PURSUANT to section 9 of the Marine and Harbours Act 1981, I, the Governor, acting with the advice, and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby vary the proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on 5 February 1982 and varied by a proclamation so published on 19 February 1982, by deleting the description of the Fremantle Boat Harbour as set out in the Schedule to that proclamation as so varied and substituting the following description—

## FREMANTLE BOAT HARBOUR.

## Part A.

All that portion of sea bed seaward of High Water Mark bounded by lines commencing from the intersection of the northernmost southeastern side of the northern mole with the southeastern boundary of Fremantle Lot 1938 and extending northeasterly and easterly along boundaries of that lot to the southwestern corner of the eastern severance of Lot 1935; thence easterly along the southern boundary of that severance to the southwestern corner of Lot 1864; thence easterly along the southern boundary of that lot to the southwestern corner of Lot 1934; thence generally southeasterly along southwestern boundaries of that lot to its southeastern corner; thence generally southeasterly and generally southwesterly along the High Water Mark to the northeastern side of the South Mole; thence generally northwesterly and generally westerly along sides of that mole to its northern extremity; thence west to the southernmost southeastern side of the north mole and thence generally north-easterly, generally southeasterly, generally northwesterly and again generally northeasterly along eastern sides of that mole to the starting point.

- (i) Survey lines within the Reserve being delineated with minimum interference to and disturbance of vegetation and timber, any traverse lines through timber stands being cut by hand.
- (ii) The clearing and construction of tracks being limited to a superficial blading and filling in of soil irregularities only, so that as far as is practicable rootstock and topsoil is left in place with its contained seed load. Any shot holes drilled being filled in and left in a safe and level condition.
- (iii) On completion or abandonment of any operational area such measures as are reasonably practical being taken to restore the area to its original condition.

## BUSH FIRES ACT 1954.

The Municipality of the Shire of Northam.

By-laws relating to the Establishment, Maintenance  
and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 8 January 1982, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, By-laws relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Municipality of the Shire of Northam.

By-laws relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades appearing in the *Government Gazette* on 3 May 1940 and amended by notice in the *Government Gazette* on 30 April 1943, are hereby revoked.

## Establishment of Brigade.

1. (a) On the resolution of the Council to establish, maintain and equip a bush fire brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1954 and regulations thereunder, the brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the brigade. Details of the brigade and its officers shall be entered in the register of Bush Fire Brigades held by the Council.

(b) A bush fire brigade may be established for the whole of the Shire or for any specified area thereof.

## Appointment of Officers.

2. Members of the Brigade shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the brigade.

3. Members of the brigade may elect a President and Secretary.

4. The Council may appoint an equipment officer who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Council for the purposes of the brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depot in the area, the equipment officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Council shall appoint bush fire control officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act shall be vested in the President and Shire Clerk of the Council conjointly.

#### Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954 and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the brigade whilst engaged in fire fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant; and in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the brigade present at the fire shall exercise all the powers and duties of the captain.

7. (1) The membership of a bush fire brigade may consist of the following:—

- (a) subscribing members
- (b) fire fighting members; and
- (c) associate members.

(2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who being interested in forwarding the objects of the brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the brigade.

(3) Fire fighting members shall be those persons being able bodied members of either sex over fifteen years, who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon; and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.

(4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.

(5) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire fighting member.

#### Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Council in the purchase of equipment, payment for services and generally for the purpose of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Council, but the Shire Clerk shall ensure that records of the expenditure incurred under this Act are maintained.

#### Meeting of Brigades.

9. Meetings will be held as necessary.

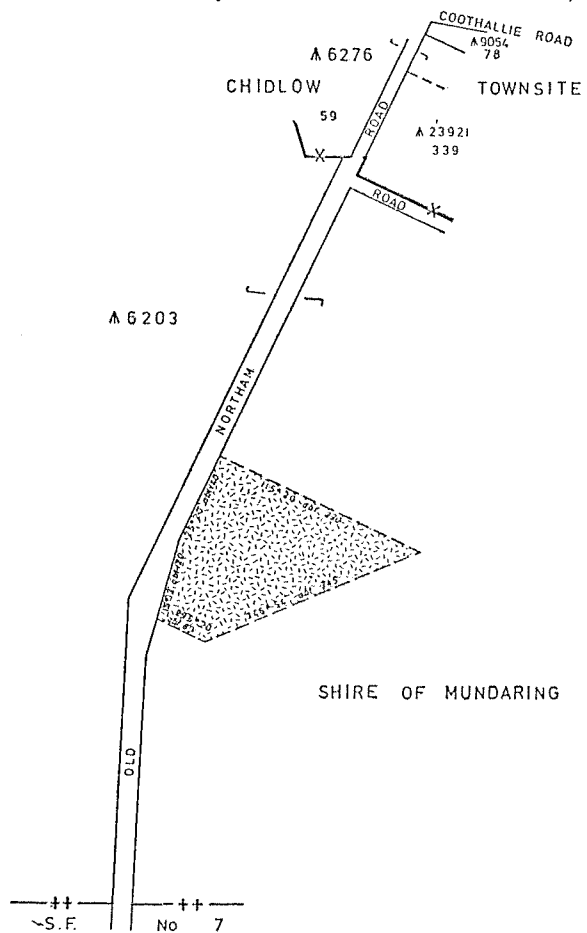

## The Municipality of the City of Canning.

## By-law Relating to Use of Foreshores.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 22 February 1982 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-law:—

1. A person shall not use the following parts of the Canning River foreshore for the purpose of training or exercising a horse:—

(a) an area fifty (50) metres wide contiguous to the right bank of the Canning River extending from the southeastern side of Riverton Bridge downwards along that bank to the prolongation southwesterly of the southeastern boundary of Canning Location 57.

(b) an area fifty (50) metres wide contiguous to the left bank of the Canning River and the right bank of Bull Creek extending from the southeastern side of Riverton Bridge downwards along the left bank of the Canning River and upwards along the right bank of Bull Creek to the northwestern boundary of Canning Location 2145 (Reserve 29130).

2. A person who commits an offence against these by-laws is liable to a maximum penalty of four hundred dollars (\$400.00).

## LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960-1981.

The Municipality of the City of Melville.

