At any time during the currency of the lease, subject to the agreed development obligations and other conditions having been met to the satisfaction of the Hon. Minister, the lessee may surrender his lease to the intent that he may apply for purchase of the said land. In this event a purchase price in accordance with the Schedule shall apply for a period of 3 years from the date of approval of the lease (following which period the price shall be subject to review) and fees associated with the issue of a Crown Grant shall be payable. - (5) The lessee shall commence construction within nine (9) months and thereafter continue construction and complete and operate the works within two (2) years from the date of the commencement of the lease.
- (6) All buildings, erections, paving, drainage and other works shall be to the approval of the Local Authority and the lessee shall perform, discharge and execute all requisitions and works unto the demised land as are or may be required by any local or public authority operating under any statute by-law or regulation.
- (7) The lessee shall, within twelve months from commencement of the lease, fence the external boundaries with security fencing to the satisfaction of the Minister.
- (8) The lessee shall maintain existing and future improvements to the satisfaction of the Minister.
- (9) All frontages shall be treated and maintained to give an appearance aesthetically pleasing consistent with the purpose of the lease according to a plan submitted to the Minister.
- (10) The lessee shall indemnify the Minister against all claims for damage to property or persons arising from the use of the land.

- (b) The land will be inspected by the Fire Control Officer appointed by the Shire of Albany and notice may then be served if action is deemed to be necessary to prevent the outbreak or spread of a bushfire on the land;
- (c) Such land is required to be made safe from fire by the reduction of fire hazards.
- Compliance with such requirements need not re-quire the removal of all inflammable materials. All Other Land:

(A) You are required to have constructed firebreaks, as specified in this notice.

- (a) Immediately inside all external boundaries of all land exceeding 2 100 square metres in area whether the land be cleared, partly cleared, bulldozed, chained, used for pasture or be undeveloped.
- (b) Immediately surrounding all buildings erected on any land having an area in excess of 2 100 square metres.

(B) You are required, on all land used for and being under crop, in the period from 15 November 1984 to 31 March 1985 to:—

- (a) Have constructed firebreaks, as specified in this notice immediately inside the external boundary of the land being used for crop and around the standing crop, and
- (b) Have standing within the external boundary of all land being used for crop which is then being harvested and at all times that the harvesting of crop is proceeding, suitable operational fire fighting equipment.

All firebreaks as designated above must be prepared on or before 15 November 1984 within that portion of the Shire lying generally north of the dividing line defined hereunder and on or before 15 December 1984 within that portion of the Shire lying generally south-west of the dividing line defined hereunder or within 14 days of the date of your becoming owner or occupier should this be after those dates.

Take notice that pursuant to Clause 33 (4) of the Bushfires Act, where the owner or occupier of land who has received notice fails or neglects to comply with the requisitions of the notice within the time specified, the Shire of Albany, may by its officers and with such servants, workmen and contractors vehicles and machinery as the officers deem fit, enter upon the land and carry out the requisitions of the notice which have not been complied with and pursuant to Clause 33 (5) of the Bush Fires Act the amount of any costs and expenses incurred may be recovered from you as the owner or occupier of the land.

Applications to Vary the Above Requirements:

If it is considered to be impractical for any reason whatever to carry out works as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council of the Shire of Albany or its duly authorised officer no later than 14 days prior to the date by which the firebreaks are required by this notice for permission to provide firebreaks in an alternative position, to take alternative action to abate the fire hazards on the land or to alter or vary this notice in any other wav.

Note: Council, or its duly authorised officer will con-Note: Council, or its duly authorised oncer will con-sider approval of other than firebreaks immediately inside the external boundaries where a more suitable alternative can be provided. Approval of such alter-natives will only be considered if submitted with the endorsement of the Bush Fire Brigade for the area con-cerned and will be on a yearly basis. If permission to vary this order is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you must comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine not exceeding \$400 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the costs of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

Failure to comply with this or other notice served may result in legal action being taken.

Important Information Relating to Your Responsibility as a Landholder in the Shire of Harvey.

