Petroleum Act 1967-1981. PROCLAMATION.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA | By His Excellency Professor Gordon Reid, Governor | fin and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 15 and subsections (2) and (3) of section 152 of the Petroleum Act, 1967-1981 that notwithstanding the Land Act 1933 or any other Act the Governor, by proclamation, may declare that any land of the Crown or part thereof reserved for or dedicated to any public purpose under any Act and howsoever classified that:

- (a) is not Crown Land within the meaning of that expression in section 5 of the Act; and
- (b) is specified in the proclamation,

is Crown Land for the purposes of the Petroleum Act 1967-1981 and is land to which that Act applies, so long as the proclamation remains in force:

Now, therefore, I the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in the exercise of the powers under subsection (2) of section 15 of the Petroleum Act 1967-1981, do hereby declare that the land of the Crown comprising Reserve No. 12666 classified as Class "C" and set apart for the purpose of Experimental Farm Sisal Hemp and Reserve No. 35118 classified as Class "A" and set apart for the purpose of Historical Site and Buildings pursuant to the provisions of the Land Act 1933 is Crown Land for the purpose of the Petroleum Act, 1967-1981 and is land to which the Petroleum Act 1967-1981 applies so long as this proclamation remains in force, subject to:

- (i) Survey lines within the Reserves being delineated with minimum interference to and disturbance of vebetation and timber, any traverse lines through timber stands being cut by hand.
- (ii) The clearing and construction of tracks being limited to a superficial blading and filling in of soil irregularities only, so that as far as is practicable rootstock and topsoil is left in place with its contained seed load. Any shot holes drilled being filled in and left in a safe and level condition.
- (iii) On completion or abandonment of any operational area such measures as are reasonably practical being taken to restore the area to its original condition.

and in regard to Historical Site and Buildings Reserve No. 35118 also subject to:

(iv) No action being taken that will interfere with or damage any historical buildings or ruins that form part of the old Onslow Townsite and which lie within Reserve No. 35118.

By-laws Relating to the Licensing of Morgues.

- (1) A person who desires a license for-
 - (i) a place for the temporary reception of the bodies of the dead and for keeping such bodies for the purpose of view, examination, identification or other lawful purpose before burial or cremation; or
 - (ii) any private premises for the temporary reception and keeping of such bodies awaiting burial

shall make application to the Council for the license hereinafter called a Morgue License.

- (2) An applicant for a Morgue License shall submit with his application a plan of the place or premises proposed to be used for the purpose mentioned in this by-law.
- (3) Every Morgue License issued by the Council shall be in force from the date of the issue thereof until 31 December then next ensuing unless it be cancelled in the meantime.
- (4) Applications for renewal of a license shall be made annually during the month of December.
 - (5) No license shall be granted in respect of any premises unless-
 - (a) All rooms to be licensed have dimensions exceeding 3m x 3m in floor area and 2.7m in height;
 - (b) The interior surface of all walls have a smooth impervious surface;
 - (c) All floors are constructed of impervious material with a smooth surface having a fall to a bucket trap set in the floor; such bucket trap to be connected to a drain which shall discharge into the sewer or if the sewer is not available to a leach drain or soakwell of a size specified by the Council;
 - (d) The premises are ventilated by direct communication to the outer air. Such ventilation is to be in the ratio of .015 square metre of uncontrolled ventilating area to each 9.00 square metres of floor area. The situation of the ventilating openings and the general arrangement of the ventilation shall be to the satisfaction of the Chief Health Surveyor.
- (6) The penalty for a breach of or non-compliance with the provisions of these by-laws shall be not more than \$100, and in the case of a continuing offence not more than \$4 per day.

(e) Trucks exceeding 6 tonnes aggregate weight single axle \$20.00

(f) Trucks exceeding 8 tonnes aggregate weight dual axle \$40.00 (g) Compactor Vehicles or Bins—load capacity not exceeding

10 cubic metres \$44.00 (h) Compactor Vehicles or Bins—load capacity exceeding

10 cubic metres \$70.00

(i) Bulk Bins exceeding 3 cubic metres but not exceeding

6 cubic metres \$20.00

(j) Bulk Bins exceeding 6 cubic metres but not exceeding

15 cubic metres \$34.00 (k) Bulk Bins exceeding 15 cubic metres \$44.00

(1) Articulated Vehicles \$50.00

City of Stirling.

By-laws.

