RULES OF TROTTING.

NOTICE OF AMENDMENT.

NOTICE is hereby given that at a meeting of the Committee of the Western Australian Trotting Association held at Gloucester Park, East Perth on 11 July 1983 it was resolved by an absolute majority of the Committee as follows:

That rules 437 to 454 each inclusive be deleted and that in the place thereof there be inserted the following rules:—

437. The words "artificial breeding" as used hereafter shall mean and include the term "artificial insemination" and shall include all techniques of fathering and collecting semen from the stallion and its introduction into the mare.

437A. (a) These Rules in so far as they relate to the artificial breeding of horses shall be read in conjunction with the Artificial Breeding of Stock Act, 1965, and the Artificial Breeding (Horses) Regulations, 1982.

(b) Any person who fails or refuses to comply with these Rules and or the Artificial Breeding (Horses) Regulations, 1982, shall be guilty of an offence under these Rules.

438. The proprietor of any stud premises at which it is proposed to practice artificial breeding shall make application for the licensing of the stud premises to the Controlling Body at least three (3) calendar months prior to the commencement of the stud season.

439. The application for the licensing of the stud premises shall be on form 3 as prescribed under the Artificial Breeding (Horses) Regulations, 1982, and shall be signed by the proprietor of the stud premises or his authorised agent and shall be forwarded to the Controlling Body accompanied by such fee as the Controlling Body shall from time to time fix.

440. (a) The application for the licensing of the stud premises shall be accompanied by an undertaking signed by the person proposing to perform artificial breeding programmes at the stud premises that he or she agrees to be bound by and conform with and to strictly adhere to all the Rules relating to artificial breeding.

(b) The person proposing to perform artificial breeding programmes at the stud premises shall be a veterinary surgeon or a licensed artificial breeding technician.

(c) The Controlling Body may grant to a person an annual licence to operate as an artificial breeding technician. Such licence shall be conveyed in writing to an applicant for the same and shall be in such form as the Controlling Body shall prescribe. Applicants for a licence to operate as an artificial breeding technician shall be restricted to persons holding a certificate of competency issued by the Western Australian Department of Agriculture. The Controlling Body may refuse to grant a licence to operate as an artificial breeding technician without assigning any reason or defer the granting of such a licence or grant such a licence on such conditions or limitations it believes the circumstances require.

441. Before the application for the licensing of the stud premises is considered by the Committee of the Controlling Body the stud premises shall be inspected by an officer authorised by the Controlling Body to carry out such inspection. Such inspection shall establish whether the stud premises comply with the following minimum requirements, that is, whether:

- (i) the stud premises to be used in the artificial breeding programme give the overall appearance of a well conducted operation,
- (ii) the general area in close proximity to the building hereinafter mentioned is maintained in a tidy manner,
- (iii) a building is provided for the collection of semen, and the insemination of mares, which building:—
 - (a) is constructed so as to provide a reasonably dust free area of convenient size,
 - (b) contains an approved veterinary work crush for the safe restraining of mares during insemination, and
 - (c) is provided with a water supply and drainage facilities sufficient to maintain the floor area in a clean condition;
- (iv) within close proximity to the area provided for the collection of semen there is a veterinary work room, which room:
 - (a) has a floor area of not less than three (3) metres square,
 - (b) has an impervious floor,
 - (c) is fitted with at least one (1) window,
 - (d) is lined and maintained in a flyproof condition internally,
 - (e) contains a work bench at least one (1) metre in length, topped with an impervious material together with a stainless steel sink connected to appropriate drainage facilities,
 - (f) is equipped with cupboards of not less than one (1) in number for each of the stallions standing on the stud premises, and
 - (g) is equipped with hot and cold running water and an approved type steriliser;
- (v) sufficient semen collecting/processing equipment is provided to allow one (1) complete set for each of the stallions standing on the stud premises.

