- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Offenders Probation and Parole Amendment Regulations 1982.
- (2) In these regulations the Offenders Probation and Parole Regulations 1964*, as amended, are referred to as the principal regulations.

- 2. These regulations shall take effect on the coming into operation of section 5 of the Offenders Probation and Parole Amendment Act

Interpretation.

- 2. In these regulations unless the contrary intention appears—
 - "Deputy Director" means the Deputy Director, Probation and Parole Services, referred to in section 5A of the Act;
 - "the Act" means the Offenders Probation and Parole Act 1963.

- The principal regulations are amended by inserting after regulation 7 the following Parts-
 - Part IA.—Director, Probation and Parole Services.
 - 7A. The duties of the Director shall include-
 - (a) with respect to probation-
 - (i) to be responsible to the Minister or such other person as the Minister shall from time to time in writing determine, for the administration of the probation service;
 - (ii) to assign probation officers to individual cases-
 - (I) for a pre-sentence report; or
 - (II) for supervision;
 - (iii) to maintain a list of all honorary probation officers appointed under section 6 of the Act;
 - (iv) to determine when an application for discharge of a probation order under section 12 of the Act, or for amendment of a probation order under section 14 of the Act, shall be made by any probation officer;
 - (v) to prepare and submit such reports as are required by the Minister or person referred to in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph; and
 - (vi) to perform such other duties as the Minister or person referred to in subparagraph (i) may require him to perform.
 - (b) with respect to parole-
 - (i) to be responsible to the Minister for the administration of the parole service;
 - (ii) to assign parole officers for supervision of persons released on parole;
 - (iii) to submit such reports as are required by the Board;
 - (iv) to apply to the Board for the cancellation of a parole order in any case where he thinks it proper to do so;
 - (v) to submit reports to the Board when cancellation of a parole order is applied for; and
 - (vi) to perform such other duties as the Minister or Board may require him to perform;
 - (c) to supervise the work of all probation and parole officers; and
 - (d) to maintain case records and statistics of the probation and parole services.

Part IB.—Deputy Director, Probation and Parole Services.

- 7B. The duties of the Deputy Director shall include-
 - (a) in the absence of the Director or during any vacancy in the office of Director, to act as Director;
 - (b) to supervise the work of the probation and parole officers as directed by the Director; and
 - (c) to perform such other duties as are directed by the Director.

(Note: Landowners wishing to remove flammable materials from road verges require prior Council approval in writing.)

2. Townsites Land: (Including Residential, Commercial and Industrial Land).

In respect of land owned or occupied by you within any townsite or any area subdivided for other purposes, you shall—

- (a) Where the area of land is 2 024 m² (approximately ½ acre) or less, remove all flammable material on the land except living standing trees from the whole of the land, and
- (b) Where the area of land exceeds 2 024 m² (⅓ acre) provide firebreaks of at least 2 metres wide, immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land. Where several adjoining lots are held or used by the owner/occupier the firebreaks may be provided inside and along the external boundaries of the group or lot.
- 3. Fuel and/or Gas Depots: In respect of land owned by you on which is situated any container normally used to contain liquids or gas fuel, including the land on which any ramp or support is constructed, you shall have the land clear of all flammable materials.
- 4. Coarse Grain Crops: Prior to the harvesting of all coarse grain crops a three (3) metre firebreak must be constructed around the perimeter and such firebreaks must be kept free of flammable material until the crop has been harvested.

5. Pine Plantations:

- (a) Firebreaks not less than ten (10) metres in width around the perimeter of land on which pines are planted.
- (b) Firebreaks not less than six (6) metres in width in such position that no part or compartment of a pine plantation shall exceed twenty eight (28) hectares in area.

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks or remove flammable materials as required by this notice or if natural features render firebreaks unnecessary you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than 1 December 1982 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer you shall comply with the requirements of this notice. 



IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 20 September 1982 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-law No. 16:

- 1. In this By-law:
 - "Council" means the Council of the City of Perth;
 - "Perform" means to play a musical instrument, sing, mime, juggle, dance, give an acrobatic display or otherwise entertain;
 - "Street" means any street, way, footpath or other public place in that area of the municipal district of the City of Perth bounded by St George's Terrace, William, Wellington and Barrack Streets;
 - "Designated place" means a place specified in the Schedule to this By-law;
 - "Designated time" means a time specified in the Schedule to this by-law in relation to a designated place.
- 2. A person shall not perform in a street except in a designated place at a designated time.

- 4. A person who fails to comply with any provision of this by-law commits an offence and on conviction shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$200.


