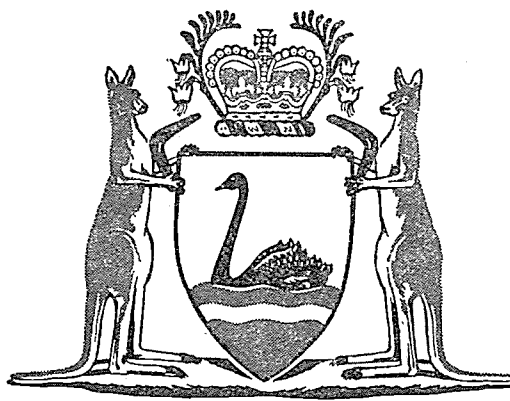

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 15 and subsections (2) and (3) of section 152 of the Petroleum Act 1967 that notwithstanding the Land Act 1933 or any other Act the Governor, by proclamation, may declare that any land of the Crown or part thereof reserved for or dedicated to any public purpose under any Act and howsoever classified that:

- (a) is not Crown land within the meaning of that expression in section 5 of the Act; and
- (b) is specified in the proclamation,

is Crown land for the purposes of the Petroleum Act 1967 and is land to which that Act applies, so long as the proclamation remains in force:

Now, therefore, I the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in the exercise of the powers under subsection (2) of section 15 of the Petroleum Act 1967 do hereby declare that the land of the Crown comprising Reserve Nos. 16522 and 18374 classified as Class "C" and set apart for the purpose of Water pursuant to the provisions of the Land Act 1933 is Crown land for the purpose of the Petroleum Act 1967 and is land to which the Petroleum Act 1967 applies so long as this proclamation remains in force, subject to:—

- (i) Survey lines within the Reserves being delineated with minimum interference to and disturbance of vegetation and timber, any traverse lines through timber stands being cut by hand.
- (ii) The clearing and construction of tracks being limited to a superficial blading and filling in of soil irregularities only, so that as far as is practicable rootstock and topsoil is left in place with its contained seed load. Any shot holes drilled being filled in and left in a safe and level condition.
- (iii) On completion or abandonment of any operational area such measures as are reasonably practical being taken to restore the area to its original condition.
- (iv) No activities being carried out that will pollute or restrict the supply of water in or to any facility situated on the reserve or in the drainage system thereto and no damage being caused to any of the improvements the property of the Public Works Department.

- (i) Survey lines within the Reserve being delineated with minimum interference to and disturbance of vegetation and timber, any traverse lines through timber stands being cut by hand.
- (ii) The clearing and construction of tracks being limited to a superficial blading and filling in of soil irregularities only, so that as far as is practicable rootstock and topsoil is left in place with its contained seed load. Any shot holes drilled being filled in and left in a safe and level condition.
- (iii) On completion or abandonment of any operational area such measures as are reasonably practical being taken to restore the area to its original condition.

## ELECTORAL ACT 1907-1980.

## (Section 51).

I, ROBERT GERALD PIKE, Chief Secretary, the Minister of the Crown to whom the administration of the Electoral Act, 1907-1980, is for the time being committed by the Governor, pursuant to section fifty-one of that Act hereby direct the Chief Electoral Officer that—

(1) The name of each elector who on or before 15 June 1982 was enrolled for an Electoral Province and Electoral District shall be transferred to the roll for the Electoral Province and the Electoral District as constituted in the final report and final recommendations of the Electoral Commissioners pursuant to the Electoral Districts Act 1947-1981, and published in the *Government Gazette* on 20 January 1982, and in which the elector now lives or is deemed to live according to the last enrolment of the elector's name on a roll.

(2) The name of each elector who claims enrolment for an Electoral Province and an Electoral District after 15 June 1982 shall be enrolled for the Electoral Province and Electoral District as so constituted under the Electoral Districts Act 1947-1981, and in which the claimant lives or is deemed to live.

(3) Where an acknowledgment of a claim is forwarded to an elector who, after 15 June 1982, duly claims enrolment for an Electoral Province and Electoral District, the acknowledgment shall contain the appropriate name of the Electoral Province and Electoral District as so constituted under the Electoral Districts Act 1947-1981, and in which the claimant lives or is deemed to live.

(4) The prescribed form of claim shall so far as is necessary, be varied by endorsing thereon the name of the Electoral District for which the elector will be enrolled pursuant to these directions.

(5) The Chief Electoral Officer may re-transfer to any roll a name that having been transferred therefrom pursuant to these directions was so transferred in error.

