The Shire of Albany further resolves and determines that the existing By-laws are amended as follows:—

PART 1—General Sanitary Provisions.

By-laws 1C and 4A (1) are revoked.

PART IX—Offensive Trades.

1. The words "Schedule 'D'" at the end of paragraph 1 of By-law 3 are to be substituted with the words "the Offensive Trades (Fees) Regulations, 1976"
2. Schedule 'D' is revoked.

CLEAN AIR (SCHEDULED PREMISES) ORDER 1982.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

- Citation. 1. This Order may be cited as the Clean Air (Scheduled Premises) Order 1982.
- Commence-
ment. 2. This Order shall take effect on and from the day on which notice of this Order is published in the *Government Gazette*.
- Schedule
amended. 3. The Schedule to the Clean Air Act 1964-1981 is amended by removing therefrom the class of premises "concrete works" and by adding thereto, in the appropriate alphabetical sequence, the following—
"concrete batching plants, being premises where concrete is made or batched and loaded for transport to another site; "

CLEAN AIR ACT 1964-1981.

CLEAN AIR (CONTROL OF DUST IN CONCRETE PLANTS)

REGULATIONS 1982.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Clean Air (Control of Dust in Concrete Plants) Regulations 1982.
- Interpreta-
tion. 2. In these regulations unless the contrary intention appears—
"Act" means the Clean Air Act 1964;
"regulation" means one of these regulations.
- Application. 3. These regulations apply to any premises which for the purposes of the Act are scheduled premises within the following classifications—
(a) concrete batching plants;
(b) cement product manufacturing works.
- Duty to
prevent air
pollution. 4. A person who is the occupier of any premises to which these regulations apply shall—
(a) conduct any trade, industry or process; and
(b) operate any industrial plant or vehicle used in connection therewith,
in or on the scheduled premises by such practicable means as may be necessary to prevent or minimise air pollution.
- Particular
duties. 5. Without prejudice to the generality of regulation 4, a person who is the occupier of any premises to which these regulations apply shall, in relation to those premises and to any trade, industry or process conducted or industrial plant or vehicle used in or on those premises—
(a) ensure that all surfaces intended to carry vehicular traffic are properly graded and sealed and capable of being swept and guide posts or other suitable barriers are erected along the edges of the sealed surfaces to prevent traffic movement on any unsealed areas of the premises;
(b) take all practicable means to ensure that all concrete trucks are effectively washed down after loading and prior to leaving the premises and that the washings from the concrete trucks and any spillages are channelled to a pit of ample size in which the slurry will be kept wet at all times, and vehicular access to the channels prevented at all times;
(c) ensure that where cement or fly-ash is received by pneumatic filling line from a filling tanker, fabric filter dust collectors of adequate size to cater for the maximum air volume from a filling tanker are installed on cement or fly-ash storage silos and the outlet air from the fabric filter dust collector is ducted to within 1 metre of ground level and that after the coming into operation of these regulations the minimum fabric area used for new or replacement fabric filters, on shaker type filters is not less than 23 square metres or of equivalent efficiency;
(d) ensure that level indicators are fitted to all cement and fly-ash storage silos and that the level indicator is—
(i) interlocked with the pneumatic filling line so that, in the event of the silo approaching an overfull condition, an audible alarm will operate, and after one minute the pneumatic filling line from the filling tanker to the storage silo will close; and

- (ii) tested prior to any delivery of cement or fly-ash and if it is found to be inoperative, the delivery of cement or fly-ash is not commenced;
 - (e) ensure that all cement or fly-ash at all stages from the storage silo through the process of weighing to the mixing is completely enclosed;
 - (f) ensure that all inspection ports and hatches on cement and fly-ash storage silos are effectively sealed at all times when not in use;
 - (g) ensure that aggregate and sand are stored in ground level storage bins, or overhead bins;
 - (h) ensure that where trucks are tipping aggregate and sand, wind shields or open fronted sheds extending not less than two metres from the front of the storage hopper and not less than six metres high are provided;
 - (i) ensure that where overhead loading bins are used, the top of each bin is totally enclosed;
 - (j) ensure that all aggregate and sand loads are wetted before tipping;
 - (k) ensure that water spray nozzles are provided on wind shields or ground bins and on the foot of each conveyor belt and that they are operating effectively to prevent dust becoming airborne when dry materials are being delivered or moved on the premises;
 - (l) ensure that all conveyor belts are enclosed so as to prevent the emission of dust;
 - (m) ensure that the charging chute to the bulk delivery concrete truck is enclosed on three sides and water sprays are provided and are operating effectively to prevent dust becoming airborne, while that truck is being loaded; and
 - (n) where fences, walls, buildings or other barriers are inadequate to prevent wind blown dust being carried beyond the boundaries of the premises, establish and maintain a screen of trees or provide other sufficient windbreak for that purpose.
6. A person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of these regulations is guilty of an offence and is liable to a penalty of two thousand dollars and in the case of a continuing offence against the regulations, to a further penalty of four hundred dollars for each day during which the offence continues.

