SOCCER FOOTBALL POOLS ACT 1984. SOCCER FOOTBALL POOLS RULES.

MADE by Australian Soccer Pools Pty Ltd and approved by the Minister under section 11 of the Act.

These rules supersede those published in the Government Gazette dated 20 July 1984.

THE POOLS RULES.

These rules and conditions shall apply to the Soccer Pools conducted by Australian Soccer Pools Pty. Limited. On-line Entries may only be used in those States or Territories in which the relevant Minister has given prior written approval.

1. Conduct of Pools.

1.1 The Company shall conduct the determination of every Pool in accordance with all legislative and other legal requirements and under the supervision of such Government representatives as are authorised by law to be present at and to view and check the process of the determination to ensure the proper conduct thereof.

1.2 The Company is responsible for the operation of the Pool and for the payment of Prizes in accordance with all legislative and other legal requirements. All decisions made by the Company concerning the Pool including the declaration of Prizes and payment thereof and the interpretation of these Rules shall be final and binding on all Subscribers and on every person making a claim in respect thereto.

2. Application of Rules.

2.1 These Rules and all instructions and conditions printed on the Entry form shall apply to each Pool and shall be binding on all Subscribers.

2.2 By submitting Entry forms Subscribers undertake to comply with and be bound by these Rules and to accept as final and binding on them all decisions made by the Company.

2.3 For the purpose of this Rule, Entry form includes in the case of an Off-line Entry, the copy form or other document attached to the Entry form.

3. Amendment of Rules.

3.1 Subject to all legislative and other legal requirements the Company may at any time and from time to time amend, modify or abrogate these Rules and any amendment, modification or abrogation will be notified to Subscribers either by printing the same or extracts therefrom on the Entry form or other document issued by the Company from time to time or by publication in the press.

4. Entry Forms and Playing Instructions.

- 4.1 General-
 - (a) There shall be printed on the Entry form at least one set of numbered squares and each numbered square shall represent the match printed opposite the same number on the List of Matches (subject to Rule 4.1 (f) notwith-standing that there are fewer numbered squares in a Game Panel than appear on the List of Matches.
 - (b) List of Matches will be published by the Company and be available to Subscribers on request.

- (c) Subscribers may elect to enter either Standard Games or System Games described on the respective Standard or System/Multi-Week Entry forms and/or on other document published by the Company and available at the premises of Authorised Persons. To enter the Pool:—
 - (i) a Subscriber is required to make a series of Forecasts:
 - (a) in the case of an Off-line Entry form by marking "X" or,

(b) in the case of an On-line Entry form by marking a vertical line, for each Forecast in a Game Panel used by a Subscriber so that the number of Forecasts made by a Subscriber in each Game Panel corresponds with the number required to be selected in accordance with the Standard Game or with the System Game chosen by the Subscriber. In the case of System/Multi-Week Entry forms the Subscriber should also mark:—

- (c) in the case of an Off-line Entry form "X" or,
- (d) in the case of an On-line Entry form by marking a vertical line, in the appropriate Standard/System box chosen by the Subscriber and in the appropriate box for the number of weeks the Subscriber wishes to enter, or
- (ii) In the case of On-line Entries the Company may from time to time make available new or additional facilities for entering the Pool upon conditions approved by the Minister and described in the Entry form or other document published by the Company.
- (d) Subject to Rules 4.1 (f) and 4.2 to determine the Six Winning Match Numbers and the Supplementary Match Number the matches represented by the numbers in a Game Panel will be deemed to have an order of rank depending on the results of those matches in accordance with (i), (ii), (iii), (iv) and (v) herein (but having regard to (vi) and (vii) herein) and for the purposes of Rule 8.1 the six highest ranked numbered matches shall be the Six Winning Match Numbers and the seventh highest ranked numbered match shall be the Supplementary Match Number.
 - (i) Score Draw—All Score Draws will be ranked higher than any other result and a Score Draw wherein more goals are scored will be ranked higher than a Score Draw wherein fewer goals are scored.
 - (ii) Nil Score Draw (scoreless)—All Nil Score Draws will be ranked equally and shall be ranked higher than an Away Win or a Home Win.
 - (iii) Win for Away Team—All Wins for Away Teams shall be ranked higher than Home Wins. Away Wins with a smaller goal difference shall be ranked higher than Away Wins with greater goal difference and where two or more Away Wins have the same goal difference Away Wins wherein more goals are scored shall be ranked higher than Away Wins wherein fewer goals are scored.
 - (iv) Win for Home Team—Home Wins with a smaller goal difference shall be ranked higher than Home Wins with greater goal differences and where two or more Home Wins have the same goal difference Home Wins wherein more goals are scored shall be ranked higher than Home Wins wherein fewer goals are scored.
 - (v) In the event that two or more numbered matches in a Game Panel are or are deemed to be of equal rank in accordance with Rule 4.1 (d) (i), (ii), (iii) and (iv) and subject to Rule 4.1 (f) and (g) any such match printed with a greater number (in magnitude) in a Game Panel shall be ranked higher than any such match printed with a lesser number (in magnitude) in a Game Panel.
 - (vi) A reference in Rules 4.1 (d) (i), (iii) and (iv) to "more goals" or "fewer goals" refers to the total number of goals scored by both teams in a match result.
 - (vii) If there are insufficient results in accordance with Rule 4.1 (d) (i) to determine the Six Winning Match Numbers and the Supplementary Match Number, then the results in accordance with Rule 4.1 (d) (ii) shall be taken into account and if still insufficient then the results in accordance with Rule 4.1 (d) (iii) shall be taken into account and if still insufficient then the results in accordance with Rule 4.1 (d) (iv) shall be taken into account and if still insufficient then the results in accordance with Rule 4.1 (d) (iv) shall be taken into account.
- (e) Off-line Entries in which Forecasts or other instructions are marked in other than black or blue ink will not be eligible for inclusion in the Pool.
- (f) In the event that any numbered match in a Game Panel is a Void Match the result of such Void Match will be deemed to be the result of the first numbered match (not being a Void Match) on the List of Matches from number 39 and onwards and the second such Void Match will be deemed to be the result of the second numbered match (not being a Void Match) on the List of Matches from number 39 onwards and so on in ascending numerical sequence for each such Void Match.
- (g) Where the List of Matches is in respect of the Corresponding United Kingdom Pool then:
 - (i) in the event that any match in the List of Matches is not played but a result has been declared in the Corresponding United Kingdom Pool then for the purposes of the Pool such result shall be deemed to be as follows:—
 - (a) in respect of a Score Draw-a goal score of 1-1,
 - (b) in respect of an Away Win-a goal score of 0-2, and
 - (c) in respect of a Home Win-a goal score of 2-0,

