THE Public is hereby notified that I have issued a permit to Antonio Gaetano Fiocco, 23 Francis Street, Geraldton, to establish a processing establishment to process fish in pursuance of the provisions of section 35C of the Fisheries Act 1905-1979, on board licensed fishing boat "Christamara Too", registered number LFB G142, subject to the following conditions.

That the processing establishment—

1. Shall comply with the requirements of the Fisheries Act 1905-1979 and all Regulations, Orders in Council, and Notices and Ministerial Directions issued thereunder.
2. Shall not be used for the processing of rock lobster or prawns.
3. Shall comply with the requirements of the Health Act 1911 (amended).
4. Shall be registered as an export establishment pursuant to the provisions of the Export (Fish) Regulations made under the provisions of the Customs Act 1901 (amended) and the Commercial (Trade Descriptions) Act 1905 (amended) of the Parliament of the Commonwealth should it be used to process fish for export.
5. Shall not be used for the processing of marron (*Cherax tenuimanus*) unless a license is held under section 39C of the Fisheries Act 1905.
6. Shall not be used for the processing of fish or crustacea caught by any other vessel.

In accordance with the provisions of section 35K, any person aggrieved by this decision, may within fourteen days after publication of this notice, appeal against the decision or order by serving on the Minister for Fisheries and Wildlife, a statement in writing of the grounds of their appeal.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve under section 84 of the Land Act 1933, of the King Locations set out in the schedule hereto being set apart as Special Settlement Lands and

of these locations being made available for selection for the purpose of "Irrigated Agriculture" pursuant to section 86 (c) of the said Act on the terms and subject to the conditions set out hereunder:—

Conditions.

1. Applications shall be accompanied by a proposed budget and five year development program which should be prepared in liaison with officers of the Public Works Department and Department of Agriculture. Development plans will need to incorporate suitable soil conservation techniques to the satisfaction of the Department of Agriculture.
2. Water supply for Locations 370 and 580 can be obtained by pumping from the adjacent main irrigation channel. The positioning of the pumps will have to be approved by the P.W.D. A pumping permit will be required from the P.W.D. and it will stipulate standards of construction to be provided and conditions of pumping.
3. Water supply for Location 605 will be supplied from S4 channel via pipeline across the D4 drain and into holding dams within the location. Construction of dams with appropriate capacity will be the responsibility of the lessee. Pumping will be required to distribute the water across the blocks.
4. Irrigation charges for water consumed will be in accordance with the Rights of Water and Irrigation Act by-laws section 31A sub 2 (a) (ii). This charge is currently \$11.76 per hectare or part thereof, charged on maximum area watered in any one year.
5. The lessee will be expected to take up residence on or within working distance of his farm within 12 months of allocation and make it his usual residence for the following five years.
6. Only one farm will be allotted to any one applicant but applicants should list their order of preference.
7. The successful applicant will be required in the first 5 years of the lease, to provide an irrigated water supply to the standards and requirements approved by the P.W.D., clear, cultivate and maintain in an arable condition not less than 40 per cent of the cultivable area in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by the Department of Agriculture. A minimum area of 10 hectares of suitable crop shall be grown under irrigation in the first year, and in subsequent years an additional 10 hectares per year of crops acceptable to the Department of Agriculture, shall be planted.
8. Each location shall be boundary fenced with a stock proof fence to the satisfaction of the Minister within 5 years. However the lessee of Location 370 shall be excused from fencing out the 20 metre strip to be excised from that location to facilitate the option of piping irrigation water to Location 325.
9. On farm drainage is the responsibility of the lessee and shall be carried out in accordance with plans approved by the Department of Agriculture. Attention is drawn to by-law 11A of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act.
10. Forfeiture provisions shall be in accordance with section 23 of the Land Act.
11. The term of the lease shall be 30 years. At the expiration of the lease or at any time after 5 years from its commencement, if the above conditions have been complied with, and the land price and water charges fully paid, a Crown Grant may issue.
12. The lessee shall not sell, assign or agree to sell or assign, or otherwise dispose of the whole or any part of the lease unless and until the Minister for Lands has given his consent to the proposed dealing. The consent of the Minister will not be given within the first five years of the lease term.

