# Control of Vehicles (Off-road areas) Act 1978 PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA GORDON REID, Governor. [L.S.] By His Excellency Professor Gordon Reid, Companion of the Order of Australia, Governor of the State of Western Australia.

UNDER section 4 of the Control of Vehicles (Off-road areas) Act 1978, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby vary the proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on 5 October 1979 at pages 3079-3080 and varied from time to time thereafter by inserting in the Schedule, after Part 10, the following Part—

Part 11

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the westernmost northwestern corner of De Witt Location 96 and extending easterly along the westernmost northern boundary of that location to the southwestern corner of Location 99; thence northerly and easterly along boundaries of that location to the northernmost western boundary of Location 96; thence northerly to the northernmost northwestern corner of that location; thence easterly about 1 550 metres along the northernmost northern boundary of that location; thence 19 degrees 8 minutes, about 900 metres; thence east to the Low Water Mark of Nickol Bay; thence generally southeasterly and generally easterly along that mark to a northern boundary of De Witt Location 137 as shown on Land Administration Reserve Plan 166; thence generally easterly, generally southeasterly and generally southwesterly along boundaries of that location to a southeastern boundary of Karratha townsite; thence southwesterly, northwesterly, again southwesterly, again southwesterly, westerly, again southwesterly, again southwesterly, again southeasterly, again northwesterly and generally southeasterly along boundaries of that townsite to the centre line of Karratha road; thence generally southeasterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of North West Coastal Highway; thence generally westerly along that centre line to the prolongation southerly of an eastern boundary of the northern severance of Location 32; thence northerly to and generally northerly, generally northerly along

1. These rules may be cited as the Dental Board Amendment Rules 1986.

# Commencement

2. These rules shall come into operation on 1 January 1987.

# Principal rules

3. In these rules the Dental Board Rules 1973\* are referred to as the principal rules.

# Rules 2 and 3 repealed

4. Rules 2 and 3 of the principal rules are repealed.

# Rule 23 amended

- 5. (1) Rule 23 of the principal rules is amended-
  - (a) in subrule (1) by deleting "the permission in writing of the Board so to do" and substituting the following
    - a certificate in a form approved by the Board authorizing him to do so ";
  - (b) in subrule (2)—
    - (i) by deleting "the permission referred to in subrule (1) of this rule unless the dentist applying therefor" and substituting the following-
      - " a certificate to a dentist under subrule (1), unless that dentist ";
    - (ii) by deleting the fullstop at the end of paragraph (c), and substituting the following-
      - " ; and "; and
    - (iii) by inserting after paragraph (c) the following paragraph—
      - (d) has paid the relevant fee set out in the Second Schedule. "; and

- (c) in subrule (3)—
  - (i) by deleting "practises a specialty with the permission of the Board" and substituting the following—
    - " holds a certificate under subrule (1) authorizing him to practice a specialty ";

and

- (ii) by deleting "is registered" and substituting the following—
  - " holds a certificate authorizing him to practice "
- (2) Where, before the commencement of these rules, a dentist had the permission of the Board under rule 23 of the principal rules as in force before the commencement of these rules, then that permission shall be deemed to be a certificate granted under rule 23 of the principal rules as amended by these rules until after the expiration of one month from the commencement of these rules.

# Part VIII amended

- 6. Part VIII of the principal rules is amended by deleting the heading "PART VIII.— LICENCES." and substituting the following heading—  $\,$ 
  - " PART VIII—LICENCES, CERTIFICATES AND PERMITS ".

#### Rules 26A, 26B and 26C inserted

7. (1) After rule 26 of the principal rules the following rules are inserted—

#### Permit to use firm-name

- 26A. (1) A person or persons engaged in the business or practice of dentistry may apply to the Board, in the form approved by the Board, for a permit to use, or to continue to use, a firm-name.
- (2) An application under subrule (1) shall be accompanied by evidence that the firm-name is registered under the  $Business\ Names\ Act\ 1962$  in the name of the applicant or applicants.
  - (3) The Board may issue to an applicant, or applicants, under subrule (1) a permit—
    - (a) in the form of form 11 in the First Schedule; and
  - (b) on payment of the relevant fee set out in the Second Schedule.
- (4) A permit granted by the Board under this rule shall expire when the firm-name is no longer registered under the *Business Names Act 1962* in the name of the person or persons mentioned in the permit.