By-laws Relating to Parks, Recreation Grounds and Public Reserves.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 12 May 1981 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following by-laws:—

1. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires:—
  - “Act” means the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended).
  - “Authorised Officer” is any officer of the Council authorised by the Council to perform duties in accordance with these by-laws.
  - “Building” is as defined by the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended).
  - “Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the City of Melville.
  - “Reserve” shall mean any park, recreation ground, public reserve, or public place.
  - “Town Clerk” means the Town Clerk of the City of Melville.
2. These by-laws shall apply to any Reserve vested in or under the care control and management of the Municipality of the City of Melville.
3. No person shall remove destroy damage or interfere with any flora or plant life, property or other matter being the property of or vested in the Council, and located on any Reserve, unless such is re-development or maintenance as authorised by the Council.
4. No person shall injure nor attempt to injure any bird fish or animal seeking refuge on or in any Reserve or improvements thereon, unless the express written permission of the Town Clerk or Commissioner of Police is first obtained.
5. No person shall climb or be upon any structure not specifically designed for the express purpose of climbing upon.
6. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner, or using indecent profane or insulting language, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing any act of indecency on any Reserve, may be removed by any Authorised Officer of the Council and commits an offence against these by-laws.
7. No person shall cause allow or suffer any animal to graze or to be tethered upon any Reserve without first having obtained written permission from the Town Clerk.
8. Subject to by-laws relating to the control of dogs, no person shall train or exercise any animal on any Reserve without having first obtained the written permission of the Town Clerk.
9. Subject to the provisions of Council’s By-laws relating to “Parking Facilities” and “Street Lawns and Gardens” no person, unless authorised in that behalf by the Council, shall lead or drive any horse or other stock or motorised vehicle:
  - (i) upon or over any portion of a Reserve, except a licenced vehicle upon a road or parking facility;
  - (ii) upon or over any portion of a road where that portion of the road is restricted to the passage of vehicles by a sign barricade or other traffic device.
10. Subject to the provisions of Council’s By-laws relating to “Parking Facilities” and “Street Lawns and Gardens” no person, unless authorised in that behalf by the Council, shall leave any vehicle, whether in charge of any person or not, stationary:
  - (i) upon a Reserve, except upon a road or parking facility;
  - (ii) upon any portion of a road where that portion of the road is restricted to the passage of vehicles by a sign barricade or other traffic device.
11. No person shall offer for sale or hire on any Reserve any goods or articles of any description without having previously obtained the written permission of the Town Clerk.
12. No person shall light a fire within any Reserve except in an area set aside for that express purpose, without having previously obtained the written permission of the Town Clerk.
13. No person shall deface or write upon or post stick stamp stencil paint or otherwise affix or cause to be posted stuck stamped stencilled painted or otherwise affixed any placard handbill notice advertisement writing or picture whatsoever upon any tree building fence post gate wall flagging or path in any Reserve without having previously obtained the written permission of the Town Clerk.
14. No person shall, except in the course of a game being lawfully played on a Reserve, throw or discharge anything in onto or over a Reserve.
15. No person shall bathe in any Reserve, except in such area set aside for that purpose.
16. No person shall in any Reserve, wilfully obstruct disturb interrupt or annoy any other person engaged in the proper use thereof, nor wilfully obstruct insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any Authorised Officer in the execution of his duty.
17. No person shall take upon, erect or operate upon any Reserve, any loudspeaker or other device for the amplifications of sound, or speak or make any noise so as knowingly to cause such speech or noise to be amplified by any loudspeaker or other device without having previously obtained the written permission of the Town Clerk.
18. No person shall spit or expectorate within any Reserve except in a receptacle provided for that express purpose.

19. No spirituous liquors wine ale beer or other alcoholic beverage shall be consumed on any Reserve without having previously obtained the written permission of the Town Clerk and then only in accordance with the terms of the permit.

20. No person shall camp lodge or tarry overnight in any Reserve, or frequent the same for the purpose of camping lodging or tarrying overnight therein.

21. No person shall—

- (a) play at or practice golf on any Reserve, except in a Reserve set aside for that purpose,
- (b) play in or at any game between opposing teams or practice at any game on a Reserve without having previously obtained the written permission of the Town Clerk,
- (c) play at any game on a Reserve to the annoyance or disturbance of any other person lawfully using the Reserve; or in such circumstances that such play might reasonably be anticipated to cause damage to any flora or plant life or any structure Building or property vested in or under the care control and management of the Council,

22. Any person organisation or club, having obtained written permission to use a Reserve for a specific game, shall not practice or play at any such game except at such times and upon such portions of the Reserve as shall be specified in the permit.

23. No person shall erect or place on or within any Reserve any tent stall platform or table for public amusement or for any performance whether for gain or otherwise, without having previously obtained the written permission of the Town Clerk.

24. No person shall create a nuisance in any Reserve, or on or in any part of any pavilion, dressing room Building or other structure erected on a Reserve.

25. No person shall fly any kite balloon or model aircraft from or on any Reserve for the purpose of displaying advertising material without the written permission of the Town Clerk.

26. No person shall operate any motorised or radio controlled model aircraft vessel or vehicle from on or in any Reserve except such Reserve or parts thereof as shall from time to time be set aside by the Council for that purpose.

27. (a) The Council may direct that all or any portion of any Reserve be set aside as a children's playground.

(b) The Council may limit the ages of persons who shall be permitted to use a children's playground, and may erect a notice to that effect on a playground.

(c) Subject to the provision of sub-by-law 28 (b) of these by-laws no person over the age specified in a notice erected on a playground, other than a person having the charge of a child or children in the playground, shall use a playground or restrict the use by other children of that playground.

28. (a) It shall be lawful for any Authorised Officer or any member of the Police Force to remove from any children's playground or from any kindergarten playground any person who is not entitled under these by-laws to the use thereof.

(b) Provision is hereby made for an Authorised Officer or member of the Police Force to remove from a Reserve any infant who is not under the control or in the care of a parent or other person over the age of eighteen years if that infant is in the opinion of an Authorised Officer or member of the Police Force acting to the detriment of other persons lawfully in use of the Reserve.

29. (a) In By-laws 29, 30 and 31 of these by-laws the term "Function" means and includes any show exhibition gymkhana sport match or test between opposing teams in any game.

(b) No person shall organise arrange or take part in any Function on a Reserve unless a permit to hold or organise that Function has been granted by the Town Clerk.

(c) The Town Clerk may grant a permit to a person to hold or organise a Function on a Reserve and may authorise a charge to be made for admission to that Function.

(d) A permit to hold a Function on a Reserve shall specify—

- (i) the purpose for which such permit is granted;
- (ii) the dates and times during which the function may be held;
- (iii) the portions of the Reserve allocated to the permit holder;
- (iv) the charge, if any, which has been authorised by the Town Clerk for admission to the Function.

(e) The permit shall not be granted for a continuous period in excess of fourteen days.

(f) Any person who has been granted a permit in accordance with this by-law and who does not comply with the terms of such permit commits an offence.

(g) No person or body of persons issued with a permit to hold a Function shall be authorised to use any Building or structure except those open for public use on any Reserve unless such permission is expressly granted and stated under the conditions of the permit.

30. Subject to By-law 29 and 31 no person to whom a permit has been granted shall exclude any member of the general public from attending a Function if such person requests admission.

31. (a) No person visibly under the influence of alcohol or acting in a riotous or disorderly manner shall attend a Function.

(b) A person to whom a permit has been granted shall take all possible action to prevent persons under the influence of alcohol or persons acting in a riotous or disorderly manner from attending a Function.

32. (a) Any person to whom a permit has been granted who commits or permits the commission of breach of any of the terms or conditions of the permit commits an offence.

(b) If the Town Clerk is satisfied that the person to whom a permit has been granted has committed or permitted or authorised the commission of a breach of any of the terms or conditions of the permit, or has committed a breach of any of these by-laws, may by a notice in writing to such person cancel the permit and thereupon the permit shall be null and void.

33. (a) No person shall erect or permit or authorise the erection of any Building or structure on a Reserve without the written consent of the Council.

