Child Welfare Act 1947.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 19 of the Child Welfare Act 1947, it is provided, *inter alia*, that the Governor may, by Order in Council, appoint a Special Magistrate for any Children's Court or Courts: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor in exercise of the power conferred by the aforementioned provision of the said Act and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby appoint David Wilford Walsh as a special Magistrate for every Children's Court heretofore established under the said section, with effect from 17 January 1985.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the City of Melville in trust for "Community Hall Site" with power to the said City of Melville subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands and Surveys to each and every lease or assignment of lease being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion thereof for any term not exceeding twenty one years from the date of the lease, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to me by section 37 of the said Act; provided that no such lease or assignment of lease shall be valid or operative until the approval of the Minister for Lands and Surveys or an officer authorised in that behalf by the Minister, has been endorsed on the Lease Instrument, or Deed of Assignment, as the case may be.

#### Local Government Act 1960.

#### ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act 1960, it shall be lawful for the Governor on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils mentioned in the schedule hereto have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for streets within the said Councils, be declared public streets: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to the public streets and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

#### City of Bunbury.

L. & S. Corres. 584/984.—Road No. 17254 (Latrielle Road). Forests Act 1918-1976.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 100/84; L. & S. 1076/897V8.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act 1918-1976 it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner—

- the Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation;
- after such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament, his proposal dated the 25th day of October, 1983, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State forest: And whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown land as State forest No. 4 described in the Schedule hereto.

Schedule.

State Forest No. 4 All that portion of land bounded by lines commencing from the intersection of the eastern boundary of Coal Mining Lease 12/719 as shown on Mines Department Original Plan 1284 with the easternmost southern boundary of Wellington Location 2814, a point on a present

boundary of State forest No. 4 and extending easterly along that boundary to the northwestern corner of location 4906 (Reserve 29312), thence southwesterly, generally southeasterly, northeasterly generally northerly and again northeasterly along boundaries of that location to the western side of a 20 metre road passing along the northwestern boundaries of Collie Townsite Lots 1270 and 1271, thence generally southerly along that side and the western side of Lyall Street (Road Number 13278) to the northeastern corner of the western severance of location 1973 (Reserve 29236), a point on a present boundary of State forest Number 4 aforesaid, thence northwesterly, generally southwesterly, generally westerly, generally southerly and again generally southwesterly along boundaries of that State forest to the eastern boundary of Coal Mining Lease 12/719 aforesaid and thence northerly along that boundary to the starting point.

### WESTERN AUSTRALIAN TROTTING ASSOCIATION.

#### RULES OF TROTTING.

##### Notice of Amendment.

NOTICE is hereby given that at a meeting of the Committee of the Western Australian Trotting Association held at Gloucester Park, East Perth on 26 March 1985 it was resolved by an absolute majority of the Committee as follows:

1. That Rule 1 be amended by the deletion of the definition of "partnership" and the substitution therefor of the following:—

"Partnership" means and refers to two or more, but not exceeding six, persons who are the owners or lessees of a horse, but no partnership shall exist between persons in their capacity of owners and others in their capacity as lessees.

2. That Rule 1 be amended by the deletion of the definition of "Racing Manager" and the substitution therefor of the following:—

"Racing Manager" in the case of a company, syndicate or partnership shall mean a natural person appointed as Racing Manager pursuant to these rules; in the case of a lease or a transfer shall mean the natural person named in the lease or transfer as the Racing Manager and if no natural person is so named then it shall mean the lessee or transferee who is first named.

3. That Rule 495 to Rule 516 (inclusive) be amended by the deletion thereof and the substitution therefor of the following:

495.

(a) Every application for registration of a company or syndicate shall be in writing in such form as the Controlling Body shall from time to time prescribe signed:—

- (i) where a company is the applicant or is a member of a syndicate by the company under its common seal;
- (ii) where a syndicate is the applicant by all members of the syndicate;

(b) Every application for registration of a company or syndicate shall:

- (i) contain the name by which it is proposed the company or syndicate shall be known;