# Certificate of good standing

- $26B.\ \ \,$  (1) A dentist who is leaving Western Australia may apply in writing to the Board for a certificate of professional standing.
- (2) The Board may, on payment of the relevant fee set out in the Second Schedule, issue to an applicant under subrule (1) a certificate of professional standing—
  - (a) in a form approved by the Board; and
  - (b) containing details from the Register that relate to that dentist.

# Temporary registration as dentist

- 26C. The fee to be paid under section 44A of the Act for a certificate of temporary registration as a dentist, or renewal of that certificate, is the relevant fee set out in the Second Schedule. ".
- (2) Where, before the commencement of these rules, a dentist was authorized by the Board to use a firm-name under rule 27 (3) of the principal rules as in force before the commencement of these rules, then that authorization shall be deemed to be a permit granted under rule 26A of the principal rules as amended by these rules until after the expiration of one month from the commencement of these rules.

- 4 27. At a place where he practises his profession, a dentist may exhibit on a plate, notice or sign—
  - (a) his name;

  - (d) his hours of attendance;
  - (e) his telephone number:
  - (f) the description "Dentist" or "Dental Surgeon" or, where the dentist holds a certificate under rule 23, the description set out in that certificate. "



# HEALTH (PESTICIDES) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (No. 2) 1986

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council on the advice of the Pesticides Advisory Committee.

# Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the Health (Pesticides) Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1986.

# Principal regulations

2. In these regulations the Health (Pesticides) Regulations 1956\* are referred to as the principal regulations.

# Regulation 19 amended

- 3. Regulation 19 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting subregulation (1) and substituting the following subregulation—
  - (1) A person shall not sell, have in his possession or transport a pesticide unless that pesticide—
    - (a) is registered;
    - (b) conforms to the specifications and descriptions provided in relation to the pesticide in the form for application for registration of the pesticide, approved under these regulations;
    - (c) is labelled with a label which is identical to the label registered in respect of the pesticide; and
    - (d) is packaged as required under these regulations,
    - or the pesticide is sold, possessed or transported—
      - (e) with the permission in writing of the Executive Director, Public Health; and
      - (f) subject to any conditions on the sale, possession or transport of that pesticide imposed in writing by the Executive Director, Public Health. ".

# Regulation 20C amended

- 4. Regulation 20C of the principal regulations is amended by deleting "applied in accordance with the permission in writing of the Executive Director, Public Health" and substituting the following—
  - " applied-
    - (d) with the permission in writing of the Executive Director, Public Health; and
    - (e) subject to any conditions on the application of that pesticide imposed in writing by the Executive Director, Public Health. ".

2. In these regulations, the  $Health\ Act\ (School\ Dental\ Therapists)\ Regulations\ 1974^*$ , are referred to as the principal regulations.

# Regulation 5 repealed and a regulation substituted

- 5. Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is repealed and the following regulation is substituted—
  - 5. (1) A school dental therapist shall not commence treatment for any child unless—
    - (a) in the case of initial treatment-
      - (i) a medical history of the child and a consent for treatment is obtained from a parent or guardian of the child; and
      - (ii) the supervising dental officer, having read the medical history and the consent for treatment, has prescribed the necessary treatment; or
    - (b) in the case of subsequent treatment-
      - (i) an updated medical history of the child showing no change in the child's health status is obtained from a parent or guardian of the child; and
      - (ii) a supervising dental officer has examined the child within the preceding 4 years.
  - (2) The medical history, the consent for treatment and the updated medical history referred to in subregulation (1) shall be in a form approved by the Commissioner of Heath. ".

# PIGGERIES AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (No. 3) 1986

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

#### Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the Piggeries Amendment Regulations (No. 3) 1986.