CITY OF STIRLING being a local authority under the provisions of the abovementioned Act, does hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by that Act and all other powers enabling it to make and publish the following by-laws:

- 1. In these by-laws the by-laws of the City of Stirling published in the Government Gazette of 30 May 1961 and amended from time to time are referred to as "the principal by-laws".
- 2. The principal by-laws are amended by deleting by-laws 63, 64 and 65 and substituting the following by-laws—
 - 63. The occupier of land or premises within the district on which any poultry or pigeons are kept shall, except when permitted pursuant to these by-laws to release them, keep or cause to be kept all poultry and pigeons confined in a suitable cage, pen or enclosure at all times.
 - 64. (1) A person shall not keep more than twenty (20) poultry on any land or premises within the district except in a rural zone.
 - (2) Not more than ten (10) of the number of poultry kept by a person on land or premises within the district (other than in a rural zone) shall be ducks.

 - (2) Where a person produces to the Council written evidence to the satisfaction of the Council that he is currently a member of or affiliated with a bona fide pigeon club or association the Council may in writing permit that person—
 - (a) to keep a number of pigeons in excess of thirty (30) but not more than seventy-five (75);
 - (b) to release the pigeons for the purpose of exercise for not more than a period of two (2) hours at any one time nor more often than twice each day.
 - (3) The Council may revoke a permit granted by it under Sub-bylaw (2) hereof.

WILDLIFE CONSERVATION ACT 1950.

F & W 49/48.

THE Minister for Fisheries and Wildlife, pursuant to the powers conferred by section 14 and 17B of the Wildlife Conservation Act 1950, does hereby declare as follows:

- (1) That the period from six o'clock in the afternoon of Saturday, 12 January 1985 until one minute before midnight in the afternoon of Sunday, 24 March 1985, shall be an open season in respect of those species of wild duck in the Second Schedule and the Third Schedule hereto in those parts of the State which lie within the boundaries of the South West Division and Eucla Division, as defined in section 28 of the Land Act 1933 with the exception of those areas defined in the First Schedule hereto.
- (2) That the species of wild duck in the Second Schedule and the Third Schedule hereto are game species in all parts of the State in respect of which an open season on those species is declared by paragraph (1) of this notice.
- (3) That a person shall not take any wild duck of a species declared to be a game species under the Second Schedule and the Third Schedule hereto unless he has been granted a license under Regulation 21 of the Wildlife Conservation Regulations.
- (4) That a person shall not take any wild duck or the egg of any wild duck for the purpose of keeping it in captivity, or for the purpose of aviculture or for the purpose of sale.
- (5) That a person shall not sell any wild duck.
- (6) That a person shall not take any wild duck by any means other than a shotgun licensed pursuant to the Firearms Act 1973, and having a calibre of less than thirty-one fortieths of an inch of internal diameter (ten gauge).
- (7) That a person shall not use any boat, raft, launch or other type of boat which is powered by any type of motor or engine or which is propelled or towed by any means other than by hand for the purpose of taking or attempting to take wild ducks.
- (8) That a person shall not take or attempt to take more than ten wild ducks of a species in the Second Schedule hereto in any one day of the open season.

- (9) That a person shall not have under his control or in his possession or keep in any cold store or any freezing chambers or other premises at any one time—
 - (a) on opening day of the open season, more than ten wild ducks of a species in the Second Schedule hereto;
 - (b) on any day other than opening day of the open season, more than twenty wild ducks of a species in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (10) That a person shall not possess or transport a wild duck unless at least one fully feathered wing is attached to the bird, and that the wing and plumage may be removed from the duck—
 - (a) when the duck is prepared for immediate cooking, and
 - (b) after the duck is taken to the residence of its owner for preservation.
- (11) That a person shall not take or attempt to take wild ducks of a species in the Second Schedule and the Third Schedule hereto between the hours of—
 - (a) 7.00 p.m. and 5.00 a.m. on any day other than opening day of the open season, and
 - (b) midnight and 6.00 p.m., and 7.00 p.m. and midnight on opening day of the open season,

in those areas defined in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

- (1) All nature reserves except those which may have been classified as shooting or hunting areas pursuant to the provisions of section 12A of the Wildlife Conservation Act 1950.
- (2) All cities and towns which lie within all municipal districts, within the meaning of the Local Government Act 1960.

