMILLAN BROWN, NEIL McNEILL and ALBERT VICTOR CRANE, members of the Legislative Assembly and the Legislative Council: I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint you, Barry Roy Blaikie, Hywel David Evans, James McMillan Brown, Neil McNeill and Albert Victor Crane, members of the Legislative Assembly and the Legislative Council, to be an honorary Royal Commission without payment of remuneration to do the following things, namely—

- (a) to continue and complete the inquiries commenced by them, as a Joint Select Committee of the Legislative Assembly and the Legislative Council, into—
  - (i) future needs of dairy products and market milk over the next decade and the potential areas of supply;
  - (ii) the basis for and the extent of the differential between the price paid for milk/cream used for manufacture in Western Australia and Victoria including the effects of economics of scale, factory efficiency, pricing structure of W.A. products at retail level;
  - (iii) new technology related to dairy production and their application or otherwise to W.A.;

- (iv) future allocation and trading of quotas for the production of market milk;
- (v) the desirability or otherwise of vesting of all milk in the Dairy Industry Authority;
- (vi) the potential impact of closer economic relations between Australia and New Zealand and the W.A. dairy market;
- (vii) the scope and need for further rationalising the manufacturing processing sector and the geographic distribution of the producing sector; and
- (b) having completed those inquiries to make their report to him in writing and to make such recommendations in regard to the matters inquired into that will in its opinion ensure an adequate and reliable supply of milk to meet future requirements of the Western Australian community and to achieve a satisfactory return to all sectors of the dairy industry,

And I hereby appoint you the said Barry Roy Blaikie to be the Chairman of the said Royal Commission: and I hereby declare that by virtue of this Commission you may, in the execution of this Commission, do all such acts, matters and things and exercise all such powers as a Royal Commission or members of a Royal Commission may lawfully do and exercise whether under or pursuant to the Royal Commissions Act 1968 or otherwise.

# Land Act 1933. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Fisheries Act Amendment Regulations 1982.

  - 12E (1) A person shall not, in the waters of Shark Bay-
    - (a) use for the purpose of taking fish any net comprised wholly or in part of mesh less than 47 millimetres;
    - (b) set a fishing net, except within any period commencing one and one-half hours before sunset on any day and ending one and one-half hours before the next sunrise and a fishing net set within any such period shall be picked up no later than one and one-half hours after the sunrise next following the setting of the net.
    - (2) Any person using a set net in the waters of Shark Bay-
      - (a) shall lift and clean the net at least once in every hour during the time that the net is set; and
      - (b) shall remain in attendance on the net at all times while it is set, and for the purposes of this paragraph "in attendance" means within 100 metres from the nearest part of the net.
  - (3) A person shall not, in the waters of Shark Bay use a set net the end or ends of which are attached by stakes or weights to the sea bed.
    - (4) For the purposes of this regulation—
      - "set net" means a net placed in the water with a cork line at or beneath the surface; and
      - "the waters of Shark Bay" means the waters of Shark Bay lying south of a line drawn from Cape Inscription on Dirk Hartog Island due east to the mainland.".



The Municipality of the City of Nedlands.

By-law No. 11—By-law Relating to Street Lawns and Gardens and the Laying of Pipes under Carriageways.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 7 August 1980, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-law to be known as By-law No. 11—By-law Relating to Street Lawns and Gardens and the Laying of Pipes under Carriageways.