(b) Any person or body of persons desirous of erecting a Building or structure on a Reserve shall make application to the Council for its consent so to do.

(c) The consent of the Council to the erection of a Building or structure on a Reserve shall specify—

- (i) the purpose for which such Building or structure may be used;
- (ii) the nature of the Building or structure which may be erected;
- (iii) the time during which such Building or structure may be permitted to remain on the Reserve;
- (iv) the times when such Building or structure may be used;
- (v) the location in which such Building or structure may be erected.

34. Any person who shall erect or use or permit or authorise the erection or use of any Building or structure on a Reserve without the written consent of the Council or otherwise than in accordance with the terms of the written consent of the Council commits an offence.

35. The Council shall reserve the right to give to the person or body of persons responsible for the erection of a Building or a structure on a Reserve, one calendar month's written notice to remove such Building or structure from a Reserve, and in default the Council shall reserve the right to effect such removal and to recover all associated costs of such removal in a Court of competent jurisdiction.

36. Subject to by-law 35, no person shall cause damage to any Building or structure on a Reserve.

37. No person or body of persons, other than those duly authorised by Council or those duly authorised to act in that behalf to permit such use, shall use a Building on a Reserve, except a building or part thereof which is open to the general public.

38. No person, other than an Authorised Officer in the capacity as a Caretaker, shall without the written approval of the Council use a Building on a Reserve as a dwelling or for the purpose of sleeping.

39. The Council shall reserve the right to transfer to any other person or body of persons the authority for occupancy of any Building on a Reserve, unless there exists an alternative specific written approval for the transfer of occupancy.

Penalties:

40. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provisions of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding:—

- (a) A maximum penalty of two hundred dollars.
- (b) A maximum daily penalty during the continuance of the breach of twenty dollars per day.

41. An amount not in excess of one-tenth of the maximum penalty for an Offence shall be the modified penalty for that Offence if dealt with under section 669D of the Act.

42. A penalty for an Offence against these by-laws (not being a modified penalty) may be recovered by the Council by taking proceedings against the alleged offender in a Court of Competent Jurisdiction.

43. The Council shall cause adequate records to be kept of all infringement notices served and modified penalties received under section 669D of the Act in respect of Offences against these by-laws.

44. (a) A notice served under subsection (2) of section 669C of the Act in respect of an Offence alleged to have been committed against one of these by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 1.

(b) Subject to sub-bylaw (c) of this by-law an infringement notice served under section 669D of the Act in respect of an Offence alleged to have been committed against one of these by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 2.

(c) An infringement notice served under subsection (2) of section 669D of the Act in respect of an Offence against one of these by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 3.

(d) A notice sent under subsection (5) of section 669D of the Act withdrawing an infringement notice served under that section in respect of an Offence alleged to have been committed against one of the by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 4.

45. (a) The owner of a vehicle shall, if required by an authorised officer, inform the Authorised Officer as to the identity and address of the driver or person in control of the vehicle at the time when an Offence is alleged to have been committed by the driver or person in control of the vehicle against a provision of these by-laws.

(b) Where the driver or person in control of a vehicle is alleged to have committed an Offence against a provision of these by-laws and the owner of the vehicle at the time of the Offence was alleged to have been committed, fails when required so to do within 21 days of the commission of the alleged Offence, to inform an Authorised Officer as to the identity and address of the person who was the driver or person in control of the vehicle at that time, the owner shall be deemed to be the person who committed that Offence and shall then be liable to the penalty prescribed in respect thereof, unless the Town Clerk is satisfied from information furnished by the owner or otherwise, that the owner could not reasonably have been aware of the identity of the driver or person in control, or that the vehicle was stolen or being unlawfully used at the time the Offence was alleged to have been committed.

(c) Where the Town Clerk is so satisfied, no proceedings shall be taken against the owner for the recovery of the penalty prescribed in respect of the Offence.

(d) In by-laws 41, 42, 43 and 44 "Offence" means an offence of which the parking or standing of a vehicle is an element.

46. No person other than the driver of the vehicle shall remove from the vehicle any notice thereto or left therein or thereon by an Authorised Officer.

47. (a) No person except an employee of the Council in the course of his duties shall drive or park a vehicle upon or over any portion of any Reserve other than a paved area specifically set aside for that purpose.

(b) No person shall park a vehicle on any part of a Reserve, including any paved areas for the purposes of conducting a business.

48. No person shall in any way obstruct or hinder an Authorised Officer in the execution of his duty.

By-laws Relating to Street Lawns and Gardens.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 15 February 1982 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following amendments to the abovementioned by-laws which were published in the *Government Gazette* on 29 May 1963 and amended by notices published in the *Government Gazettes* of 18 August 1971, and 18 April 1975 and 15 July 1977.

1. By-law 2 of the Principal By-laws is amended by the inclusion of the following definition after the definition of "footpath".

"garden" means an area of a street which is planted, developed or treated otherwise than as a lawn but does not include any development or treatment which involves the construction of works in a street within the meaning of section 509 of the Local Government Act.

2. By-law 2 of the Principal By-laws is amended by the inclusion of the following definition after the definition of "junction".

"lawn" means an area of a street which is planted solely with grass and which comprises no other landscaping feature other than a tree or shrub planted by the Council.

3. By-law 3 of the Principal By-laws is amended by deleting the words "that lawn or garden shall be deemed to have been regularly planted pursuant to these by-laws" and inserting the words "the owner or occupier of the land that abuts on that portion of the street in which that garden is planted shall ensure that the garden complies with the provisions of these by-laws but is not required to obtain a permit pursuant to these by-laws."

4. By-law 4 (3) is amended by adding the words "and any trees or shrubs proposed to be planted" after the word "beds" in line 3.

5. By-law 16 is amended by deleting the word "three" after the word "is" in line 3 and substituting the word "ten".

The by-law relating to Control and Management of the Geraldton and Districts Aquatic Centre published in the *Government Gazette* on 16 February 1973 is amended in the following manner:—

(i) Clause 1 by adding the following definitions:—

"Office" means the section of the building containing three rooms, situated adjacent to and north of the main entrance to the pool premises;

"Plant Room" means the building situated in the southeast portion of the premises and houses the pumping and filtration equipment;

"Storage Facilities" means the building situated within the pool premises and located between the club room and the plant room;

(ii) Clause 10 by adding after the word "female" in line two the words "above the age of four years";

(iii) Clause 18 by adding after the word "excepting" in line two the words "areas specified by the Pool Manager";

- (iv) Clause 27 by adding after the word "premises" in line four the words "except a person who is blind or partially blind and being accompanied by a dog *bona fide* used by him as a guide dog";
- (v) Clause 31 by adding after the words "club room" appearing in lines two and four the words "and eastern half of the storage facilities";
- (vi) Clause 32 by:—
  - (a) Adding after the words "club room" appearing in lines one and two the words "storage facilities, plant room, office and kiosk";
  - (b) Adding after the word "organization" appearing at the commencement of line two the words "or person".

#### DOG ACT 1976-1977.

The Municipality of the Shire of Albany.

