 - (iii) Where a swab blood urine or other sample taken from a horse is shown to contain a drug or drugs the drug or drugs shall be deemed to have been administered to the horse within a period of seven days preceding the time of taking the said swab blood urine or other sample unless the contrary is established to the satisfaction of the Stewards. Provided that this presumption shall not apply in relation to any drug notified by the Chairman of Stewards to be a drug exempted from the operation of this sub-rule.

POISONS ACT 1964-1970.

Notice.

(Section 24 (5).)

1. I, JAMES COLUMBA McNULTY, Commissioner of Public Health, acting under the provisions of section 24 of the Poisons Act 1964-1970, do hereby cancel the notice issued under that section of the Act on 7 March 1980, and do hereby impose such conditions, restrictions and limitations on the sale, supply, use and possession of the poisons which are specified in the Seventh Schedule of Appendix "A" to the Poisons Act 1964-1970, and also specified in the first column of the Schedule to this notice as are set out directly opposite and corresponding to that poison in the second column of that Schedule.

2. In this notice unless the contrary intention appears—

"Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Public Health;

"Department" has the meaning attributed to it in the Public Service Act 1978;

"Pesticides Regulations" means the Pesticides Regulations made under the Health Act 1911;

"primary producers" means persons whose land is used for all or any of the following businesses—

(a) an agricultural business (but not a forestry or reforestation business); and

(b) a grazing, horticultural, viticultural, apicultural, pig-raising or poultry farming business;

"registered veterinary surgeon" has the meaning attributed to it in the Veterinary Surgeons Act 1960;

"research" means research approved by the Commissioner.

3. The conditions, restrictions and limitations on the sale, supply, use and possession of the specified poisons imposed by this notice shall not affect—

(a) the supply to and use by persons approved by the Commissioner for research, or other specific purposes;

(b) the sale by persons licenced to manufacture and distribute or sell by wholesale to retailers licenced in accordance with the Poisons Act Regulations 1965, to sell such poisons;

(c) the sale by persons licenced to manufacture and distribute or sell by wholesale to commercial pesticide firms or pesticide operators licenced under the provisions of the Pesticide Regulations to use these poisons in accordance with the label registered or licence issued under the Pesticide Regulations;

(d) the use and possession by registered commercial pesticide firms or licenced pesticide operators for use in accordance with licences issued under the Pesticide Regulations;

(e) the sale by persons licenced to manufacture and distribute or sell poisons specified in the Seventh Schedule by wholesale or by retail to industrial users approved by the Commissioner;

(f) the use and possession of poisons specified in the Seventh Schedule by industrial users approved by the Commissioner.

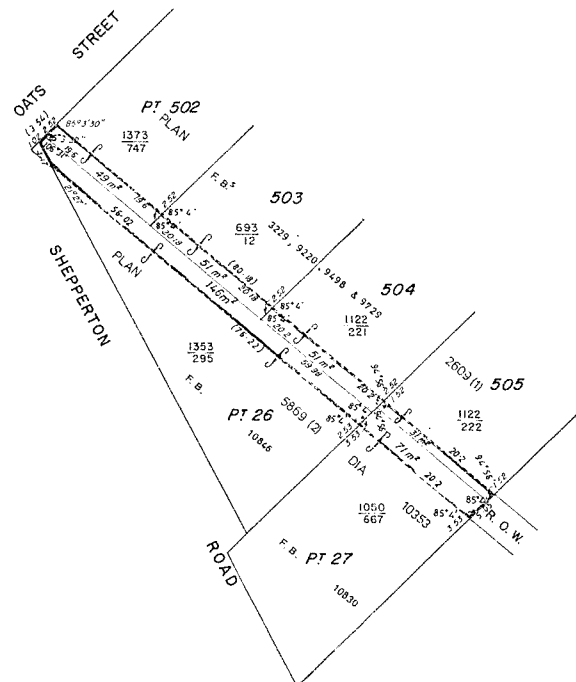

DOG ACT 1976-1977.

City of Melville.

By-Laws Relating to Dogs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 25 November 1980 to repeal the whole of the "By-Laws Relating to Dogs" as published in the *Government Gazette* No. 104 of 7 November 1972, and to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws:—

I.—Interpretation.

