## FISHERIES AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (No. 4) 1987

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

**Citation**

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Fisheries Amendment Regulations (No. 4) 1987*.

**Principal regulations**

2. In these regulations the *Fisheries Regulations 1938\** are referred to as the principal regulations.

**Regulation 3A amended**

3. Regulation 3A of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) in subregulation (3) by deleting "a fee shall not be payable" and substituting the following—

" 50% of the fee shall be payable "; and

(b) by repealing subregulation (4) and substituting the following subregulation—

" (4) A person who is the holder of a professional fisherman's licence shall not hold a recreational fishing licence for any activity other than the taking of marron and a recreational fishing licence specifying that the holder may take rock lobster or use a set gill net or a hauling gill net issued to a professional fisherman is not valid. "

**Regulation 3AB amended**

4. Regulation 3AB of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) in subregulation (4) by deleting "Penalty: Five hundred dollars.";

(b) by inserting after subregulation (4) the following subregulation—

" (5) The penalty for an offence under this regulation—

(a) which involved rock lobster, marron or abalone is—

(i) for a first offence \$750;

(ii) for a second or subsequent offence \$1 000;

(b) in relation to any fish other than rock lobster, marron or abalone is \$500. "; and

(c) in the Schedule, by inserting in PART A in the appropriate alphabetical position, the following—

" Cockle (Ark Shell) (*Anadara trapezia*) . . . 9 litres "

**Regulation 8 amended**

5. Regulation 8 of the principal regulations is amended in subregulation (1) (ii) (d), by deleting "undersized fish" and substituting the following—

" them "

**Regulation 12EA inserted**

6. After regulation 12E of the principal regulations the following regulation is inserted—

" 12EA. (1) A person, other than a person who is the holder of a professional fisherman's licence, shall not, in the waters between 23°30' South latitude and 26°30' South latitude or in the waters of Shark Bay lying south of a line drawn from Cape Inscription on Dirk Hartog Island due east to the mainland—

(a) take or attempt to take snapper (*genus Chrysophrys*) by means other than one hand-line to which not more than 3 hooks are attached;

(b) transport at sea fish other than whole fish.

(2) Notwithstanding subregulation (1) (b)—

(a) fish may be gilled and gutted at sea; and

(b) mackerel may be processed at sea by cutting up if the skin is left attached to the fish for identification.

(3) In this regulation "mackerel" means Narrow-barred spanish mackerel (*Scomberomorus commerson*), Broad-barred (or grey) spanish mackerel (*Indocybium semi-fasciatum*), Australian spotted mackerel (*Scomberomorus munroi*), School (or Queensland) spanish mackerel (*Scomberomorus queenslandicus*), Wahoo mackerel (*Acanthocybium solandri*) or Shark mackerel (*Granulatorcynus bicarinotus*). "

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

The Municipality of the Shire of Northampton

By-laws Relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality records having resolved on the 17th day of October 1986 to revoke its Bush Fire Brigades By-laws adopted in March 1941 and to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.

Establishment of Brigade

- 1. (a) By resolution, the Council may establish, maintain and equip a bush fire brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954 and regulations thereunder, the brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the brigade. Details of the brigade and its officers shall be entered in the register of Bush Fire Brigades held by the Council.
- (b) A bush fire brigade may be established for the whole of the Shire or for any specified area thereof.

Appointment of Officers

- 2. The Council shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the brigade.
- 3. Members of the Brigade shall elect a person to act as Secretary to the Brigade and shall inform the Council accordingly.
- 4. The Council may appoint an equipment officer who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Council for the purposes of the brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain.

Power and Duties of Officers

- 5. The powers and duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954 and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations.

Membership of Brigade

- 6. (1) the membership of a bush fire brigade may consist of the following:
  - (a) subscribing members; and
  - (b) firefighting members;



(2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who being interested in forwarding the objects of the brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the brigade at the following rates:

- (i) owner or occupier of land within the brigade area—minimum subscription of \$2.00;
- (ii) other persons—minimum subscription of \$2.00.

(3) Fire fighting members shall be those persons, being able bodied persons over 15 years who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon; and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these By-laws.

(4) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable by firefighting members and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Council.

(5) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a firefighting member.

Finance

7. The expenditure incurred by the Council in the purchase of equipment payment for services and generally for the purpose of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Council and records of such expenditure shall be maintained in accordance with Municipal audit requirements.