(6) In relation to any by-election for an Electoral Province or Electoral District that it is necessary to hold before the next general election the Chief Electoral Officer may give, in lieu of these directions, such directions as he may consider necessary or expedient to implement the provisions of the Electoral Act 1907-1980, for the proper and efficient conduct of that by-election.

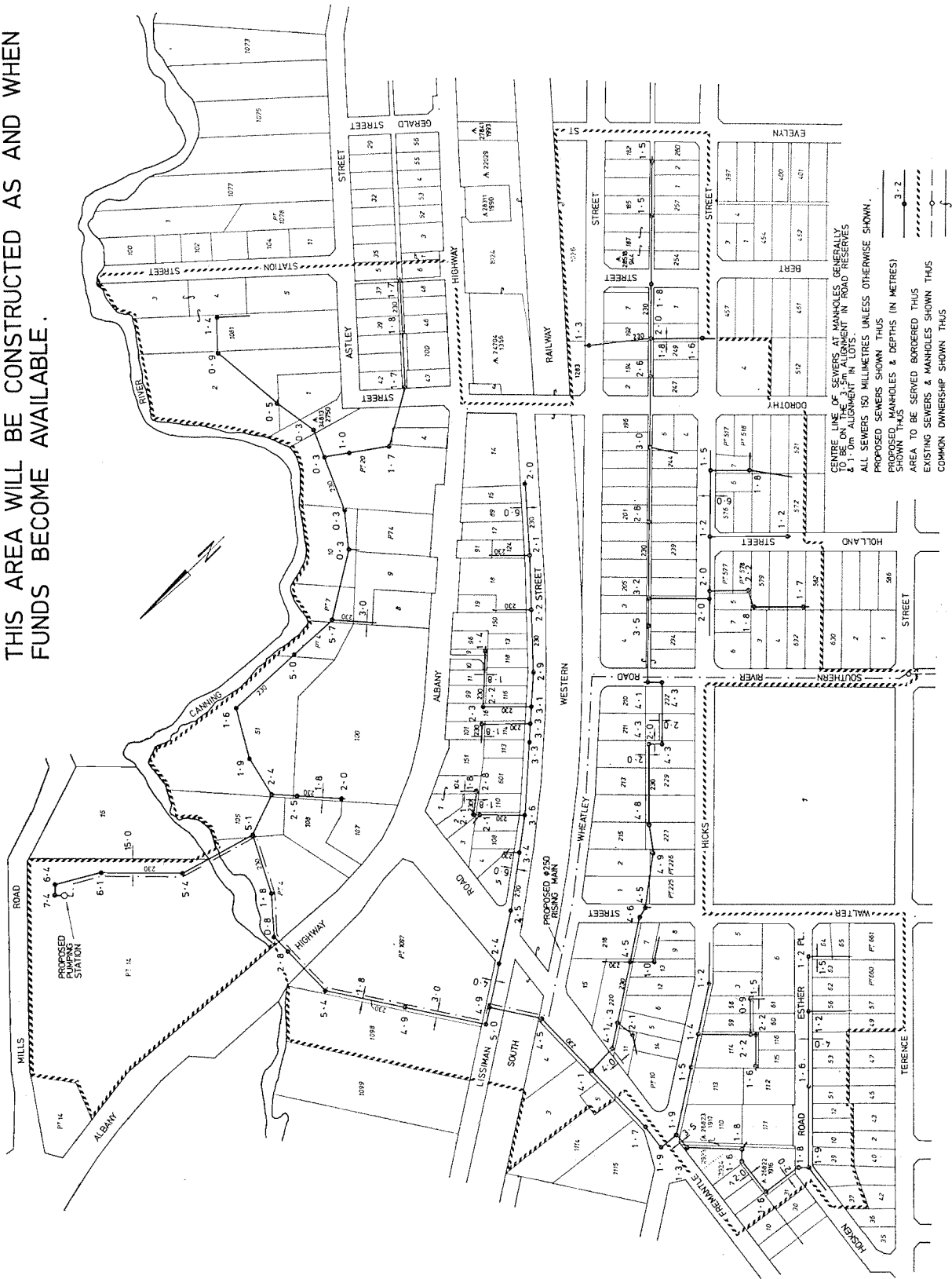

## HEDLAND COLLEGE.

Statute No. 1.

Interpretation.

1. Definitions. In any Statute including a by-law or rule made under a Statute or in any by-law made under the Colleges Act 1978-1980 unless the contrary intention appears—

“academic certificate” means certificate, diploma or other qualification gained as a result of a course of study undertaken with/at the College.

“Accountant” means the accountant of the College.

“administrative assistant” means an administrative assistant of the College so designated by the Council.

“Administrative Officer” means the staff member so designated by the Council.

