ARRANGEMENT BETWEEN THE ATTORNEY-GENERAL OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA AND THE PREMIER OF THE STATE OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA UNDER SECTION 11 OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION ACT 1981.

IT is agreed that the Commissioner for Equal Opportunity (referred to herein as "the Commissioner") assisted by her Office, constitutes an appropriate agency to receive and investigate complaints under the Human Rights Commission Act on behalf of the Human Rights Commission (referred to herein as "the Commission") and, where appropriate, to endeavour to effect a settlement. In addition, the Commissioner will assist the Commission in its promotional and educational functions, as agreed from time to time between the two agencies.

There will be one office in Western Australia, the Office of the Commissioner for Equal Opportunity and of the Human Rights Commission, for the handling of human rights related complaints. The objectives of this arrangement are to:

- (i) provide one point of contact both for advice and the handling of complaints;
- ii) make for efficient and economic handling of complaints by ensuring that all available remedies are used in a co-ordinated way;
- (iii) assist members of the public who would not have to move from office to office in search of redress; and

(iv) avoid demarcation disputes between agencies, particularly where a complaint involved both Commonwealth and State issues.

It is agreed that the Commissioner for Equal Opportunity would normally handle all complaints to a conclusion. However, the Commissioner will retain a right, in consultation with the Commission, to decline to handle a particular complaint. The Commission will retain a right, in consultation with the Commissioner, to assume responsibility for handling a particular complaint.

It is recognised that complaints that are of a kind that are more appropriately handled by the Commission include the following, namely, complaints where:

- (i) major research is involved;
- (ii) the outcome may be a requirement for changes in Commonwealth legislation;
- (iii) a major national policy issue is raised;
- (iv) there is a major point of law involved, or
- (v) the expense is too large to be handled within the normal operating framework.

Discussions between the two agencies will refine this list so that progressively a clear set of working arrangements develops.

The Commissioner will provide from time to time, information to the Commission about complaints. This information will be provided when the complaint is received, when the case is completed and at such other times and in relation to such other details as may be mutually agreed between the two agencies.

In relation to costs, the general principle is that the Commonwealth, through the Commission, will meet the cost to the Office of the Commissioner of the handling of complaints and of educational and other activities undertaken on the Commission's behalf.

The Commissioner, the Commission and all appropriate Departments will consult in relation to other details of financial arrangements.

This arrangement is to be reviewed within six months and is to be subject to regular review thereafter. However, the arrangement should continue to operate unless and until there is agreement that it should be revised or notice of termination is given by either Minister to the other Minister.

Any difficulties that may arise in the implementation of this arrangement which cannot be resolved between the Commission and the Commissioner shall be referred to the Ministers.





DOG ACT 1976.

The Municipality of the City of Cockburn.

By-Law Relating to Dogs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 26 February 1985, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following bylaw.

Previous By-law.

1. The by-laws of the City of Cockburn Relating to the Control of Dogs and Relating to Dog Kennels and the Breeding of Dogs published in the *Government Gazette* of 11 May 1973 and amended in the *Government Gazette* of 2 May 1975, 31 October 1975, 9 November 1979, 29 October 1982 and 9 December 1983, are hereby revoked.

2. This by-law may be cited as the City of Cockburn by-law Relating to Dogs.

PART I-Preliminary.

3. In this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires:

"Act" means the Dog Act 1976.

"authorised person" has the same meaning as that given to it in the Act.

- "Clerk" means the Town Clerk for the time being of the Council and includes, in the absence of the Town Clerk, the Deputy or Acting Town Clerk of the Council.
- "Council" means the Council of the City of Cockburn.
- "district" means the district of the municipality of the City of Cockburn.

PART II-Impounding of Dogs.

4. The Council may establish and maintain a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized and detained pursuant to the provisions of the Act. The pound established by the City of Cockburn at Lot 50 Wellard Street, Spearwood, within the district has been established for those purposes.

5. The fees and charges payable by an owner upon the return of a dog and upon the release of an impounded dog are those specified in the First Schedule.