WITH reference to section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954-1981, you are required to carry out fire prevention work on land owned or occupied by you, in accordance with the provisions of this order.

This work must be carried out by 15 November 1984, and kept maintained throughout the summer months until the close of the Restricted Burning Period, 1985.

An inspection of firebreaks and hazard removal will be carried out in all areas of the Shire by Authorised Officers, on or after 15 November 1984.

Persons who fail to comply with the requirements of the order may be issued with an infringement notice (Penalty \$40) or prosecuted with an increased penalty, and additionally, Council may carry out the required work at cost to the owner or occupier.

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks as required by this notice or if natural features render firebreaks unnecessary, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer, not later than 1 December 1984 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions (strategic breaks) or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the Land. If permission is not granted by the Council, or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice. If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

A. Rural Land: Firebreaks not less than two (2) metres wide must be provided in the following positions:

- (a) within 60 metres inside and along the boundaries of all land including that which is uncleared, so as to form a continuous break around the holding. (Note: firebreaks constructed on road verges do not constitute a legal firebreak);
- (b) where the area of land exceeds 120 ha (300 acres), additional firebreaks are required so as to divide the land into areas of not more than 120 ha (300 acreas) which are completely surrounded by firebreaks;
- (c) not more than 100 metres and not less than 20 metres from the perimeter of all groups of buildings, haystacks and fuel installations provided on that land.

Note: Irrigation Areas—Owners or occupiers may be exempted from all or part of the requirements of the above if, in the opinion of the Fire Control Officer responsible for the area in which the land is located, there is no need to construct breaks on the irrigated land or non-irrigated land, not exceeding 20 hectares in area if surrounded by irrigated land. B. Special Rural Land: The owners of all existing small rural holdings zoned as "Special Rural" under Town Planning Schemes, must maintain clear of all flammable materials, a firebreak not less than two (2) metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land.

C. Urban Land (Residential, Commercial and Industrial land within a townsite or any other area subdivided for residential purposes).

In respect of land owned or occupied by you within any townsite or any area subdivided for other purposes, you shall:

- (a) where the area of land is 2 024 sq. m (approx.  $\frac{1}{2}$  acre) or less, remove all flammable material on the land except living standing trees, from the whole of the land; and
- (b) where the area of land exceeds 2 024 sq. m (approx. ½ acre) provide firebreaks of at least two (2) metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land. Where several adjoining lots are held or used by the owner/occupier, the firebreaks may be provided inside and along the external boundaries of the group or lot.

external boundaries of the group or lot. Note: Myalup and Binningup—Firebreaks two (2) metres wide inside and around all boundaries of land are accepted in lieu of item (a) of the above requirements.

D. Fuel and/or Gas Depots: In respect of land owned or occupied by you on which is situated any container normally used to contain liquid or gas fuel, including the land on which any ramp or supports are constructed, you shall maintain the land clear of all flammable materials.

E. Pine Plantations: Any pines planted for commercial purposes constitute a pine plantation and you are required to provide firebreaks:

- (a) not less than 10 metres wide around the perimeter of each plantation;
- (b) not less than 6 metres in width in such position that no part or compartment of the plantation exceeds twenty eight (28) hectares in area.

Where the land is prepared for clearing by burning after 15 October 1984 you shall provide the firebreak immediately.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reasons to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to Council or its duly authorised Officer for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council, or its duly authorised Officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of \$400 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this Notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from land as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer in writing on or before 15 November 1984, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The Firebreaks Inspection Officers will commence inspection of firebreaks and fire hazards early in the season.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of \$400 or a prescribed penalty of \$40 on service of an infringement notice, and a person in default is also liable whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed by this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act, which include the necessity for permits to burn during the restricted burning season.

## Shire of Lake Grace.

## Firebreak Order.

Notice to all Owners and or Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Lake Grace.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before 1 November 1984, to plough, cultivate, scarify, burn or otherwise clear upon the land, firebreaks free of all inflammable materials at least three metres wide, according to the following directions and in the following circumstances, on all rural and townsite land owned or occupied by you, and thereafter up to and including 31 March 1985, to maintain the firebreaks clear of all inflammable materials.

