IN these By-Laws, the Model By-Laws Series "A", as amended from time to time by the City of Bayswater by resolution, published in the *Government Gazette* of 21 July 1964, are referred to as "the principal By-laws".

The principal By-laws are amended by inserting after By-law 4B of Part I, the following By-law 4C:—

By-law 4C.

The owner of every house, public place, or private place, shall provide on the premises for the use of the occupants thereof, in accordance with the provisions of section 99 of the Act, the following:—

Every house used for human habitation shall be provided with:-

- A kitchen which conforms in every respect to the requirements of the Uniform Building By-Laws 49.2.
- 2. At least one (1) sink installed in the kitchen. Such sink shall be in accordance with AS1756 and unless otherwise approved, shall be provided with an intergral, fluted drainer, not less than 300 mm in length, extending on at least one side of the sink and graded to permit the surface water to drain into the sink.

A sink without a drainer may be fixed adjacent to a sink with a drainer, provided the distance between the two(2) sinks is not more than 50 mm, and both sinks are inserted in a bench top, in accordance with Sub-section 18.17.3.2 of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board By-laws.

 A cooking stove installed in accordance with Part 25 of the Uniform Building By-laws.

This By-law operates and has effect in the whole of the district of the City of Bayswater.