“authorized officer” means an officer who is a delegate to act under a Statute, by-law or rule and is authorized by the Council in writing to so act; and “authorized committee” has a corresponding meaning.

“branch” means a branch of the College established at a site other than South Hedland.

“by-law” means a by-law made under the Act or under a Statute.

“Chairman” includes the appointed Chairman or, in his absence, the Deputy Chairman or the elected Chairman of the Council.

“College Land” includes any land vested in the Council or the College for the purposes of the Act.

“Council” includes the Interim Council of the College.

“delegate” used in relation to a power, authority, duty or function of the Council under the Act, means a person or committee to whom the Council has delegated that power, authority, duty or function.

“Deputy Chairman” means the member of the Council so elected by the Council.

“Director” means the chief executive officer of the College.

“Head of School” means the senior academic staff member of the School so designated by the Council.

“officer” means an officer of the College so designated by the Council.

“precincts” means the precincts of a site.

“rule” means a rule made under a Statute or By-law.

“School” means a School of the College so designated by the Council.

“Secretary” means the Secretary of the Council so designated by the Council.

“section” means a section of the Statute in which the words is used.

“site” means a place where any buildings or grounds are held, reserved or used for the purposes of the College or where any course of instruction, lecture, class or examination is held by or on behalf of the College whether those buildings or grounds are marked by the fences or boundaries or not.

“site by-law” means a by-law made for the control and management of any site.

“staff” means staff of the College.

“student” means a person enrolled for any course of instruction, lecture, class or examination conducted by or on behalf of the College.

"the Act" means the Colleges Act 1978-1980 and includes Statutes and by-laws made under the Act and by-laws and rules made under any of the Statutes.  
"this Statute" includes by-laws and rules made under the Statute wherein the expression occurs.

2. Interpretation Act. The Interpretation Act, 1918-1975, applies to the Statutes and By-laws made under the Act and to By-laws and Rules made under the Statutes as if they were By-laws and Rules made under the Act.

3. Designated persons. In any Statute, by-law or rule, unless the contrary intention appears, a reference to a member of the Council, a member of the staff or an officer or functionary of the College or to such a person by the name of his office includes a reference to every person for the time being duly acting in the place of such a person or in such an office or duly discharging the duties of such a person or such an office.

#### HEDLAND COLLEGE.

##### Statute No. 2.

##### Power to Make By-laws and Rules.

1. Matters embraced by By-laws and Rules. The Council of the College may make By-laws and Rules not inconsistent with the Act, with respect to all matters pertaining to the College and in particular may make By-laws and Rules regulating or providing for the regulation of:

- (a) the management, good government and discipline of the College;
- (b) the use and custody of the common seal of the College, and the functions of the Council that may be exercised without the use of the common seal for that purpose;
- (c) the organization and supervision of the teaching of enrolled students;
- (d) the academic and other staff, officers and employees of the College and its branches;
- (e) the manner and time or convening, holding and adjourning the meetings of the Council, the manner of voting at those meetings, the powers and duties of the Chairman, the conduct and record of the business, the appointment of committees of the Council and the quorum, powers and duties of those committees;
- (f) the entrance standard for students;
- (g) the granting of appropriate academic certificates and honorary awards by the Council;
- (h) the granting of scholarships, exhibitions, bursaries and prizes;
- (i) the fees to be charged for courses of study or instruction, examinations, academic certificates of the College and for such other facilities or privileges of the College as are prescribed;
- (j) the admission of graduates and students of other educational institutions to any corresponding status in the College without examination;
- (k) the recognition, instead of or for the purpose of any examination or course of study, of any course of study completed or examination passed in any educational institution;
- (l) the establishment by the Council of hostels and halls of residence for enrolled students and the management, control and closing of any of those hostels and halls;
- (m) the government of hostels and halls of residence that are under the control of the Council, the affiliation of hostels and halls of residence that are not under the control of the Council and the licensing and supervision of boarding houses catering for enrolled students and for the revocation of the licensing thereof;
- (n) the control and investment of the property of the College;
- (o) for carrying out or giving effect to any Statute.

##### 2. Effecting By-laws.

- (a) Every By-law made by the Council of the College shall be sealed with the common seal of the College and shall be transmitted by the Council for the approval by the Governor and when so approved, shall be published in the *Gazette*.
- (b) The By-law shall come into effect on the date it is published in the *Gazette*, unless specified otherwise in the By-law.

##### 3. Effecting Rules.

- (a) The Administrative Officer shall seal each rule and cause it to be published.
- (b) (i) A rule is published by posting a copy of it on the notice board which the College shall provide outside the main entrance to the Administration Office or where it applies only to one branch or site, on a notice board which the College shall provide outside the administrative office of that branch, or site.  
(ii) A rule takes effect from the date it is published.

