Local Government Act 1960 ORDERS IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act 1960, it shall be lawful for the Governor on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the Government Gazette to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils mentioned in the schedule hereto have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for streets within the said Councils, be declared public streets: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

LOCAL COURTS ACT 1904

LOCAL COURT AMENDMENT RULES (No. 2) 1986

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

1. These rules may be cited as the Local Court Amendment Rules (No. 2) 1986.

Commencement

2. These rules shall take effect on the day that is one month after the day that these rules are published in the *Gazette*.

Appendix amended

- 3. The Appendix to the Local Court Rules 1961^* is amended in Part II in the table headed BAILIFF'S FEES—
 - (a) by deleting items 5 and 6, and substituting the following items—
 - (b) by deleting item 11. and substituting the following item—
 - 4 11. (1) Subject to subitem (2) the fee for service or execution of a process or document, other than a Bench Warrant, is inclusive of travelling expenses where that document or process is served or executed—
 - (a) by a bailiff attached to the court at Perth in any area within his bailiwick, being north of the Swan River and within a radius of 25 kilometres from the Perth General Post Office;
 - (aa) by a bailiff attached to the court at Armadale, in any area within his bailiwick being south of the Swan River and within a radius of 15 kilometres of the Perth General Post Office or within the localities of Thornlie, Maddington, Gosnells, Westfield, Kelmscott and Armadale;
 - (b) by a bailiff attached to the court at Fremantle in any area within his bailiwick being north of a line generally extending in an easterly direction along Phoenix Road, North Lake Road and South Street;
 - (c) by a bailiff attached to the court at Midland in any area within his bailiwick being within a radius of 12 kilometres of his office at Midland but excluding the localities of Upper Swan, Belhus, Millendon, Henley Brook, Herne Hill, Red Hill, Piesse Brook, Hackett's Gully and Pickering Brook;
 - (d) by a bailiff attached to the court at Rockingham in any area within his bailiwick but within a radius of 6 kilometres of his office at Rockingham or within the localities of Medina, Calista, Orelia and Parmelia;
 - (e) by a bailiff of any court, other than a bailiff referred to in paragraphs (a) to (d) and in any area within his bailiwick but within a radius of 6 kilometres of his office,

but, where the service or execution of a process by the respective bailiff is effected outside the area referred to in the paragraph applicable to him, the fee for service or execution is increased by 50 cents for every kilometre or part thereof (calculated one way only) that the address for service is outside the area prescribed by the relevant paragraph.

- (2) In addition to the fee referred to in subitem (1) the bailiff attached to the court at Albany, Bunbury or Geraldton shall receive the sum of \$1 for every process or document served or executed.
- (3) The fee for execution of a Bench Warrant is 50 cents per kilometre or part thereof calculated from the court to the address of the debtor. ".

FREMANTLE PORT AUTHORITY REGULATIONS 1971

Notice of Amended Water Ski Area and Speed Limit

Fremantle Port Authority, Fremantle, 22 August 1986.

ACTING pursuant to the powers conferred by Regulation 367B of the Fremantle Port Authority Regulations 1971 (as amended) the Fremantle Port Authority by this notice:—

- Defines and sets aside the following areas of the Outer Harbour of the Port of Fremantle for the purpose of water ski-ing and imposes as a condition of water ski-ing in any of the following areas of the Port that every person engaged therein shall conform with the rules of the Western Australian Water Ski Association for the time being in force.
 - (i) Ski-ing Areas—Definition:

Within the boundaries of an imaginary line ommencing at the southeasternmost corner of CSBP Jetty berth (Latitude 32°14.68′ South, Longitude 115°45.21′ East) and extending in a southwesterly direction on a true bearing of 221°30′ thence passing along the eastern side of Kwinana Grain Jetty the eastern side of Kwinana Grain Jetty berth to a point approximately 600 metres distance from the shoreline in position Latitude 32°16.23′ South, Longitude 115°43.56′ East, thence continuing on an easy curve to the right at a constant 600 metres distance from the shoreline and running parallel to the shoreline at 600 metres distance to a point 600 metres from the Garden Island Causeway groyne in position Latitude 32°16.29' South, Longitude 115°42.26' East, thence in a northerly direction parallel to and 600 metres distance from the eastern and 600 metres distance from the eastern side of the groyne until the line intersects the "Naval Waters" limiting boundary in position Latitude 32°14.54' South, Longitude 115°42.21' East, thence along the "Naval Waters" boundary in an approximately northeasterly direction to a point on the "Naval Waters" boundary in position Lati-"Naval Waters" boundary in position Latitude 32°13.95' South, Longitude 115°42.52' East. This point is on a line between Colpoys Point light beacon (Latitude 32°13.75' South, Longitude 115°41.79' East) and the southern extremity of CSBP Jetty berth (Latitude 32°14.67′ South, Longitude (Latitude 32°14.67′ South, Longitude 115°45.20′ East) and its intersection with the "Naval Waters" boundary. From this point, the ski-ing area's defined boundary continues in a southeasterly direction of a true bearing of 108°00′ to the southeast corner of CSRP Letty barth (Latitude 20°14.69′ South CSBP Jetty berth (Latitude 32°14.68' South, Longitude 115°45.21' East), this being the termination point and coinciding with the point of commencement as mentioned

(ii) Restricted Areas:

The corridor will be marked by PVC-type spar buoys.