Repeal.

7. The Clean Air Act (Control of Cement Dust) Regulations 1971 published in the *Government Gazette* on 30 November 1971 are repealed.

HEALTH ACT 1911 (AS AMENDED).

City of Stirling.

Amendments to Consolidated Health By-laws.

THE City of Stirling being a Local Authority under the provisions of the Health Act 1911-1981, doth hereby under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the said Act and all other powers enabling it make and publish the following By-laws:—

The By-laws of the City of Stirling published in the *Government Gazette* of 30 May 1961, as amended from time to time are hereby amended in the following manner:—

By-law 57A (1) is deleted and replaced by the following:—

By-law 57A (1)

The owner or occupier of premises shall provide a rubbish receptacle, or as many receptacles as directed by the Chief Health Surveyor, for holding refuse.

The receptacle shall comply with the following:

- (a) In the case of separate dwellings and buildings containing not more than twelve dwelling units each receptacle shall have a capacity of not less than 70 litres for each dwelling or unit or more than 113 litres;
- (b) In the case of a factory or shop, each receptacle shall have a capacity of not less than 70 litres;

- (c) In the case of a building containing thirteen or more dwelling units the number and size of each receptacle shall be as follows:

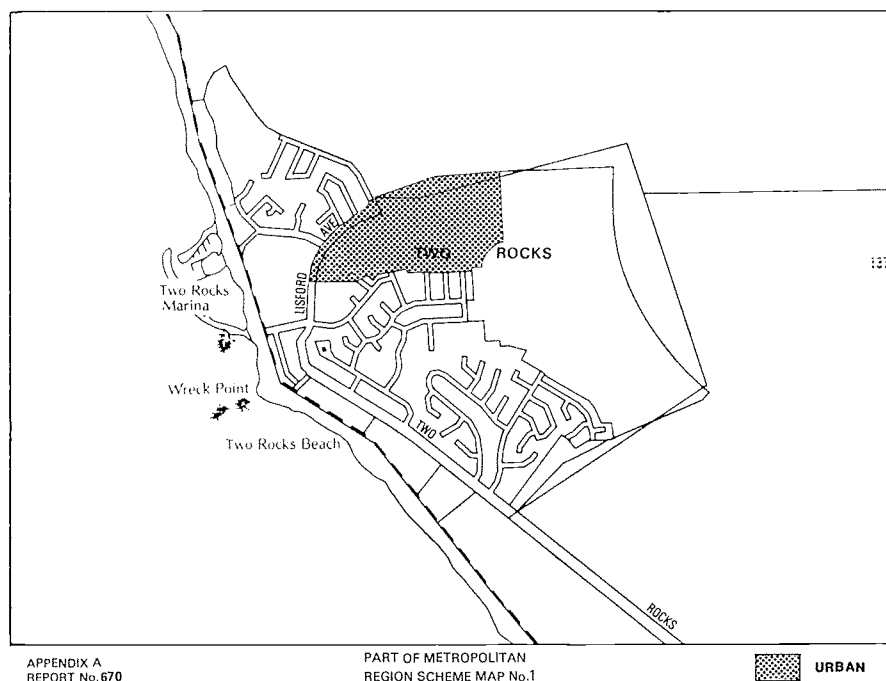

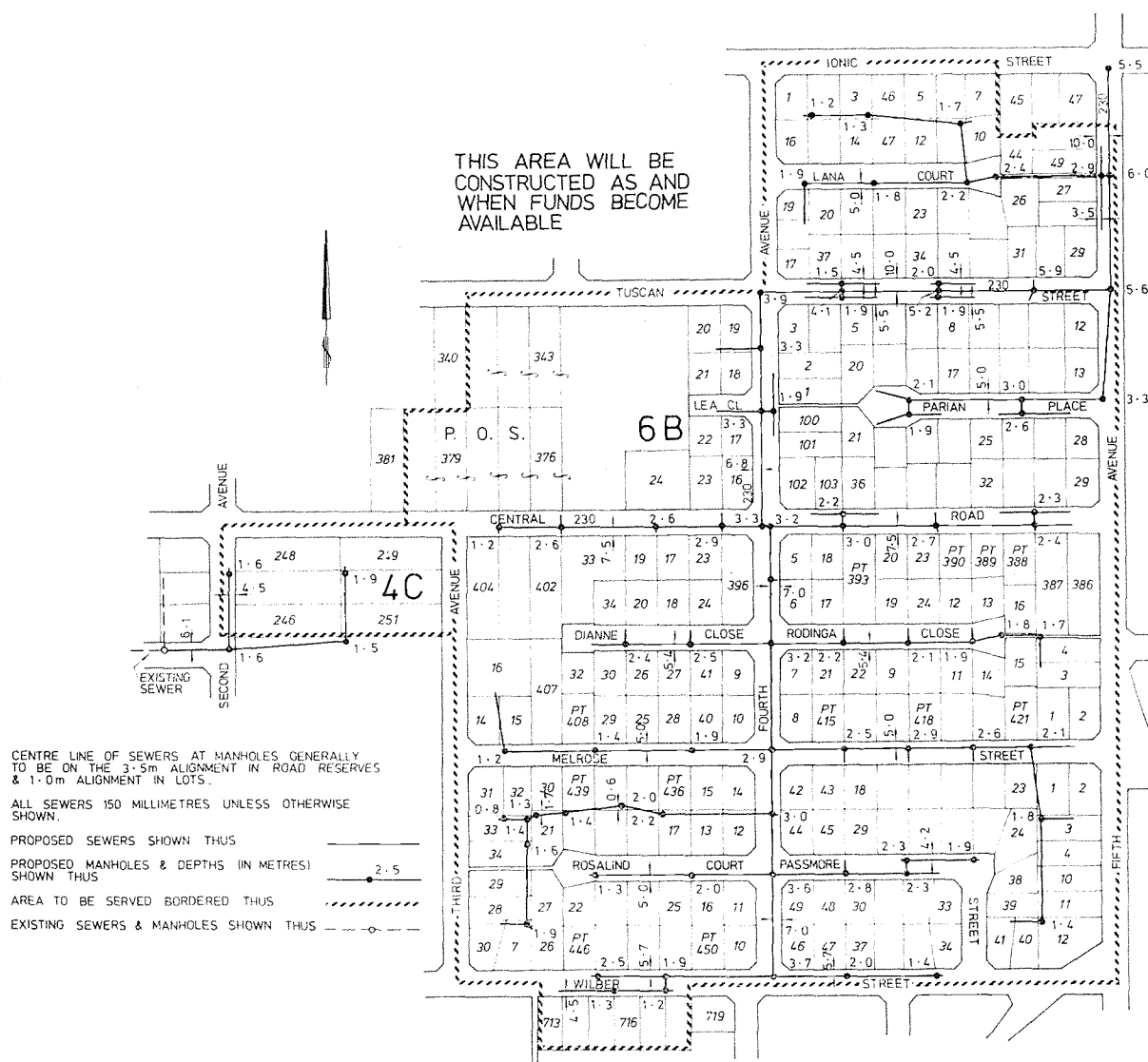

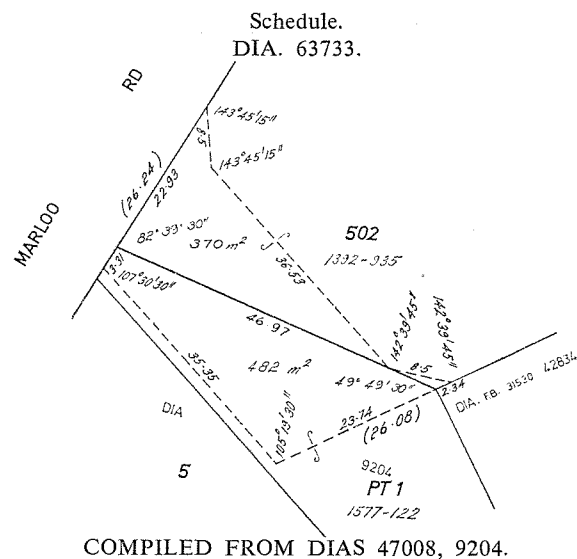