- (ii) Notwithstanding that one or more of the matches was not played as printed on the List of Matches the results of matches so printed on the List of Matches shall subject to sub-clause (i) hereof be the results adopted in the Corresponding United Kingdom Pool.
- (h) For the purpose of determining the eligibility of Entries for payment of a sum computed and payable to a Subscriber in accordance with the provisions of Rule 8.1 each and every combination of six of the matches Forecasted or deemed to be Forecasted in a System Entry shall for the purposes of Rule 8.1 be deemed a separate Entry.
- (i) Subscribers may submit as many Entries as they wish.
- (j) A minimum Entry requirement may be adopted by the Company in those States or Territories where the relevant Minister has given prior written approval, such minimum Entry requirement to be printed on the Entry Form.

4.2 If the number of Forecasts selected in any Game Panel in an Off-line Entry is greater than that required for the Entry selected by the Subscriber or specified on the Entry form the highest numbered Forecasts in such Game Panel in descending numerical sequence additional to the required number will be disregarded.

4.3 If the number of Forecasts selected in any Game Panel in an Off-line Entry is less than that required for the Entry selected by the Subscriber or specified on the Entry form then the Entry the subject of such Game Panel will be accepted and evaluated for Prizes on the basis of the Forecasts selected in that Game Panel.

5. Submission of Entry Forms.

5.1 Entry forms may only be submitted through an Authorised Person or sent by post to the Company in a sealed envelope, duly stamped and addressed to "Soccerpools" at the postal address printed on the Entry form.

5.2 Each Entry form must be accompanied by payment of the correct Entry Fee or Entry Fees. By submitting Entries to an Authorised Person the Subscriber accepts liability to pay the Commission to the Authorised Person at the time of payment of the Subscription.

5.3 Payment by cheque is limited to \$43.00 except with the express written permission of the Company but any Entry with which a cheque is tendered as payment may be refused.

5.4 Each Off-line Entry form must be completed with the name and address of the person who in case of an Off-line Entry shall for all purposes be the Subscriber. In the case of an On-line Entry the person surrendering the Receipted Ticket (subject to Rule 12) to an Authorised Person or the Company is for all purposes the Subscriber. All Forecast or other instructions appearing on the Off-line Entry form or the Receipted Ticket (as the case may be) are deemed to be made or given exclusively by the Subscriber. Where a person submits an Entry as agent or nominee for another person or persons the Company will not be deemed to have any knowledge of such agency or nomination and the transaction will be conducted solely with the Subscriber.

5.5 Notwithstanding anything in these Rules or any rule of law to the contrary an Authorised Person is not nor shall he be deemed to be the agent of the Company for any purposes whatsoever and the Company shall not be responsible to any Subscriber for any negligence, neglect, omission, delay or failure on the part of an Authorised Person to forward an Off-line Entry form or transmit an On-line Entry to the Company in accordance with these Rules or in the case of an On-line Entry the failure on the part of an Authorised Person or the Computer to record an Entry or on any other account whatsoever. Neither an Authorised Person nor his servant or agent shall be responsible for any loss or damage or expense which may be sustained by the Subscriber by reason of any negligence, neglect, omission, delay or failure on the part of an Authorised Person, his servant or agent to forward any Off-line Entry form or transmit an On-line Entry to the Company.

5.6 Subject to Rule 13 to be eligible for inclusion in the Pool an Entry must be received by the Company not later than the Competition date and:---

(a) in the case of an Off-line Entry form be microfilmed, or

(b) in the case of an On-line Entry be recorded on the magnetic storage of the Computer,

before matches commence.

5.7 An Off-line Entry form received by the Company but which for any reason whatsoever is not microfilmed as provided in Rule 5.6 will be deemed (subject to these Rules) to be an Entry form submitted for inclusion in the next Pool.

5.8 In the event that a Subscription is incorrectly paid according to the Forecasts entered and/or Game Panels completed and/or System(s) selected by a Subscriber the remittance paid will be considered the deciding factor in evaluating the Forecasts entered by such Subscriber and the following provisions will apply:—

(a) where a remittance paid by a Subscriber in respect of an Entry is less than the Subscription required for the number of Forecasts selected and/or Game Panels completed and/or System(s) selected the remittance so paid will be applied to those Game Panels in alphabetical sequence for which the remittance is sufficient to comply fully with the Subscriber's instructions in respect of such Game Panels and any remaining remittance after so doing will be applied to any next remaining Game Panel(s) in alphabetical sequence in accordance with Rule 5.8 (b), and (b) after applying Rule 5.8 (a) any remaining remittance will be applied to the next remaining Game Panel(s) in alphabetical sequence as if completed in accordance with the highest numbered fully applicable System or a Standard Game for which there is a sufficient remaining remittance to constitute a Subscription and the highest numbered Forecast(s) (if any) additional to the number required for the highest numbered fully applicable System or a Standard Game will be disregarded in descending numerical sequence until such time as the number of Forecast(s) required for the next highest numbered fully applicable System.

