UNDER section 10 (2) of the Shipping and Pilotage Act 1967, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the boundaries of the Port of Fremantle described in the Schedule to that Act to be varied in the manner set out in the Schedule to this Proclamation.

Schedule

The Port of Fremantle is varied—

- (a) by the addition of the following area to The Outer Harbour—

“ All that area bounded by a line starting at a point on the sea coast of the mainland in latitude 31 deg. 56 min. 22 sec. S. and extending northwesterly on a true bearing of 315 deg. to the intersection of latitude 31 deg. 56 min. S.; thence extending north northwesterly on a true bearing of 341 deg. to the intersection of latitude 31 deg. 46 min.; thence due west to intersect the meridian of longitude 115 deg. 30 min. E.; thence due south to intersect latitude 31 deg. 57 min. S.; thence due east to intersect the meridian of longitude 115 deg. 34 min. E.; thence due south to the present boundary; thence generally south, east and north along that boundary to the starting point on the sea coast of the mainland. ”;

- (b) by the excision of the following areas from The Outer Harbour—

- (i) All that area of land the bed and shores of the Port as delineated and bordered in red on Lands and Surveys Miscellaneous Plan 1536. Lands and Surveys Public Plans: Perth 2 000 BG. 34/Part 05.13 and 06.13, 06.12, 07.12 and 07.13;
- (ii) All that portion of land delineated and shown bordered in red on Lands and Surveys Miscellaneous Diagram Number 105. Lands and Surveys Public Plan: Perth 2 000 06.13;
- (iii) All that portion of reclaimed land delineated and shown bordered in red on Lands and Surveys Miscellaneous Plan Number 1527. Lands and Surveys Public Plans: Perth 2 000 06.13; Perth 2 000 06.14; Perth 2 000 16.15; and
- (iv) All that portion of land and seabed bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the High Water Mark of Cockburn Sound with the prolongation easterly of the southern boundary Cockburn Sound Location 2638, a point on a present eastern boundary of

Fremantle Port Authority Outer Harbour and extending westerly to and westerly, northwesterly and northerly along boundaries of that location to the southeastern corner of Location 2805; then westerly and generally northwesterly along boundaries of that location to its western corner; thence 352 deg. 38 min., 339.84 metres; thence north to the High Water Mark of Cockburn Sound, a point on a present northeastern boundary of Fremantle Port Authority Outer Harbour and thence generally southeasterly, generally northeasterly again generally southeasterly and generally southerly along that boundary to the starting point.

- (c) by redescribing the boundaries of the Inner Harbour to conform with the following—

FREMANTLE PORT AUTHORITY NOTICE 1986

GIVEN by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council under section 22.

Citation

1. This notice may be cited as the *Fremantle Port Authority Notice 1986*.

Alteration of port boundaries

2. The boundaries of the port of Fremantle described in the First Schedule to the *Fremantle Port Authority Act 1902*, as altered from time to time by notices published in the *Government Gazette**, are further altered by the excision from the Outer Harbour of all that portion of land and seabed referred to in the Schedule;

Schedule

All that portion of land and seabed bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the High Water Mark of Cockburn Sound with the prolongation easterly of the southern boundary Cockburn Sound Location 2638, a point on a present eastern boundary of Fremantle Port Authority Outer Harbour and extending westerly to and westerly, northwesterly and northerly along boundaries of that location to the southeastern corner of Location 2805; then westerly and generally northwesterly along boundaries of that location to its western corner; thence 352 degrees, 38 minutes, 339.84 metres; thence north to the High Water Mark of Cockburn Sound, a point on a present northeastern boundary of Fremantle Port Authority Outer Harbour and thence generally southeasterly, generally northeasterly again generally southeasterly and generally southerly along that boundary to the starting point.

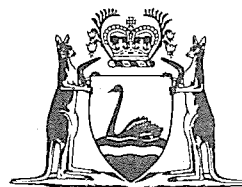
