(3) Within 30 days after the expiration of the time during which a permit to conduct any continuing lottery has effect, the holder of the permit shall furnish to the Commission a true and accurate account of the receipt and disposal of all property in the conduct of the lottery. ". |

(1) A person shall not conduct a continuing lottery in which there is sold any ticket that is so made that the layer concealing the symbols from which the holder of a ticket ascertains whether or not the presentation of the ticket will entitle him to receive any prize in the lottery is not continuously sealed on all sides against the portion of the ticket on which the symbols are printed.
(2) A person shall not conduct a continuing lottery in which the total value of the prizes that may be won is less than 60% of the total face value of the tickets in the lottery.
(3) Where tickets in a continuing lottery are sold or offered for sale by means of a vending machine the owner of the vending machine commits an offence unless—
(a) each such vending machine is identifiable by a serial number permanently stamped on the vending machine; and
(b) except where the vending machine is located on premises to which a club licence within the meaning of the Liquor Act 1970 relates, the cash tray of each such vending machine is capable of being locked independently of any other part of the vending machine.
(4) Where tickets in a continuing lottery are sold or offered for sale by means of a vending machine the person conducting the lottery commits an offence unless—
(a) there is clearly displayed on each such vending machine a notice to the effect that cash prizes cannot be won in the lottery; and |

(b) except where the vending machine is located on premises to which a club licence within the meaning of the Liquor Act 1970 relates—

(i) there is clearly displayed on each such vending machine a notice indicating for whose benefit the proceeds of the lottery are to be applied; and

(ii) there is printed on each ticket so sold or offered for sale either the name of the holder of the permit under which the lottery is conducted or the name of the premises at which the tickets are so sold or offered for sale. ”.

Health By-laws—Eating Houses.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act 1911 (as amended), a Local Authority may make by-laws and may amend, repeal or alter any by-laws so made; Now, therefore, the Council of the Municipality of the City of Gosnells, being a Local Health Authority, doth hereby repeal the previous by-laws published in the *Government Gazette* dated 28 September 1961 and submit for approval the following by-laws:—

PART I.

Interpretation.

1. In the construction of this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires:—

“Act” means the Health Act 1911; and any amendment thereof.

“Local Authority” means the Municipality of the City of Gosnells.

“Medical Officer” means the Medical Officer of the Local Authority and includes any person acting in that capacity.

“Health Surveyor” shall have the same meaning as it has under the Health Act.

“Eating House” shall have the same meaning as it has under section 160 of the Health Act and shall include for the purpose of registration Restaurants, Dining Rooms, Tea Rooms, Refreshment Rooms and Take-Away Food Premises.

“Licence” means a licence to conduct an eating house granted pursuant to the provisions of this by-law.

“Registered Premises” means any premises which are registered as an eating house under this by-law, and includes any yard or land appurtenant to such eating house.

The terms “food”, “owner”, “premises” and “proprietor” shall have the same meanings as they have under the Health Act.

“Town Clerk” means the Town Clerk or the Acting Town Clerk for the time being of the Municipality of the City of Gosnells.

PART II.

Licences and Registration.

2. These by-laws shall have effect from 1 July 1985.

3. No person shall occupy or use any premises as an eating house unless:—

(a) The premises are registered under this by-law by the Local Authority, and

(b) The proprietor of the said premises is the holder of a licence issued by the Local Authority authorising him to conduct on the premises the business of an eating house.

4. Before any premises are registered under this by-law, the proprietor thereof shall make application in the form prescribed in the First Schedule hereto and shall forward his application, together with a plan of the premises in respect of which such application is made, and the prescribed fee, to the Town Clerk, and if the application is approved, the Local Authority shall issue to the proprietor a Certificate of Registration in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto.

5. Before any licence to any proprietor to conduct an eating house is granted by the Local Authority under this by-law, the proprietor shall sign an application for the same in the form prescribed in Third Schedule hereto and shall forward same, together with the prescribed fee, to the Town Clerk, and if the application is approved, the Local Authority shall issue to the proprietor a licence in the form prescribed in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

6. Any person who makes a false statement in connection with any application under Clauses 4 or 5 hereof shall be guilty of an offence.

7. Every Certificate of Registration of premises registered as an eating house and every licence issued to a proprietor shall be signed by the Town Clerk and shall be duly entered in a book to be provided by the Local Authority for that purpose. Every proprietor of registered premises shall keep the Certificate of Registration and the licence on the registered premises and shall when requested so to do by the Health Surveyor, produce to him the Certificate of Registration and also the licence issued to the proprietor in respect of such premises.

