WHEREAS by the Transfer of Land Act 1893, the Governor is empowered by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to revest in Her Majesty as of Her former estate all or any lands, whereof Her Majesty may become the registered proprietor, and whereas Her Majesty is now the registered proprietor of the lands described in the Schedules hereto: Now therefore, I, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation revest in Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, the land described in the Schedules hereto as of Her former estate.

PURSUANT to sections 5 and 6 of the Plant Diseases Act 1914, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby vary the proclamation made pursuant to the Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on 10 February 1984 at page 343 by deleting paragraph (b) and substituting the following—

“(b) because of the likelihood of the introduction of disease into the State—

- (i) prohibit absolutely the bringing or sending into the State from any other State or Territory of the Commonwealth machinery and equipment which has been used in the production or handling of potatoes; and
- (ii) prohibit the bringing or sending into the State from any other State or Territory of the Commonwealth, of potatoes, except in accordance with the Plant Diseases (Potato) Regulations 1984.”

HEALTH ACT 1911 (AS AMENDED).

The Municipality of the Shire of Coolgardie.

Health By-Laws—Eating Houses.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act 1911 (as amended), a Local Authority may make by-laws and may amend, repeal or alter any by-laws so made; now therefore, the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Coolgardie being a Local Health Authority, doth hereby record having resolved on 20 June 1984, to make and submit for the approval of the Governor the following by-laws.

These by-laws will come into affect from the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*.

PART I—Interpretation.

1. In the construction of this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires:—
 - “Act” means the Health Act 1911 (as amended); and any amendment thereof.
 - “Local Authority” means the Municipality of the Shire of Coolgardie.
 - “Medical Officer” means the Medical Officer of the Local Authority and includes any person acting in that capacity.
 - “Health Surveyor” shall have the same meaning as it has under the Health Act.
 - “Eating House” shall have the same meaning as it has under Section 160 of the Health Act and shall include for the purpose of registration Restaurants, Dining Rooms, Tea Rooms, Refreshment Rooms and Take-away Food Premises.
 - “Licence” means a licence to conduct an Eating House granted pursuant to the provisions of this by-law.
 - “Registered Premises” means any premises which are registered as an Eating House under this by-law, and includes any yard or land appurtenant to such Eating House.

The terms “food”, “owner”, “premises” and “proprietor” shall have the same meaning as they have under the Health Act.

"Shire Clerk" means the Shire Clerk or the Acting Shire Clerk for the time being of the Municipality of the Shire of Coolgardie.

PART II—Licences and Registration.

2. No person shall occupy or use any premises as an Eating House unless:—
 - (a) The Eating House is registered under this by-law by the Local Authority, and
 - (b) the proprietor of the said Eating House is the holder of a licence issued by the Local Authority authorising him to conduct on the premises the business of an Eating House.
3. Before any Eating House is registered under this by-law, the proprietor thereof shall make application in the form prescribed in the First Schedule hereto and shall forward his application, together with a plan of his premises in respect of which such application is made, and the prescribed fee, to the Shire Clerk, and if the application is approved, the Local Authority shall issue to the proprietor a Certificate of Registration in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto.
4. Before any licence to any proprietor to conduct an Eating House is granted by Local Authority under this by-law, the proprietor shall sign an application for the same in the form prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto and shall forward same, together with the prescribed fee, to the Shire Clerk, and if the application is approved, the Local Authority shall issue to the proprietor a licence in the form prescribed in the Fourth Schedule hereto.
5. Any person who makes false statement in connection with any application under Clauses 3 or 4 hereof shall be guilty of an offence.
6. Every Certificate of Registration of premises registered as an Eating House and every licence issued to a proprietor shall be signed by the Shire Clerk and shall be duly entered in a book to be provided by the Local Authority for that purpose. Every proprietor of registered premises shall keep the Certificate of Registration and the licence on the registered premises and shall when requested so to do by the Health Surveyor, produce to him the Certificate of Registration and also the licence issued to the proprietor in respect of such premises.
7. Every Certificate of Registration and every licence shall be in force from the day of the date of the issue thereof until and inclusive of the 31st day of December then next ensuing, unless the same be cancelled in the meantime in accordance with the provisions of the Act.
8. Application for the renewal of Certificate of Registration and licences shall be made annually during the month of December. Such applications shall be in the form prescribed in the Fifth and Sixth Schedules hereto, respectively, and shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.
9. The fees to be paid to the Local Authority on the registration of premises, on the issuing of a licence shall be as set out in the Seventh Schedule hereto.
10. So often as any person holding a licence issued pursuant to this by-law changes his place of abode, he shall within seven days next after such a change give notice his new place of abode and he shall at the same time produce such licence to the Shire Clerk, who shall endorse thereon and sign a memorandum specifying the particulars of such a change.
11. If the owner of any registered premises sells or transfers or agrees to sell or transfer the said premises to another person, he shall within 14 days from the date of such sale or transfer or agreement notify the Shire Clerk thereof in writing on the form prescribed on the Eighth Schedule hereto.

PART III—Management.

12. All premises occupied or used, or intended to be occupied or used as an Eating House shall comply with the Health By-laws for the Shire of Coolgardie.
13. The proprietor of every Eating House registered under this by-law shall remove or cause to be removed the whole of the canned or preserved food or any food contained in an hermetically sealed container (such container not being composed wholly of glass or stone ware) intended for use on the registered premises from such original can or container immediately after the same shall have been opened.
14. Remove or cause to be removed any food which may have been served to any person or placed on any table occupied by a customer on the registered premises and not then consumed or removed by him immediately after such person shall have finished his refreshment to the kitchen or serving room of such premises, not permit, suffer or allow any of such food so removed to any such kitchen or serving room be again served to any person on the registered premises, and such food shall immediately be deposited in the waste food garbage bin. Provided that in this paragraph food shall not mean or include the following substances, to wit, sugar, pepper, salt, mustard, vinegar, sauces, spices, or condiments if such substances are contained in receptacles or containers of such a design approved by the Health Surveyor and so constructed that the contents of such receptacles or containers cannot be handled by any person. Provided further, that in this paragraph food shall not include bread, which is placed in a glass receptacle or container of a design approved by the Health Surveyor and so constructed that the contents are only handled as required.
15. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and, upon conviction, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$100, and, where such breach is of a continuing nature to a daily penalty not exceeding \$4.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Fisheries Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1984.
- Commencement. 2. These regulations shall come into operation 12 months after the day of publication of these regulations in the *Government Gazette*.
- Regulation 12F inserted. 3. After regulation 12E of the Fisheries Act Regulations*, as amended, the following regulation is inserted—
" 12F. The holder of a professional fisherman's licence, shall not use or leave unattended in the waters of a fishery set out in the Schedule to this regulation—
(a) any surface fishing net, unless the net has end floats a minimum of 150 millimetres in diameter, clearly marked with the professional fisherman's licensed fishing boat number;
(b) any fishing net, unless the net has either every tenth lead weight marked clearly with lettering, a minimum of 4 millimetres high showing the professional fisherman's licensed fishing boat number, or every tenth net float marked clearly with lettering a minimum of 10 millimetres high showing the professional fisherman's licensed fishing boat number.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 25B (1) of the above Act, I, Kenneth Finlay McIver being the Minister charged with the administration of the Bush Fires Act 1954-1981 do hereby cancel the conditions imposed with or for any like purpose in the *Government Gazette* of 14 October 1983 in so far as the conditions apply to land in the municipalities of the Town of Bassendean, Shire of Bayswater, City of Belmont, City of Canning, Town of Claremont, Town of Cottesloe, Town of East Fremantle, City of Fremantle, City of Melville, Town of Mosman Park, City of Nedlands, Shire of Peppermint Grove, City of Perth, City of South Perth, City of Stirling, City of Subiaco and the Shire of Swan in so far as it effects Zone 1 as published in the *Government Gazette* (No. 75) of 16 September 1984.

