Local Government Act 1960-1982.

#### ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act 1960-1982, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils mentioned in the schedule hereto have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for streets within the said Councils, be declared public streets: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

ASSOCIATIONS (CERTIFICATION) REGULATIONS 1982.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Associations (Certification) Regulations 1982.
- Interpretation. 2. In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—
- “the Act” means the Associations Incorporation Act 1895.
- Application. 3. (1) These regulations apply to all associations, institutions or bodies which apply for a certificate from the Attorney General that the association, institution or body is one to which the facilities given by the Act ought to be extended as provided in the definition “Association” in section 2 of the Act.
- (2) These regulations are in addition to and do not derogate from The Associations Regulations 1953.
- Application  
for certificate. 4. An application to the Attorney General for his certificate pursuant to section 2 of the Act shall be accompanied by 2 copies of the rules and regulations or Trust or Settlement deed of the applicant Association verified by the person authorized to apply for the certificate.

matter. 5. (1) Where rules and regulations of the applicant Association are submitted, they shall be divided into paragraphs which shall be numbered consecutively and given headings to indicate the subject matter.
- (2) The rules shall contain provisions in separate paragraphs in respect of the following matters—
- (i) The name of the association.
- (ii) The objects of the association.
- (iii) The powers of the association necessary to achieve the objects.
- (iv) The non-profit making purpose of the association.

- (v) The qualifications (if any) for membership.
- (vi) The procedure to become a member.
- (vii) The procedure for expulsion, suspension or other disciplinary matters.
- (viii) The entrance fees, subscriptions and other amounts (if any) to be paid by members.
- (ix) The constitution of the committee.
- (x) The powers of the committee.
- (xi) The procedure for electing the committee.
- (xii) The term of office for members of the committee.
- (xiii) The procedure and business of the annual general meeting.
- (xiv) The procedure for special or extraordinary general meetings.
- (xv) The quorum required for general meetings.
- (xvi) The control and management of the funds of the association.
- (xvii) The appointment of an auditor at the annual general meeting.
- (xviii) The procedure for the audit of the accounts.
- (xix) The procedure for altering the rules.
- (xx) The custody and use of the common seal.
- (xxi) The custody of books, documents and securities.
- (xxii) The inspection of books and documents by members.
- (xxiii) The procedure for dissolution.
- (xxiv) The disposition of any surplus assets upon dissolution.

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Kulin.

Where the land is prepared for clearing by burning after the 15 October 1982 you shall provide the firebreak immediately.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reasons to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to Council or its duly authorised Officer for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council, or its duly authorised Officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$200 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this Notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

" Bush Fires Regulations 1954 "
- Regs. 39BA and 39C repealed and substituted. 4. Regulations 39BA and 39C of the principal regulations and the heading thereto are repealed and the following heading and regulations are substituted—  
" Part VIIB.—Control of Welding and Cutting Apparatus and Explosives.

## Welding and Cutting Apparatus.

39BA. Pursuant to section 27A (1) (a) (ii) of the Act the operation of—

(a) welding apparatus;

(b) power operated abrasive cutting discs,

in the open air, are hereby specified as operations likely to create a bush fire danger, generally and at all times.

39C. (1) A person shall not operate in the open air, welding apparatus of any kind, unless at least one fire extinguisher is provided at the place where welding operations are carried on.

(2) A person shall not operate in the open air, power operated abrasive cutting discs of any kind, unless at least one fire extinguisher is provided at the place where cutting operations are carried on.

(3) A bush fire control officer may, subject to the directions, if any, of the local authority by which he was appointed, issue to a person operating—

(a) welding apparatus referred to in subregulation (1) of this regulation;

(b) a power operated abrasive cutting disc referred to in subregulation (2) of this regulation,

or to the owner or occupier of the land upon which those operations are carried on, such directions as he considers necessary for the prevention of fire on that land and the person, owner or occupier, as the case may be, shall comply with those directions. "



## MINING AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (No. 2) 1982.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Mining Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1982.
- Commencement. 2. These regulations shall come into operation on the day on which the Acts Amendment (Mining) Act 1982 comes into operation.
- Principal regulations. 3. In these regulations the Mining Regulations 1981\*, as amended, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Regulation 2 amended. 4. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is amended in the definition of "the Act" by deleting "— 1981".
- Regulation 30 repealed and substituted. 5. Regulation 30 of the principal regulations is repealed and the following regulation is substituted—
- Notice required by section 56A (8) or 70 (8) of Act. " 30. When the holder of—  
 (a) a special prospecting licence granted under section 56A (6); or  
 (b) a prospecting licence granted under section 70 (6), of the Act makes an application for a mining lease for gold or precious stones or both in respect of the land or any part thereof which is the subject of that special prospecting licence or prospecting licence, as the case requires, he shall within 14 days of the date of that application serve notice in the form No. 21 in the First Schedule on the holder of—  
 (c) the prospecting licence firstmentioned in section 56A (1); or  
 (d) the exploration licence referred to in section 70 (1), of the Act, as the case requires. "
- Regulation 43 amended. 6. Regulation 43 of the principal regulations is amended by repealing subregulation (2) and substituting the following subregulation—  
 " (2) The surrender under section 95 of the Act of one or more mining tenements may be conditional on an application for a new mining tenement in respect of the whole or any part of the area of the mining tenement or mining tenements so surrendered being granted to the holder of that mining tenement or those mining tenements. "
- Regulation 44 amended. 7. Regulation 44 of the principal regulations is amended—  
 (a) in subregulation (1) by deleting "rectangular (without any restriction as to the ratio of length to breadth)" and substituting the following—