8. Every Certificate of Registration and every licence shall be in force from the day of the date of the issue thereof until and inclusive of the 31st day of December then next ensuing, unless the same be cancelled in the meantime in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

9. Applications for the renewal of Certificate of Registration and licences shall be made annually during the month of December. Such applications shall be in the form prescribed in the Fifth and Sixth Schedules hereto, respectively, and shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

10. The fees to be paid to the Local Authority on the registration of premises, on the issuing of a licence and on the renewal of any registration or licence shall be as set out in the Seventh Schedule hereto.

11. So often as any person holding a licence issued pursuant to this by-law changes his place of abode, he shall within seven days next after such a change give notice thereof in writing to the Town Clerk, specifying in such notice his new place of abode and he shall at the same time produce such licence to the Town Clerk, who shall endorse thereon and sign a memorandum specifying the particulars of such change.

12. If the owner of any registered premises sells or transfers or agrees to sell or transfer the said premises to another person, he shall within 14 days from the date of such sale or transfer or agreement notify the Town Clerk thereof in writing on the form prescribed in the Eighth Schedule hereto.

PART III.

Management.

13. Any premises registered or required to be registered under the provisions of these by-laws shall in addition to the provisions hereof also comply with:—

- (i) The Food Hygiene Regulations (1973)
- (ii) The by-laws of the City of Gosnells

or any subsequent amendments thereto.

14. The Proprietor of any Eating House shall:—

- (a) Not permit kerosene, benzene, naphtha, alcohol, mineralised or methylated spirits or any volatile liquid (not being an article of food) to be stored in any kitchen.
- (b) Provide and properly maintain at all times suitable and effective means of keeping the premises free from dust, rats, mice, cockroaches, flies, spiders, bugs, ants, moths and all other vermin, and if in the opinion of a Health Surveyor effective means and methods of cleansing and eradication of vermin from the premises cannot be done effectively while the ordinary business of the establishment is carried on then the Local Authority may order the temporary closure of the premises to the public until such time as such cleansing and eradication of vermin has been carried out to the satisfaction of the Health Surveyor, and the proprietor shall comply with such order. The form of order to be served is set out in the Ninth Schedule hereto.
- (c) Keep all portions of the premises free from any unwholesome or offensive odour arising from the premises or the operations carried on thereon.
- (d) Provide and maintain an exhaust hood over every wood, gas, oil, or electric cooking appliance, stove or boiler; the hood shall be of such size and so placed as to arrest all steam, effluvia, odours and smoke from the process of cooking or boiling, excluded are micro wave ovens used for heating food.
- (e) Cleanse daily and at all times keep and maintain all water closets, urinals, lavatories, grease traps, and all other sanitary appliances on the premises in a clean and sanitary condition.
- (f) Provide and maintain a suitable changeroom for employees if all of one sex or suitable separate changerooms for each sex if required by the Health Surveyor.

15. Every person engaged in any eating house in the preparation of food shall wear a clean outer garment or overall of washable material the sleeves of which shall be comparatively short, and every such person shall immediately before beginning or recommencing the preparation of food and immediately after visiting a sanitary convenience wash their hands and every such person shall maintain their clothing and body clean. The proprietor of such premises shall provide and maintain at all times on such premises adequate and efficient means for maintaining personal cleanliness to the satisfaction of the Health Surveyor.

16. There shall be provided sanitary conveniences for the use of employees, and where required by the Local Authority there shall also be provided sanitary conveniences for these of customers and in either case when considered necessary by the local authority separate sanitary conveniences shall be provided for each sex.

17. There shall be provided a storeroom to the satisfaction of the Health Surveyor.

18. The proprietor shall not permit, suffer or cause any structural alterations to be made to the premises or any portion thereof without first having obtained permission in writing from the Local Authority.

Penalties.

19. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and, upon conviction, shall be liable to a penalty of \$100.00, and, where such breach is of a continuing nature to a daily penalty of \$4.00.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act 1911 (as amended) a Local Authority may make or adopt by-laws and may alter, amend or repeal any by-laws so made or adopted: Now, therefore, the City of Melville being a Local Authority within the meaning of the Act and having adopted the Model By-Laws described as Series "A" as published in the *Government Gazette* of 17 July 1963, and as amended from time to time thereafter, doth hereby resolve and determine that the said Model By-Laws so amended and adopted shall be further amended as follows:

PART I—GENERAL SANITARY PROVISIONS.