5.9 Once delivered or posted as provided in Rule 5.1 no Off-line Entry form may be altered or withdrawn except with the consent of the Company.

5.10 Subject to Rule 5.3 remittances accompanying Entry forms submitted by post may be paid by postal notes, money orders or cheques (up to \$43.00) payable to "Soccerpools", crossed and marked "Not Negotiable".

6. Delays etc.

6.1 Delays howsoever caused shall be the responsibility of the Subscriber and the Company shall not be liable nor bear responsibility for the same or be in any way liable or responsible for any loss, damage or expense of whatever description nature or kind arising out of, resulting from or caused or contributed to by delays.

6.2 The Company shall not be liable for any loss, damage or expense arising out of the acts or omissions of its servants or agents or third parties (including Authorised Persons) or arising out of fire, storm, tempest, flood, riot, civil commotion or strikes or arising whether directly or indirectly out of lost or stolen Entry forms.

6.3 The Subscriber shall accept all risks which may occur in the ordinary course of post and the Company or Authorised Persons shall be under no obligation to send remittances or documents by registered post.

6.4 The Subscriber shall have and make no claim or demand on or against the Company by reason of or arising out of delay.

7. Prize Fund.

7.1 An amount equal to not more than 2% of Subscriptions received in respect of any Pool may be retained in the Prize Fund and that amount together with the proceeds of any investment accruing from the Prize Fund will be allocated to and used only for:—

- (a) the payment of Prizes in accordance with Rule 8.8 (b) in respect of any Entries not included in the computation of Prizes payable in respect of any previous Pool,
- (b) the payment of higher or additional Prizes in accordance with Rule 9.1,
- (c) the payment of any amounts by which Prizes are increased in accordance with Rules 8.3 and 8.5, and
- (d) the reimbursement to the Company for any amount by which it has subsidised the Prize Fund or Prizes paid in respect of any Pool conducted in accordance with these Rules or any previous Rules issued by the Company and approved by the Minister.

7.2 From the balance remaining in the Prize Fund after deducting the amount provided for in Rule 7.1 such amount may be deducted as is required for payment of Prizes for the purpose of Rule 9.1.

7.3 After deducting the amounts provided for in Rule 7.1 and 7.2 the final balance remaining will be allocated to and used for the payment of Prizes in the particular Pool in accordance with Rule 8.

8. Prizes in the Pool.

8.1 The final balance remaining in the Prize Fund in accordance with Rule 7.3 will be allocated to and used for the payment of prizes in a particular Pool as follows:—

- (a) an amount equal to 65% thereof will be divided by the number of Entries with the Six Winning Match Numbers Forecast in a Game Panel and the resulting amount will be payable as the First Dividend to Subscribers submitting such Entries,
- (b) an amount equal to 2% thereof will be divided by the number of Entries with five but not more than five of the Six Winning Match Numbers Forecast plus the Supplementary Match Number Forecast in a Game Panel and the resulting amount will be payable as the Second Dividend to Subscribers submitting such Entries.
- (c) an amount equal to 6% thereof will be divided by the number of Entries with five but not more than five of the Six Winning Match Numbers Forecast in a Game Panel and the resulting amount will be payable as the Third Dividend to Subscribers submitting such Entries,
- (d) an amount equal to 15% thereof will be divided by the number of Entries with four but not more than four of the Six Winning Match Numbers Forecast in a Game Panel and the resulting amount will be payable as the Fourth Dividend to Subscribers submitting such Entries, and
- (e) an amount equal to 12% thereof will be divided by the number of Entries with three but not more than three of the Six Winning Match Numbers Forecast plus the Supplementary Match Number Forecast in a Game Panel and the resulting amount will be payable as the Fifth Dividend to Subscribers submitting such Entries.

8.2 (a) If in a Pool there is no Entry eligible for the First Dividend in accordance with Rule 8.1 (a) an amount equal to the Prize money allocated to such dividend shall be retained in the Prize Fund until the next Pool in which an Entry is eligible for a First Dividend and the aggregate amount so retained in the Prize Fund shall be added to the amount allocated for First Dividend(s) in such next Pool and such total amount shall be divided by the number of Entries entitled to a First Dividend in such next Pool and the resulting amount will be payable as the First Dividend in such next Pool.

(b) If in a Pool there is no Entry eligible for any one or more Dividends other than the First Dividend in accordance with Rule 8.1 (b), (c), (d) and (e) the Prize money allocated to any such Dividend shall be added to the Prize money allocated to the next lower ranked Dividend level payable which aggregate amount will be divided by the number of Entries entitled to such lower ranked Dividend and the resulting amount will be payable as that Dividend to Subscribers submitting such Entries.

8.3 To facilitate payment, the Company may at its discretion add to or deduct from any Prize an amount not exceeding 2.5 cents.

8.4 If any Dividend payable pursuant to Rule 8.1 is less than any lower ranked Dividend the amounts allocated to such Dividend level and the amounts allocated to all lower ranked Dividend levels will be aggregated and the resulting amount will be divided by the aggregate number of Entries entitled to all such Dividends and the resulting amount will be payable to Subscribers submitting all such Entries.

8.5 If any Dividend computed in accordance with Rule 8.1 (and after any application of Rule 8.4) is less than \$1.00 then the Dividend which would otherwise be payable shall be increased so that the amount payable is \$1.00.

8.6 If for any reason all of the Prizes in the Pool are cancelled or the Pool is cancelled then all Entries received by the Company in accordance with these Rules in respect of that Pool shall be deemed to be Entries in the next Pool.