#### Schedule amended

- 2. The Schedule to the Piggeries Regulations 1952\*, is amended under the heading "Parts of Road Districts" by inserting after the item "Three Springs" the following item—
  - " Victoria Plains—
    - (1) Bolgart—All that land contained within a circle having a radius of 2 kilometres described from the intersection of George Street with Albert Street in the townsite of Bolgart, with the exception of that portion of the land contained within the boundaries of a circle having a radius of 600 metres described from that intersection.
    - (2) Calingiri—All that land contained within a strip 2 kilometres wide surrounding and contiguous to the boundary of the townsite of Calingiri, with the exception of the whole of that townsite and, within 500 metres outside the boundary of that townsite.
    - (3) Mogumber—All that land contained within a strip 1500 metres wide surrounding and contiguous to the boundary of the townsite of Mogumber, with the exception of the whole of that townsite and within 500 metres outside the boundary of that townsite.
    - (4) Piawaning—All that land contained within a circle having a radius of one kilometre described from the intersection of Denton Street with the Waddington-Wongan Hills Road in the townsite of Piawaning with the exception of that portion of the land contained within the boundaries of a circle having a radius of 500 metres described from that intersection.
    - (5) Yerecoin—All that land contained within a strip 2 kilometres wide surrounding and contiguous to the boundary of the townsite of Yerecoin, with the exception of the whole of that townsite and within 500 metres outside the boundary of that townsite. ".

# POISONS AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (No. 10) 1986

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

# Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the Poisons Amendment Regulations (No. 10) 1986.

# Principal regulations

- 2. In these regulations the *Poisons Regulations 1965\** are referred to as the principal regulations.

# PART 1 Preliminary

1.2 Citation: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Shire of Waroona Town Planning Scheme No. 6—Clifton Hills Special Rural Scheme, hereinafter referred to as "The

Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the Government Gazette.

- 1.3 Objectives of the Scheme.
- 1.3.1 To identify by zoning an area of land that can be subdivided into lots suited to rural residential activity.
- 1.3.2 To specify land use and development controls which will ensure the creation of and maintenance of the ethos of a bushland village in the hills.
- 1.3.3 Making provision for other matters authorised by the enabling Act.
- 1.4 Responsible Authority: The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Waroona (hereinafter called "the Council").
  - 1.5 Contents of the Scheme: The Scheme comprises:
    - (a) The Scheme Text.
    - (b) The Land Use Map.
    - The Scheme Map.
    - (d) The Subdivision Guide Map.

The Scheme Text is divided into the following parts:

PART I Preliminary.
PART II Control of Development and Use of Land.

PART III General Provisions.

PART IV Administration.

- 1.6 Scheme Area: The Scheme applies to the area of land contained within the inner edge of the broken black line on the Scheme Map (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area").
- 1.7 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective meaning set out in Appendix D of the Town Planning Regulations, 1967 unless the context clearly requires otherwise or otherwise specified by this Scheme. "Rural Pursuit" means uses normally carried out in connection with agriculture but does not include any commercial agricultural use, any use which involves ground water consumption over the total allowance as determined by the Water Authority, piggeries, noxious uses or other uses considered by Council to be detrimental to health or the amenity of the area.

# PART 2 Control of Development and Use of Land

- 2.1 Classification into zones.
- 2.1.1 The Scheme creates one only zone: Special Rural Zone.
- 2.1.2 That zone is depicted on the Scheme Map in accordance with the legend thereon.
  - 2.2 Zoning and Development Table.
- 2.2.1 The Zoning and Development Table indicates, subject to the provisions of the Scheme, the uses permitted in the zone and the development standards that apply to various uses specified in the Table.
- 2.2.2 The symbols used in the cross references in the Zoning and Development Table have the following meanings:
  - P = A use that is permitted if it complies with
    - the relevant development standards contained in this Scheme Text and in the (a) the Zoning and Development Table.
    - (b) the conditions (if any) imposed by the Council in granting planning consent.
  - PS = A use that is not permitted unless special approval to it is given by Council after all landowners in the Scheme Area have been notified of the proposal and given 30 days to advise their views and it complies with:
    - (a) the relevant development contained in this Scheme Text and in the Zoning and Development Table.
    - (b) the conditions (if any) imposed by the Council in granting planning consent.
  - IP = A use that is not permitted unless it is incidental to the predominant use of the land as determined by the Council.
- 2.2.3 Where in the Zoning Table a particular use is mentioned it is deemed to be excluded from any other use class which by its more general terms might otherwise include such particular use.