1. (a) Immediately inside all external boundaries of the property or as near as is practicable, firebreaks of not less than 3 metres wide; and

(b) Any aerial landing ground used as the motor start up, refuelling and maintenance area to be completely cleared of inflammable materials for a radius of 18 metres; and

4. Maintain clear of all inflammable materials all townsite blocks; and

5. Where the bush or land has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether intended to burn the bush or not), provide a firebreak of not less than 13 metres wide immediately inside the external boundaries of the land so prepared. If you become owner or occupier of land after the first day of November 1984, the requirements of this notice are varied so as to require you to comply with the terms of this notice within 14 days of the date of your becoming owner or occupier of such land, instead of on or before 1 November 1984. The firebreaks required by this notice are to be maintained clear of inflammable materials up to and including 31 March 1985.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. Shire of Mandurah Town Planning Scheme No. 11. Scheme Text.

THE Council of the Shire of Mandurah, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme.

#### PART I-PRELIMINARY.

1.1 Citation: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Mandurah Town Planning Scheme No. 11 (hereinafter called the "Scheme").

1.2 Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the land within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use Map and the Scheme Map. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area". 1.3 Responsible Authority: The Authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Mandurah (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

1.4 Maps: The following maps are attached to this Text and form part of the Scheme:--

Land Use Map.

Scheme Map.

1.5 Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme Text is divided into the following parts:---

PART I—Preliminary.

PART II—Relocation of National Park Boundary and Exchange of Land.

PART III-Subdivision Requirements.

PART IV-Land Use and Development Requirements.

PART V—General Provisions.

PART VI-Finance and Administration.

1.6 General Objects: The general objects of the Scheme are:---

(a) To guide subdivision of land within the Scheme Area;

- (b) To rationalise the boundary between privately held land and the Yalgorup National Park and
- to a land and the recessary land exchanges;
  (c) To plan within the Scheme Area suitable roads;
  (d) To ensure the proper provision of utility services including water supply, drainage and facilities for fire fighting;
  (c) To ensure the proper provision of utility services including water supply, drainage and facilities for fire fighting;
- (e) To guide the development of land within the Scheme Area ensuring the preservation of amenity and the harmony of development with the natural environment;
- (f) To make provision for road widening where required.

Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations 1967

(as amended) unless otherwise specified by this Scheme. "Act" means the Town Planning and Development

Act, 1928 as amended;

"clause" means a clause of the Scheme; "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Mandurah:

"Scheme" means this Town Planning Scheme:

"Scheme Area" means the area defined in Clause 1.2:

"sub-clause" means a sub-clause of the clause in which the term is used.

PART II-Relocation of National Park Boundary and Exchange of Land.

2.1 The Council shall initiate the alienation of all that land comprising the Yalgorup National Park situated within the Scheme Area east of the proposed new boundary, from Crown holding.

2.2 The Council shall not be held liable to the landowners if due to matters beyond its control or influence, the land owners are prohibited either by statute or otherwise from proceeding with the exchange of land between the owners and the Crown.

2.3 The Council proposes that owners of land within the Scheme Area shown on the Scheme Map for in-clusion in the Yalgorup National Park shall transfer that land free of cost to the Crown for National Park purposes and the Crown shall concurrently transfer to the owners that land alienated from the National Park pursuant to Clause 2.1.

2.4 The Council further proposes that the land to be transferred by owners to the Crown for National Park purposes and the Crown land to be transferred to the owners pursuant to Clause 2.3 shall, subject to survey, be in accordance with Scheule No. 1 and the sketch appended thereto.

PART III-Subdivision Requirements.