By deleting the whole of By-Law 29A and substituting a new By-Law 29A as follows:—

(1) An occupier of premises within the Municipal District of the City of Melville shall not keep or permit to be kept poultry on any premises within the City of Melville without first:—

- (a) Making application for and obtaining registration of the premises as a poultry yard and the applicant as a keeper of poultry.
- (b) Paying to the City of Melville a registration fee for the premises in the sum of five dollars (\$5.00).

(2) Registration of premises and of keepers of poultry shall not be effected by the City of Melville until such time as the Chief Health Surveyor certifies that the provision made for the enclosures and housing of poultry on any premises are adequate and capable of complying with the requirements of these By-Laws.

(3) An occupier registered as a keeper of poultry shall ensure that:—

- (a) At all times properly constructed enclosures are provided and maintained and all poultry kept on premises are kept within the confines of such enclosures at all times.
- (b) Adequate housing for the poultry as approved by the City of Melville is maintained at all times for poultry which housing shall be constructed of approved materials with a concrete or other form of impermeable floor and situate not less than 1.2 m from any boundary fence.
- (c) All enclosures within which poultry are kept are maintained in a clean and sanitary condition.
- (d) No poultry shall be kept at a distance less than 9 m from any place of human habitation.
- (e) No more than 12 poultry shall be kept on premises at any one time.

(4) Notwithstanding any other provision contained in this By-Law, an occupier shall not keep or permit to be kept a rooster, goose, peacock or turkey without the express permission of the Council of the City of Melville being first obtained to that effect.

(5) The registration of any occupier may be cancelled or refused by the Council of the City of Melville in relation both to the premises and the occupier in the event that the occupier is or has been convicted in any court of any offence relating to the keeping of poultry. In the event that registration is cancelled, all poultry shall be removed from the premises within seven (7) days of the date of cancellation.

STRATA TITLES GENERAL REGULATIONS 1985.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

| Quality of plans. | 4. A plan lodged for registration under the Act shall conform to the following requirements, namely—
(a) the paper shall be of good quality plan paper, white, unblemished and free of creases;
(b) drawings and writing shall be within a margin of not less than 40 mm on the left hand edge of the paper and not less than 15 mm on the other edges of the paper;
(c) the writing, drawing or typewriting shall be only on one side of the paper;
(d) the ink used for drawing or writing shall be a good waterproof ink and drawings, writing or typewriting shall be clear and legible and of sufficient density to permit photographic or other reproduction and shall not be blurred or liable to blur. |

Plan specifications.

5. (1) All plans lodged for registration under the Act shall be drawn showing—

- (a) the north point, which shall direct upwards;
- (b) the scale to which the plan is drawn, being a scale which will allow all details and notations to be clearly shown;
- (c) in the case of a floor plan, the boundaries of lots or whole separate parts of lots by continuous lines so that boundaries defined by walls or other structural features are clearly distinguished from boundaries defined by lines only; and
- (d) in the case of a location plan—
 - (i) if the Registrar of Titles so requires, the relationship of the external surface boundaries of the parcel to the location of the building; and
 - (ii) offsets in any case where part of the building is within 2 metres of a boundary of the parcel; and
 - (iii) encroachments, if any,
 but no other dimensions are necessary.

(2) All linear connections shown on plans shall be referred to a stated surface of a floor, wall, ceiling, or structural feature.

(3) No reference shall be made in a floor plan to the relationship of boundaries of lots to boundaries of the parcel.

(4) Every plan shall be drawn to one of the following ratios, or multiples of 10 of the ratios—

1:50
1:75
1:100
1:200
1:250
1:300
1:400
1:600
1:800

(5) Additional plan sheets may be used as required and shall comply with the same specifications as the first plan sheet but all floor plans shall be drawn to the same scale and in the same relationship to the borders of the floor plan sheets.

Numbering of lots on plans.

6. (1) In a strata plan lodged for registration under the Act, each lot shall be numbered consecutively commencing with lot 1 and terminating with a lot number corresponding with the total number of lots comprised in the plan.

(2) In a strata plan lodged for registration under the Act as a strata plan of consolidation or as a strata plan of subdivision each lot shall be numbered consecutively, the lowest lot number being greater by one than the highest number of any lot in the existing strata scheme.

