Department of Marine and Harbours,
 Fremantle, 26 September 1984.

ACTING pursuant to the powers conferred by Regulation 48A of the Navigable Waters Regulations, the Department of Marine and Harbours by this notice:—

- (i) Defines and sets aside the following areas of navigable waters for the purpose of water skiing and orders that bathing shall be prohibited therein:—

OCEAN AREAS.

(a) CITY OF BUNBURY—BUNBURY-KOOMBANA BAY:

- (i) Point Macleod: All that area of water from a point off the northwest end of the groyne in the Koombana Channel 290 metres due north thence 180 metres west thence 290 metres south and thence easterly along the shoreline to the starting point.
- (ii) Ocean Cut (Power House): All that area of water from a point on the northwest corner of the power house wall in a northwest direction for 100 metres, thence in a northeast direction for 1 400 metres, thence in a southeast direction for 200 metres to meet the shoreline.

This area is not suitable for water skiing during on-shore winds.

(b) SHIRE OF BUSSELTON—GEOGRAPHE BAY: All the waters of Geographe Bay between Castle Rock and Wonnerup Inlet excepting the following:—

- (i) That area of water from a point on the foreshore 100 metres west of the boat launching ramp at the foot of Dolphin Road to a point on the foreshore 100 metres west of the foot of Carey Street and for a distance of 2 000 metres to seaward.

- (ii) All the waters within 300 metres of shore providing that the following areas may be used as take off and set-down points:—

(a) East Busselton: All the waters extending 300 metres to seaward from the foreshore between a point 100 metres west of the foot of Carey Street and a point 100 metres west of the foot of Georgette Street.

(b) West Busselton: All the waters contained within an area commencing 100 metres west of the boat launching ramp at the foot of Dolphin Road for a distance of 450 metres west along the foreshore and extending 300 metres to seaward.

- (c) West Busselton: All the waters contained within an area commencing 50 metres west of the boat launching ramp at Newton Beach for a distance of 450 metres west along the foreshore and extending 300 metres to seaward.
- (d) Quindalup: All the waters contained within an area commencing at the eastern boundary of Reserve A46 and continuing for a distance of 200 metres westwards along the foreshore and extending 300 metres seaward.
- (e) Siesta Park: All that water contained within an area commencing at the Siesta Park Groyne for a distance of 300 metres east along the foreshore and extending 300 metres to seaward.
- (c) SHIRE OF ESPERANCE—ESPERANCE BAY: All waters within a line commencing at a point $320^{\circ} 215$ metres from the breakwater light, thence in a 210° direction for 600 metres, thence in a 120° direction to the breakwater.
- Again from the previously mentioned point $320^{\circ} 215$ metres from the breakwater light 120° for a distance of 140 metres to the breakwater extension.
- This water ski area is closed during shipping operations and to all craft other than those engaged in water skiing at all times.
- (d) SHIRE OF EXMOUTH:
- (i) LEARMONTH: All that water contained within an area commencing at a point on the foreshore 260 metres south of the ramp adjacent to the old "Potshot" operations jetty (Lat. $22^{\circ} 11' 30'' S$ Longitude $114^{\circ} 05' 00'' E$ approximately); thence due east for 305 metres; thence due north for 520 metres; thence due west for approximately 305 metres to the foreshore.
- (ii) EXMOUTH: All the water contained within an area commencing at a point on the foreshore of Exmouth Gulf in Latitude $21^{\circ} 57.1' S$ Longitude $114^{\circ} 08' E$ thence in a due east direction for 2 kilometres; thence due south for 2 kilometres; thence due west to the foreshore.
- (e) FREMANTLE OUTER HARBOUR:
- (i) ROTTNEST ISLAND-THOMSON BAY: Commencing at a point 15 metres east of the Army Jetty; thence in an 045° direction for 610 metres; thence easterly to Phillip Rock; thence in a south-southwesterly direction to Phillip Point provided that no boat or skier shall approach within 45 metres of the foreshore except at the take-off area 60 metres in width and situated immediately eastwards of the above commencement point.
- (ii) COOGEE: All the waters of Cockburn Sound contained within an area measuring 75 metres along the foreshore and extending 370 metres to seaward and situated immediately south of the Anchorage Abattoir, Coogee.
- (iii) JERVOISE BAY: All the waters of Cockburn Sound contained within an area commencing at a point on the foreshore 75 metres south of the "Alacrity" wreck, thence extending 310 metres in a westerly direction; thence 370 metres in a southerly direction; thence 245 metres in an easterly direction; thence 270 metres in a northerly direction; thence in an easterly direction to the shore. Provided that no boat or skier shall approach within 60 metres of the shoreline except at the take-off area and which extends 100 metres along the foreshore from the point of commencement.
- (iv) KWINANA: All the waters of Cockburn Sound contained within an area commencing at a point on the foreshore being the prolongation of the southern side of Weld Street, Kwinana, and extending 310 metres to seaward; thence 370 metres in a southerly direction parallel to the foreshore; thence 245 metres in an easterly direction; thence 270 metres in a northerly direction parallel to the foreshore; thence easterly to the shore. Provided that no boat or skier shall approach within 60 metres of the shoreline except at the take-off area and which extends 100 metres along the foreshore south of the aforesaid starting point.
- (v) PALM BEACH: All the waters of Cockburn Sound contained within an area commencing at a point on the foreshore 75 metres west of the Palm Beach Launching Ramp (west); thence in a northerly direction for 750 metres; thence in a westerly direction for 840 metres; thence in a southeasterly direction for 950 metres to a point on the foreshore 210 metres west of the boat launching ramp.
- (f) TOWN OF GERALDTON—GERALDTON INNER HARBOUR:
- (i) That area of water in Geraldton Inner Harbour which has been dredged to 9.8 metres RL bounded by a line from the eastern end of No. 1 berth to the East Breakwater light thence to the NE end of No. 5 berth so however that no boat or skier shall approach closer than 60 metres from any berth. Skiers operating in this area must keep clear of cargo vessels approaching or leaving the harbour berths. With the absence of beach take-off areas skiers are advised that take-off and landings must be confined to deep water.
- (ii) All the water contained within an area, starting from a point on the Geraldton Foreshore opposite Lot 69 ($28^{\circ} 46' 31'' S$ — $114^{\circ} 36' 22'' E$), thence in a northerly direction to a Nor-Nor Easterly direction to a point in the water 200 metres offshore from the prolongation of Phelps Street ($28^{\circ} 45' 53'' S$ — $114^{\circ} 36' 48'' E$) thence in a general south westerly direction to the starting point.
- No boat or skier shall approach within 20 metres of the rockwall except for landing and take-off purposes which are permitted at the beach opposite Lot 69.
- All water skiing within this area shall be in an anti-clockwise direction.
- (g) SHIRE OF IRWIN—PORT DENISON:
- (i) All the water contained in an area commencing at a point on the foreshore 50 metres north of the northern breakwater thence in a 290° direction for a distance of 250 metres but so that no boat or skier shall approach within 50 metres of the breakwater; thence due north for 500 metres; thence due east to a point 60 metres offshore; thence in a southerly direc-

tion to a point 120 metres from the breakwater; thence in a southeasterly direction to the foreshore provided that no boat or skier shall approach within 60 metres of the foreshore except at the take-off area and which extends 70 metres along the foreshore in a northerly direction from the commencing point.

All water skiing in this area shall be in an anti-clockwise direction.

- (ii) All the water contained in an area commencing at a point on the southern boundary of area (i) situated due north of the elbow of the northern breakwater thence in a 250° direction for a distance of 400 metres but so that no boat or skier shall approach within 50 metres of the breakwater thence due north for 100 metres; thence in a 070° direction to a point on the eastern boundary of area (i).

All water skiing in this area shall be in an anti-clockwise direction PROVIDED HOWEVER that skiing is prohibited whilst the area is occupied by any vessel at anchor or any other moored vessel or object.

