STAMP AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1987

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Stamp Amendment Regulations 1987*.

Commencement

2. These regulations shall be deemed under section 22 of the *Stamp Amendment Act 1986* to have come into operation on 11 November 1986.

Regulation 8AA inserted

3. The *Stamp Regulations 1979** are amended by inserting after regulation 8A the following regulation—

Exemption under section 31B

" 8AA. For the purposes of section 31B (3), all transactions referred to in section 31B (1) (c) which would not be liable to duty if section 31B did not exist are exempted from the operation of subsections (1) and (2) of section 31B. "

FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS DUTY ACT 1983

FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS DUTY AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1987

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Financial Institutions Duty Amendment Regulations 1987*.

Regulation 5A inserted

2. After regulation 5 of the *Financial Institutions Duty Regulations 1984** the following regulation is inserted—

Prescription under section 10 (4) (r)

" 5A (1) In this regulation "PBS" means the Perth Building Society, a building society registered under the *Building Societies Act 1976*.

(2) There is prescribed under section 10 (4) (r) of the Act as a receipt to which the Act does not apply—

- (a) a receipt by PBS which is the consequence of the conversion of withdrawable share capital of PBS to a deposit with PBS; and
- (b) a receipt by a financial institution which is the consequence of a person becoming the holder of shares in the capital of that financial institution where—
 - (i) the financial institution is a company which was formed by the registration of PBS as a company under the *Companies (Western Australia) Code*; and
 - (ii) the person became the holder of those shares by reason only of his being the holder of shares in PBS immediately before that registration. ”.

DOG ACT 1976

The Municipality of the City of Bunbury

By-laws Relating to Dog Kennels and the Keeping of Dogs

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 28 July 1986 and 12 January 1987 to make and submit for confirmation of the Governor the following by-laws relating to Dog Kennels and the Keeping of Dogs.

The By-laws of the City of Bunbury Relating to Dog Kennels and the Keeping of Dogs published in the *Government Gazette* of 7 November 1972 are hereby repealed.

1. In this part of the following interpretation shall apply:—

“Applicant” shall mean a person who makes an application for an approved kennel establishment licence;

“Approved Kennel Establishment” shall mean the kennel or kennels and yards appurtenant thereto which are subject of an application for an approved kennel establishment licence as prescribed by Clause 3;

“Approved Kennel Establishment Licence” shall mean a licence granted by the Council to an Applicant pursuant to Clause 4;

“Licensee” shall mean a person who holds an approved kennel establishment licence.

2. (a) The occupier of premises shall not keep, or have, or permit, or suffer to be kept, or to remain thereon at any one time more than two dogs unless such premises are licensed as an approved kennel establishment.

(b) A person wishing to keep more than two dogs but not more than six dogs on any premises may seek exemption for those premises under section 26 (3) of the Dog Act.

3. (a) Any application for a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be submitted in writing in the form of the First Schedule of this by-law and shall be supported by evidence that due notice of the proposed application has been given to persons in the locality.

(b) Unless the Council otherwise decides, an applicant for a licence shall give notice by:—

(i) Advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the Municipality giving one month's notice of intention to apply.

(ii) Giving written notice to owners and occupiers of all adjoining properties advising of intention to apply.

(c) The application shall be submitted with three copies of a plan showing the specifications of the kennels and yards appurtenant thereto with the relationship of the kennels and yards to the boundaries of the lots and other information as the Council may require.

4. Subject to the provisions of the Dog Act the Council may grant or refuse an approved kennel establishment licence and if granting an approved kennel licence shall forthwith issue to the Applicant an approved kennel establishment licence in the form set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

5. On granting of the approved kennel establishment licence the approved kennel establishment shall be deemed to be licensed upon the Licensee causing to be paid to the Council an annual licence fee of twenty dollars (\$20).

6. No person shall erect a kennel establishment unless and until plans, specifications and a location plan showing the proposed site for such kennel establishment and of the yards appurtenant thereto have been approved by the Council.

7. The licensee or occupier of an approved kennel establishment shall ensure that the establishment complies with the following conditions:—

(a) Each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto.

(b) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 25 metres from any road reserve boundary.

(c) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than nine metres from any dwelling house, church, schoolroom, hall, shop or factory and shall in no circumstance be of less distance than seven metres from any boundary.