8.7 Where the List of Matches is in respect of the Australian Season Pool and results (not being Void Matches) are declared in less than 38 of the Matches in the List of Matches then the Pool shall be cancelled.

8.8 (a) At any time before the payment of Prizes the Company may correct any error made in the number of Entries entitled thereto or the amount thereof.

(b) If any Entries which would otherwise have been entitled to payment of Prizes are discovered after the payment of Prizes the Company may at its discretion pay to the Subscribers submitting such Entries the same Prizes as were payable in respect of Entries winning such Prizes or such smaller Prizes as would have been paid under this Rule if such Entries had been taken into account when declaring Prizes.

9. Higher or Additional Prizes.

9.1 The Company may from time to time offer Prizes higher or additional to the Prizes as set out in Rule 8.1 as approved by the Minister from time to time.

10. Announcement of Prizes, Claims.

10.1 The Company will make available to the media for publication as soon as practicable after known to the Company:—

(a) the Winning Match Numbers and the Supplementary Match Number for each Pool, and

(b) the amount of the Prizes referred to in Rule 8.

10.2 If any claim is made otherwise than in accordance with Rules 11.2, 11.4 and 11.5 in the case of Off-line Entries or Rules 12.2, 12.3 and 12.4 in the case of On-line Entries or is not received within the time specified it will not be entertained unless the Company in its absolute discretion decides otherwise.

10.3 Unless otherwise specified in the condition or terms attaching to higher or additional Prizes as provided in Rule 9, Rules 11 and 12 only refer to Prizes payable in accordance with Rule 8 hereof.

11. Claims for Prizes in the Pool-Off-line Entries.

In the case of Off-line Entries:----

11.1 On the same day as Prizes are published as referred to in Rule 10.2 Subscribers who have submitted Entries entitled to receive a Prize of more than \$25 000.00 will be informed.

11.2 Subscribers who claim to be entitled to have won a Prize in excess of \$25 000.00 and who have not been so informed within six days after the Competition date must claim immediately by telegram addressed to "Soccerpools" at the telegraphic address printed on the Entry form and the subject of the claim and such telegram must contain the like particulars as are set out in Rule 11.5 and be received by the Company not later than twelve days after the Competition date.

11.3 Prizes in excess of \$25 000.00 will be paid on the fourteenth day after the Competition date.

11.4 All other Prizes will be sent by ordinary post within six days after the Competition date. Subscribers must wait until fourteen days after the Competition date and, if payment is not received by then, Subscribers must claim by letter addressed to "Soccerpools" at the postal address printed on the Entry form the subject of the claim and such letter must contain the like particulars as are set out in Rule 11.5 and must be received by the Company within twenty-one days after the Competition date.

11.5 All claims must state:----

- (a) the name and address of the Subscriber on the Entry form,
- (b) whether submitted by post or through an Authorised Person and, if so which,
- (c) the reference number of the Entry form, and
- (d) the Match Numbers selected.

11.6 Only the microfilm of the Entry form in possession of the Company and the Minister will be considered in determining any claim.

12. Claims for Prizes in the Pool-On-line Entries.

In the case of On-line Entries:-

 $12.1\ {\rm Prizes}$ will be published in the press as soon as practicable after the Competition date.

12.2 Payment of First or Second Dividend Prizes shall be paid by cheque personally or by ordinary post following receipt by the Company of a valid claim form together with the Receipted Ticket as referred to in Clause 12.3.

12.3 Claim forms shall be provided at the offices of the Company and at the premises of Authorised Persons, and a claimant shall properly complete the same and forward it to the Company at its office as shown on the claim form together with the relevant Receipted Ticket.

12.4 Payment by the Company to the person as indicated in the claim form shall be a good and complete discharge to the Company in respect of any Prize for the relevant Receipted Ticket notwithstanding any notice which the Company may have of the right, title, interest or claim of any other person or persons to any such Prize.

12.5 Unless a First or Second Dividend Prize is payable on the same Receipted Ticket, Third, Fourth and Fifth Dividend Prizes may be collected from any Authorised Person which issues Receipted Tickets at any time after the publication of the Prizes by the Company subsequent to the Competition date upon surrender of the Subscriber's Receipted Ticket and prizes not so collected within ten (10) weeks after the Competition date will be paid thereafter only at or from the offices of the Company.

12.6 Only the details recorded by the Computer on the magnetic storage in the possession of the Company and the Minister will be considered in determining any claim.

13. Disqualification.

13.1 Notwithstanding that an Off-line Entry form may have been microfilmed, or an On-line Entry may have been recorded on the magnetic storage of the Computer, such Entry form or Entry will be disqualified and no claim will be entertained in respect of it if in fact or in the opinion of the Company:

- (a) subject to Rule 5.8 it is not accompanied by the relevant Entry Fee, or if the form of remittance accompanying it is not acceptable,
- (b) it is sent in by a Subscriber who has defaulted in payment of any previous Entry Fee owing to the Company,
- (c) it is not received by the Company as provided in the Rules,
- (d) the genuineness of any Forecast or Forecast instructions thereon is doubtful,
- (e) in the case of Off-line Entries it does not contain the name of the Subscriber, (f) it is incomplete, incorrectly completed, ambiguous or illegible or the Forecasts
- in the case of an Off-line Entry are marked in other than black or blue ink or from whatever cause any Forecasts therein are torn off or damaged,
- (g) it is an alleged Entry which from whatever cause is missing and cannot be traced after search, or is not received by or transmitted to the Company, or
- (h) there is any other breach of the Rules in relation to it which justifies disqualification.

13.2 The receipt of an Entry Fee or an envelope will not be accepted as proof that the Company received an Entry form and proof of posting is not proof and will not be accepted as proof of delivery.

