TO THE HONOURABLE SIR FRANCIS THEODORE PAGE BURT, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia; WHEREAS by clause XIV of the Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom constituting the office of Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, dated 29 October 1900, it is provided that in the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent from the seat of Government or from the State, he may in every such case, by an instrument under the Public Seal of the State constitute and appoint the Lieutenant Governor, or if there be no such officer, or if such officer be absent or unable to act, then any other person, to be his deputy during such absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute for and on behalf of the Governor during such absence, but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor by such Letters Patent, as shall in and by such instrument be specified; and whereas I, the said Governor, propose to absent myself temporarily from the seat of Government: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, do by this instrument under the Public Seal of the State constitute and appoint you the said Sir Francis Theodore Page Burt as from the date of my departure upon the said absence and during such absence to be my deputy, and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute for and on my behalf, as such Governor, all the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Letters Patent.

LEGAL AID COMMISSION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA
DETERMINATION—PROFESSIONAL OFFICERS

PART IX—PIGGERIES.

Delete By-law 2 of the principal by-laws and replace with the following by-law:—

2. No premises shall be registered as a piggery unless every portion of such piggery is at least 60 metres distance from any street, thoroughfare, or other boundary, and at least 90 metres from any dwelling house, dairy, watercourse or source of water supply or premises wherein food is prepared for sale.

STATUTE No. 10—STUDENT DISCIPLINARY STATUTE.

Definitions.

1. In this Statute, unless the context otherwise requires—
 - “Appeals Committee” or “Committee” means the Council Appeals Committee constituted in accordance with section 16;
 - “Board of Discipline” or “Board” means a Board of Discipline constituted in accordance with section 12 or 13;
 - “Director” includes any Senior Officer of the Institute to whom the Director has delegated any of his powers and functions under section 3;

Schedule—*continued.*

“Examination” means an examination conducted by the Institute, and includes an examination conducted by any other person or body prescribed by the Statutes as a person or body authorised to conduct examinations for the Institute, and also includes any academic assessment of a student or his work in accordance with the relevant procedures adopted within the Institute or any Division, School or Department from time to time;

“Member of the Institute” means a person who is a member of the Council, a member of the staff of the Institute or a student;

“Misconduct” shall have the meaning set out in section 2;

“Senior Officer of the Institute” means the Director, an Assistant Director, the Academic Registrar, a Chairman of Division, a Dean, a Principal of a College, a Head of a School, and such other members of the staff of the Institute as the Director may designate from time to time for the purposes of this Statute or under the Institute’s Land and Traffic By-laws.

Misconduct.

2. In this Statute, “misconduct” means conduct on the part of a student which impairs the reasonable freedom of other persons to pursue their studies, researches, duties or lawful activities in the Institute, or upon Institute premises or to participate in the life of the Institute or which is otherwise detrimental to the proper conduct of the Institute and without limiting the generality of the foregoing, includes—

- (a) wilfully obstructing or disrupting any teaching study, research or examination;
- (b) wilfully obstructing or disrupting any official meeting, proceeding or ceremony within the Institute or any Institute activity;
- (c) wilfully interfering with the freedom of speech within the Institute of any member of the Institute or of any person invited by any section of the Institute to express his views;
- (d) wilfully interfering with the freedom of movement within the Institute of any member of the Institute or any visitor;
- (e) failing to leave any place within the Institute forthwith upon being directed to leave it by a Senior Officer of the Institute;
- (f) entering any place within the Institute which the student is forbidden by any Statute, By-law or Rule to enter or which the student has been forbidden to enter by any Senior Officer of the Institute;
- (g) acting dishonestly or unfairly in connection with any examination or other academic work;
- (h) wilfully obstructing or attempting to obstruct or deter any member of the staff of the Institute in the performance of his duties;
- (i) wilfully damaging or wrongfully dealing with any Institute property or the property within the Institute of any person;
- (j) assaulting or attempting to assault any person within the Institute;
- (k) failing to comply with any provision of any Statute, By-law or Rule;
- (l) failing to comply with any penalty imposed under any Statute, By-law or Rule.

An instance of misconduct shall be deemed to be a disciplinary offence within the meaning of the Act.

Delegation by the Director.

3. Without prejudice to the generality of the Director’s powers of delegation under section 14 (3) or 34 (1d) of the Act, the Director may at any time and from time to time delegate all or any of his powers and functions under this Statute to any Senior Officer of the Institute.

Penalties.