(h) **SHIRE OF MANDURAH—MANDURAH:**

All the waters contained within an area commencing at a point opposite the adjoining boundaries of Lots 2 and 3 of Ormsby Terrace, thence in a northwesterly direction for a distance of 150 metres; thence in a westerly direction for a distance of 150 metres; thence in a southwesterly direction 250 metres from and parallel to the foreshore for a distance of 660 metres; thence in a northwesterly direction for a distance of 400 metres; thence in a northeasterly direction for a distance of 920 metres; thence in a southwesterly direction for a distance of 650 metres to a point on the foreshore opposite the adjoining boundaries of Lots 10 and 11 Ormsby Terrace, 160 metres northeast of the initial starting point.

(i) **SHIRE OF NORTHAMPTON—PORT GREGORY:**

All waters between a line commencing at a point on the foreshore 0.8 km southeast of the Port Gregory jetty and extending in a southerly direction to the reef and a line commencing at a point on the foreshore 1.5 km southeast of the Port Gregory jetty and extending in a southerly direction to the reef.

Provided that no boat or skier shall within 20 metres of the beach or reef except for landing or take-off purposes.

(j) **SHIRE OF PORT HEDLAND—PORT HEDLAND-DOWNES ISLAND:**

That rectangular area of water enclosed within boundary lines commencing at a start point on the mainland bearing 165° from benchmark PA 21 on Finucane Island 900 metres; thence in a southwesterly direction a distance of 2 000 metres; thence in a northwesterly direction a distance of 600 metres; thence in a northeasterly direction a distance of 2 000 metres; thence in a southeasterly direction to the start point; but excluding the gazetted swimming area where boating is prohibited.

(k) **SHIRE OF ROCKINGHAM—**

- (i) **SAFETY BAY:** All those waters of Warnbro Sound bounded by lines commencing on the foreshore by the prolongation of Ernest Road, Safety Bay, thence in a southwesterly direction to Passage Rock; thence extending southeasterly to Becher Point.

Provided that no boat or skier shall approach within 300 metres of the foreshore except at the only beach take-off site at Summons Way, Safety Bay, extending for 300 metres along the foreshore and marked by signs.

Direction of skiing in this area is anti-clockwise.

- (ii) **SHOALWATER BAY:** All the waters seaward between a point on the foreshore 45 metres north of Boundary Road and Cape Peron but that no boat or skier shall approach within 90 metres of the shore except between the point on the foreshore 45 metres north of Boundary Road and a point 275 metres in a northerly direction which shall be the take-off area.

(l) **SHIRE OF ROEBOURNE—**

- (i) **PORT OF DAMPIER:** All the waters contained between East Inter-course Island foreshore from the causeway to the point situated 1 675 metres to the northeast and seaward in a southerly direction for a distance of 380 metres to the north side of the Hamersley Iron small boat harbour inner channel excluding the confines of the small boat harbour.

- (ii) **PORT WALCOTT—COSSACK-BUTCHERS INLET:** All that water contained within an area commencing 50 metres northeast of the Cossack boat launching ramp and extending 600 metres along the foreshore in a northeasterly direction and for a distance of 300 metres into the water.

(m) **SHIRE OF WANNEROO—WHITFORDS-MULLALOO:**

All that water contained within an area commencing at a point on the foreshore 300 metres north of the Pinnaroo Point Boat Launching Ramp, thence extending seawards towards Flat Rock for a distance of 400 metres; thence in a north-northwesterly direction for 1 450 metres thence in an easterly direction for 700 metres to a finishing point on the foreshore 400 metres south of the Mullaloo Surf Life Saving Clubhouse.

Provided that no boat or skier shall approach within 100 metres of the foreshore in this area except within the take-off area and which extends for 150 metres north of the abovementioned point of commencement.

Provided also that on Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays water skiing in this area shall not take place after 12 noon.

INLAND WATERS.

(n) **SWAN RIVER—**

- (i) All the waters from a position 580 metres upstream of the Garratt Road Bridge and extending upstream to a position 235 metres downstream of the Ascot Swimming Jetties. This area is set aside for the training of members of Barefoot Division of the W.A. Water Ski Association only and is not to be used for any other purpose unless approved by the Department.

- (ii) Between a line from a spit post at or about the centre of Belmont Park Racecourse due east to the bank and a line between the two chimneys of the Swan Portland Cement Works on southern bank and the chimneys of the brickworks on the northern bank. This area shall not be used for water skiing between the hours of 12 noon and 5.00 p.m. on those Sunday afternoons that the Maylands Yacht Club is conducting races.

- (iii) Between a line drawn from the southwestern extremity of Heirisson Island to a point on the South Perth foreshore 600 metres west of the prolongation of Ellam Street, South Perth, and a line drawn from a point on Heirisson Island 375 metres upstream from the north end of the southern causeway span to a point

on the Victoria Park foreshore 580 metres upstream from the south end of the southern causeway span. This area is set aside for the teaching and training of competition skiing by members of the Western Australian Water Ski Association.

WATER SKIERS ARE CONFINED TO THE FOLLOWING SWAN RIVER AREAS ON SATURDAYS, SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS, AT ALL OTHER TIMES WATER SKIING IS PERMITTED ON ALL WATERS OF THE SWAN RIVER DOWNSTREAM OF THE NARROWS BRIDGE WITH THE EXCEPTION OF GAZETTED SPEED LIMIT AREAS AND SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE NAVIGABLE WATERS REGULATIONS.

- (iv) Within a line extending 460 metres in a westerly direction from the prolongation of Jutland Parade, Dalkeith; thence 800 metres in a northwesterly direction to the beacon on Karrakatta Bank; thence in an east-northeasterly direction to the shore but so that no boat or skier shall approach within 90 metres of the shore other than in an area extending 305 metres along the foreshore from the said prolongation of Jutland Parade which shall be the take-off area.
- (v) From the prolongation of Osborne Parade 305 metres from shore in an easterly direction in a direct line to the southeast end of the Claremont Jetty; thence in a southerly direction for 675 metres and then 305 metres in a westerly direction to meet the shore at the foot of Forrest Street.
This water ski area shall be a deep water take-off only.
- (vi) Between all that area of water within 305 metres of the shore for a distance of 610 metres to the northwest of Chidley Point, thence in the same direction for a further 230 metres tapering to 230 metres of the shore at the northwesterly extremity of the area, but so that no boat or skier shall approach within 60 metres of the shore except at Chidley Point.
- (vii) All the waters of the Swan River contained within an area bounded on the north by an imaginary line drawn from Bricklanding Pile to North Point Walter Spit thence to the extremity of Point Walter Spit and bounded on the south by the foreshore between the extremity of Point Walter Spit and a limit of ski area sign situated on the foreshore 536 metres southeast of the Point Walter Jetty but so that no boat or skier shall approach within 60 metres of the Point Walter Jetty or within 76 metres of the foreshore between the jetty and a further limit of ski area sign situated 285 metres southeast of the jetty.
- (viii) Within a line extending 475 metres from Heathcote Point, Applecross, in a northeasterly direction, thence in a northwesterly direction for 230 metres; thence southwesterly for 1 070 metres and thence due south to the shore, but so that no boat or skier shall approach within 90 metres of the shore except within an area on the foreshore extending for 150 metres in a southwesterly direction from Heathcote Point as a take-off area, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 2 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays.

(ix) Within a line extending from the groyne at Mill Point, South Perth in a westerly direction for 455 metres; thence in a south-southwesterly direction for 1 525 metres to the Pelican Rocks Beacon; thence in a northeasterly direction for 1 370 metres to a point on the foreshore, being the prolongation of Judd Street, South Perth, so that no water skier shall approach within 45 metres of the foreshore except at the take-off area.

(x) Within a radius of 340 metres from a point on the foreshore 70 metres downstream from the Queen Street Jetty, South Perth.

This site is reserved for commercial ski schools only.

(o) CANNING RIVER: All that area of water within the following boundaries:—

- (i) On Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays whilst rowing regattas are not in progress—All the waters of the Canning River between a line drawn 100 metres upstream and parallel to Canning Bridge and a line drawn 100 metres downstream and parallel, to a line joining Fifth Avenue at Rossmoyne and Salters Point, but so that no boat or skier shall approach within 60 metres of the foreshore on the west bank between Canning Bridge and Deepwater Point or between Queens Road and the junction of Bull Creek or within 60 metres of the southern foreshore at Rossmoyne between the junction of Bull Creek and the point 100 metres downstream of Fifth Avenue, or within 60 metres of the northern foreshore of Aquinas Bay from the foot of Sulman Avenue to a sign on the foreshore on the eastern side of Mt. Henry.