13.3 No responsibility is or will be undertakn by the Company to notify Subscribers that their Entries, for whatever reason are disqualified or do not qualify for entry in the Pool, and no claim will be entertained in respect of such Entries except only as provided in Rule 13.4.

13.4 Where an Entry is recognised by the Company to be disqualified any Subscription received in respect thereof will be refunded to the Subscriber. In any event no claim for a refund will be entertained in respect of an Entry submitted more than 8 weeks before the date of the claim.

14. Rescission of Previous Rules and Transitional Provisions.

14.1 The Soccer Football Pool Rules (in this rule referred to as "the former Rules") made by the Company and in force immediately prior to the date upon which these Rules take effect are rescinded.

14.2 Except as provided to the contrary in these Rules, these Rules do not apply to or in respect of a Pool conducted in relation to matches played before the date upon which these Rules take effect and the former Rules shall continue to apply to and in respect of any such Pools as if the former Rules had not been rescinded.

14.3 Entries (including Multi-Week Entries) received by the Company pursuant to the former Rules and which relate to a Pool or Pools to be conducted by the Company on or after the date these Rules take effect shall be deemed to be submitted as Entries in such Pool(s) pursuant to these Rules and notwithstanding that the Subscriber may have selected Forecast(s) from no more than 36 numbers in each Game Panel.

14.4 Any amounts retained in the Prize Fund pursuant to Rule 8.2 (a) of the former Rules following the last Pool conducted prior to these Rules taking effect shall be dealt with as if such amounts had been retained pursuant to Rule 8.2 (a) of these Rules.

14.5 In respect of a Multi-Week Entry submitted pursuant to the former Rules and which relates to a Pool or Pools to be conducted by the Company on or after the date these Rules take effect, the Company, upon receiving from the Subscriber a request in writing that the balance of any Subscriptions in respect of such Entry held for the credit of the Subscriber be refunded to the Subscriber or that such balance be held by the Company for the credit of the Subscriber against the receipt by the Company of any Entry or Entries to be submitted by the Subscribed in accordance with these Rules, shall accede to such request, provided that until or unless such request is actually received by the Company such Entry shall be dealt with as provided in Rule 14.3.

14.6 For the purpose of this Rule 14 and except as expressly provided in Rules 14.3 and 14.5 the Company shall not be liable for any claim, loss, damage or expense nor for any non-receipt by any Subscriber of any notification or refund if forwarded by the Company by ordinary pre-paid post to the Subscriber at the address specified on the Entry form.

Definitions.

In these Rules unless inconsistent with the context thereof:

- "Australian Season Pool" means the Pool conducted by the Company based upon the list of matches supplied to it from time to time by the Australian Soccer Federation and published as the List of Matches by the Company.
- "Australian Soccer Federation" means the Australian Soccer Federation of 36 Clarence Street, Sydney its successors and assigns or if such Federation ceases to exist the association corporate or unincorporate which fulfils the same or similar objects or functions.
- "Authorised Person" means a person whether he be described in legislation or elsewhere as "Representative", "Authorised Representative", "Approved Representative", "Accredited Representative", "Agent" or "Client's Agent" or by any other word or phrase who is approved or appointed by the Company and who may lawfully distribute and receive Entry forms or Entries and Subscriptions for the purpose of transmitting them to the Company.
- "Away Team" means the team named as printed on the right hand column of the List of Matches and "Away Win" or "Win for Away Team" shall mean a result where the team so printed has or is deemed to have scored more goals in the match than the team printed to the left of it.
- "Commission" means the amount(s) approved by the Minister and charged by an Authorised Person for receiving, handling and transmitting Entries.
- "Company" means Australian Soccer Pool Pty. Limited.
- "Competition date" means the date or dates fixed for the playing of the matches the subject of the Pool.
- "Computer" means the computer used by the Company in recording On-line Entries.
- "Corresponding United Kingdom Pool" means the 8 match Treble Chance Pool conducted by Vernons Pools, Vermail House, Ormskirk Road, Aintree, Merseyside, in the United Kingdom on the same matches as are the subject of the Pool.
- "Dividend" means a Prize payable in accordance with the provisions of Rule 8 hereof.

"Entry" means (except as is herein otherwise expressly provided):-----

- (a) In the case of an Off-line Entry a series of Forecasts submitted on an Entry form in accordance with the Standard Game or any one of the Systems indicated thereon or;
- (b) in the case of an On-line Entry a series of Forecasts on the Receipted Ticket in accordance with the Standard Game or any one of the Systems indicated thereon.
- "Entry Fee" means the sum of the Commission and the Subscription.
- "Entry form" means any Entry form distributed by the Company from time to time in accordance with these Rules and includes a renewed Multi-Week Entry form.
- "Forecast" means in the case of an Off-line Entry a numbered square in a Game Panel on an Entry form which has been marked with the letter "X" or in the case of an On-line Entry the numbers printed (or numbers indicated by instructions printed) on the Receipted Ticket for each alphabetically lettered Game Panel.