4. The penalties that may be imposed for any instance of misconduct are—

- (a) a fine which shall be up to a maximum determined from time to time by Council;
- (b) suspension of all or any of a student’s rights and privileges within the Institute including—
 - (i) suspension from attendance at or exclusion from lectures, seminars, tutorials and other classes;
 - (ii) suspension from the use of or exclusion from laboratories or other Institute facilities or any part of such facilities;
 - (iii) suspension from attendance at or exclusion from any examination;
 - (iv) exclusion from the Institute or any part of the Institute; for any specified period, not exceeding the remainder of the calendar year; or
 - (v) refusal of re-enrolment as a student;
- (c) cancellation or deprivation of credit for any examination or other academic work but only if the misconduct involved acting dishonestly or unfairly in connection with any examination or other academic work;
- (d) expulsion from the Institute;
- (e) restitution of or for any Institute property lost, damaged or destroyed by the student up to a maximum which shall be determined from time to time by Council.

Schedule—*continued*.

Other provisions relating to penalties.

5. (1) Any person or body authorised to impose any penalty under the Act or this Statute or any other Statute, By-law or Rule may caution or reprimand the student instead of or in addition to any other penalty that may be imposed.

(2) A penalty may be partly of one kind and partly of another.

(3) A penalty may be suspended by the person or body imposing it until the time for lodging an appeal has expired or generally on such terms and conditions, including undertakings by the student, as the person or body suspending the penalty thinks fit.

(4) If the penalty is expulsion from the Institute, it shall not take effect until after the time for lodging an appeal has expired, and it has been confirmed by the Council, but all the student's rights and privileges shall be suspended until the Council has decided whether or not to confirm the expulsion.

(5) A student expelled from the Institute shall not be re-enrolled except with the authority of the Council.

(6) No degree or diploma shall be conferred on a student charged with misconduct until after the charge has been dealt with in accordance with this Statute, and any appeal by the student has also been dealt with or the time for lodging an appeal has expired, and any fine imposed has been paid, unless otherwise decided by the Director.

(7) Subject to the rights of appeal specified in this Statute, any decision under this Statute that a student has been guilty of misconduct or imposing a penalty or both is final and conclusive.

Director's powers.

6. (1) The Director may (in addition to his powers under section 10) for any instance of misconduct by a student—

(a) fine the student; or

(b) suspend for a period not exceeding 14 days all or any of the student's rights and privileges within the Institute;

or impose a penalty under both paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subsection.

(2) The Academic Registrar shall forthwith confirm by written notice to the student any penalty imposed under this section.

Academic Registrar's powers.

7. (1) The Academic Registrar may for any instance of misconduct by a student—

(a) fine the student; or

(b) exclude the student from any examination or any part of any examination but only if in his opinion it is necessary to do so to preserve order and decorum in the place where the examination is being conducted;

or impose a penalty under both paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subsection.

(2) The Academic Registrar may suspend all or any of a student's rights and privileges—

(a) if the student does not pay a fine imposed on him under this Statute or under any other Statute, By-law or Rule within the time specified by the person or body imposing it or if no time is specified, within 14 days after the date on which it was imposed or within such extended time as the Academic Registrar allows; or

(b) if the student does not pay any fees or other debt due and payable by him to the Institute within such time or extended time as the Academic Registrar allows.

Any suspension imposed by the Academic Registrar under this subsection shall cease to have effect on payment of the overdue fine, fees or other debt in respect of which it was imposed.

(3) The Academic Registrar shall forthwith confirm by written notice to the student any penalty imposed under this section.

Powers of Chairmen, Deans, Heads of Schools and Principals

8. (1) A chairman of Division, a Dean, a Head or Principal of a School or College and such other senior members of the Academic staff as may be designated by the Director from time to time for the purposes of this section may for any instance of misconduct by a student within a Division, School or College, as the case may be, or with respect to an activity conducted by the Division, School or College, or an activity for which it is responsible within the Institute—

(a) fine the student; or

(b) suspend for a period not exceeding 14 days all or any of the student's rights and privileges within the Division, School or College in which the misconduct occurred; or

(c) cancel the student's credit or deprive him of credit for an examination or other academic work or any part thereof done within the Division, School or College in which the misconduct occurred, but only if the misconduct involved acting dishonestly or unfairly in connection with any examination or other academic work;

or impose a penalty under any two or more of paragraphs (a), (b) or (c) of this subsection.

(2) The Chairman, Dean, Head or Principal concerned shall forthwith—

(a) confirm by written notice to the student any penalty imposed on him under this section; and

(b) report the matter in writing to the Academic Registrar.

Schedule—*continued*.Other
person's
powers.

