However, because of the rejection by Federal Members and Senators of the suggested increase, the Tribunal departed from this percentage relativity and increased State Members above the 90 per cent rate.

The 2.6 per cent National Wage Increase will maintain the new relativity but, as indicated in the 2 October 1984 Determination, the Tribunal will examine the possibility of returning to the 90 per cent of the Federal Members rate when circumstances permit.

the right to alter the Access Policy Plan on the merits of a particular application subject to the approval of the Metropoli-tan Region Planning Authority in respect of development fronting Albany Highway and the other Regional Roads.

The Council may permit the provision of temporary crossovers until sufficient redevelopment and consolidation of access is possible subject to the applicant entering into an agreement requiring the closure of the temporary crossover at such time as alternative access is available.

- All proposed service roads and laneways shown on the Access Policy Plan shall be contained within an 8 metre wide Right of Way to be granted free of cost and to be constructed to Council's satisfaction as a condition of development or subdivision.
- Council shall require (where it deems necessary) the applicant and/or land-owner to register or enter into an agreement with the adjoining landowners (as the case may be) a grant of easement to enable reciprocal rights of carriageway over the subject lots prior to development being permitted to commence.
- (j) In considering an application for development, use of land or subdivision the Council may require the applicant to transfer the land required for road widening purposes to the Crown.
- Council reserves the right to control the appearance of buildings in order to protect the overall amenity of the area.
- No flashing signs, tower or roof-mounted signs will be permitted. Only signs relating to goods and services available on the premises will be permitted constructed on any lot. to
- (m) All other relevant provisions contained in the Scheme.
- Where development is proposed complying fully with the principles of controlling access to Albany Highway, the (n) Where ceding of road widening to the Crown on a free of cost basis, the provision of crosseasements for access, the concept of centralised carparking and any other mat-ter considered by Council to be beneficial to the Scheme Area which is over and above that normally required of an applicant, the Council may negotiate as an incentive for compliance with these specified requirements, a reduction in setbacks from the street frontage, carparking and landscaping requirements and other development criteria at Council's discretion up to a limit of 25 per cent of that specified herein for the proposed use. Such dispensation shall not, however, apply to the lot size and frontage provisions or where any additional dispensation has already been agreed to by Council.
- (4) Development Policies Applicable to Centre Development Zone.

The Centre Development Zone described in this clause applies to Policy Areas 2 and 3, delineated on the following Plan. Because of the current multiplicity of ownerships in the area it is not possible or necessary to accurately predetermine the allocation of specific uses to particular lots. However, it is Council's intention to use the following policies as a guideline for assessing and approving development within the Centre Development Zone. In order to give a clearer presentation of these policies, Policy Areas 2 and 3 have been further subdivided into precincts as detailed in the plan. It is proposed that the staging of development in Policy Area 2 will be on a demand basis governed by the availability of reticulated sewers.

(a) Policy Area 2.
(i) General Objectives.

To provide for the co-ordinated and planned devel-opment of the whole of Policy • To

Area No. 2 and reduce the possibility of isolated and unrelated designs and functions within the Area.

- To control and restrict the further expansion of retail uses within the Area.
- To control the staging of the development by requiring all development to be connected to reticulated sewers.

(ii) Policies.

• Uses in Policy Area 2 will be limited to those uses which are classified as non-retail commercial or commercial recreational pursuits. Retail uses will only be considered where the retail component is incidental to the predominant use or where Bulk Retail Sales are permitted as set out in the footnote to Zoning Table—Table No. 3.

When considering development applications Council shall have due regard to the physical effect of the proposed development on adjoining, existing or approved development and shall also satisfy itself that such proposed development shall not in any way cause any detrimental effect to the enjoyment and occupation of the existing or proposed adjacent development; providing that such control shall not be construed as to give Council the power to consider such matters as would affect only the Business prospects of nearby premises by reason of close proximity of competition from a like business, as such matter is not within the authority of the Council.

- Ensure the co-ordinated development between retail shopping (outside this area), office, recreational and civic and cultural uses within Policy Area 2.
- Require all proposed development to be connected to reticulated sewers.

(iii) Policy Precinct 2.1

More particularly this precinct is earmarked for Bulk Retail Sales although uses such as warehouses general and professional offices will be considered by Council. Important objectives are the achievement of a centralised and communal use of carparking facilities, joint access and no direct vehicular access from any property to Olga Road.

(iv) Policy Precinct 2.2

More particularly this precinct is earmarked for civic and commercial recreation pursuits although restaurant, reception centre, night clubs, cinemas, hospital, medical centre, churches and similar uses will be considered by Council. Important objectives are the restriction of individual lot access to Albany Highway, centralised and communal use of carparking areas and the provision of a well constructed, joint pedestrian/bicycle path linking Attfield Street and Albany Highway as detailed in the Concept Plan.

(v) Policy Precinct 2.3

This precinct more particularly is earmarked for general and professional office development although restaurants and other similar uses will be considered. A substantial portion of the precinct is owned by the Council and used for civic and cultural purposes. Important objectives are the limitations of access from Albany Highway and communal use of carpark areas.