442. Every application for the licensing of stud premises shall be dealt with by the Controlling Body which shall decide each application on its merits. The Controlling Body may refuse to grant a licence without assigning any reason or defer the granting of a licence or grant a licence on such conditions or limitations it believes the circumstances require.

443. The licence for the stud premises shall be conveyed in writing to the proprietor of the stud premises and shall be in such form as the Controlling Body shall prescribe.

444. The licence for the stud premises shall state the conditions set out herein and any other conditions and or limitations imposed by the Controlling Body and must be produced when requested by either the owner of a brood mare or an official of the Controlling Body or any other person having reasonable grounds for making such request.

445. The proprietor of stud premises, any stallion owner, or other person who:—

- (i) permits artificial breeding at stud premises prior to receiving a licence for the stud premises from the Controlling Body;
- (ii) permits semen collected on stud premises to be transported off the stud premises;
- (iii) stores, freezes, treats or preserves semen collected on stud premises;
- (iv) performs or permits the performance of the technique of artificial breeding by any person other than a veterinary surgeon or a licensed artificial breeding technician;
- (v) allows semen collecting/processing equipment marked with a stallion's name to be used in the collection and or handling of semen from another stallion;
- (vi) utilises or allows to be utilised any disposable gloves, syringes and pipettes on more than one occasion;

shall be guilty of an offence under these Rules.

446. Without in any way limiting the right of the Controlling Body to impose additional conditions or limitations the licence for the stud premises shall provide that:

- (i) where necessary the approval of the appropriate State Government Department must be obtained;
- (ii) artificial breeding shall be carried out on the stud premises at the place where the semen is collected;
- (iii) the semen collected on the stud premises must be used immediately upon its collection;
- (iv) the number of mares that may be served by any one (1) stallion either naturally or artificially in any one (1) season shall be limited to a total of one hundred (100) mares or such other number as the Controlling Body may from time to time determine;
- (v) the owner of any stallion used for artificial breeding shall keep accurate records of all mares served either naturally or artificially and shall produce such records for inspection when required by the Controlling Body or by its properly authorised officer;
- (vi) the use of extenders in the practice of artificial breeding shall be permitted;
- (vii) the techniques of artificial breeding shall be performed entirely by a veterinary surgeon or a licensed artificial breeding technician;
- (viii) where the person nominated pursuant to Rule 440 ceases to be solely responsible for the technique of artificial breeding at the stud premises during the currency of any stud season the licence of the stud premises as an approved artificial breeding establishment shall forthwith be withdrawn and all artificial breeding activities shall cease unless or until the proprietor of the stud premises shall have advised the Controlling Body of the name of a substitute person and lodge an application for transfer of the licence with the Minister for Agriculture;
- (ix) the stud premises the building provided for the collection of semen the veterinary work room and the semen collecting/processing equipment shall at all times during the currency of the licence conform with the minimum requirements set forth in Rule 441.
- (x) each set of semen collecting/processing equipment shall:—
 - (a) be indelibly marked with the name of the stallion for which it is to be used, and
 - (b) shall be stored separately in one of the cupboards as mentioned in Rule 441, which cupboards shall also be indelibly marked with the name of the stallion whose equipment is stored therein;
- (xi) the veterinary surgeon and or licensed artificial breeding technician shall ensure that:—
 - (a) the general area of the stud premises and all equipment used in any artificial breeding programme shall be maintained in a tidy and sanitary condition,
 - (b) a separate set of semen collecting/processing equipment indelibly marked with the name of each stallion for which it is intended such equipment shall be used is maintained,

- (c) each set of semen collecting/processing equipment used is used individually in respect only of the stallion designated for use with such equipment,
- (d) on completion of collections/inseminations using semen from any stallion all equipment used is adequately cleansed, sterilised and returned to the appropriate cupboard prior to the commencement of any collection/inseminations of semen from any other stallion,
- (e) no more than one (1) stallion is present in the collection area at any given time,
- (f) semen from more than one (1) stallion is not permitted to be present in the collection area, working room or insemination area at any given time,
- (g) only one (1) set of semen collecting/processing equipment is in use at any given time,
- (h) all semen collecting/processing equipment not in use is stored in the appropriate cupboard when the stallion named on any such equipment is not in actual stud use, and
- (i) all inseminations are performed using disposable gloves, syringes and pipettes.