(d) Each kennel shall have walls constructed of concrete, brick, stone, timber, fibro-cement sheeting or such other materials as the Council shall approve.

(e) The roof shall be constructed of an impervious material.

(f) All untreated external surfaces of kennels shall be painted and kept painted with good quality paint unless Council grants an exemption from this clause.

(g) The lowest internal height shall be at least 1.8 metres from the floor.

(h) Each yard shall be securely fenced and kept securely fenced with a fence not less than 1.8 metres in height constructed of approved materials of galvanised iron, timber or galvanised steel link mesh.

(i) All gates shall be provided with proper catches or means of fastening.

(j) The upper surface of the floor of each kennel shall be set at least 100 mm above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a smooth surface. It shall have a fall of not less than 1 in 100 to a drain which shall be properly laid, ventilated and trapped. The floor shall have a coved upstand at the junction of the floor and the internal wall surface and in the case of a wooden framed building, the bottom plate shall rest on a coved concrete upstand 75 mm above the floor level and the internal wall sheeting shall finish a minimum of 25 mm below the bottom of the floor plate. All floor washings shall pass through the aforementioned drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the Health requirements of the Council.

- (k) The floor of any yard which is floored shall be constructed in the same manner as the floor of any kennel and as provided in the next proceeding paragraph.
- (l) For each dog kept therein every kennel shall have not less than 1.8 square metres of floor space and every yard not less than 2.25 square metres.
- (m) All kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels shall be maintained in a clean condition and cleansed and disinfected when so ordered by an officer of the Council.

8. The licensee or occupier of any premises of an approved kennel establishment shall not allow, permit or suffer any dog to be at large or roam outside the kennel and yard.

9. A licensee shall not keep or permit dogs to be kept on premises on which there is an approved kennel unless he ensures that a person in charge of the dogs either resides on such premises or within reasonably close proximity so as to enable such person to have control over the dogs.

10. The licensee shall maintain any area of those premises frequented or occupied by a dog in clean condition. Refuse, dog faeces and food wastes must be disposed of daily in an approved manner. Odours, fleas, flies and other vermin must be effectively controlled.

11. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of these by-laws shall, upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960

Municipality of the City of Stirling

By-laws Relating to Street Trading

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 2 September 1986 to make and submit for confirmation by the Government the following by-laws:

1. In these by-laws the By-laws of the City of Stirling published in the *Government Gazette* of 12 May 1971 and amended from time to time are referred to as "the principal by-laws".

2. The principal by-laws are amended by inserting after By-law 729 the following—

" 730. The provisions of By-laws 731 to 744 inclusive shall apply only to that portion of the district specified in the First Schedule hereto.

731. In By-laws 731 to 744 unless the context otherwise requires:—

"authorised officer" includes any ranger, poundkeeper, parking inspector, health surveyor, beach inspector, impounding officer, foreman, ordinance officer, collector, building inspector or zoning inspector employed by the Council and the Town Clerk or any other person appointed by the Council as an authorised officer for the purposes of these by-laws;

"public place" includes a street, way and place which the public are allowed to use, whether the street, way or place is or is not on private property;

"trading" means selling goods, wares, merchandise or services or offering goods, wares, merchandise or services for sale in a street or other public place and includes displaying goods, wares or merchandise for the purpose of offering them for sale, inviting offers for sale, soliciting orders or carrying out any other transaction therein, but does not include the setting up of a stall, or the conducting of business at a stall, under the authority of a licence issued under by-laws made under section 242 of the Act;

"licence" means a licence issued under By-law 736;

"street" includes a highway and a thoroughfare which the public are allowed to use and includes every part of the highway or thoroughfare, and other things including bridges and culverts, appurtenant to it.

732. By-laws 731 to 744 inclusive shall not apply to the selling or offering for sale of newspapers.

733. No person shall carry on trading in any street or public place unless that person—

(a) is acting in compliance with the requirements, terms and conditions of a current licence issued under by-law 736 and for which all fees and charges have been paid; and

(b) is the holder of a valid licence issued under by-law 736 or is an assistant specified in a valid licence.

734. An application for a licence shall be in writing and shall:

(a) include the full name and address of the applicant;

(b) specify the proposed number and the names and addresses of assistants to be engaged by the applicant in trading pursuant to the licence;

(c) specify the location for which the licence is sought;

(d) be accompanied by an accurate plan and description of any proposed stand, table, structure or vehicle which may be used for trading;

(e) specify the proposed days and hours of trading;

(f) specify the proposed goods, wares, merchandise or services in respect of which trading will be carried on.