(3) Where different parts of a building constitute a single lot, reference shall be made on each sheet on the plan that depicts part of that lot, to any other sheet of the plan that refers to that part or another part of that lot.

(4) In all plans, where a numbered lot is shown as consisting of more than one part, each part shall be described as part of that numbered lot, using the abbreviation "Pt." before the number.

(5) The Registrar of Titles may, after giving notice to all persons affected by his decision, number or re-number any lots in any plan lodged for registration or registered under the Act or the former Act.

Plan of consolidation.

7. (1) Where—

- (a) the land in a proposed strata scheme comprises more than 1 lot, allotment or portion of land; or
- (b) it is proposed to consolidate adjoining land with a parcel under section 18,

the strata plan shall be accompanied by a plan of survey consolidating the land into 1 lot.

(2) Where a consolidation referred to in subregulation (1) is effected an application for a certificate of title for the land not included in the consolidation shall accompany the transfer.

(3) The plans referred to in subregulation (1) shall comply with the rules and regulations in force for the guidance of surveyors when practising under the Transfer of Land Act 1893.

Description of Parcel, etc.

8. (1) The parcel shall be defined in a strata plan other than a strata plan of subdivision or a strata plan or consolidation—

- (a) by reference to the certificate of title or Crown grant; and
- (b) to a lot, allotment or portion illustrated on the relevant plan on public record in the Office of Titles.

(2) In a strata plan or subdivision or a strata plan of consolidation lodged for registration under the Act the parcel shall be defined by reference to the lots and common property, if any, in the strata scheme.

Schedule of unit entitlement.

9. The vertical interval between items in a schedule of unit entitlement or an amended schedule of unit entitlement shall be not less than 8 millimetres.

Licensed Valuer's Certificate.

10. (1) Subject to the Act, a certificate given by a licensed valuer for the purposes of the Act is valid for a period of 12 months.

- (2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), upon registration of the certificate of a licensed valuer the certificate shall be valid until the unit entitlement of the strata scheme is reallocated under section 14 or 15 and a new certificate is registered.
- Appeal Certificate. 11. Where a plan is accompanied by a certificate given under section 26(12)(a) or 27(10)(a) the certificate shall be bound into and form part of the plan.
- Consents of registered persons. 12. The consents required under—
 (a) section 8(3)(h);
 (b) section 9(3)(c); and
 (c) section 15(2)(b),
 shall be endorsed on or bound into the plan or application in the manner approved by the Registrar of Titles.
- Alteration. 13. (1) A sheet of a plan lodged in the office of the Registrar of Titles for registration shall be—
 (a) altered only by striking through the matter intended to be altered and not by rubbing, scraping or cutting the surface of the sheet; and
 (b) replaced, if in the opinion of the Registrar of Titles any alteration will render it unsuitable for copying by photographic or similar means.
 (2) Every alteration to a sheet of a plan, other than an alteration made by the Registrar of Titles under regulation 6(5) or 20 shall be authenticated—
 (a) by the surveyor, unless the sheet shows only the whole or part of a schedule of proposed unit entitlement; and
 (b) if the alteration—
 (i) relates to the definition of a lot boundary, by the local authority; or
 (ii) affects the proportional unit entitlement of any lot in the strata scheme, by the licensed valuer.
- Arrangement and presentation of plans etc. 14. The certificates, consents, instruments or documents required by the Act to accompany a strata plan shall be presented, arranged or bound with the strata plan in the manner approved by the Registrar of Titles.
- Numbering of strata plans. 15. The Registrar of Titles shall—
 (a) upon accepting a plan for registration, allot a distinctive reference to the plan; and
 (b) keep a record of all plans registered under the Act.
- PART III.—REGISTRATION.
- Application to register. 16. (1) A person who desires to register a strata plan or any order, consent or notice or make any application under the Act shall apply in writing to that effect to the Registrar of Titles.
 (2) Except where otherwise prescribed under these regulations, a notice, consent or application shall be in the form approved by the Registrar of Titles.
- Certificate of title to be produced. 17. Except where otherwise prescribed by these regulations, a document lodged for registration under the Act shall be accompanied by the certificate of title for the land or lot that will be affected upon the registration of the document.
- Prescribed manner of registration. 18. Except where otherwise prescribed by these regulations, registration of a document under the Act shall be effected by the notation of sufficient information to identify the transaction and the time and date of registration of the document on the relevant strata plan or relevant form in the strata plan or the certificate of title, as the case requires, and the authentication of that notation by the affixing of the seal of the Office of Titles and the facsimile signature of the Registrar of Titles by the proper officer of the Office of Titles.
- Patent errors. 19. Before registration of any plan or document, the Registrar of Titles may supply omissions and correct patent errors in the plan or instrument.
- Abbreviated procedure for conversion of tenancies in common. 20. The Registrar of Titles may direct that instead of the normal procedure that would but for that direction apply the procedure for the conversion of a tenancy in common to a strata scheme shall be in accordance with the abbreviated procedure as follows—
 (a) an application for conversion to strata title shall be made to the Registrar of Titles;
 (b) an application referred to in paragraph (a) shall be accompanied by—
 (i) the certificates of titles issued in respect of the interests held in the land the subject of the application; and
 (ii) a dispositional statement in the form of Form 24;
 (c) upon being satisfied that the strata plan and the relevant instruments are in order for registration the Registrar shall direct—
 (i) that the certificates of title issued in respect of the land the subject of the application be cancelled;
 (ii) that certificates of title be issued in respect of each lot on the strata plan;
 (iii) that each certificate of title so issued shall be endorsed so that every notation relating to an encumbrance that applies to the land held under the tenancies in common is brought forward and endorsed on the certificates of title issued in respect of the lots on the strata plan in accordance with the dispositional statement that accompanies the application,
 and effect shall be given to those directions.
- Quality of documents. 21. Except as otherwise prescribed by these regulations a document lodged for registration under the Act shall conform as to its quality and size to the requirements prescribed for the quality and size of documents registered under the Transfer of Land Act 1893.