446A. (a) The proprietor of any stud premises licensed for the practice of artificial breeding shall when required to do so by a person who renders to him an authority duly signed by the Secretary of the Controlling Body forthwith permit and assist such person to inspect the stud premises so as to enable such person to ascertain whether the conditions or limitations of the licence for the stud premises are being or have been strictly observed.

(b) No person shall obstruct delay or mislead a person authorised by paragraph (a) in the doing of any of the acts or things therein mentioned and any person who does so shall be guilty of an offence under these Rules.

447. The owner of any stallion used for artificial breeding shall observe the Rules dealing with the notification to the Controlling Body of all mares served by a registered stallion and the Sire Summary Sheet shall include the names of all mares served either naturally or artificially including the names of any mares deemed not to be in foal.

448. The Sire Summary Sheet where mares have been served by a stallion used in artificial breeding shall be accompanied by a certificate from the person or persons performing the technique of artificial breeding certifying that he or she wholly performed the technique of artificial insemination and stating the names of the mares that have been artificially inseminated and the respective dates upon which they were so inseminated.

449. Any horses begotten by artificial breeding in or outside Australia shall be eligible for registration in any State of Australia and for subsequent inclusion in the Australian Trotting Stud Book and may be entered for any race for which it would normally be eligible in the same manner as a foal begotten by natural breeding provided that all rules concerning artificial breeding in the State or Country where the artificial breeding is performed have been strictly observed.

450. The published records or details of any horse begotten by artificial breeding shall not be made distinctive by a mark or sign or by any method to show that it was begotten by artificial breeding.

451. Where the Controlling Body has granted a licence to a proprietor for his stud premises to be used for artificial breeding the proprietor or owner of a stallion shall include in any advertisement or contract the statement that the stud premises has been approved for artificial breeding and that service may be carried out by this method if appropriate at the time of service unless otherwise arranged.

452. If the Committee of the Controlling Body believes any part of these Rules concerning artificial breeding or any related part of these Rules have been infringed then the Committee of the Controlling Body may in its absolute discretion refuse to grant registration of all or any of the progeny obtained from mares served either naturally or artificially on the property of the owner or stud master concerned.

453. Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding Rules the Committee of the Controlling Body may in addition to any power which it may have under any other Rule inflict a fine of any amount and or suspend or disqualify for any period any person or persons deemed guilty of any infringement or offence against these Rules.

454. The owner of any mare served by a stallion which appears in the Register of Sires must notify the Secretary of the Controlling Body the result of such service and comply with Rule 436 (a).

HEALTH ACT 1911 (AS AMENDED).

Town of Albany.

By-Laws—Eating Houses No. 16.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act 1911 (as amended) a local authority may make by-laws and may amend, repeal or alter any by-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Town of Albany being a local authority, does hereby make the following by-laws:

Commencement.

1. These by-laws shall come into operation on the 1st day of July 1983.

Interpretation.

2. In the construction of these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires: "Act" means the Health Act 1911 (as amended) including any amendments thereof and any regulations made thereunder.

"Certificate of Registration" means a certificate issued in the form prescribed in the second schedule.

"Eating House" means an eating house as defined in Division 3, section 160, of the Health Act 1911 (as amended).

"Health Surveyor" means a health surveyor appointed under this Act, and includes any acting or assistant health surveyor.

"Licence" means a licence to conduct an eating house granted pursuant to the provisions of these by-laws in the form prescribed in the Fourth Schedule.

