- (a) The construction of a five hundred millimetre nominal diameter steel water main below ground and approximately three hundred and seventy metres in length complete with valve pits and all other necessary apparatus commencing within the Mt. Hawthorn reservoir site \uparrow 15555 and thence proceeding in a general northerly direction across the reservoir site to McDonald Street thence proceeding in a general westerly direction along McDonald Street to Stoneham Street and terminating thereat.
- (b) The construction of a three hundred millimetre nominal diameter steel water main below ground and approximately two hundred metres in length complete with valve pits and all other necessary apparatus commencing at the terminating point in (a) above and thence proceeding in a general northerly direction along Stoneham Street to Hector Street and terminating thereat, as shown on Plan M.W.A. 17968.

Workers' Compensation and Assistance Act 1981.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 160 of the Workers' Compensation and Assistance Act 1981 that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of that Section; and whereas the Bank of New South Wales of 109 St. George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the Section has duly, in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the Section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, a bond of Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25 000.00) given by the Bank charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt the Bank of New South Wales of 109 St. George's Terrace, Perth, from the operation of section 160 of the Workers' Compensation and Assistance Act 1981 for a period expiring on the 31st day of March, 1984.

1. Subject to the proviso in paragraph 6 of this Schedule the driving and extraction of the piling, sheeting and piles subject to this Order shall be carried out only at such times and with such conditions as the Commissioner of Public Health may direct.
2. The equipment and techniques used shall be the quietest practicable in the circumstances of the case.
3. All practicable means shall be employed to control the emission of noise and vibration from driving and extractions and from any equipment and process associated therewith.
4. All practicable means shall be employed to ensure that vibrations from the operations do not imperil any building or structure.
5. So far as is practicable effective steps shall be taken to prevent the exposure of the ears of any person, whether or not employed at, or working at the operations, to any level of noise which is likely to be injurious to his hearing.
6. In this Order "practicable" means reasonably practicable having regard, among other things, to local conditions and circumstances, to the current state of technical knowledge and to the financial implications, and "practicable means" include the design, installation, maintenance and manner of operation of plant and machinery, and the design, construction and maintenance of acoustic screens and structures and acoustic damping techniques applies to the piling; provided that the test of "practicable means" and the application of any limitation as to the times at which operations are carried out are applied only so far as compatible with any duty imposed by law and only so far as compatible with safety and safe working conditions, and with the exigences of any emergency or unforeseeable circumstances.
7. Advance written notice shall be given to occupiers of premises located within a minimum of a 100 metre radius from the site of proposed pile driving activities as to expected date of commencement, intended time of operation and expected completion date. A sign to this effect shall be clearly displayed on site.

- (a) sets fire to any rubbish at a site set aside for the deposit of rubbish, except where the rubbish is in a properly constructed incinerator; or
- (b) removes any matter or thing whatsoever from a site set aside for the disposal of rubbish without the written permission of the local authority;
- (c) deposits or disposes of any rubbish at a place other than a place set aside by the local authority for that purpose;
- (d) deposits or disposes of motor vehicle bodies at a place other than a place set aside by the local authority for that purpose;
- (e) deposits motor vehicle bodies on land set aside by the Council for the purpose without the payment of a fee as follows—

Motor Vehicle Bodies:—

arising from commercial or industrial premises (\$10.00) per vehicle body;

arising from residential premises within the Murray Shire (Nil);

commits an offence.

Important Information Relating to Your Responsibility as a Landholder in the Donnybrook-Balingup Shire.

With reference to section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954-1979, you are required to carry out fire prevention work on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the provisions of this order.

This work must be carried out by 1 December 1982, and kept maintained throughout the summer months until 31 March 1983.

8. Fuel Drums:—All grass and other inflammable materials must be cleared from areas where fuel drums, either empty or containing fuel are stored or intended to be stored. The cleared area is to extend for a distance of 3 metres completely surrounding the fuel drums.
9. Beverley Townsite:—On or before 30 November 1982, a firebreak 2.2 metres wide completely free of all inflammable material shall be provided inside and along all external boundaries. Additionally, all lots of 1.62 ha or less shall be cleared of all inflammable material.