PART IV.—STRATA COMPANIES.

- First meeting of body corporate. 22. The following provisions apply to and with respect to the meeting to be held pursuant to section 49(1)—
- (a) not less than 2 weeks notice shall be given of the time, day and meeting place of the strata company;
 - (b) the notice referred to in paragraph (a) shall be in writing delivered to each proprietor personally or sent by registered mail to the proprietor's last known address, or if the proprietor's address is not known, posted in a conspicuous place in the proprietor's lot or unit;
 - (c) the notice referred to in paragraph (a) shall specify the business to be conducted at the meeting;
 - (d) the original proprietor or the agent of the original proprietor shall preside at the meeting;
 - (e) the meeting shall be conducted in accordance with such of the provisions of Schedule 1 as apply to and with respect to the conduct of meetings of a strata company.
- Period of retention of certain records. 23. The prescribed period for the purposes of clause 16 of Schedule 3 to the Act is—
- (a) 12 years commencing on the day that the Act comes into operation; or
 - (b) if the strata company is wound up before that period, until the winding up of the strata company.
- Period for keeping records under section 35. 24. The prescribed period under section 35 is—
- (a) the period of 12 years commencing—
 - (i) in the case of minutes of a strata company on the day the minutes were recorded; and
 - (ii) in the case of books of account of a strata company on the day when a statement of those accounts was submitted to an annual general meeting; or
 - (b) if the strata company is wound up before that period until the winding up of the strata company.
- Interest on unpaid contributions. 25. The prescribed rate of interest under section 36(4)(b) is 15 per centum per annum.
- Prescribed amount under section 47(1). 26. The prescribed amount under section 47(1) is \$25.

PART V.—MISCELLANEOUS.

- Fees. 27. The fees specified in Schedule 1 are payable in respect of the several matters specified therein.
- Forms. 28. A form referred to in the second column of Schedule 2 is the form prescribed for the provision of the Act or these regulations specified opposite thereto in the first column.



NOISE ABATEMENT (HEARING CONSERVATION IN WORKPLACES) REGULATIONS 1983.

EXPLANATORY NOTES.

Objectives.

1. The aim of the regulations is to prevent workers suffering noise induced hearing loss in the course of their work. The most positive means of achieving this, and the only one which is wholly reliable in the long term, is to reduce noise at the workplace to levels which are not damaging. The regulations currently require all practicable means to be taken to reduce noise levels so that workers' noise exposure (Leq A8) do not exceed 90 dB(A). It has in the past been recognised that this criterion will not ensure 100% freedom from detectable effects on hearing. In consultation with industry it was expected that the criteria would be reduced below the noise exposure (Leq A8) of 90 dB(A) as soon as possible after the introduction of these regulations, when quieter industrial equipment and techniques become adequately available and no unfair differentials in operating costs would be created.