6. The fee payable by the owner of a dog which has been destroyed pursuant to the provisions of the Act is that prescribed in the First Schedule.

PART III-Restricted Areas.

7. The person liable for the control of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:

(a) a public building;

(b) a theatre;

- (c) a house of worship;
- (d) or other business premises not being a shop or business premises where dogs are sold or treated for illness or injury;
- (e) Reserve No. 24306 known as Coogee Beach.

8. The person liable for the control of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:-

- (a) a sports ground;
- (b) land set aside for public recreation;
- (c) a car park:
- land vested in or under the control of the Council excepting Reserve 24306 known as (d) Coogee Beach.

PART IV-Keeping of Dogs.

9. The owner or occupier of premises within the district on which a dog is kept shall ensure that the premises or portion of the premises are fenced in a manner capable of confining the dog.

10. The owner or occupier of any premises within the district shall not, unless the premises have been granted exemption under section 26(3) of the Dog Act, keep, permit or suffer to remain thereon more than two dogs over the age of three months unless such premises are:—

- (a) situated within that portion of the district contained within the shaded area on the map depicted in the Fifth Schedule; and
- (b) licensed as an approved kennel establishment pursuant to this by-law.

11. An application for a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in the form of the Third Schedule and shall be accompanied by two copies of a plan showing the details and specifications of all kennels and yards appurtenant thereto and showing the distances from the said kennels to the boundaries of the land the subject of the application and all buildings on the said land together with such other information as the Council may require.

12. A person seeking the issue of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall, unless the Council decides otherwise, give notice of the proposed use of the land:—

(a) by advertising at least once in a newspaper circulating in the district; and

(b) in writing to the owners and occupiers of all adjoining land and premises;

at least 14 days before application is made to the Council.

13. A licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in the form of the Fourth Schedule.

14. The fees payable for the issue of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment and for the renewal of such licence are specified in the First Schedule.

15. A licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall remain valid for a period of twelve (12) months from the date of issue thereof.

16. A person seeking the renewal of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall make application to the Council in the form of the Third Schedule.

17. The occupier of premises licensed as an approved kennel establishment shall ensure that the dogs in that establishment shall ensure that the dogs in that establishment are kept in kennels and yards appropriate to the breed or kind in question and in accordance with the following requirements:—

- (a) each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto which is capable of retaining the dog within its confines;
- (b) each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance of not less than 30 metres from any boundary road or street of the land the subject of the licence;
- (c) each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance of not less than 15 metres from any dwelling, church, school room, hall, factory, dairy or any premises wherein food is manufactured, prepared, packed or stored for human consumption;
- (d) the walls of each kennel shall be constructed of concrete, brick, stone or timber framing sheeted with asbestos or galvanised iron internally and externally;
- (e) the roof of each kennel shall be constructed of impervious material;
- (f) the lowest internal height of the kennel shall be at least two metres from the floor;
- (g) all painted external surfaces of the kennel shall be kept in good condition and well painted;
- (h) all gates shall be provided and fitted with proper catches or means of securely fastening;
- (i) each yard for a kennel shall be securely fenced with a fence not less than two metres in height constructed of material approved by the Council;
- (j) the upper surface of a kennel floor shall be at least 10 cms above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a surface having a fall of not less than 1 in 100 to a drain which shall be properly laid, ventilated and trapped in accordance with the health requirements of the Council;
- (k) all floor washings shall pass through the drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the health requirements of the Council;
- the floor area of each kennel shall be an area of not less than 2.5 square metres for every dog kept therein over the age of three months;
- (m) the yard of any kennel or group of kennels shall not be less than twice the area of the kennel or group;
- (n) all kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels shall be maintained in a clean disinfected and sanitary condition and shall be cleansed and disinfected when so ordered by an officer of the Council;
- (o) every approved kennel establishment shall be provided with reticulated water in the form of a supported stand pipe and hose for the hosing down of the kennels and yards.