3.1 Plan of Subdivision:

- 3.1.1 Subdivision of land within the Scheme Area shall generally accord with the subdivisional concept plan shown on the Scheme Map and in accordance with the provisions of this Part.
- 3.1.2 Notwithstanding sub-clause 3.1.1 the Town Planning Board may approve variations to the subdivisional concept plan provided that any such approval is only given—
  - (a) where the Town Planning Board, fol-lowing consultation with the Council, is satisfied that the objectives of the Scheme will still be capable of achievement:
  - (b) where it can be demonstrated that the variations proposed will not prejudice the proper and orderly subdivision of the remainder of the land within the Scheme Area.
- 3.1.3 Notwithstanding Clauses 3.1.1 and 3.1.2 the Board shall not approve any subdivision which, in its opinion, would prejudice a Parliamentary decision on the proposed relocation of the National Park boundary.
- 3.2 Road and Pedestrian Accessway Construction:
  - 3.2.1 All roads shall consist of a pavement 9.8 metres wide with a sealed carriageway of 7.4 metres unless agreed otherwise by Council.

Kerbing shall be provided at corners and/or where wash aways are likely to occur as determined by Council. All roads shall be constructed to the satisfaction of the Council.

3.2.2 All pedestrian accessways shall be 10 metres in width and shall be constructed of com-pressed limestone to the satisfaction of Coun-cil so that they are capable of being used as alternative fire escape exits from the subdivision area.

3.3 Strategic Fire Breaks:

- 3.3.1 The Scheme Map shows several strategic fire breaks including one along the proposed new boundary between the private land and the National Park. This latter strategic fire break shall be a minimum width of 10 metres and shall be established within an easement to the satisfaction of the Council, Bush Fires Board and the National Parks Authority allowing unimpeded access along its entire length to four wheel drive fire fighting vehicles.
- 3.3.2 All strategic fire breaks shall be constructed by the subdivider, in whose land the strategic fire break or portion thereof falls, to the speci-fication and satisfaction of the Council.
- 3.3.3 Fire breaks other than strategic fire breaks as described in the preceding clauses shall comply with the provisions of the firebreak order issued by the Shire of Mandurah.

3.4 Water Supply: All lots of less than 4 hectares in area shall be connected to a reticulated water supply system and such system shall be installed prior to final approval by the Town Planning Board of a plan of subdivision creating lots of less than 4 hectares.

- 3.5 Land Contributions:
  - 3.5.1 Land shown to be set aside for the purpose of parks and recreation on the Scheme Map shall be transferred to the Crown prior to final approval by the Town Planning Board of a plan of subdivision within which the proposed reserve for parks and recreation or part thereof falls.
  - 3.5.2 Land shown on the Scheme Map for the purpose of road widening to the Old Coast Road shall be transferred free of cost to the Main Roads Department prior to final approval by the Town Planning Board of a plan of subdivision within which the proposed road widening or part thereof falls.

Fence: The subdivision area is to be separated 3.6 from the National Park by a Cyclone fence. The fence is to be constructed at the cost of the subdivider to the specification and satisfaction of the subdivider to the specification and satisfaction of the Council in consultation with the National Parks Authority and is to be aligned along the eastern and northern align-ments of the strategic fire break shown on the Scheme Map running along the common boundary of the de-velopment area and the National Park.

- PART IV-Land Use and Development Requirements. 4.1 Land Use:
  - 4.1.1 With respect to land use requirements this Scheme prevails over District Zoning Scheme 1A to the extent of any inconsistency.
  - 4.1.2 Within the Scheme Area the following uses are permitted:
    - (i) Single dwelling house.
    - (ii) Rural pursuits.
  - 4.1.3 Within the Scheme Area the following uses are permitted only if special approval is granted by the Council:
    - (i) Forestry.
    - (ii) Wayside stall.
    - (iii) Stables.
  - 4.1.4 Within the Scheme Area the following uses are not permitted unless special approval is given by the Council after the proposal has
    - been advertised: (i) Private recreation.
      - (ii) Bee keeping.

      - (iii) Health farm.

[5 October 1984.

4.1.5 Within the Scheme Area each of the follow-ing uses is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Council:—

(i) Home occupation.