- 1.2 Upon ground from which all bush or other inflammable matter is thoroughly cleared within two metres at all points of the site of the fire:

Provided that, notwithstanding the provisions of subparagraph 1.1 of this paragraph, a local authority may, upon being satisfied that no fire hazard is likely to occur, give permission in writing for the use of an incinerator situated at a lesser distance than two metres from any building or fence, subject to compliance with the other requirements of that subparagraph.

2. No fire shall be lit other than in an incinerator for the purpose of destroying garden refuse or rubbish or for any like purpose on a day or days for which the Bureau of Meteorology in Perth has issued in respect of the locality, a fire danger forecast of "Extreme" or "Very High".

3. During the period from 15th December to 31st March inclusive:—

- 3.1 A fire which is lit for the purpose of destroying garden refuse or rubbish other than in an incinerator shall be lit only between the hours of six o'clock in the evening and eleven o'clock of the same day and shall be completely extinguished not later than midnight of that day.
- 3.2 Where a fire is lit for any purpose mentioned in this notice the person who lit the fire, or the person left in attendance on the fire as required by this notice as the case may be, shall completely extinguish the fire by the application of water or earth before he leaves it.

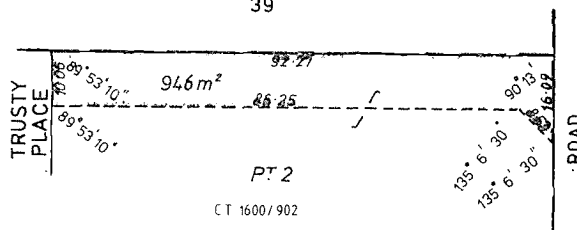

- Citation. 1. This Order may be cited as the Soil and Land Conservation (West Maya Soil Conservation District) Order 1984.
- Commencement. 2. This Order shall come into operation on the date of publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette*.
- Interpretation. 3. In this Order—
“the district” means the West Maya Soil Conservation District constituted by item 4 of and the Schedule to, this Order.

West Maya Soil Conservation District. 4. All that portion of land set out in the Schedule to this Order, is hereby constituted as the West Maya Soil Conservation District.

Establishment of District Advisory Committee. 5. Pursuant to section 23 (2) of the Act there is hereby established for the district a district advisory committee to be known as the District Advisory Committee for the West Maya Soil Conservation District.

Constitution of Committee. 6. (1) It is hereby determined, on the recommendation of the Minister after consultation with the Shires of Perenjori and Dalwallinu, that the committee shall comprise 15 members of whom—

- (a) one shall be the Commissioner of Soil Conservation or his nominee;
- (b) one shall be appointed by the Governor on the nomination of the council of the Shire of Perenjori;
- (c) one shall be appointed by the Governor on the nomination of the council of the Shire of Dalwallinu;
- (d) 3 shall be appointed by the Governor on the nomination of the Minister to represent the Primary Industry Association of Western Australia; and
- (e) 9 shall be appointed by the Governor on the nomination of the Minister, and shall be persons actively engaged in land use in the district.

(2) The Primary Industry Association of Western Australia shall submit to the Minister a panel containing the names of persons willing to be appointed as members of the committee and where such a panel is submitted in accordance with this Order 3 persons whose names appear on the panel submitted by the Primary Industry Association of Western Australia shall be nominated for appointment.

PLANT DISEASES (POTATO) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1984.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Plant Diseases (Potato) Amendment Regulations 1984.
- Commencement. 2. These regulations shall come into operation 28 days after the date on which they are published in the *Government Gazette*.
- Principal Regulations. 3. In these regulations the Plant Diseases (Potato) Regulations 1984*, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 4 amended. 4. Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) and substituting the following paragraphs—
 “ (a) (i) are certified under a scheme authorized and administered by a State or Territory of the Commonwealth to have originated from pathogen tested stock and are contained in sealed new bags or packages bearing legible details of the State or Territory of origin and the relevant certification scheme; or

 (b) are presented for the inspection of an inspector at an approved port of entry. ”

STOCK DISEASES (REGULATIONS) ACT 1968.

ENZOOTIC DISEASES AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (No. 5) 1984

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

- Citation. 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Enzootic Diseases Amendment Regulations (No. 5) 1984.
 (2) In these regulations the Enzootic Diseases Regulations 1970*, as amended, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Commence-ment. 2. These regulations shall come into operation 30 days after publication in the *Government Gazette*.
- Regs. 29 to 34 substituted. 3. The principal regulations are amended by repealing regulations 29 to 34 (inclusive) and substituting the following regulations—
 " 29. (1) The conditions, restrictions and prohibitions set out in the Second Schedule apply to and in relation to the movement of stock into the State.
 (2) Stock shall not be moved into the State contrary to the provisions set out in the Second Schedule.

(3) Stock shall not be moved into the State unless a certificate in the approved form relating to stock of that kind has been—

- (a) completed in accordance with the requirements set out in the certificate; and
- (b) furnished to an inspector at the inspection post through which the stock are moved into the State.

(4) A person shall not make a false statement in any certificate given for the purposes of subregulation (3).

30. (1) An inspector may detain, prevent the movement of, or impound stock being brought into the State or that has recently been brought into the State where the bringing in of the stock was not in compliance with these regulations and he may so detain, prevent the movement of, or impound the stock until he is satisfied that all steps have been taken, subsequently, to comply with these regulations as far as is practicable, or until he is otherwise ordered by the Chief Inspector.

(2) An inspector may seize any stock that stray across the border into this State.

(3) The Chief Inspector may, at any time, instruct an inspector not to authorize the bringing into the State of stock and may, where an authority is issued contrary to his instruction, revoke the authority and seize the stock that may have been brought in under the authority.