Meetings of Brigades

8. Meetings will be held as necessary.

- (d) Scheme costs assessed in accordance with paragraph (c) and (e) shall be paid to the Shire of Kalamunda which shall expend the moneys on improvements to community and recreational amenities within the Scheme Area of Scheme 10.
- (e) With respect to "Scheme Costs" defined in clause 13 of Scheme 10 the Council shall—
  - (i) Divide the Scheme Costs or estimated Scheme Costs after deducting contributions paid or payable by owners of any Private Development Lands by the number of subdivisional lots which will be produced within the Scheme Area excluding any Private Development Lands and including the balance of subdivisional lots and part lots in respect of all owners retaining one lot for each dwelling standing on the land retained as at 17 May 1982 the date of Council's resolution pursuant to clause 13 of the Town Planning Regulations 1967 (as amended) to adopt Scheme 10;
  - (ii) Multiply the proportion of Scheme Costs calculated under paragraph (e) part (i) by the balance of subdivisional lots and any part lot calculated under paragraph (e) part (i) in respect of the owner of the nursery land retaining a lot or part lot.
- (f) Council may make an adjustment to the sum calculated under paragraph (e) parts (i) and (ii) of any additional subdivisional costs likely to be incurred by the owner in the subdivision of the nursery land.

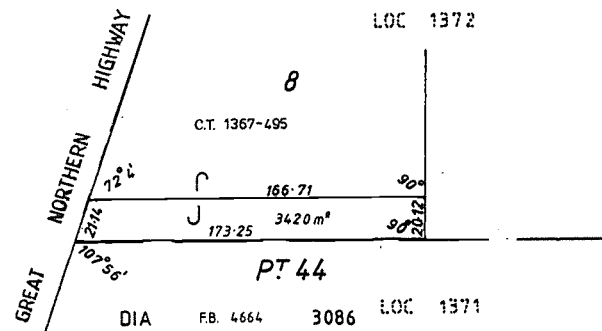

## STATE ENERGY COMMISSION ACT 1979

## Order

WHEREAS by reason of an industrial stoppage the provision, distribution and supply of electricity within the State is likely to be affected and the interruption, curtailment or termination of supply may result.

NOW THEREFORE, THE STATE ENERGY COMMISSION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA (the Commission) acting pursuant to section 57 of the State Energy Commission Act 1979 HEREBY—

1. DECLARES that in the opinion of the Commission a "SYSTEM EMERGENCY" as defined in subsection (1) of section 57 of the State Energy Commission Act 1979, exists.

2. ORDERS that with effect from 0001 hours on Friday, 8 May 1987 the undermentioned restrictions will apply to the use of electricity supplied by the Commission from its interconnected system—

## A. Industrial Commercial and General Consumers

(1) Electricity must not be used for—

(a) Industrial purposes except where—

(i) a supply is essential to prevent serious damage to a consumer's plant and prior approval has been given in writing by the Commission; or

(ii) the Commission has given specific approval in writing.

(b) Heating and air conditioning. Circulating fans may be used only where absolutely necessary for ventilation purposes.

(c) Refrigeration (including deep freezing) except to the extent that is necessary to prevent deterioration of stock.

(d) Display, window, sign, decorative or external lighting.

(e) Recreational, sporting or entertainment purposes except in cinemas or theatres where the minimum amount of electricity may be used for projection, safety and/or security purposes.

(f) Pumping of water, unless specific approval in writing has been given by the Commission.

(2) (a) All automatic time switches controlling lighting, pumping or other loads must be switched off.

(b) Only one lift or escalator, or not more than half the number of lifts or escalators, (whichever shall be the greater number) installed in a building or premises are to be used.

(c) Internal lighting must be kept to a minimum and in any case not more than one third of the installed internal lighting may be used at any one time.

## B. Domestic Consumers

The use of electricity by domestic consumers must be restricted to essential needs.

In particular:

Electric room heaters, air conditioners and water heaters must not be used, except where vital to the well being of children or invalids and then only if no other means exists.

Cooking must be limited to one hot plate at a time.

Internal lighting must be kept to a minimum and restricted to two rooms.

External lighting must not be used.

Refrigerators and Deep Freezers may only be used to the extent that is necessary to prevent the deterioration of food.

Water reticulation and swimming pool pumps must not be used and automatic time switches must be switched off.

3. FOR the purposes of this Order "interconnected system" means that electrical system from which electricity generated at one or more of the Commission's power stations at Kwinana, Muja, Bunbury and Geraldton, respectively, is supplied to consumers.

4. THIS Order shall cease to have effect seven (7) days from the time and date specified in Clause 2 hereof unless previously renewed or cancelled.

## MINING (TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS) (ANOMALIES PREVENTION) ORDER 1987