735. The Council may refuse to issue a licence if:

(a) the applicant has committed a breach of by-law 733, 738, 739 or 740;

(b) the proposed activity or place of trading is in the opinion of Council undesirable;

(c) the proposed stand, table, structure or vehicle is in the opinion of Council unsuitable in any respect to the location for which the licence is sought;

(d) the needs of the district or the portion thereof for which the licence is sought are in the opinion of Council adequately catered for.

736. A licence shall be in the form of the Second Schedule and shall specify:

(a) the full name and address of the licensee;

(b) the dates of issue and the expiration of the licence;

(c) the place to which the licence applies;

(d) the number, type, form and construction as the case may be of any stand, table, structure or vehicle which may be used for trading;

(e) the particulars of the goods, wares, merchandise or services in respect of which trading may be carried on;

(f) the number and the full names and addresses of assistants (if any) who may be engaged at any one time in trading pursuant to the licence;

(g) the days and hours when trading may be carried on;

(h) any other requirements, terms or conditions that the Council may see fit to impose.

737 (a) The fee payable for the issue of licence is \$20.00;

(b) in addition to the licence fee payable under paragraph (a) of this clause a licensee shall before the issue of a licence pay the Council the charge specified in the third Schedule hereto.

- 738. No licensee or assistant specified in a licence shall:
 - (a) engage in or permit any trading in any goods, wares, merchandise or services other than those specified in the licence;
 - (b) cause or permit or suffer any nuisance to exist, arise or continue on or from the permitted place specified in the licence;
 - (c) deposit, place or store any goods, wares or merchandising on any street or other public place other than on the place to which the licence applies;
 - (d) create any noise or disturbance to the annoyance of nearby occupants or passers-by;
 - (e) obstruct the free passage of pedestrians on any footpath or roadway.
- 739. A licensee shall not:—
 - (a) in trading use or employ or permit to be used or employed at any one time more than the maximum number of assistants specified in the licence; or
 - (b) transfer, assign or otherwise dispose of his licence.
- 740. A licensee shall:—
 - (a) personally attend at the place specified in his licence at all times when trading is conducted on or from that place;
 - (b) keep the place and any stand, table, structure or vehicle specified in his licence in a clean and safe condition and in good repair;
 - (c) keep the place and any stand, table, structure or vehicle specified in his licence free from trade refuse and other refuse and rubbish;
 - (d) on demand produce his licence to any authorised officer of the Council or any police officer;
 - (e) remove his stand, table, structure or vehicle and all of his goods, wares, merchandise and signs from the place to which the licence applies and leave that place clean and vacant in all respects:—
 - (i) at the conclusion of the permitted hours of operation specified in his licence;
 - (ii) whenever not trading on the place to which the licence applies.
- 741. A licence is valid for the period between the date of issue and the date of expiration specified in the licence, which period shall not exceed twelve (12) months, or until its revocation.
- 742. The Council may revoke a licence if—
 - (a) the licensee or assistant specified in a licence commits an offence against by-laws 733, 738, 739 or 740; or
 - (b) the Council or a Crown agency, instrumentality or department requires access to the place to which a licence applies for the purpose of carrying out works on, over or under that place.
- 743. Where a licence is revoked the Council shall if requested provide the licensee with written reasons for the revocation and shall refund the charge having first deducted the charge applicable to the period from the issuing of the licence to the revocation thereof.
- 744. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of By-laws 733, 738, 739 or 740 commits an offence and is liable on conviction to:—
 - (a) a maximum penalty of One Thousand Dollars (\$1 000.00) or imprisonment for six (6) months;
 - (b) a maximum daily penalty during the breach of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) per day.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960

The Municipality of the City of Subiaco

By-law No. 49 Relating to Outdoor Eating Areas

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Local Government Act 1960 and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the City of Subiaco hereby records having resolved on 25 November 1986 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:

Interpretation

1. In these By-laws unless the context otherwise requires:
 - “Act” means the Local Government Act 1960 (as amended).
 - “By-law” means a by-law of these by-laws.
 - “Council” means the Council of the City of Subiaco.
 - “eating area” has the meaning given to it in and for the purposes of section 244AA of the Act.
 - “eating house” has the meaning given to it in and for the purposes of the Health Act 1911.
 - “Health Act” means the Health Act 1911 as amended and includes the Food Hygiene Regulations 1973 as amended made pursuant to the provisions of the Health Act.
 - “licence” means a licence issued by the Council under these by-laws to set up and conduct an eating area.
 - “licence plan” means a plan attached to and forming part of a licence depicting those areas of a street or public place within which an eating area may be set up and conducted.