- (ii) where a company is the applicant:—
- (1) attach a certified copy of the certificate of incorporation of the company;
  - (2) attach a certified copy of the memorandum and articles of association of the company;
  - (3) attach a certified copy of the latest annual report of the company;
  - (4) attach a certified copy of the latest balance sheet and profit and loss account of the company;
  - (5) contain the full name, address, occupation and date of birth of each director of the company;
  - (6) contain the full address of the registered office of the company;
  - (7) contain the full name, address and occupation of each member of the company unless the Controlling Body in its discretion and to the extent it considers appropriate has agreed to dispense with the whole or part of this requirement;
  - (8) where the Controlling Body shall so require contain the full names, addresses and occupations of all natural persons who are members of a company which is itself a member of a company or syndicate seeking registration and/or on whose behalf a share or interest in a company or syndicate is held;
  - (9) where a member of a syndicate is a company (in this paragraph called "the member company") which is not registered under these rules where the Controlling Body shall so require the member company shall provide the Controlling Body with such documents and information as the member company would be required to provide if it were an applicant for registration;
- (iii) where a syndicate is the applicant:—
- (1) attach a certified copy of the syndicate agreement which shall contain:—
    - (A) the full name and address, and where applicable the occupation and date of birth, of each member of the syndicate;
    - (B) the share of each member in any horse of which the syndicate is owner or lessee;
    - (C) provision setting out the financial arrangements between the members of the syndicate and in particular the method of calculating and the timing of payments of any contribution payable by a member of the syndicate towards racing, training and other expenses;
    - (D) provision for the keeping of proper books of account for the syndicate and the distribution of copies of the annual accounts of the syndicate to each member of the syndicate;
    - (E) such other provisions as the Controlling Body shall from time to time in its discretion deem fit.
  - (2) attach a declaration made by each member of the syndicate declaring that the member has read these Rules and in particular the Rules that concern syndicates and interests in horses;
  - (3) contain an address in Western Australia to be the registered address for the syndicate;
  - (4) contain details of the registration of the syndicate by any other State Controlling Body; and
  - (5) attach a power of attorney executed by each member of the syndicate granting to one of the members of the syndicate, being a natural person, full power and authority to execute all such necessary documents and to do all such further acts matters and things as shall be necessary to facilitate the lease or transfer of title to the horse or horses for the time being the property of the syndicate and agreeing and undertaking to ratify and confirm whatsoever the appointed attorney shall lawfully do or cause to be done under and by virtue of the power of attorney.
- (iv) be accompanied by such fee as the Controlling Body shall from time to time prescribe.

496.

- (a) For the purposes of these Rules:—
- (i) a combination of more than one person and not more than six persons shall be termed a partnership;
  - (ii) a combination of more than six persons and not more than twenty persons shall be termed a syndicate.
- (b) For the purpose of calculating the number of natural persons in any combination of persons for the purpose of the application of the Rules in this part contained:—
- (i) a husband and wife shall be counted as two persons; and
  - (ii) only the persons having a like interest in a horse shall be counted to the intent that in the case of a leased horse for the purpose of determining who are the lessees, a person who is an owner and not also a lessee shall not be counted.

497. A horse shall not be registered in the names of more than six persons nor shall a lease to more than six persons be registered. Where a horse is owned by or leased to more than six persons they shall be required to form a syndicate.

498.

- (a) A syndicate or company may own any number of horses at any one time and may be a co-owner of a horse with a natural person.
- (b) No syndicate shall be a member of another syndicate or race a horse in partnership with another syndicate without the approval of the Controlling Body.
- (c) A natural person, company, firm or stud may be a member of or have an interest in any number of syndicates.

499.

- (a) The Controlling Body shall have complete discretion whether to approve:—
  - (i) any company or syndicate as the owner or lessee of a horse or;
  - (ii) any member or members of a company or syndicate as the owner or owners or lessee or lessees of a horse; and
  - (iii) the Racing Manager of a horse for a company or syndicate.
- (b) The Controlling Body shall not grant approval to any syndicate of which any member is a disqualified person.
- (c) A company or syndicate shall be registered for such period as the Controlling Body may from time to time determine and shall if the Controlling Body so determines be required to renew its or their registration annually.
- (d) Upon the registration of a company or syndicate the Controlling Body shall issue a certificate showing:
  - (i) the name of the company or syndicate;
  - (ii) the registered office of the company or the office of the syndicate (as the case may be);
  - (iii) the name and address of the Racing Manager;
  - (iv) the date of registration;
  - (v) such other information as the Controlling Body may from time to time determine.
- (e) The Controlling Body may in its absolute discretion at any time and without assigning any reason therefore suspend or cancel the registration of a company or syndicate.
 

