Local Government Act 1960. ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972-1980. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted (inter alia) by section 19 of the Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972-1980, that where the Minister recommends that it is in the general interest of the community to do so, the Governor may, by Order in Council, declare that site to be a protected area; and whereas the Minister recommends to the Governor that the art and occupation site at Willigulli is an Aboriginal site of outstanding importance: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor acting with the advice and consent of Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 19 of the Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972-1980, hereby declares that the area specified in the first column of the Schedule to this order is a protected area for the purpose of the Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972-1980, in relation to the Aboriginal site specified in the second column.

SUPREME COURT ACT 1935.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Act 1935, and all other powers hereunto enabling, the Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia hereby make the following rules.

AMENDMENT OF THE RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT 1971.

Citation and

These rules may be cited as the Supreme Court (Costs) Rules commencement. No. 2, 1985 and shall come into operation on 1 January 1986.

Principal rules.

2. In these rules, the Rules of the Supreme Court 1971, reprinted in the Government Gazette on 11 June 1981 pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act 1954, and amended from time to time are referred to as the principal rules.

0.66 R. 16 substituted.

3. Order 66 of the principal rules is amended by revoking rule 16 and substituting the following rule:

- Subject to the provisions of these rules and to the provisions of the Legal Practitioners Act 1893 permitting a solicitor to make a written agreement as to costs with his client-
 - (1) the costs of or in relation to a party to an action or other proceeding (inclusive of counsel fees but exclusive of other disbursements)-
 - (a) recoverable by one party from another party; or
 - (b) payable by a party to his own solicitor,

shall not exceed-

(i) the sum of \$3000 where the action or other proceeding is commenced on or after 1 January 1954, but before 7 April 1960;

- (ii) the sum of \$4 500 where the action or other proceeding is commenced on or after 7 April 1960, but before 1 February 1967;
- (iii) the sum of \$5 000 where the action or other proceeding is commenced on or after 1 February 1967, but before 1 June 1975;
- (iv) the sum of \$7 500 where the action or other proceeding is commenced on or after 1 June 1975, but before 1 January 1976;
- (v) the sum of \$10 000 where the action or other proceeding is commenced on or after 1 January 1976, but before 1 July 1982;
- (vi) the sum of \$17 500 where the action or other proceeding is commenced on or after 1 July 1982, but before 1 January 1985;
- (vii) the sum of \$20 500 where the action or other proceeding is commenced on or after 1 January 1985, but before 1 January 1986; or
- (viii) the sum of \$21 800 where the action or other proceeding is commenced on or after 1 January 1986
- (2) where the action or issue is one in which a claim is made for damages for death or bodily injury caused by or arising out of the use of a motor vehicle, the total costs shall not exceed the costs that could have been allowed if the amount recovered were—
 - (a) the sum of \$10 000 where the action is commenced on or after 7 April 1960, but before 15 June 1973;
 - (b) the sum of \$20 000 where the action is commenced on or after 15 June 1973, but before 1 January 1978;
 - (c) the sum of \$40 000 where the action is commenced on or after 1 January 1978, but before 1 July 1982;
 - (d) the sum of \$75 000 where the action is commenced on or after 1 July 1982, but before 1 January 1985;
 - (e) the sum of \$90 000 where the action is commenced on or after 1 January 1985, but before 1 January 1986; or
 - (f) the sum of \$96 000 where the action is commenced on or after 1 January 1986.

WILDLIFE CONSERVATION ACT 1950 (AS AMENDED).

W49/48, W885/85.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by section 14 and 17B of the Wildlife Conservation Act 1950, I hereby declare as follows:

- (1) That the period from six o'clock in the forenoon of Sunday, 12 January 1986 until one minute before midnight in the afternoon of Sunday, 9 February 1986, shall be an open season in respect of those species of wild duck in the Second Schedule hereto in those parts of the State which lie within the boundaries of the South West Division and Eucla Division, as defined in section 28 of the Land Act 1933 with the exception of those areas defined in the First Schedule hereto.
- (2) That the species of wild duck in the Second Schedule hereto are game species in all parts of the State in respect of which an open season on those species is declared by paragraph (1) of this notice.
- (3) That a person shall not take any wild duck of the species declared to be a game species under the Second Schedule hereto unless he has been granted a licence under Regulation 21 of the Wildlife Conservation Regulations.
- (4) That a person shall not take any wild duck or the egg of any wild duck for the purpose of keeping it in captivity, or for the purpose of aviculture or for the purpose of sale.
- (5) That a person shall not sell any wild duck.
- (6) That a person shall not take any wild duck by any means other than a shotgun licensed pursuant to the Firearms Act 1973, and having a calibre of less than thirty-one fortieths of an inch of internal diameter (ten gauge).
- (7) That a person shall not use any boat, raft, launch or other type of boat which is powered by any type of motor or engine or which is propelled or towed by any means other than by hand for the purpose of taking or attempting to take wild ducks.
- (8) That a person shall not take or attempt to take on any one day of the open season more than five wild ducks of a combination of the species listed in the Second Schedule hereto or more than five of any one of the species of wild duck listed in the Second Schedule hereto.

- (9) That a person shall not have under his control or in his possession or keep in any cold store or any freezing chambers or other premises at any one time—
 - (a) on the opening day of the season, more than five wild ducks of a combination of the species listed in the Second Schedule hereto or more than five wild ducks of any one species listed in the Second Schedule hereto;
 - (b) on any day other than opening day of the open season more than ten wild ducks of a combination of the species listed in the Second Schedule hereto or more than ten wild ducks of any one species listed in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (10) That a person shall not possess or transport a wild duck unless at least one fully feathered wing is attached to the bird, and that the wing and plumage may be removed from the duck—
 - (a) when the duck is prepared for immediate cooking, and
 - (b) after the duck is taken to the residence of its owner for preservation.
- (11) That a person shall not take or attempt to take wild ducks of a species in the Second Schedule hereto between the hours of
 - (a) 7.00 p.m. and 5.00 a.m. on any day other than opening day of the open season, and
 - (b) midnight and 6.00 a.m., and 7.00 p.m. and midnight on opening day of the open season. in those areas defined in the Third Schedule hereto.

- (4) That a person shall not take any wild duck or the egg of any wild duck for the purpose of keeping it in captivity, or for the purpose of aviculture or for the purpose of sale.
- (5) That a person shall not sell any wild duck.
- (6) That a person shall not take any wild duck by any means other than a shotgun licensed pursuant to the Firearms Act 1973, and having a calibre of less than thirty-one fortieths of an inch of internal diameter (ten guage).
- (7) That a person shall not use any boat, raft, launch or other type of boat which is powered by any type of motor or engine or which is propelled or towed by any means other than by hand for the purpose of taking or attempting to take wild ducks.
- (8) That a person shall not take or attempt to take more than 10 wild ducks in any one day of the open season.
- (9) That a person shall not have under his control or in his possession or keep in any cold store or any freezing chambers or other premises at any one time—
 - (a) on opening day of the open season more than 10 wild ducks;
 - (b) on any day other than opening day of the open season, more than 20 wild ducks.
- (10) That a person shall not possess or transport a wild duck unless at least one fully feathered wing is attached to the bird and that the wing and plumbage may be removed from the duck—
 - (a) when the duck is prepared for immediate cooking, and
 - (b) after the duck is taken to the residence of its owner for preservation.

- (6) A Wildlife Officer may, if after inspection of the property he considers it necessary, prohibit the taking of that species of wild duck described in the Schedule hereto on that property, until the landholder obtains a Damage Licence in accordance

with the Wildlife Conservation Regulations and thereupon no persons shall take those wild ducks on that property except under authority of a licence.

- The accounts of the Shire of Derby/West Kimberley are prepared on the basis of historical cost. In preparing its balance sheet it is not the policy of the Council to recognise all liabilities which exist at balance date.
- 2. This policy does not comply with the Local Government Act, which requires an annual statement showing the liabilities of the Council, nor does it comply with generally accepted accounting standards, although it is consistent with previous years.
- 3. At 30 June 1985, Council has written back to the municipal accumulation account the balance of depreciation provided at 30 of each fixed asset over its estimated useful life. This policy complies with the requirements of the Local Government Act and the Accounting Directions, although it is not in accordance with generally accepted accounting standards.