4. Rules made by delegates.
  - (a) Where a rule is made by a delegate, a copy of it shall be laid down before the Council as soon as practicable after the rule is published.
  - (b) If the Council resolves that a rule made by a delegate be revoked in whole or in part, that rule or that part is, from the date of resolution, of no effect, but without affecting the validity of anything done pursuant to the rule between the date it was published and the date of the resolution.
5. Revoking or amending By-laws or Rules. A By-law or Rule made under this Statute may be revoked or amended by a subsequent By-law or Rule so made.
6. Delegations to act under Statute, By-law or Rule.
  - (a) Where the Council delegates to one of its members, a committee or officer any power to act under a Statute, By-law or Rule, it shall give to the member, the committee or the officer written notice of the delegated power.
  - (b) The production of a written notice given pursuant to subsection (a) of this section is sufficient evidence that the member, committee or officer nominated in the notice has the power specified in it.

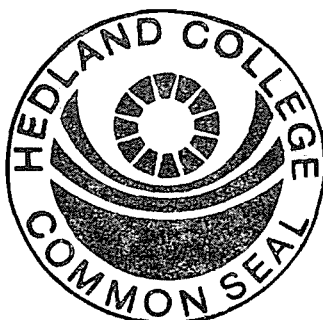

Statute No. 3.

The College Seal.

1. Form. The form of the Common Seal of the College is—



2. Location. The Administrative Officer shall hold the Seal in safe custody and make it available for use as authorized by this Statute.
3. Documents on which to be used.
  - (a) The Administrative Officer may affix the Seal to the following documents—
    - (i) academic certificates granted or conferred by the Council;
    - (ii) Statutes, By-laws and Rules made by the Council; and
    - (iii) such classes of documents as are approved by a resolution of the Council.
  - (b) Where a document required to be under the Seal relates to matters which the Chairman, Deputy Chairman or Director considers are formal or of special urgency the Chairman, Deputy Chairman or Director, as the case may be, may direct that the Seal be affixed to that document. The Chairman or Director authorizing the use of the Seal under this Clause shall report the circumstances to the Council at the first opportunity.
  - (c) Except as is provided in Section 3 Clauses (a) and (b) of this Statute the Seal shall only be used by the authority of the Council.
4. Affixing of the Seal.
  - (a) Except as hereinafter provided, where the Seal is affixed to a document pursuant to Section 3 of this Statute—
    - (i) every document to which the Seal is affixed shall be signed by the Chairman or the Director and countersigned by the Administrative Officer or by some other person appointed by the Council for the purpose;
    - (ii) whenever the Seal is affixed to a document the following sealing clause shall be inserted at the end of the document:

“The Common Seal of Hedland College was hereto affixed on the..... day of..... 19.... by the authority of the Council (or the Chairman or Director as the case requires).”

- (b) Where the Seal is affixed to academic certificates granted or conferred by the Council—
- (i) the academic certificate shall contain in an appropriate place a clause of the following form—  
“Given under our hand and seal”
  - (ii) the date of affixing shall be written in the appropriate place on the academic certificate;
  - (iii) the affixing shall be attested by the Chairman and the Director;
  - (iv) the Council may, by resolution, from time to time determine either generally or in any particular case or cases that in relation to any certificate of an award to which the Seal is affixed the signature of the Chairman or the Director may be affixed by some mechanical means and be as a facsimile of those persons' signatures in such manner as may be specified in the Council's resolution.

5. Register. The Administrative Officer shall maintain a Register of the use of the Common Seal in which he shall cause to be recorded, in respect of each document to which the Seal is affixed, particulars of the nature of the document, its date, the authority for it and the name and title of any persons signing and countersigning the document as required by this Statute.

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HEDLAND COLLEGE.

Statute No. 4.

The Council.