#### POLICY STATEMENT

It is the intention of Council to ensure that the bushland character of the special rural village is maintained. Development proposals not specifically provided for or controlled by the Table will not be permitted if they would result in excessive clearing dispersed or large buildings fire risks, excessive use of ground water, or any other diminution of the health, safety and general amenity of the residents of the area.

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- 2.2.4 If the use of land for a particular purpose is not specifically mentioned on the Zoning Table and cannot reasonably be determined as falling within the interpretation of one of the use categories the Council may:
  - (a) determine that the use is not consistent with the objectives and purpose of the particular zone and is therefore not permitted, or
  - (b) determine by absolute majority that the proposed use may be consistent with the objectives and purpose of the zone and thereafter
  - (c) advise all landowners within the Scheme Area of the proposal and that they have 30 days to advise council of their views.
  - (d) after expiration of the above, Council shall consider and determine the application.
- 2.2.5 Subject to the provisions of the Scheme, a person shall not use land or erect or commence to erect a building or structure for a use or purpose specified in the Zoning and Development Table otherwise than in accordance with the relevant provisions of that Table.
  - 2.3 Landscape Protection Area.
- 2.3.1. Within the Scheme Area the following Area is created: Landscape Protection Area which is delineated on the Scheme Map according to the legend thereon.

2.3.2 In considering development of the Landscape Protection Area, Council shall take into account the need to protect the heavily vegetated escarpment from activity that would damage that vegetation. It is Council's intention to encourage landowners to maintain the Area in its natural state and to establish additional vegetation where possible.

# PART 3 General Provisions

- 3.1 Subdivision Guide Plan.
- 3.1.1 Subdivison within the Scheme area shall be generally in accordance with the Subdivision Guide Plan forming part of this Scheme.
- 3.1.2 Minor variations from the Subdivision Guide Plan may be recommended by the Council provided that such variation can be shown to be in accordance with the objectives and provisions of the scheme.
- 3.1.3 The variation provided for in 3.1.2 shall not include the creation of more lots than those shown on the Subdivision Guide Plan.
- 3.1.4 The Subdivision Guide Plan includes a Highway Protection Area within which:
  - (a) A building or advertising sign or hoarding shall not be erected.