 86D. Notwithstanding regulation 86, the holder of a mining tenement who uses in the course of mining operations clay, gravel, limestone, rock or sand which is not—  
 (a) sold; or  
 (b) used for processing or manufacturing purposes, is exempt from the payment of royalty in respect thereof. "
- Royalty not payable in respect of gold.
- Exemption in respect of certain clay, gravel, limestone, rock or sand.

If such a holder passes or repasses over that Crown land, he must comply with the requirements of subsection (5a) of section 20 of the Mining Act 1978 and should bear in mind the right of the occupier of that Crown land to claim from him compensation for any damage caused by his passing or repassing to any improvements or livestock on that Crown land. ” ;

 (b) in form No. 16 by deleting “(Secs. 42, 55, 59, 75,” and substituting the following—  
 “ (Secs. 42, 59, 75, ”.

1. By-law No. 213 for the provision of new building lines within the district of the City of Fremantle is hereby further amended by amending the 11'0" (3.35 metres) set back for road widening applicable to Queen Victoria Street, Fremantle, by deleting the 11'0" (3.35 metres) set back from the section coloured red in the Plan annexed hereto which applies to the frontages of property on the north-west side of Queen Victoria Street, between Edward Street and James Street.

2. Annexed hereto is a Plan setting out the area affected by this Amendment.
3. So much of the by-law which was proclaimed on the 20th day of July, 1955 and established a set back of 11'0" (3.35 metres) for Queen Victoria Street Fremantle as relates to that Section of Queen Victoria Street across the frontages of the properties on the northwest side of Queen Victoria Street between the southwest boundary of Lot 3 of F.T.L. 309 and the north east boundary of F.T.L. 301 as is set out in the plan and the schedule hereto is hereby deleted.



#### LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960-1982.

The Municipality of the City of Nedlands.

#### By-laws Relating to Fencing.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 6 May 1982 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:

##### 1. Revocation:

The By-laws of the Municipality of the City of Nedlands relating to fencing published in the *Government Gazette* of 22 October 1970, 31 October 1975 and 25 June 1976 are hereby revoked.

##### 2. Interpretation:

(1) In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires—

“by-law” means one of these by-laws;

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the City of Nedlands;

“dangerous” in relation to a fence means a fence which is likely to collapse or fall, or part of which is likely to collapse or fall, by reason of its faulty design, location or construction, deterioration of materials, damage by termites, decay, changes in ground levels or other cause whatsoever;

"district" means the district of the Municipality of the City of Nedlands;

"dividing fence" has the meaning given to it in and for the purposes of the Dividing Fences Act 1961;

"fence" includes a wall;

"height" in relation to a fence means, subject to sub-bylaws (2) and (3) of this by-law, the distance between the top of the fence at any point and the natural level of the ground immediately below that point;

"Schedule" means the schedule to these by-laws;

"setback area" means that portion of a lot situated between the street alignment and the line between which a building cannot be erected as prescribed by a town planning scheme or a by-law for the time being in force in relation to the district or any part thereof;

"sub-bylaw" means a sub-bylaw of the by-law in which the term is used;

"Surveyor" means the Building Surveyor of the Municipality of the City of Nedlands and includes the Acting Building Surveyor.

Expressions used in these by-laws have the meanings given to them by the Local Government Act 1960-1982.

(2) Where the natural level of the ground cannot be ascertained, the height of a fence shall be measured from a level fixed by the Surveyor.

(3) Where a fence is erected on or adjacent to a retaining wall, the retaining wall is deemed to be part of the fence for the purpose of measuring the height thereof, unless in any particular case the Surveyor decides otherwise.

### 3. Height of Fences:

Subject to these by-laws, a person shall not erect or commence to erect a fence exceeding a height of 1.8 m without the approval of the Council.

### 4. Fences within setback area:

(1) Subject to sub-bylaw (2), a person shall not erect or commence to erect on or within a setback area of a lot a fence—

(a) exceeding 750 mm in height unless—

(i) the Surveyor has first approved plans and specifications of the fence and the location thereof;

(ii) the fence does not exceed 1.8 m in height; and

(iii) the fence does not cover more than 60 per cent of the linear frontage of the lot; or

(b) which is constructed of a material other than timber, brick, concrete, masonry, wrought iron, cast iron or other material approved by the Council.