18. The holder of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall:-

(a) maintain the establishment in a clean, sanitary and tidy condition;

- (b) dispose of all refuse, faeces and food waste daily in a manner approved by the Council;
- (c) take all practical measures for the destruction of fleas, flies and other vermin.

PART V-General.

19. The district is hereby specified as an area in which it is an offence (unless the excreta is removed) for any person liable for the control of a dog to permit that dog to excrete on any street or public place or on any land without the consent of the occupier.

20. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of this by-law commits an offence and shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$100.00.

21. The offences described in the Second Schedule are prescribed pursuant to section 50 (1) (d) of the Act as offences in relation to which a modified penalty applies and the amount appearing directly opposite each such offence is the prescribed modified penalty payable in respect of that offence.

22. (1) Where an authorised person has reason to believe that a person has committed an offence against this by-law as prescribed in Clause 21, he may serve on that person an infringement notice and the infringement notices issued under this by-law shall be in the form depicted in Form 7 of the First Schedule of the Dog Act Regulations 1976.

(2) An infringement notice may be served on an alleged offender personally or by posting it to his address as ascertained from him, at the time of or immediately following the occurrence giving rise to the allegation of the offence, or as recorded by Council pursuant to the Act.

(3) Where a person who receives an infringement notice fails to pay the prescribed penalty within the time specified in the notice, or within such further time as may in any particular case be allowed, he is deemed to have declined to have the allegation dealt with by way of a modified penalty.

(4) An alleged offender on whom an infringement notice has been served may, within the time specified in that notice or such further time as may in any particular case be allowed, send or deliver to the Council the amount of the prescribed penalty, with or without a reply as to the circumstances giving rise to the allegation, and the Council may thereupon:-

- (a) appropriate that amount in satisfaction of the penalty and issue an acknowledgement; or
- (b) withdraw the infringement notice and refund the amount so paid.

(5) An infringement notice may, whether or not the prescribed penalty has been paid, be withdrawn by the Council by sending a notice in the prescribed form to the alleged offender at the address specified in the notice or his last known place of residence or business.

(6) The prescribed form of Withdrawal of Infringement Notice issued under this by-law shall be in the form depicted in Form 8 of the First Schedule of the Dog Act Regulations 1976.



DOG ACT 1976.

The Municipality of the Shire of Wyalkatchem.

By-laws Relating to the Control of Dogs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the above mentioned Act, and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the above mentioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 18 July 1985, to repeal the by-laws for the control of dogs as published in the *Government Gazette* of 19 September 1975, and to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.

PART I-Preliminary.

1. In these by-laws the term "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Wyalkatchem.

PART II-Impounding of Dogs.

2. The Council may establish and maintain a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act 1976.

3. A dog seized by a Police Officer or an Officer authorised by the Council may be placed in a pound.

4. Where a dog has been seized or placed in a pound the keeper of the pound or other employees authorised by the Council shall if the owner or person usually in charge of the dog is known to him forthwith notify such person that the dog has been impounded.

5. The pound keeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such times and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.

6. If the owner or person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of a dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog then upon payment of the fees specified in the First Schedule hereto the dog shall be released to such person.

7. Any person applying for the release of a dog seized or impounded shall prove to the satisfaction of the pound keeper or other employee authorised by the Council the ownership of the dog and his authority to take delivery of it. The pound keeper or employee may accept such proof as he considers satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against him or the Council in respect of the delivery of the dog if made in good faith.

8. If a dog shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 72 hours of it being impounded or if a dog having a collar around its neck with a registration disc for the current year affixed thereto shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 72 hours of the service of a notice upon the registered owner the pound keeper or other employee authorised by the Council may sell the dog or have it destroyed. Any costs incurred by the Council in seizing or disposing of the dog shall be recoverable by the Council from the owner.

9. Upon the sale of the dog the proceeds of sale shall be the property of the Council and may be disposed of in such a manner as the Council thinks fit. The owner of a dog sold pursuant to these by-laws shall have no claim against the Council in respect of the proceeds thereof.