1. Definition. In this Statute unless the contrary intention appears—  
“meeting” means a meeting of the Council and “secretary” means the person so designated from time to time by the Council.
2. Calling of meetings.
  - (a) Ordinary meetings shall be held on such dates as the Council determines and publishes in the College Handbook.
  - (b) The Chairman or, in his absence, the Deputy Chairman may, or any four members may, by notice in writing given to the Secretary, call a special meeting to be held, for a purpose specified in the notice, on such a date within a period of fourteen days after the notice as the Secretary shall determine.
  - (c) The Secretary shall fix the time of day and place for a meeting.
  - (d) The Secretary shall, at least seven days before a meeting, give notice of the date, time and place of, and the agenda for, the meeting.
3. Conduct of meetings.
  - (a) A Council shall not transact business at a meeting unless a quorum is present.
  - (b) If at the expiration of half an hour from the time fixed for the commencement of a meeting a quorum is not present, the Chairman or in his absence the Deputy Chairman or in his absence the majority of members present, or any member present alone, or in the absence of the Chairman and all the members, the Secretary, may declare the meeting closed and the business which could have been transacted had there been a quorum at the meeting, may be placed on the agenda of the next ordinary meeting with precedence over other items on that agenda.
  - (c) The Council may adjourn any meeting to a later date.
  - (d) All proceedings of the Council and its Committees shall be minuted and permanently recorded.

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HEDLAND COLLEGE.

Statute No. 5.

The Director.

1. Duties and responsibilities.
  - (a) The powers and duties of the Director shall be exercised and performed subject to the Statutes and By-laws and Rules and to the resolutions of Council.
  - (b) The Director is responsible for the academic, administrative, and other business of the College.



- (c) The Director shall—
- (i) promote the interests and further the development of the College; and
  - (ii) exercise general supervision over all persons in the service of the College and over the welfare and discipline of students.
2. Enrolment responsibilities.
- (a) The Director may refuse en enrolment as a student of any person if the Director considers that—
    - (i) the person is not capable of benefiting from the course or subject in which the enrolment is sought; or
    - (ii) the enrolment or if the continued enrolment of the student would be prejudicial to the efficient operation of the College or to any of its programs or activities.
  - (b) The Director may require a student to withdraw from the College if he considers that the student's progress toward completion of a Course is unsatisfactory or if the continued enrolment of the student would be prejudicial to the efficient operation of the College or to any of its programs or activities.
  - (c) If the Director refuses an enrolment or requires a student to withdraw he shall so report to the Council.
  - (d) The Council may allow an enrolment which the Director has refused or reinstate a student whom the Director has required to withdraw from the College.
3. Membership of committees. The Director is *ex officio* a member of every Board or Committee within the College other than a Committee of Council and may, if requested or he considers it desirable, preside at any meeting of such a Board or Committee.

#### HEDLAND COLLEGE.

##### Statute No. 6.

##### Election of Elective Members of the Council.

1. Introductory.
  - (a) The staff members of the College and the enrolled student of the College to be appointed members of the Council pursuant to the Act shall be elected in accordance with this Statute.
  - (b) An election of elective members (other than in respect of a casual vacancy) shall be held at a time to be fixed by the Administrative Officer not less than one month prior to a vacancy of such members occurring.
  - (c) For the purposes of this Statute "staff" means all full-time employees of the College Council and "student" means a person enrolled in an approved course of study as defined in the College's Enrolment Rules and whose enrolment is valid and current under the terms of those Rules.
  - (d) The term "Administrative Officer" wherever it appears in this Statute means the Administrative Officer or a member of the Administrative staff appointed by the Director to carry out any of the duties of the Administrative Officer.
2. Rolls.
  - (a) The Administrative Officer shall keep separate rolls of—
    - (i) the members of the staff of the College as defined in section 1 (c); and
    - (ii) the enrolled students of the College.
  - (b) Each roll shall contain:—
    - (A) in respect of section 2 (a) (i):—
      - (i) the full name and the departmental address of each person;
      - (ii) qualification for entry of each such person;
    - (B) In respect of section 2 (a) (ii) the full name and residential address of each student enrolled.
  - (c) For each election the roll of persons entitled to vote at that election shall be the roll as at 4 p.m. on the day on which nominations for that election close, provided that up to the time fixed for the close of voting the Administrative Officer may add to the roll the name of any person otherwise qualified to vote but whose name was inadvertently omitted from the roll.
  - (d) The Administrative Officer shall from time to time make any correction to a roll which may be necessary to ensure its accuracy. Subject to any such correction the inclusion of a person's name on a roll shall be conclusive evidence of his right to vote at an election, and the absence of a person's name shall be conclusive evidence that he has no right to vote at an election.
3. Administrative Officer to conduct election.
  - (a) The Administrative Officer shall conduct every election, and he may appoint such other persons to assist him as he shall deem necessary.