9. (1) This section authorises the following persons to impose the penalty specified in subsection (2) of this section—

All members of the academic staff, and such members of the senior technical staff and senior administrative staff as may be charged with responsibility for the operation or maintenance of any facility of the Institute or who may otherwise be designated by the Director for the purposes of this Section.

(2) Any person authorised by this section may for any instance of misconduct by a student in any lecture, seminar, tutorial or other class, laboratory or other facility conducted or supervised by him exclude the student therefrom for a period not exceeding the next following twenty-four hours.

(3) A person imposing a suspension under this section shall forthwith report the matter in writing to the relevant Chairman of Division, Dean, Principal or Head of School or the Academic Registrar as the case may be, and the person to whom the matter is so reported shall thereupon affirm or annul the suspension imposed and take such other action in exercise of his powers under this Statute as he may consider appropriate.

Reference to
a Board of
Discipline.

10. (1) A student may refer to a Board of Discipline by way of appeal any decision made against him or any penalty imposed on him under sections 6 to 9 inclusive, or under any other Statute, By-law or Rule which prescribes that the conduct complained of is deemed to be "misconduct" for the purposes of this Statute.

(2) The Director may, in the name of the Institute, charge a student with misconduct and refer the charge to a Board. A reference shall be made by notice in writing to the Chairman of the Board of Reference appointed under section 13 (2).

(3) Whenever the Director charges a student with misconduct and refers the charge to a Board, he may suspend for a period not exceeding 28 days all or any of the student's rights and privileges within the Institute (other than in relation to hearings before the Board or an Appeals Committee) pending the hearing of the case. The Board to which the charge has been referred may, at any time after the reference, lift the suspension, but unless it does so, the suspension shall continue until the period for which it was imposed has elapsed or the Board gives its decision in the case whichever shall first occur.

Powers of
a Board.

11. (1) A Board of Discipline shall have power to hear and adjudicate upon any reference to it under section 10.

(2) In the case of a reference by way of appeal under subsection 10 (1), the Board shall hear the matter again from the beginning and it may, in addition to other powers conferred by this section, affirm or annul the decision or penalty or both, or may reduce or increase the penalty or impose in its place any other penalty which may be imposed under this Statute.

(3) In the case of a reference under subsection 10 (2) the Board may find that a charge of misconduct has been proved, or it may dismiss the charge, and it may, for any instance of misconduct, impose any penalty which may be imposed under this Statute.

(4) If a Board finds a charge of misconduct has been established it may decline to record a finding of misconduct or to impose a penalty if in its opinion the misconduct was trivial, or if, for any other reason, the Board is of opinion that a finding of misconduct should not be recorded or a penalty should not be imposed.

(5) The decision of the Board on a reference by way of appeal under subsection 10 (1) shall be final and conclusive, except that if the penalty is expulsion from the Institute, the provisions of subsection 5 (4) shall apply.

Constitution
of a Board.

12. (1) A Board of Discipline shall be constituted by the Director in accordance with this section whenever a matter is referred to a Board under section 10.

(2) A Board of Discipline shall consist of—

- (a) a Chairman appointed by the Director, who must be either a qualified legal practitioner or hold a degree in law;
- (b) two members of the full-time academic staff selected at random by the Director from a panel of five members of the academic staff nominated annually by the Academic Staff Association.
- (c) two students selected at random by the Director from a panel of five students nominated annually by the Student Guild;

(3) If any of the persons mentioned in paragraphs 2 (b) or 2 (c) of this section is unable or unwilling to act as a member of the Board the Council shall elect a substitute member from the members of the Council to fill the vacancy.

(4) If a person is selected as a member of a Board and in the opinion of the Chairman he should not act as a member of the Board due to his involvement in the case, the Director shall select at random a substitute from the panel of which he is a member.