No water ski take-off or landing shall be permitted from the Manning foreshore between a point 100 metres upstream of Canning Bridge and Mt. Henry Bridge except from a point on this foreshore being 73 metres south of the prolongation of the southern side of Edgewater Road and extending for 100 metres in a southerly direction along the foreshore.

All water skiing within this area shall be in an anti-clockwise direction and no person shall engage in water skiing except between the hours of 9.00 a.m. and sunset.

It shall also be a condition of water skiing in this area that water ski boats shall observe the ENTRY and NO ENTRY signs on the spans of the Mt. Henry Bridge and that no boat being within 300 metres of either side of the Mt. Henry Bridge shall turn across the directional line of traffic.

- (ii) On Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays whilst authorised rowing regattas are in progress that portion of the area defined in sub-paragraph (i) between Canning Bridge and Mt. Henry Bridge shall not be used by water skiers except during those hours between 9 a.m. and sunset which do not conflict with the holding of rowing regattas the hours of which have been duly authorised by the Department of Marine and Harbours.

- (iii) On Mondays to Fridays (not including public holidays)—All the waters of the Canning River between a line drawn from Deepwater Point due east to the Manning foreshore and a line drawn 100 metres downstream, and parallel to a line joining Fifth Avenue at Rossmoyne and Salters Point but so that no boat or skier shall approach within 60 metres of the foreshore on the west bank between Queens Road and the junction of Bull Creek or within 60 metres of the southern foreshore at Rossmoyne between the junction of Bull Creek and the point 100 metres downstream of Fifth Avenue, or within 60 metres of the northern foreshore of Aquinas Bay from the foot of Sulman Avenue to a sign on the foreshore on the eastern side of Mt. Henry.
- No water ski take-off or landing shall be permitted on the Manning foreshore except from a point on the foreshore being 73 metres south of the prolongation of the southern side of Edgewater Road and extending for 100 metres in a southerly direction along the foreshore.
- All water skiing within this area shall be in an anti-clockwise direction and no person shall engage in water skiing except between the hours of 9.00 a.m. and sunset.
- It shall also be a condition of water skiing in this area that water ski boats shall observe the ENTRY and NO ENTRY signs on the spans of the Mt. Henry Bridge and that no boats being within 300 metres of either side of the Mt. Henry Bridge shall turn across the directional line of traffic.
- The area north of the line drawn from Deepwater Point due east to the Manning foreshore is gazetted with an 8 knot speed limit and is prohibited to water skiing.
- (p) SHIRE OF ALBANY—KALGAN RIVER: All that portion of the Kalgan River bounded on the south by a line drawn westward from the northern boundary of Plantagenet Location 517 and extending northwards to a line drawn eastwards from the southern boundary of Plantagenet Location 241.
- This area has been set aside for use by the West Australian Water Ski Association and is under the control of the Albany Water Ski Club.
- (q) TOWN OF ALBANY—OYSTER HARBOUR: Within a radius of 1350 metres from a point situated on the eastern limit of Albany townsite boundary and extending for a distance of 50 metres into the water from the eastern foreshore of Emu Point channel in a southerly direction to a point 110 metres north of the rock known locally as Ringbolt Rock.
- (r) SHIRE OF AUGUSTA-MARGARET RIVER—
- (i) AUGUSTA: All the waters lying within the Hardy Inlet known as the Deadwater.
- (ii) BLACKWOOD RIVER: All that portion of the Blackwood River extending 2 000 metres north and 930 metres south of the area known as Twineham's Bend and which is situated approximately 15 kilometres north of Augusta townsite.
- (s) SHIRE OF CARNAMAH—LAKE INDOON: All the waters of Lake Indoon with the exception of an area on the northern foreshore commencing at a point 100 metres west of the western side of the boat launching ramp continuing for a distance of 120 metres along the foreshore in a westerly direction and extending 60 metres into the lake which is set aside as a swimming area and defined by markers.
- (t) SHIRE OF CARNARVON—GASCOYNE RIVER: All that portion of the northern arm of the Gascoyne River from the mouth 4 km. approximately upstream known as "Dwyers Leap".
- (u) SHIRE OF CRANBROOK—
- (i) LAKE POORARECUP: All the waters of Lake Poorarecup with the exception of an area on the eastern shore measuring 200 metres along the shore and 183 metres into the water set aside as a swimming area and defined by markers.
- (ii) LAKE UNICUP: All that area of water within lines extending from surveyed peg E50 on the northwest shore of the lake in a southeasterly direction for 134 metres; thence in a northwesterly direction for approximately 134 metres.
- (iii) LAKE NUNIJUP: All of the waters of Lake Nunijup with the exception of a swimming area contained within a radius of 137 metres from a marker post erected at the eastern most corner of Reserve 29175.
- (v) SHIRE OF DANDARAGAN—LAKE NAMMING: All the waters of Lake Namming with the exception of an area on the eastern shore being that area for a distance 300 metres south of the launching area and 60 metres from the mean water level or tree line which is set aside as a swimming area and defined by markers.
- (w) SHIRE OF DENMARK—WILSONS INLET:
- (i) All that area of water defined and coloured red on Lands and Surveys Department registered plan Miscellaneous 351.
- (ii) All the water in the vicinity of Rudyard Beach and contained within an area commencing at the southern most extremity of Black Point; thence in a southerly direction for 410 metres; thence in a westerly direction for 1 190 metres; thence in a northerly direction for 365 metres to the southern extremity of Rabbit Island; thence in an easterly direction for 1100 metres; thence in a northerly direction to the shoreline.
- (x) SHIRE OF DUMBLYUNG—LAKE DUMBLEYUNG: All that area of Lake Dumbleyung contained within Reserve 26665, with the exception of an area commencing 9 metres southeast of the launching ramp and extending 45 metres southeast by 33 metres north which is set aside as a swimming area and defined by markers.
- (y) SHIRE OF GREENOUGH—GREENOUGH RIVER: From an imaginary line drawn from a point on the northern foreshore on a bearing of approximately 290 degrees from the southeast corner of Lot 4200, thence across the river to the southern foreshore in a direction of 220 degrees, to a second imaginary line from a point on the northern foreshore due west of the junction of Greenough River Road and Murray Road thence across the river to the southern foreshore in a direction of 180 degrees as marked by signs. Providing however that this area is set aside for slalom skiing only on the slalom course marked by buoys.

(z) SHIRE OF HARVEY—

(i) LAKE PRESTON: All the waters of Lake Preston within an area commencing at a point on the western foreshore being the Water Ski Club Building; thence 1.5 kilometres due north; thence 1.1 kilometres due east; thence 2 kilometres due south; thence 1.1 kilometres due west; thence 0.5 kilometres north to the starting point. Provided that no boat or skier shall approach within 60 metres of the foreshore within this area except at the take-off area and which extends for 250 metres north and south of the Ski Club Building.

(ii) LOGUE BROOK DAM: All the waters of Logue Brook Dam contained within an area extending from the Dam Head to the northern end of the saddle embankment, a distance of approximately 2 590 metres. The width of the area is approximately 245 metres in the centre of the Dam, and the boating public and water skiers are advised that in view of the numerous submerged and semi-submerged tree stumps on the shoreline they should not approach the shoreline except at the recognised take-off and landing areas. These take-off areas are situated at the northern end of the saddle embankment and on the southern foreshore approximately 965 metres upstream of the Dam Head.

No boat or water skier shall approach within 50 metres of the swimming area which is marked by a post at each end and situated at the southern end of the saddle embankment.

The rotation of all water skiing on the Dam shall be in an anti-clockwise direction.

(za) SHIRE OF KATANNING—EWLYAMARTUP LAKE: All the water of Ewlyamartup Lake with the exception of an area on the western shore of the Lake measuring 90 metres along the shore and 76 metres into the water set aside as a swimming area and defined by markers.