"Local Authority" means the Council of the Town of Albany.

"Proprietor" means the person having the management or control of premises.

"Registered premises" means any premises which are registered as an eating house under these by-laws.

"Town Clerk" means the Town Clerk or the Acting Town Clerk for the time being of the Town of Albany.

3. No person shall occupy or use any premises as an eating house unless:—

- (a) the premises are registered under these by-laws as an eating house; and,
- (b) the proprietor of the said premises is the holder of a licence issued by the local authority authorising him to conduct on the premises the business of an eating house.

Registration of an Eating House.

4. Before any premises are registered under these by-laws as an eating house the proprietor thereof shall make application in the form prescribed in the First Schedule hereto and shall forward the application together with a plan of the premises in respect of which such application is made, and the prescribed fee to the Town Clerk and, if the application is approved, the local authority shall issue to the proprietor a certificate of registration in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto.

5. The local authority may attach such conditions as are deemed necessary to the registration of an eating house, and these conditions shall be set out in the certificate of registration.

Licence to Conduct an Eating House.

6. Before any licence to any proprietor to conduct an eating house is issued by the local authority under these by-laws, the proprietor shall complete an application in the form prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto and shall forward same, together with the prescribed fee to the Town Clerk, and if the application is approved, the local authority shall issue to the proprietor a licence in the form prescribed in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

Register of Registrations and Licences.

7. Every certificate of registration of premises registered as an eating house and every licence issued to a proprietor shall be signed by the Town Clerk and shall be entered in a register maintained by the local authority for that purpose.

Certificates of Registration and Licences.

8. Every proprietor of registered premises shall keep the certificates of registration and the licence on the registered premises in a position visible to the general public and shall, when requested to do so by a Surveyor, produce the certificate of registration and the licence issued to the proprietor in respect of such premises.

9. Every certificate of registration and every licence shall be in force from the day of issue to the next 30th day of June, inclusive, unless the same be cancelled in the meantime in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws.

10. Applications for renewal of certificates of registration and licences shall be made annually during the month of June.

11. The fees payable to the local authority on the registration of premises or the issue of a licence and on the renewal of any registration or licence shall be the maximum fee prescribed in section 172, subsection 1, paragraph 3.

12. So often as any person holding the licence issued pursuant to these by-laws changes his place of abode he shall, within seven days of such a change, give notice in writing to the Town Clerk, specifying his new place of abode and he shall, at the same time, produce such licence to the Town Clerk, who shall endorse thereon and sign a memorandum specifying the particulars of such change.

13. Any licence issued to any proprietor under the provisions of this by-law to conduct an eating house shall not be transferable to any other person except as specified in section 168 subsection 2 of the Act.

14. If the licensed proprietor of any premises registered as an eating house ceases to be the proprietor, as defined under these by-laws then any person wishing to become the proprietor of such premises must make application to the Town Clerk for a licence to conduct an eating house as required by By-law No. 6 of these by-laws.

15. Where application is made to the local authority either for:—

- (i) an eating house to be registered; or
- (ii) a licence to be issued to conduct the business of an eating house, then—
- (i) such application may be issued or refused subject to section 165 subsection 1 and section 166 subsection 1 of the Act,
- (ii) any such registration or licence, if allowed and issued, may be cancelled at any time if any conditions or term of issue, be broken or if any of the provisions of the Act, are not complied with.

16. Before any premises are registered as an eating house, the site intended to be used for such purpose shall be subject to the approval of the local authority.

17. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and upon conviction shall be liable to the maximum penalty prescribed in section 171 of the Act.

Town of Kwinana.