31. (1) An owner of stock that is brought into the State from any other part of the Commonwealth shall forthwith after the stock is so brought in, present the stock or cause the stock to be presented for examination by an inspector at an inspection post, that is—

- (a) in the case of stock brought in by sea, at the port at which the stock was so brought in;
- (b) in the case of stock brought in by air, at the airport or in the vicinity of the airport at which the stock was so brought in;
- (c) in the case of stock brought in by land—
 - (i) into the Kimberley Division of the State, at either Halls Creek or Kununurra;
 - (ii) along the Eyre Highway, at Norseman or if another place has been nominated by the Minister by a notice displayed at the point on the border of the State at which the stock was so brought in, at that other place;
 - (iii) by rail, at Parkeston.

(2) A person shall not move any stock from an inspection place at which it has been presented pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation unless an authority in the form of Form No. 5 has been issued by an inspector authorizing the moving of the stock.

(3) Except in the case of stock brought into the Kimberley Division of the State from the Northern Territory for the purpose of immediate slaughter, an owner of stock is liable to pay the fees prescribed in the Fourth Schedule in relation to the stock with respect to matters specified therein.

(4) An inspector shall not issue an authority in the form of Form No. 5 with respect to any stock unless he is satisfied that all the laws of the State relating to the bringing into the State of the stock have been complied with.

(5) A person acting in contravention of subregulation (1) or subregulation (2) of this regulation commits an offence.

Penalty:

Minimum—One hundred dollars (\$100).

Maximum—Four hundred dollars (\$400).

32. The Chief Inspector may order any stock that is in the course of being brought into the State to be placed in quarantine for such time and at such place as he specifies.

33. Notwithstanding anything in these regulations, where an owner of land in Western Australia is also the owner of adjoining land in South Australia or the Northern Territory, the Chief Inspector may, in writing, authorize stock kept or depasturing on the adjoining land to be brought into the State for such period, not exceeding 6 months, as he specifies, but such stock shall not be allowed into the State beyond the boundaries of the land specified in the above mentioned authority unless all the requirements of these regulations relating to the bringing into the State of stock are complied with. ”.

- Regulation 116 amended. 4. Regulation 116 of the principal regulations is amended by inserting after “Any person who” the following—
“ makes a false statement in any form given for the purposes of these regulations or who ”.
- Second Schedule substituted. 5. The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is deleted and the following schedule substituted—

Second Schedule.

GENERAL

- Notification of arrival.
1. Notification not less than 3 days before the expected date and time of arrival shall be given of the expected date and time of the arrival of the stock to an inspector at the inspection post through which the stock are to be moved into the State.
- Inspection before movement.
2. Stock shall not be moved into the State unless the stock—
- have been inspected by a qualified Government Veterinary Officer or inspector not more than 7 days prior to movement for the purposes of ensuring that the stock conform to such of the requirements of the Schedule as apply in relation to the stock;
 - have been isolated from other stock not of the same health status prior to movement into the State; and
 - have been certified according to the certification requirements of these regulations that apply in relation to the stock by a Government Veterinary Surgeon of the State or Territory in which the property of origin of the stock is situate.
- Stopping places.
3. Stock shall not be allowed to stop en route to the State except at approved stopping places.
- Vehicle to be clean.
4. Any vehicle that is used for transporting stock shall be clean.
- Separate movement.
5. Stock shall not be moved in such a way that they have contact with any stock of lesser health status.
- Stock to be in general good health. Certificate to be furnished.
6. In addition to the particular requirements set out in this Schedule stock shall be in a good general state of health.
7. (1) A certificate in the approved form stating that the stock conform to the requirements of this Schedule shall be completed in accordance with the directions given on the form and shall be furnished to an inspector at the inspection post through which the stock are being moved into the State.
- (2) Notwithstanding anything in subclause (1) where the stock in question consists of newly hatched, or hatching eggs of domestic fowls a certificate of the kind referred to in subclause (1) is not necessary if—
- the stock is boxed in containers made of or containing materials not previously been used for holding fowls, chickens or eggs; and
 - the container holding the stock bears on its lid and body a clearly visible imprint of an approved stamp.
- CATTLE NOT FOR IMMEDIATE SLAUGHTER.**
- Liver fluke.
8. Cattle shall not be moved into any portion of the State other than the Kimberley Area of the State unless the cattle have been treated with an approved anthelmintic for liver fluke on a date within 14 days of their movement and the date and type of treatment shall be certified by a Government Veterinary Surgeon in the State or Territory in which the property of origin is situate.
- Further treatment on entry to the State.
9. (1) Cattle shall not be brought into any portion of the State that is within the district of any of the following local authorities, namely—
- The Cities of Nedlands, Perth, Subiaco, Stirling, Cockburn, Fremantle, Melville, Canning, Gosnells and South Perth; the Towns of Claremont, Cottesloe, Mosman Park, Bassendean and East Fremantle; and the Shire of Bayswater, Kalamunda, Mundaring, Swan, Wanneroo, Kwinana, Rockingham, Armadale-Kelmscott, Belmont, Serpentine-Jarrahdale.
- The shires of Mandurah, Murray, Waroona, Harvey, Dardanup, Collie, Capel, Busselton, Donnybrook, Balingup, Augusta-Margaret River, Manjimup, Nannup and the City of Bunbury,
- unless the property of destination—
- has been approved as being free from the liver fluke vector snail; and
 - has approved facilities for the holding of the cattle and their treatment for liver fluke.
- (2) Cattle entering any portion of the State except the Kimberley Division, shall be subjected to 2 further treatments of an approved anthelmintic under the supervision of an inspector as follows—
- the first treatment shall be administered not earlier than 19 days and not later than 22 days after the treatment administered prior to movement of the stock into the State;
 - the second treatment shall be administered not earlier than 56 and not later than 63 days after the treatment administered prior to movement of the stock into the State.
- Ephemeral fever.
10. Cattle shall not be moved to the State from a property on which there has been a case of ephemeral fever within 30 days prior to the movement.

Tricho-
moniasis.

11. Cattle shall not be moved to the State from a property on which Trichomoniasis has been known to exist or is suspected to have existed at any time within 5 years prior to movement.

Johne's
Disease.

12. Cattle shall not be moved to the State if Johne's Disease exists or is known or suspected to have existed on the property of birth of each animal or on any other property on which each animal has grazed in the five years immediately prior to the date of that birth or grazing history.

Tuberculosis
status.

13. (1) Cattle shall be certified by a Government Veterinary Surgeon of the State or Territory in which the property of origin is situate, as coming from a herd having one of the following statuses (whichever applies) in relation to tuberculosis, namely—

- (a) tuberculosis accredited free;
- (b) tuberculosis confirmed free;
- (c) tuberculosis tested negative;
- (d) tuberculosis monitored negative.

(2) Where cattle are certified as being tuberculosis monitored negative the cattle shall not be introduced into the State unless the cattle have been tuberculin tested within 30 days prior to movement with negative results.

Brucellosis.