- (b) Trees or other indigenous vegetation must not be felled or cleared except those which are dead, diseased or dying, or for the purpose of a firebreak required by a By-law.
- 3.2 Building Envelope: Notwithstanding the minimum boundary setbacks set down in the Zoning Development Table no person shall erect a building outside a building envelope shown on the Subdivision Guide Plan.
  - 3.3 Clearing Controls.
- 3.3.1 No indigenous vegetation or scrub or substantial vegetation shall be felled or removed except:—
  - (a) trees which are dead, diseased or dangerous;
  - (b) for the purpose of a firebreak inside all lot boundaries:
  - (c) for approved accessways into each lot;
  - (d) for building works approved by Council; and
  - (e) for an approved rural pursuit as defined by this Scheme.
- 3.3.2 Within the Landscape Protection Area, in addition to the requirements of clause 3.3.1, Council will encourage landowners to maintain the Area in its existing state and to introduce additional vegetation where possible. Moreover, as a condition of development within the Landscape Protection Area Council may require the planting and maintenance of native trees.
- 3.4 Essential Services: Council shall require that all buildings intended for residential use incorporate rainwater storage tanks of not less than 92 000 litres capacity.
  - 3.5 Fencing.
- 3.5.1 The minimum standard of fencing shall be 1.4m post and 4 strand wire or such similar materials as approval by Council but such materials such as asbestos, metal meeting or wooden pickets shall not be used.
- 3.5.2 Prior to the Town Planning Board granting final approval to the subdivision of whole or part of the Special rural Zoning each lot being subdivided shall have a boundary fence constructed.
- 3.5.3 Boundary fences shall be of a rural character and of a standard capable of confining livestock and must be constructed in accordance with Council By-Laws.
  - 3.6 Animal Stocking Rates.
- 3.6.1 The keeping of horses and other livestock shall be subject to determination by Council as to the appropriate capacity of a lot to absorb the effects of the livestock without environmental or landscape degradation. Council's determination is to accord with the recommendation of the Department of Agriculture and is to take into account the limitations placed on available ground water by the Water Authority of Western Australia.
- 3.6.2 Where in the opinion of Council excessive livestock numbers on a lot are causing environmental damage or nuisance, it may take appropriate action to eliminate or reduce the effects and recover the costs of such action from the registered proprietor of the lot.
- 3.6.3 Within the Landscape Protection Area the number and type of stock permitted shall be as determined by Council.
- 3.7 General Appearance of buildings: No person shall erect a building which by virtue of colour or type of materials, achitectural style, height or bulk, ornamental or general appearance has an exterior design which in the opinion of Council is out of character of the area.
- 3.8 Roads: Roads throughout the subdivision are to be sealed but not kerbed so that they blend with the contours and landscape particularly in areas which have been substantially cleared. The minimum road width permitted within the Scheme Area should be 20 metres and construction standards are to be to Council's satisfaction.
- 3.9 Battle-Axe Lots: Prior to the granting of final approval of subdivision of lots with battle-axe legs, the access leg is to be constructed to Council's satisfaction.

Where accessways occur singularly they are to be 4 metres wide with a 2.5 metre pavement. When accessways occur in pairs the combined width shall be 6 metres and a single 3 metre pavement constructed. Registered reciprocal rights of access to use the accessways will be required on Certificates of Title when accessways occur in pairs.

3.10 Temporary Accommodation: Council will only permit the occupation of temporary accommodation such as a caravan for the duration of a Building Licence issued for a dwelling on the lot.

- 3.11 Groundwater Management: The Scheme Area is located within the South West Coastal Ground Water Area in which extraction of ground water is controlled by the Water Authority of Western Australia. Prior to extraction of ground water, application shall be made to the Water Authority for licence to operate a private bore. Ground water extraction will be as determined by the Water Authority.
- 3.12 Scheme Awareness: Lot owners shall ensure that prospective purchasers of the lots in the Scheme Area will be advised of those provisions of the Scheme which relate to the use and management of the land.
  - 3.13 Fire Management.
- 3.13.1 Provision shall be made for an appropriate secondary water supply for bushfire purposes to the satisfaction of the Bushfires Board and the Council.
- 3.13.2 Fire breaks not less than two metres in width shall be maintained clear of all flammable material along the inside of all lot boundaries.
  - 3.14 Access to Coast Road Highway.
- 3.14.1 The Subdivision Guide Plan includes a 10 metre wide pedestrian accessway abutting the highway across which vehicle access is prohibited.

Access to the highway shall be limited to designated breaks in the pedestrian accessway.

# PART 4 Administration

- 4.1 Application for Planning Consent.
- 4.1.1 A person who desires to develop or use land for any purpose shall make application to the Council for planning consent to the development or use.

For the purposes of the Scheme the following works and uses are not development and it is not necessary for a person to make application for planning consent in respect thereof—