- "Game Panel" means any one of the alphabetically lettered boxes or spaces set out on an Entry form and containing therein thirty-eight (38) numbered squares and in the case of an On-line Entry includes any one of the alphabetically lettered columns printed on the Receipted Ticket.
- "Home Team" means the team named as printed on the lefthand column of the List of Matches and "Home Win" or "Win for Home Team" shall mean a result where the team so printed has or is deemed to have scored more goals in the match than the team printed to the right of it.
- "List of Matches" means the list of matches published from time to time by the Company either
 - (a) in respect of the Corresponding United Kingdom Pool which shall contain a list of 55 Matches or such other number of Matches exceeding 38 as shall be approved by the Minister, or
 - (b) when the corresponding United Kingdom Pool is not conducted on matches played in the United Kingdom, in respect of the Australian Season Pool which shall contain a list of 50 Matches or such other number of Matches exceeding 38 as shall be approved by the Minister, (as the case may be).
- "Minister" means the Minister administering the legislation under which the Pool is conducted.
- "Off-line Entry" means any Entry other than an On-line Entry.
- "On-line Entry" means an Entry for which a Receipted Ticket is issued.
- "Pool" means a soccer pool conducted by the Company.
- "Prize" means any sum computed and payable to a Subscriber in accordance with Rules 8 and 9 hereof and includes a Dividend.
- "Prize Fund" means the amounts received from Subscriptions which are to be allocated and used as provided by Rule 7 pursuant to or in accordance with legislative requirements.
- "Receipt or received by the Company" means actual receipt by the Company and receipt by an Authorised Person does not constitute receipt by the Company.
- "Receipted Ticket" means the receipted ticket printed and issued by a computer terminal at the premises of an Authorised Person in respect of an Entry recording:-
 - (i) the Competition date or number;
 - (ii) the identifying number of the relevant computer terminal;
 - (iii) the registration number of the Entry and cost thereof;
 - (iv) the Forecasts for each Game Panel.
- "Results" means where the Corresponding United Kingdom Pool applies the results declared in that Pool or where the Australian Season Pool applies the results declared by the Company based upon the information supplied to it by the Australian Soccer Federation.
- "Rules" means these Rules and any amendment, modification variation or abrogation thereof for the time being in force.
- "Standard Game" means an Entry in a Game Panel wherein six (6) Forecasts are made by a Subscriber.
- "Subscriber" means in the case of an Off-line Entry the person who is so designated on the Entry form or in the case of an On-line Entry the person surrendering to an Authorised Person or the Company the Receipted Ticket for such Entry.
- "Subscription" means the amount payable by the Subscriber in accordance with the following table:

 - For each size match selection—50 cents—(Standard Game) For each seven match selection—\$3.50—(System 7) For each eight match selection—\$14.00—(System 8) For each nine match selection—\$42,00—(System 9)
 - For each ten match selection-\$105.00-(System 10)
- "System" or "System Game" means an Entry in a Game Panel entered on a System/Multi-Week Entry which allows for every possible combination of six Forecasts from a greater number of Forecasts made by a Subscriber and includes:
 - System 7 wherein 7 Forecasts are made in a Game Panel

 - System 8 wherein 8 Forecasts are made in a Game Panel. System 9 wherein 9 Forecasts are made in a Game Panel. System 10 wherein 10 Forecasts are made in a Game Panel.
- "System/Multi-Week Entry form" means an Entry form on which can be entered a System Game or Standard Game with the option to enter the same Forecasts for 5, 10, 15, 20 or 52 consecutive weeks.
- "Void Match" means where the Corresponding United Kingdom Pool applies a Match so declared in that Pool or where the Australian Season Pool applies a Match in the List of Matches so declared by the Company based upon the information supplied to it by the Australian Soccer Federation.
- "These Rules take effect for Entries Submitted for Competition Dates on and after 20 April 1985."

PART I—Preliminary.

1.1 Citation: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Boulder Town Planning Scheme No. 2—Somerville Guided Development Scheme, hereinafter called "the Scheme", and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 Responsible Authority: The Authority responsible for implementing the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Boulder, hereinafter called "the Council".

1.3 Scheme Area: The Scheme Area applies to all that land within the inner edge of a broken black border shown on the Land Use Map and the Scheme Map.

1.4 Contents of Scheme: The Scheme comprises:

(a) This Scheme Text.

- (b) The Scheme Map.
- (c) The Land Use Map.

1.5 Scheme Objectives: The general objectives of the Scheme are:

(a) to facilitate and encourage the progressive subdivision and development of the land within the Scheme Area for residential, home occupation and other purposes permitted under the zoning of the land within the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Joint Town Planning Scheme.

- (b) To co-ordinate and control development in the Scheme Area.
- (c) To plan and make provision of land for, and the construction of, suitable roads and the improvement of existing roads within the Scheme Area.
- (d) To make provision for the reticulation of water throughout the Scheme Area.
- (e) To provide for the equitable distribution of Scheme Costs amongst owners of land within the Scheme Area.

1.6 Relationship to the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Joint Town Planning Scheme: The Scheme is complementary to and is not a substitute for the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Joint Town Planning Scheme. The provisions of the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Joint Town Planning Scheme, as amended, continue to have effect. In so far as an Outline Development Plan is required for the development of land within the Residential Development Zone, the subdivision shown on the Scheme Map shall be regarded as an Outline Development Plan.

1.7 Interpretation: In this Scheme unless the context otherwise requires, words and expressions have the respective meanings given to them in Appendix D of the Town Planning Regulations 1967 unless otherwise provided herein.

- "Act" means the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended).
- "Clause" means a clause of the Scheme.
- ""Council" means the Council of the Shire of Boulder.
- "Owner" means an owner of land within the Scheme Area.
- "Scheme" means this Town Planning Scheme.
- "Scheme Area" means the area defined in Clause 1.2.

"Sub-clause" means a sub-clause of the clause in which the term is used.

PART II-SUBDIVISION AND DEVELOPMENT.

2.1 Scheme Map: The Scheme Map forms a basis for the development of the Scheme Area showing the proposed location of roads, and indicates the proposed subdivision design for the Scheme Area.

2.2 Subdivision: As and when an owner subdivides his land such subdivision shall generally be in accordance with the overall plan of subdivision for the Scheme Area shown on the Scheme Map.