Schedule—*continued.*

- Procedure of a Board.
13. (1) The quorum of a Board of Discipline shall be three members, of whom one must be the Chairman. A Board may act and continue to act notwithstanding the absence of any member or members but a decision can only be given by not less than three members, including the Chairman, all of whom have been present throughout the hearing.
- (2) If, for any reason, a Board is unable to obtain a quorum or is unable to reach a decision on any matter, the Chairman shall report to the Council accordingly, which shall then—
- (a) appoint a substitute Board in which event the provisions of section 12 shall not apply, and a Board may be constituted by the Council appointing any five members of the Council to constitute the substitute Board; or
- (b) with the exception of members appointed to the Appeals Committee, constitute itself as a Board of Discipline.
- (3) The Chairman of a Board shall have a deliberative but not a casting vote.
- (4) On any question whether a charge of misconduct has been proved, if the votes are equally divided, the charge shall be deemed not to have been proved. On any question whether an appeal should be allowed, if the votes are equally divided, the appeal shall be allowed.
- (5) A Board of Discipline which has been duly constituted under this section shall continue to act in the matter notwithstanding any change in the membership or constitution of the Council.
- (6) A Board of Discipline constituted to hear and adjudicate upon a charge of misconduct made against a student or an appeal made to it may have referred to it a charge or charges of misconduct made against another student or other students or another charge or other charges against the first mentioned student or any other appeal or appeals and the Board may deal with all the charges and appeals referred to it, except that—
- (a) the Board shall not deal with more than one charge or appeal at the same hearing unless, in its opinion, the charges arise out of instances of misconduct which—
- (i) comprise a series of instances of the same or a similar character;
- (ii) are committed in the furtherance of a common objective; or
- (iii) occur during group activity by the students charged or on whom penalties have been imposed, whether or not with other students;
- (b) if the Board forms the opinion at any stage before making known its decision that it should in the interests of justice refrain from hearing or desist from proceeding further with any of the charges or appeals, it shall so refrain or desist and another Board shall be constituted to deal with any such charge or appeal.
- Appeal to the Appeals Committee.
14. (1) A student may appeal to the Appeals Committee against any decision made against him by or any penalty imposed on him by a Board of Discipline in any case which was not itself an appeal to the Board.
- (2) The Institute may appeal to an Appeals Committee against any decision by a Board of Discipline in any case which was not itself an appeal to the Board.
- (3) No appeal may be made limited to the question of costs.
- Powers of the Committee.
15. (1) An Appeals Committee to which an appeal is made may affirm or annul the decision or penalty or both, or reduce or increase the penalty, or impose in its place any other penalty which may be imposed under this Statute.
- (2) (a) On any appeal against the imposition of a penalty only, only matters relevant to the penalty shall be dealt with.
- (b) On any appeal, an Appeals Committee may hear the case from the beginning, hear additional evidence or rely on the record of the Board of Discipline, as it shall think fit. Any point of law shall be decided by the Chairman alone.
- (3) The decision of an Appeals Committee shall be final and conclusive, provided that if the penalty is expulsion from the Institute the provisions of subsection 5 (4) shall apply.
- Constitution of a Committee.
16. (1) The Council shall, at its regular March meeting each year, appoint an Appeals Committee which shall consist of—
- (a) a Chairman, who must either be a qualified legal practitioner or hold a degree in law;
- (b) two members of the Council one of whom shall be a student.
- (2) If a member of the Appeals Committee is involved in any matter the subject of an appeal to the Appeals Committee or was a member of the Board of Discipline from which an appeal is being made, he shall not participate in the appeal as a member of the Appeals Committee.
- (3) The Council may appoint a substitute member to take the place of any person excluded from participation under subsection (2) of this section or to fill a casual vacancy.
- (4) The Chairman and members of the Committee shall continue in office until the appointment of the next Appeals Committee, except that an Appeals Committee shall continue in office to conclude the hearing of any appeal and to give its decision notwithstanding the appointment of a new Appeals Committee.