“proprietor”

- (a) has the same meaning given to it in and for the purposes of Division 3 of Part V of the Health Act 1911 where the premises in question are registered as an eating house under that Act; or
- (b) means the holder of a licence granted under the Liquor Act 1970 where the premises in question are the subject of an Hotel licence, a limited Hotel licence or a Restaurant licence granted under that Act.

“public facility” means any structure, item or fitting whether in a street or public place that is the property of or has been provided by a Government Department, instrumentality of the Crown or the Council.

“Schedule” means a Schedule to these by-laws.

Application of By-laws

2. These by-laws do not apply to any eating area set up or conducted on a place which is on private property notwithstanding that the public are allowed to use that place.

Prohibitions

3. No person shall set up or conduct an eating area in a street or public place:
- (a) other than in a portion of a street or public place adjoining an eating house;
 - (b) unless the person is the proprietor of the eating house referred to in Sub-by-law (a) of this by-law;
 - (c) unless the person is the holder of a valid and current licence issued pursuant to these by-laws; and
 - (d) otherwise than in accordance with the licence plan and any conditions on the licence.

Application for licence

4. A proprietor of an eating house seeking the issue of a licence shall make application in the form prescribed in the Schedule 1 and shall forward the application to the Council together with:

- (a) the fee and the charge prescribed in Schedule 3;
- (b) a plan and specification of the proposed eating area on a scale of 1:50 showing:
 - (i) the location and dimensions of the proposed eating area and the means by which the eating areas is to be separated from the balance of the street or public place;
 - (ii) the position of all tables, chairs and other structures proposed to be provided in the eating area and which of such items, if any, are to be retained within the eating area at all times;
- (c) a plan and specification on a scale of 1:200 showing the eating area and all land and improvements thereon within thirty metres of the boundaries of the eating area including any public facility and parking restrictions;
- (d) a colour photograph or photographs of the tables, chairs and other structures to be set up in the eating area;
- (e) a written statement of the manner in which foodstuffs and other dining accessories are to be conveyed to and protected from contamination within the eating area;
- (f) written particulars of arrangements made in respect of public liability insurance of not less than one million dollars (\$1 000 000); and
- (g) any other information that the Council considers necessary in the circumstances of the case.

Council Consideration of an Application

5. The Council shall not be obliged to consider an application for a licence which is incomplete in relation to the requirements of By-law 4.

6. The Council may in respect of an application:

- (a) refuse the application; or
- (b) approve the application on such terms and conditions as it thinks fit.

7. Where the Council approves of an application it shall issue a licence in the form of Schedule 2, such licence expiring on the 30th day of June next, and shall cause to be attached to the licence plan which shall form part of the licence.

Renewal or Transfer of Licence

8.1 A proprietor who is the person named in a licence may:

- (a) in writing apply to the Council by the 1st day of June in each next year for the renewal of the licence and shall submit with the application for renewal the fee and the charge prescribed in Schedule 3;
- (b) at any time seek the Council's consent to alter any of the conditions of the licence and such application shall be treated as though it were an application for a licence to the extent of the alteration;
- (c) for the purpose of a function or event, seek in writing a minimum of fourteen (14) days beforehand, the Council's consent to the operation of the eating area on a day or time not permitted by the licence.

8.2 An application pursuant to By-law 8.1(c) shall:

- (a) be in writing;
- (b) state the nature of the function or event concerned and the additional day and time sought; and
- (c) be accompanied by the fee prescribed in Schedule 3.

8.3 Where it is proposed that the proprietor named in a licence be replaced by another person (such other person being herein referred to as “the proposed licensee”) the proprietor and the proposed licensee shall, prior to the date proposed for the replacement, make application in writing to the Council for the licence to be transferred to the proposed licensee and shall submit the licence to be transferred together with the written application to the Council

and the Council may in its discretion on payment of the fee prescribed in Schedule 3 transfer the licence by endorsement upon the licence and by the issue of consent in the form of Schedule 4.