- (a) the maintenance, improvement or alteration of or to a building if the works—
  - (i) affect only the interior of the building; or
  - (ii) do not materially affect the external appearance of the building or increase the floor area thereof.
- (b) the use of a building or land within the curtilage of a dwelling house for a purpose incidental to the enjoyment of the dwelling house as such.
- 4.2 Council Decisions.
- 4.2.1 The Council may grant planning consent or its special approval with or without conditions or may refuse to grant its consent or approval to an application.
- 4.2.2 If the Council grants its planning consent or special approval subject to conditions and any of the conditions is not fulfilled or complied with the Council may revoke its consent or approval.
- 4.2.3 The Council may limit the time for which its planning consent or special approval remains valid.
  - 4.3 Powers of Council.
- 4.3.1 The Council in the conduct and management of the Scheme has, in addition to all other powers vested in it, the following powers:—
  - (a) by its officers, employees, agents or contractors, to enter and inspect any land or building within the Scheme Area at a reasonable time;
  - (b) to enter into agreements and arrangements with any of the owners of land within the Scheme Area: and
  - (c) to acquire land or buildings within the Scheme Area.
- 4.3.2 The Council may exercise the powers conferred by section 13 of the Act.
- 4.3.3 The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
  - 4.4 Offences and Penalties.
- 4.4.1 A person shall not use any land or any building or structure thereon contrary to or otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme.
- 4.4.2 If pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, planning consent or an approval has been granted by the Council with Conditions, a person who commits a breach of or fails to comply with any of those conditions or who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to the penalties prescribed by the Act.

4.5 Appeals: An applicant or owner of land in respect of which an application has been made has a right of appeal under Part V of the Act in pursuant to respect of the exercise of a discretionary power by Council under the Scheme.

# The Municipality of the Town of Albany

By-laws Relating to the Establishment, Operation and Maintenance of Motels No. 39

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the above mentioned Act and all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovenamed municipality hereby records having resolved on 26 August 1986 to revoke the By-laws Relating to the Establishment, Operation and Maintenance of Motels No. 39 as published in the *Government Gazette* dated 22 June 1984, and to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following by-laws:

- These by-laws may be cited as the Town of Albany By-laws Relating to the Establishment, Operation and Maintenance of Motels No. 39.
- 2. These by-laws shall apply to the whole of the Municipality of the Town of Albany.

  Interpretation
- 3. In these by-laws:
  - (a) "Motel" means any land and a building or buildings used or intended to be used to accommodate patrons including holidaymakers and travellers for temporary periods and in which special provision is made for the accommodation of patrons with motor vehicles.
  - (b) "Council" means the Council of the Town of Albany.
  - (c) "Approved form" means such form as Council may decide on from time to time as the application form for the registration of or the renewal of registration of premises as a motel.
  - (d) "Bed room" means, an open area capable of being used for sleeping and recreational purposes.

# Composition

- 4. A motel shall comprise:
  - (a) not less than 20 residential units;
  - (b) either a cafe, cafeteria or restaurant;
  - (c) adequate laundry facilities except when Council pursuant to By-law 9 resolves otherwise.

# Residential Unit

- 5. A residential unit of a motel shall have a floor area, exclusive of any patio, covered way or car park, of not less than 23 square metres and comprise not less than:
  - (a) a bed room;
  - (b) luggage storage space or rack;
  - (c) ablution and toilet unit; and,
  - (d) a proper complement of bedding and furniture in good order, repair and condition;
  - (e) not less than one three pin power socket.
- 6. A motel shall be constructed in accordance with the Uniform Building By-laws.
- 7. (1) An ablution shall include:
  - (a) a shower cubicle or bath, or both;
  - (b) a hand basin;
  - (c) an air lock or mechanical ventilation system approved by Council; and,
  - (d) a water closet.
  - (2) Hot and cold running water shall be provided to the shower cubicle or bath or both and hand basin of each ablution unit.

# Cooking Facilities

 Where in a motel a common kitchen is provided it shall comprise not less than one stove and one sink of a type or style and size approved by Council and have a floor area of not less than 9.3 square metres.

# Laundry

9. The common laundry in a motel shall have a floor area of not less than 4.6 square metres and comprise not less than one washing machine and one set of wash troughs of a type style and size approved by Council provided always that Council may not require the provision of a common laundry in a motel where adequate commercial laundry facilities are provided outside a motel.