- 1. In this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires:—
- "carriageway" means a portion of a road that is improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular traffic, and includes the shoulders, and areas, including embayments, at the side or centre of the road, used for the standing or parking of vehicles, but does not include a lane, right-of-way or driveway;
- "Council" means the Council of the City of Nedlands;
- "footpath" means that part of a road set apart or constructed for the use of pedestrians and every established footway, pavement, lane, thoroughfare or any other part of a road set apart for the use of pedestrians;
- "intersection" means the area comprised within imaginary straight lines joining in succession the points of transection of the property lines of two or more roads that meet each other. Where the property lines are curved at any corner, the point of transection of the property lines shall be regarded as the point of the curve nearest to the point at which those property lines, if extended in straight lines from each end of the curve would met;
- "junction" means that part of a road lying between imaginary straight lines at right angles to the road commencing from the point of transection formed by its own property lines with the property lines of a road which abuts thereon. Where the property lines are curved at any corner, the point of transection formed by the property lines shall be determined in the same manner as is provided in the definition of "intersection";
- "garden" means an area of a street which is planted, developed or treated otherwise than as a lawn but does not include any development or treatment which involves the construction of works in a street within the meaning of section 509 of the Local Government Act 1960-1981;
- "lawn" means an area of a street which is planted solely with grass and which comprises no other landscaping feature other than a tree or shrub planted by the Council;
- "property line" means the boundary between the land comprising a street and the land that abuts thereon.
- "street" includes a thoroughfare—which the public are allowed to use; and includes every part of the thoroughfare;
- "verge" means that portion of the street between the property line and the carriageway.

- 2. Where before the coming into operation of this by-law, a garden has been planted in a street, the owner or occupier of the land that abuts on that portion of the street in which that garden is planted shall ensure that the garden complies with the provisions of this by-law but is not required to obtain a permit pursuant to this by-law.
- 3. (1) A person shall not plant a garden in a street, except pursuant to a permit issued by the Council and then only in conformity with this by-law.
- (2) The Council shall not issue a permit for the planting of a garden in any portion of a street, except on the application of the owner or occupier of the land that abuts on that portion of the street.
- (3) A person requiring a permit to plant a garden in a street shall submit to the Council a sketch plan setting out details of the proposed garden and the positions of the proposed garden beds and any trees or shrubs proposed to be planted in relation to the frontage of the carriageway.
- (4) Plans submitted for verge development shall allow for unobstructed pedestrian access to all signs, seats, bus shelters, and similar public service facilities from any constructed footpath. Where there is no constructed footpath a 1.5 metres wide strip parallel and adjacent to the kerb shall be provided and this area shall be sufficiently stable for foot traffic and must conform to any specifications approved by the Council.
- (5) Paving of portion of the verge abutting private property for the purpose of car parking shall not exceed 33.1/3% of the total area inclusive of all crossovers.
- (6) The owner or occupier of land that abuts on portion of a street may plant a lawn in that portion of the street without obtaining a permit to do so unless the lawn is part of a garden in that portion of the street.
  - 4. A person shall not plant a garden in a street:
    - (a) so that it extends beyond the frontage in respect of which the permit is issued.
    - (b) so that it encroaches on the pavement of a carriageway or a made footpath.
- 5. (1) The owner or occupier of land abutting on portion of a street in which a lawn or garden is planted shall ensure that any water pipe laid to that lawn or garden:—
  - (a) if laid beneath the surface of that part of the street other than the carriageway is laid at a depth of not more than 30 cm nor less than 15 cm and so that any fitting connected to a pipe does not project above the surface of the lawn or garden;
  - (b) if connected to a public water supply, is laid to comply with the requirements of the body constituted for, and having control of that supply under an Act;
  - (c) if connected to a private water supply, where passing under carriageway, pavement, made footpaths or crossings, is of galvanised, wrought iron, or of copper; and
  - (d) has valves located within the property, where they are connected to the water supply, and are fitted so as to give complete control of the flow of water from that supply.
- (2) Where a person, in the course of laying pipes pursuant to this by-law, causes damage to any carriageway, pavement, footpath, or crossing or to any water, gas or sewerage pipes, to any power or telephone cable or to a fire hydrant, that damage may be made good, by the authority having the control of the thing damaged, at the expense of that person or of the person on whose behalf the pipes were laid, and the amount of that expense may be recovered in any court of competent jurisdiction.
- 6. (1) No person shall lay any pipe or construct any pipeline beneath any carriageway without first obtaining the written approval of the Town Clerk of the City of Nedlands, nor otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of this by-law.
- (2) The Council may in giving its approval fix a period during which the pipe or pipeline may remain beneath the carriageway or may give its approval for an indefinite period.
- (3) If, during the carrying out of road works or other works approved by the Council, the said pipe or pipeline is damaged by any employee of the Council, the Council itself will not be held responsible for such damage or be compelled to repair same.
- (4) Any person laying any pipe or constructing any pipeline beneath a carriageway shall comply with the following conditions.
  - (a) He shall lodge with the Town Clerk of the City of Nedlands, for retention, a plan showing the proposed position of the pipes and such longitudinal and cross section as may be necessary together with full particulars as to the purpose for which the pipe or pipeline is proposed to be used.
  - (b) He shall lodge with the Council, pending the satisfactory completion of the work, such deposit as the Council may reasonably require as a security for the satisfactory completion of the work.
  - (c) He shall lay the pipe or pipeline in accordance with the plan submitted and the pipe or pipeline shall be properly aligned and jointed.
  - (d) He shall lay the pipe or pipeline so that no part thereof shall be nearer than 450 mm to the surface of any portion of the carriageway, or at a depth approved by the Town Clerk.
  - (e) He shall erect a suitable sign, to be approved by the Town Clerk, where the pipe or pipeline enters and leaves the carriageway, showing the exact position of same.
  - (f) He shall take all reasonable precautions to avoid accident to users of the road or footpath during the progress of the work and shall indemnify the Council against any claims it may receive because of the work so carried out.