8.4 Where the Council approves of the transfer of a licence for the remaining period of the licence it shall not be obliged to refund any part of the fee or charge paid by the former licensee.

Obligations of Proprietor

9. A proprietor who is the person named in a licence:
 - (a) shall ensure that the eating area is conducted at all times in accordance with the provisions of these By-laws;
 - (b) shall ensure that the eating area is kept in a clean and tidy condition at all times;
 - (c) shall maintain the chairs, tables and other structures set up in the eating area in good and serviceable condition at all times;
 - (d) shall be solely responsible for all and any costs associated with the removal, alteration, repair, reinstatement or reconstruction of the street, carriageway or footpath or any part thereof arising from the conduct of the eating area or persons therein. The Council may recoup from the proprietor such cost in a court of competent jurisdiction;
 - (e) shall be solely responsible for all rates and taxes levied upon the land occupied by the eating area;
 - (f) shall display the licence in a conspicuous place in the adjoining eating house and whenever requested by a Health Surveyor to do so shall produce to him the licence.

Offences and Penalties

10. A person who commits a breach of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a maximum penalty of:
 - (a) \$1 000.00 in the case of a breach of By-law 3(c); or
 - (b) \$500.00 in the case of a breach of any other by-law, and in addition in either case to a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$50.00 per day.

11. The Council may cancel a licence where the proprietor has been convicted of an offence against these by-laws, the Health Act or any other law relating to the setting up or conducting of eating areas or has transferred or assigned or attempted to transfer or assign the licence without the consent of the Council and shall not be obliged to refund any part of the fee or charge to the proprietor.

Delegation

12. The Council may, pursuant to section 157A of the Act, delegate to a specified officer the powers conferred on it by these by-laws.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960
The Municipality of the Shire of Harvey

By-laws Relating to the Management of the Dr Peter Topham Memorial Swimming Pool.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 14 October 1986, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.

1. In these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires the following terms shall have the meaning set against them hereunder respectively.

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Harvey.

“Attendant” means an officer, or employee of the Council duly authorised to perform duties in connection with the pool premises.

“Pool Manager” means the person for the time being employed by the Council to control and to manage the pool premises and includes his assistant or deputy.

“Pool Premises” means and includes the swimming pool for the time being under the control and management of the Council and all buildings, structures, fittings, fixtures, machinery, chattels, furniture and equipment forming part of such swimming pool or used in connection therewith.

“Shire Clerk” means the Shire Clerk of the Shire of Harvey.

“Adult” means any person over the age of 17 years who is not a full-time student.

“Child” means any person under the age of 17 years or attending a Senior High School.

2. (a) The pool shall be open for admission of the public during such hours and periods as the Council may from time to time by resolution determine.

(b) The pool premises, or any part thereof, may at any time at the discretion of the Pool Manager, subject to the written approval of the Shire Clerk endorsed by Council, be set aside for the use of certain persons to the exclusion of others.

3. The Council may refuse any person admission to the pool premises at any time and children under the age of five (5) years shall be refused admission unless accompanied by a responsible person over the age of seventeen (17) years.

4. Every person using the pool premises shall obey all reasonable directions of the Pool Manager or attendant with regard to such use.

5. The Pool Manager or attendant may temporarily suspend admission to, or remove from the pool premises, or any part thereof, all or any persons or person if, in his opinion, such action is necessary or desirable.

6. (a) Swimwear as approved by the Pool Manager shall be worn whilst persons are using the water areas of the pool premises. The Pool Manager shall have the power to vary this clause if in his opinion circumstances warrant.

(b) If a person shall appear in public and in the opinion of the Pool Manager or attendant, be indecently or insufficiently clad, the Pool Manager or attendant shall direct that person forthwith to resume his or her ordinary clothing and such person shall forthwith comply with that direction.

7. (a) It shall be the duty of the Pool Manager or attendant, who is hereby so empowered and directed, to refuse admission to or remove, or cause to be removed from the pool premises any person who, in the opinion of the Pool Manager or attendant:

- (i) is a child under the age of five (5) years and is unaccompanied by a responsible person over the age of seventeen (17) years; or
- (ii) commits a breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws; or
- (iii) is by his past, or present conduct within or about the pool premises undesirable; or
- (iv) is under, or apparently under, the influence of alcohol or drugs; or
- (v) is apparently suffering from any contagious infectious offensive disease or skin complaint.