(zb) SHIRE OF MURRAY—

(i) PEEL INLET: All waters lying within an area commencing at a point in Latitude 32°35'30"S Longitude 115°44'30"E (approximately), being the pile beacon to mark the western extremity of the Yunderup Canals approach channel, thence due south for 800 metres; thence due west for 400 metres; thence due north for 800 metres; thence due east for 400 metres to the starting point.

(ii) HARVEY ESTUARY: All that water within an area commencing at a single pile situated 420 metres east of the Dawesville boat launching ramp; thence in an 060° direction for 1 750 metres; thence in a 184° direction for 1 750 metres; thence in a 249° direction for 700 metres; thence in a 325° direction for 1 350 metres to the starting point.

6. If it is considered impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or remove inflammable material as required by this notice you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than 15 December 1984, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative measures to abate fire hazards on the land. Any such application must bear the signature of the Fire Control Officer for the area signifying his agreement to the variation. If permission is not granted, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The Council forwards a copy of an abridged firebreak order each year to all landholders. The Firebreak Order is also published in the *Warren Blackwood Time* and additional copies are available from the Shire Office. The requirements of this order are considered to be the minimum standard of fire prevention work required to prevent not only individual properties but the district generally. In addition to this order Council may issue separate special orders to owners or occupiers if hazard removal is considered necessary in some specific area.

Establishment of Brigade.

3. (a) On the resolution of the Council to establish and maintain a bush fire brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954, and Regulations thereunder, the brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the brigade.

(b) A bush fire brigade may be established for the whole of the Shire or for any specified area thereof.

Appointment of Officers.

4. The brigade members shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as they shall deem necessary to act as officers of the brigade, and shall notify the Council of such appointments.

5. The brigade members shall appoint a secretary of the brigade and shall notify the Council of such appointment.

6. The Council may appoint an equipment officer who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Council for the purpose of the brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depot in the area, the equipment officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

Duties of Officers.

7. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations.

Membership of Brigade.

8. Brigade members shall be those persons of either sex over 15 years who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.

Meetings of Brigades.

9. Meetings of the brigade will be held as necessary, however, a minimum of one meeting per year will be held.

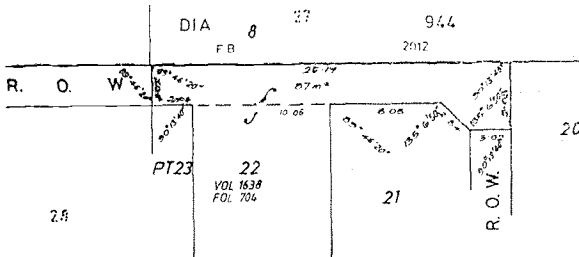

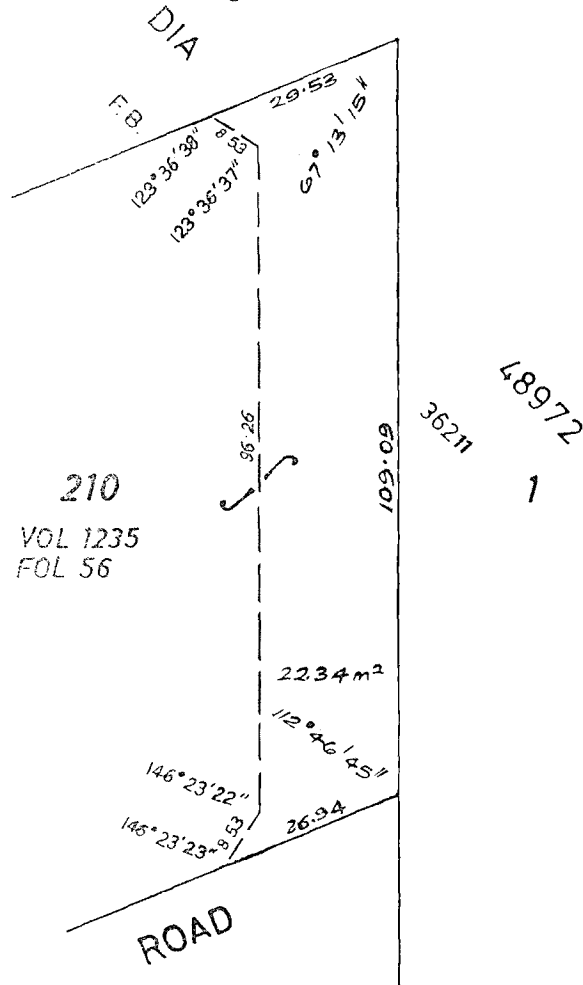

- “Act” means the Local Government Act 1960 (as amended);
- “advertising device” means any object on which words or numbers or figures are written, placed, affixed or painted for the purpose of advertising any business, function, operation or other activity and includes any vehicle or trailer or other similar stationary object placed or located so as to serve the purpose of advertising any business, function, event, product or undertaking;
- “billposting” means the sticking of any bill or painting, stencilling or affixing any advertisement on any building, structure, fence, wall, hoarding, signpost, pole, blind or awning, so as to be visible to any person in a street, public place, public reserve or other land;
- “Building Surveyor” means the Building Surveyor appointed by the Council from time to time and includes any acting Building Surveyor or Deputy Building Surveyor;
- “Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the City of Melville;
- “development sign” means a sign or signs erected on an area of land which has been approved for subdivision into a number of smaller lots, advertising the lots for sale but upon which no building development has taken place at the time of approval of the sign or signs;
- “direction sign” means a sign erected in a street or public place to indicate the direction to another place but does not include any such sign erected or affixed by Council or the Commissioner of Main Roads or a road direction sign erected or affixed by a duly incorporated association or union of motorists authorised in that regard by the Minister for the time being administering the Road Traffic Act 1974 (as amended);
- “display home sign” means a sign or signs erected on a lot on which a home is erected where the lot and house have been approved by the Building Surveyor as meeting Council’s requirements for a display home including the provision of the required parking;
- “fly posting” means advertising by means of posters placed on fences, walls, trees, or other structure or objects, without authority and in contravention of By-law 4.11;
- “hoarding” means a detached or detachable structure other than a pylon sign that is erected for the sole purpose of displaying a sign or signs and includes a posted panel, a wall panel or an illuminated panel but does not include a hoarding within the meaning of section 377 of the Act;
- “horizontal sign” means a sign fixed parallel to the wall of a building to which it is attached and with its largest dimension horizontal;
- “illuminated panel” means a posted or painted advertisement externally illuminated by an artificial source of light.
- “illuminated sign” means a sign that is so arranged as to be capable of being lighted either from within or without the sign by artificial light provided, or mainly provided, for that purpose;
- “information panel” means a panel used for displaying Government and Local Authority notices, functional and dated announcements or a religious, educational, cultural, recreational or similar character, general information for the benefit of the public and travellers, and general commercial advertising;
- “institutional sign” means a sign erected or placed on any land or building used for, or in connection with, a surgery, clinic, hospital, rest home, home for the aged, or other institution or place of a similar nature;
- “projection sign” means a sign that is made by the projection of light on a wall or similar structure;

"pylon sign" means a sign supported by one or more piers and not attached to a building and includes a detached sign supported on one or more piers to which sign infills may be added;

"roof sign" means a sign erected on the roof of a building;

"sale sign" means a sign indicating that the premises whereon it is affixed are for sale, for letting or to be auctioned;

"semaphore sign" means a sign affixed and supported at, or by, one of its ends only;

"sign" includes a signboard, a portable sign or a bunting sign and a clock other than a clock which is built into a wall and does not project beyond the face of the wall, and flags and bunting which carry no written message;

"sign infill" means a panel which can be fitted into a pylon sign framework;

"tower sign" means a sign affixed to or placed on a chimney stack or open structural mast or tower;

"verandah", for the purpose of these by-laws, includes cantilever awnings, cantilever verandahs and balconies whether over public streets and ways or over private land;

"verandah signs" includes signs above verandah fascias, signs on verandah fascias and signs under verandahs;

"vertical sign" means a sign attached to a building in which the vertical dimension exceeds the horizontal dimension exclusive of the back projection;

"wall panel" means a panel used for displaying a posted or painted advertisement and affixed to or adjoining the wall of business premises or erected on the forecourt of such business premises.