The Municipality of the Shire of Wanneroo.

By-laws Relating to Fire Control Order.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on 28 April 1982 to make and submit to the Governor for approval the following By-laws:—

1. Interpretation:—

- (a) "Council" means the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Wanneroo.
- (b) "Firebreak period" means the period of time between the 30th day of November in any year until the 26th day of April inclusive in the following year.
- (c) "Firebreak" means the land from which all inflammable material (which includes vegetation) has been removed and on which no inflammable material (which includes vegetation) is permitted during the firebreak period.

2. Subject to By-law 3 hereof all owners or occupiers of land within the municipality of the Shire of Wanneroo shall prior to the commencement of the firebreak period or within fourteen (14) days of becoming the owner or occupier should this occur within the firebreak period establish and thereafter maintain during the firebreak period firebreaks of the dimensions prescribed as follows:—

- (i) Two (2) metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of parcels of land 2 000 square metres or under.
- (ii) Three (3) metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of parcels of land over 2 000 square metres unless the Council has otherwise directed to the owner or occupier in writing.
- (iii) A minimum of ten (10) metres wide immediately surrounding flammable liquids storage sites including fuel dumps and ramps.
- (iv) Three (3) metres wide immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

3. If the owner or occupier considers it impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks or remove inflammable material from land as required by these By-laws the owner or occupier may apply in writing to the Council not less than fourteen (14) days prior to the commencement of the firebreak period for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land.

4. On receiving such an application the Council may refuse the same or may grant permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land and may set out in the notice granting such permission the time and the manner in which such alternative firebreaks are to be established and maintained and the owner or occupier shall thereupon comply with the requirements of the notice.

5. If the requirements of these By-laws are carried out by burning, such burning shall be carried out in accordance with the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954 as amended and any regulations, By-laws and notices made thereunder.

6. On failure of compliance with these By-laws by any owner or occupier of land within the municipality of the Shire of Wanneroo the Council may by its workmen and subcontractors enter the land and carry out all works and do all things necessary as would have been required pursuant to these By-laws by the owner or occupier thereof to comply with these By-laws and to charge to the owner or occupier thereof the Council's reasonable costs in so doing.

7. The owner or occupier of the land shall comply with the lawful directions of the Council or its duly authorised officers given for the purposes of administering the Bush Fires Act 1954 as amended, the regulations and By-laws made thereunder. An owner or occupier of land to whom a direction has been given and who fails or neglects in any due respect to comply with the direction commits an offence.

8. Any owner or occupier committing an offence under these By-laws is liable to a fine of \$400.00 and in addition shall pay the costs incurred by the Council in performing the works pursuant to By-law 6 of these By-laws.

One culvert is to cross Railway Avenue and is to be approximately thirty metres long. The second is to cross Abbey Road and is to be approximately forty metres long.
- (ii) The relocating, deepening, widening and straightening of the remaining open earth sections of drain. These improved sections of drain are to have a bottom width of approximately 4.0 metres, side slopes of approximately one vertical to one horizontal, depths varying from 1.8 to 3.0 metres and a total length of approximately three hundred and eighty metres.
- (iii) The construction of a reinforced concrete drop structure.

Works are to be complete with all apparatus and things connected therewith and includes all land acquisitions arising therefrom and restoration and reinstatement where required.

Actual construction works will take place in or adjacent to the following properties:—

Lots 6, 7, 146, 147 and 148 Railway Avenue, Lots 157 and 158 Abbey Road, Lots 80, 81, 82 and 83 Marian Avenue, Lot 3 Dale Road, Lots 201, 202, 203 and 204 Forest Court, the South Western Railway Reserve, Railway Avenue (itself) Abbey Road (itself) and various pieces of land which have already been set aside for drainage purposes.