2.3 Departures from Design: After considering the recommendation of the Council the Board may permit departures from the subdivision design shown on the Scheme Map if it considers the proposed subdivisional design to be of a similar standard to that shown on the Scheme Map but no departure from the subdivisional design shall be permitted if it would impede the subdivision of the Scheme Area as a whole.

2.4 Developer to Submit Plans: An owner who desires to develop his land either alone or in conjunction with other owners shall submit a plan of the proposed development to the Council and if the proposals involve subdivision he shall submit an application for approval to subdivide to the Town Planning Board in accordance with the Act and Regulations made pursuant to the Act.

PART III—ROADS, PEDESTRIAN ACCESSWAYS AND PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY.

3.1 Road Frontage: Each owner is responsible for providing new lots created from the subdivision of his land with frontage to a constructed road connected to the constructed road system of the locality. Such roads are to be constructed and drained to the satisfaction of the Council.

3.2 Resumption and Construction: The Council may resume or otherwise acquire the whole of or any portion or portions of the land required for new roads or pedestrian accessways and may construct and drain any existing or new roads or pedestrian accessways within the Scheme Area. If the Council shall do so prior to the subdivision of the land abutting such road or pedestrian accessway, the costs of the construction and drainage of the said road or pedestrian accessway and all compensation and other costs consequent upon the acquisition of the land shall be paid to the Council by the respective owners of land in accordance with the foregoing provisions as and when they subdivide their land.

3.3 Repayment by Owners who Subdivide after Council Resumes and/or Construct: If an owner shall subdivide his land and if he or his predecessor in title shall have claimed or shall have been paid compensation by reason of the resumption or acquisition by the Council of the land for a new road or pedestrian accessway within the Scheme Area and/or shall have benefitted from the construction and drainage of any existing and/or new road or pedestrian accessway carried out by the Council under this Scheme, he shall before the approval from his survey plan of subdivision release the Council the compensation paid by it to him or his predecessor in title as the case may be, and/or repay to the Council the cost of the said construction and drainage and all interest costs and appropriate fees as identified in Clause 6.1.

3.5 Sharing of Costs between Owners: Where an owner has paid or contributed to the payment for any road works or pedestrian accessway necessary to enable the Scheme to be implemented but the cost of which is not a Scheme Cost such costs shall be apportioned among the owners who take advantage of the works to facilitate or enable the approval of their respective applications for subdivision to be granted. The proportion payable by each such owner shall be the same as the frontage of his land to the road or pedestrian accessway bears to the total frontage provided to land owned by owners who can take advantage of the works to facilitate or enable the approval of their respective applications for subdivision to be granted. The amount payable by each owner shall be paid to the Council when that owner pays his proportion of the Scheme Costs.

3.5 Closure of Public Roads and Rights of Way: The lands shown as "closed roads" or "closed rights of way" on the Scheme Map shall be closed either by resumption under the Public Works Act or as provided for under Section 288A of the Local Government Act

PART IV-WATER SUPPLY AND DRAINAGE.

4.1 Water Supply and Drainage Works: Water supply works as are in the opinion of the Council necessary for the proper servicing of the Scheme Area and the connection of the land therein to existing drains and to water mains shall at the appropriate times be carried out by the owners of the land served by such works or by the Council if it elects to, in any event at the cost of the owners served by the works.

4.2 Resumption or Other Acquisition of Land and/ or Easements: The Council may resume or otherwise acquire such land and/or easements as it considers necessary for drainage or water supply services and may set aside land for drainage sumps and compensating basins and other works.

4.3 Carrying Out by Council: If the Council in accordance with the last two preceding clauses, carries out the local drainage works or water supply works or resumes or otherwise acquires land and/or easements necessary for drainage or water supply services, each owner of land served by those works or benefitting from those services shall pay his proportion of the costs or estimated costs of the works and all compensation, interest and other costs consequent upon acquisition of land and/or easements and/or works relating to water supply and drainage works.

4.4 Sharing of Costs between Owners: Where an owner has paid or contributed to the payment for any water supply and drainage works necessary to enable the Scheme to be implemented but the cost of which is not a Scheme Cost such costs shall be apportioned among the owners who take advantage of the works to facilitate or enable the approval of their respective applications for subdivision to be granted. The proportion payable by each such owner shall be the same as the number of lots which have access to that service bears to the total number of lots shown on land owned by owners who can take advantage of the works to facilitate or enable the approval of their respective applications for subdivision to be granted. The amount payable by each owner shall be paid to the Council when that owner pays his proportion of the Scheme Costs.

PART V-RESERVES.

5.1 Existing Reserves: The Scheme Area contains two existing reserves under the Land Act 1933, as amended.

- (a) Reserve 8455 for the purposes of the Church of England (Church Site).
- (b) Portion of Reserve 8682 for the purposes of water supply (Goldfields Water Scheme).

5.2 Alienation and Re-use of Reserves: The Crown may alienate or the Council may initiate the alienation of all or part of the land held within Reserves 8455 and 8682 and/or its re-use in the manner and for the purposes shown on the Scheme Map.

PART VI-FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

6.1 Scheme Costs: The costs or estimated costs of the following items are hereinafter referred to as Scheme Costs.

- (a) all compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation and any payment for damage or injurious affection arising out of the Scheme;
- (b) all compensation which the Council shall pay or become liable to pay by reason of any building or other improvement being affected by the proposals contained in the Scheme Map or the use and enjoyment of any land, building or improvement being adversely affected by the Scheme;
- (c) the administration costs of the Scheme including an amount to reimburse the Council for such overhead and supervision costs as may be incurred in the implementation of the Scheme. The term "administration costs" shall include all legal costs, planning costs, payments to consultants, engineers and other professional consultants, management costs and valuation costs in each case where incurred before or after the coming into effect of the Scheme and reinbursement to the Council for the recorded time spent by an officer, employee or agent of the Shire of Boulder in so far as that time was spent in connection with the Scheme and including time spent prior to the coming into operation of the Scheme in addition to administration or supervision fees payable in accordance with the Local Government Act 1960, as amended;
- (d) the costs of acquisition of any land and/or easement within the Scheme Area for the benefit of the Scheme in the event of such land and/or easements being acquired other than by resumption;
- (e) the costs of upgrading drainage works, outside the Scheme Area necessary for the appropriate drainage of the Scheme Area;
- (f) the costs to Council of any road construction or service installation within the Scheme Area;
- (g) any interest costs of providing finance for the Scheme including bank charges, accountancy and audit fees.

