- (b) revokes the power previously vested in Manager, Finance and Corporate Services; Accountant; Manager, Personnel and Management Services, and in any person temporarily appointed to perform the normal duties of the said Manager, Finance and Corporate Services; Accountant; Manager, Personnel and Management Services during their absence or incapacity, to make minor appointments in respect of the department specified in Column 1 of the Schedule hereto.

LAND TAX ASSESSMENT ACT 1976

Notice to all Owners of Land or Property in W.A.

A Land Tax Return for Land Owned at midnight on 30 June 1986 must be lodged no later than 31 July 1986.

Penalty for Non Compliance—10% Additional Tax

1. A return is not required where an owner has lodged a return in a previous year and his land holdings have since remained unchanged unless—

- (a) the usage of land has altered (e.g. a previously exempt residential property is not now used as the ordinary place of residence of all the owners); or
- (b) the land has since been subdivided.

2. The following classes of land should not be included in a return—

- (a) any single lot used solely or principally as the ordinary place of residence of all the owners;
- (b) land outside the metropolitan region which does not have a zoning or is zoned "rural" under a town planning scheme and is used solely or principally for a specified business of primary production;
- (c) land held as a mining tenement unless it is owned in fee simple;
- (d) land owned at 30 June 1985, which is still owned and meets the requirement for exemption or concession as set down in the Land Tax Assessment Act.

NOTE—Owners of land of any of the above four classes are not required to make application in order to obtain an exemption from land tax.

2. These regulations shall come into operation on the day on which sections 3 to 12 (inclusive) of the *Companies Amendment Act 1985* of the Commonwealth come into operation.

Definition

3. In these regulations, "the Act" means the *Companies (Application of Laws) Act 1981*.

Section 8 amended

" (1A) Where—

- (a) by virtue of section 265A of the *Companies (Western Australia) Code*, a company is to be deemed, for the purposes of that Code, to lodge a document with the Commission at a particular time; and
- (b) a fee would, if the company had lodged the document with the Commission at that time, have been payable to the Commissioner for Corporate Affairs under subsection (1) for or in respect of the lodgement,

then—

- (c) the company shall pay to the Commissioner for Corporate Affairs, for and on behalf of the State, a fee (in this subsection referred to as "the relevant fee") of an amount equal to the amount of the fee referred to in paragraph (b); and
- (d) as from that time, the relevant fee is a debt due to the State and may be recovered by the Commissioner for Corporate Affairs in a court of competent jurisdiction. "

PART III—STORAGE CHARGES

Cargo Storage and Storage Charges

No storage charge will be levied for the first week of storage. A storage charge will then be levied at the rate of \$1.55 per tonne per week, with a minimum charge of \$15.50 per week. If, after four weeks the cargo has not been removed the storage charge will then increase to \$3.10 per tonne per week, with a minimum charge of \$31.00 per week and this rate shall be applied thereafter. For the purpose of this regulation a fraction of a tonne shall be deemed to be a tonne and a part of a week shall be reckoned as one week: provided that, if the consignee or owner hands to the Port Authority an indemnity, in the form provided and approved by the Wharf Manager, relieving the Port Authority from all liability, the storage charges on goods for which goods shed accommodation is not provided, and which are not protected for the weather, may be reduced by one-half.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the Wharf Manager may remove or order the removal of all or any such goods, at any time after the time hereinbefore appointed for their removal by the consignee, and in the event of such goods being removed by or on the orders of the Wharf Manager the Port Authority shall not be responsible for any loss, damage or injury whatsoever or howsoever occasioned to the goods by reason of their being removed into the open.

(2) A licencing officer shall endorse a gear identification number on every recreational fishing licence issued specifying that the holder may—

(a) take rock lobster;

(b) use a set gill net or a hauling gill net.

(3) Where a recreational fishing licence is issued to—

(a) a student under the age of 16 years;

(b) a person receiving—

(i) under the *Social Security Act 1947* of the Commonwealth, an age, invalid or widows pension;

(ii) a pension under the *Coal Mine Workers (Pensions) Act 1943*;

- (iii) under the *Repatriation Act 1920* of the Commonwealth, a pension as a widow of a member of the forces, a service pension or the special rate of pension as a person who is totally and permanently incapacitated; or

(c) a person who is the wife or widow of a person referred to in paragraph (b), a fee shall not be payable.

