HEALTH ACT 1911 (AS AMENDED)

Shire of Esperance

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act 1911 (as amended), a local authority may make or adopt by-laws and may alter amend or repeal any by-laws so made or adopted. Now, therefore, the Shire of Esperance being a local authority within the meaning of the Act and having adopted the Model By-laws described as Series "A" as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on 17 July 1963 doth hereby resolve and determine that the said adopted By-law shall be amended so far as Part I thereof is concerned by—

deleting By-law 19 (6) and inserting the following provision in its place:—

(6) The driver of a vehicle upon entry on any land set aside by the Council for the purpose of depositing refuse, garbage or rubbish shall make payment of a fee as per the fee schedule as shown and as amended from time to time by resolution of the Council:—

- (i) Per vehicle load of less than 2 tonnes mass deposited by identification card holders and not contractors—no charge.
- (ii) Per car, utility or trailer load up to 2 tonnes mass deposited by non card holders—\$2.00.
- (iii) Per vehicle load of more than 2 tonnes and less than 4 tonnes—\$4.00.
- (iv) Per vehicle load of more than 4 tonnes and less than 8 tonnes—\$8.00.
- (v) Per vehicle load of more than 8 tonnes—\$10.00.
- (vi) Per car body—\$10.00.
- (vii) Non-hazardous liquid wastes—\$3.00/200 litres.

"

FIRE BRIGADES (BUNBURY FIRE DISTRICT) ORDER 1987

1. This Order may be cited as the *Fire Brigades (Bunbury Fire District) Order 1987*.

Bunbury Fire District

2. The boundaries of the Bunbury Fire District are adjusted so that the boundaries are in accordance with the description set out in the Schedule.

Cancellation

3. The Order in Council made under section 5 (2) (d) of the *Fire Brigades Act 1942* and published in the *Gazette* on 21 September 1973 is cancelled.

BUNBURY FIRE DISTRICT

Schedule A

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the Low Water Mark of the Indian Ocean with a line in prolongation westerly of the southern boundary of Leschenault Location 24 and extending easterly to and easterly along that boundary and onwards to the Low Water Mark of the northwestern shore of Leschenault Estuary; thence generally southwesterly along that Low Water Mark to the Low Water Mark of the northern shore of The Cut; thence generally westerly along that Low Water Mark to the Low Water Mark of the Indian Ocean at the northwestern extremity of the northeastern breakwater of The Cut and thence generally southeasterly and generally northeasterly along that Low Water Mark to the starting point.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of a line in prolongation northwesterly of the northeastern boundary of Bunbury Lot 538 with the Low Water Mark of Koombana Bay and extending generally northeasterly and generally northwesterly along that Low Water Mark to the northwestern extremity of the southwestern breakwater of The Cut; thence generally southeasterly along the Low Water Mark of The Cut to the Low Water Mark of Leschenault Estuary; thence generally southwesterly and generally southeasterly along that Low Water Mark to a line in prolongation northwesterly of the southwestern boundary of Lot 1 of Location 26, as shown on Office of Titles Diagram 636; thence southeasterly to and southeasterly along that boundary to the northern corner of late Lot 7, as shown on Office of Titles Diagram 614; thence southwesterly along the northwestern boundary of that lot and southwesterly along the northwestern boundary of Wellington Location 5165 to the northern corner of Lot 8 of Leschenault Location 26, as shown on Office of Titles Diagram 614; thence southwesterly and southeasterly along boundaries of that lot to a northwestern side of Old Coast Road; thence, southwesterly along that side to a line in prolongation northwesterly of a northeastern side of Vittoria Road; thence southeasterly to and generally southeasterly along sides of that road to the northern side of Jubilee Road; thence easterly along that side to the Western side of Ince Road; thence southerly along that side to the northern boundary of Collie Agricultural Area Lot 46; thence westerly, southerly, easterly, again southerly and again easterly along boundaries of that lot to its southeastern corner, a point on a present northeastern boundary of Bunbury Townsite; thence southeasterly, southerly and generally southeasterly along boundaries of that townsite to the right bank of the Ferguson river; thence generally southwesterly downwards along that bank to the right bank of the Preston River; thence generally northwesterly downwards along that bank to a line

Auditors Report

1. The financial statements of the Shire of Derby/West Kimberley are prepared on the basis of historical cost. In preparing its balance sheet it is not the policy of the Council to:—

- (a) calculate depreciation to write off the cost of each fixed asset over its estimated useful life; and
- (b) recognise all assets and liabilities which exist at balance date.

2. The policy at (a) complies with the requirements of the Local Government Act and the Accounting Directions, although it is not in accordance with generally accepted accounting standards.

3. The policy at (b) does not comply with the Local Government Act, which requires an annual statement showing the assets and liabilities of the Council, nor does it comply with generally accepted accounting standards.

4. Council has spent approximately \$39 247 for which no budget item was raised in the 1985/86 budget. Such expenditure is unauthorised expenditure in accordance with the Local Government Act.

5. The Local Government Accounting Directions 1985 require Councils to prepare financial statements on the accrual basis of accounting. At 30 June 1986 the financial statements complied with these requirements with the exception of the matters referred to in paragraph 1 (b), although throughout the year ended on that date there were inconsistencies with those requirements.

6. I have, with the assistance of my staff, audited the books of the Shire of Derby/West Kimberley for the year ended 30 June 1986. In my opinion the financial statements, comprising schedules 1 to 5, 7 to 14, 16 and 20 to 25 are in agreement with the books and records of the Council, and, subject to my comments in paragraphs 3 to 5 are prepared on a basis consistent with the Local Government Act and the Accounting Directions.

Auditor's Report

1. We have audited the books and records of the Shire of Wongan-Ballidu in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards and the Local Government Audit Directions issued by the Minister for Local Government.

2. As at 1 July 1985, the Shire implemented a new computerised accounting system. In our opinion this system did not provide adequate controls to ensure that income and expenditure were correctly recorded in the Shire's books of account. Notwithstanding that we were satisfied that the underlying payments and receipts records had been adequately maintained, we believe that the lack of controls could have prevented us from detecting any relatively minor misclassifications of the income and expenditure shown in Schedules 2 to 16.

3. A difference of \$6 448.16 has been written off on page 5 of Schedule 1, being the amount of the difference shown in Schedule 2. A further difference of \$264.85 has been written off in Schedule 1. In our opinion these differences are an indirect consequence of the control inadequacies noted in paragraph 2 above.

4. Subject to the foregoing reservations, in our opinion the annual accounts have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Act 1960 and amendments thereto, and the Local Government Accounting Direction and give a true and fair view of:

- (a) The state of affairs of the Shire of Wongan-Ballidu as at 30 June, 1986;
- (b) The financial activity of the Shire of Wongan-Ballidu for the year ended 30 June, 1986;

and are in accordance with the books and records of the Shire of Wongan-Ballidu.