10. Notwithstanding anything herein contained, but subject to the provisions of subsection (12) of section 29 of the Dog Act 1976 any dog seized or impounded may at any time be destroyed upon the written authority of a registered veterinary surgeon, medical practitioner or health surveyor.

11. If the Council shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not the owner shall pay to the Council the fees specified in the First Schedule hereto.

12. No person shall

- (a) unless a pound keeper or other employee of the Council duly authorised in that regard release or attempt to release a dog from a pound;
- destroy break into damage or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any (b) pound;
- destroy, break into, damage, or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any (c) dog cart vehicle or container used for the purpose of catching holding or conveying dogs which have been seized.

13. No person shall obstruct or hinder an employee of the Council or member of the Police Force in the performance of anything authorised by the provisions of the Dog Act 1976 or by the regulations made in pursuance of those provisions or by these by-laws.

14. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure care detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of his liability to a penalty under any of the provisions of these by-laws.

15. Any person who shall commit a breach of these By-laws 2-14 (both inclusive) shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

PART III—Keeping Dogs.

16. The occupier of premises shall not unless the premises are licensed as an approved kennel establishment or have been granted exemption pursuant to section 26 (3) of the Act keep or permit to be kept on those premises more than two dogs over the age of three months and the young of those dogs under that age if the premises are situated within the townsite of Wyalkatchem.

17. (1) The owner or occupier of premises within the townsite of Wyalkatchem on which a dog is kept shall cause the portion of those premises on which the dog is kept to be fenced in a manner capable of confining the dog to that portion and in accordance with the provisions of this by-law.

(2) The fence used to confine a dog and every part of the fence shall, having regard to the species, age, size and physical condition of the dog, prevent that dog from passing over, under or through the fence.

(3) If there is a gate in the fence the gate shall be:-

(a) fitted with:---

- (i) an efficient self-closing mechanism;
- (ii) an efficient self-latching mechanism attached to the inside of the gate;
- (iii) a mechanism which enables the gate to be permanently locked;
- (b) kept closed at all times except when the dog is not kept on the premises, but nothing in this paragraph prevents a person from opening the gate in order to leave the premises.

(4) In this by-law the term "fence" includes a wall.

18. (1) An application for a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in writing and shall be in or substantially in the form contained in the Second Schedule and shall be accompanied by evidence that due notice of the proposed use of the land has been given to persons in the locality.

(2) Unless the Council shall otherwise decide, an applicant for a licence shall give notice of the proposed use of the land by:—

- (a) not less than one advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district; and
- (b) giving written notice to the owners and occupiers of all adjoining properties at least thirty days before the application is made to the Council.

19. The fee payable for the issue of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment is that specified in the First Schedule.

20. A licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in or substantially in the form contained in the Third Schedule.

21. The fee payable for the renewal of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment is that specified in the First Schedule.

22. A person shall not erect an approved kennel establishment unless it complies with the provisions of these by-laws and until plans and specifications and a location plan showing the proposed site for the kennel and of the yard appurtenant thereto have been approved by the Council and the fee for the licence prescribed in the First Schedule has been paid.

23. The owner or occupier of premises which have been licensed as an approved kennel establishment shall provide a kennel or kennels which comply with the following specifications:—

(a) Each kennel shall have a yard appurtemant thereto;

- (b) each kennel and each yard and every part thereto shall not be any less distance than 30 metres from the boundaries of the land in the occupation of the occupier;
- (c) each kennel and each yard and every part thereto shall not be any less distance than 30 metres from any road or street;
- (d) each kennel and each yard and every part thereto shall not be any less distance than 20 metres from any dwelling house, Church, schoolroom, hall or factory;
- (e) the wall shall be rigid, impervious and structurally sound;
- (f) the roof shall be constructed of impervious material or other material approved by Council;
- (g) all untreated external surfaces of a material shall be painted and kept painted with good quality paint;
- (h) the lowest internal height shall be at least 2 metres from the floor;
- (i) each yard shall be securely fenced and kept securely fenced with a fence not less than 2 metres in height constructed of galvanised iron, wood, galvanised link mesh or netting;
- (j) all gates shall be provided with proper catches or means of fastening;
- (k) the upper surfaces of the floor of each kennel shall be set at least 100 mm above the surface of the surrounding kennel ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a smooth surface and shall be drained in accordance with the health requirements of Council;
- (1) the floor of a yard shall be constructed in the same manner as the floor of a kennel;
- (m) for each dog kept herein every kennel shall have not less than 2 square metres of floor space and every yard not less than 2.5 square metres;
- (n) each kennel shall be constructed so far as is practicable with materials which prevent or minimise emission of noise therefrom.