Schedule—*continued.*

- Procedure of a Committee. 17. (1) All members of an Appeals Committee must be present throughout the hearing of an appeal.
 (2) The Chairman of an Appeals Committee shall have a deliberative but not a casting vote.
 (3) On any question whether an appeal should be allowed, if the votes are equally divided, the appeal shall be allowed.
- Secretary of Board or Committee. 18. The Academic Registrar or a member of the administrative staff appointed by him shall act as Secretary of all Boards of Discipline and Appeals Committees.
- Lodgement of Appeal. 19. A reference to a Board of Discipline by way of appeal or an appeal to an Appeals Committee must be lodged with the Academic Registrar within seven days after the decision appealed against has been notified to the student, unless the Board or Committee to whom the appeal is made allows an extension of time. An extension of time shall not be allowed unless the Board or Committee is satisfied that there was good reason for failure to lodge the reference or appeal within the time allowed.
- Notice of hearing. 20. (1) The Academic Registrar shall give to a student charged with misconduct before a Board of Discipline or who is a party to an appeal not less than five days written notice of the hearing by the Board of Discipline or Appeals Committee. The notice shall contain particulars of—
 (a) the charge in the case of a charge referred to a Board of Discipline;
 (b) the time and place of the hearing; and
 (c) the student's rights under section 22 (1).
 (2) If the student fails to appear at the hearing and the Board or Committee is satisfied that the student has been given notice in accordance with this section, it may proceed with the hearing in the student's absence, or order an adjournment.
- General Discretion as to Procedure. 21. The procedure of a Board of Discipline or Appeals Committee including the order in which evidence may be called and addresses heard shall be in the discretion of the Board or Committee.
- Hearings. 22. (1) During any hearing, the student shall be entitled—
 (a) to be represented by a legal practitioner, another student, or a member of the staff of the Institute;
 (b) to be present with his representative throughout the hearing except when the Chairman and members of the Board of Discipline or Appeals Committee wish to confer privately among themselves or to consider their decision;
 (c) either himself or by his representative to call and examine witnesses, cross-examine witnesses other than any witness called by him or his representative, and to address the Board or Committee.
 (2) The Director may appoint a legal practitioner or a member of the staff of the Institute to represent the Institute at the hearing and any person so appointed may call and examine witnesses, cross-examine witnesses called by the student or his representative, and address the Board or Committee.
 (3) Hearings of a Board or Committee shall be in private unless the student charged elects otherwise, in which event they shall be open to other members of the Institute provided that—
 (a) if charges against two or more students are being dealt with together before the Board or Committee and any one of them elects a private hearing, the hearing shall be private; and
 (b) the Board or Committee may order that an open hearing be continued in private if in its opinion order cannot otherwise be maintained.
 (4) At every hearing, the Board or Committee shall have complete authority to keep order and it may order the removal of any person, including (notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1) of this section) a student in respect of whom the hearing is taking place or the representative of such a student for unruly conduct.
 (5) The Academic Registrar shall forthwith confirm by written notice to the student any penalty imposed on him by a Board or Committee.
- Costs. 23. (1) Where a student desires to engage a legal practitioner to represent him before a Board of Discipline or an Appeals Committee and is unable to engage legal representation through either the State or Federal Legal Assistance programmes, then the Institute will reimburse him reasonable legal expenses, the amount to be determined and certified by the Board or Committee.
 (2) A Board of Discipline which has heard a charge of misconduct against a student or an appeal by a student may award the student the whole or part of his costs of the hearing or appeal as the case may be.
 (3) An Appeals Committee may award a student appellant the whole or part of his costs including the costs of the appeal to the Committee and the costs of the hearing of the charge by the Board of Discipline.
 (4) If an Appeals Committee or a Board of Discipline makes an award of costs, it shall fix the amount payable and it shall be paid to the student out of Institute funds.

Schedule—*continued*.

- Decisions. 24. Every decision of a Board of Discipline and an Appeals Committee together with short reasons therefor shall be expressed in writing and the Secretary of the Board or Committee shall forthwith give a copy of the decision to the student.
- Notices. 25. (1) Any notice or copy of decision required to be given to a person under this Statute shall be sufficient if given to him in person or sent to him by registered post addressed to the last address known to the Institute as his place of residence.
(2) Any notice or copy of decision given by post shall be deemed to have been given when the letter would have been received at the address in the normal course of post.
- Repeal. 26. The Student Disciplinary By-laws, adopted on 19 February 1969, and the Student Disciplinary Statute, adopted on 19 February 1975 and amended on 18 February 1976, are hereby repealed.

STATUTE No. 12—ENROLMENT.

1. In this Statute, unless the context otherwise requires, "Rules" means rules, as from time to time in force, made under this Statute.
2. The Council may enrol as a student of the Institute any person who satisfies the conditions specified in the Rules, for any course of study or programme offered by the Institute.
3. The Council may from time to time limit the enrolment of persons as students of the Institute for any course of study or programme.
4. A person shall be an enrolled student of the Institute when the enrolment procedures prescribed by the Rules, have been completed.
5. A student shall cease to be enrolled as prescribed by the Rules.
6. An enrolled student shall be subject to the Institute's By-laws and Statutes, By-laws and Rules made under any Statute, and the lawful instructions of authorised persons at the Institute.
7. (1) The Council may by resolution make rules, not inconsistent with the Act, this Statute or any other Statute, regulating or providing for the regulation of the enrolment of persons as students of the Institute, or to carry out or give effect to this Statute.
(2) Without in any way limiting the rule-making power contained in subsection (1) of this section, the Council may make rules which prescribe fees to be charged to all or any persons applying for enrolment.
8. The Council may delegate its powers under sections 2 and 3 of this Statute.
9. Statute No. 12—Enrolment—adopted on 17 November 1976 is hereby repealed.