(4) A person who is the holder of a professional fisherman's licence shall not hold a recreational fishing licence specifying that the holder may take rock lobster and a recreational fishing licence specifying that the holder may take rock lobster issued to a professional fisherman is not valid.



STATE ENERGY COMMISSION ACT 1979

STATE ENERGY COMMISSION (ELECTRICITY AND GAS CHARGES)
AMENDMENT BY-LAWS (No. 3) 1986

MADE by the State Energy Commission of Western Australia with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These by-laws may be cited as the *State Energy Commission (Electricity and Gas Charges) Amendment By-laws (No. 3) 1986*.

Commencement

2. These by-laws operate on and from 1 July 1986.

Principal by-laws

3. In these by-laws the *State Energy Commission (Electricity and Gas Charges) By-laws 1978** are referred to as the principal by-laws.

SOIL AND LAND CONSERVATION ACT 1945 SOIL AND LAND CONSERVATION (MURCHISON SOIL CONSERVATION DISTRICT) ORDER 1986

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council under sections 22 and 23 of the *Soil and Land Conservation Act 1945* and on the recommendation of the Minister for Agriculture.

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the *Soil and Land Conservation (Murchison Soil Conservation District) Order 1986*.

Interpretation

2. In this Order—

“appointed member” means a person appointed under clause 5 (1) (b), (c), (d) or (e) to be a member of the committee;

“committee” means the District Advisory Committee for the Murchison Soil Conservation District;

“member” means a member of the committee;

“the district” means the Murchison Soil Conservation District constituted by clause 3 of and the Schedule to this Order.

Murchison Soil Conservation District

3. All that portion of land comprising the whole of the Shire of Murchison as described and altered by notices in the *Government Gazette* set out in the Schedule to this Order, is hereby constituted as the Murchison Soil Conservation District.

Establishment of District Advisory Committee

4. Pursuant to section 23 (2) of the *Soil and Land Conservation Act 1945* there is hereby established for the district a district advisory committee to be known as the District Advisory Committee for the Murchison Soil Conservation District.

Constitution of Committee

5. (1) It is hereby determined, on the recommendation of the Minister, after consultation with the Shire of Murchison, that the committee shall comprise 10 members of whom—

- (a) one shall be the Commissioner for Soil Conservation or his nominee;
- (b) 2 shall be appointed by the Governor on the nomination of the Shire of Murchison;
- (c) one shall be appointed by the Governor, on the nomination of the Minister, to represent the Primary Industry Association;
- (d) 2 shall be appointed by the Governor on the nomination of the Minister to represent the Pastoralists and Graziers Association; and
- (e) 4 shall be appointed by the Governor, on the nomination of the Minister, and shall be persons actively engaged in land use in the district.

(2) The Primary Industry Association of Western Australia and the Pastoralists and Graziers Association of Western Australia shall each submit to the Minister a panel containing the names of persons willing to be appointed as members of the Committee and where such a panel is submitted in accordance with this Order—

- (a) one person whose name appears on the panel submitted by the Primary Industry Association of Western Australia shall be nominated for appointment;
- (b) 2 persons whose names appear on the panel submitted by the Pastoralists and Graziers Association of Western Australia shall be nominated for appointment.

(3) Subject to this clause each appointed member shall hold office for such period not exceeding 3 years as is specified in the instrument of his appointment and is eligible for reappointment.

(4) The Minister may grant leave of absence to an appointed member on such terms and conditions as the Minister determines.

(5) The Governor may terminate the appointment of an appointed member for inability, inefficiency or misbehaviour.

(6) If an appointed member—

- (a) is or becomes an undischarged bankrupt or person whose property is subject to an order or arrangement under the laws relating to bankruptcy;
- (b) has his appointment terminated by the Governor, pursuant to subclause (5);
- (c) is absent, except on leave duly granted by the Minister, from 3 consecutive meetings of the committee of which he has had notice; or
- (d) resigns his office by written notice addressed to the Minister,

the office of that appointed member becomes vacant.

Proceedings of the committee

6. (1) The committee shall hold its meetings at such place on such days and at such intervals as the committee shall from time to time determine.