Without prejudice to the foregoing registration shall be cancelled if:

  - (i) any member, Racing Manager, director or officer of any syndicate is or becomes a disqualified person or a person whose interest in a horse would under these Rules operate to prohibit the horse from being entered for or starting in a race;
  - (ii) any member or Racing Manager or officer of a company or syndicate fails to supply to the Controlling Body or its Stewards within a stipulated time such information as the Controlling Body (or the Stewards at the direction of the Controlling Body) may require;
  - (iii) being a company registered alone as a syndicate a winding up order is made or a receiver, receiver and manager or official manager is appointed in respect of it;
  - (iv) the Controlling Body accepts an application for registration of a company or syndicate subject to the company or syndicate satisfying a condition and limits the time in which such condition is to be so satisfied and the time so limited expires without such condition being so satisfied.
- (f) The registration of a syndicate will not be affected by the fact that:
  - (i) a member of the syndicate has disposed of the whole part or part of his share since the agreement was registered provided that:
    - (1) no share of any one such member is disposed of more than once in any period of twenty-eight (28) days; and
    - (2) notification of each such disposition signed by the transferor and transferee and containing a declaration by the transferee declaring that he/she has read these Rules and in particular these Rules that concern syndicates and interests in horses is lodged with the Controlling Body within seven (7) days of the disposition;
    - (3) if the Controlling Body by notice sent to the registered address of the syndicate calls for a new formal agreement to be lodged with the Controlling Body for approval then at the expiration of twenty-eight (28) days after the date of the notice or such other period as the notice shall prescribe the registration of the agreement previously lodged shall be cancelled; or
  - (ii) a member of the syndicate has died, provided that:—
    - (1) written notification of death is lodged with the Controlling Body within twenty-eight (28) days;
    - (2) if the Controlling Body by notice sent to the registered address of the syndicate calls for a new formal agreement to be lodged with the Controlling Body for approval then at the expiration

of twenty eight (28) days after the date of the notice of such other period as the notice shall prescribe the registration of the agreement previously lodged shall be cancelled; or

- (iii) there has occurred any changes of the directors and of the shareholders of a company registered as a syndicate or of the members of a syndicate not being a company provided that written notification thereof shall be made to the Controlling Body within twenty eight (28) days.
- (g) The registration of a syndicate may be cancelled by the Controlling Body upon written application by a member of the syndicate or a company registered as a syndicate if the Controlling Body is satisfied;
  - (i) that the applicant has given written notice of the application to all other members at their last known place of abode;
  - (ii) that such notice has called upon such other members if they object to such application to do so to the Controlling Body in writing within twenty one (21) days of the date of such notice;
  - (iii) that within twenty one (21) days of such notice having been so given no member has given notice in writing to the Controlling Body that he objects; and
  - (iv) that in all respects it is reasonable and proper that the syndicate registration be cancelled.
- (h) Notice of the suspension cancellation or reinstatement of the registration of a syndicate shall be given in writing and sent to the last known place of abode of each member of the syndicate.

500. Subject to rules 499 (b) and 499 (e) (i) where a member of a syndicate is disqualified the syndicate;

- (a) may not race a horse;
- (b) may engage in breeding activities and may register any horse bred by the syndicate; and
- (c) may with the approval of the Controlling Body sell any horse bred by it or of which it is the owner on such terms as approved by the Controlling Body.

501. Rule 347 shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to each and every horse owned by a company or syndicate a member of which is disqualified or warned off provided that the Controlling Body may approve the sale or assignment by a disqualified member of a syndicate or by the spouse of that person of his or her share or interest in the company or syndicate whether by public auction or by private treaty to any other person (including another member or members of the syndicate) or a relative by blood of the disqualified person or spouse if it is satisfied on reasonable grounds that the proposed sale or assignment is made *bona fide*.

502. Registration of a company or syndicate shall be for such period and on such terms and conditions as the Controlling Body shall from time to time prescribe and application for renewal of registration of a company or syndicate shall be made annually prior to the date of expiration of the then current registration and such application shall provide such information as the Controlling Body requires and shall be accompanied by the prescribed renewal fee.