(2) Where the Council is satisfied that—

(a) the frontage of a lot is less than 14 m; or

(b) there is an unusual ground configuration which warrants that action; or

(c) there are satisfactory means of access to the rear of a lot and vehicular access at the frontage thereof is not necessary;

the Council may grant its approval to a fence of a height exceeding 750 mm but not exceeding 1.8 m which covers more than 60 per cent of the linear frontage of the lot.

(3) Where the Surveyor is satisfied that—

(a) there will be not more than 25 per cent loss of vision through the truncation;

(b) no single obstruction to vision will be more than 290 mm in horizontal dimension; and

(c) the safety of persons will not be unduly impaired;

approval may be granted for the erection of a fence within the truncation area referred to in sub-bylaw (4).

(4) A person shall not erect or commence to erect a fence within a truncation of any vehicular accessway located on a lot or an adjoining lot which truncation has the dimensions of 2.5 m x 1.5 m, the 1.5 m being measured along the frontage of the lot or adjoining lot or both as the case requires, unless the fence does not exceed a height of 750 mm.

### 5. Fence on or adjacent to boundary of public reserve:

(1) A person shall not erect or commence to erect on or within a distance of 7.5 m from the boundary of a public reserve a fence exceeding a height of 1.8 m without the approval of the Council.

(2) Where the Council is satisfied that a fence exceeding a height of 1.8 m constructed of materials specified in by-law 4 (1) (b) will not prejudice the amenity of the locality or the use or proposed use of the public reserve the Council may grant its approval to the erection of a fence exceeding that height constructed of those materials on or within 7.5 m of the boundary of a public reserve.

### 6. Use of materials likely to be dangerous:

A person shall not use or affix to or on a fence abutting a street, way, footpath or other public place or within the setback area any iron spike, broken glass, barbed wire or other wire with spiked or jagged projections or other things which in the opinion of the Council are, or are likely to be, dangerous.

### 7. Permitted materials for fences not within the setback area:

A person shall not erect or commence to erect on any other part of a lot a fence constructed of a material other than timber, brick, concrete, masonry, wrought iron, steel, link mesh, corrugated fibrous cement or other material approved by the Council.

## 8. Second hand materials:

A person shall not use second hand materials in the construction of a fence without the approval of the Surveyor and if that approval is given the person shall paint or treat the second hand material as directed by the Surveyor.

## 9. Sufficient fences:

A fence constructed in accordance with the specifications contained in the Schedule is hereby prescribed as a sufficient fence for the purposes of the Dividing Fences Act, 1961.

## 10. Dangerous fences:

A person shall not erect a dangerous fence on or within 3 m of the boundary of a public place.

## 11. Maintenance of fences:

(1) The owner of land on which a fence is erected shall keep the fence in good condition and so as to prevent it from becoming dangerous, dilapidated, unsightly or prejudicial to the amenity of the locality.

(2) The Council may give notice in writing to the owner or occupier of land upon which is erected a fence that has not been maintained in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws requiring him to repair, paint or maintain the fence within the time stipulated in the notice, being not less than 7 days from the date of service of the notice.

(3) If a person to whom a notice has been given pursuant to sub-bylaw (2) requiring him to maintain a fence fails to comply with the requirements of the notice the Council may enter upon the land and maintain the fence and recover the amount of the expense from the owner in a court of competent jurisdiction.

## 12. Offences:

A person who does anything in contravention of any of the provisions of these by-laws or who fails to carry out any duty or requirement imposed upon him by these by-laws commits an offence and is liable to—

- (a) a maximum penalty of \$500; and
- (b) the maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$50 per day.

## Schedule.

## Timber fences.

Corner posts shall be 125 mm x 125 mm.

Intermediate posts shall be 125 mm x 75 mm spaced at not more than 2.75 m centres.

All posts shall have tops with not less than 38 mm weather and shall be sunk at least 600 mm into the ground.

Corner posts shall be strutted two ways with 100 mm x 50 mm struts.

Rails shall be 75 mm x 50 mm. Each rail spanning two bays of fencing with joints staggered and the fence shall be covered with:

- (a) 75 mm x 20 mm sawn pickets nailed to each rail; or
- (b) corrugated or contoured asbestos cement sheets.

## Fibre cement fences.

Large profile corrugated fibre cement sheet free standing fences shall be erected as follows:

- (a) sheets of less than 1.8 m in height to be trenched 450 mm in soil;
- (b) sheets over 1.8 m and not more than 2.4 m in height to be trenched 610 mm in soil.

Sheets to be lapped and fixed with three galvanised 6 mm gutter bolts, nuts and washers.

Sheets to be capped with galvanised iron or fibre cement moulded cap.