13. King Location 370 is made available subject to payment within thirty days of allocation, for improvements existing on the land, should the successful applicant be other than the owner of the said improvements.

- (a) The purchaser shall erect on the lot purchased a residence to comply with Local Authority by-laws within four (4) years from the due date of the first instalment. 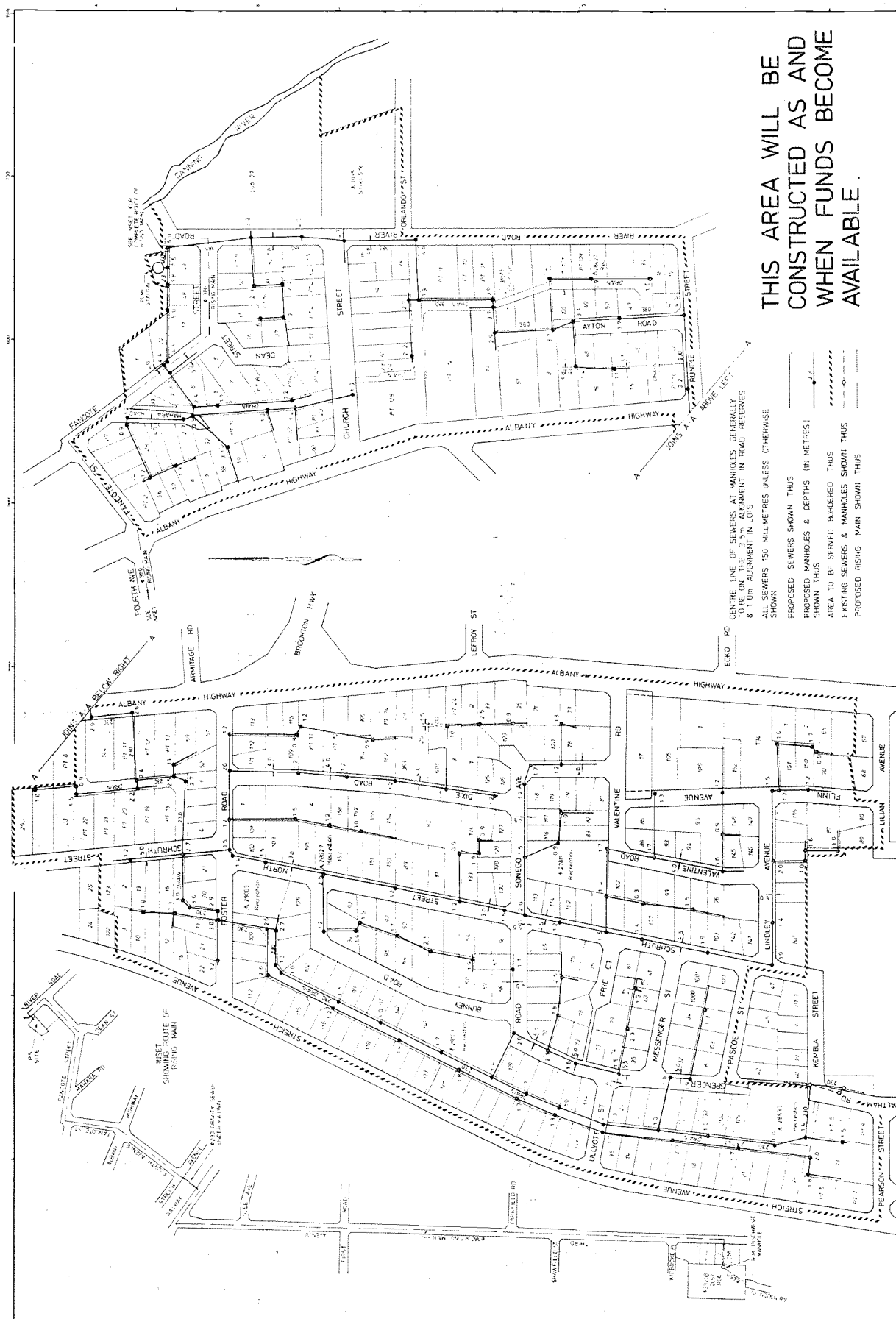