24. A person who keeps or permits dogs to be kept in an approved kennel establishment shall:—

- (a) keep dogs in kennels and yards appropriate to the breed or kind in question, sited and maintained in accordance with the requirements of public health and sufficiently secured;
- (b) not permit any dog to escape from the kennel or yard in which it is kept or wander at large except for the purpose of reasonable exercise whilst under effective control; and
- (c) maintain all kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels used by dogs therein in a clean condition and cleanse and disinfect them when required to do so by an authorised person.

25. A right of appeal to local court is conferred by section 27 of the Act where the Council refuses the grant of a licence and gives notice of intention to cancel a licence in respect of an approved kennel establishment.

PART IV—General.

26. The owner of a dog or person responsible for its keeping shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—

- (a) a public building;
- (b) a theatre, or drive-in theatre;
- (c) a house of worship;
- (d) a shop or other building used by the public.

27. The owner of a dog or person responsible for its keeping shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:—

- (a) a sportsground; (b) an area set eside for public recreation.
- (b) an area set aside for public recreation;
- (c) a car park;
- (d) any land vested in or under the control of the Council within the townsite of Wyalkatchem including a road or street.

28. Any person who shall commit a breach of any by-law 26-27 (both inclusive) shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00). And in the case of a continuing breach not exceeding \$10.00 for each day that the breach is committed.

- (b) by inserting after subclause (2) the following-
 - (3) Subject to this clause each appointed member shall hold office for such period not exceeding 3 years as is specified in the instrument of his appointment and is eligible for reappointment.
 - (4) The Minister may grant leave of absence to an appointed member on such terms and conditions as the Minister determines.

(5) The Governor may terminate the appointment of an appointed member for inability, inefficiency or misbehaviour.

- (6) If an appointed member-
 - (a) is or becomes an undischarged bankrupt or person whose property is subject to an order or arrangement under the laws relating to bankruptcy;
 - (b) has his appointment terminated by the Governor, pursuant to subclause (5);

(c) is absent, except on leave duly granted by the Minister, from 3 consecutive meetings of the committee of which he has had notice; or

(d) resigns his office by written notice addressed to the Minister,

the office of the appointed member becomes vacant. ".

5. After clause 6 of the principal Order the following clause is inserted-

Clause 7 inserted. Proceedings of the committee.

"

7. (1) The committee shall hold its meetings at such place on such days and at such intervals as the committee shall from time to time determine.

(2) At any meeting of the committee-

- (a) a majority of the members constitute a quorum;
- (b) the Chairman shall preside and where he is absent from the meeting the members may appoint one of their number to preside at that meeting;
- (c) each member present is entitled to a deliberative vote; and
- (d) where the votes cast on any question are equally divided the Chairman or the presiding member in terms of paragraph (b), shall have a casting vote.

(3) The committee shall cause accurate minutes to be kept of the proceedings at its meetings.

(4) To the extent that it is not prescribed, the committee may determine its own procedure. ".



Court Trusts, Minor Trusts, Workers' Compensation, Agency Trusts, Deceased and Uncared-for Property (in the state of trusteeship or where considered necessary by the Public Trustee) and not otherwise prescribed, Incapable Patients' and Infirm Persons' Estates; at the rate of 14.5 per cent per annum as from 1 March 1986 and 15 per cent per annum as from 1 April 1986.

Deceased and Uncared-for Property (in course of administration or whilst under investigation) remains at the rate of 9.5 per cent per annum.