1. In these By-laws unless the context otherwise requires the following definitions shall apply:—

"Act" shall mean the Dog Act 1976 and Amendment and Regulations appurtenant thereto.

"Authorised Officer" shall mean an Officer of the Council authorised by the Council to perform duties in accordance with these By-laws.

"Council" shall mean the Council of the Municipality of the City of Melville.

"District" shall mean the district of the Municipality of the City of Melville.

"Foreshore" shall mean that portion of the District under the care control and management of the Council adjoining the left banks of the Swan and Canning Rivers between the district boundary and the nearest made portion of a carriageway adjacent thereto.

"Pound" shall mean a dog pound as prescribed in the Act.

"Reserve" shall have the same meaning as that of a Public Reserve as in the Local Government Act 1960-1980.

"Schedule" unless the context otherwise states shall mean a schedule of these By-laws.

"Seized" shall mean a dog seized by an Authorised Officer, but not having been placed in a Council Pound.

"Road Reserve" shall have the same meaning as that of a "Street" as defined in the Local Government Act 1960-1980.

II.—Impounding.

2. The Council nominates as a Pound an area sited on portion of Swan Location 74 Part of lot 6 on Diagram 4518 Certificate of Title Volume 1219 Folio 923, being, at the Council depot, Norma Road, Myaree.

3. The Pound shall be open for the release of impounded dogs at such times and on such days of the week as determined by the Council. At any other reasonable time a dog may be released conditional upon the payment of fees applicable to the special opening of the Pound as detailed in By-law 4 and the first Schedule.

4. The owner or person lawfully authorised by the owner of a seized or impounded dog requiring the release of the dog on production of proof of ownership of the dog and upon payment of the fees as specified in the first Schedule and proof of registration of the dog in accordance with the Act shall be entitled to the release of that dog.

III.—Restricted Areas.

5. The owner or person having charge of a dog shall prevent that dog entering or being in or upon any of the following:—

- (i) a public building;
- (ii) private property on which a sign is erected clearly indicating that no dogs shall be permitted thereon;
- (iii) the foreshore and adjoining Reserve of the total foreshore area on the left banks of the Swan and Canning Rivers on the North boundary of the District for the East boundary of the District in a direction generally North then generally West on the North boundary to the West boundary of the District, but excluding those areas as defined in By-law 6 and 7 of these By-laws.

6. The owner or person having charge of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in or upon any of the following places unless restrained by a cord, chain or leash held by a person capable of effecting restraint of the dog:—

- (i) any Reserve on which a sporting activity is in progress;
- (ii) that portion of the foreshore of the Canning River and adjoining Reserve on the North boundary of the District from the prolongation of the Southern alignment of Flanagan Street generally South to the down stream of the Canning Bridge;
- (iii) that portion of the foreshore of the Canning River and the adjoining Reserve on the North boundary of the District from the prolongation of the Southern alignment of Queens Road generally South to the prolongation of the Northern alignment of Cranford Avenue being the intersection of The Esplanade and Pulo Road, Mt. Pleasant.

7. The provisions of By-law 5 shall not apply to that portion of the Reserve No. 24063 known as Burke Drive Reserve and bounded on the South by the Northern alignment of Burke Drive and on the West by a prolongation of the Eastern alignment of Stock Road at the intersection of Honour Avenue, on the East by the prolongation of the Western alignment of Haig Road, and on the North by the North boundary of the District.

IV.—General.

8. Any person liable for the control of a dog who permits that dog to excrete on any Reserve or Road Reserve or on any land within the District without the written consent of the occupier of that land commits an offence unless the excreta is totally removed forthwith and disposed of either on private land with the written consent of the occupier or in such other manner as the Council may approve.

9. (a) Subject to By-law 9 (b) the owner of a dog shall ensure that fences and gates to the property on which the dog is normally kept shall be capable of preventing the dog from escaping from the property.

(b) The Council may serve a written direction to the owner of any dog to provide a suitable enclosure on the property where the dog is normally kept if in the opinion of the Council the dog is not adequately prevented from escaping from the property.

(c) Any person receiving a lawful direction pursuant to sub-by-law (b) herein shall comply with the direction within fourteen days of its service.