# Other By-laws

- 10. Nothing in these by-laws shall relieve any person from his obligation to comply with any other regulation or by-law made pursuant to the provisions of the Local Government Act 1960 (as amended), the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended), and the Health Act 1911 (as amended).
- 11. No person shall establish or operate or hold himself out as having established or as operating a motel unless the premises are registered as a motel with the Council.
- 12. No premises shall be registered as a motel by the Council unless they comply with the provisions of these by-laws and any other legislation governing the establishment of motels
- 13. An application for registration of a motel shall be made to Council in the approved form or in the event that there is no approved form the application shall be in writing and signed by the applicant and include:
  - (a) the name and address of the registered proprietor of the land;
  - (b) the address and title particulars of the land;
  - (c) such plans and drawings as Council considers necessary to ensure that the provisions of these by-laws have been complied with; and,
  - (d) the name of the resident manager or person in charge of the motel.
- 14. The registration of or renewal of registration of any premises as a motel shall be valid until 30 June in each year.

- 15. Where premises have been registered as a Motel under these by-laws:
  - Council shall renew registration of the premises as a Motel on 1 July in each year provided always that during the preceding 12-month period there has been or are no changes to the particulars set out in the original application for renewal of registration of the premises as a Motel.
  - 2. In the event that during the preceding 12-month period there has been or are changes to the particulars set out in the original application for or any written application for renewal of registration of the premises as a Motel then in that event an Applicant may renew the registration of the premises as a Motel by lodging with the Council by no later than 30 June in each year an application in the approved form, or in the event that there is no approved form, the Application shall be in writing and signed by the Applicant advising of the change or changes to the said particulars.
  - 3. In the event that an Application for renewal of premises as a Motel is made pursuant to By-law 15 (2) hereof and is not lodged with the Council by 30 June then as from midnight on 30 June no person shall operate the premises as a Motel

#### Retrospectivity

16. The provisions of these By-laws relating to the minimum floor area of a residential unit, the number of residential units, a common laundry and the requirements of By-law 13 (c) shall not apply to premises that are or will be operated as a motel before the date that these by-laws were published in the Government Gazette.

#### Penalty

- 17. Any person who commits a breach of these by-laws is liable, on conviction, to a maximum penalty of \$500 and payment of any such penalty shall not relieve any person of his liability to rectify the breach of which he was convicted.
- 18. Any person who permits a breach of these by-laws to continue after their conviction pursuant to clause 17 and after a reasonable time to rectify the breach has elapsed, commits a further offence and is liable to a maximum fine of \$50 in respect of each day in which the offence so continues.

# LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960

Municipality of Town of Kwinana

By-law relating to Disabled Parking

IN pursuance of the power conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 22 October, 1986, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-law.

- 1. This by-law may be cited as the Town of Kwinana Disabled Parking By-law.
- 2. In this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires:-
- "Acrod Parking Sticker" refers to a sticker provided by Australia's Council of Disability, for the purpose of identifying vehicles driven by disabled persons. This sticker is to be attached in such a manner as to be visible from the front of the vehicle;
- "authorised officer" means a member of the Police Force, a Council Ranger, any officer of Council authorised by the Council and any other person authorised by the Council in writing to carry into effect the provisions of this by-law;
- "Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Kwinana;
- "park" means to permit a vehicle, whether attended or not, to remain stationary, except for the purpose of avoiding conflict with other traffic, of complying with provisions of any law or of immediately taking up or setting down persons or goods; and "parking" has a correlative meaning;
- "stand" in relation to a vehicle, means to stop the vehicle and permit it to remain stationary, except for the purpose of avoiding conflict with other traffic or of complying with the provisions of any law; and "standing" has a correlative meaning;
- "the Act" relates to the Local Government Act 1960.