- (b) Subject to this Statute and to any Rules made in respect of this Statute, the Administrative Officer shall have power and authority to determine all procedural matters relating to an election.
4. Notice of election.
- (a) When an election is to be held, the Administrative Officer, shall publish on an official notice board of the College designated as such by the Administrative Officer, and by such other means, if any, as he may deem desirable, a notice which shall—
- (i) state that an election of staff members or of enrolled students to be appointed to the Council, as the case may be, is to be held on a specified date;
  - (ii) state the number of persons of either category to be elected;
  - (iii) invite nominations of qualified persons for election and specify the form in which nominations shall be made;
  - (iv) fix a date and time by which nominations shall reach the Administrative Officer;
  - (v) in all matters of timing conform to the intervals specified from time to time in the College's Electoral Rules.
- (b) The Administrative Officer shall send to each elector a copy of such notice as is published in accordance with section 4 (a) of this Statute.
5. Manner of nomination.
- (a) A nomination of a candidate shall be made by delivering the nomination paper in the prescribed form to the Administrative Officer at his office by the appointed time.
- (b) A nomination paper shall be signed by the candidate and by—
- (i) in the case of an election of members by the staff, two persons qualified to vote at the election;
  - (ii) in the case of an election of a member by the student body, five persons qualified to vote at the election.
- (c) Only one candidate may be nominated on a nomination paper.
- (d) After the time fixed for the closing of nominations, a nomination may not be withdrawn.
6. Result if number nominated equals number to be elected. If the number of valid nominations is fewer than the number of persons who may be appointed, the Administrative Officer shall declare the persons nominated to be elected, and shall notify the Council that the electorate concerned has failed to nominate a sufficient number of persons.
7. Result if insufficient nominations. If the number of valid nominations is fewer than the number of persons who may be appointed, the Administrative Officer shall declare the persons nominated to be elected, and shall notify the Council that the electorate concerned has failed to nominate a sufficient number of persons.
8. Result if more nominated than to be elected. If the number of valid nominations received exceeds the number of persons who may be appointed, an election shall be held.
9. Voter not to part with voting paper. A voter shall not before or after voting permit a voting paper issued to him to be used by any other persons or part with it otherwise than placing it in a ballot box or by posting or causing it to be delivered to the Administrative Officer.
10. Secret ballot. Voting shall be by secret ballot.
11. Times for voting. Ballot boxes shall be available from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on each day of the week excluding Saturdays and Sundays preceding the closing date for receipt of voting papers. Ballot boxes shall be sealed immediately prior to being set out for the receipt of voting papers and shall remain sealed until counting commences. Each candidate or a person nominated by him may be present at the sealing of the ballot boxes.
12. Secrecy. The Administrative Officer or any scrutineer or other person concerned with the conduct of an election shall not in any way disclose nor aid in disclosing in what manner any voter voted.
13. Scrutineers. A candidate may appoint not more than two scrutineers.
14. Election not to be invalidated by informalities. An election shall not be invalidated by reason of—
- (a) inadvertent failure to send any person qualified to vote any notice or ballot paper;
  - (b) failure to do any act at or by the required time;
  - (c) any defect in the appointment of a person who acts as a scrutineer.
15. Right of appeal. A candidate shall have the right of appeal to the Chairman within seven days of the declaration of the poll should he feel that the conduct of the election was in any way contrary to this Statute. The Chairman shall have full power to make such enquiry as he deems necessary into the matter complained of, and after such enquiry may confirm the election or annul the election and direct that a fresh election be held, or give such other directions as he considers necessary. The decision of the Chairman after hearing such appeal shall be final and conclusive.

## HEDLAND COLLEGE.

## Statute No. 7.

## Student Association.

1. Definition. In this Statute "the association" means the "student association" referred to in Section 44 of the Act.
2. Eligibility for membership. All enrolled students of the College are eligible to be members of the Association.
3. Interim Council.
  - (a) The College Council shall appoint forthwith a Student Association Interim Council.
  - (b) Until the Association Council is appointed, the Interim Council shall have all the powers, authorities, duties and obligations that the Association Council would have on appointment.
  - (c) When the Association Council is appointed, the Student Association Interim Council shall be dissolved.
4. Constitution.
  - (a) On appointment, the Student Association Interim Council shall adopt for the Association, a constitution that is approved by the College Council and that includes provision for the appointment of the Association Council as the governing authority of the Association.
  - (b) The Association may amend its constitution with the approval of the College Council but not otherwise.
  - (c) The powers, duties and functions of the Association are as set out in its constitution from time to time.
5. Fees. The fees payable to the Association by its members are such fees as are approved by the College Council after report and recommendation of the Association Council.