10. No person shall permit to remain on a property more than two dogs over the age of three months unless such premises are licenced as an approval kennel establishment with the Council and in accordance with the "By-laws Relating to the Control of Dogs and Kennels", or unless such premises are exempt pursuant to Section 26 of the Act.

11. Any owner who by implication or expressly requests or permits the euthanasia of his dog whether that dog shall have been seized or impounded or otherwise shall be liable for and shall pay to the Council prior to the euthanasia of the dog the fee or fees prescribed in the first Schedule.

12. Council may engage the services of a veterinary surgeon registered pursuant to the Veterinary Surgeons Act (1960) to implement the euthanasia of dogs required to be destroyed by the Council pursuant to the Act or these By-laws.

13. Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of these By-laws commits an offence and shall upon conviction in a court of competent jurisdiction be liable to a PENALTY not exceeding ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS.

14. The payment of any fees in respect to the seizure, care, detention or euthanasia of a dog shall in no way relieve the owner of his liability to any penalty under any provisions of the Act and Regulations or these By-laws.

15. (a) The offences described in column three of the second Schedule are prescribed pursuant to the respective By-laws as an offence in relation to which modified penalties apply and the amount appearing in column four of that Schedule directly opposite an offence is a modified penalty payable in respect of that offence if dealt with pursuant to these By-laws.

(b) Infringement notices issued under this By-law shall be in the form depicted in form 7 of the first schedule to the Dog Act Regulations 1976.

(c) Withdrawal of infringement notice issued under these By-laws shall be in the form depicted in form 8 of the first schedule to the Dog Act Regulations 1976.

The Municipality of the Town of Bassendean.

By-Laws Relating to the Prevention of Damage and Obstruction to Streets, Public Places and Property Vested in or Under the Control of the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all of the powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on 28 July 1980, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

The By-laws relating to the Prevention of Damage to Streets published in the *Government Gazette* of 10 June 1965 are hereby repealed:—

1. No person shall without the authority of the Council, destroy, damage or otherwise interfere with any road, street, bridge, building, fence or other property vested in or under the care, control or management of the Council.
2. No person shall without the consent of the Council by means of any writing, drawing, painting, stencilling or by poster, or by causing any paper or other substance to adhere or otherwise to place any notice, sign, advertisement, design, writing or picture on any building, fence or tree or other property vested in or under the care, control or management of the Council.
3. No person shall deface, damage or do any act which has the effect of defacing or damaging any building, appliance, apparatus, fence or seat vested in or under the care, control or management of the Council.
4. No person shall remove any sand, timber or other material from any street, public reserve, or property vested in or under the care, control or management of the Council without the written consent of the Council.
5. No person shall injure, damage, destroy, carry away or remove from its place any tree, shrub or plant standing in any street, public reserve or property vested in or under the care, control or management of the Council.
6. No person shall destroy or cause any damage to or remove any tree guard, fence or other protection to any tree shrub or plant.
7. No person shall without the authority of the Council, do any of the following acts:—
 - (a) break up, damage, displace or destroy the surface of or excavate in a street, way, footpath or other public place;
 - (b) throw, place or drain offensive noxious or dangerous fluid or substance in any street, way, footpath or other public place or into a gutter or drain, way, footpath or other public place;
 - (c) deposit any obstruction, box, case, crate, milk bottle or any other matter or thing whether of the same kind as or a different kind from those in this paragraph specified in a street, way, footpath or other public place;
 - (d) throw, place or leave or cause to be thrown, placed or left, fruit or fruit skins or peel or other vegetable substances or any offensive, noxious or dangerous substances in a street, way, footpath or other public place;
 - (e) obstruct a street, way or footpath provided that nothing herein contained shall prohibit the owner of a street or way or other public place which is not dedicated for public use but which the public are allowed to use or prohibit a person deriving title through the owner thereof from exercising his legal rights of closing it whether temporarily or otherwise;
 - (f) permit goods or merchandise including coal, charcoal, firewood, soil, fertilisers and building materials to remain in a street, way, footpath or other public place for a longer period than is necessary for delivering the goods or merchandise into the place of delivery;
 - (g) light any fire or burn rubbish or other material in any street, way or footpath or in any public place;
 - (h) fell any tree on or across a street, way or footpath or prevent vehicles or persons from the free and unhindered use of any such street, way or footpath;
 - (i) cause or permit water from a hose or sprinkler to interfere with the use by pedestrians or vehicles of a street, way, footpath or other public place.
8. The Council may by its employees agents or contractors, take possession of and remove to a place appointed by the Council or otherwise dispose of anything deposited upon a street, way, footpath or other public place contrary to the provisions of these by-laws and may reinstate the street, way, footpath or public place at the expense of the person or persons responsible for the deposit thereof and recover from him or them in a Court of competent jurisdiction, the expense incurred in taking possession of and the removal or disposal of the thing so deposited or in such reinstatement as aforesaid.
9. The Council may, by its employees agents or contractors, remove any tree lying upon or any obstruction to any street, way footpath, bridge, gutter, drain or culvert.
10. No person shall on any part of a street (whether or not such part of a street be paved) without the consent of the Council, leave or park any vehicle or any part thereof which is not capable of being driven away under its own power; provided that it shall not be an offence under this by-law to leave for longer than is reasonably necessary a motor vehicle which while in transit has suffered a mechanical breakdown rendering it impossible or unsafe for it to be driven.