(b) Any such person shall, upon the request of the Pool Manager or attendant to withdraw from the pool premises, quietly and peaceably, do so immediately.

8. Any person who has been refused admission to the pool premises or has been requested to leave the pool premises and who feels aggrieved by the action of the Pool Manager or an attendant, may appeal to the Council, by letter addressed to the Shire Clerk, against such action. The Council shall consider the objection and give such direction in the matter as it thinks fit. The right of appeal given by this by-law shall not imply any right of action for damages or other remedy against the Council or Pool Manager or an attendant arising out of such refusal of admission or direction to leave the pool premises.

9. A person shall not for profit, teach, coach or train any persons in the pool premises, unless with the prior written consent of the Council subject to such conditions as it thinks fit.

10. (a) A person, club organiser or association shall not conduct controlled swimming or diving events, carnivals or competitions without the prior written approval of the Council.

(b) The Council may grant such approval subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may, at any time, withdraw such consent.

(c) A person, club, association or organisation conducting any carnival at the pool premises shall be responsible for the conduct of the competitors and spectators during the carnival and shall prevent overcrowding and ensure that no damage is done to the buildings or fencing or any other portion of the pool premises and that these by-laws are observed by all competitors, officials and spectators attending the carnival.

11. All articles left in the pool premises and not claimed within a period of three (3) calendar months, shall be disposed of by the Council in any manner acceptable at common law.

12. (a) No person shall enter any portion of the pool premises set apart exclusively for the opposite sex. Nor shall any person, without the consent of the occupier, enter or attempt to enter any bathroom, or dressing box or other compartment which is already occupied.

(b) No person upon the pool premises shall, in any way, interfere with any other person therein or with any other person's use thereof nor throw or push, or attempt to throw or push any person into the swimming pool or throw any stones, sticks or any other matter or thing to the annoyance of any person using the pool premises.

(c) No person or group of persons shall play any ball games or take any action whatsoever which shall in any way limit the enjoyment of the users of the pool premises, provided that clothing therein contained shall apply to the playing of any games or aquatic sports organised and conducted on the pool premises by any club, association or organisation or other person at such time and in such manner as shall be approved by the Council.

(d) No person liable for the control of an animal shall cause or permit such animal to enter or remain in or about the pool premises.

13. No person shall:

- (a) Enter the pool premises without the authority of the Pool Manager or attendant, unless that person is an officer or employee of the Council in the course of his duties.
- (b) Obstruct the Pool Manager or attendant in carrying out their duties.
- (c) Enter or depart from any part of the pool premises except by means of the respective entrances or exits set apart for that purpose.
- (d) Dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume except in a dressing room enclosure provided for that purpose.
- (e) Appear in public unless properly attired in a costume of such nature as to preserve public decency and to cover the body so as to prevent indecent exposure of the person.
- (f) Enter or be in the pool premises while in an intoxicated condition induced by liquor and/or drugs.
- (g) Take into the pool premises, or have in his possession therein, any intoxicating liquor and/or drugs.
- (h) Use any soap in any part of the pool premises other than in the dressing rooms or shower recess.
- (i) Climb up or upon any roof, fence, wall or partition on the pool premises.

- (j) In any part of the pool premises behave in an unseemly, improper, disorderly, riotous or indecent manner; swear or use any indecent, obscene, offensive or abusive language or gamble or misconduct himself or herself.
 - (k) Deposit any filth or rubbish in any part of the pool premises except in places set aside for that purpose.
 - (l) Smoke, consume foodstuffs or drinks in any specific area in which smoking or consumption is prohibited by notice.
 - (m) Wastefully use the water or leave any taps dripping in the dressing rooms or elsewhere in the pool premises.
 - (n) Spit or expectorate in the swimming pool or on any part of the pool premises or in any way commit any nuisance on or in any part of such premises.
 - (o) Use any substance or preparation whereby the water of the swimming pool may become discoloured or rendered turbid or otherwise unfit for the proper use of bathers.
 - (p) Foul or pollute water in any shower, bath or in the swimming pool; or soil, damage, injure, destroy, use improperly, disfigure or write in or upon any dressing room, closet, or compartment, or other part of the pool premises or any furniture or other article of equipment therein.
 - (q) Damage, improperly use or interfere with any tap, valve, locker or other fitting or appliance in or about the pool premises.
 - (r) Smoke unless permitted by the Pool Manager, in any building, dressing room or other compartment in the pool premises.
 - (s) Whilst suffering from any contagious, infectious or cutaneous disease, or whilst in an unclean condition, enter or use or attempt to enter or use the swimming pool or the pool premises or any part thereof.
 - (t) Soil or defile or damage any towel or bathing costume.
 - (u) Break, injure, damage or destroy any life saving or other equipment or structure or any locker key or any property of the Council.
 - (v) Take glass containers of any description into the pool premises.
 - (w) Use any equipment or structure provided in the pool premises for any purpose other than that purpose for which such equipment or structure has been provided.
14. Any person offending against any of the provisions of these by-laws shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$200.00