By-laws Relating to Dogs and Dog Kennels.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on 26 February 1982 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Shire of Albany by-laws relating to Dogs and Dog Kennels.
2. The by-laws of the Shire of Albany relating to dogs published in the *Government Gazette* of 24 January 1930 and 27 November 1953 are hereby revoked.

#### PART I—PRELIMINARY.

3. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires:

"Act" means the Dog Act 1976 (as amended).

"Authorised Person" means a person authorised by or under section 29 of the Act.

"Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Albany.

"Rural Area" means any land situated within a rural zone as classified by the Town Planning Scheme.

"Special Rural Area" means any land situated within a special rural zone as classified by the Town Planning Scheme.

"Town Planning Scheme" means Shire of Albany Town Planning Scheme No. 3 published in the *Government Gazette* on 15 February 1980 and amended from time to time or any other Town Planning Schemes or by-laws for the time being in force whereby the district of the Municipality of the Shire of Albany or any part thereof is classified or zoned.

#### PART II—IMPOUNDING OF DOGS.

4. If the owner or a person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of a dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog then upon payment of the fee specified in the First Schedule hereto the dog shall be released to such person.

5. The pound keeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such times and on such days of the week as the Council determines from time to time. In the absence of the pound keeper a claim for a dog seized or impounded may be made to an authorised person.

6. The fee payable where a dog is destroyed at the request of the owner thereof pursuant to section 29 (14) of the Act is that specified in the First Schedule.

7. The payment of fees or charges in respect of the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of the dog from liability to a penalty under any of the provisions of the Act, the Dog Act Regulations 1976 or these by-laws.

## PART III—KEEPING OF DOGS.

8. (a) The owner or occupier of any premises within the district of the Shire of Albany shall not keep or permit to be kept thereon more than two dogs over the age of three months and the young of those dogs under that age unless such premises are situated within that area of the district where kennels are permitted under the Town Planning Scheme and unless such premises are licensed as an approved kennel establishment.

(b) Notwithstanding By-law 8 (a) the owner or occupier of any premises situated within a rural area may keep such number of dogs as is reasonably required for the purposes of tendering, mustering and controlling livestock on the property on which such dogs are kept without such premises being licensed as an approved kennel establishment.

(NOTE: A person wishing to keep more than two dogs but not more than six dogs on any premises under By-law 8 (a) may seek exemption for those premises under the provisions of section 26 (3) of the Act).

9. An application for a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall:—

- (a) be in writing,
- (b) be in or substantially in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws; and
- (c) be supported by evidence that due notice of the proposed use of the land has been given to owners/occupiers of properties which either adjoin or are within 400 metres of the boundaries of the proposed kennel establishment.

10. The fee payable for the issue or renewal of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment is that specified within the First Schedule.

11. A licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in or substantially in the form contained in the Third Schedule.

12. Dogs in an approved kennel establishment shall be kept in kennels and yards appropriate to the breed or kind in question, sited and maintained in accordance with the requirements of public health, sufficiently secured and having specifications of a standard not less than the following:—

- (a) Each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto.
- (b) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance of not less than 20 metres from the boundaries of the land in the occupation of the occupier.
- (c) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance of not less than 75 metres from the boundary of any road reserve to which the premises has its main frontage, or not less than 20 metres from the boundary of any road reserve constituting a side or rear boundary.  
Where a premises has frontage to more than one road reserve, the main frontage shall be that as determined by Council.
- (d) (i) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance of not less than 75 metres from any dwelling house, church, schoolroom, hall or factory.  
(ii) Notwithstanding By-law 12 (d) (i) where in respect to a dwelling house situated on a lot on which the kennels are to be located, the distance maybe reduced to 50 metres.
- (e) External walls and partition walls between kennels under the same roof shall be constructed of single brick or any other material which has a sound reduction indice of not less than 30 dB (A).
- (f) Each partition wall shall extend past the kennel opening by not less than 1.5 metres.
- (g) The roof shall be constructed of corrugated asbestos and also lined with asbestos with a minimum airspace between of 75 mm filled with fibreglass wool, or similar sound absorbent blanket or mat. The roof and lining shall be completely sealed to external and partition walls. The Council may permit the use of other materials or methods of construction of the roof and lining if the material has a sound reduction indice of not less than 30 dB (A).
- (h) Each enclosed sleeping kennel shall be fitted with a door with sufficient ventilation openings and the door shall be kept closed at night.  
(i) The lowest internal height shall be at least 1.8 metres from the floor.
- (j) Each yard shall be securely fenced and kept securely fenced with a fence not less than 1.8 metres in height constructed of galvanised link mesh or other material approved by the Council.
- (k) All gates shall be provided with proper catches or means of fastening.
- (l) The upper surface of the floor of each kennel shall be set at least 150 mm above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a smooth surface and shall have a fall of not less than 1 in 100 to a drain. The entire yard shall be surrounded by a drain which shall be properly laid, ventilated and trapped. All floor washings shall pass through this drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the health requirements of the Council.
- (m) The floor of any yard shall be constructed in the same manner as the floor of any kennel as provided in by-law 12 (1).
- (n) For each dog kept therein every kennel shall have not less than 3 square metres of floor space and every yard not less than 5 square metres.
- (o) All kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels shall be maintained in a clean condition and cleaned and disinfected when so ordered by an Officer of the Council.

(p) Reticulated water must be available at the kennel via a properly supported standpipe and hose cock for the hosing down of the kennel and floored yard.

13. A person shall not erect a kennel unless and until two copies of plans and specifications of and a location plan showing the proposed site of the kennel and of the yard appurtenant thereto have been approved by the Council.

14. Council may not approve or register a kennel establishment until the occupier of the premises has advertised in a newspaper circulating in the district his intention to establish a kennel establishment upon the premises and Council has considered any written objections forwarded to it within 21 days of the advertisement, to the maintenance of the kennel establishment upon the premises.

15. Approved kennel establishments shall be registered by the Council upon receipt of the fee prescribed in the First Schedule.

#### PART IV—PENALTIES.

16. (1) A person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the requirements of these by-laws commits an offence against these by-laws.

(2) A person who commits an offence against these by-laws is liable to a maximum penalty of—

- (a) \$25 for a first offence;
- (b) \$50 for a second offence;
- (c) \$100 for a third and each subsequent offence.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960-1981.

Municipality of the Shire of Albany.

By-laws Relating to Control of Fencing.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 23 January 1981 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following by-laws:—

1. These by-laws are made for the general control of fences in areas zoned Industrial and Residential within the boundaries of the Municipality of the Shire of Albany.

2. In these by-laws unless the context requires otherwise:

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Albany.

“Dangerous”, in relation to any fence, means a fence which is likely to collapse or fall, or part of which is likely to collapse or fall, by reason of its faulty design, location or construction, deterioration of materials, damage by termites, decay, changes in ground levels or any other cause whatsoever.

“Dividing Fence” has the meaning given to it in and for the purposes of the Dividing Fences Act 1961.

“Fence” includes a wall.