FIRE BRIGADES (SUPERANNUATION FUND) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1983.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Fire Brigades (Superannuation Fund) Amendment Regulations 1983.
- Principal regulations. 2. In these regulations the Fire Brigades (Superannuation Fund) Regulations 1977*, as amended, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 2 amended. 3. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is amended in subregulation (1) by repealing the definition "the benefit formula" and substituting the following formula—

" "the benefit formula" in relation to a Member means the formula:

$$B = \frac{S}{12} \times (0.135 \times M + 0.015 \times NFM)$$

Where

B is the lump sum benefit payable to or in respect of the Member;

S is the final average salary of the Member;

M is the Membership of the Member expressed in completed months; and

NFM is the Membership of the Member after 28 April 1977 expressed in completed months. "

POLICE ACT 1892.

POLICE (KALGOORLIE TWO-UP GAMING) REGULATIONS 1983.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Police (Kalgoorlie Two-up Gaming) Regulations 1983.
- Conditions relating to gaming. 2. Subsection (1) and subsection (2) of section 86 of the Police Act 1892 shall not have effect in relation to the game known as "two-up", or persons playing or betting at that game, where that game and the gaming associated with that game—
- (a) takes place—
 - (i) at the established rings situated within the boundaries of the demarcated playing area, being a rectangle having dimensions of 80 metres by 40 metres as delineated on Department of Lands and Surveys Miscellaneous Diagram No. 85 (in these regulations referred to as "the designated area"), comprised within the area of tenement No. GML 6590E held by William John Sheehan and Nicholas Turich on the East Coolgardie Goldfield adjacent to the Kalgoorlie-Meekatharra Road;
 - (ii) during the hours of daylight between sunrise and sunset, at a time other than on Christmas Day or Good Friday or the morning of Anzac Day, and not otherwise;
 - (b) is conducted—
 - (i) by William John Sheehan of M.H.L. 215E North Kalgoorlie or by Nicholas Turich of 56 Collins Street, Kalgoorlie;
 - (ii) in the customary manner; and
 - (iii) so as to comply with the conditions prescribed by regulation 3 of these regulations;
 - and
 - (c) is subject to supervision in accordance with the requirements of regulation 4 of these regulations.
- Conditions relating to persons. 3. (1) A person who is—
- (a) under the age of 18 years; or
 - (b) under the influence of alcohol or drugs, or alcohol and drugs, shall not be, or be permitted to be, in the designated area.
- (2) Liquor, within the meaning of the Liquor Act 1970, shall not be, and shall not be permitted to be, taken into or consumed within the designated area.
- Police requirements. 4. (1) Access to the designated area shall at all times be permitted to any member of the Police Force.
- (2) A financial statement containing such particulars of the operations of the gaming to which these regulations apply as the Commissioner of Police may require shall be furnished to him by the persons conducting the gaming, or each of them, at intervals of not more than 1 calendar month or at such further or other times as the Commissioner of Police may require.

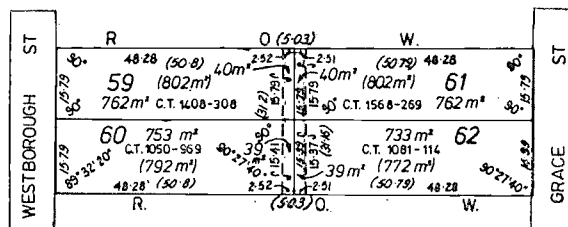

(1) By deleting Clause 4B and by inserting in substitution therefor the following:—

4 (B) (1) The Council may, as a condition of a licence, require that a person carrying on an extractive industry shall pay into a fund established by the Council for the purpose of restoring and reinstating any area excavated under the authority of the licence, such sum at such times as is prescribed in the licence. In lieu of the said payment the Council may accept a Bank Guarantee for the payment of the said sum.

(2) The Council may apply the money paid pursuant to subclause (1) of this clause to or towards the restoration and reinstatement of the site if the person carrying on the extractive industry does not carry out the restoration and reinstatement at his own cost but the Council shall refund to that person the money so paid to the fund as is not used for restoration and reinstatement of the site when the restoration and reinstatement of the site has been carried out to the satisfaction of Council.