It should be noted that not all portions of the improvement works will be carried out at the same time. Where improvements are deferred, flow will continue to discharge down the existing watercourse which will be subject only to normal maintenance and minor improvement. The timing of the construction of the future work has not yet been determined, but will be dependent on further increases in peak flow rates.

IT is hereby notified for general information that, in accordance with the provisions of the Dairy Industry Act 1973-1980, the Dairy Industry Authority of Western Australia has fixed the undermentioned prices and rates—

for market milk and the treatment and transport of market milk;

for special products milk produced in dairy areas within the State of Western Australia for the manufacture of the following classes of dairy produce which are sold within the State of Western Australia and which are prescribed in the Dairy Industry Regulations, 1977:—

PASTEURISED CREAM,
YOGURT,
FLAVOURED MILK;

and for special products milk produced in dairy areas within the State of Western Australia which is sold for human consumption within the State of Western Australia in areas not constituted as dairy areas within the meaning of the Dairy Industry Act 1973-1980;

to be effective in the undermentioned dairy areas and districts as from September 1, 1982.

- (a) METROPOLITAN DAIRY AREA,
- (b) SOUTH-WEST COASTAL DAIRY AREA—
Shires of Harvey, Murray and Waroona,
- (c) SOUTH COASTAL DAIRY AREA.

DAIRY INDUSTRY ACT 1973—*continued*.

MINIMUM PRICES TO DAIRYMEN

Minimum price to be paid to dairymen by the Authority at the dairy for market milk containing not less than 11·75 per cent total milk solids as determined by Australian Standard Method 1084–1974, Section 3, in relation to a representative composite sample taken over a testing period; and containing not less than 3·2 per cent milk fat as determined by the Babcock or Milko-Tester methods in relation to the same representative composite sample at the rate of 27·98 cents per litre.

Minimum price to be paid to dairymen by the Authority at the dairy for special products milk containing not less than 11·75 per cent total milk solids as determined by the Australian Standard Method 1084–1974, Section 3, in relation to a representative composite sample taken over a testing period; and containing not less than 3·2 per cent milk fat as determined by the Babcock or Milko-Tester methods in relation to the same representative composite sample at the rate of 17·25 cents per litre.

MAXIMUM PRICES TO AUTHORITY

Maximum price to be paid to the Authority by dairy produce factories for market milk at the rate of 30·18 cents per litre.

Maximum price to be paid to the Authority by dairy produce factories for special products milk at the rate of 28·00 cents per litre.

MAXIMUM TRANSPORT CHARGES (Market Milk only)

Maximum charge for transport of market milk from dairy produce factories outside the metropolitan area to dairy produce factories in the metropolitan area at the rate of 1·61 cents per litre.

OTHER CHARGES (Market Milk only)

Maximum charge for treatment, excluding pasteurisation and packing, of market milk at dairy produce factories outside the metropolitan area at the rate of 1·86 cents per litre.

Maximum price to be charged at dairy produce factories in the metropolitan area for market milk received for treatment from dairy produce factories outside the metropolitan area at the rate of 35·32 cents per litre.

ACCEPTANCE AND DISPOSAL OF MILK BY THE AUTHORITY

It is further determined that, where milk delivered by a dairyman—

is found to contain less than 11·75 per cent total milk solids, as determined by the aforementioned Standard Method during any testing period on a second or succeeding occasion after January 1 1982 or a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of that testing period will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found to contain less than 3·2 per cent milk fat, as determined by one of the aforementioned methods during any testing period on a second or succeeding occasion after January 1 1982 or a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of that testing period will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain anti-biotic on a second occasion after January 1 1982 or a second occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for that one day will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain anti-biotic on a third or succeeding occasion after January 1 1982 or on a third or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by the dairyman for the duration of that testing period in which that day occurs will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added water on the first occasion after January 1 1982 or on the first occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for that one day will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added water on a second or succeeding occasion after January 1 1982 or on a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of the testing period in which that day occurs will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added solids on the first occasion after January 1 1982 or on the first occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk for a minimum of two testing periods.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added solids on a second or succeeding occasion after January 1 1982 or a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk for a minimum of four testing periods.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day after January 1 1982 or on any day in a subsequent quota year, to have a bacterial count of over 50 000 bacteria per millilitre not less than 10 days—