“Height”, in relation to a fence, means the greatest distance between the top of the fence at any point and the ground immediately below that point but where—

(a) the natural level of the ground cannot be ascertained, the height of the fence shall be measured from a level fixed by the surveyor;

(b) a fence is erected on or adjacent to a retaining wall, the retaining wall is deemed to be part of the fence for the purpose of measuring the height thereof, unless in any particular case the Council decides otherwise.

“Industrial Area” means an area classified as a light industry zone, general industry zone, noxious industry zone or fuel depot zone by the Town Planning Scheme.

“Residential Area” means an area classified as a residential zone or residential development zone by the Town Planning Scheme.

“Surveyor” means the Building Surveyor of the Municipality of the Shire of Albany.

“Town Planning Scheme” means Shire of Albany Town Planning Scheme No. 3 published in the *Government Gazette* of 15 February 1980 and amended from time to time or other town planning schemes or by-laws for the time being in force whereby the district of the Municipality of the Shire of Albany or any part thereof is classified or zoned.

3. No person shall commence to erect, proceed with the erection, rebuild, reconstruct, or alter any fence exceeding 1 800 mm in height, if it is situated within 7 500 mm of a street alignment unless and until he has lodged with the Council, two copies of the plans and specifications of the proposed fence or proposed rebuilding, reconstruction or alteration and the Council has approved of the plans and specifications.

#### Front Fences Exceeding 900 mm.

4. No person shall erect a fence exceeding 900 mm in height to the frontage of a lot or the front 7 500 mm of the side boundaries unless and until he has lodged with the Council two copies of the plans and specifications of the proposed fence, such specifications to stipulate the type of material to be used and the Council has approved of the plans and specifications. In no case shall fences constructed along the frontage of a lot exceed 1 800 mm in height.

5. A person shall not erect a fence exceeding 750 mm in height on any frontage of a lot which is situated at the intersection of two or more streets within a distance of 6 000 mm from the point of intersection of the lines obtained by producing the street alignments fronting the lot provided however, that on a lot being lawfully used for industrial purposes the Council may permit a link mesh fence to be erected to a greater height than 750 mm if the Council is satisfied that any such fence would not materially affect the visibility of drivers of vehicles approaching the intersection.

#### Spiked or Jagged Projections.

6. Subject to By-law 7, a person shall not erect or allow to remain erected on any boundary fence of an allotment owned or occupied by him in either an Industrial or Residential Area as defined within By-law 2, any barbed or other wire with spiked or jagged projections.

7. A person shall not erect or affix or allow to remain on any boundary of an allotment owned or occupied by him in an Industrial Area, any barbed or other wire with spiked or jagged projections unless the wire is carried on posts bent back into the allotment from the boundary at an angle of 45 degrees, nor unless the bottom row of wire is set back 150 mm from the face of the fence and is not nearer than 2 150 mm to the ground.

8. Except with the prior written consent of the Council, no person shall affix or allow to remain upon any fence, any iron spike, broken glass, barbed wire, or other wire with spiked or jagged projections, and in the event of Council granting its consent, no person shall permit such iron spike, broken glass or barbed wire to be less than 2 150 mm vertically above the level of any street, roadway, or public place or to project thereover.

#### Secondhand Material.

9. Except with the prior written consent of the Council, no person shall construct any fence with secondhand material and in the event of such consent being given, the person to whom that consent has been given shall paint or treat the secondhand material as directed by the Surveyor.

#### Types of Fences Approved.

10. A person shall not construct a fence from other than brick, concrete, wrought iron, tubular steel, link mesh, timber, plastic coated link mesh, corrugated asbestos, colour bonded metal or such other material as the Council may approve. Free standing corrugated asbestos fences shall be bolted in accord with the Manufacturers specifications, so far as they are not inconsistent with the requirements of Schedules 1 and 2 hereof.

#### Dangerous Fences.

11. A person shall not erect a dangerous fence on or within 3 000 mm of the boundary of a public place.

#### Maintenance.

12. (1) The owner of land on which a fence is erected shall maintain the fence in good condition and so as to prevent it from becoming dangerous, dilapidated, unsightly or prejudicial to the amenity of the neighbourhood.

(2) The Council may give notice in writing to the owner or occupier of land upon which is erected a fence that has not been maintained in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws requiring him to repair, paint or maintain the fence within the time stipulated in the notice, not being less than 14 days from the date of service of the notice.

(3) A person who fails to comply with the notice given to him pursuant to sub-by-law (2) hereof commits an offence.

(4) If a person to whom a notice has been given pursuant to sub-by-law (2) requiring him to maintain the fence fails to comply with the requirements of the notice, the Council may enter upon the land and maintain the fence and recover the amount of the expense of so doing from the owner in a court of competent jurisdiction.

## Service of Notices.

13. Any notice required to be served under these by-laws upon either the owner or occupier of land shall be so served in accordance with the provisions of section 657 of the Local Government Act.

## Sufficient Fence.

14. A fence constructed in accordance with the specifications contained in the Schedule specified hereunder is hereby prescribed as a sufficient fence for the purposes of the Dividing Fences Act 1961 within the area set opposite the number of that Schedule hereunder.

Schedule No.	Area
1	Residential Area
2	Industrial Area

## Fences on Boundaries Between Differing Areas.

15. Where a fence is to be erected on the boundary between differing areas, the minimum type of fencing able to be erected shall be that as provided for in Schedule 1 hereof.

## Penalty.

16. Any person who does anything in contravention of any of the provisions of these by-laws or fails to carry out any duty or requirement imposed upon him by these by-laws commits an offence and shall be liable upon conviction to a maximum penalty of \$200 and in addition a maximum daily penalty of \$20 per day during which the offence continues.

## Schedule 1.

## Fences in Residential Areas.

Across a frontage and for a distance of 7 500 mm from the street alignment along a side boundary of an allotment, except as in by-laws 4 and 5 of these by-laws, a fence shall not exceed 900 mm in height. Brick, concrete or masonry fences shall have concrete footings of not less than 230 mm wide by 150 mm deep.

Fences of materials other than brick, concrete or masonry shall be constructed in accord with Clauses (1), (2) and (3) of Schedule 1.

Thereafter, along the side boundary and along the rear boundary, the fences shall be constructed as follows:—

1. Corrugated self supporting sheet fencing shall be erected as follows:—
  - (a) Sheets up to 1 800 mm in length to be trenched 460 mm into the ground.
  - (b) Sheets exceeding 1 800 mm in length but not 2 400 mm to be trenched 600 mm into the ground.
  - (c) Sheets exceeding 2 400 mm in length shall be erected in accordance with the Manufacturer's specifications or, alternatively, the method of proposed erection is to be supported by a practising Structural Engineer's design and specifications.
  - (d) Sheets to be lapped and fixed with three galvanized 6.4 mm gutter bolts, nuts and washers.
2. Fences of other than corrugated self supporting sheets shall be erected as follows:—
  - (a) First posts and rear corner posts shall not be less than 125 mm x 135 mm x 2 100 mm.
  - (b) Intermediate posts shall not be less than 135 mm x 75 mm x 2 100 mm.
  - (c) All posts shall be spaced at not more than 2 750 mm centres.
  - (d) All posts shall be sunk at least 460 mm into the ground.
  - (e) Corner posts shall be struted two ways with 100 mm x 50 mm and 75 mm x 50 mm struts.
  - (f) Posts must have at least two rows of rails.
  - (g) Rails shall be not less than 75 mm x 50 mm double nailed to each post and each rail shall span two bays of fencing with joints staggered.
  - (h) The fence may be covered with a material as approved by the Council.
  - (i) All pickets or palings shall be placed not more than 100 mm apart, and shall be double nailed to each rail.
  - (j) Steel posts may be used in lieu of timber with the written approval of Council provided that they be set in concrete blocks having a depth of not less than 460 mm and a surface area of not less than 150 mm x 150 mm.