14. (1) In this clause—

- (a) the description of a herd by the term "accredited free", "confirmed free", "tested negative", "monitored negative", "provisionally clear", "non-assessed", "suspect", "infected" or "restricted" is a description of the herd by reference to its status in relation to the disease brucellosis;
- (b) the description of an area by the term "free", "provisionally free", "eradication", or "control" is a description of the area by reference to its status in relation to the disease brucellosis;
- (c) "certified" means certified by a Government Veterinary Officer of the State or Territory from which the cattle the subject of the certificate originate.

(2) A certificate shall not be given for the purposes of this clause unless the cattle the subject of the certificate have been on the property of origin for a period of not less than 12 months but individual animals that have not been on the property for that period may be included in the certificate if those animals had, at the time of introduction to the herd, the same or higher status in relation to brucellosis as the other cattle the subject of the certificate.

(3) Breeding cattle that are certified as coming from—

- (a) a herd having a status specified in column 1 of the Table to this subclause; and
- (b) a property of origin situate in an area having a status specified in column 2 of the Table to this subclause opposite and corresponding to the herd specified in column 1,

may be moved to a portion of the State specified in column 3 of the Table to this subclause opposite and corresponding to the kind of herd and property of origin without restriction except that any pregnant female in a consignment of cattle, other than a pregnant female from an accredited free herd or confirmed free herd in a free area, shall be isolated on introduction into the State and re-tested by the complement fixation test not less than 15 and not more than 45 days after calving.

(4) Breeding cattle that are certified as coming from—

- (a) a herd having a status specified in column 1 of the Table to this subclause; and
- (b) a property of origin situate in an area having a status specified in column 2 of the Table to this subclause opposite and corresponding to the herd specified in column 1,

shall not be moved to a portion of the State specified in column 3 of the Table to this subclause opposite and corresponding to the herd specified in column 1 and the area specified in column 2 unless each breeding animal among the cattle being moved has been—

- (c) held in isolation not less than 30 days prior to movement; and
- (d) tested by the complement fixation test with negative results,

and any pregnant female in the consignment of cattle shall be isolated on introduction to the State and re-tested by the complement fixation test not less than 15 and not more than 45 days after calving.

(5) Breeding cattle that are certified as coming from—

- (a) a herd having a status specified in column 1 of the Table to this subclause; and
- (b) a property of origin situated in an area having a status specified in column 2 of the Table to this subclause opposite and corresponding to the herd specified in column 1,

shall not be moved into a portion of the State specified in column 3 of the Table to this subclause opposite and corresponding to the herd specified in column 1 and the area specified in column 2 unless—

- (c) the cattle consist only of bulls;
- (d) each entire male animal among the cattle being moved has been held in isolation and tested by the complement fixation test on 2 occasions with an interval of 60 to 90 days between each test with negative results, the second of such tests having been conducted within 14 days of the movement; and
- (e) each animal has been examined clinically and shown no evidence of disease.

Identification.

15. Each animal in a consignment shall be identified by the registered tail tag of the property of origin and each breeding animal shall be individually identified by a tattoo, ear tag or brand.

Prior approval for pregnant cattle.

16. Separate prior approval shall be obtained for each pregnant animal.

Cattle tick.

17. (1) Cattle shall be free from ticks.
(2) Where the cattle are being moved from Queensland or the Northern Territory the cattle shall be sprayed or dipped with an approved insecticide immediately before movement unless in the period of 35 days immediately before movement the cattle were held on an area not known or suspected to be infected with cattle tick.

SHEEP AND GOATS NOT FOR IMMEDIATE SLAUGHTER.

Residence on property of origin.

18. (1) Sheep or goats shall not be moved into the State unless the sheep or goats have been born and bred on the property from which they are to be moved to the State or have been on the property for a period of not less than 1 year except for periods of temporary removal for the purposes of an agricultural show or for sale.
(2) Where sheep or goats have been moved for the purpose of an agricultural show or sale movement of the sheep or goats to the State is prohibited unless effective precautions against contamination with footrot have been taken during the period of their absence from the property of origin.

Property of origin.

19. Sheep or goats shall not be moved into the State if any sheep or goats on the property from which they originate have been infected or are suspected to have been infected with footrot within a period of 2 years prior to the movement of the sheep or goats.

Footrot.

20. Sheep or goats shall not be moved into the State if the sheep or goats—
(a) have been vaccinated against footrot; or
(b) have been in contact with any sheep or goats that are or have been affected by footrot in the period of 12 months immediately preceding movement.

Liver fluke.

21. (1) Sheep or goats shall not be moved into the State unless they have been treated with an approved anthelmintic within 14 days prior to movement and the date and type of treatment has been certified by a Government Veterinary Surgeon in the State or Territory in which the property is situate.

(2) Sheep or goats shall not be brought into any portion of the State that is within the district of any of the following local authorities, namely—

The Cities of Nedlands, Perth, Subiaco, Stirling, Cockburn, Fremantle, Melville, Canning, Gosnells and South Perth; the Towns of Claremont, Cottesloe, Mosman Park, Bassendean and

East Fremantle; and the Shires of Bayswater, Kalamunda, Mundaring, Swan, Wanneroo, Kwinana, Rockingham, Armadale-Kelmscott, Belmont, Serpentine-Jarrahdale.

The shires of Mandurah, Murray, Waroona, Harvey, Dardanup, Collie, Capel, Busselton, Donnybrook, Balingup, Augusta-Margaret River, Manjimup, Nannup and the City of Bunbury, unless the property of destination—

- (a) has been approved as being free from the liver fluke vector snail; and
- (b) has approved facilities for the holding of the sheep or goats and their treatment for liver fluke.

(3) Sheep or goats entering any portion of the State except the Kimberley Division, shall be subjected to 2 further treatments of an approved anthelmintic under the supervision of an inspector as follows—

- (a) the first treatment shall be administered not earlier than 19 days and not later than 22 days after the treatment administered prior to the movement of the stock into the State; and
- (b) the second treatment shall be administered not earlier than 56 and not later than 63 days after the treatment administered prior to the movement of the stock into the State.

Lice and keds.

22. Sheep shall not be moved into the State unless they are free from lice and keds.

Ovine brucellosis.

23. Rams shall not be moved into the State unless they have been examined by a Government Veterinary Officer of the State or Territory from which they originate and found to be free of clinical evidence of epididymitis and—

- (a) originate from an ovine brucellosis accredited free flock; or
- (b) within 90 days preceding movement, have been subjected to the complement fixation test for ovine brucellosis with negative results.

Johne's Disease.

24. Sheep or goats shall not be moved into the State unless the herd from which they are derived is a property in which Johne's Disease has not been known to exist or suspected to have existed during the period of 5 years immediately prior to movement.

Identification of sheep and goats.

25. Sheep and goats shall not be moved into the State unless they can be identified to their property of origin by means of a wool brand, ear tag, tattoo or some other approved identification.

CATTLE AND SHEEP FOR IMMEDIATE SLAUGHTER.

Cattle for immediate slaughter—brucellosis.