11. No person shall in any street, way, footpath or other public place, without the consent of the Council:—
 - (a) place, park or cause to be placed or parked a vehicle or trailer for any period exceeding 24 hours; or
 - (b) leave any animal, vehicle or anything whatsoever so as to obstruct any portion thereof.

This by-law is in addition to and does not affect the application of the by-laws relating to parking of commercial vehicles on a street verge.
12. The Council may through its employees or with the assistance of any member of the Police Force, remove any vehicle, animal or any other thing obstructing any street, way, footpath or other public place or any portion thereof and any animal, vehicle or thing so seized may be removed to any such place as may be designated by the Council or Town Clerk.
13. Any animal removed or seized by the Council through any of its employees or officers may be placed at the discretion of the Council in a public pound and shall be dealt with in a manner authorised for animals impounded.
14. Any vehicle or other thing which may have been so removed under these by-laws shall be taken to the Council depot and the Town Clerk shall cause an entry to be made in a register kept by the Council giving details of the date and time of such removal and the place from which it was removed together with a description of the vehicle or thing.
15. The Town Clerk shall cause to be exhibited on the Notice Board of the Council, a notification to the effect that a vehicle or thing described in the notice has been impounded and removed to the Council depot.
16. Any person claiming to be the owner of a vehicle or thing seized or impounded by Council under these by-laws may claim the same within one month from the day upon which it was seized or impounded, by paying to the Council:—
 - (a) the cost incurred in removing the vehicle or thing; and
 - (b) the sum of \$1.00 for each day or part thereof during which the said vehicle or thing has remained in the Council depot.

The Town Clerk shall, if satisfied that the person claiming to be the owner of the vehicle or thing is in fact so, deliver possession thereof and permit the same to be removed.
17. Where a vehicle or thing seized and/or removed by the Council to the depot in accordance with these by-laws has not been recovered or claimed by the owner or a person entitled hereto within one month from the day upon which it was so seized or impounded, the Council may cause the vehicle or thing to be offered for sale by public auction or by public tender and accept the best or only offer made and where no offer has been made for the purchase thereof Council may dispose of it in such other manner as it shall deem fit.
18. Proceeds for the sale under the preceding by-law shall be applied as follows:—
 - (a) in meeting the costs of the sale;
 - (b) in meeting the costs of removal of the vehicle or thing to the Council depot, and a sum of \$1.00 for each day or part thereof the vehicle or thing has remained at the depot; and
 - (c) in payment of any other expense reasonably incurred by the Council in connection with such a seizure or removal.

The balance if any shall be paid to any person or persons claiming to be the owner or owners thereof upon satisfactory proof being given to that effect, or where the identity or whereabouts of the owner is unknown, placed in a trust fund and dealt with according to the provisions of section five hundred and twenty-six of the Local Government Act 1960-1981.
19. No person shall without the authority of the Town Clerk, remove from the Council depot, any vehicle or thing seized or impounded under the provisions of these by-laws.
20. Any person who fails to comply with or who contravenes any of these by-laws or any part thereof commits an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$200.00.

DOG ACT 1976-1977.

The Municipality of the Shire of Ravensthorpe.