503. Subject to Rules 499 (e) (iii) and 499 (g) (i) (ii) (iii) (iv) where a company resolves to go into liquidation or an order is made for the winding up of a company or where the members resolve to dissolve or terminate a syndicate, notice thereof shall forthwith be given by the Racing Manager to the Controlling Body.

504.

- (a) Where the owner or lessee of a horse is a company, a syndicate or a partnership such owner or lessee shall nominate in writing a natural person as its Racing Manager and shall lodge such nomination with the Controlling Body. If in the case of a partnership no such nomination has been made the person whose name appears first on the certificate of registration or (in the case of partners who are lessees on the lease) shall be deemed to be the Racing Manager.
- (b) A company, syndicate or partnership shall have only one Racing Manager at any one time. A Racing Manager does not require to be a member of the company syndicate or partnership in relation to which he is so nominated.
- (c) The Racing Manager appointed hereunder by virtue of such appointment shall be deemed to have full power and authority to;
  - (i) register, nominate and race the horse or horses for the time being the property of the company, syndicate or partnership; and
  - (ii) to employ and terminate the employment of trainers and drivers; and
  - (iii) to do or undertake all such acts and things as an owner or lessee (as the case may be) of a horse is obliged or authorized to do by these Rules; and
  - (iv) to appoint an agent for the doing or undertaking of any of the acts and things which may be done or undertaken by an agent on behalf of an owner or lessee (as the case may be) and such appointment when made shall be forthwith advised in writing to the Controlling Body.

505. Where a Racing Manager desires to retire or resign or be relieved of his position as Racing Manager of a company, syndicate or partnership and the other members of the company, syndicate or partnership will not consent thereto he may give notice to the Controlling Body in writing of his desire and he shall forthwith upon the lodging of such notice with or the receipt of such notice by the Controlling Body be deemed to have retired as Racing Manager.

506. Where a Racing Manager retires in accordance with Rule 505 the Controlling Body shall forthwith notify in the case of the company, the company and in the case of a syndicate or partnership the members thereof. Within fourteen (14) days of such notification the company, syndicate or partnership shall appoint, in writing, another Racing Manager and lodge the Controlling Body notice thereof. Such appointment shall in the case of a company be made under its common seal and in the case of a syndicate or partnership by all its members. Where no such notice is lodged within the aforesaid period of twenty one (21) days the Controlling Body may in its absolute discretion for such period thereof as it sees fit refuse to permit any horse owned by the company, syndicate or partnership to compete in any race.

507.

- (a) The Articles of Association of a company or the constitution or rules of a syndicate or the provisions of a partnership agreement and the rights and liabilities of a member of a company, syndicate or partnership shall be the responsibility of such members and neither the Controlling Body nor any Club shall be in any way obliged to ensure that the provisions of such articles, constitution, rule or agreement or any part thereof are observed or performed; and
- (b) The Controlling Body and every such Club shall be entitled to accept any nomination engagement or appointment made and every other act matter or thing done and every deed or document executed or signed by the Racing Manager for the time being of the company, syndicate or partnership as being the act of the company, syndicate or partnership and as being done with the authority and consent of all members thereof; and
- (c) For the purposes of these Rules the Racing Manager shall be deemed at all times to be acting with the full authority and consent of all members of the company, syndicate or partnership; and
- (d) The payment by the Controlling Body or any Club to the Racing Manager of any company, syndicate or partnership (or to such Racing Manager's duly appointed agent) of any stake prize or prize money or the delivery to such Racing Manager or agent of any trophy to which such company, syndicate or partnership is entitled shall be a full and sufficient discharge to the Controlling Body or Club for such payment or delivery.

508. The Controlling Body may on being satisfied that a syndicate is duly registered in another State or Territory of the Commonwealth, grant to that syndicate registration (to be known as temporary registration) for a period not exceeding three (3) months and may renew temporary registration on such terms as it thinks proper.

509. The Controlling Body shall keep and maintain a register of companies and syndicates registered under these Rules in which shall be entered the name of the company or syndicate and its registered office or registered address and in the case of a syndicate the name address and occupation of each member of the syndicate. The register shall be kept at the office of the Controlling Body and information contained therein may be made available to members of the public upon written application to the Controlling Body.