Kalgoorlie College Statute No. 10

PURSUANT to section 26 (1) of the Colleges Act 1978, the Council of Kalgoorlie College hereby makes the Statute set out in the Schedule hereto and authorizes the affixing of the seal thereto.

Schedule

Statute No. 10

Student Association

1. Definitions: In this Statute, unless the context otherwise states:—

"Act" means the Colleges Act 1978, as amended.

"Association" means Kalgoorlie College Student Association established pursuant to section 2 of this Statute.

"Association By-law" means a by-law made by the Association under the authority of and in accordance with section 8 of this Statute.

"Chief Executive Officer" means the Director of the College.

"College" means Kalgoorlie College as established under the Colleges Act 1978, as amended.

"Council" means the council of the College.

"Executive" means the Executive of the Association referred to in section 7 of this Statute.

"Member" means a member of the Association.

"Section" means any section in this Statute.

2. Establishment: In accordance with section 44 (1) of the Act there is hereby established and shall be maintained in the College an organized Association of Enrolled Students to be known as "Kalgoorlie College Student Association".

3. Objects: The objects of the Association shall be:—

- (i) to further the common interests and encourage communication of the enrolled students;
- (ii) to represent enrolled students whenever such representation is necessary or desirable, and to provide the recognized means of communication between the student body and the Council;
- (iii) to co-operate or affiliate with any body or organization having kindred aims;
- (iv) to provide extra-curricular activities and amenities or facilities for the general well-being of the enrolled students.

4. Powers: Subject to the Act, and the Statutes and by-laws of the College, the Association shall have the power:—

- (i) to expend and invest moneys;
- (ii) to operate banking accounts;
- (iii) to transact any financial business as may be necessary to fulfil the objects of the Association;
- (iv) to purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any real or personal property and to sell, let, mortgage or otherwise dispose of it;
- (v) to borrow, raise or secure payment of any money for any of the objects of the Association from time to time and in particular by mortgaging or charging the property of the Association or any part thereof;
- (vi) to engage and dismiss employees;
- (vii) to hold licences under any legislation for the time being in force;
- (viii) to impose fines or other penalties, including suspensions or withdrawal of privileges, upon Members of the Association, for breaches of the provisions of this Statute. However the limit of all fines or suspensions shall not exceed the maximum penalty which the Council may, by Statute, impose from time to time;
- (ix) generally, to act in all other matters authorized by this Statute, or which are necessary or convenient for giving effect to this Statute.

5. Membership.

- (1) Subject to the Act and this section, all enrolled students of the College except those stated in subsections (3), (4), and (5) shall be members of the Association.
- (2) There shall be three classes of membership of the Association:—
 - (a) Full time membership for students whose enrolment is classified as full time by the College.
 - (b) Part time membership for students whose enrolment is classified as part time by the College.
 - (c) Leisure course membership for students who are only enrolled in such a course by the College, and whose enrolment is classified as leisure by the College.
- (3) The following persons shall not be eligible for any class of membership:—
 - (a) Enrolled students of the College who are members of the full-time Academic Staff of the College.
 - (b) Persons who are not enrolled students of the College.
 - (c) Such other persons or classes of persons as the Council declares by resolution to be ineligible for membership of the Student Association.