26. Breeding cattle shall not be moved to the State for the purposes of immediate slaughter at an abattoir in the Kimberley Division of the State unless each animal, including spayed females but not including bulls, from a brucellosis non-assessed herd, a brucellosis provisionally clear herd, a brucellosis infected herd, or a brucellosis restricted herd has been subjected to a serological test for brucellosis with negative results at least 30 days immediately before movement.

Cattle for immediate slaughter—tuberculosis.

27. Cattle shall not be moved to the State for the purposes of immediate slaughter at an abattoir outside the Kimberley Division unless the cattle are certified by a Government Veterinary Officer or Inspector of Stock of the State in which the property of origin is situate as coming from a herd having one of the following statuses (which ever applies in relation to the cattle)—namely—

- (a) tuberculosis accredited free;
- (b) tuberculosis confirmed free;
- (c) tuberculosis tested negative; or
- (d) tuberculosis monitored negative,

and unless each breeding animal including spayed females is certified by a Government Veterinary Officer as coming from a herd having one of the following statuses, namely—

- (e) brucellosis accredited free;
- (f) brucellosis confirmed free;
- (g) brucellosis tested negative;
- (h) brucellosis monitored negative.

Sheep and cattle.

28. Sheep and cattle shall not be moved to the State for the purposes of immediate slaughter at an abattoir outside the Kimberley Division of the State unless each animal being moved that has not been born and bred on a property situate in an area in which liver fluke vector snails are not known to exist or suspected to exist has been treated for liver fluke with an approved anthelmintic not more than 14 days prior to movement.

Cattle and
sheep to be
identifiable.

29. (1) Cattle or sheep shall not be moved to the State for the purpose of immediate slaughter at an abattoir outside the Kimberley Division of the State unless each animal being moved is identified by a paint or wool brand as the case requires, and in the case of cattle each animal is tagged with the registered tail tag of the property of origin.

(2) Cattle shall not be moved to the State for the purpose of slaughter at an abattoir inside the Kimberley Division unless each animal being moved is identified to its property of origin by means of the registered tail-tag, ear mark or brand, as the case requires, and in addition cattle derived from tuberculosis infected premises shall be marked by a paint mark along the animal's back.

SWINE.

Swine
brucellosis.

30. Swine shall not be moved to the State from Queensland or any part of the Northern Territory that is north of the Tropic of Capricorn unless the swine are derived from—

- (a) a herd that is a brucellosis accredited free herd; or
- (b) a herd in which swine brucellosis is not known to exist and each animal being moved has been subjected to a blood test for swine brucellosis with negative results within 30 days before movement.

POULTRY.

Poultry.

31. Domestic fowl, pheasants and other game birds, other than newly hatched birds and hatching eggs, shall not be moved to the State unless—

- (a) the virus of infectious laryngotracheitis in a form likely to cause economic loss does not exist in the birds being moved and has not existed within 80 kilometres of the property of origin for a period of at least 3 months immediately prior to movement;
- (b) clinical infectious laryngotracheitis in any form has not existed in the birds being moved;
- (c) the birds being moved have not been vaccinated against infectious laryngotracheitis within a period of 3 months prior to movement; and
- (d) the flock from which the birds are derived is—
 - (i) accredited as being free from pullorum disease; or
 - (ii) not known to be infected with pullorum disease and the birds have been serologically tested with negative results within 30 days prior to movement.

Newly
hatched birds
and hatching
eggs.

32. Newly hatched poultry, turkeys, pheasants and game birds and eggs of these species shall not be moved to the State unless—

- (a) the flocks from which they are derived are free from pullorum disease; and
- (b) the hatchery in which they were hatched has contained eggs that are hatched only from flocks that are free from pullorum disease.

DEER.

Liver fluke.

33. (1) Deer shall not be moved to the State unless they have been treated with an approved anthelmintic within 14 days prior to movement and the date and type of treatment shall be certified by a Government Veterinary Surgeon in the State or Territory in which the property of origin is situate.

(2) Deer shall not be brought into any portion of the State that is within the district of any of the following local authorities, namely—

The Cities of Nedlands, Perth, Subiaco, Stirling, Cockburn, Fremantle, Melville, Canning, Gosnells and South Perth; the Towns of Claremont, Cottesloe, Mosman Park, Bassendean and East Fremantle; and the Shire of Bayswater, Kalamunda, Mundaring, Swan, Wanneroo, Kwinana, Rockingham, Armadale-Kelmscott, Belmont, Serpentine-Jarrahdale.

The Shires of Mandurah, Murray, Waroona, Harvey, Dardanup, Collie, Capel, Busselton, Donnybrook, Balingup, Augusta-Margaret River, Manjimup, Nannup and the City of Bunbury, unless the property of destination—

- (a) has been approved as being free from the liver fluke vector snail; and
 - (b) has approved facilities for the holding of the deer and their treatment for liver fluke.
- (3) Deer entering any portion of the State except the Kimberley Division, shall be subjected to 2 further treatments of an approved anthelmintic under the supervision of an inspector as follows—
- (a) the first treatment shall be administered not earlier than 19 days and not later than 22 days after the treatment administered prior to movement of the stock into the State;

- (b) the second treatment shall be administered not earlier than 56 and not later than 63 days after the treatment administered prior to movement of the stock into the State.
- Tuberculosis and brucellosis. 34. Deer shall not be moved to the State from any State or Territory, other than Tasmania, unless they have been subjected to intradermal tests for tuberculosis and serological tests for brucellosis with negative results within 30 days before movement. ”.
- Third Schedule amended. 6. The Third Schedule to the principal regulations is amended by deleting Form 6, Form 6A, Form 6B and Form 6C.

Principal regulations. 2. In these regulations the Enzootic Diseases Regulations 1970* are referred to as the principal regulations.

First Schedule amended. 3. The First Schedule to the principal regulations is amended in Part C by inserting after "Sarcoptic mange" the following—
" Squamous cell carcinoma (including perineal cancer) of sheep ”.

COLLEGES ACT 1978-1983.

KALGOORLIE COLLEGE.

PURSUANT to section 26 (1) of the Colleges Act 1978-1983, the Council of the Kalgoorlie College hereby makes the Statute set out in the Schedule hereto and authorises the affixing of the Seal thereto.

Schedule.

STATUTE No. 9.

STUDENT DISCIPLINE.