3. In instances where ironstone or other rock restricts the excavation of trenches to the required depth, fences may be supported by uprights, either wooden or steel, set in concrete blocks having a depth of not less than 460 mm and a surface area of not less than 150 mm x 150 mm.

Where corrugated asbestos sheeting is to be used, a wooden rail of dimensions not less than 75 mm x 50 mm shall be bolted to the uprights at a minimum distance of 75 mm from the top of such upright and to which the top of the sheeting shall be affixed. The bottom of such sheeting shall either be trenched a minimum of 150 mm into the ground or affixed to a further rail if so required.

## Schedule 2.

## Fences in Industrial Areas.

1. Corrugated self supporting sheet fencing shall be erected as follows:—
  - (a) Sheets up to 1 800 mm in length to be trenched 460 mm into the ground.
  - (b) Sheets exceeding 1 800 mm in length but not 2 400 mm to be trenched 600 mm into the ground.
  - (c) Sheets exceeding 2 400 mm in length shall be erected in accordance with the Manufacturer's specifications, or, alternatively, the method of proposed erection is to be supported by a practising Structural Engineer's design and specifications.
  - (d) Sheets to be lapped and fixed with three galvanized 6.4 mm gutter bolts, nuts and washers.
  - (e) Gateposts shall be constructed of galvanized iron piping having an internal diameter of not less than 50 mm and shall have caps to tops and set into concrete blocks, having a depth of not less than 600 mm and a surface area of not less than 150 mm x 150 mm.
  - (f) Struts shall be constructed of galvanized iron piping having an internal diameter of not less than 30 mm in concrete bases.
2. Link mesh fencing shall be erected as follows:—
  - (a) Corner posts shall be a minimum of 50 mm internal diameter and shall have not less than two struts of a minimum of 35 mm internal diameter, at right angles to each other. Gateposts shall be a minimum of 50 mm internal diameter and shall have not less than one strut of a minimum of 35 mm internal diameter.
  - (b) Intermediate posts shall be constructed of galvanized iron piping having an internal diameter of not less than 35 mm, set in concrete having a depth of not less than 460 mm and a surface area of not less than 150 mm x 150 mm spaced at not more than 2 750 mm centres.
  - (c) Cables shall be affixed to the top, centre and bottom of all posts and shall consist of two or more No. 10 gauge wires, twisted together.
  - (d) Galvanized link mesh wire shall be not less than 1 800 mm and constructed of 50 mm mesh No. 12 gauge galvanized iron wire and shall be strained, neatly secured and laced to the posts and affixed to cables. Gates shall provide an opening of not less than 3 600 mm and shall be constructed of 25 mm tubular framework with one horizontal and one vertical stay constructed of 20 mm piping and shall be covered with 50 mm No. 12 gauge galvanized link mesh strained to framework.
  - (e) Gates shall be fixed with a drop bolt and locking attachment.

## DOG ACT 1976-1977.

## The Municipality of the Shire of Capel.

## By-laws Relating to Dogs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 11 September 1981 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

## PART I—PRELIMINARY.

1. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires—
 

“Act” means the Dog Act 1976-1977;

“By-law” means one of the by-laws;

“Clerk” means the Shire Clerk for the time being of the Shire of Capel or the person acting for the time being in that capacity;

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Capel;

“Foreshore” means ninety (90) metres landwards of low water mark at ordinary spring tides;

“Schedule” means a schedule to these by-laws.

Expressions used in these by-laws have the meanings given to them by the Act.
2. These by-laws apply throughout the whole of the district of the Shire of Capel.



## PART II—IMPOUNDING OF DOGS.

3. The charges payable in relation to the detention, maintenance care and release of dogs are as specified in the First Schedule hereto.

4. The charges in relation to the destruction of a dog or dogs pursuant to the Act are set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

5. (1) The pound keeper or any other person authorised by the Council shall attend to the release of dogs at such times on the days of the week as the Clerk determines from time to time.

(2) In the absence of a pound keeper or any other authorised person a claim for a dog to be released from a pound or other authorised premises shall be made to the Clerk.

6. The payment of fees or charges in respect of the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog does not relieve the owner of the dog of liability to a penalty under any of the provisions of the Act, the Dog Act Regulations 1976 or these by-laws.

## PART III—KEEPING OF DOGS.

7. (a) The occupier of premises shall not unless the premises are licensed as an approved kennel establishment or have been granted an exemption pursuant to section 26 (3) of the Act, keep or permit to be kept on those premises more than:—

(i) two dogs over the age of three months and the young of those dogs under that age if the premises are situated in any area specified in Schedule Three hereto.

(ii) four dogs over the age of three months and the young of those dogs under that age if the premises are situated in an area other than any area specified in Schedule Three, but not more than two of those dogs shall be either German Shepherd or Dobermann.

(b) The occupier of those premises described pursuant to by-law 7 (a) (i) hereof shall cause either the whole of the premises or a part thereof to be fenced in such a manner as to form an enclosure capable of confining a dog or dogs therein.

## PART IV—KENNEL LICENCE.

8. (1) An application for a licence for an approved kennel establishment pursuant to section 27 (1) of the Act shall be in writing and shall be in or substantially in the form contained in the Sixth Schedule and shall be supported by evidence that due notice of the proposed use of the land has been given to neighbouring owners.

(2) Unless the Council otherwise decides an application for a licence shall give notice of the proposed use of the land by:—

(a) not less than one advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district; and

(b) giving written notice to the owners and occupiers of all adjoining property at least thirty days before the application is made to the Council.

(3) The Council may make whatever enquiries or investigations that it thinks fit in making a decision with respect to the application for a licence and the Council may make further enquiries to any person or persons whom it considers is likely to be affected by the granting of a licence.

(4) The application shall be supported by detailed plans and specifications of the proposed establishment including a location plan showing the proposed kennel establishment site in relation to other buildings or proposed buildings on the premises and also showing the distance of the proposed kennel establishment from the boundaries of such premises and the position of any buildings of any adjoining premises.

9. The fee payable for the issue of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be that fee prescribed in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

10. The fee payable for the renewal of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be that fee prescribed in the Fifth Schedule hereto.

11. A licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be substantially in the form contained in the Seventh Schedule hereto.