(2) At any meeting of the committee—

- (a) a majority of the members constitute a quorum;
- (b) the Chairman shall preside and where he is absent from the meeting the members may appoint one of their number to preside at that meeting;
- (c) each member present is entitled to a deliberative vote; and
- (d) where the votes cast on any question are equally divided the Chairman or the presiding member in terms of paragraph (b), shall have a casting vote.

(3) The committee shall cause accurate minutes to be kept of the proceedings at its meetings.

(4) To the extent that it is not prescribed, the committee may determine its own procedure.

“Australian Standard 1716-1982” means the Australian Standard 1716-1982 Respiratory Protective Devices published by the Standards Association of Australia;

“Occupational Health Guide” means the Occupational Health Guide, Threshold Limit Values 1983-84 published by the National Health and Medical Research Council with permission from the American Conference of Governmental Industrial Hygienists. ”.

4. Regulation 8.5 of the principal regulations is amended in subregulation (1) by deleting “mine air” in paragraph (c) and substituting the following—

“ working places ”.

Reg. 8.7 amended

5. Regulation 8.7 of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) by deleting “in the course of mining”;

(b) by inserting after “endangered” the following—

“ or is likely to be endangered ”; and

(c) in paragraph (b)—

(i) by inserting before “supply” the following—

“ where it is not practicable to comply with the provisions of paragraph (a), ”;

(ii) by inserting after “dust” the following—

“ or atmospheric contaminant ”.

Abrasive Blasting Equipment

“ 8.7A. (1) The owner or Manager of a mine shall not cause or permit—

(a) abrasive blasting equipment to be operated in or about a mine without appliances to control or suppress the emission of dust and contaminants to the atmosphere; and

- (b) abrasive blasting to be carried out using material containing more than 10 per cent free silica.

(2) For the purpose of this regulation "free silica" shall have the same meaning as under regulation 8.10 (1). "

" or more frequently when required by the District Inspector "

Reg. 8.10 amended

8. Regulation 8.10 of the principal regulations is amended—

- (a) by repealing subregulation (2) and substituting the following subregulation—

" (2) The Manager shall ensure that the air in a working place shall be of a standard that shall conform with the Occupational Health Guide. ";

- (b) by repealing subregulation (4) and substituting the following subregulation—

" (4) Except where workmen are required to work in an irrespirable atmosphere in the course of maintenance, where it is found that a toxic gas concentration in the air in any working place exceeds the standard prescribed by subregulation (5)—

- (a) where that gas concentration exceeds the STEL or "C" value as defined in the Occupational Health Guide, no work shall be allowed or undertaken in that working place unless—

(i) such work is necessary for the purpose of remedying the situation; and

(ii) is carried out with protective equipment; and

- (b) where that gas concentration exceeds the standard but not the STEL or "C" value, tests shall be made over a period of not less than 30 minutes and a time weighted average of gas concentration shall be determined, but if that time weighted average exceeds the standard for that gas prescribed by subregulation (5) action shall be taken forthwith to remedy the situation. ";

- (c) by repealing subregulation (5) and substituting the following subregulations—

" (5) The air in a working place shall be of an acceptable standard if it contains not less than 20 per cent of oxygen by volume and not more than—

- (a) 5 000 parts per million of carbon dioxide;
- (b) 50 parts per million of carbon monoxide;
- (c) 10 parts per million of hydrogen sulphide;
- (d) 3 parts per million of nitrogen dioxide;
- (e) 2 parts per million of sulphur dioxide;
- (f) 5 parts per million of aldehydes (as formaldehyde);
- (g) 0.2 milligrammes of quartz, as respirable dust, per cubic metre of air;
- (h) 5 milligrammes of respirable dust per cubic metre of air;
- (i) 10 milligrammes of total dust per cubic metre of air;
- (j) per millilitre of air—
 - (i) 0.1 fibre crocidolite or amosite; or
 - (ii) 1.0 fibre of chrysotile, anthophyllite, actinolite, tremolite, or other type of asbestos, or fibrous materials in talc, as determined by the method laid down by the National Health and Medical Research Council Membrane Filter Method of Estimating Airborne Asbestos Dust;
- (k) 0.15 milligrammes of lead in total dust per cubic metre of air;
- (l) 5 milligrammes of manganese in total dust per cubic metre of air;
- (m) 6 milligrammes of total dust per cubic metre of air, where the dust originates from soapstone;