By-laws Relating to Dogs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 20 August 1981 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following By-laws regarding the Control of Dogs in the Townsites of Ravensthorpe, Hopetoun, Munglinup, Fitzgerald and Jerdacuttup.

Part 1—Preliminary.

1. In these By-laws unless the context otherwise requires:—

“Act” means the Dog Act 1976-1977.

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Ravensthorpe.

“Schedule” means a schedule to these By-laws.

“Form” means a form contained in the Second Schedule.

Expressions used in these By-laws have the meanings given to them by the Act.

All previous By-laws relating to Dogs as were published in the *Government Gazette* of 13 December 1929 are hereby repealed.

Part 2—Keeping of Dogs.

2. The occupier of premises situated within the Townsites of Ravensthorpe, Hopetoun, Munglinup, Fitzgerald and Jerdacuttup shall not unless the premises are licensed as an approved Kennel Establishment under section 27 of the Act or have been granted exemption pursuant to section 26 (3) of the Act keep or permit to be kept on those premises MORE THAN TWO dogs over the age of three months and the young of those dogs under that age.

3. The owner or occupier of premises within the Townsites specified in By-law 2 on which a dog is kept shall cause portion of the premises to be fenced in a manner capable of confining the dog.

Part 3—Seizure and Impounding of Dogs.

4. The Dog Pound for the Shire of Ravensthorpe is situated on Lot 20 Morgans Street, Ravensthorpe.

5. The fees payable for the seizure, impounding, destruction and maintenance of dogs are those specified in the First Schedule.

Part 4—Regulation of Kennel Establishments.

6. An application for a licence to keep an approved Kennel Establishment shall be in writing and shall be in or substantially in the form of Form No. 1 of the Second Schedule.

7. An application for a licence to keep an approved Kennel Establishment shall be supported by evidence that:—

(a) Full details and particulars of the proposal have been advertised by the applicant at least twice in a newspaper circulating in the district of the Shire of Ravensthorpe. Such advertisement shall specify the manner in which and the period (not being less than 21 days) during which representations may be made to the Council.

(b) Adjoining property owners have been notified of the proposal in writing.

8. In accordance with section 27 (4) of the Act Council shall consider any representations made either in support of or in opposition to the proposal.

9. The fee payable for the issue of a licence to keep an approved Kennel Establishment is that specified in the First Schedule.

10. A licence to keep an approved Kennel Establishment shall be in or substantially in the form of Form 2 of the Second Schedule.

11. The fee payable for the renewal of a licence to keep an approved Kennel Establishment is that specified in the First Schedule.

12. The owner or occupier of premises which are licensed as an approved Kennel Establishment shall provide kennels and yards appropriate to the breed or kind in question, sited and maintained in accordance with the requirements of public health, sufficiently secured and having specifications of a standard not less than the following:—

(a) each Kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto;

(b) each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance of not less than 7 metres from the boundaries of the land in the occupation of the occupier;

(c) each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance of not less than 24 metres from the front road or street;

(d) each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance of not less than 10 metres from any dwelling house, church, schoolroom, hall or factory;

- (e) the walls shall be constructed of concrete, brick, stone, wood, asbestos, ceillite or galvanised iron;
 - (f) the roof shall be constructed of impervious material or other material approved by the Council;
 - (g) all external surfaces of galvanised iron, wood or asbestos material shall be painted and kept painted with good quality paint;
 - (h) the lowest internal height shall be at least 1.8 metres from the floor;
 - (i) each yard shall be securely fenced and kept securely fenced with a fence not less than 1.8 metres in height constructed of galvanised iron, wood, galvanised link mesh or netting or other material approved by the Council;
 - (j) all gates shall be provided with proper catches or means of fastening;
 - (k) the upper surface of the floor of each kennel shall be set at least 100 mm above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a smooth surface and have a fall of not less than 1 in 100; the entire yard shall be surrounded by a drain which shall be properly laid, ventilated and trapped; all floor washings shall pass through the drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the health requirements of the Council;
 - (l) the floor of any yard which is floored shall be constructed in the same manner as the floor of any kennel as is provided in the last preceding paragraph;
 - (m) for each dog kept therein every kennel shall have not less than 2 square metres of floor space and every yard not less than 3 square metres;
 - (n) all kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels shall be maintained in a clean condition and cleansed and disinfected when so ordered by an Officer of the Council.
13. A person shall not erect a kennel unless and until plans and specifications of and a location plan showing the proposed site of the kennel and of the yard appurtenant thereto have been approved by the Council.
14. A person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of these By-laws commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$100.