2.2 Words and expressions used have the same respective meaning as is given in the Act.

3. LICENCES.

3.1 Licences and Exemptions:

3.1.1 Subject to By-law 3.1.2 and 3.6—

(a) No person shall erect, make or maintain a sign or advertising device except pursuant to a licence issued under the by-laws.

(b) An owner or occupier of premises shall not suffer or permit a sign or advertising device to remain on those premises so as to be visible from a street, public reserve or other public place except pursuant to a licence issued under these by-laws.

3.1.2 The following are exempt from the requirements of these by-laws:

(a) a sign erected or maintained pursuant to any Act having operation within the State;

(b) a sale sign not exceeding 1 m² in area;

(c) a plate not exceeding 0.2 m² in area erected or affixed on the street alignment or between that alignment and the building line to indicate the name and occupation or profession of the occupier of the premises;

(d) signs of use solely for the direction and/or control of people, animals and/or vehicles, or to indicate the name and/or street number of a premises providing the area of any such sign does not exceed 0.2 m²;

(e) advertisements affixed to or painted on a shop window by the occupier thereof and relating to the business carried on therein;

(f) subject to By-law 5.6.4 the name and occupation of any occupier of business premises painted on a window, wall or fence of those premises;

(g) signs not larger than 0.7 m x 0.9 m on advertising pillars or panels approved by or with the consent of the Council for the purpose of displaying public notices for information;

(h) subject to By-law 5.6.4 building name signs on residential flats or home units where they are of a single line of letters not exceeding 450 mm in height, fixed to the facade of the building.

(i) newspaper posters.

3.1.3 Every licence shall be granted and shall subsist subject only to the provisions of these by-laws.

3.1.4 Notwithstanding that a sign or hoarding would otherwise comply with the provisions of these by-laws the Council may refuse a licence if the sign or hoarding would, in its opinion, increase the number or variety of signs so as to become too numerous or various to be acceptable to residents in the area or be injurious to the amenity or natural beauty or safety of the area; or if the sign or hoarding advertises goods or services which are not produced, displayed or offered for sale or otherwise available to the public upon or from the land where the sign or hoarding is erected.

3.2 Revocation of Licences: Council may, without derogation of any penalty to which that person may be liable, by notice in writing revoke a licence:

(a) where anything purporting to be done pursuant to a licence issued under these by-laws is not done in conformity with the licence or with these by-laws or is so altered that, in the opinion of Council, it contravenes By-law 3.1.4; or

(b) where the licensee commits an offence against these by-laws.

3.3 Inspection of Licences:

3.3.1 A licence shall, on demand by an Officer of Council, authorised in that regard, produce his licence for inspection.

3.3.2 Every licensed sign or hoarding shall bear on its face, (on the bottom left hand corner as viewed), in clearly legible figures the number of the licence under which it is erected or displayed.

3.4 Applications for Licences:

3.4.1 An application for a licence under these by-laws shall be made in the form of an application set out in the first schedule hereto.

3.4.2 An application for the first issue of a licence in respect of a sign shall be accompanied by duplicate plans, drawn to a scale of not less than 1 to 50 showing the size, position, design and inscription to appear thereon, the method of construction and fixing of the sign for which the licence is sought, setbacks from street boundaries where applicable together with such further information as Council may reasonably require.

3.4.3 An application for the first issue of a licence in respect of a roof sign or a special pylon sign shall be accompanied by a certificate from a practising Structural Engineer certifying that the building or structure upon which it is proposed to erect the sign is in all respects of sufficient strength to support the sign, under all conditions, and that the sign is itself of structurally sound design.

3.4.4 Every applicant for a licence shall furnish in writing such further particulars as may be required by the Building Surveyor.

3.4.5 If so required by Council an applicant for a licence in respect of an illuminated sign shall produce to Council a written consent to the erection of the sign, signed by or on behalf of the person or body having for the time being the management of traffic control lights.

3.4.6 Subject to By-law 3.2 and except where otherwise stated in these By-laws a licence issued pursuant to the By-laws remains valid until any alteration is proposed to be made to the structure or area of the sign in respect of which it is issued and in that event the licensee shall apply for a new licence.

3.4.7 A licence issued shall be in the form set out in the first schedule to these by-laws.

3.5 Licence Fees: A licence shall be issued upon payment of the appropriate fee set out in the second schedule to these By-laws but the payment of a licence fee pursuant to any by-laws of Council relating to Signs, Hoardings and Billposting and the like, that were in operation prior to the coming into operation of these by-laws is deemed to be a payment for the purposes of this by-law.

3.6 Special Permits:

3.6.1 Notwithstanding anything contained in these by-laws Council may, by permit under the hand of the Building Surveyor, allow the display of advertisements at churches, theatres and other places of public entertainment, election notices or advertisements of meetings or other matters of public interest upon such terms and for such period as Council may in each case decide.

3.6.2 Council may revoke any such permit at any time without assigning any reason for such action.

3.6.3 Upon the expiration or revocation of a permit issued under this by-law the person to whom it was issued shall forthwith remove the advertisement to which it relates and failure so to remove the advertisement is an offence.

4. GENERAL.

4.1 Restrictions: A sign shall not be erected or maintained:

- (a) (i) So as to obstruct or impede all or part of the view which may be enjoyed from a street or public place of the river, the sea or any other place or feature of natural beauty;
- (ii) So as to obstruct or impede the sight lines required for the free and safe movement of traffic in any street or public place.
- (b) so as to be likely to be confused with or mistaken for an official traffic light or sign or so as to contravene the Road Traffic Act 1974 or any Regulations thereto;
- (c) except with the approval of Council, on any ornamental tower, spire, dome or similar architectural feature or on a lift machinery room, bulkhead over stairs or other super-structure over the main roof of a building;
- (d) subject to sub By-law 3.1.2, on any land that is classified in a Town Planning Scheme or Zoning By-laws as residential or for flats other than a site of lawful non-conforming use unless specifically permitted in these by-laws;
- (e) on any building of which the stability is, in the opinion of the Building Surveyor, likely to be affected by the sign;
- (f) as a movable or portable sign in a street, public place or private property;
- (g) on a light or power pole without the approval of the relevant authority responsible for the erection of that pole;
- (h) in any position where it obstructs or obscures a person's view from a dwelling of a river, the sea or any other natural feature of beauty;
- (i) in any position where, in the opinion of Council, the advertisement will be out of harmony with the surroundings in the locality in which the advertisement is proposed to be exhibited or where Council considers it will be undesirable.

4.2 Inscriptions on Signs: Except in the case of a hoarding or direction sign, signs generally shall only display one or more of the following:

- (a) the name of one or more of the occupiers of the premises;
- (b) details of the business or business carried on in the premises;
- (c) details of the goods sold in the premises to which it is affixed and nothing more;
- (d) any other matter specifically approved by Council.

4.3 Existing Signs: Where existing signs fail to conform to the requirements of these by-laws they shall be removed immediately upon receipt of a direction from the Building Surveyor provided that a person aggrieved by such a direction may within 14 days of his receipt thereof appeal to Council.

4.4 Fixing of Signs: Every sign shall be securely fixed to the structure by which it is supported, to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor, and shall be safely maintained.

4.5 Headroom; Every sign shall, unless otherwise permitted by the Surveyor, be so fixed as to provide a clear headway thereunder of not less than 2.75 m.

4.6 Obstruction to Doors, etc: A sign shall not be erected so as to obstruct access to or from any door, fire escape or window, other than a window designed for the display for goods.

4.7 Glass in Signs: Glass shall not be used in any sign except for illumination purposes in an illuminated sign.

4.8 Readily Combustible Material: Except in the case of bunting and flags or posters securely affixed to a signboard or hoarding, paper, cardboard, cloth or other readily combustible material shall not form part of or be attached to any sign.

4.9 Signs to be Kept Clean: Every sign shall be kept clean and free from unsightly matter and shall be maintained by the licensee or owner in good order and condition.