- (g) He shall exhibit danger signs and red flags during the hours of daylight and shall keep red lights burning during the hours of darkness throughout the time during which there is excavation open or other dangers to traffic.
- (h) He shall, unless a temporary closure of the road is authorised by the Council, ensure that a sufficient portion of the road or footpath is kept open for traffic or pedestrian use while the work is in progress.
- (i) He shall fill in the excavation and reinstate the surface of the road or footpath on the completion of the work to the satisfaction of the Town Clerk
- (j) The work when commenced shall be carried to completion with all reasonable speed.
- (5) If the person laying any pipe or constructing a pipeline beneath the carriageway shall fail to fill in the excavation or to reinstate the surface of the carriageway, the Council may do so and recover the cost from him.
- (6) No person shall dig up, alter or otherwise interfere with any pipe or pipeline laid beneath a carriageway except with the written approval of the Council. The work carried out shall as far as is applicable be done in accordance with the provisions of Clause 6 (4) of this by-law.
- (7) Where any pipe or pipeline has been laid beneath a carriageway the Council may give notice in writing to the person owning or served by such pipe or pipeline to repair or replace it, and such person shall thereupon carry out such work under the conditions so far as applicable as are set forth in Clause 6 (4) of this by-law.
- (8) At the expiration of the period specified by the Council in its approval, the person owning or served by the pipe or pipeline shall remove it, complying with the provisions of Clause 6 (4) of this by-law so far as they are applicable.
- (9) The Council may, at the expiration of the period specified in its approval, or if no period has been specified, at any time order that the person owning or served by the pipe or pipeline remove it and he shall so remove it complying with the provisions of paragraphs (f) to (j) both inclusive, of Clause 6 (4) of this by-law so far as the same are applicable.
- (10) Should any person who has been ordered to replace, repair or remove a pipe or pipeline fail to do so, the Council itself may carry out the work and recover the cost from him.
- 7. A person shall not water a street lawn or garden in such a manner as will, or may, occasion inconvenience to persons using the adjoining carriageway or footpath.
- 8. (1) A person shall not without first obtaining the approval of the Council plant or keep any tree or shrub in a garden in a street if that tree or shrub is of a height exceeding 0.50 metres, or is of a variety likely to grow to a height exceeding 0.50 metres.
- (2) Nothing in this by-law authorises a person to place or erect any fence enclosure or other obstruction on, or about a lawn or garden in a street.
- 9. (1) The Council may at any time by notice in writing to the owner or occupier of land that abuts on portion of a street in which a lawn or garden is planted require that owner or occupier to remove any tree, shrub, water piping or fitting from that lawn or garden and the owner or occupier shall comply with that notice within the time stipulated for compliance therewith in the notice.
- (2) If an owner or occupier upon whom a notice has been served pursuant to subclause (1) of this clause fails to comply with that notice within the stipulated time, the Council may remove the tree, shrub, piping or fitting referred to in the notice at the expense of the owner or occupier and any expense incurred by the Council in so doing may be recovered from that owner or occupier in a court of competent jurisdiction.
- 10. (1) The Council may, without being liable to compensate any person therefore, dig up all or any part of a lawn or garden in a street, for the purpose of carrying out any authorised works.
- (2) A person employed by the Council acting pursuant to this clause shall not disturb a lawn or garden or damage any pipes laid under that lawn or garden to any greater extent than is reasonably necessary for the purpose of carrying out any authorised works and shall, upon the completion of the works, reinstate the lawn or garden, as far as is reasonably practicable.
- 11. (1) Where the Council for the purpose of carrying out authorised works is of the opinion that the carrying out of those works may be impeded by the existence of piping, under a lawn or garden in a street, it may give notice to the owner or occupier of the land abutting on the lawn or garden to remove the piping, until the completion of the works.
- (2) Where the owner or occupier does not comply with the notice within the time stipulated in the notice for compliance therewith, the Council may remove and replace the piping at the expense of the owner or occupier.
- 12. (1) Except as provided by this by-law, a person shall not damage a lawn or garden in a street.