THE Minister for Fisheries and Wildlife, pursuant to the powers conferred by section 14 and 17B of the Wildlife Conservation Act 1950, does hereby declare as follows:—

- (1) That the period from five o'clock in the forenoon of 1 January 1985, until seven o'clock in the afternoon of 31 December 1985, shall be an open season in respect of those species of wild duck in the Second Schedule hereto in those parts of the State which lie within the boundaries of the Kimberley, North West and Eastern Divisions, as defined in section 28 of the Land Act 1933, with exception of those areas defined in the First Schedule hereto.
- (2) That the species of wild duck in the Second Schedule hereto are game species in all parts of the State in respect of which an open season on those species is declared by paragraph (1) of this notice.
- (3) That a person shall not take any wild duck of a species declared to be a game species under the Second Schedule hereto unless he has been granted a license under Regulation 21 of the Wildlife Conservation Regulations.
- (4) That a person shall not take any wild duck or the egg of any wild duck for the purpose of keeping it in captivity, or for the purpose of aviculture or for the purpose of sale.
- (5) That a person shall not sell any wild duck.
- (6) That a person shall not take any wild duck by any means other than a shotgun licensed pursuant to the Firearms Act 1973, and having a calibre of less than thirty-one fortieths of an inch of internal diameter (ten gauge).
- (7) That a person shall not use any boat, raft, launch or other type of boat which is powered by any type of motor or engine or which is propelled or towed by any means other than by hand for the purpose of taking or attempting to take wild ducks.
- (8) That a person shall not take or attempt to take more than ten wild ducks in any one day of the open season.
- (9) That a person shall not have under his control or in his possession or keep in any cold store or any freezing chambers or other premises at any one time—
 - (a) on opening day of the open season more than ten wild ducks;
 - (b) on any day other than opening day of the open season, more than twenty wild ducks.
- (10) That a person shall not possess or transport a wild duck unless at least one fully feathered wing is attached to the bird and that the wing and plumage may be removed from the duck—
 - (a) when the duck is prepared for immediate cooking, and
 - (b) after the duck is taken to the residence of its owner for preservation.

 - (a) when the duck is prepared for immediate cooking; and
 - (b) after the duck is taken to the residence of its owner for preservation.
- A Wildlife Officer may, if after inspection of the property he considers it necessary, prohibit the taking of that species of wild duck described in the Schedule hereto on that property, until the landholder obtains a Damage License in accordance with the Wildlife Conservation Regulations and thereupon no persons shall take those wild ducks on that property except under authority of a license.

 - (d) the full-time senior tutors and tutors in the departments and centres referred to in Sub-Clauses (b) and (c) above, other than those temporarily holding such appointments;
 - (e) the Head of the Department of Education or his nominee who shall be a full-time member of the teaching staff of the Faculty of Education;
 - (f) the Dean of the Faculty of Economics and Commerce;
 - (g) the University Librarian;
 - (h) the President of the Arts Union of the University and two other members enrolled in the Faculty of Arts elected annually by the members of that Union; and
 - (i) such other persons as may from time to time be appointed by the Senate on the nomination of the foregoing, and on the recommendation of the Professorial Board.

- (b) Clause 12 is amended by deleting the existing clause 12 and substituting the following:
 - 12. The Faculty of Science shall consist of-
 - (a) the Sub-Dean of the Faculty;
 - (b) the professors and lecturers and the full-time senior tutors in the Departments of Anatomy and Human Biology, Anthropology, Biochemistry, Botany, Clinical Biochemistry, Computer Science, Geography, Geology, Human Movement and Recreation Studies, Mathematics, Microbiology, Organic Chemistry, Pathology, Pharmacology, Physical and Inorganic Chemistry, Physics, Physiology, Psychology and Zoology and in such other departments as may from time to time be established within the Faculty;
 - (c) the Deans of the Faculties of Agriculture, Economics and Commerce and Education or their nominees who shall be full-time members of the teaching staff of the faculties concerned;
 - (d) the Head of the School of Agriculture;
 - (e) those members of the School of Agriculture, the Centre for Prehistory, the Crystallography Centre and the Electron Microscopy Centre, who are involved in teaching and research or other business of the Faculty of Science and who are accepted by the Faculty:
 - (f) three members of the Science Union of the University enrolled in the Faculty of Science elected annually by members of that Union; and
 - (g) such other persons as may from time to time be appointed by the Senate on the nomination of the Faculty and on the recommendation of the Professorial Board.

 - (a) The title of the Statute is amended by deleting "Professorial Board" and substituting "Academic Board".