4.10 Billposting: Subject to sub by-law 3.1.2 a person shall not post any bill or paint, stencil, place or affix any advertisement on any street or on any building, structure, fence, wall hoarding, sign post, blind or awning so as to be visible to a person in a street, public place, public reserve or other land, except on a hoarding approved for the purpose by Council.

4.11 Fly Posting:

4.11.1 No person shall fly post at any place or location within the boundary of the Municipality of the City of Melville.

5. REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICULAR SIGNS.

5.1 Clocks: A clock shall:

(a) if suspended under a verandah or in an arcade, have its centre coinciding with the centre line of the footway thereunder;

(b) comply as regards size with the following table:

Height of Bottom of Clock above Footway	Maximum Diameter or Width of Clock Face and Depth of Clock including Lettering
2.75 m and under 4 m	300 mm
4.0 m and under 6 m	750 mm
6.0 m and under 12 m	1.0 m
12.0 m and over	1.5 m

(c) be fixed either parallel or at right angles to the wall to which it is attached;

(d) not project from the wall to which it is attached:

- (i) if parallel to the wall more than 300 mm; or
(ii) if at right angles to the wall more than 2 m;

(e) afford a minimum headway of 2.75 m;

(f) be maintained so as to show the correct time;

(g) be illuminated from sunset to midnight; and

(h) if fitted with chimes, not be permitted to strike between the hours of midnight and seven a.m.

5.2 Development Signs—Development signs shall:

(a) only be erected where the area of residential land being subdivided exceeds 5 ha;

(b) only be erected in the ratio of 1 m² of area per hectare up to a maximum 50 m² with no individual sign exceeding 20 m²;

(c) be removed from the site within two years or when 80% of the lots in the subdivision have been sold, whichever is the sooner.

5.3 Direction Signs on Street Poles: A direction sign attached to a pole in a street shall not exceed 150 mm in depth or 750 mm in length with a headroom of 2.75 m.

5.4 Display Home Signs shall:

(a) be provided in a ratio not exceeding 2 m² per house in a centre with no individual sign exceeding 6 m²; overall height of sign not to exceed 4 m;

(b) not be illuminated after 9.00 p.m.;

(c) be approved for a period not exceeding twelve months at any one time.

5.5 Hoardings:

5.5.1 Hoardings shall not:

(a) be erected in a residential area;

(b) except with the specific approval of Council, be erected within 15 m of any street or other public place and in any case not closer than its own height to a street or public place;

(c) be of greater area than 22 m².

5.5.2 A licence issued in respect of a hoarding is valid in terms of the licence for such period as may be determined by Council with a maximum period of validity of ten years.

5.5.3 The licence fee for a hoarding is an annual licence fee and is payable annually so long as the hoarding is maintained with the approval of Council.

5.6 Horizontal Signs:

5.6.1 A horizontal sign shall:

- (a) afford a minimum headway of 2.75 m;
- (b) be fixed parallel to the wall of the building to which it is attached;
- (c) conform as to depth to the following table:

Minimum Distance of Sign above Street	Maximum Depth of Sign
Less than 7.5 m	750 mm
7.5 m to 9 m	900 mm
9.0 m to 12 m	1200 mm

The increase above 12 m should be 150 mm in depth for each 300 mm in height to a maximum of 4.5 m;

- (d) not project more than 600 mm from the wall to which it is attached; and
- (e) not be within 600 mm of either end of the wall to which it is attached, unless the end of the sign abuts against a brick, stone or cement corbel, pier or pilaster which is at least 25 mm in front of and 75 mm above and below the sign.

5.6.2 Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (c) of sub-by-law 5.6.1, Council may permit an increase of not more than fifty percent of the depth therein mentioned in any part or parts of a sign to permit the inclusion therein of a motif or capital letter.

5.6.3 There shall be not more than two lines of horizontal signs facing any one street or any building.

5.6.4 The name of the building, owner or occupier may be shown on the facade of a building but:

- (a) unless otherwise specifically approved by Council, only one such name shall be placed on any facade;
- (b) the letters of the name shall not exceed 1.2 m in height;
- (c) the letters shall be of metal or other incombustible material; and
- (d) the letters shall not be lit or illuminated unless all illuminated lettering has been specifically approved by Council.

5.7 Illuminated Signs: Every illuminated sign shall:

- (a) have any boxing or casing in which it is enclosed constructed of incombustible material;
- (b) have its electrical installation constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the State Energy Commission or the appropriate electricity supply authority and in accordance with the S.A.A. Wiring Rules No. C.C.1, Part 1, 1961;
- (c) be maintained to operate as an illuminated sign; and
- (d) not have a light of such intensity as in the opinion of the Building Surveyor will cause annoyance to the public.

5.8 Information Panels: Council may provide information panels or bays of varying sizes and charge fees for the inclusion of advertisements in such panels or bays.

5.9 Institutional Signs: Institutional signs shall not exceed 0.5 m² in area except with the approval of Council but in any case shall not exceed 2 m².

5.10 Projection Signs:

5.10.1 No person shall install or operate a projection sign which can be seen from any street, way, footpath, or other public place onto any building, screen or structure without a written licence issued by Council, nor without the consent of the owner of the building or structure.

5.10.2 No licence shall be issued by Council:

- (a) unless the building, screen or structure onto which it is proposed to project such projection sign or projection signs is specified in the application for such licence;
- (b) in respect of any such projection sign which when projected onto a building, screen or structure is more than 12 m in width or 12 m in height;
- (c) unless the licence specifies the building, screen or structure onto which such projection sign may be projected.

5.10.3 Where it is proposed to project such projection signs onto a building, screen or structure in a series Council may issue one licence in respect of all the projection signs in that series provided that no projection sign or projection signs other than that or those in respect of which a licence has been issued shall be projected.

5.10.4 Where a licence has been issued by Council pursuant to this by-law the projection sign or projection signs in respect of which it has been issued shall not be projected onto any building, screen or structure not specified in such licence.

5.10.5 The owner or occupier of any building, screen or structure shall not permit any projection sign or projection signs to be projected onto the same unless a licence has been issued pursuant to this by-law.

5.11 Pylon Signs:

5.11.1 A pylon sign shall:

- (a) Not have any part thereof less than 2.75 metres or more than 6 metres above the level of the ground immediately below it except as approved by Council, which approval shall be limited to areas determined by Council to be central business areas or large shopping complexes and industrial areas.
- (b) Not exceed 3.0 metres measured in any direction across the face of the pylon sign or have a greater superficial area than 4 square metres except as approved by Council and such approval will be granted only where the pylon sign—
 - (i) is the motif or emblem of a large shopping complex;
 - (ii) is the only such pylon sign on the development;
 - (iii) does not exceed 20 metres in height;
 - (iv) does not exceed 10 square metres on any face;
 - (v) is not erected within its own overall height of any street or right of way;
- (c) not project more than 1 m over any street;
- (d) be supported on one or more piers or columns of brick, stone, concrete or steel of sufficient size and strength to support the pylon sign under all conditions;
- (e) where a pylon sign is supported on two or more piers or columns the space between the columns or piers shall not be wholly or partly filled in with any material below 2.75 m above ground level;
- (f) not, as to any part thereof, project over any street at a height or less than 2.75 m;
- (g) not be within 1.8 metres of the site boundaries of the lot on which it is erected unless the prior approval in writing of Council has been obtained provided that Council shall not approve a sign to be erected less than 1.8 metres of the side boundary of a lot where that lot abuts an intersecting street or right of way;
- (h) not have any part thereof less than 6 m from any part of another pylon sign erected on the same lot.

5.11.2 Where pylon signs are to be erected on a lot on which unit factories or small shops are erected or are to be erected Council may require all the pylon signs to be incorporated into one pylon sign complying with the following:

- (a) initial approval is to be given to the pylon sign framework together with one or more sign infills.
- (b) an application is to be submitted and approval given for each additional infill;
- (c) all infills are to be of an equal size and space is to be provided for one infill for each shop or unit on the lot;
- (d) where Council requires pylon signs to be combined the total area of the infill pylon signs specified under sub-by-law 5.11.1 (b) may be increased by up to 50%, i.e., to a maximum of 6 m².