510. Every company, syndicate or person committing a breach of any Rule contained in this part or failing to comply with any of the requirements thereof shall be guilty of an offence under these Rules and may be dealt with accordingly.

511. Every member of a company or syndicate shall in all respects and for all purposes be bound by these Rules, irrespective of the nature or extent of the interest or rights of such person in the company or syndicate and irrespective of the provisions of any articles, rules or constitution governing the company or syndicate or any agreement or stipulation as between the members of the company or syndicate.

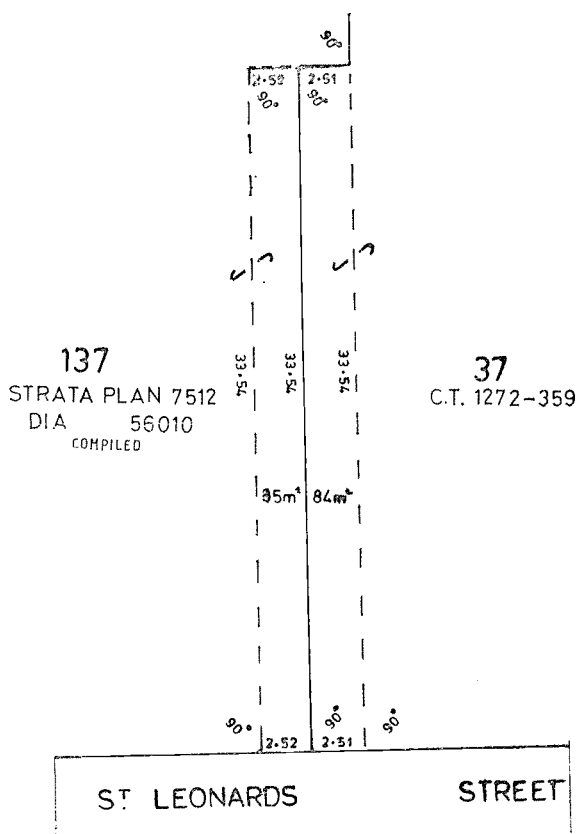

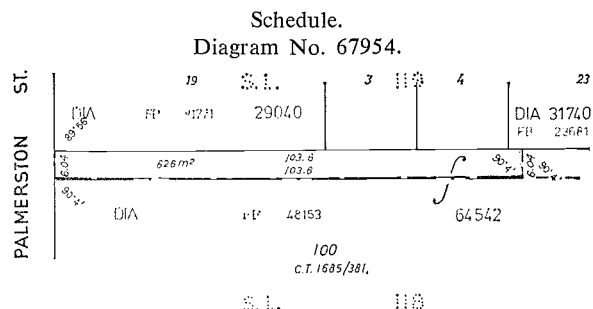

FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1963.  
FACTORIES AND SHOPS (ASBESTOS) REGULATIONS 1985.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

## PART I—PRELIMINARY.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Factories and Shops (Asbestos) Regulations 1985.
- Commencement. 2. These regulations shall come into operation on the 28th day after the day on which they are published in the *Government Gazette*.
- Interpretation. 3. In these regulations unless the contrary intention appears—  
 “approved” means approved by the Chief Inspector;  
 “AS”, followed by a designation, refers to the Australian Standard having that designation that is published by the Standards Association of Australia;  
 “asbestos” means fibrous minerals of crocidolite, amosite, chrysotile, anthophyllite, tremolite or actinolite or any material containing any mixture or any one of those minerals;  
 “asbestos dust” means airborne dust consisting of or containing a time weighted average fibre concentration of asbestos, as measured by the Membrane Filter Method as approved by the National Health and Medical Research Council, October 1976, in excess of the threshold limit value;  
 “asbestos process” means any manufacturing process involving the use or handling of asbestos or any substance containing asbestos, and includes—  
 (a) the sawing, cutting and sanding of asbestos materials;  
 (b) the repair, maintenance and replacement of asbestos surfaces;  
 (c) the cleaning and disposal of asbestos materials; and  
 (d) the mixing and application of asbestos shorts, cements, grouts, putties and similar compounds;  
 “asbestos processing area” means a workplace in which an asbestos process is carried out;  
 “exhaust system” means a system whereby asbestos is removed from the air and includes—  
 (a) any collecting hood, ductwork and fan whereby asbestos is collected;  
 (b) any air cleaning device whereby asbestos is removed from the air;  
 (c) any collector, bin or receptacle in which asbestos is collected; and  
 (d) any means whereby a collector, bin or receptacle referred to in paragraph (c) is emptied of the asbestos it contains;  
 “respiratory equipment” means respiratory equipment that complies with the relevant requirements of AS 1716-1982 “Respiratory Protective Devices” and is approved for use with asbestos;  
 “threshold limit value” means a time weighted average fibre concentration of—  
 (a) 0.1 fibre of crocidolite or amosite; or  
 (b) 1.0 fibre of any other asbestos type,  
 per millilitre of air, whether containing other material or not;  
 “workplace” means any premises to which these regulations apply.
- Application. 4. These regulations apply to—  
 (a) any factory, shop or warehouse where an asbestos process is carried out;  
 (b) any factory, shop or warehouse where asbestos is present; and  
 (c) any premises to which the operation of the Act has been extended in accordance with section 6 where asbestos is present.

