Notice of Amendment

NOTICE is hereby given that at a meeting of the committee of the Western Australian Trotting Association held at Gloucester Park, East Perth on 14 April 1987 it was resolved by an absolute majority of the committee that the Rules of Trotting be amended as follows:—

1. By inclusion after Rule 359 of the following 359A:—

(i) The controlling body may prescribe a figure which it deems to be the upper limit of the quantity of any substance being a drug within the meaning of the rules which can be produced naturally by a horse and which may be found in such horse without administration of such substance or any other substance.

(ii) If at any time on analysis of saliva, urine or blood a horse is found to have a quantity of substance above the figure prescribed in sub-rule (i) above such finding shall be prima facie evidence of administration of the substance contrary to Rule 364.

(iii) If the stewards or any tribunal hearing the said proceedings finds that there has been no administration of the substance the horse shall be disqualified from racing for life.

(iv) The controlling body may from time to time publish a schedule of substances and maximum levels for the purpose of sub-rule 359A (i).

2. That Rule 360 be amended by inclusion of the following paragraph after the paragraph ending with the words "may not take a blood sample":—

For the purpose of this rule, the controlling body, the stewards or a person authorised by the controlling body may instruct a duly qualified veterinary surgeon or his deputy to take and retain a referee sample of the blood and urine and/or other samples taken from any horse. Such referee sample to be retained by the controlling body, the stewards or a person authorised by the controlling body until a request is made by the owner and/or trainer of the horse from which the sample is taken or the controlling body that the referee sample is to be submitted for analysis.

3. By inclusion after sub-rule (iii) of Rule 365A (a) the following sub-rule:—

(iv) that the owner and/or trainer may request the controlling body to submit a referee sample for analysis to confirm the analyst's report on the first sample;

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

The Municipality of the Shire of Northampton

By-laws Relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality records having resolved on the 17th day of October 1986 to revoke its Bush Fire Brigades By-laws adopted in March 1941 and to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.

Establishment of Brigade

1. (a) By resolution, the Council may establish, maintain and equip a bush fire brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954 and regulations thereunder, the brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the brigade. Details of the brigade and its officers shall be entered in the register of Bush Fire Brigades held by the Council.

(b) A bush fire brigade may be established for the whole of the Shire or for any specified area thereof.

Appointment of Officers

2. The Council shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the brigade.

3. Members of the Brigade shall elect a person to act as Secretary to the Brigade and shall inform the Council accordingly.

4. The Council may appoint an equipment officer who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Council for the purposes of the brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain.

Power and Duties of Officers

5. The powers and duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954 and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations.

Membership of Brigade

- 6. (1) the membership of a bush fire brigade may consist of the following:
 - (a) subscribing members; and
 - (b) firefighting members;
- (2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who being interested in forwarding the objects of the brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the brigade at the following rates:
 - (i) owner or occupier of land within the brigade area—minimum subscription of \$2.00;
 - (ii) other persons—minimum subscription of \$2.00.
- (3) Fire fighting members shall be those persons, being able bodied persons over 15 years who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon; and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these By-laws.
- (4) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable by firefighting members and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Council.
- (5) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a firefighting member.

Finance

7. The expenditure incurred by the Council in the purchase of equipment payment for services and generally for the purpose of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Council and records of such expenditure shall be maintained in accordance with Municipal audit requirements.

8. Meetings will be held as necessary.

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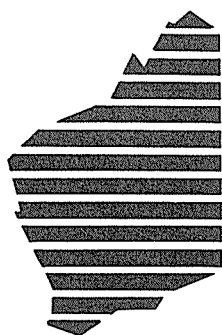