- A person who commits an offence against this by-law is liable to a penalty of two hundred dollars.

#### By-laws Relating to Fencing.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 11 September 1981, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

- 1. The following by-laws apply within the boundaries of the Shire of Capel.
- 2. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires the following terms shall have the meanings set against them hereunder respectively:—

"Council" means the Council of the Shire of Capel.

"Dangerous" in relation to any fence or wall, means a fence that is likely to collapse or fall or part of which is likely to fall by reason or faulty design, location, construction, deterioration of materials, damage by termites, decay, changes in ground level or any other cause.

"Fence" includes a wall and retaining wall.

- "Dividing Fence" has the meaning given to it by the Dividing Fences Act.
- "Cattle" includes horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, colts, camels, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, lambs, goats, and
- 3. Notwithstanding any other provision in these by-laws, Council may give approval in writing to erect a security wire mesh fence on land within the Shire. Such a fence shall not exceed 1.8 metres in height at any point along its length unless so authorised by the Council approval.
- 4. (a) The use of corrugated galvanised iron or flat iron is prohibited in the construction of any new fence or in the repair, alteration or addition to any existing fence.
- (b) The use of iron spikes or broken glass on a fence, gate or any part of the premises or on anything erected on property adjoining a street way, footpath or other public place is prohibited.
- (c) No person shall erect a dangerous fence on or within three metres of the boundary of a public place.
- 5. (a) The owner or occupier of land which a fence is erected upon shall maintain the fence in good condition and in such a manner as to prevent it from becoming dangerous, or in a state of disrepair.
- (b) Where the fence is a dividing fence each of the owners or occupiers of the adjoining land is liable to maintain it as required by sub-bylaw (a) hereof.
- 6. The Council may give notice in writing to the owner or to the occupier of any land upon which there exists a fence that has not been maintained in accordance with by-law 5 requiring such owner or occupier to pull down, repair, remove, paint or maintain such fence within the time stipulated in the notice.
- 7. If any owner or occupier of land who has been given notice pursuant to by-law 6 fails to comply therewith the Council may enter upon such land and maintain the fence and recover the amount of expenses thereof from the owner in a Court of competent jurisdiction and may prosecute the owner for committing a breach of by-law 5.
- 8. A person who fails to comply with a notice given to him pursuant to by-law 6 or who does anything which he is prohibited from doing by these by-laws or who fails to do a thing which he is required or directed to do by these by-laws commits an offence.
  - 9. A person who is guilty of an offence against these by-laws is liable to:-
    - (a) a maximum penalty of \$200.00.
    - (b) a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$20.00 per day.

Within the area of Town Planning Scheme Nos. 3, 4 and the Capel, Boyanup and Gwindinup Townsites.