## PART II—PROHIBITIONS.

- Compressed air, dry brushing and dry sweeping. 5. A person shall not use or cause or permit to be used compressed air, dry brushing or a dry sweeping method in conjunction with any asbestos process or any other work involving the use or handling of asbestos or any material containing asbestos.
- Spraying process. 6. A person shall not use or cause or permit to be used asbestos or any material containing asbestos in a spraying process.

Crocidolite, amosite and products containing crocidolite or amosite.

7. A person shall not handle or use or permit another person to handle or use crocidolite, amosite or products containing either mineral in any workplace unless—

- (a) approval in writing has been given by the Chief Inspector to handle or use the crocidolite, amosite or products; and
- (b) the handling or use is carried out in accordance with these regulations and any directions given in writing by the Chief Inspector.

#### PART III—DUTIES OF OCCUPIER.

Duties of occupier.

8. (1) Where an asbestos process is carried out in a workplace the occupier shall—

- (a) ensure that the workplace is kept free of asbestos dust by the use of an efficient exhaust system capable of removing asbestos from the air; or
- (b) subject to subregulation (2), in circumstances where it is not possible to comply with paragraph (a), ensure that—
  - (i) employees engaged in an asbestos process are provided with and use non-powered tools or approved tools which incorporate suitable dust suppression or dust extraction attachments;
  - (ii) respiratory equipment is provided and used in accordance with subregulation (3); and
  - (iii) employees and other persons in the workplace exposed to asbestos dust are provided with and wear approved protective coverall clothing which is waterproof, disposable or made of reusable polyester cotton blend or similar material so as to ensure that the employees are adequately protected from exposure to asbestos dust.

(2) An occupier shall not operate under subregulation (1) (b) unless he has first obtained the written approval of the Chief Inspector.

(3) An occupier required to provide respiratory equipment under subregulation (1) (b) (ii) shall ensure that employees and other persons in the workplace exposed to asbestos dust—

- (a) are provided with respiratory equipment;
- (b) are trained in the correct usage and maintenance of that equipment in accordance with the relevant requirements of AS 1715-1982 "Selection Use and Maintenance of Respiratory Protective Devices"; and
- (c) use that equipment when engaged in any asbestos process.

(4) Where an asbestos process is carried out in a workplace the occupier, upon completion of the process, or at least daily, shall ensure that the asbestos processing area is left in a clean and safe conditions either by washing or by vacuuming with approved vacuuming equipment.

Operation of exhaust system.

9. An occupier shall ensure that an exhaust system provided in accordance with regulation 8 (1) (a) is kept in operation at all times when an asbestos process is occurring and for such time thereafter as is necessary to remove, so far as is reasonably practicable, all asbestos from the air in the asbestos processing area.

Dust collectors.

10. An occupier shall ensure that any dust collector that is part of an exhaust system provided in accordance with regulation 8 (1) (a) is—

- (a) installed in an enclosure designed to prevent the escape of asbestos;
- (b) replaced forthwith whenever the likelihood of a leakage of asbestos occurs; and
- (c) not emptied, cleaned, agitated or reconditioned except by mechanical or other approved means.

Inspection.

11. An occupier shall ensure that an exhaust system provided in accordance with regulation 8 (1) (a) is inspected and examined at intervals not exceeding 3 months by a person competent to conduct such inspections and examinations.