1. Definitions: In this Statute, unless the contrary intention appears:
- “Board” means the Board of Discipline, convened by the Director.
- “Member of College” means enrolled student, member of staff, member of Council.
- “Officer of the College” means member of Academic staff or member of general staff delegated by the Director.
- “Staff” means a person in the employ of the College.
- “Student” means a student enrolled at the College.
- “Director” includes any Senior Officer of the College to whom the Director has delegated any of his powers and functions.
- “Misconduct” shall have the meaning set out in section 2.
2. Misconduct: In this Statute, “misconduct” means conduct on the part of a student which impairs and/or impinges upon the reasonable freedom of other persons to pursue their studies, researches, duties or lawful activities in the College and/or upon College premises or to participate in the life of the College or which is otherwise detrimental to the proper conduct of the College and without limiting the generality of the foregoing, includes:
- wilful obstruction or disruption of any teaching, study, research or examination;
 - wilful obstruction or disruption of any official meeting, proceeding or ceremony within the College or any College activity;
 - wilful interference with the freedom of speech within the College of any member of the College or of any person invited by any section of the College to express his views;
 - wilful interference with the freedom of movement within the College of any member of the College or any visitor;
 - failing to leave any place within the College forthwith upon being directed to leave it by an Officer of the College;
 - entering any place within the College which the student is forbidden by any Statute, By-law or Rule to enter or which the student has been forbidden to enter by any Senior Officer of the College;
 - acting dishonestly or unfairly in connection with any examination or other academic work;
 - wilfully obstructing or attempting to obstruct or deter any member of the staff of the College in the performance of his duties;
 - wilfully damaging or wrongfully dealing with any College property or the property within the College of any person;

- (j) assaulting or attempting to assault any person within the College;
- (k) failing to comply with any provision of any Statute, By-law or Rule; and
- (l) failing to comply with any penalty imposed under any Statute, By-law or Rule.

An instance of misconduct shall be deemed to be a disciplinary offence within the meaning of the Act.

3. Reporting of Students: A student may be reported within a reasonable time in relation to the circumstances by any member of staff to the appropriate Head of School, for any breach of discipline or misconduct. Where misconduct occurs in the Library, the appropriate Head of School is the Head Librarian.

4. Suspension and Fines:

- (a) Where, in an academic staff member's opinion, student misconduct has occurred, the staff may suspend the student in accordance with Rules as defined in Statute No. 4.
- (b) Where misconduct occurs in the Library, a student may be suspended by an Officer from all Library privileges for twenty-four (24) hours.
- (c) Any breach of discipline referred to in the above which resulted in a temporary suspension of this nature should be reported to the appropriate Head of School in writing not later than within twenty four (24) hours of the suspension being imposed.
- (d) On hearing the complaint, a Head of School may fine the student up to \$5 and/or suspend him from class attendance for periods up to one (1) week, if in his opinion the student's conduct is likely to be prejudicial to efficient teaching. If the Head of School feels that a more severe penalty is justified, he will refer the case to the Director.
- (e) The Director may fine the student any amount up to \$20. He may also suspend the student for any period up to four (4) weeks if, in his opinion, the student's presence in class is likely to prejudice efficient teaching. If, in the Director's opinion, a more severe penalty is warranted, then he will refer the case to the Board within fourteen (14) days of the offence being reported to him.
- (f) Notwithstanding the provisions of 4d and 4e above, the student may be required to make good any damage or loss, in accordance with the Colleges Act (as amended).
- (g) Any student who is suspended for any length of time, must at the completion of his suspension report to the Head of School. The Head of School may then at his discretion, impose a probationary period.
- (h) When placed on probation, a student commits a further breach of discipline, appropriate action may be taken under the guidelines as set out in section 4 subsections a, b, c, d, e, f.

5. Board of Discipline:

- (a) The Board shall consist of the Director or his nominee as Chairman, two academic staff nominated by the Director and two students nominated by the Council of the Student Association. The decision of the Board shall be by simple majority. A quorum of the Board shall be three (3) but shall always include at least one (1) student member. In the event of there being no Student Association from time to time, the student member shall be the student member elected to the College Council.
- (b) The Registrar or a member of the administrative staff appointed by him shall act as Secretary of all Boards of Discipline.
- (c) The Board may fine a student up to \$50 and/or may suspend him for twelve months or for any shorter period. The suspension shall include the withdrawal of right to sit for any examination held during the period of suspension. If the offence occurs after the end of the academic year, the Board may suspend the student for any period up to the end of the following calendar year.
- (d) Where the Board finds that the breach of discipline is sufficiently serious to warrant stronger action, or if a second offence has been reported after the student has been notified of any action pending against him, the Board may expel the student. The student may apply for re-admission not less than twelve months after the date of expulsion. Such application must be made to the Director, who may refer it to the Board.
- (e) In addition to cases referred to it by the Director, the Board may also hear appeals from students against disciplinary decisions of a Head of School or the Director. Notice of appeal should be lodged with the Registrar within seven days of the student being informed of the penalty.
- (f) The person against whose decision an appeal is being heard shall not be a member of the Board but shall be replaced by a nominee.
- (g) A student, who must appear in person, may call evidence, and unless the Board (for a good reason) determines otherwise may be represented by any other person of the student's choice not being a qualified legal practitioner. In cases where a student is represented by another person, the Board may co-opt an associate member who shall not have voting power.

6. Examinations: Any person controlling a College examination may report a student for misconduct to the Registrar. If, in the opinion of the person controlling the examination, the student's conduct is prejudicial to the satisfactory performance of the other students present, action may be taken in accordance with Rules established according to Statute No. 4. All cases shall be reported by the Registrar to the Director, together with his recommendation. The Director may then decide whether or not to allow the results of the particular examination to stand. In addition, he may also fine the student an amount not exceeding \$20.

7. Advice to Students:

- (a) Wherever practicable, a student shall be informed by the Head of School as soon as possible, of the nature of any complaints made against the student. Confirmation in writing shall be forwarded by certified mail to the address shown on the student's enrolment form. In all cases, the person or Board hearing the complaint against the student, shall give the student the opportunity of answering the charges laid.
- (b) A student shall be informed, as soon as possible, of all penalties and suspensions imposed. The student shall also be immediately informed in writing by certified mail to the address shown on the student's enrolment form. Failure to pay a fine within twenty-eight (28) days shall constitute a breach of discipline and a further penalty may be imposed by the Director within the limits prescribed above. Alternatively, the Director may refer the matter to the Board.
- (c) In any case of appeal to be heard before the Board or Council, the student shall be given notice in writing at least fourteen (14) days prior to the hearing. This shall be sent by certified mail to the address shown on the student's enrolment form.
- (d) Any notice or copy of decision given by post shall be deemed to have been given when the letter would have been received at the address in the normal course of post.

8. Role of Council:

- (a) All fines and penalties imposed shall be reported to the next meeting of the Council. The proceedings of any Board meeting shall also be tabled before the Council.
- (b) The Council may hear appeals against decisions in any cases which have been before the Board only and may confirm, quash or vary any such decisions within the limits laid down above. Appeals shall be made in writing to the Council through the Registrar within fourteen (14) days of the Board decision.

9. Payment of Fines: Any fines not paid within sixty (60) days may be recovered under the due process of the law.

10. Prosecution under a Land By-law: Where, under any College Land and Traffic By-laws, a student has been prosecuted for an alleged breach of that By-law, he cannot be proceeded against under this Statute, in respect of a complaint of which the particulars are substantially the same as the particulars of the alleged breach under the Land and Traffic By-law.

GOVERNMENT SCHOOL TEACHERS' TRIBUNAL.