- 10. A fence constructed in accordance with the specifications of the first schedule to these by-laws shall be a sufficient fence for the purpose of defining a "sufficient fence" pursuant to section 5 of the Dividing Fences Act.
  - 11. By-law 12 (a) and (b) applies to areas of 2 000m<sup>2</sup> or less.
- 12. (a) Subject to by-law 4 the following materials may be used in construction of a fence, namely:— brick, concrete, masonry, link mesh, timber or asbestos and the use of any other materials other than the above whether in the construction of a new fence or in the repair, alteration or the addition to an existing fence is prohibited unless approval is obtained from the Council.
- (b) Notwithstanding by-law 12 (a) barbed wire may be used on a Council approved security wire mesh fence provided that such barbed wire is no less than 1.8 metres from the ground at any point along the length of such fence.
- 13. The use of secondhand materials is prohibited in the construction of a new fence or in the repair, alteration or addition to any existing fence, unless Council approves otherwise.

Within the area of Town Planning Scheme No. 2 and all Special Rural Zones.

- 14. A fence constructed in accordance with the specifications contained in schedule 2 of these by-laws shall be a sufficient fence for the purpose of the definition of a sufficient fence pursuant to section 5 of the Dividing Fences Act.
- 15. The previous by-laws relating to Fencing Lands Abutting on any Road as published in the Government Gazette on 31 July 1953 are hereby revoked.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

If it is not practical to comply with any specifications laid down for the First Schedule, Council may consider an alternative standard on written request.

Within the area of Town Planning Scheme Nos. 3 and 4 and the Capel, Boyanup and Gwindinup Townsites a sufficient fence shall be as follows:—

#### Allotments of 2 000 m<sup>2</sup> and less.

- 1. (i) Any fence fronting a street shall not exceed a height of 900 mm at any point along the whole length of such frontage.
- (ii) Any dividing fence which abuts a street shall not exceed a height of 900 mm
- at any point for a distance of 7.5 m from such street.

  (iii) That length of a dividing fence more than 7.5 metres distance from a street and any other fence around an allotment at a greater distance than 7.5 metres from a street shall not exceed 1.8 metres in height at any point along its length.
  - 2. Save as aforesaid a sufficient fence shall be constructed as follows:-
    - (a) Corner posts shall be 125 mm x 125 mm x 2 150 mm and intermediate posts shall be 125 mm x 75 mm x 2 150 mm spaced at not more than three (3) metre centres.

Corner posts shall be strutted two ways with 100 mm x 50 mm sole plates and 75 mm x 50 mm struts.

Posts shall be checked for two rows of rails.

Fences shall be covered with 75 mm x 20 mm x 1 800 mm sawn pickets placed close together so as to form a complete screen and shall be double nailed to each rail.

- (b) Corrugated asbestos sheet fences shall be erected as follows:---
  - (i) Sheets under 1800 mm in height to be trenched 450 mm into the ground.
  - (ii) Sheets 1 800 mm and over in height to be trenched 600 mm into the ground.

Sheets to be lapped and fixed with three galvanised 6 mm gutter bolts, nuts and washers.

#### Allotments of Over 2 000 m2.

- 1. For fences of four plain wires, posts not more than 4.0 metre intervals.
- 2. For fences of six plain wires, posts not more than 6.0 metre intervals.
- 3. (a) For fence of meshed wire to have posts not more than 20.0 metre intervals.
- (b) To consist of not less than one wire above the mesh. To be a support wire for the mesh.
  - (c) Ties from mesh, to be not more than 7.0 metre intervals.
- All posts, supports, droppers and wire spacers to have tops properly aligned; such fence to be cattle proof.
  - 5. Barbed wire may be used subject to the written approval of Council.
  - 6. All posts to be not less than 1.2 m above the ground.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE.

Within the areas of Town Planning Scheme No. 2 and all Special Rural Zones a sufficient fence shall be constructed as follows:-

- 1. Not less than four wires with posts, droppers or wire spacers at not more than 4.0 metre intervals.
- For fences of one barb and five plain wires, posts, droppers or wire spacers at not more than 6.0 metre intervals.
- For electrified fences, posts at not more than 10 metre intervals, and not less than four wires.
- For suspended fences, at least four wires of which two shall be barbed, with posts at not more than 22 metres and droppers or wire spacers at 5 metre intervals.
- (a) For fences of meshed wire to have posts not more than 20.0 metre intervals.
  - (b) To consist of not less than one wire above the mesh. To be a support wire for the mesh.
  - (c) Ties from mesh, to be not more than 7.0 metre intervals.
- All posts to be not less than 1.2 m above the ground.
- All posts, supports, droppers and wire spacers to have tops properly aligned; such fence to be cattle proof.
- If it is not practical to comply to these specifications, Council may consider an alternative standard on written request.