Report.

12. (1) A person making an inspection and examination under regulation 11 shall, no later than the working day next following the day on which he concludes the inspection and examination, furnish the occupier with a written report which shall—

- (a) list the components of the exhaust system that were inspected or examined;
- (b) give details of the results of such inspection and examination with respect to each component of the exhaust system listed in the report; and
- (c) make any necessary recommendation with respect to the maintenance or replacement of any components of the exhaust system.

(2) The occupier shall keep a report furnished under subregulation (1) in the workplace for a period of not less than 2 years and ensure that such report is readily available for inspection.

- Work while exhaust system repaired or replaced.
13. Where an occupier is furnished with a report under regulation 12 (1) and that report recommends the repair or replacement of any component which through its deficiency renders the exhaust system ineffective, the occupier shall immediately stop any asbestos process from continuing in the asbestos processing area and—
- (a) ensure that the asbestos process is not resumed until such time as defective components of that exhaust system are repaired or replaced; or
  - (b) having first obtained the written approval of the Chief Inspector, allow the asbestos process to continue in accordance with regulation 8 (1) (b) in the asbestos processing areas serviced by the exhaust system.

- Cleaning of protective clothing.
14. An occupier shall ensure that—
- (a) all items of protective clothing worn during an asbestos process of the asbestos process, or at least daily, within the workplace if in his workplace are cleaned as soon as possible after completion it has approved facilities for cleaning or at a commercial laundry; and
  - (b) all items of protective clothing which are to be despatched to a commercial laundry are thoroughly wetted, sealed in impermeable bags and clearly marked to show that they contain asbestos contaminated material.

#### PART IV—DUTIES OF EMPLOYEES.

- Employees to use protective equipment.
15. (1) An employee working in an asbestos processing area shall—
- (a) use tools and other equipment provided in accordance with regulation 8 (1) (b) (i); and
  - (b) handle asbestos material in such a manner as to minimise the emission of airborne asbestos during the asbestos process.
- (2) An employee working in an asbestos process for whose use protective coverall clothing and respiratory equipment has been provided shall—
- (a) wear and make proper use of the respiratory equipment in accordance with the relevant requirements of AS 1715-1982 "Selection, Use and Maintenance of Respiratory Protective Devices";
  - (b) wear the protective clothing; and
  - (c) forthwith report to his employer any defect he discovers in the protective coverall clothing or respiratory equipment.

#### PART V—CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE.

- Asbestos processing areas to be cleaned.
16. (1) An occupier of a workplace where asbestos is present shall ensure that the workplace is maintained in a clean condition and, in particular, shall ensure that—
- (a) all machinery, apparatus, equipment, work benches, furniture and other fittings used for the purpose of an asbestos process;
  - (b) the external surfaces of any exhaust system and vacuum cleaning equipment; and
  - (c) the floor, wall, ceilings or inside part of the roof and other interior surfaces,
- are kept, as far as is reasonably practicable, free of asbestos and other waste materials.
- (2) An occupier shall ensure that cleaning is carried out under subregulation (1)—
- (a) by means of approved vacuuming equipment; or
  - (b) by some other suitable method, so that, so far as is practicable, asbestos is not discharged into the atmosphere of the workplace.

- Maintenance of asbestos surfaces.
17. (1) An occupier of a workplace shall ensure that—
- (a) every asbestos surface in the workplace is kept in good condition;
  - (b) any repair or sealing necessary to prevent the breaking up of asbestos or the release of airborne asbestos is done promptly; and
  - (c) maintenance, replacement, removal or repair of an asbestos cement surface in a workplace is carried out in accordance with the provisions of Part VIIA of the Construction Safety Regulations 1973 made under the Construction Safety Act 1972.

- Warning signs.
18. An occupier of a workplace shall ensure that—
- (a) a warning notice with the words "DANGER—ASBESTOS" is prominently displayed at the entry to each asbestos processing area in the workplace; and
  - (b) signs referred to in paragraph (a) conform with the requirements of paragraphs 4.2.1 and 4.2.3 of AS 1319-1983 Safety Signs for the Occupational Environment.

- Disposal of asbestos.
19. An occupier shall ensure that asbestos removed for disposal is placed in approved bags or contained in some other approved manner.