(4) An enrolled student who objects on the grounds of conscientious belief to being a member of the Association and who—

- (a) declares by writing to the Chief Executive Officer of the College that he/she has a conscientious objection to being a member of the Student Association and notifies the Student Association accordingly; and
- (b) at the time of enrolment pays to the Student Association or to a fund or body established for a charitable purpose nominated either by the Student Association, or if the student so elects, by the student him/herself an amount equivalent to the subscription which would be payable if the student were a member of the Student Association,

is exempt from membership of the Association.

6. Subscriptions.

- (1) Members of the Association shall pay to the Association such subscriptions as are from time to time determined by the Executive and approved by the Council.
- (2) Different subscriptions payable to the Association may be determined and approved under subsection (1) in respect of different classes of membership or different classes of students as prescribed by Association By-laws.
- (3) A student enrolled at another tertiary institution in Western Australia and who has paid a subscription to another Student Association may, upon application to the Association Executive and subject to Association By-laws be exempted from payment of the Association subscription.
- (4) The College is authorized to collect, on behalf of the Association, the annual subscription from members of the Association, and to transmit such subscriptions to the Treasurer of the Association.
- (5) The College is authorized to refund, on behalf of the Association, the subscription, in whole or part, to any member of the Association who withdraws or changes enrolment status.
- (6) Every member of the Association shall pay the applicable Association subscription to the Association (in the manner prescribed by Association By-law) at the time of enrolment at the College.

7. Executive.

- (1) The Association shall be administered by an Executive comprising the President, Secretary, Treasurer and three ordinary members.
- (2) The eligibility for election, manner of election, retirement, removal and replacement and rights and duties of the Executive of the Association shall be prescribed by Association By-laws.
- (3) A person shall not be a member of the Executive unless that person is a member of the Association.
- (4) The members of Executive shall be elected annually in a manner prescribed by Association By-laws.

8. Association By-laws.

- (1) The Association may in the manner prescribed in subsection 2 of this section but subject in every case to the provisions of subsection 3 of this section, make, alter and repeal by-laws to provide:—
 - (a) for the internal administration, the calling of meetings and referenda, organization, finances and functions of the Association,
 - (b) for the interpretation of by-laws and rules,
 - (c) for the implementation of the objects and powers of the Association and the other provisions of this Statute,
 - (d) for any other matter required by this Statute to be prescribed by by-laws.
- (2) The Association may make, alter or repeal by-laws either in general meeting or by referendum of the members or both, as the Executive may decide in relation to each proposal but if the Executive decide to refer a matter to a general meeting, the general meeting may require the proposal to be decided by referendum.
- (3) A by-law or the alteration or repeal of a by-law (duly passed by the Association and confirmed in accordance with the preceding provisions of this

section) shall be submitted to the Council for approval and shall take effect on the day following the day upon which approved by the Council, or such later date as may be specified in the by-law.

9. Common Seal: The Executive shall provide for the safe custody of the original seal of the Association which shall not be used except with the authority of a resolution of the Executive acting in accordance with the Association By-laws and then only in the presence of two members of the Executive both of whom shall sign every instrument to which the seal is affixed.

10. Accounts and Records.

- (1) The Executive shall provide for the proper keeping of accounting records in connection with all the financial transactions of the Association.
- (2) The Executive shall as soon as practical after 31 December and not later than 30 April in each and every year prepare and present to a general meeting of members of the Association, a report of the operations of the Association during the immediately preceding year, together with audited accounts of income and expenditure of the Association at that time.
- (3) For the purpose of subsection (2), the Executive shall ensure that the Association accounting records are audited at least once in each year, by the College's Manager-Finance, or by another auditor nominated by the Executive from time to time.
- (4) A copy of the audited annual balance sheet and statement of income and expenditure of the Association shall be transmitted to the Council each year, within 14 days of the adoption of the reports.

11. Transitional Provisions.

- (1) Notwithstanding the other provisions of this Statute, the Council shall make rules with respect to:—
 - (a) the first election of the Executive,
 - (b) meetings of the Executive,
 - (c) general meetings and referenda of the Association,
 - (d) financial provisions of the Association.
- (2) The rules established by Council shall cease to exist after the election of the Executive to the Association and the adoption of by-laws of the Association relating to the matters referred to in section 11 (1) (a)-(d) of this Statute.

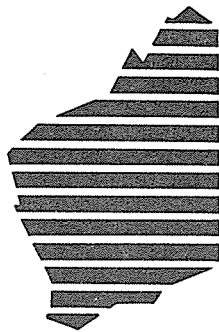