after an initial examination indicating over 100 000 bacteria per millilitre;

or, after any two initial examinations within the quota year indicating over 100 000 bacteria per millilitre;

or, after two consecutive initial examinations indicating over 50 000 bacteria per millilitre—

milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk as follows:

on the first occurrence in any quota year—for that one day;

on the second occurrence in any quota year—for that day and for the two closest days within the same test period;

on the third or succeeding occasion in any quota year—for the duration of the testing period in which that day occurs.

Where milk delivered by a dairyman is acceptable as market milk or special products milk and the abovementioned prices for market milk or special products milk apply—

market milk or special products milk delivered by a dairyman to the Authority is accepted by the Authority at the dairyman's registered dairy produce premises.

market milk or special products milk delivered by a dairyman and accepted by the Authority is disposed of by the Authority to the dairy produce factory at the point of acceptance by the Authority.

DAIRY INDUSTRY ACT 1973—*continued*

PROVIDED THAT nothing in the Dairy Industry Act 1973-1980, requires the Authority to accept all or any milk delivered to it by any person; and milk delivered to and accepted by the Authority may be disposed of by the Authority to milk vendors or other persons.

The Maximum Prices—

- to be charged by milk vendors to milk vendors and milk distributors;
- to be charged by milk distributors to milk shops;
- to be charged consumers;

shall be at the undermentioned rates and shall apply in the dairy areas and districts mentioned for market milk which is sold in—

- Ten- or Twenty-litre Bags-in-Crate;
- Six Hundred Millilitre Bottles;
- Six Hundred Millilitre Containers Other than Bottles;
- One-litre Containers Other than Bottles;
- Two-litre Containers Other than Bottles;
- Three Hundred Millilitre Containers.

METROPOLITAN DAIRY AREA

Districts within the Metropolitan Dairy Area INCLUDING THE DISTRICTS OF Shire of Kalamunda (western portion), Shire of Mundaring (western portion), Swan (southern portion) and Wanneroo (southern portion) as described hereunder; BUT EXCLUDING THE DISTRICTS OF Cockburn No. 137, Shire of Kalamunda (with the exception of the western portion), Shire of Mundaring (with the exception of the western portion), Shire of Serpentine-Jarrahdale, Swan (with the exception of the southern portion) and Wanneroo (with the exception of the southern portion).

- 2A. A person who is a member of the staff of the University other than a person who is primarily a student is not eligible for election as a member of the Academic Council under section 2 (c) or 2 (d) of this Statute.

Statute No. 8—Interpretation.

Statute 8 shall be amended by the insertion after section 5 (d) of the following section 5 (e)—

- (e) A reference to a person who is “primarily a student” is a reference to a person who the Vice-Chancellor determines is primarily a student.

Statute No. 9—Board of Part I Studies.

Statute 9 shall be amended by the insertion after section 3 of the following new section 3A—

- 3A. A person who is a member of the staff of the University other than a person who is

primarily a student is not eligible for election as a member of the Board under section 3 (g) of this Statute.

Statute No. 12—Board of Research and Postgraduate Studies.

Statute 12 shall be amended by the insertion after section 5 of the following new section 5A—

- 5A. A person who is a member of the staff of the University other than a person who is primarily a student is not eligible for election as a member of the Board under section 5 (e) of this Statute.

MURDOCH UNIVERSITY.

Statute No. 18—Patents.

STATUTE No. 18 shall be amended by the deletion of Clauses 1-10 and the substitution of the following.

1. In this Statute, unless the context otherwise requires:

“Act” means the Commonwealth Patents Act 1952 as from time to time amended or re-enacted;

“Invention” means an invention which is capable of being made the subject of a patent or group of related patents under the Act;

“Inventor” does not include a person merely importing an invention from abroad;

“Staff” includes both academic and non-academic staff.