#### DOG ACT 1976-1977.

Shire of Dandaragan,

By-laws Relating to Dogs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on 18 June 1981 to amend its By-laws Relating to Dogs, published in the *Government Gazette* on 24 November 1972 with such alterations as are here set out.

- (a) Add the heading "Part 1" before clause 1.
- (b) Add the following new clauses:
  - 20. A person shall not keep or permit or suffer to be kept more than two dogs over the age of three months and the young of those dogs under that age on any premises within the townsites of Badgingarra, Cervantes, Dandaragan and Jurien unless such premises are licensed as an approved kennel establishment pursuant to section 27 of the Dog Act or have been granted an exemption pursuant to section 26 (3) of the Dog Act.

#### Part II—Regulation of Dog Kennels.

- 21. The occupier of any premises whereon more than two dogs are kept or permitted or suffered to remain and which premises have been licensed by the Council as an approved kennel establishment, shall provide a kennel or kennels which shall comply with the following conditions:—
  - (a) Each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto.
  - (b) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 10 metres from the boundaries of the land in the occupation of the occupier.
  - (c) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be any less distance than 24 metres from any road or street to which the premises has its main frontage. In the case of a corner allotment no part of any kennel or yard shall be at any less distance than 6 metres from the side boundary to which the premises has its secondary frontage.
  - (d) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be any less distance than 20 metres from any dwelling, house excluding a house on property on which a kennel establishment is to be located, church, school-room, hall or factory.
  - (e) The walls shall be rigid, impervious and structurally sound.
  - (f) The roof shall be constructed of some impervious materials.
  - (g) Unless otherwise approved by Council all external surfaces of material shall be painted and kept painted with quality paint.
  - (h) The lowest internal height shall be at least two metres from the floor.
  - (i) Each yard shall be securely fenced and kept securely fenced with a fence not less than two metres in height constructed of galvanised iron, wood, galvanised link mesh or netting and or any other material approved by Council.
  - (j) All gates shall be provided with proper catches or means of fastening,
  - (k) The upper surface of the floor of each kennel shall be set at least 100 millimetres above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a smooth surface. It shall have a fall of not less than 1 in 100. The entire yard shall be surrounded by a drain which shall be properly laid, ventilated and trapped. All floor washings shall pass through this drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the health requirements of the Council.
  - (1) The floor of any yard which is floored shall be constructed in the same manner as the floor of any kennel and as provided in paragraph (k).

- (m) For each dog therein every kennel shall have not less than two square metres of floor space and every yard not less than three square metres.
- (n) All kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels shall be maintained in a clean condition and cleaned and disinfected when so ordered by an officer of the Council.
- 24. Council shall not permit the establishment or maintenance of a kennel in any area if in the opinion of the Council such kennel would adversely affect the environment, be a nuisance to other residents or in any way otherwise be detrimental or prejudicial.
- 25. No kennel shall be erected unless and until plans, specifications and a location plan showing the proposed site for such kennel and of the yard appurtenant thereto have been approved by the Council.
- (c) Replace the Schedule of Fees with the following:-

  - "Act" means the Local Government Act 1960-1981.
  - "Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Gingin.
  - "Municipal District" means the municipal district of the Shire of Gingin. the terms "stall" and "stallholder" shall have the meanings assigned to them by section 242 of the Act.

other terms and expressions have the same meanings as they have in the Act.

