PURSUANT to section 9 (2) of the Marine and Harbours Act 1981, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby vary the proclamation made under that Act published in the *Government Gazette* on 5 February 1982 at pages 410 to 412 as amended by proclamation so published on 19 February 1982 at page 584 by deleting the description of the Dampier Port Area as set out in the Schedule to that proclamation and substituting the following description—

#### " DAMPIER PORT AREA.

All that portion of sea bed bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the High Water Mark of the Indian Ocean on the northwestern coast of the mainland of the State of Western Australia at east Longitude 116 degrees 36 minutes and extending north along that meridian to south

Latitude 20 degrees 23.7 minutes; thence northeasterly to the intersection of south Latitude 20 degrees 18.2 minutes with east Longitude 116 degrees 50 minutes; thence south along that meridian to the High Water Mark of Flying Foam Passage on the northwestern coast of Dolphin Island; thence generally southwesterly along that mark to the westernmost southwestern extremity of Dolphin Island; thence southwesterly crossing the western entrance of Searipple Passage to the High Water Mark of Mermaid Sound at the north westernmost northwestern extremity of Burrup Peninsula; thence generally southwesterly along that mark to the northeastern boundary of DeWitt Location 197; thence northwesterly, generally southwesterly and generally northwesterly along boundaries of that location to the northeastern corner of Location 199; thence generally northwesterly and generally southwesterly along boundaries of that location to the westernmost northwestern corner of Location 197; thence generally southwesterly and easterly along boundaries of that location to the High Water Mark of Mermaid Sound; thence generally southwesterly along that mark to the northern corner of Location 151; thence generally southwesterly, southeasterly, northeasterly, again southeasterly; again northeasterly, northwesterly, again northeasterly and again southeasterly along boundaries of that location to the westernmost northern corner of Location 200; thence southwesterly, southeasterly generally southerly and east along boundaries of that location to the High Water

Mark of King Bay; thence generally easterly and generally southwesterly along that mark and generally southwesterly along the High Water Mark of the Indian Ocean to the starting point.

Excluding DeWitt Location 26 (Special Lease 3116/3471), Location 42 (Special Lease 3116/3806), Location 43 (Special Lease 3116/3807), Location 79 (Special Lease 3116/4976), and Location 90 (Special Lease 3116/5503) Lands and Surveys Public Plans: Dampier and Barrow Island 1:250 000, Dampier S.E. 1:25 000 and Nichol Bay S.W. 1:25 000. ”.

#### PRISONS AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1985.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Prisons Amendment Regulations 1985.
- Reg. 10 amended. 2. Regulation 10 of the Prisons Regulations 1982\* is amended—
- (a) in subregulation (1), by deleting paragraphs (b) and (c) and substituting the following paragraphs—
- “ (b) served a continuous period of 15 years service in the Western Australia Prisons Department and such medallion shall be known as the “Western Australia Prisons Department 15 years Long Service Medallion”; or
- (c) served a continuous period of 25 years service in the Western Australia Prisons Department and such medallion shall be known as the “Western Australia Prisons Department 25 years Long Service Medallion”; ; and
- (b) by repealing subregulation (3) and substituting the following subregulation—
- “ (3) Where the Minister is of the opinion that in a special case a Western Australia Prisons Department 15 years Long Service Medallion or Western Australia Prisons Department 25 years Long Service Medallion ought to be awarded to a prison officer who has not served the prerequisite period in the prison service, he may make that award. ”.

Every person desiring to engage in trade as an itinerant vendor of food shall, before so engaging or if already so engaged, then during the first week of January in each year, apply to the Local Authority in the form of Schedule "C" for a licence to carry on such trade and shall with his application deposit a fee of \$60.00.

## HEALTH ACT 1911 (AS AMENDED).

## PART I—GENERAL SANITARY PROVISIONS.

Part I—General Sanitary Provisions of the existing by-laws is amended by inserting after by-law 29A (1), sub-by-law (f) a new sub-by-law as follows—

(g) A person shall not keep a goose, peacock or rooster on any land or premises within the district of the Town of Kwinana, without the written permission of Council except in a Rural Zone or Special Rural Zone as depicted in the Town of Kwinana Town Planning Scheme as amended.

## CLEAN AIR ACT 1964.

## CLEAN AIR ORDER 1985.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council under s. 43 and on the recommendation of the Air Pollution Control Council.

- Citation. 1. This Order may be cited as the Clean Air Order 1985.
- Commencement. 2. This Order shall come into operation on 1 July 1985.
- Repeal. 3. The Clean Air Order 1982 published in the *Government Gazette* on 26 March 1982 is repealed.
- Prohibition of certain industrial plant. 4. The use of abrasive blasting equipment for dry abrasive blasting is prohibited in the area specified in item 5 and the Schedule, except where that equipment is used in a grit room or grit chamber.
- Area. 5. The area to which this Order applies is the area of the municipal districts set out in the Schedule excepting that land occupied by—
- (a) Alcoa of Australia Pty Ltd;
  - (b) State Energy Commission at the Kwinana Power Station;
  - (c) Australian Iron and Steel Pty Ltd;
  - (d) B.P. Australian Ltd;
  - (e) CSBP and Farmers Ltd,
- between Rockingham Road and the high water mark of the Indian Ocean in the Town of Kwinana; and also excepting—
- (f) that land occupied by the Western Mining Corporation Ltd. Nickel Refinery west of Rockingham Road on the boundary of the Town of Kwinana and the Shire of Rockingham.

By-laws Relating to the Establishment and Maintenance of Bush Fire Brigades.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 15 February 1985, to make and submit for confirmation of the Governor the following By-laws relating to the Establishment and Maintenance of Bush Fire Brigades:—

## Interpretation.

1. In these by-laws:—

"Council" shall mean the Cranbrook Shire Council.

2. All previous by-laws relating to the establishment and maintenance of Bush Fire Brigades are repealed.

## Establishment of Brigade.

3. (a) On the resolution of the Council to establish and maintain a bush fire brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954-1981, and Regulations thereunder, the brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the brigade. Details of the brigade and its officers shall be entered in the Register of Bush Fire Brigades held by the Council.

(b) A bush fire brigade may be established for the whole of the Shire or any specified area thereof.

## Appointment of Officers.

4. The brigade members shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as they shall deem necessary to act as officers of the brigade, and such appointments shall be referred to Council for its endorsement.

5. The brigade members shall appoint a secretary of the brigade and shall notify the Council of such appointment.

6. The Council may appoint an equipment officer who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance, in good order and condition, of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Council for the purpose of the brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain.

## Powers and Duties of Officers.

7. The powers and duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954-1981, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and Regulations.

## Membership of Brigade.

8. Brigade members shall be those persons of either sex over 15 years who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the first schedule to these by-laws.

## Finance.

9. The expenditure incurred by the Council in the purchase of equipment, payment for services and generally for the purpose of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Council and records of such expenditure shall be maintained in accordance with Municipal audit requirement.

## Meetings of Brigades.

10. Meetings of the Brigade will be held as necessary, however, a minimum of one meeting per year will be held.