5.12 Roof Signs:

5.12.1 Approval for the erection of a roof sign shall be granted by a resolution of Council and where approval has been granted a roof sign shall:

- (a) not at any point be within 4 m of the ground;
- (b) not extend laterally beyond the external walls of the building;
- (c) comply as regards height above ground and height of roof sign with the following table:

Height of Main Building Above Ground Level at Point where Roof Sign is to be fixed	Maximum Height of Roof Sign.
4 m and under 5 m	1.25 m
5 m and under 6 m	1.8 m
6 m and under 12 m	3.0 m
12 m and under 18 m	5.0 m
18 m and under 24 m	6.0 m
24 m and upwards	7.0 m

5.12.2 When ascertaining the height of the main building above ground level for the purpose of this by-law, any part of the roof at the point where the sign is to be erected that is provided solely for the purpose of architectural decoration, shall be disregarded.

5.13 Sale Signs: Subject to licence issued under these by-laws and the exemption of signs less than 1 m² in area, a person may erect a sale sign not exceeding 10 m² in area as follows:

- (a) in respect of an auction sale if it is erected not more than twenty-eight days before the date on which the auction sale is to be held and if it is removed not later than forty-eight hours after the sale;
- (b) in respect of the sale of subdivisional land under five hectares in area if such sale sign is not permitted to remain for a period exceeding six months and no other sale sign advertising the sale of the same land or any part thereof is erected within a period of one year from the erection of that sale sign, except a sale sign not exceeding 1 m²;

- (c) advertising that flats and dwelling units in a building erected or to be erected on the land on which the sale sign is situated are or will be available for letting or for purchase if that sale sign is not erected or allowed to remain upon the land before the date of issue of the building licence in respect of such building or after three months following the completion of the building.

5.14 Semaphore Signs:

5.14.1 A semaphore sign shall:

- (a) afford a minimum headway of 2.75 m;
- (b) be fixed at right angles to the wall to which it is attached;
- (c) not project more than 1 m from the point of attachment nor be of greater height at any point than 1 m;
- (d) be fixed over or adjacent to the entrance to a building; and
- (e) not be approved under or over any verandah.

5.14.2 Not more than one semaphore sign shall be fixed over or adjacent to any one entrance to a building.

5.15 Tower Signs: A tower sign shall not, unless otherwise specially approved by Council:

- (a) indicate or display any matter other than the name of the owner or occupier of the land or premises on which the mast, tower or chimney stack is erected;
- (b) if illuminated, be a flashing sign;
- (c) exceed in height one-sixth of the height of the mast, tower or chimney stack on which it is placed;
- (d) exceed in width the width or diameter of the mast, tower or chimney stack on which it is placed; or
- (e) extend laterally beyond any part of the mast, tower or chimney stack on which it is placed.

5.16 Verandah Signs:

5.16.1 Signs above Verandah Fascias: Signs comprising freestanding lettering only may be erected above the outer fascia of a verandah parallel to the kerb, if the lettering does not exceed 400 mm in height and is mounted on a base of at least 75 mm in width.

5.16.2 Signs on Verandah Fascias: A sign fixed to the outer or return fascia of a verandah:

- (a) shall not exceed 600 mm in depth;
- (b) shall not project beyond the outer metal frame or surround of the fascia; and
- (c) if an illuminated sign may be of changing colours but shall not emit a flashing light.

5.16.3 Signs on Verandah Fascias (Theatre):

5.16.3.1 An illuminated sign fixed to the outer fascia of a theatre verandah shall:

- (a) not be constructed or erected unless plans and specifications thereof and structural details of the verandah have been submitted to Council and the plans of the sign approved by Council;
- (b) be so constructed that its bottom edge is not lower than the bottom edge of the fascia or its top edge not higher than the top edge of the fascia;
- (c) not in any event exceed 1.2 m in height.

5.16.3.2 Where such a sign is to be fixed to the outer fascia of a theatre verandah which has already been constructed at the time that this by-law comes into force, the outer face of the sign shall not be less than 150 mm from a line drawn vertically from the kerb line of the footpath beneath such verandah.

5.16.3.3 Where such a sign is to be fixed to the outer fascia of a theatre verandah constructed after this by-law comes into force, the outer face of the sign shall not be less than 600 mm from a line drawn vertically from the kerb line of the footpath beneath such verandah.

5.16.4 Signs Under Verandahs: A sign under a verandah shall:

- (a) afford a headway of at least 2.75 m or, when approved by Council, 2.4 m;
- (b) not exceed 2.4 m in length or 500 mm in depth;
- (c) not weigh more than 50 kg;
- (d) not, if it exceeds 300 mm in width, be within 1.4 m, or where it does not exceed 600 mm in width be within 1 m, of the side wall of the building, measured along the front of the building before which it is erected;
- (e) not, if it exceeds 300 mm in width, be within 2.75 m, or where it does not exceed 300 mm in width be within 1.75 m, of another sign under that verandah;
- (f) be fixed at right angles to the front wall of the building before which it is erected except on a corner of a building at a street intersection where the sign may be placed at an angle with the wall so as to be visible from both streets;
- (g) be so placed that the centre of its base longitudinally is equidistant from the outer edge of the verandah and the vertical plane of the shop front directly opposite the end of such sign.

5.17 Vertical Signs:

5.17.1 A vertical sign shall:

- (a) afford a minimum headway of 2.75 m;
- (b) subject to sub-by-law 5.17.2, not project more than 1 m from the face of the building to which it is attached;
- (c) subject to sub-by-law 5.17.3 not be within 1.75 m of either end of the wall to which it is attached;
- (d) be of a height of at least twice its width;
- (e) not project more than 1 m above the top of the wall to which it is attached nor more than 1 m back from the face of that wall;
- (f) not be within 4 m of another vertical sign on the same building;
- (g) not be placed on a corner of a building, except at a street intersection where it may be placed at an angle with the walls so as to be visible from both streets; and
- (h) except with the approval of Council not exceed 1 m in width exclusive of the back projection.

5.17.2 Where a vertical sign is affixed to the face of a building that is set back beyond the face of another building within 3 m of it, the sign may project 500 mm further than the distance prescribed by paragraph (b) of sub-by-law 5.17.1 or the distance by which the building to which it is affixed is set back beyond the face of the other, whichever is the lesser.

5.17.3 Where a building to which a vertical sign is to be affixed is set back from the boundary or abuts on an intersecting street or right-of-way, Council may authorise the affixing of the sign at a lesser distance from the end of the wall than that prescribed by paragraph (c) of sub-by-law 5.17.1.

6. OFFENCES.

6.1 Every person who erects a sign or a hoarding which does not comply with, or erects a sign or a hoarding in a manner contrary to the provisions of these by-laws, commits an offence.

6.2 Where by these by-laws it is required that a person obtain a licence to erect or maintain a sign or hoarding, every person who maintains a sign or a hoarding without a licence or in respect of which the licence has expired or been cancelled commits an offence.

6.3 Neither the owner nor the occupier of any land or premises shall permit a sign or hoarding to remain therein or thereon unless such sign or hoarding complies with these by-laws.

6.4 Without prejudice to the preceding provisions of this by-law Council may serve on the owner or occupier of any premises on which any sign or hoarding is erected, affixed or maintained contrary to these by-laws, notice to remove that sign or hoarding within such time as may be specified in the notice and a person neglecting or failing to comply with the terms of a notice served on him pursuant to this Sub-by-law commits an offence.

6.5 Council or any person duly authorised by Council in that regard may remove to a place appointed by Council any sign, advertisement, advertising device, hoarding or signboard placed on or erected on any street, way, footpath or other public place unless so placed or erected pursuant to these by-laws.

Council or any person duly authorised by Council in that regard may without being liable in damages or otherwise dispose of any of the things mentioned above and reinstate the street, way, footpath or public place at the expense of the person or persons responsible for the deposit thereon or the injury thereto and recover the amount of the expense from him in a Court of competent jurisdiction.

7. PENALTIES.

Any person who commits an offence against these by-laws is liable on conviction, to:

- (a) a penalty not exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars; or
- (b) a daily penalty during the continuance of the breach not exceeding twenty-five dollars.

8. APPLICATION.

These by-laws shall apply to the whole of the District of the Municipality of the City of Melville.