Impulse Noise.

2. The criterion defining noises with a peak level in excess of 140 dB(lin) as hazardous, differs from that of 145 dB(lin) stated in the 1980 document "Proposals for Hearing Conservation in Industry". This change was approved after a review of the literature on the latest research into the effects of impulse noise on hearing was made. As this is an on-going field of research, more definitive criteria may evolve in the future and the need to further amend this limit will be kept under review.

Noise Control

4. Sub-Regulation 9 (2) (b) (i) refers to recommendations on reduction of noise levels given in Section 4 of Australian Standard 1269-1983. This Section is reproduced below with the written permission of the Standards Association of Australia.

SECTION 4. ENGINEERING NOISE CONTROL.

4.1 SCOPE OF SECTION. This Section provides recommendations for controlling noise by engineering methods.

The use of engineering methods to control noise requires detailed knowledge of the characteristics of the offending noise and its source, based on detailed measured data and their analysis; determination of the most appropriate control measures; and design of the control devices and their correct installation. Generally the services of a specialist in engineering noise control will be required, and therefore in this Section only a brief summary is given of the principles of controlling noise by engineering methods.

4.2 NOISE CONTROL.

4.2.1 GENERAL. Each noise control problem involves a system with three components, viz. the source, the paths of transmission, and the receiver. The most effective method of control is the elimination or partial suppression of the noise at its source.

Potential occupational noise problems should be considered in the planning of new buildings or building alterations, and at the design stage of new machinery. Effective planning is the primary step to implement an engineering noise control programme. Involvement of maintenance staff and operators in such planning may prove beneficial.

4.2.2 MODIFICATION OF THE SOURCE. Reduction in the noise output of a machine is best effected through the design process, as it is generally difficult to reduce the noise output on an existing machine. However, some of the ways in which the noise of existing machines may be reduced are as follows:—

- Use of a process which is inherently quieter than the alternatives, e.g. mechanical pressing rather than drop forging.
- Avoidance or reduction of metal-to-metal impact.
- Suppression of vibration of the external surfaces of the machine, e.g. by selection of suitable material, stiffness, and damping and by careful dynamic balancing.
- Use of vibration-isolating mountings to reduce vibration transmission.

4.2.3 MODIFICATION OF TRANSMISSION PATHS. Some useful ways of modifying noise transmission paths are as follows:—

- (a) Increasing the distance between source and receiver. (This will not be effective in reverberant indoor conditions.)
- (b) Enclosing noisy machines. Complete enclosure is the most effective method of controlling airborne noise and the enclosure should therefore be as complete as the function of the machine will allow.
- (c) Separating noisy and quiet areas by partitions. The required size and location of partitions will depend on the size of the noise source and the frequency of the sound to be attenuated. Separation should be as complete as possible, partitions should be extended to walls and ceilings, and the number of openings in them kept to a minimum.
- (d) Providing a machine operator with a sound reducing enclosure.
- (e) Use of a sound-absorbing material on walls and ceilings to minimize increases in sound level due to reflection.
- (f) Use of "silencers" in intake and exhaust systems associated with fluid flow processes, e.g. internal combustion engines or air-conditioning systems.

4.2.4 ROSTERING OF JOB ALLOCATIONS. The noise dose to which some personnel are subjected may be reduced by rostering work to reduce each individual exposure time.

4.2.5 INSPECTION AND MAINTENANCE OF MACHINES. The adoption of a high standard of maintenance is essential. Machines in good order are quieter than machines in poor mechanical condition and the differences in noise emission are often significant.

New installations and maintenance should be supervised and inspected by persons adequately trained in the methods of noise control.

Australian Standard 1269-1983 also includes sections on noise measurements (section 2), evaluation of noise (section 3), hearing protection and educational programmes (section 5), to which reference will be necessary.

Training Courses.

5. Persons requiring further information on courses of training available for audiometric officers or noise officers are advised to contact the Manager WAIT-Aid or other tertiary institutions in Western Australia.

 - (d) 3 shall be appointed by the Governor, on the nomination of the Minister, and shall be persons actively engaged in land use in the district.
- (2) The Primary Industry Association of Western Australia shall submit to the Minister a panel containing the names of persons willing to be appointed as members of the Committee and where such panel is submitted in accordance with this Order 3 persons whose names appear on the panel submitted by the Primary Industry Association of Western Australia shall be nominated for appointment.