- 4. There is some doubt as to the legality of certain rates, including mining rates, which Council has raised, and until the situation is clarified, the collection of such rates is doubtful. In my opinion a provision of \$125 000 for doubtful debts should be raised and charged to the municipal accumulation account to cover these and other debtors.
- 5. I have, with the assistance of my staff, audited the books of the Shire of Derby/West Kimberley for the year ended 30 June 1985. In my opinion, the balance sheet, statement of receipts and payments, adjustment account and municipal accumulation account are in agreement with the books and records of the Council, and, subject to my comments in paragraph 2, are prepared on a basis consistent with the Local Government Act and the Accounting Directions.

REPORT OF THE AUDITOR GENERAL.

The accounts of the Shire of Wanneroo have been audited for the financial year ended 30 June 1985. The accounts have been found to be in order and properly kept in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Act 1960 and have been allowed.

In my opinion, the Balance Sheet and the related financial statements for the year ended 30 June 1985 have been prepared on a basis consistent with the Local Government Act Accounting Directions and present fairly the affairs of the Shire.

My report for the financial year ended 30 June 1982 stated that certain expenditures associated with Town Planning Scheme No. 5 were being contested in a Supreme Court action, brought against the Shire by scheme participants, on the grounds that these expenditures were either not authorised by the scheme text and hence contrary to law or were subdivisional costs of work undertaken by the Shire without authority of landowners.

On 18 September 1985, the Council entered into a Deed of Compromise and Arrangement with the landowners within Town Planning Scheme No. 5 to compromise the claim being contested in the Supreme Court.

compromise the claim being contested in the Supreme Court.

This settlement resulted in the Town Planning Scheme No. 5 liability of \$1808 504.44 shown in the Balance Sheet at 30 June 1985 being increased to \$1857 202.11 due to the inclusion of agreed new works at an estimated cost of \$88 880.00 and refunds of \$295 491.93 due to landowners, offset by an amount of \$335 674.26 payable by the Municipal Fund under the terms of the Deed.

The Scheme liability of \$1857 202.11 is to be met from contributions of \$451 042.55 from landowners and \$1406 159.56 from the Municipal Fund. The latter amount is comprised of concessions to landowners in accordance with the Deed, \$1355 840.14, and the net costs of \$50 319.42 attributable to the Scheme from 1 October 1984 to 30 June 1985.

The liability of \$1 285 915.91 to the Municipal Fund as shown in the notes to the financial statements comprises the \$335 674.26 and \$1 406 159.56 together with further costs to complete the Scheme, estimated at \$462 653.00 less \$918 570.91 due to the Fund from the Scheme.

It is anticipated that in future years the liability will be reduced by the sale of 14 lots in the Scheme area, the proceeds from which are estimated by Council at \$935 000.

FINANCE BROKERS CONTROL ACT 1975.

Code of Conduct.

THE following Code of Conduct has been approved by the Finance Brokers Supervisory Board pursuant to the provisions of section 81 of the Finance Brokers Control Act 1975

Finance Brokers failing to comply with the terms of the Code will be liable for disciplinary action (see 83(2)(c) (iii) of the Act).

- 1. A Brokers relationship with his client is confidential and Brokers shall not allow or permit except so far as the law requires any publication of any information relating to his client's affairs without the consent of the client.
- 2. Brokers are responsible for the conduct acts and statements of all persons employed in the business of the Broker in the normal course of business.

3. Brokers shall understand fully the duties and obligations imposed upon them by the Finance Brokers Control Act and Regulations and this Code of Conduct.

Brokers shall be as fully informed as possible in matters of the practice of a Finance Broker and shall advise their clients as to their responsibilities and obligations under any agreement negotiated by the Broker on behalf of a client.

- 4. Brokers shall at all times act in the interests of their clients and shall not place a lender or borrower to disadvantage for the Broker's own benefit.
- 5. A Broker shall make full disclosure to any prospective lender of any interest whatsoever which the Broker or any employee of the Broker or any member of their respective families may directly or indirectly have in any property offered as security for a loan.

In the event of the existence of any such interest then in addition to disclosure the Broker shall not permit any such loan to be made unless the lender has received separate advice from an independent Solicitor, Valuer or Finance Broker.