## HEDLAND COLLEGE

## By-law No. 1.

## College Land By-law.

1. Application. This by-law applies to all land vested in the College for the purposes of the Act.
2. Definitions. In this by-law unless the contrary intention appears—
  - "drive" means ride or drive a vehicle or an animal;
  - "driver" means a person riding, driving or in control of a vehicle or an animal;
  - "park" means park a vehicle or an animal; and "the land" means any land vested in the College for the purposes of the Act.
3. Provisions.
  - (1) A person shall not trespass on the land.
  - (2) Where an authorized officer reasonably suspects that a person is trespassing on the land the officer may request the person—
    - (a) to give his name and address to the officer; and
    - (b) to leave the land.
  - (3) Where a person receives a request pursuant to Clause 3 (2) of this by-law that person shall immediately comply with that request.
  - (4) A person shall not damage the land or any fixture, movable object or growth.
  - (5) A person shall not, without the permission of the Council, remove, interfere with, or climb on any fixture, movable or growth.
  - (6) A person shall not, without the permission of the Council—
    - (a) walk on or over any bed containing or being prepared for flowers or shrubs;
    - (b) walk on or over any lawn in contravention of any notice posted on it; or
    - (c) enter or walk on or over any section on which is posted a notice prohibiting persons from entering or walking on or over it.
  - (7) Except for some purpose of College business or College education, a person shall not bring a vehicle onto the land.

- (8) A person shall not, without the permission of the Council, bring an animal onto the land.
- (9) A person shall not, without the permission of the Council, park on any part of the land.
- (10) A driver or a person reasonably suspected by an authorized officer of having parked on any part of the land shall give his name and address to the authorized officer if he so requests.
- (11) A person shall not drive at a speed exceeding 40 km per hour.
- (12) Where the Council has fixed a speed limit for any specified road and has posted a notice on that road specifying that limit, a person shall not drive on that road at any higher speed.
- (13) A person shall not drive in a dangerous or careless manner or without reasonable consideration for other persons in the vicinity.
- (14) An authorized officer may, without assigning any reason, remove from the land or part of it any vehicle or animal parked in contravention of this by-law.
- (15) A driver shall remove his vehicle or animal from the land or part of it on being directed to do so by an authorized officer.
- (16) A person shall not park on a grassed area unless specifically so directed by an authorized officer.
- (17) A person shall not—
  - (a) spit on any path or on or in any building or erection;
  - (b) use abusive, insulting, obscene, blasphemous or indecent language;
  - (c) behave in any offensive, indecent or improper manner; or
  - (d) damage or deface any furniture or furnishings.
- (18) An authorized officer may remove from the land any person contravening Clause 17 of this by-law.
- (19) A person shall not throw, place, deposit or leave on the land any rubbish, paper, bottle, can, glass (broken or otherwise) or litter except in a receptacle specifically provided by the Council for the receipt of the particular material.
- (20) A person shall not, without the permission of the Council—
  - (a) mark or affix any matter to any part of the land or any fixture, movable, or growth on the land; or
  - (b) distribute or give out any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement or any matter in writing.
- (21) Where posters are permitted by the Council they may be placed only on notice boards approved by the Council.
- (22) The Council may prohibit the holding of any meeting.
- (23) Where the Council prohibits the holding of a meeting a person shall not conduct, promote or take part in such a meeting.
- (24) A person shall not interrupt a class, lecture or meeting by noisy or unseemly behaviour.
- (25) Except at such times and on such parts of the land as the Director may authorize in writing, a person shall not bring intoxicating liquor onto, or keep or consume it on, the land.
- (26) A person shall not—
  - (a) gamble;
  - (b) play a game of hazard or chance; or
  - (c) sell or purchase or offer for sale or to purchase on or in College land or property an interest in or a ticket or coupon for, or which purports to be for, a consultation, sweep, horse-race, or lottery.
- (27) A person shall not, without the permission of the Council—
  - (a) kill or injure an animal other than vermin, a dangerous animal, or a poisonous reptile except in the course of duly authorized study in a College laboratory;
  - (b) possess or discharge a firearm or fireworks;
  - (c) pollute or bathe in a lake or pool;
  - (d) light a fire; or
  - (e) throw or discharge a stone or missile.
- (28) Where a person is doing anything for which written authority is required, the person shall, on request by an authorized officer or a police officer, produce the authority to that officer and give his name and address to him.
- (29) A person who commits a breach of this by-law is, in addition to any other legal liability, liable to a penalty of fifty dollars (\$50).
- (30) Any fines not paid within sixty (60) days may be recovered under the due process of the law.