(3) The Council may, as an alternative to payment to a fund pursuant to subclause (1) of this clause, as a condition of the licence, require the applicant for the licence to give to the Council a bond with or without sureties in such sum as the Council deems sufficient to ensure that the person carrying out an extractive industry will himself carry out or cause to be carried out such restoration and reinstatement work as may be agreed between the Council and the applicant on the granting of the licence.

(4) If the applicant makes default in carrying out the restoration and reinstatement work or causing it to be carried out the bond shall be forfeited and the amount thereof shall be paid by the applicant to the Council which shall apply that money or so much thereof as is required in the carrying out of that work.

By-laws Relating to Refuse, Rubbish, Dangerous Things and Nuisances.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on 24 January 1983 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.

The by-laws published in the *Government Gazette* of 1 August 1960 and 21 February 1963 are hereby repealed and replaced by the following:

1. In these by-laws—

“Council” means the Bassendean Town Council.

“District” means the Town of Bassendean.

“Animal” means any animal other than a dog.

2. If there is—

(a) on any vacant land within the district any trees, scrub, undergrowth or rubbish;

or

(b) on any land within the district any refuse, rubbish or disused material, whether of the same kind or a different kind from that here specified,

which in the opinion of the Council is likely to affect adversely the value of adjoining property or the health, comfort or convenience of the inhabitants thereof, the Council may cause a notice under the hand of the Town Clerk to be served on the owner or occupier of such land requiring him, within the time specified in such notice to clear land of such trees, scrub, undergrowth, or remove such refuse, rubbish or disused material from such land.

3. The notice referred to in By-law 2 shall be in writing and signed by the Town Clerk and may be served on an owner or occupier in person or by registered post addressed to the owner's or occupier's last known place of abode.

4. Any notice served under these by-laws shall give any owner or occupier at least 14 days to remove the refuse or rubbish or disused material as may be specified in the notice.

5. Where the owner or occupier does not clear the land, or remove the refuse, rubbish or disused material as required by the notice given under By-law 2 hereof the Council, without payment of any compensation in respect thereof, may clear the land or remove the refuse, rubbish or disused material at the expense of, and may recover in a Court of competent jurisdiction the amount of the expense from the owner or occupier to whom the notice was given.

6. No person shall—

(a) store a disused motor vehicle, an old motor vehicle body or any old machinery; or

(b) dismantle or break up a disused motor vehicle, an old motor vehicle or any old machinery,

except at a place approved by the Council for that purpose or inside a garage.

7. No person shall carry out any activity, conduct any business or engage in any undertaking on any land or premises in such a manner as to permit the escape therefrom of noise, smoke, dust, sawdust, fumes or waste in such a quantity or to such an extent or in such a manner as to create a nuisance to any other person.

8. No person shall keep any animal or bird which, in the opinion of the Council is dangerous or causes a nuisance to any other person.

9. Any person who fails to comply with or contravenes any of these by-laws or any notice issued thereunder or any part thereof commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$500.00 and to a daily penalty of not more than \$50.00 per day in respect of a continuing breach.

The Municipality of the Shire of Albany.

By-laws Relating to Vehicle Wrecking.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 18 February 1983 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:

1. These by-laws may be cited as Shire of Albany By-laws relating to Vehicle Wrecking.

2. The by-laws of the Shire of Albany relating to vehicle wrecking published in the *Government Gazette* of 12 October 1966 and 17 September 1976 are hereby revoked.