(vi) Policy Precinct 2.4

Since a significant part of this precinct is currently zoned for retail purposes Council is prepared to consider a rounding off by permitting Bulk Retail Sales. Important objectives to be achieved include limiting access to Albany Highway and protecting residential development abutting the precinct.

(b) Policy Area 3.

- (i) General Objectives.
 - * To control and restrict the further expansion of retail uses within Policy Area 3.
 - * To upgrade the existing commercial development by encouraging redevelopment complying more particularly with the Service Industry provisions contained within the Scheme.
 - * To create a better visual aspect from Albany Highway by improving landscaping requirements and controlling advertisement signs.
 - * To control the location and development of various uses as generally set out in the Concept Plan.

(ii) Policies

Uses in Policy Area 3 will be limited to those which are listed in the Zoning Table No. 3. However, the provisions of the Service Industry Zone shall prevail in the case of any interpretational conflict between zones. Upgrading of existing shops will be considered on the merits of a particular application and the non-conforming use provisions will apply to any existing Shopping Development.

(iii) Policy Precinct 3.1

In view of the proposed road widenings to Albany Highway all of the existing development fronting Albany Highway north-west of Maddington Road will eventually have to be demolished. The redevelopment of these properties shall be limited to the uses permitted under a Service Industry Zone. Composite Residential/Service Industrial uses will be encouraged. Important objectives to achieve will be limiting access from Albany Highway, to set new development back on recognised alignments and to create satisfactory landscaping along the street frontages.

(iv) Policy Precinct 3.2

Those lots which are developed with shopping development will be subject to the non-conforming use provisions of the Scheme. Applications to use these premises for non-retail uses such as offices will be encouraged. Otherwise the Service Industry Zone provisions of the Scheme will apply. The

communal use of carparking areas, limited access to Albany Highway and satisfactory landscaping provisions are objectives which will be pursued by Council.

(v) Policy Precinct 3.3

This land is developed with residential flats and its nonconforming rights are hereby recognised enabling further residential flat development to be permitted on the site providing reticulated sewers are available. Further development of the site will be subject to the provision of satisfactory buffer planting between precincts 3.2 and 3.3. All access to the site will be limited to Dalziel Street.

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

GAS STANDARDS ACT 1972.

GAS STANDARDS AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1985.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation.

These regulations may be cited as the Gas Standards Amendment Regulations 1985.

Commencement. 2. These regulations shall come into operation on 30 June 1985.

Principal regulations. 3. In these regulations the Gas Standards Regulations 1983*, are referred to as the principal regulations.

Regulation 3 amended.

- 4. Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is amended in subregulation (1) by inserting, in their appropriate alphabetical positions, the following definitions—
 - " "authorized gas fitter" in relation to gas fitting work, means a person authorized under these regulations to engage in or carry out such gasfitting work;
 - "higher heating value" means the number of megajoules liberated when one cubic metre of gas is completely burnt in air under test conditions set down either—
 - (a) in ASTM D1826-64 (being American Standards for Testing of Materials); or
 - (b) in I.S.O. 6974 for the analysis of the natural gas using I.S.O. 6976 for the calculations from that analysis;
 - "I.S.O." means the International Standards Organization standard;
 - "Wobbe index" means the number obtained by using the following formula—

Wobbe index = Higher heating value

Relative density "...

Regulation 28 amended.

- 5. Regulation 28 of the principal regulations is amended—
 - (a) by repealing subregulation (1) and substituting the following subregulation—
 - " (1) A gas fitter who installs a Type A appliance in a consumer's gas installation shall attach to the appliance in a consipicuous position instructions as to the proper operation of the appliance and shall if a gas supply is available, check the appliance for correct operation. "; and

Standards.

 - (a) shall have a "Wobbe index" which is not more than 51.0 and not less than 46.5;
 - (b) shall be free by normal commercial standards from dust and other solid or liquid matters, waxes, gums and gum forming constituents, aromatic hydrocarbons and radioactive components which might cause injury to or interfere with the proper operation of all equipment through which it flows;

- (c) shall not have a total sulphur content exceeding 50 milligrams per cubic metre of the gas;
- (d) shall-
 - (i) have an odour that is distinctive, unpleasant and nonpersistent and which, when the gas is discharged, throughout its discharge indicates the presence of gas down to 1/5th the lower explosive limit;
 - (ii) be odorised to comply with this standard by the addition to the gas of an odoriser, the nature and rate of which shall be approved from time to time by the Commission; and
 - (iii) where odorant is added, be subject to periodic sampling to determine the effectiveness of odorising, and records kept of all such sampling.
- (2) Notwithstanding the requirements of paragraph (d) of subregulation (1) the Commission may, in a particular case, approve of gas not being odorised if the gas is delivered for further processing or use where the odorant would serve no useful purpose as a warning agent.
- (3) The higher heating value produced by combustion of the gas must be not less than 37.0 and not more than 41.0 megajoules per cubic metre of the gas. "

AGRICULTURE AND RELATED RESOURCES PROTECTION ACT 1976-1983.

Agriculture Protection Board, South Perth, 30 April 1985.