Ski-ing is permitted within the corridor whilst travelling between the take-off area and the ski-ing area but all craft must keep to the starboard side of the thoroughfare and proceed with proper lookout and caution.

(iv) Special Area:

- (ii) a special products milk quota or special products milk quotas exceeding, in aggregate, 450 litres on a daily basis:
- (b) a family transfer (as determined by section 30A (2) (b)) where the application involves the whole or part of the interest of the applicant in the market milk quota or special products milk quota

provided-

approval would not result in the proposed transferee or the proposed transferee together with any person associated with the proposed transferee (as determined by the Authority in accordance with paragraph 2 below) holding quotas exceeding, in aggregate, the maxima in 1 (a) above, or

approval would not result in the proposed transfer or holding less than 245 litres on a daily basis of market milk quota

unless—

the circumstances are such that refusal of the application would, in the opinion of the Authority, cause undue hardship and the Authority is satisfied that approval of the application would not otherwise be inconsistent with these directions:

(c) a transfer through an exchange established by the Authority on approved terms, conditions and limitations

provided-

approval would not result in the proposed transferee or the proposed transferee together with any person associated with the proposed transferee (as determined by the Authority in accordance with paragraph 2 below) obtaining more than 100 litres on a daily basis of market milk quota or 30 litres on a daily basis of special products milk quota in a 12-month period from the date of purchase through the exchange, or quota holdings, in aggregate, exceeding the maxima in 1 (a) above

- 2. A person is associated with a proposed transferee if that person holds a market milk quota or a special products milk quota and is:
 - (a) a spouse of the proposed transferee;
 - (b) a partner of the proposed transferee;
 - a corporation of which the proposed transferee is an officer or director;
 - (d) where the proposed transferee is a corporation, an officer or director of the corporation;
 - (e) an officer or director of any corporation of which the proposed transferee is an officer or director;
 - (f) an employee or employer of the proposed transferee;
 - (g) an employee of a natural person of whom the proposed transferee is an employee;
 - (h) a corporation whose directors are accustomed or under an obligation whether formal or informal, to act in accordance with the directions, instructions or wishes of the proposed transferee or, where the person is a corporation, of the directors or management of that person;

- a corporation in accordance with the directions, instructions or wishes of which, or of the directors or management of which, the proposed transferee is accustomed or under an obligation, whether formal or informal, to act;

SOIL AND LAND CONSERVATION (NUNGARIN SOIL CONSERVATION DISTRICT) ORDER 1986

Citation

Nungarin Soil Conservation District

3. All that portion of land comprising the whole of the Shire of Nungarin as described and altered by notices in the *Government Gazette* set out in the Schedule to this Order, is hereby constituted as the Nungarin Soil Conservation District.

Establishment of District Advisory Committee

4. Pursuant to section 23 (2) of the Soil and Land Conservation Act 1945 there is hereby established for the district a district advisory committee to be known as the District Advisory Committee for the Nungarin Soil Conservation District.

Constitution of Committee

- 5. (1) It is hereby determined, on the recommendation of the Minister, after consultation with the Shire of Nungarin, that the committee shall comprise 9 members of whom—
 - (a) one shall be the Commissioner for Soil Conservation or his nominee;
 - (b) one shall be appointed by the Governor on the nomination of the Shire of Nungarin;
 - (c) 3 shall be appointed by the Governor, on the nomination of the Minister, to represent the Primary Industry Association; and
 - (d) 4 shall be appointed by the Governor, on the nomination of the Minister, and shall be persons actively engaged in land use in the district.
- (2) The Primary Industry Association of Western Australia shall submit to the Minister a panel containing the names of persons willing to be appointed as members of the Committee and where such a panel is submitted in accordance with this Order, 3 persons whose names appear on the panel submitted by the Primary Industry Association of Western Australia shall be nominated for appointment.
- (3) Subject to this clause each appointed member shall hold office for such period not exceeding 3 years as is specified in the instrument of his appointment and is eligible for reappointment.
- (4) The Minister may grant leave of absence to an appointed member on such terms and conditions as the Minister determines.
- (5) The Governor may terminate the appointment of an appointed member for inability, inefficiency or misbehaviour.
 - (6) If an appointed member-
 - (a) is or becomes an undischarged bankrupt or person whose property is subject to an order or arrangement under the laws relating to bankruptcy;
 - (b) has his appointment terminated by the Governor, pursuant to subclause (5);
 - (c) is absent, except on leave duly granted by the Minister, from 3 consecutive meetings of the committee of which he has had notice; or
 - (d) resigns his office by written notice addressed to the Minister,

the office of that appointed member becomes vacant.