3. In these by-laws, unless the context requires otherwise—

“Act”—means the Local Government Act 1960-1982 and includes any Act amending or re-enacting that Act for the time being in force;

“Council”—means the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Albany;

“District”—means the district of the municipality of the Shire of Albany;

“District Scheme”—means the Shire of Albany Town Planning Scheme No. 3 published in the *Government Gazette* of 15 February 1980 and amended from time to time or any other town planning scheme for the time being in force whereby the district or any part thereof is classified or zoned;

“Industrial Purposes”—means purposes or uses of land within the definition of “industry” in and for the purposes of the District Scheme and for the purposes of this interpretation the definition contained in Appendix “D” to the Town Planning Regulations 1967 shall be deemed to be contained in the District Scheme unless it is otherwise provided in that Scheme;

“Planner”—means the Shire Planner of the municipality of the Shire of Albany;

“Surveyor”—means the Building Surveyor of the municipality of the Shire of Albany;

“Vehicle”—means a disused motor vehicle, old motor vehicle body or old machinery;

“Wreck”—means the dismantling or breaking up of vehicles and inflexions and derivatives of the verb have corresponding meanings;

Words and expressions used in these by-laws have the meanings given to them respectively in and for the purposes of the Act.

4. A person shall not wreck, store or dispose of a vehicle on any land within the district unless the use of that land for that purpose is permitted under the District Scheme and unless he complies with the provisions of these by-laws.

5. In order to prevent the creation or secure the abatement of unsightly conditions a person shall not use any land within the district for wrecking, storage or disposal of vehicles unless—

(a) the land is screened by a fence and/or vegetation and landscaped with trees and shrubs to the satisfaction of the Planner;

(b) where the land is zoned or classified for industrial purposes in addition to the requirements of paragraph (a) of this by-law—

(i) a landscaped area not less than 6 m wide adjacent to each street alignment (unless the Council otherwise approves) planted with trees, shrubs and plants is provided and maintained to the satisfaction of the Planner;

(ii) a fence not less than 1.8 metres high, in a location/s to the satisfaction of the Planner, and of a design and construction approved by and to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, is erected and maintained on the land—except where this requirement is otherwise waived by Council;

(c) all vehicles to be wrecked or being wrecked are kept on the portion of the land shown on a development plan approved by the Planner for that purpose;

(d) all vehicles to be wrecked or which have been wrecked are not immediately removed from the land are kept in neat rows to the satisfaction of the Planner;

(e) where the land is zoned or classified for use for industrial purposes by the District Scheme—

(i) vehicles are not stored over an area exceeding 1 ha;

(ii) the rows of vehicles referred to in paragraph (d) hereof do not exceed the height of the fence referred to in subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (b) hereof.

6. A person who wrecks or disposes of vehicles on land within the district shall not—

(a) engage in that activity—

(i) on a Sunday; or

(ii) between the hours of 7 p.m. on one day and 7 a.m. on the following day,

unless the Council otherwise approves;

(b) destroy any portion of a vehicle on the land except by a process approved by the Council and in accordance with any conditions it imposes on that approval;

(c) cause a nuisance.

7. A person who commits a breach of any of these by-laws is liable to a maximum penalty of \$500.00.

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Shire of Nungarin Pest Plant By-laws 1982.
2. In these by-laws, unless the contrary intention appears:—
 “council” means council of the municipality of the Shire of Nungarin;
 “pest plant” means a plant described as a pest plant by By-law 4 of these by-laws.
3. These by-laws apply in respect of the townsite of Nungarin.
4. Every plant described in the First Schedule to these by-laws is a pest plant.
5. (1) The council may serve on the owner or occupier of private land within the townsite of Nungarin, a duly completed notice in the form of the Second Schedule to these by-laws requiring him to destroy, eradicate or otherwise control any pest plant on that land.
 (2) A person served with a notice under sub-by-law (1) of this by-law shall comply with that notice within the time and in the manner specified therein.
6. Where a person fails to comply with a notice under By-law 5 of these by-laws served upon him, the council may:—
 (a) without payment of any compensation in respect thereof, destroy, eradicate or control, as the case may be, any pest plant the destruction, eradication or control of which was required by the notice; and
 (b) recover in a court of competent jurisdiction from the person to whom the notice is directed, the amount of the expense of such destruction, eradication or control.

