WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act 1911 a local authority may make or adopt by-laws and may alter, amend or repeal any by-laws so made or adopted; now therefore the Shire of Busselton being a local authority within the meaning of the Act and, having adopted the Model By-laws described as Series "A" as reprinted in the *Government Gazette* 17 July 1963 doth hereby resolve and determine that the said adopted by-laws be amended as follows:—

Part I—General Sanitary Provision

- 1. By-law 29A is repealed.
- 2. Substitute a new By-law 29A to read as follows:-
 - (1) On and after 1 May 1986, an occupier of premises shall not keep or permit to be kept poultry on any premises occupied by him within the area described in sub-bylaw (2) of this by-law except under and in compliance with the following conditions:—
 - (a) The occupier has provided properly constructed enclosures and facilities for the keeping of poultry and the poultry are kept therein at all times.
 - (b) The poultry do not exceed 20 in number.
 - (c) Poultry are not to be kept within 12 metres of any dwelling-house.
 - (d) All enclosures within which poultry are kept are maintained in a clean condition.
 - (e) Roosters are not permitted to be kept in a residential area.
 - (2) This by-law operates and has effect in all residential zoned land within the Shire of Busselton.

HEALTH ACT 1911

Shire of West Pilbara

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act 1911 a Local Authority may make or adopt by-laws, and may alter, amend or repeal any by-law so made or adopted: Now, therefore the Shire of West Pilbara, being a Local Authority within the meaning of the Act and having adopted the Model By-laws described as Series "A" as reprinted, pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act 1954 in the *Government Gazette* on 17 July 1963 and as amended from time to time thereafter doth hereby resolve and determine that the said adopted by-laws shall be amended as follows:—

Part 1—General Sanitary Provisions

By-law 28 and the heading thereto are repealed and hereby replaced by a new heading and two new by-laws numbered 28A and 28B to read:—

Keeping of Horses, Cows, Sheep, Goats and Swine 28A Urban and Other Population Centres

Definition-

"Railway support facility" is a temporarily or permanently constructed establishment located near a railway line, which provides amenities for quartering, nourishing,

entertaining and generally assisting personnel (employees or contractors), engaged in the daily up-keep of that railway line.

- (a) Except as provided in sub-bylaw 1 (b) the keeping of horses, cows, sheep, goats or swine within any railway support facility or townsite is prohibited.
 - (b) Council may approve the keeping of a horse within a townsite for the following reasons:—
 - (i) Short term bona fide veterinary treatment or veterinary reasons.
 - (ii) For a period of up to 14 days before and 10 days after a bona fide race meeting conducted by a duly constituted horse racing club.
 - (c) Application in respect of sub-bylaw 1 (b) (i) and sub-bylaw 1 (b) (ii) shall be made in writing to Council and approvals so granted may contain conditions necessary to prevent the commission of a nuisance or public annoyance.
- 2. (a) Notwithstanding By-law 1 Council may permit the keeping of horses within a townsite provided:—
 - (i) Those horses are kept at and confined within an area of land owned, leased or rented by a bona fide horse or pony club for the purpose of conducting equestrian events:
 - (ii) Those horses are kept at and confined within an area of land owned, leased or rented by a person which the Council, has designated for rural pursuits or activities pursuant to the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended) from time to time.

28B Other

The occupier of any premises shall not permit any horse, cow, sheep, goat or swine to be kept in any paddock, yard or other place forming portion of such premises and the owner of any yard, paddock or other place shall not permit any horse, cow, sheep, goat or swine to be kept in any such yard, paddock, or place unless and until, due provision is made to prevent any such horse, cow, sheep, goat or swine from approaching within 15 metres of any dwelling, whatsoever and within 24 metres of any shop, factory, bakery or place where foof is manufactured stored or exposed for sale.

Auditor's Report

- . The accounts of the Shire of Wyndham-East Kimberley are prepared on basis of historical costs. In preparing its balance sheet it is not the policy of Council to:-
 - (a) calculate depreciation to write off the cost of each fixed asset over its estimated useful life;
 - (b) recognise all liabilities which exist at balance date; and
 - (c) recognise as assets loans receivable where repayments are due after balance date.
- The policy at (a) complies with the requirements of the Local Government Act and the Accounting Directions, although it is not in accordance with generally accepted accounting standards.
- 3. The policies at (b) and (c) do not comply with the Local Government Act, which requires an annual statement showing the assets and liabilities of the Council, nor does it comply with generally accepted accounting standards although it is consistent with previous years.
- 4. There is some doubt as to the legality of certain rates, including mining rates, which Council has raised, and until the situation is clarified the collection of such rates is doubtful. In addition there are other assets where recoverability is doubtful. In my opinion, a provision of \$335 000 for doubtful debts should be raised and charged to the municipal accumulation account to cover the possibility of non-recovery.

5. I have, with the assistance of my staff, audited the books of the Shire of Wyndham-East Kimberley for the year ended 30 June 1985. In my opinion, the balance sheet, statement of receipts and payments, adjustment account and municipal accumulation account are in agreement with the books and records of the Council, and, subject to my comments in paragraph 3, are prepared on a basis consistent with the Local Government Act and the Accounting Directions.