Application No. S3/84.

IN the matter of: An application for an award to provide allowances for teachers employed in country localities entitled the "Government School Teachers' (Education Department) Locality Allowances Award 1984".

In the matter of an application by the State School Teachers' Union of Western Australia (Incorporated) for the issue of an award entitled the "Government School Teachers' (Education Department) Locality Allowances Award 1984".

Reasons For Decision.

At the present time, teachers working in remote areas of the state receive locality allowances under the provisions of the Government School Teachers' (Education Department) Locality Allowances Award 1981, the term of which expired on the 31st day of December 1983. The Applicant now applies for the issue of a new award structured in a form different from that of the award which it is to replace. A comprehensive review of the allowances payable is not sought and in point of fact the application is limited to increases in respect to seven localities and provision for allowances for teachers serving at two new locations where schools have recently been established.

The Respondent in his answer formally objects to any increase in the rates applicable in the established localities. No objection is raised as to the allowances sought for the two new localities. The substance of the objection is based on the constraints imposed under the National Wage Case guidelines. In the presentation of his case, however, the Respondent indicated that, if the adjustments sought could be granted without offence to those guidelines, he would not have any objection.

The advocate for the Applicant, Ms Parker, in her address to the Tribunal, had this to say about the changes sought to be introduced:

Ms Parker: Briefly, I will direct the tribunal to the changes that we have put into the preamble to the award and where appropriate simply explain the reasoning behind it. As to clause 3, Scope, the wording in this clause has been amended to reflect the wording of the relevant clause which is also clause 3 of the Transfer, Travelling, Relieving and Removal Award 1984. This is simply an attempt to standardise as far as possible the wording within the various awards.

As to clause 4, Definitions, the definitions remain unchanged except for the inclusion of the definition of spouse, the wording of which is as for the Transfer, Travelling Relieving and Removal Award.

Clause 5, Locality Allowances, has been amended to remove the reference to the married male teacher and to allow all teachers to receive half of the prescribed rates, with the exceptions to this being detailed under subclause (1). The reasons for this desire to remove the discriminatory aspects in the award, the union's attention to this clause was initiated by a female teacher whose marriage was dissolved. Her husband continued to receive the married rate after they were separated. The teacher tried unsuccessfully to request the department to pay her the single rate and although they did pay her from the date they became aware of her request, they replied that they were unable to pay her the rate back to the date of separation as under the award the rate had properly been paid to the married male teacher.

The remainder of clause 5 basically reflects the previous award. As to clause 6, Adjustment of Rates, it is considered that the method previously employed of pegging the rates in columns B, C and D for various periods is no longer necessary as the adjustments have served their purpose. It is therefore proposed and agreed between the parties that all rates shall be adjusted every 12 months in accordance with variations in the Consumer Price Index for Perth for the period ending on 31 December each year and that the rates so adjusted shall apply on and from the first day of January each year.

If I can turn now to the schedule of rates, all rates claimed—with some exceptions—are the same. The union is only claiming an increase in the allowance payable to teachers in Newman, Paraburdoo, Tom Price, Hedland, Goldsworthy and Esperance.

In relation to the established centres, the increases sought are as follows:

Esperance—	From \$710 to \$801.
Goldsworthy—	From \$2 482 to \$2 654.
Newman	} From \$2 482 to \$2 654.
Paraburdoo	
Tom Price	
Hedland—	From \$2 450 to \$2 915.
Wyndham—	From \$3 709 to \$3 962.

The Applicant further seeks the incorporation of an allowance of \$4 000 for Limestone Creek and the same amount for Glen Hill.

In the case of Wyndham, the Applicant seeks to increase the allowance to that payable at Kununurra. As to all the other established centres, the Applicant seeks increases so that the allowances will equate with those payable under the Public Service's Allowances (District) Agreement No. 5 of 1973.

The 1981 award was made after a lengthy hearing and extensive enquiries on the part of the representatives of the parties and the Tribunal. In the course of the case then presented on behalf of the Applicant, it was strenuously argued that, because of the nature of teaching, the standing of teachers in the community in which they serve, the need for teachers to update their qualifications to keep abreast of current educational trends and to pursue higher studies for the purposes of promotion, the allowances payable to teachers should in the ordinary course be higher than those paid under the general Public Service Agreement. At that time the Tribunal was persuaded that the argument so addressed to it had merit and accordingly the award, when issued, provided for allowances substantially higher than those paid under the Public Service Agreement. For example, the allowance payable for Newman was some 25.29 per cent higher and that for Hedland 14.05 per cent higher.

Teachers now do not enjoy the advantage they held in 1981. In respect to Newman, Paraburdoo, Tom Price and Goldsworthy, an increase of some 6.9 per cent is required to bring the allowances of teachers serving in those localities up to the allowances payable to Public Servants. Again, the increases necessary to bring about the same result for Esperance and Hedland are 12.8 per cent and 18.9 per cent respectively.

The allowances payable under the award were determined by the application of formulae as therein expressed in the first instance. A method of adjustment of allowances in accordance with movements in the Consumer Price Index for Perth was incorporated with the object of producing allowances not less than those prevailing immediately before the issue of the award and to minimise the relative inequities which might arise by the strict mathematical application of formulae. By that method some localities were granted indexation annually for the term of the award, others for only two years, one year or not at all. Esperance, Goldsworthy, Newman, Paraburdoo, Tom Price and Hedland were localities in the last named classification, that is to say they were excluded from any adjustment. The Tribunal had recourse to the most up-to-date statistical data then available and applied that data to the formulae employed. The scheme of the award involved the application of economic forecasts, particularly in relation to the movement in the cost of living over the term of the award. The Tribunal saw the need for a careful monitoring of the allowances so determined and anticipated being given the opportunity to effect a review long before the present application was referred to arbitration. In relation to the localities mentioned to which indexation did not apply, the Tribunal is satisfied that the allowances payable are now anomalous and adjustment is justified.

In the case of Wyndham, the Applicant seeks an increase of the allowance to that which prevails for Kununurra. Again, whilst the formulae were accurately applied for both centres when the award was made, the Tribunal considers that there is now substance in the claim that it would be inequitable to continue to pay an allowance for Wyndham lower than that for its more populous near neighbour.

The Australian Conciliation and Arbitration Commission in the National Wage Case 1983 made provision for the adjustment of wages every six months in relation to the last two quarterly movements of the eight capital C.P.I. unless persuaded to the contrary by those seeking to oppose the adjustment. A comprehensive set of guidelines was published for the determination of increases outside the adjustments mentioned. The Tribunal without any reservation acknowledges the relevancy of the principles emanating from the National Wage Case to an application of the nature of that now being considered.