- 3. The Council may on land which is owned, vested in or under the care, control or management of Council, set aside space for the purpose of disabled parking.
- 4. Where disabled parking space is set aside on private property by an owner, the Council may at the request of the owner enforce the provisions of this by-law.
- Spaces set aside for disabled parking shall be clearly identified by sign posts and/or pavement markings.
- 6. A person who parks or stands a vehicle which does not display a current Acrod parking sticker, in a parking space set aside for the purpose of disabled parking, commits a breach of this by-law.
- 7. An authorised officer, is authorised, if a breach of this by-law occurs, to affix to the vehicle a notice in the form specified in Schedule II.
- 8. A person who is not an authorised officer shall not in any way assume the duties of an authorised officer with respect to this by-law.
- $9.\ \mathrm{No}\ \mathrm{person}\ \mathrm{shall}\ \mathrm{in}\ \mathrm{any}\ \mathrm{way}\ \mathrm{obstruct}\ \mathrm{or}\ \mathrm{hinder}\ \mathrm{an}\ \mathrm{authorised}\ \mathrm{officer}\ \mathrm{in}\ \mathrm{the}\ \mathrm{execution}\ \mathrm{of}\ \mathrm{his}\ \mathrm{duty}.$
- 10. No person other than the driver of the vehicle shall remove from such vehicle any notice affixed thereto or left therein or thereon by an authorised officer.
- 11. No person shall, without the authority of the Council, mark, set up or exhibit any sign purporting to be or resembling a sign marked, set up or exhibited by the Council under the authority of this by-law.
- 12. A notice served under subsection (2) of section 669C of the Act in respect of a breach of this by-law shall be in or to the effect of Form 1 contained in Schedule II.
- 13. Subject to Clause 14 of this by-law, an infringement notice served under section 669D of the Act in respect of a breach of this by-law shall be in or to the effect of Form 2 contained in Schedule II.
- 14. An infringement notice served under subsection (2) of section 669D of the Act in respect of a breach of this by-law shall be in or to the effect of Form 3 contained in Schedule II.
- 15. A notice sent under subsection (5) of section 669D of the Act withdrawing an infringement notice served under that section in respect of a breach of this by-law shall be in or to the effect of Form 4 contained in Schedule II.
- 16. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of this by-law commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$80.
- 17. The amount appearing in Schedule I directly opposite an offence described in that Schedule is the modified penalty for that offence if dealt with under section 669D of the Act.
- 18. A penalty for an offence against this by-law (not being a modified penalty) may be recovered by the Council by taking proceedings against the alleged offender in a Court of Petty Sessions.
- 19. The Council shall cause adequate records to be kept of all infringement notices served and modified penalties received, under section 669D of the Act in respect of offences against this by-law.

The Municipality of the Shire of Port Hedland

By-laws Relating to Clearing of Land and Removal of Refuse, Rubbish and Disused Material

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Port Hedland hereby records having resolved on 28 August 1986 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

- 1. In these By-laws:-
  - "Council" means the Port Hedland Shire Council.
  - "District" means the townsite of the Shire of Port Hedland.
- 2. If there is:-
  - (a) on any vacant land within the district any trees, scrub, undergrowth or rubbish; or
  - (b) on any land within the district any refuse, rubbish or disused material, whether of the same kind or a different kind from that here specified,

which in the opinion of the Council is likely to effect adversely the value of adjoining property or the health, comfort or convenience of the inhabitants thereof, the Council may cause a notice under the hand of the Shire Clerk to be served on the owner or occupier of such land requiring him within the time specified in such notice, to clear the land of such trees, scrub, undergrowth or rubbish, or remove such refuse, rubbish or disused material from such land.

- Every owner or occupier of land upon whom a notice is served under by-law 2 of these by-laws shall comply with such notice within the time therein specified.
- 4. Where the owner or occupier does not clear the land or remove the refuse, rubbish or disused material as required by the notice given by the Council, the Council may, without payment or any compensation in respect thereof, clear or remove it and dispose of it at the expense of, and recover in a court of competent jurisdiction the amount of the expense, from the owner or occupier to whom the notice was given.
- 5. Any person who fails to comply with any notice served under by-law 2 of these by-laws commits an offence against these by-laws and on conviction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200) and a daily penalty not exceeding ten dollars (\$10) for each day on which the offence occurs after the expiry of the Notice.
- The Shire's by-laws relating to the Clearing of Land and Removal of Refuse, Rubbish and Disused Material published in the Government Gazette of Western Australia on 12 February 1971 are hereby revoked.



8. Elections to fill the offices of councillor in the Central, North and South Wards and the additional office of councillor in the Town Ward shall be held on 2 May 1987.