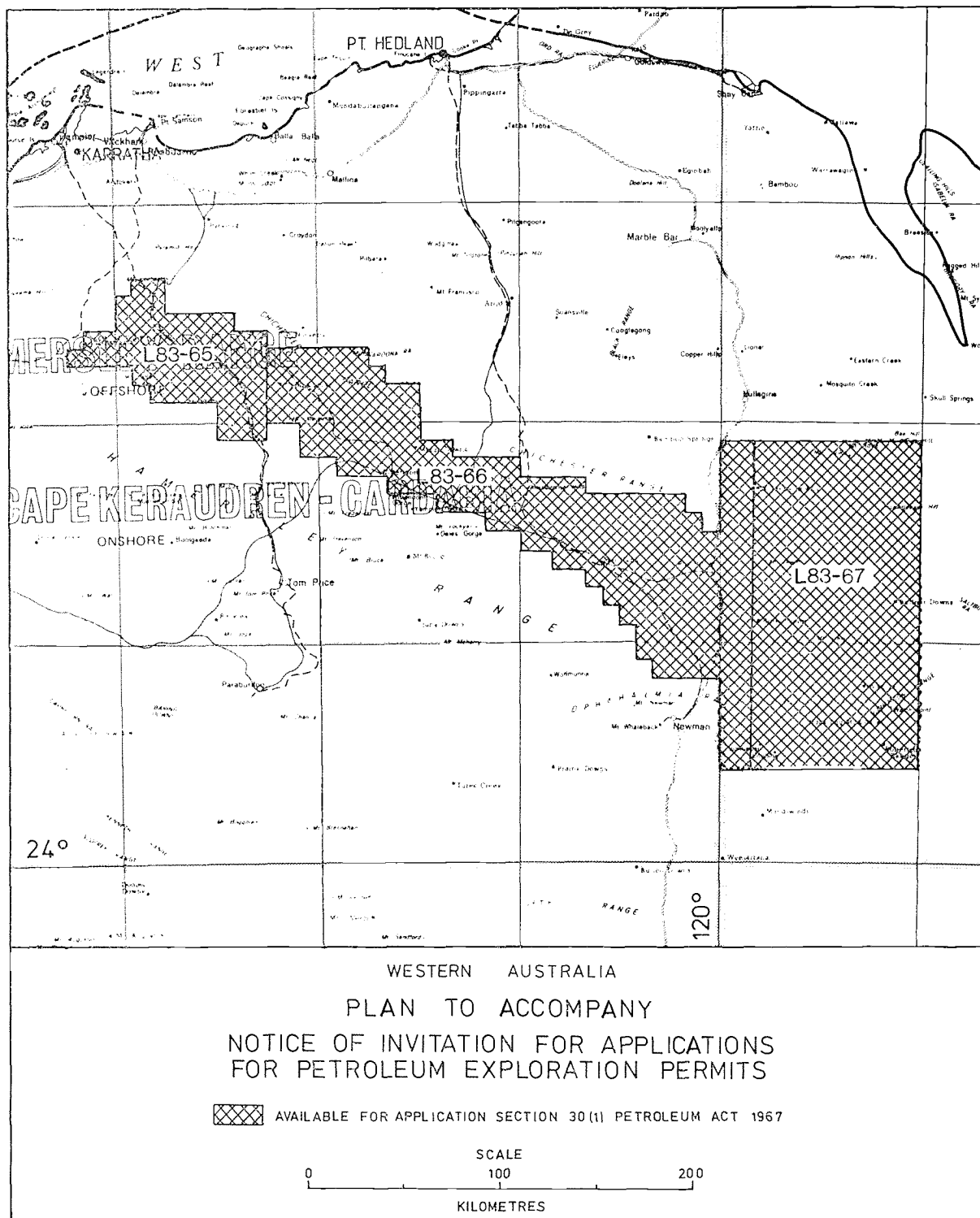
