### ELECTORAL (ADDRESSES ON ROLL) ORDER 1985.

Declaration of single procedure in relation to addresses on roll.

2. An arrangement having been entered into under section 31B(1) of the Electoral Act 1907, it is hereby declared that, on and after 1 September 1985, a single procedure is in operation for the purpose of making a request under section 51B of the Electoral Act 1907 and section 104 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918 that the residence of an elector not be shown on an electoral

### Explanatory Note.

On and after 1 September 1985 the Commonwealth Electoral Office will be undertaking, on behalf of the State, the functions of the receipt, assessment and grant or refusal of requests under section 51B. From that date persons wishing to request that their address not be shown on State and Commonwealth electoral rolls will only be required to lodge a single request that that address not be entered on, or be deleted from, State and Commonwealth electoral rolls.

A new form of request is available at the offices of the Australian Electoral Commission, Divisional Returning Officers and the State Electoral Department. This form replaces the 2 separate forms now used by the Commonwealth and the State.

On and after 1 September 1985 a form of request, when duly completed, is to be sent to the Australian Electoral officer, care of the Divisional Returning Officer for the Commonwealth Division in which the person making the request resides.

Important information relating to your responsibility as a landholder in the Shire of Nannup.

WITH reference to section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954 you are required to carry out fire prevention work on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the provision of this order.

This work must be carried out by 1 December 1985 in the townsite and by 15 December 1985 in the Rural Area, and kept maintained throughout the summer months until the close of the Restricted Burning Period.

An inspection of firebreaks and hazard removal will be carried out in all areas of the Shire by Authorised Officers on or after 15 December 1985.

Persons who fail to comply with the requirements of the order may be issued with an infringement notice (Penalty \$40) or prosecuted with an increased penalty, and additionally, council may carry out the required work at cost to the owner or occupier.

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks as requested by this notice or if natural features render firebreaks unnecessary, you may apply to the Council

or its duly authorised officer not later than 8 December 1985 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice. If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the bush fires act.

A. Rural land: (All land other than a pine plantation and that listed as urban).

Firebreaks not less than two (2) metres wide must be provided in the following positions:

(a) "Strategic Break" means a fire break constructed wherever the lie of the land permits or where it is most convenient for fire protection. Rivers, creeks, and green flats and subdivisional roads including Forests Department firebreaks outside a property constitute a strategic break. A copy of the plan to be held in the Shire Office.

That each Brigade draw up a strategic plan to cover their area.

(b) Not more than 100 metres and not less than 20 metres from the perimeter of all buildings and/or haystacks situated on the land. Haystacks includes hayrolls.

Note: Grassed lawns around dwellings are construed as firebreaks.



- is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain antibiotic on a second occasion after I January 1985 or a second occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for that one day will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.
- is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain antibiotic on a third or succeeding occasion after 1 January 1985 or on a third or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by the dairyman for the duration of that testing period in which that day occurs will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.
- is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added water on the first occasion after I January 1985 or on the first occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for that one day will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.
- is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added water on a second or succeeding occasion after 1 January 1985 or on a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of the testing period in which that day occurs will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.
- is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added solids on the first occasion after I January 1985 or on the first occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk for a minimum of two testing periods.
- is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added solids on a second or succeeding occasion after 1 January 1985 or a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk for a minimum of four testing periods.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day after 1 January 1985 or on any day in a subsequent quota year, to have a bacterial count of over 50 000 bacteria per millilitre not less than 10 days—

after an initial examination indicating over 100 000 bacteria per millilitre; or

after any two initial examinations within the quota year indicating over 100 000 bacteria per millilitre; or after two consecutive initial examinations indicating over 50 000 bacteria per millilitre—

      - (ii) if the carcase is frozen or is intended for small goods manufacture, with the Australia Inspected Lamb stamp, issued to the export establishment in accordance with the Export Meat Orders made under the Export Control (Orders) Regulations of the Export Control Act 1982 of the Commonwealth.
    - (2) The brand referred to-
    - (a) in subregulation (1)(b)(i) shall be applied in the manner illustrated in Part C of Schedule 1;
    - (b) in subregulation (1)(b)(ii), shall be applied in the manner specified in regulation 11(6)(b),

using an approved red ink. ".