6.2 Payment of Scheme Costs.

6.2.1 Each owner shall pay to the Council a proportion of Scheme Sosts. Unless otherwise provided in this Scheme the appropriate proportion of the Scheme Costs payable by each owner shall be an amount which bears the same proportion to the Scheme Costs as the area of the owner's land within the Scheme Area which may be subdivided bears to the whole of the land within the Scheme Area which may be subdivided (excluding land shown on the Scheme Map as being reserved for water supply or park and recreation purposes and land which cannot be further subdivided).

6.2.2 Each owner when subdividing his land shall pay or make satisfactory arrangements with the Council to pay his proportion of Scheme Costs referred to in Clause 6.1 before Council gives a clearance to the Board prior to its endorsement of final approval of subdivision.

6.3 Power and Authorities of Council:

6.3.1 In carrying out the provisions of this Scheme the Council shall have the following powers and authorities.

- (a) to enter and inspect any land within the Scheme Area;
- (b) to enter into agreements with the owners or occupiers of any land within the Scheme Area;
- (c) to enter into agreements with purchasers or prospective purchasers or prospective occupiers of land within the Scheme Area;
- (d) to enter into agreements with any person or to make arrangements with any Government instrumentality for the purpose of carrying out any of the Scheme works or otherwise for the purpose of the Scheme;
- (e) to extend the time within which payments have to be made to the Council and agree to the securing of such payments;
- (f) to resume any land within the Scheme Area for public purposes, or in order to make it available for any of the purposes for which the Council by the provisions of this Scheme is empowered to acquire land in cases where the owner thereof will not agree to make the land available for that purpose in accordance with the provisions of this Scheme;
- (g) to dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled whether under sub-clause (c) or (f) hereof or otherwise upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit and without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell the lots singularly or in groups and on conditions if it sees fit to improve them;

 $6.3.2\,$ The Council may at any time exercise the powers conferred by Section 13 of the Act.

6.4 Claims for Compensation.

6.4.1 Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of the Scheme shall be made within six (6) calendar months of the date of gazettal of final approval to the Scheme.

6.4.2 When an owner subdivides his land and if he or his predecessors in title have claimed or have been paid compensation by reason of the resumption of the Council pursuant to this Scheme of a former part of that land for a new road he shall before the final approval by the Board to his plan of subdivision release the Council from the compensation paid by it to him or his predecessors in title as the case may be.

6.5 Valuations:

6.5.1 If it is necessary for the purpose of this Scheme to ascertain the value of any land, such value shall be determined by a valuer licensed under the Land Valuer's Licence Act 1978, as amended, appointed by Council. If an owner shall object to the value so determined, he may give notice of such objection to the Council within twenty-eight (28) days after having been informed of the said value or the revised value. If the valuer does not agree to change the value to a figure acceptable to the owner, the value shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained.

6.5.2 If a valuation made by the valuer shall be changed as a result of an objection, the valuer may reconsider the values placed on other lands and make such revaluations as he considers just and equitable.

6.6 Tenders: Before undertaking any works associated with the Scheme the Council shall first make a public call for tenders and qualified persons may tender for the work. Council may also tender for the work itself and subject to normal considerations associated with the acceptance of a tender and the letting of a contract including the financial and technical ability of a tenderer, award a contract accordingly.

6.7 Estimates of Costs: The Council may from time to time estimate the appropriate proportion of the costs payable by any owner pursuant to any provision in the Scheme, prior to the determination of the final costs. The costs required by the Council to be contributed by any owner pursuant to any provision of the Scheme may be the estimated costs provided that upon the determination of the final costs the Council shall make appropriate adjustments to recover from owners any amount by which the estimate falls short of or to repay any amount by which the estimate exceeds the final costs as determined. An estimate may be revised from time to time.

6.8 Moneys received by Council: All moneys received by the Council pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme shall, except in so far as such moneys are required to pay the costs of the Scheme and the works to be carried out be returned to the owner or the successors in title of the owner in the same proportion as supplied to the allocation of Scheme Costs.

6.9 Arbitration: Any dispute or difference between the owners or between an owner or owners and the Council as to their respective rights under the Scheme, or as to the value of any land, or in respect of any matter pursuant to this Scheme, may be determined by Arbitration in the manner provided by the Arbitration Act 1895, or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force.

6.10 Scheme Management: The Council may appoint a Scheme Manager for the purpose of advancing the progress and completion of the Scheme. In such case functions and duties assigned to the Council by various provisions of the Scheme may be carried out by the Scheme Manager for the term of Scheme operations or for a nominated lesser period, provided that the Council may at any time terminate the appointment.

6.11 Notice: Twenty-eight (28) days written notice is hereby prescribed as the notice to be given pursuant to Section 10 of the Act. Any expenses incurred by the Council under the said Section may be recovered from the person in default as a simple contract debt in such Court of Civil Jurisdiction as is competent to deal with the amount of the claim.

6.12 Appeals: Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Council in respect of the exercise of a discretionary power under the Scheme may appeal in accordance with Part V of the Act and the Rules and Regulations pursuant to the Act.