12. The owner or occupier of premises licensed as an approved kennel establishment shall provide kennels constructed in accordance with the following specifications:—

(a) each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto;

(b) each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 25 metres from any street, but where this is impracticable a lesser distance may be approved by Council;

(c) each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 9 metres from any dwelling house, church, schoolroom, hall, shop, or factory;

(d) the walls of all kennels and yards shall be constructed of concrete, brick, stone or wood forming sheeted with asbestos or galvanized iron internally and externally, or other material approved by Council;

(e) the roof shall be constructed of impervious material approved by the Council;

(f) all untreated external surfaces other than brick or approved material shall be painted and kept painted with good quality paint;

(g) the lowest internal height shall be at least 2 metres from the floor;

(h) all gates shall be provided with proper catches or means of fastening;

- (i) the upper surface of the floor of each kennel shall be impervious and set at least 100 mm above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a smooth surface, and shall have a fall of not less than 1 in 100; the entire yard shall be surrounded by a drain which shall be properly laid, ventilated and trapped; all floor washings shall pass through this drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the health requirements of the Council;
- (j) the floor of a yard shall be constructed in the same manner as the floor of a kennel;
- (k) for each dog kept therein every kennel shall have not less than 2 m<sup>2</sup> of floor space and every yard not less than 2.5 m<sup>2</sup>;
- (l) each kennel shall be constructed so far as is practicable with materials which prevent or minimise the emission of noise therefrom.

## PART V—GENERAL.

13. A person liable for the control of a dog who permits that dog to be:—

- (a) on the foreshore within 800 metres north or south of the centre line of Peppermint Grove Road at Peppermint Grove Beach;
- (b) on the foreshore within 800 metres north or south of the centre line of Forrest Beach Road at Forrest Beach

commits an offence unless the dog is under the effective control of some person and is restrained by means of a chain, cord, leash or harness.

Penalty: \$100.00.

14. A person who fails to comply with or contravenes any of the provisions of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable to a maximum penalty of \$100.00.

15. The by-laws published in the *Government Gazette* on 19 July 1974 are hereby revoked.

## LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960-1981.

Municipality of the Shire of Mundaring.

By-laws Relating to Reserve No. 23165—Lake Leschenaultia.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 16 February 1982 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following by-laws—

## PART I—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

1. In these by-laws, unless the context requires otherwise—

“Act” means the Local Government Act 1960-1981;

“authorized officer” means a person appointed by the Council to enforce these by-laws and includes the caretaker and any member of the police force of the State;

“by-law” means one of these by-laws;

“caretaker” means the person appointed by Council to maintain the facilities on the Reserve and to enforce these by-laws;

“carriageway” means a part of the Reserve designed or ordinarily used for vehicular traffic, including ingress to an egress from the Reserve;

“Clerk” means the Shire Clerk of the Shire of Mundaring;

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Mundaring;

“driver” means a person driving or in control of a vehicle;

“Lake” means the lake on the Reserve known as Lake Leschenaultia;

“owner” means in relation to a vehicle, the person who is the holder of the requisite vehicle licence under the Road Traffic Act 1974 in respect of the vehicle or, if the vehicle is not licensed under the Act, the person who owns the vehicle or is entitled to the possession of the vehicle;

“park” means to permit a vehicle, whether attended or not, to remain stationary on the Reserve;

“prescribed fee” means the fee specified in the First Schedule to these by-laws;

"Reserve" means the area designated as Swan Locations 7165, 5287, 5290, 5291, and 5293 and being Reserve No. 23165, known as Lake Leschenaultia Reserve;

"Schedule" means a schedule to these by-laws;

"sub-bylaw" means a sub-bylaw of the by-law in which the term is used;

"ticket issuing machine" means a machine installed by the Council that issues, as a result of a prescribed coin or coins being inserted in the machine, a ticket showing the period during which it is lawful to remain parked on the Reserve.

Words and expressions not defined in these by-laws have the meanings respectively given to them in and for the purposes of the Act.

#### Hours of Admission.

2. The Reserve is open for public use during the periods and at the times specified in the Second Schedule.

#### Risk.

3. Every person using the Reserve does so at his own risk.

#### Fees.

4. The fees payable for parking, camping, fishing and reservation of areas are specified in the First Schedule.

#### Control of the Reserve.

5. Every person using the Reserve shall obey all reasonable directions of an authorized officer.

6. (1) The Council may appoint a person to be caretaker or an authorized officer for the purpose of these by-laws.

(2) An authorized officer is authorized—

- (a) to carry into effect the provisions of these by-laws;
- (b) to report to the Clerk on the working, effectiveness and functioning of these by-laws;
- (c) to recommend to the Clerk, the institution of prosecutions; and
- (d) subject to section 646 of the Act, to institute and conduct prosecutions as directed by the Clerk from time to time.

7. (1) If, in the opinion of an authorized officer, a person has committed a breach of one of these by-laws in or on the Reserve, the authorized officer may require the person forthwith to leave the Reserve and not to re-enter it before 5.30 a.m. on the following day.

(2) A person who on being required to leave the Reserve fails to do so forthwith or having been forbidden to re-enter the Reserve before 5.30 a.m. on the following day, re-enters before that time, commits an offence and may be removed by the authorized officer.

8. A person shall not in or on the Reserve—

- (a) wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use thereof or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty or refuse to obey the lawful directions of an authorized officer;
- (b) damage or interfere with any tree, shrub, log, tree guard, wall, fence, building, seat, barbecue, or other property;
- (c) climb or be upon any building or be upon the roof of any building;
- (d) light a fire except at a fireplace made of brick, stone or other fireproof material;
- (e) put, stick, stamp, stencil, paint or otherwise affix any placard, poster, handbill, notice, advertisement, sign or any other document whatsoever upon any tree, board, fence, building, road, or any other place whatsoever unless authorized in writing to do so by the Clerk;
- (f) distribute or exhibit any printed or written pamphlet or handbill in any manner whatsoever unless authorized in writing to do so by the Clerk;
- (g) use a microphone, loudspeaker, megaphone or other means of sound amplification for the purpose of advertising nor use such an instrument for any other purpose so as to cause annoyance to other persons using the Reserve;
- (h) discharge a firearm or shoot, snare or destroy any bird or animal therein, but this paragraph does not apply to an authorized officer in the conduct of his duties;
- (i) sell or expose or offer for sale any goods, wares, refreshments, fruits or other merchandise or things or make a charge for any form of entertainment without first obtaining in writing, the approval of the Council and paying in advance, any fee or satisfying any conditions attached to the approval;
- (j) camp, lodge or tarry overnight or frequent the Reserve for the purpose of camping therein without first obtaining the approval of an authorized officer and paying the fee specified in the First Schedule;
- (k) drive or permit to be driven or park a vehicle except in accordance with these by-laws;
- (l) drive a vehicle on any portion of the Reserve other than a road, carriageway or area of the Reserve where motor vehicles are normally driven;
- (m) subject to by-law 9, use a motor boat or canoe on the waters of the Lake other than a boat or canoe propelled by oars or paddles unless he first obtains approval in writing from the Clerk or a person authorized in writing, by the Clerk to give that approval;

- (n) play or practise at golf or strike a golf ball;
- (o) play at any game of chance or any unlawful game or gamble, bet or call the odds or offer to gamble or bet;
- (p) consume any alcoholic beverage on the Reserve if the alcoholic beverage is drawn from a keg or barrel without first having obtained the written approval of the Clerk or an authorized officer;
- (q) ride or lead a horse or pony on any portion of the Reserve used for camping or within 200 metres of the water of the Lake or of a barbecue.