COMPULSORY FRUIT FLY BAITING AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1982.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Compulsory Fruit Fly Baiting Amendment Regulations 1982.
- Principal regulations. 2. In these regulations the Compulsory Fruit Fly Baiting Regulations*, as amended, are referred to as the principal regulations.

(2) The special roll so furnished shall contain, in the case—

(a) where a natural person is the sole occupier of an orchard in the district—the name of that person;

(b) where there is more than one occupier, the name of one of those occupiers, but not more than one at any time, authorized in accordance with regulation 4D (1) of these regulations; and

(c) where the occupier of an orchard is a corporate body, a representative of that corporate body authorized in accordance with regulation 4D (2) of these regulations.

4C. Where the Director of Agriculture has failed to include in the special roll the name of an occupier of an orchard in the district, who is entitled to be enrolled in accordance with these regulations, the occupier may have his name included on the special roll if he lodges with the Director, not less than 14 days before the taking of the poll, an application in the form of Form No. 1 in the Appendix to these regulations.

4D. (1) Where there is more than one occupier of an orchard one of those occupiers may be authorized by the other occupier or other occupiers to represent them for the purposes of voting at any poll taken under section 12B or 12C of the Act and on receipt from that representative of an application for enrolment in the form of Form No. 2 in the Appendix to these regulations the Director of Agriculture may cause that representative to be enrolled in the special roll.

(2) Where the occupier of an orchard is a corporate body the Board of Directors or other management authority of the body may authorize one only of the officers of the body to represent the body for the purposes of voting at any poll taken under section 12B or 12C of the Act and on receipt from that representative of an application for enrolment in the form of Form No. 2 in the Appendix to these regulations the Director of Agriculture may cause that representative to be enrolled in the special roll.

(3) For the purposes of subregulation (2) of this regulation the following persons are officers of a body corporate—

(a) a director or other member of the Board of Directors or other management authority of the body;

(b) a trustee of the body;

(c) the manager or secretary, or any other officer, of the body.

(4) Where the Director of Agriculture has not received the name of a representative in accordance with subregulations (1) or (2) of this regulation, 14 days before the day fixed for the taking of the poll he shall insert the name of a natural person who appears to him to be an occupier or director of the relevant orchard, as the case may be, into the special roll.

(5) Where the Director of Agriculture determines that the name of an occupier who is entitled to be enrolled is not on the special roll furnished to the returning officer, he may, not less than 7 days before the day fixed for the taking of the poll, cause the returning officer to be furnished with the particulars of that occupier for inclusion in the special roll.

(6) A person shall be entitled to one enrolment only on the special roll at any one time, whether as a voter in his own right or as the representative of joint occupiers or a corporate body, or otherwise.

(7) Revocation of authority given under subregulations (1) or (2) of this regulation may be made by notice in writing signed by the other occupiers or a director and one other officer as the case may be, sent or delivered to the Director of Agriculture and on receipt of such notice the Director shall cause to have removed from the special roll the name of the representative person whose authority has been so revoked; but any such revocation shall not invalidate any vote given by that representative person enrolled and voting by virtue of such authority at a poll taken prior to that revocation.

(8) Every authority given under subregulations (1) and (2) of this regulation shall remain effective for all subsequent polls until written notice of revocation is sent or delivered to the returning officer. ”

PLANT DISEASES ACT (INSPECTION OF CONVEYANCES)
AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1982.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Plant Diseases Act (Inspection of Conveyances) Amendment Regulations 1982.

Principal regulations.

2. In these regulations the Plant Diseases Act (Inspection of Conveyances) Regulations 1963*, are referred to as the principal regulations.

- (4) An owner, occupier or agent to whom a direction is given under subregulation (3) of this regulation shall comply with the direction so given.
- (5) An inspector intending to act under subregulation (3) of this regulation shall, before so acting—
- (a) take 2 samples of the acid concerned and mark both samples with an identifying mark; and