PART VI—ASBESTOS BASED THERMAL/ACOUSTIC  
INSULATING MATERIALS.

- Sealing of asbestos-based insulating material.
20. (1) Where asbestos-based thermal/acoustic insulating materials have been used for any purpose in a workplace the Chief Inspector may issue a written notice to the occupier requiring him to remove or seal the insulating material in such manner and within such time as the Chief Inspector directs.
- (2) Where the Chief Inspector issues a notice to an occupier under subregulation (1) the occupier—
- shall comply with the notice; and
  - shall engage the services of an asbestos removal contractor to carry out the work in accordance with Part VIIA of the Construction Safety Regulations 1973 made under the Construction Safety Act 1972.
- (3) A copy of any notice issued under subregulation (1) shall be forwarded by the Chief Inspector to the Chief Inspector appointed under the Construction Safety Act 1972.

## PART VII—ASBESTOS MATERIALS.

- Despatch and storage of asbestos materials.
21. (1) In this regulation "asbestos material" means—
- loose asbestos fibre;
  - material containing loose asbestos fibre for use in an asbestos process; and
  - waste material containing asbestos fibre that has been collected within a workplace.
- (2) An occupier shall ensure that asbestos material is not—
- despatched from an asbestos processing area;
  - so far as is practicable, received into an asbestos processing area; or
  - stored in a workplace,
- unless it is contained in a receptacle which prevents the escape of asbestos or is transported within the workplace in a completely enclosed system of conveyance.

## PART VIII—MISCELLANEOUS.

- Medical examinations.
22. (1) Until 1 April 1985 the Commissioner, Health Department of Western Australia and thereafter the Principal Medical Officer of the Occupational Health, Safety and Welfare Commission established under the Occupational Health, Safety and Welfare Act 1984 may by notice in writing direct an occupier to provide such medical examinations as he deems appropriate for persons employed in a workplace in which there is an asbestos processing area.
- (2) An occupier shall comply with a notice given under subsection (1) within the time specified in the notice.
- General offence and penalty.
23. (1) A person who contravenes a provision of these regulations commits an offence.
- (2) A person who commits an offence under these regulations is liable to a fine not exceeding \$400 and in the case of a continuing offence to a daily penalty of \$20.
- Repeal.
24. The Asbestos Regulations 1978 are repealed.

#### SOIL AND LAND CONSERVATION (BUNTINE-WEST WUBIN SOIL CONSERVATION DISTRICT) ORDER 1985.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council under sections 22 and 23 of the Soil and Land Conservation Act 1945 and on the recommendation of the Minister for Agriculture.

Citation. 1. This Order may be cited as the Soil and Land Conservation (Buntine-West Wubin Soil Conservation District) Order 1985.

Commencement. 2. This Order shall come into operation on the date of publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette*.

Interpretation. 3. In this Order—  
“the district” means the Buntine-West Wubin Soil Conservation District constituted by item 4 of and the Schedule to, this Order.

Buntine-West Wubin Soil Conservation District. 4. All that portion of land set out in the Schedule to this Order is hereby constituted as the Buntine-West Wubin Soil Conservation District.

Establishment of District Advisory Committee. 5. Pursuant to section 23 (2) of the Act there is hereby established for the district a district advisory committee to be known as the District Advisory Committee for the Buntine-West Wubin Soil Conservation District.

Constitution of Committee. 6. (1) It is hereby determined, on the recommendation of the Minister after consultation with the Shires of Dalwallinu and Perenjori, that the committee shall comprise 10 members of whom—

- (a) one shall be the Commissioner of Soil Conservation or his nominee;
- (b) one shall be appointed by the Governor on the nomination of the Shire of Dalwallinu;
- (c) one shall be appointed by the Governor on the nomination of the Shire of Perenjori;
- (d) 3 shall be appointed by the Governor on the nomination of the Minister to represent the Primary Industry Association of Western Australia; and
- (e) 4 shall be appointed by the Governor on the nomination of the Minister, and shall be persons actively engaged in land use in the district.

(2) The Primary Industry Association of Western Australia shall submit to the Minister a panel containing the names of persons willing to be appointed as members of the committee and where such a panel is submitted in accordance with this Order 3 persons whose names appear on the panel submitted by the Primary Industry Association of Western Australia shall be nominated for appointment.
