Police Act 1892. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA GORDON REID, Governor, [L.S.] By His Excellency Professor Gordon Reid, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Commissioner of Police, do hereby under section 89A of the Police Act 1892—

- (a) prohibit the use or possession of the slot machines described in the Schedule; and
- (b) cancel the proclamation made under that section and published in the Government Gazette on 6 September 1963 at page 2710.

Schedule.

Prohibited Slot Machines.

Every slot machine which----

- (a) has any recording or accounting device (other than a device which records the progress score of each player of that slot machine) fitted within or on that slot machine;
- (b) returns, or purports to return, to a player thereof, or entitles a player thereof to, any money or money's worth, other than—
 - (i) an opportunity afforded by the automatic action of that slot machine to use or play it for an additional or longer period without the insertion of a coin or token in respect of that period; or
 - (ii) the delivery by means of that slot machine of one or more coins or tokens as a prize (in this subparagraph referred to as "the prize coins or tokens") in respect of a game played on that slot machine, if one or more coins or tokens of a value or aggregate value equal to or greater than the value or aggregate value of the prize coins or tokens was or were inserted in that slot machine by or on behalf of that player in order to play that game,

on the contingency of any score recorded by that slot machine;

(c) affords, or purports to afford, any advantage to a player of that slot machine for the insertion of more than one coin or token prior to the commencement of use or play; or (d) is a machine of the kind generally known and described as a poker machine, fruit machine or roulette machine or is a mechanical device in the nature of, or similar to, a machine of that kind.

Local Government Act 1960.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HOUSING LOAN GUARANTEE ACT 1957-1973. Declaration Under and Pursuant to Section Seven F of the Housing Loan Guarantee Act 1957-1973.

THE HONOURABLE BRIAN THOMAS BURKE, M.L.A., the Treasurer, have been requested under the pro-visions of Section Seven F of the Housing Loan Guarantee Act 1957-1973 (in this notice called "the Act") to do so, do by this notice declare the following matters, that is to say-

- (a) the maximum amount which the Treasurer may guarantee under the Act during the period com-mencing 19 May 1958, and ending 30 June 1986, is the sum of eighty five million dollars (\$85 000 000);
- (b) the maximum amount in respect of which agreements for indemnity may be entered into by the Treasurer during the period commencing 1 January 1962 and ending 30 June 1986, is the sum of seven million dollars (\$7 000 000);
- the maximum rate of interest which an approved institution may charge on a loan to a borrower or on the purchase money to a purchaser in respect of any period whilst an agreement for indemnity is in force in respect of the loan or purchase money, is thirteen and one quarter per centum (13.25%); and

(d) for the purpose of Section Seven B of the Act the maximum amount which an approved institution shall advance to a borrower on the giving of a first mortgage of a new house or the maximum amount of the purchase moneys which an approved instito the purchase moneys which an approved insti-tution shall permit to remain payable under a con-tract for sale and purchase of a new house before an indemnity is given by the Treasurer under the Act, is seventy per centum (70%) of the value of a new house as defined in the Act.

In addition to the above allowances, witnesses residing at a distance from the place of trial or hearing may be allowed reasonable travelling expenses actually paid, excluding any charges for maintenance or sustenance.

The Taxing Officer may also allow such amount as he thinks has been reasonably and properly incurred and paid to witnesses for qualifying to give skilled evidence.

Except by special order of the trial magistrate no allowance shall be made to any expert witness for attendance at Court assisting or advising counsel or solicitor for a party during the trial.

In the case of persons giving evidence as experts the allowance in the above scale may be increased in the discretion of the Taxing Officer. *Assessment of damages 50% of scale. ".

PREVENTION OF CRUELTY TO ANIMALS ACT 1920. PREVENTION OF CRUELTY TO ANIMALS ACT—CONTROL OF VIVISECTION AND EXPERIMENTS AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1985.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act-Control of Vivisection and Experiments Amendment Regulations 1985.

Principal regulations.

Schedule amended. Various regulations amended. In these regulations the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act—Control of Vivisection and Experiments Regulations 1959* are referred to as the principal regulations.
 The Schedule to the principal regulations is amended in Form 2 by deleting "Public".

4. The provisions of the principal regulations referred to in the Schedule to this regulation are amended by deleting "Public" wherever it occurs.

4. Landowners and/or occupiers adjoining Vacant Crown Land are, in addition to the above, encouraged to maintain external firebreaks where their property adjoins the Vacant Crown Land.

Urban land (all land within the townsites of Dandaragan, Badgingarra, Cervantes and Jurien) you shall clear lots of all debris, dry grass, dry bush, etc., of an inflammable nature.

General.

In situations where contruction of firebreaks in accordance with the Order may aggravate soil erosion problems or where the owner or occupier of land considers a more effective system of fire protection can be obtained or for any other reason, Council may approve an application for alternative siting of firebreaks. If for any reason it is considered impractical to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its authorised officer not later than 15 October for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions. If permission is not granted by the Council or its authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of \$400 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice, if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

2.2 No person shall use the area of land between the building set back line and a street alignment for any purpose other than one or more of the following.

- (a) a means of access.
 - (b) the loading and unloading of vehicles.
 - (c) landscaping.
 - (d) trade display, but so that in no case shall more than 10 per cent of the area be used for trade display purposes and any such trade display shall not be situated within 3 metres of any street alignment.