## HEDLAND COLLEGE.

## By-law No. 2.

## Student Disciplinary By-law.

1. Definition. In this by-law, unless the contrary intention appears—  
“Board” means the Board of Discipline.
2. Reporting of students. A student may be reported by any member of staff to the appropriate Head of School, for any breach of discipline or misconduct. Where misconduct occurs in the library, the appropriate Head of School is the principal Librarian.
3. Suspension and fines.
  - (a) Where, in a staff member's opinion, a student's behaviour is prejudicial to the efficient conduct of a class the staff member may suspend the student for the rest of that period. Where misconduct occurs in the Library, a student may be suspended from all Library privileges for twenty-four (24) hours. Any breach of discipline which resulted in a temporary suspension of this nature should be reported to the appropriate Head of School in writing not later than within twenty-four (24) hours of the suspension being imposed.
  - (b) On hearing the complaint a Head of School may fine the student up to \$5 and/or suspend him from class attendance for periods up to one (1) week, if in his opinion the student's conduct is likely to be prejudicial to efficient teaching. If the Head of School feels that a more severe penalty is justified, he may refer the case to the Director.
  - (c) The Director may fine the student any amount up to \$20. He may also suspend the student for any period up to four (4) weeks if, in his opinion, the student's presence in class is likely to prejudice efficient teaching. If, in the Director's opinion, a more severe penalty is warranted then he may refer the case to the Board within fourteen (14) days of the offence being reported to him.
4. Board of Discipline.
  - (a) The Board shall consist of the Director or his nominee as Chairman, two academic staff nominated by the Director and two students nominated by the Council of the Student Association. The decision of the Board shall be by simple majority. A quorum of the Board shall be three (3) but shall always include at least one (1) student member.
  - (b) The Board may fine a student up to \$50 and/or may suspend him for twelve months or for any shorter period. The suspension shall include the withdrawal of the right to sit for any examination held during the period of suspension. If the offence occurs after the end of the academic year, the Board may suspend the student for any period up to the end of the following calendar year.
  - (c) Where the Board finds that the breach of discipline is sufficiently serious to warrant stronger action or if a second offence has been reported after the student has been notified of an action pending against him, the Board may expel the student. The student may apply for re-admission not less than twelve months after the date of expulsion. Such application must be made to the Director, who may refer it to the Board.
  - (d) In addition to cases referred to it by the Director, the Board may also hear appeals from students against disciplinary decisions of a Head of School or the Director. Notice of appeal should be lodged with the Administrative Officer within seven days of the student being informed of the penalty.
  - (e) The person against whose decision an appeal is being heard shall not be a member of the Board but shall be replaced by a nominee.
  - (f) A student, who must appear in person, may call evidence, and may, at the discretion of the Board, be represented by any other person not being a qualified legal practitioner. In cases where a student is represented by another person, the Board may co-opt an associate member who shall not have voting power.
5. Examinations. Any person controlling a College examination may report a student for misconduct to the Administrative Officer. If, in the opinion of the person controlling the examination, the student's conduct is prejudicial to the satisfactory performance of the other students present, the student may be dismissed from the examination. All cases shall be reported by the Administrative Officer to the Director, together with his recommendation. The Director may then decide whether or not to allow the results of the particular examination to stand. In addition, he may also fine the student an amount not exceeding \$20.
6. Advice to students.
  - (a) Wherever practicable, a student shall be informed orally by the Head of School as soon as possible, of the nature of any complaints made against the student. Confirmation in writing shall be forwarded by certified mail to the address shown on the student's enrolment form. In all cases the person or Board hearing the complaint against the student, shall give the student the opportunity of answering the charges laid.
  - (b) A student shall be informed orally, as soon as possible, of all penalties and suspensions imposed. The student shall also be immediately informed in writing by certified mail to the address shown on the student's enrolment form. Failure to pay a fine within twenty-eight (28) days shall constitute

a breach of discipline and a further penalty may be imposed by the Director within the limits prescribed above. Alternatively the Director may refer the matter to the Board.

- (c) In any case of appeal to be heard before the Board or Council the student shall be given notice in writing at least fourteen (14) days prior to the hearing. This shall be sent by certified mail to the address shown on the student's enrolment form.

#### 7. Role of Council.

- (a) All fines and penalties imposed shall be reported to the next meeting of the Council. The proceedings of any Board meeting shall also be tabled before the Council.
- (b) The Council may hear appeals against decisions in any cases which have been before the Board only and may confirm, quash or vary any such decisions within the limits laid down above. Appeals shall be made in writing to the Council through the Administrative Officer within fourteen (14) days of the Board decision.

8. Payment of fines. Any fines not paid within sixty (60) days may be recovered under the due process of the law.

9. Prosecution under a Land By-law. Where, under any College Land By-law, a student has been prosecuted for an alleged breach of that By-law, he cannot be proceeded against under this By-law in respect of a complaint of which the particulars are substantially the same as the particulars of the alleged breach under the Land By-law.