- 2. Any person who desires to be a stallholder within the municipal district shall make application to the Council for a licence to do so in the form of the first schedule hereto.
- 3. The Council may grant a licence to the applicant; or the Council may refuse to grant a licence upon any of the following grounds:—
  - 3.1 that the applicant has committed a breach of this by-law;
  - 3.2 that the applicant is not of good character or has been convicted of a criminal offence;
  - 3.3 that the needs of the municipal district or the affected portion thereof are adequately catered for by established shops or by persons to whom licences have been issued;
  - 3.4 that the stall is untidy, in disrepair or of insufficiently sound construction for use as a stall;
  - 3.5 that the stall or the customers thereof are likely to cause an obstruction to pedestrians or vehicular traffic;
  - 3.6 that the stall will adversely affect the amenity of the affected area;
  - 3.7 that inadequate parking space is available for the customers of the stall.
- 4. A licence granted by the Council shall be in the form of the second schedule hereto and shall describe the things or services which are authorised by the licence to be displayed and sold at the stall and the place at which the stall is authorised to be set up and conducted.
- 5. A licence granted by the Council shall remain valid until 31 December next after the issue of the licence or until the expiry date specified in the licence, unless previously revoked.
- 6. The fees set out hereunder shall be payable to the Council in respect of each licence:—
  - 6.1 Stallholders Licence (Annual) .... .... .... 40.00
    6.2 Stallholders Licence (Issued in respect of a period of three months or less) .... 15.00
- 7. The Council may revoke any licence issued by it on any of the grounds set out in Clause 3 hereof, or upon any of the following grounds:—
  - 7.1 that the licensee has committed a breach of the terms or conditions of the licence;
  - 7.2 that the licensee is not conducting his business in a respectable or sober manner;
  - 7.3 that the licensee has assigned his licence or does not himself carry on the business;
  - 7.4 that the licensee is not regularly carrying on the business for which the licence was granted; or
  - 7.5 that the stall does not comply with this by-law.
  - 8. No person shall act as a stallholder or operate a stall:—
    - 8.1 without being licensed by this Council;
    - 8.2 in any place or part of the district other than that specified in the licence;
    - 8.3 in respect of commodities or goods of a type description of place of origin not authorised by the licence;
    - 8.4 otherwise than in accordance with any conditions imposed by the Council when granting the licence.
  - 9. No stallholder shall:-
    - 9.1 sell or offer for sale any commodity excepting between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m.;
    - 9.2 deposit or store any box or basket under a vehicle or on the roadway or footpath;
    - 9.3 shout his wares or make any violent outcry noises or disturbances;

- 9.4 conduct a stall in such a manner that the stall or customers obstruct the free passage of pedestrians or vehicles on any footpath or roadway; or 9.5 act in an offensive manner.
- 10. A person to whom a stallholders licence is issued shall maintain the stall in respect of which the licence is issued in good order and condition.
  - 11. A stallholder shall:-

- 11.1 carry his licence with him and produce it upon demand to any authorised officer of the Council or to a member of the Police Force.
- 11.2 have his name legibly displayed on every stall operated by him.
- 12. Any person who commits a breach of any provisions of this by-law or who is found guilty of an offence against any provision of this by-law shall be liable to:—
  - 12.1 a maximum penalty of \$200.00; and
  - 12.2 a maximum daily penalty during breach of \$20.00 per day.
- 13. Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 2, clause 4 and clauses 6 and 8 of this by-law, the Council may grant, without fee, licences to conduct stalls in any street or way or on any land for any period specified in such a licence if such stalls are conducted solely for the purposes of raising money for religious or charitable purposes.

  - (4) (i) The total floor area of the convenience containing the above facilities shall be a minimum of 5.2 square metres and shall be constructed in accordance with the building and health by-laws as adopted by the Shire from time to time;
    - (ii) the liquid waste of any caravan parked on the land shall be discharged by a pipe to a waste disposal gully and thereafter disposed of pursuant to the Bacteriolytic Treatment of Sewage and Disposal of Effluent and Liquid Waste Regulations as adopted by the Council from time to time;
    - (iii) a hardstanding area sealed with a two coat bitumen seal or concrete to a thickness to the satisfaction of the Council and to a minimum size 9 metres long by 2.5 metres wide shall be provided for each caravan;

    - (v) anchor blocks shall be provided to each hardstand site in the same manner as provided for in by-law 15 (2) (i) of these by-laws;
    - (iv) the hardstand site and convenience containing the above facilities shall be provided with a joint enclosure consisting of a 1.8 metre high wire mesh fence.