PART III-APPLICATIONS FOR FUNERALS.

Division I—Application.

3. Delete By-law 15 and substitute the following in lieu thereof:

15. All applications must be lodged at the office of the Trustees in such time as to permit at least five (5) working hours notice to be given prior to the time requested to be fixed for the funeral.

PART VI-MONUMENTAL AND OTHER WORK.

Division II-Application for and Performance.

4. Delete By-law 66 and substitute the following in lieu thereof:

66. A person carrying out monumental work within the cemetery may be required by the Trustees to deposit with them a bond of \$10.00. Such bond shall be forfeited to the Trustees if the work does not comply with the specification submitted or is not carried out in a workmanlike manner.

5. Delete By-law 67 and substitute the following in lieu thereof:

67. The materials used in monuments or for monumental work shall be of the highest quality and the Trustees or an officer duly authorized pursuant to By-law 4 may reject

8. Delete By-law 81 and substitute the following in lieu thereof:

- 81. Any work not completed before a weekend or Public Holiday shall be left in a neat and safe condition to the satisfaction of the Administrator.
 - PART VII-GENERAL

9. Delete By-law 84 and substitute the following in lieu thereof:

84. Vehicles shall proceed within the cemetery by such roads as they are directed by the Administrator or other officer of the Trustees authorized to direct traffic.

Those methods adopted by approved laboratories, provided that a certificate is issued showing the results of that calibration, are approved methods for the purposes of the Regulations.

The certificate need not give individual details of calibration results, but sufficient information to identify the particular instrument calibrated and the results of that calibration in terms of the instrument satisfying (or otherwise) all the tests conducted.

Complete details of test results should be available if required. 8. Procedure for Assessment of Hearing Protection Devices.

The following procedures are approved for showing adequate attenuation of noise by hearing protection devices for the purposes of regulation 16 of the Regulations:

- (a) If it is practicable to conduct an octave band frequency analysis of the noise, and the sound pressure levels in the octave bands with centre frequencies 31.5 Hz, 63 Hz and 16 kHz do not contribute significantly to the overall noise level, that procedure in Australian Standard 1269-1983 Appendix C, Section C3.1, provided the standard attenuation measurements used for the device are the current results obtained by the National Acoustic Laboratories, Commonwealth Department of Health (N.A.L.).
- (b) If it is practicable to conduct an octave band frequency analysis of the noise and the sound pressure levels in the octave bands with centre frequencies, 31.5 Hz, 63 Hz or 16 kHz do contribute significantly to the overall noise level, a procedure extrapolated from that in (a), using for the corrected attenuation values of 31.5 Hz and 63 Hz the same value as calculated for 125 Hz and for 16 kHz the value calculated for 8 kHz.
- (c) If it is not practicable to conduct an octave band frequency analysis of the noise due to its short duration and infrequent occurrence, that procedure in Australian Standard 1269-1983 Appendix C, Section C3.2, provided that the SLC values used for the device are those obtained by NAL, and that the unweighted sound pressure level may be used instead of the C-weighted sound pressure level.
- (d) If in addition the peak noise level exceeds 140 dB (1in), the device shall have an SLC value, as determined by NAL of at least 29.0 dB.

If assessment by the appropriate procedure (a), (b) or (c) above shows that no available hearing protection device is capable of attenuating the noise at the ear to less than 90 dB (A), a combination of an earmuff and earplug having SLC values, as determined by NAL, of at least 29.0 and 20.0 dB respectively, shall be used.

9. Form of Audiogram.

The following forms of audiograms are approved for use for the purpose of regulation 23 of the Regulations:

- (a) a chart and the symbols similar to that given in Appendix C of Australian Standard 2586-1983, excepting that the range of hearing levels displayed may be altered to suit the range of the particular audiometer(s) in use;
- (b) a table showing the hearing threshold level, for the right and left ears separately; for each of the tested frequencies including 500 Hz, 1000 Hz, 2000 Hz, 3000 Hz, 4000 Hz and 6000 Hz;
- (c) a chart labelled as in (a), but with separate sections for the results of testing left and right ears (for use with automatic audiometers),

--provided they include information on the designated worker's or former designated worker's full name, date of birth and employer; the audiometer used (make, model, serial number); the date and time of the hearing test; the type of test (reference or monitoring); and the signature and approval number of the audiometric officer conducting the test.

10. Inspection of Audiograms.

- (b) the period for the calibration of sound measuring equipment, where the laboratory is not at the time approved for the purpose, is 24 months preceding each day of use of the equipment concerned, provided that in all other respects the calibration is involved monthed in concerned in concerned with the negative of the Regulation. conducted and reported in accordance with the requirements of the Regulations;
- (c) the period for the calibration of audiometers, where the laboratory is not at the time approved for the purpose, is 12 months preceding each day of use of the audiometer concerned in accordance with the requirements of the Regulations;
- the period for reference audiometry, where the person conducting the audiometry is not at the time approved as an audiometric officer, is the 24 months prior to the coming into operation of the Regulations or a period of 12 months from the date of (d) completion of the first reference audiogram accepted under this provision, provided that in all other respects the reference audiogram is conducted and reported in accordance with the requirements of the Regulations.