(ii) Parks, recreation and playing fields.

- 4.1.6 The use of land or buildings for the breed-ing or keeping of animals for commercial gain, or intensive agricultural pursuits for com-mercial gain, shall not be permitted.
- 4.1.7 All other uses not mentioned in the pre-ceeding subclauses are not permitted.
- 4.2 Development Requirements:
  - 4.2.1 So far as is practicable the rural character of the area shall be maintained and native trees shall be retained.
  - 4.2.2 Subject to Clause 4.1 not more than one dwelling shall be constructed on any lot.
  - 4.2.3 No building shall be erected other than within the building envelopes prescribed for each lot as shown on the Scheme Map. How-ever, the Council may at its discretion re-locate the building envelope on any particular lot subject to it being satisfied that any pro-posed relocation would not affect the amenity of adjoining lots or the Scheme Area generally.
  - 4.2.4 Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 4.2.3 no building shall be constructed or building envelope located closer to the front boundary of a lot than 15 metres or closer than 10 metres to any other boundary.
  - 4.2.5 No building shall be erected within the areas notated as Tree Preservation Areas on the Scheme Map.
  - 4.2.6 Excepting lots connected to a reticulated water supply, no dwelling house shall be con-structed unless a domestic water supply consisting of at least an adequate roof catchment area and a water storage tank of not less thau ninety thousand litres (90 000 litres) is incorporated in the plans and specification of the building and constructed at the same time as the building.
  - 4.2.7 The owner or occupier of a lot shall not keep or permit to be kept on the lot or any part thereof any one or more of the following animals; namely, a kangaroo, or any animal within the definition of "cattle" in section 6 of the Local Government Act 1960, unless a fence capable of preventing the escape of such animal or animal is created upon the lot or animal or animals is erected upon the lot or the part thereof upon which such animal or animals are kept in accordance with standards to be approved by the Council and shall not keep or permit to be kept there any other animal without the prior consent of the Coun-cil which consent may be granted subject to such conditions as the Council thinks fit.
  - 4.2.8 No building shall be constructed in such manner or of such materials that it would in the opinion of the Council adversely affect local amenities.
  - Without prejudice to the preceding, the Council may in any particular case or in re-spect of any particular area or areas impose 4.2.9 additional restrictions or requirements.

PART V-General Provisions.

5.1 Tree Preservation Areas:

- 5.1.1 No person shall remove or cause to be removed any tree within the land notated as Tree Preservation Areas on the Scheme Map without the prior written approval of the Council.
- 5.1.2 The removal of trees associated with driveway construction to allow for the carrying out of development for which the Council has

granted approval pursuant to Part IV of the Scheme, shall be deemed to be the subject of written approval of the Council. 5.1.3 The Tree Preservation Area is to be main-tained as a low fuel area to the satisfaction of the Council in consultation with the Bush Eires Board Fires Board.

5.2 Land Management and Conservation of Areas of Natural Beauty:

- 5.2.1 Irrespective of whether land is within a Tree Preservation Area, no person shall denude land within the Scheme Area of trees or manage or over-stock land in such a way that the land becomes capable of erosion by wind.
- 5.2.2 Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 5.2.1 land shall be cleared of undergrowth, long grasses and other fire fuel at the direction of Council.

PART VI-Finance and Administration.

6.1 Powers of the Council: The Council in the conduct and management of the Scheme has, in addition to all other powers vested in it, the following powers:-

- (a) to permit its officers and employees to enter and inspect any building within the Scheme Area:
- (b) to enter into agreements and arrangements with owners of land within the Scheme Area for the purpose of fostering the objectives of the Scheme:
- (c) to acquire land or buildings for the purposes of carrying out the objectives of the Scheme.

6.2 Disposal of Land: The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agree-mate with other owners on it doesne for ments with other owners as it deems fit.

6.3 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

6.4 Appeals: Any owner who is aggrieved by a decision of Council acting under a discretionary power pursuant to the Scheme may appeal against that decision under the provision of the Act and the Rules and Regulations made thereunder.