2. Any invention made by a member of the staff of the University in the course of his employment or work at the University, or by a student in the course of his studies or work at the University, in each case including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, when at the University or with the University's materials, shall belong to and be the property of the University.

3. The inventor of an invention referred to in section 2 shall promptly notify the University of the invention by notice in writing to the Secretary.

4. At any time within one year after notice is received by the Secretary under section 3, the University may cause applications for one or more patents to be applied for in the name of the inventor and there-after cause the benefit of the application or applications and any subsequently registered patent or patents to be assigned to the University or its nominee at the expense of the University but without payment to the inventor. The inventor shall provide all necessary assistance for any such application to be made and the registration and assignment to be completed. If the University does not cause at least one patent to be applied for within the abovementioned one year, the University shall be deemed to have waived its rights to the invention.

5. If an invention is made by a member of the staff of the University or a student in circumstances other than those described in section 2, he shall notify the University of those circumstances by notice in writing to the Secretary.

6. The University may, if the Senate thinks fit, exploit any invention of which the University is the owner under this Statute, in such manner as the Senate may decide.

7. If the University exploits an invention and receives a cash return from such exploitation (in this section called “proceeds”) then such proceeds shall be applied in relation to each calendar year as follows—

(a) Until all costs incurred by the University in applying for and obtaining any related patent or patents and exploiting and developing the invention and current costs for that year have been recovered, in payment of 15 per cent of all proceeds to the University for all such costs.

(b) Any additional proceeds in any year shall be applied so that two-thirds are retained by the University and one-third is paid to the inventor.

8. The time of payment of an inventor's share of proceeds under section 7 shall be as determined by the University from time to time but shall not be later than three months after the end of the relevant year.

9. If the University does not exploit an invention within three years after it is first notified of the invention under section 3, the inventor shall have the option to purchase the invention and the related patent rights from the University for an amount equal to 50 per cent of the University's costs in relation to any application for any related patent or patents and any exploitation or attempted exploitation of the invention prior to the date of purchase. Such option shall be exercisable by notice in writing to the Secretary.

10. Notwithstanding the provisions of this Statute, the Senate may from time to time enter into a specific agreement with any inventor in relation to one or more particular inventions on terms differing from those set out in this Statute.

MURDOCH UNIVERSITY.

Statute No. 20—Examinations.

1. In this Statute, the expression “Board or Committee” means the Academic Council and includes all other Boards and Committees constituted within the University.

2. Regulations may be made under this Statute in relation to any aspect of the assessment of a student's academic results or progress within the University and examination held within the University.

3. With the exceptions mentioned below, a student who is a member of a Board or Committee shall withdraw from any meeting of the Board or Committee of which he or she is a member during deliberations on any matter relating to the assessment of the academic results or progress of an individual student and he or she shall not participate in the deliberations of that Board or Committee in relation to such assessment except where—

- (a) the student member of the Board or Committee is also a full-time member of the academic staff; or
- (b) the student is a part-time member of the academic staff and the deliberations of the Board relate to the assessment of the results or progress of one or more students in any course in which he or she was teaching,

but neither of these exceptions shall apply where the assessment affects the student member of the Board or Committee personally.

4. With the exceptions mentioned below, no papers or information with respect to the assessment of the academic results or progress of an individual student, presented or to be presented to a Board or Committee, shall be made available or distributed to a student who is a member of that Board or Committee except where—

- (a) the student member of the Board or Committee is also a full-time member of the academic staff; or
- (b) the student is a part-time member of the academic staff and the deliberations of the Board relate to the assessment of the results or progress of one or more students in any course in which he or she was teaching.

but neither of these exceptions shall apply where the assessment affects the student member of the Board or Committee personally.

5. Notwithstanding the other terms of this Statute, a student may be appointed to a Board or Committee to consider an appeal by another student against a final assessment of a course where the grounds of appeal include grounds other than only a request for a second assessment of the student's performance.