- 6. Brokers shall not be entitled to make any charge for services other than those laid down in the Scale of Fees established under the Finance Brokers Control Act without the prior written consent of their clients.
- 7. Brokers shall take all reasonable precautions to protect their clients against fraud, misrepresentation and other unethical practice and to ascertain and communicate to them all available relevant facts relating to a property offered as security to a lender.
- 8. Where a Broker is also a licensed Estate Agent and where a loan is negotiated on behalf of a borrower that loan shall not be made conditional on the granting to the agent/broker of a selling agency or property management agreement.
- 9. Brokers shall inquire whether a prospective borrower is eligible for a low interest government or other beneficial loan and if so, the Broker shall advise the applicant accordingly before taking an application for a loan from the prospective borrower.
- 10. Where two Brokers act in conjunction in satisfying an applicant for a loan the Brokers shall share the brokerage by pre-determined arrangement and no additional fees shall be paid by any person by virtue of such arrangement.
- 11. A person being the licensee of a business operated under a licence, and a person holding himself out as being in bona fide control of a business operated under a licence, including the manager of a branch office of such a business, shall—
 - (a) ensure that such business is conducted from premises to which the public have access during normal business hours, on days that business is generally conducted in the district in which those premises are situate, unless by advertisement displayed on the premises and which can readily be seen and read from outside the premises, the public is informed that those premises will only be open on stated days or part days of the week;
 - (b) personally manage full time and carry out the principal managerial duties of such business and where a branch office of the business is conducted, ensure that the manager of each branch office personally manages and carries out the principal managerial duties of such branch office business;
 - (c) except for reasons of genuine emergency, sickness, or for the taking of annual holidays, a licensee or person in bona fide control of a business operated under a licence shall attend at the premises from which that business is conducted and the manager of every branch office of that business shall attend at the branch office of the business which he manages and from which the business is conducted, at such times and as frequently as shall be required, so as to ensure that the licensee or person in bona fide control of the business is in bona fide control of that business and can capably and properly manage the affairs thereof and so as to ensure that every manager of every branch office of the business is in full control of that branch office and can capably and properly manage the affairs thereof;
 - (d) when persons call at premises from which a business operated under a licence is conducted, or telephone those premises, for the purpose of speaking to the licensed person, or to the person in bona fide control of the business, or to the manager of the branch office, as the case may be, on business concerning such business, the licensed person, or the person in bona fide control of the business, or the manager of the branch office, as the case may be, shall make such arrangements as may be necessary to enable the person who calls or telephones to speak with him as soon as reasonably possible;
 - (e) not take holidays of more than twenty consecutive days (excluding weekends and public holidays) in any one calendar year, without the prior written consent of the Finance Brokers Supervisory Board.
- 12. Upon request by a borrower or lender Brokers shall provide free of cost to the person requesting the statement a statement of account in respect of a current loan relating to such person which is managed by the Broker but not more often than at intervals of six months. Any additional statements shall be at cost to the person requesting the statement.

- 13. A Broker or any of his employees shall not be excused for non-observance of the terms of this Code by reason of any claimed ignorance of the terms of the Code.
- 14. Prior to registration of any mortgage to secure a loan negotiated by a Broker, a Broker shall provide the lender and borrower with a written statement setting out the following information:—
 - (i) Full name and address of lender.
 - (ii) Full name and address of borrower.
 - (iii) Amount of loan.
 - (iv) Description of mortgaged property.
 - (v) Commencement date for interest.
 - (vi) Date of advance.
 - (vii) Interest rate.
 - (viii) Penalty rate.
 - (ix) Dates payment due.
 - (x) Term of loan.
 - (xi) Rights of discharge.
- $15.\,\mathrm{A}$ Broker shall not engage in any harsh or unconscionable conduct.

- (i) the technical qualifications of the applicant and of its employees;
- (ii) the technical advice available to the applicant;
- (iii) the financial resources available to the applicant, including evidence of the applicant's ability to fund the work programme proposal, a statement of other exploration plans and commitments over the next six years, and a copy of the latest annual report for each applicant company;
- (iv) where relevant, the viability of the consortium lodging the application, including evidence that a satisfactory settlement has been, or can be, reached on the joint operating agreement (a copy of a Heads of Agreement dealing will generally suffice);
- (v) the percentage participating interest of each party to the application, and
- (vi) the business address for service of notices in respect to each applicant.