It is the Respondent's view that the Tribunal should acknowledge the influence of the principles referred to and the weight to be given to them. Mr. O'Connor for the Respondent had this to say:

What we are simply doing in this case is putting before the Tribunal that the wage fixing principles need to be acknowledged, and no doubt the Tribunal does acknowledge them—to perhaps make short reference to those principles but at the same time to indicate, as the minister intended that I do, that he recognises the potential conflict and perhaps the anomalous situation where teachers are receiving less allowances for working and living in the same areas as their wages and Public Service counterparts. I think the bottom line really is that we are leaving it in the hands of the Tribunal, and I hope that is not an unkind thing to do.

He later added to make the issue quite clear:

By formal submission, I would request and indicate that the respondent does submit that these principles are relevant in the context of an assessment of wages, salaries and conditions for teachers in this Tribunal. We would formally request that the Tribunal does acknowledge the principles in determining this and other matters brought before it.

Mr. O'Connor conceded that principle 6 of the Wage Fixing Principles was relevant to this application. The Tribunal notes that paragraph (a) (i) of that principle provides that:

In the resolution of anomalies, the overriding concept is that the Commission must be satisfied that any claim under this Principle will not be a vehicle for general improvements in pay and conditions and that the circumstances warranting the improvement are of a special and isolated nature.

Principle 9 deals with allowances and by paragraph (i) provides "existing allowances which constitute a reimbursement of expenses incurred may be adjusted from time to time where appropriate to reflect the relevant change in the level of such expenses". The Commission is clearly saying that in the resolution of anomalies and in the adjustment of allowances there must not be any significant flow-on and regard must be had to the cost of granting increases. In our view, the adjustments now sought can be granted without offence to the guidelines to rectify anomalies and, in the case of the locality allowance payable for Wyndham, a perceived inequity. Whilst there cannot be any reasonable doubt of the propriety in the course adopted by the Tribunal in 1981 in endorsing the general thrust of the argument of the Union and in applying the scientific statistical evidence then available, in the end result the award throughout its life must on the face of it bear the imprint of rationality and fairness. From what is before us, we are satisfied that the claims for increases in allowances for the several localities named and for the allowances for the two new centres are justified and that they represent no possible flow-on impact and a total cost which is not significant.

The terms of the award otherwise have been agreed by the parties and effect significant changes. It is now agreed that the preference previously enjoyed by male teachers should be removed. Heretofore, a married male teacher was entitled to the full allowance whether he had a dependant or not whereas his female counterpart was required to establish that she was supporting a dependant. The male teacher now bears the same onus. This change is consistent with the terms of the Sex Discrimination Act 1984. The parties are now agreed that the benefits of the award should extend to cover *de facto* marriages. The application of this extension might well raise administrative difficulties as the parties appear to appreciate. The definition of "spouse" is in terms as previously agreed. The Tribunal considers that early consideration should be given to the adoption of a definition consistent with that for a "*de facto* spouse" as contained in the Sex Discrimination Act 1984 and which is in these terms:

"*de facto* spouse", in relation to a person, means a person of the opposite sex to the first-mentioned person who lives with the first-mentioned person as the husband or wife of that person on a bona fide domestic basis although not legally married to that person.

The parties are also agreed that the locality allowances determined under this award shall be adjusted on the first day of January each year in accordance with movements in the Consumer Price Index for Perth. As to the commencement date, it is also now agreed that any allowance which would otherwise have been payable for 1984 shall not be prejudiced by the making of this award. In relation to the commencement date, the Tribunal is bound by the terms of section 22(3) of the Government School Teachers' Arbitration and Appeal Act which provides that in making an award the commencement date shall not precede the day on which the application was submitted for arbitration. Here, the application was so submitted by letter dated the 9th day of August 1984. The parties further agree that this award shall run for three years. The application is granted and the award sought now issues in the terms set out in the annexure hereto.

Having heard Ms E. M. A. Parker on behalf of the applicant and Mr. M. O'Connor on behalf of the respondent, the Tribunal pursuant to the power conferred on it under Part III of the Government School Teachers' Arbitration and Appeal Act 1979 hereby makes the award following:—

GOVERNMENT SCHOOL TEACHERS'
(EDUCATION DEPARTMENT)
LOCALITY ALLOWANCES AWARD 1984.

1.—Title.

This award shall be known as the Government School Teachers' (Education Department) Locality Allowances Award 1984.

2.—Arrangement.

1. Title.
2. Arrangement.
3. Scope.
4. Definitions.
5. Locality Allowances.
6. Adjustment of Rates.
7. New Locations.
8. Term of Award.

3.—Scope.

This award shall apply to all Government School Teachers employed under the provisions of the Education Act 1928-1981 who are employed in localities within the State of Western Australia covered by the provisions hereof.

4.—Definitions.

"Teacher" means teacher as defined in the Government School Teachers' Arbitration and Appeal Act 1979.

"Director General" means the Director General of Education appointed under the Education Act 1928 and amendments.

"Family" means the spouse of a teacher and their children.

"Spouse" includes a person who is not married to the teacher but who is living with the teacher on a permanent domestic basis as a *de facto* wife or husband.

5.—Locality Allowances.

1. All teachers employed in localities covered by this award shall be paid the locality allowance at half the rates contained within the schedule hereto, excepting that:

- (i) A teacher whose spouse is not in receipt of any district allowance and/or has dependent children shall receive the full rate.
- (ii) A teacher other than a teacher under (i) who is the main support of relatives usually resident in this state shall also be paid the full rates for the locality in which that teacher is employed provided that under (i) and (ii) a teacher shall if required supply proof that he or she is the main support of relatives or that his or her spouse does not receive a district allowance and/or the teacher has dependant children.

2. Where both spouses are teachers, the total of the allowances payable to them shall not exceed the allowance at the full rate for the locality in which they are employed.

3. When a teacher is on long service leave or other approved leave with pay (other than leave for the May, August and Summer vacations) that teacher shall only be paid the locality allowance for the period (if any) of the said leave his or her family or other dependants remains or remain resident in the locality to which the allowance relates.

4. If a teacher leaves the locality in which he or she is employed on duty and remains away for a continuous period of two weeks thereafter and until that teacher returns he or she shall not be entitled to the Locality Allowance which ordinarily would have been payable unless the Director-General otherwise determines.

5. A teacher who is employed for a complete school year in a school in a locality in respect of which a locality allowance is payable shall be paid the appropriate allowance for the full year in which so employed.

6.—Adjustment of Rates.

The locality allowances payable under this award shall be adjusted on the 1st day of January, 1985 and thereafter every 12 months in accordance with variations in the Consumer Price Index for Perth for the preceding 12 months period ending on the 31st day of December each year.

7.—New Locations.

Liberty is reserved to the Union to apply to amend this award for the purpose of establishing a locality allowance for a teacher taking up an appointment in a new location not mentioned in the schedule.

8.—Commencement.

The locality allowances determined by this award shall apply from the commencement of the first pay period commencing on or after the 9th day of August, 1984 provided that the locality allowance payable to any teacher in 1984 shall not be less than that to which the teacher would have been entitled had this award not been made.

9.—Term of Award.

The term of this award shall be for a period of three years from the date hereof.