By-law No. 48 Relating to the Removal of Vehicles.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of
all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby
records having resolved on 24th July 1984 to make and submit for confirmation by the
Governor the following by-law:—1. This by-law may be cited as City of Subiaco By-law No. 48—Removal of
Vehicles.

2. In this by-law—

“Act” means Local Government Act 1960;

“authorised person” means a person authorised by the Council to remove vehicles,
pursuant to this by-law;

“clause” means a clause of this by-law;

“Council” means the Council of the City of Subiaco;

“inspector” means a parking inspector appointed by the Council under this by-law
and includes a chief parking inspector and an assistant parking inspector;

“owner” has the meaning given to it by the Act;

“parking facility” has the meaning given to it by City of Subiaco By-law No. 29—
Parking Facilities published in the *Government Gazette* of 23 December 1971
and amended from time to time;“parking region” has the meaning given to it by City of Subiaco By-law No. 29—
Parking Facilities;

“public place” has the meaning given it by the Act;
 “park” has the meaning given it by the Act;
 “specified place” means a yard or other piece of land set aside as a place to which obstructing or trespassing vehicles may be removed pursuant to this by-law;
 “stand” has the meaning given to it by the Act and
 “stood” has a correlative meaning; and
 “street” has the meaning given it by the Act.

3. The portion of the district of the City of Subiaco that is defined in Clause 2 as a parking region is hereby constituted as a parking region to which this by-law applies.

4. A person shall not stand or park a vehicle so as to cause obstruction to traffic in a street or public place.

5. Where an inspector, a member of the police force or an authorised person finds a vehicle stood or parked contrary to the provisions of Clause 4 or trespassing on privately owned land within the parking region he may remove the vehicle to a specified place and may use such force as is necessary to enter the vehicle for the purpose of so removing it.

6. The Council may appoint a person as an authorised person for the purpose of this by-law.

7. The Council may set aside a yard or other piece of land as a specified place to which vehicles may be removed pursuant to this by-law.

8. Where an authorised person places a vehicle in a specified place pursuant to this by-law, he shall enter in a register to be provided by the Council for that purpose, details of the time and date, a description of the vehicle, and of the place from which it was removed and shall notify the Clerk of the Council.

9. The Clerk of the Council shall exhibit on the Notice Board of the Council a notification that a vehicle therein described has been placed in the specified place and shall, unless the vehicle is sooner recovered, keep that notification exhibited for a period of not less than seven (7) days.

10. A person may recover a seized vehicle from a specified place by paying to the Clerk of the Council during office hours at the Council's Municipal offices—

(a) the cost incurred by the Council in removing the vehicle thereto; and

(b) the sum of five dollars (\$5) per day for each day or part of the day that the vehicle has remained in the specified place,

and upon payment of that cost and charge the Clerk, if satisfied that the person is the owner of the vehicle or is a person entitled to possession of the vehicle, shall permit him to remove it.

11. A person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of this By-law commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding eighty dollars (\$80).

Direction by the Minister to the Dairy Industry Authority under section 27.

I, HYWEL DAVID EVANS, Minister for Agriculture, being the Minister for the time being administering the Dairy Industry Act 1973, pursuant to the powers conferred by section 27 of the said Act hereby direct the Dairy Industry Authority to determine applications for market milk and special products milk quotas made to it under section 26 of the Act in respect of the quota year commencing on 1 January 1985, on the following bases or principles—

1. (1) Subject to this paragraph, a dairyman holding a market milk quota or a special products milk quota at the end of the 1984 quota year shall, upon application duly made, be granted a market milk quota or a special products milk quota, as the case requires, for the 1985 quota year of an amount that is not less on a

daily basis than the amount held by him at the end of the 1984 quota year (disregarding the whole or any part of a market milk quota surrendered by the dairyman on or immediately before 31 December 1984).

Provided that—

- (a) the dairy premises to which the application relates and upon which milk is to be produced are the same as the dairy premises referred to in the quota certificate held by the applicant immediately before the end of the 1984 quota year; or
 - (b) the dairy premises to which the application relates and upon which milk is to be produced are as approved under the terms, conditions and limitations determined by the Authority in accordance with section 28 (2) (c) of the Act.
- (2) If the requirements of subparagraph (1) (a) of this paragraph apply to, but are not satisfied by, a dairyman in his application he shall not be granted a market milk quota or a special products milk quota, as the case may be.

(3) Where a dairyman short supplied the market milk quota applicable to him at any time during the year ending on 30 June 1984, the market milk quota to be granted to the dairyman for the 1985 quota year shall be of an amount calculated according to the following formula:

365 (a — b)

where:

- “a” is the number of litres obtained after ascertaining the average daily supply to be delivered under the market milk quota applicable to the dairyman on 31 December 1984; and
- “b” is the number of litres that is equal to the average daily amount short supplied by the dairyman in respect of the quota held in the month of greatest average daily short supply during the year ending on 30 June 1984.

(4) Where a dairyman short supplied the special products milk quota applicable to him at any time during the year ending on 30 June 1984, the special products milk quota to be granted to the dairyman for the 1985 quota year shall be of an amount calculated according to the following formula:

365 (c — 2d)

where:

- “c” is the number of litres obtained after ascertaining the average daily supply to be delivered under the special products milk quota applicable to the dairyman on 31 December 1984; and
- “d” is the number of litres that is equal to the average daily amount short supplied by the dairyman in respect of the quota held in the month of greatest average daily short supply during the year ending on 30 June 1984.

(5) Where subparagraph (3) or (4) of this paragraph applies to the grant of a market milk quota or a special products milk quota for the 1985 quota year, a dairyman shall be informed by written notice that the grant to him of a market milk quota or special products milk quota for the 1985 quota year is subject to the conditions contained in subparagraph (3) or (4) of this paragraph; and, provided that within fourteen days of receiving such notice the dairyman by written notice served on the Authority satisfies the Authority that the conditions of subparagraph (3) or (4) of this paragraph should not apply to him due to reasons beyond his control, then a market milk quota or special products milk quota shall be granted to him in accordance with the conditions contained in subparagraph (1) of this paragraph; and in any event a market milk quota shall not under subparagraph (3) be granted for less than 89 425 litres for the 1985 quota year.

2. A dairyman who has not previously held a market milk quota may be granted such a quota of not less than 89 425 litres for the 1985 quota year and shall be selected for this purpose in accordance with the principles set out in paragraph (c) of the principles published in the *Government Gazette* on 24 December 1976.

3. A dairyman who is granted a market milk quota under paragraph 2 of these principles and applies for the grant of a special products milk quota may be granted a special products milk quota not exceeding 89 425 litres for the 1985 quota year.

4. Supply under a quota granted pursuant to paragraph 2 or 3 of these principles shall commence on such date as the Authority may specify.

5. (1) The Authority may refuse an application if approval of the application would result in the applicant or the applicant together with any person associated with the applicant (as determined by the Authority in accordance with subparagraph (2) of this paragraph) holding a market milk quota of more than 403 325 litres or a special products milk quota of more than 89 425 litres for the 1985 quota year.

(2) The Authority may determine that a person is associated with an applicant if that person holds a market milk quota or a special products milk quota and is—

- (a) a partner of the applicant;
- (b) a corporation of which the applicant is an officer or director;
- (c) where the applicant is a corporation, an officer or director of the corporation;
- (d) an officer or director of any corporation of which the applicant is an officer or director;
- (e) an employee or employer of the applicant;
- (f) an employee of a natural person of whom the applicant is an employee;
- (g) a corporation whose directors are accustomed or under an obligation whether formal or informal, to act in accordance with the directions, instructions or wishes of the applicant or, where the person is a corporation, of the directors or management of that person;
- (h) a corporation in accordance with the directions, instructions or wishes of which, or of the directors or management of which, the applicant is accustomed or under an obligation, whether formal or informal, to act;
- (i) a corporation in which the applicant holds a substantial interest; or
- (j) where that person is a corporation—a person who holds a substantial interest in the corporation,

but persons shall not be regarded as associates if the Authority is satisfied on representations made by one or more of them and after its own enquiries (if any) that they are commercially independent in their respective enterprises.