9. (1) The Clerk or a person authorized in writing by the Clerk to give that approval, may impose any conditions upon the grant of approval under by-law 8 (m), he thinks necessary.

(2) The provisions of by-law 8 (m) do not apply where use of a motor boat on the Lake by an authorized officer or someone delegated by that person is necessary for the safety of members of the public.

#### Fishing.

10. (1) A person shall not fish in the Lake without first obtaining a written permit from the Clerk or an authorized officer.

(2) The fee specified in the First Schedule is payable for a permit to fish in the Lake.

(3) The number of fish which a permit holder may take from the Lake is six (6).

(4) A person who takes from the Lake a greater number of fish than the limit referred to in sub-by-law (3) commits an offence.

11. (1) The Council may designate an area in which fishing may be allowed by rod and line or by line only.

(2) A person who holds a permit pursuant to by-law 10 shall not fish in any part of the Lake other than within the designated area.

12. A person shall not use a speargun or net or any other instrument other than a rod or line for the purpose of catching fish.

#### Bathing.

13. (1) A person over the age of four years bathing in the Lake shall be properly and adequately clad so as to secure the observances of decency.

(2) Where an authorized officer considers that the costume or other clothing of a person using the Reserve is not proper or adequate to secure the observance of decency, he may order the person to put on adequate clothing and, if that person refuses, the authorized officer may remove that person from the reserve.

14. A person shall not undress or remove any part of his bathing costume in a place open to public view.

#### Dogs.

15. A person shall not bring a dog on to the Reserve or permit a dog to remain thereon unless the dog is at all times restrained on a chain, cord or leash.

16. A person shall not cause or permit a dog—

- (a) to enter the waters of the Lake;
- (b) be a nuisance to any other person within or about the Reserve.

#### Reserved Areas.

17. (1) An authorized officer may, on request and on payment of the fee specified in the First Schedule, set aside an area of land in the Reserve, other than the cleared foreshore on the southeast corner of the waters of the Lake, for use by a group of persons or club for a period not exceeding eight hours.

(2) The authorized officer shall mark or erect signs defining an area so reserved and stating that it is reserved.

(3) A person shall not enter upon an area so reserved during the period for which it has been reserved unless he is a member of the group or club for whom it was reserved.

(4) The reservation of an area of land pursuant to this by-law is valid for the day in respect of which it is made only.

#### PART II—PARKING.

18. Subject to these by-laws, a person shall not drive a vehicle on to the Reserve or permit the vehicle to remain thereon unless he has purchased a ticket from a ticket issuing machine or an authorized officer and that ticket is current.

19. A ticket entitles the driver of a vehicle to bring the vehicle on to the Reserve and park it thereon during the period shown on the ticket.

20. By-law 18 does not apply on any day or during any period that a notice is erected on or adjacent to a ticket issuing machine indicating that parking on the reserve is free.

21. (1) In this by-law "prescribed coin" means any of the following coins—

- one cent (1c);
- two cents (2c);
- five cents (5c);
- ten cents (10c);
- twenty cents (20c).

(2) A person shall not insert or cause to be inserted or attempt to insert into the coin slot of a ticket issuing machine any coin other than a prescribed coin.

(3) A person who inserts a prescribed coin into a ticket issuing machine shall do so only in accordance with the instructions printed on the machine.

22. A person shall not park a vehicle on the Reserve—

(a) in a place in which an authorized officer has directed him not to park the vehicle, or in which parking is prohibited by a sign on or adjacent or referable to the place;

(b) so as to constitute an obstruction or danger;

(c) after the expiration of the period for which a ticket has been purchased unless another ticket is purchased or unless he is lawfully camping on the Reserve and has paid the fee specified in the First Schedule.

23. The driver of a vehicle in the Reserve shall, on purchasing a ticket from a ticket issuing machine, place the ticket inside the vehicle in a position that the time of issue and number printed on the ticket by the machine is clearly visible and legible to an authorized officer examining the ticket from outside the vehicle.

24. A person shall not drive or bring a vehicle on to the Reserve or permit it to remain thereon if it is unduly noisy, in a dangerous condition or unlicensed.

25. A person other than the driver of the vehicle shall not remove from the vehicle any notice affixed to or left in or on the vehicle by an authorized officer.

26. A person shall not, without the written permission of the Council, affix any board, sign, placard, notice or other thing to, or paint or write upon any part of a ticket issuing machine.

27. A person who has paid the camping fee specified in the First Schedule is not required to purchase a ticket from a ticket issuing machine during the period for which the camping fee was paid.

#### PART III—PENALTIES.

28. A person who commits a breach of or fails to comply with any of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable to a maximum penalty of two hundred dollars (\$200.00).

29. (1) A notice served under subsection (2) of section 669C of the Act in respect of an offence alleged to have been committed against one of these by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 1 contained in the Third Schedule.

(2) Subject to sub-by-law (3) of this by-law, an infringement notice served under section 669D of the Act in respect of an offence alleged to have been committed against one of these by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 2 contained in the Third Schedule.

(3) An infringement notice served under subsection (2) of section 669D of the Act in respect of an offence against one of these by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 3 contained in the Third Schedule.

(4) A notice sent under subsection (5) of section 669D of the Act withdrawing an infringement notice served under that section in respect of an offence alleged to have been committed against one of these by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 4 contained in the Third Schedule.

30. The amount of six dollars (\$6.00) is the modified penalty for an offence dealt with under section 669D of the Act.

  - (b) recover in a court of competent jurisdiction from the person to whom the notice is directed, the amount of the expense of such destruction, eradication or control.

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has under section 4 (2) of the Mines Regulation Act 1946-1974 declared the underground construction of the Cooling Water Intake on Burrup Peninsula including—

- (a) twin tunnels, each with a cross section of approximately 31 square metres and each approximately 1 800 metres in length;
- (b) one access tunnel with a cross sectional area of approximately 20 square metres and a length of approximately 500 metres at a gradient of 1 in 7.5; and
- (c) two land based riser shafts each of approximately 6 metres in diameter,

to be a project which is classed for the purposes of the Act as described in section 4 (2), during the construction of the project and has exempted that project from the following provisions of the Mines Regulation Act 1946-1974 and the Mines Regulation Act Regulations 1976—

Supervision and inspection of working places underground shall be carried out by a competent person or persons appointed by the Underground Manager and approved by the Senior Inspector of Mines, such approval may be withdrawn by the Senior Inspector if he is satisfied that the person or persons so appointed is or are incompetent;
- (b) section 39 (1) subject to the conditions—
  - (i) that a person shall not be employed to work underground for more than 10 hours in any day and for more than 6 shifts in any week; and
  - (ii) that maximum allowable airborne dust concentrations be 80% of the permissible maximum concentrations provided for in Part 8 of the Mines Regulation Act Regulations 1976.
- (c) regulation 10.1 subject to the condition that all surveys and plans of the construction are made and drawn by a competent person appointed by the manager and approved by the Senior Inspector of Mines.
