## HEALTH ACT 1911

## HAIRDRESSING ESTABLISHMENT AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1987

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

**Citation**

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Hairdressing Establishment Amendment Regulations 1987*.

**Principal regulations**

2. In these regulations the *Hairdressing Establishment Regulations 1972\** are referred to as the principal regulations.

[\*Published in the *Gazette of 10 November 1972 at pp. 4338-40. For amendments to February 1987 see 1985 Index to the Legislation of Western Australia p. 246.*]

**Regulation 3 amended**

3. Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) by inserting in the appropriate alphabetical positions the following definitions—

“alcohol based solution” means 70% (v/v) ethyl alcohol with or without any other disinfectant or antiseptic or any formulation containing any other alcohol as its principal active constituent that is approved by the Executive Director, Public Health as being of equivalent strength;

“disinfected” means subjected to the appropriate process set out in regulation 17A (1) or (2) and stored or packaged in the manner set out in regulation 17A (3);

“instrument” means any appliance, implement or apparatus which may come into contact with the skin or hair of any person in the course of any procedure carried out by a hairdresser; ”; and

(b) by deleting the following definitions—

“disinfecting appliance” and “disinfecting solution”.

**Regulation 7 amended**

4. Regulation 7 of the principal regulations is amended by repealing subregulation (1) and substituting the following subregulation—

“ (1) A person shall not use any room in which hairdressing or cosmetic practices are conducted for any other purpose. ”.

**Regulation 17 amended**

5. Regulation 17 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting “disinfectant solution” and substituting the following—

“ alcohol based solution ”.

**Regulation 17A inserted**

6. After regulation 17 of the principal regulations the following regulation is inserted—

“ 17A. (1) For the purpose of these regulations an instrument, other than clippers, shall be disinfected if it is—

(a) subjected to a thorough washing in cold water with soap or detergent; and

(b) immersed in an alcohol based solution for 15 minutes or in the case of razors 30 minutes.

(2) Clippers shall be disinfected where they are—

(a) thoroughly cleaned with a dry brush; and

(b) an alcohol based solution is applied to the clipper head with a disinfected brush.

(3) Where an instrument has been disinfected it shall be stored or packaged until use in such a manner as to protect it from contamination.

(4) Any blood stained towel or article of washable material shall be immersed in a 5% solution of household bleach for 12 hours before washing in the normal manner. ”.

**Regulation 18 repealed and a regulation substituted**

7. Regulation 18 of the principal regulations is repealed and the following regulation is substituted—

“ 18. A hairdresser shall ensure that any instrument used on a person shall be disinfected before being used on any other person in accordance with the method specified in regulation 17A. ”.

**Regulation 19 repealed and a regulation substituted**

8. Regulation 19 of the principal regulations is repealed and the following regulation is substituted—

“ 19. The proprietor of a hairdressing establishment shall provide a sufficient number of instruments to enable used instruments to be disinfected in accordance with these regulations. ”.

**Regulation 20 amended**

9. Regulation 20 of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) by deleting “a disinfecting solution” and substituting the following—

“ an alcohol based solution for not less than 15 minutes ”; and

(b) by deleting “at least ten minutes” and substituting the following—

“ not less than 10 minutes ”.

**Regulation 22A inserted**

10. After regulation 22 of the principal regulations the following regulation is inserted—

“ 22A. (1) A hairdresser may perform hairdressing procedures in the private residence of a customer in a room which is not used for the storage, preparation or consumption of food.

(2) Where hairdressing procedures are carried out in accordance with subregulation (1), regulations 4 (excluding paragraph (c)), 5, 7, and 17 do not apply. ”.

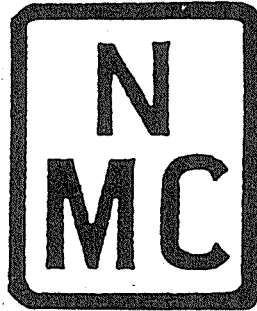

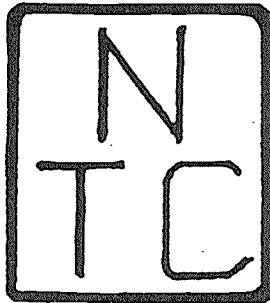

## ROAD TRAFFIC (LICENSING) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1987

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

**Citation**

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Road Traffic (Licensing) Amendment Regulations 1987*.

**Regulation 23 amended**

2. Regulation 23 of the *Road Traffic (Licensing) Regulations 1975\** is amended—

- (a) in subregulation (1) by deleting “is a special plate or name plate the Board shall issue a special plate or name plate bearing the same characters or numerals or both, as the case may be” and substituting the following—

“ is—

- (a) a special plate;
- (b) a name plate; or
- (c) a personalised plate,

the Board shall issue a number plate in substitution for that number plate being of the same type or class, and bearing the same characters or numerals or both, as the case may be, as that number plate ”; and

- (b) in subregulation (2) by deleting "and where the number plates are special plates issue a special plate or name plate bearing the same characters or numerals or both, as the case may be, to replace the special plate or name plate that is damaged or dilapidated" and substituting the following—

" and where the number plate so dilapidated or damaged is—

- (a) a special plate;
- (b) a name plate; or
- (c) a personalised plate,

the Board shall issue another number plate in substitution for that number plate, being of the same type or class, and bearing the same characters or numerals or both, as the case may be, as that number plate. "

#### ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1974

#### VEHICLE STANDARDS AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (No. 2) 1987

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

##### Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Vehicle Standards Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1987*.

##### Principal regulations

2. In these regulations the *Vehicle Standards Regulations 1977\** are referred to as the principal regulations.

##### Commencement

3. These regulations shall come into operation 28 days after the date on which they are published in the *Gazette*.

##### Regulation 104 amended

4. Regulation 104 of the principal regulations is amended in subregulation (1) by inserting, in the appropriate alphabetical positions, the following definitions—

" "Perth Region" means the area comprised in the municipal districts of—

- the Cities of Armadale, Bayswater, Belmont, Canning, Cockburn, Fremantle, Gosnells, Melville, Nedlands, Perth, South Perth, Stirling, Subiaco, Wanneroo;
- the Towns of Bassendean, Claremont, Cottesloe, East Fremantle, Kwinana, Mosman Park;
- the Shires of Kalamunda, Mundaring, Peppermint Grove, Rockingham, Serpentine-Jarrahdale, Swan;

"route service omnibus" means any omnibus providing a public passenger transport service along a route within the Perth Region or along a route within a city or town declared under the *Local Government Act 1960*; "

##### Regulation 311 inserted

5. After regulation 310 of the principal regulations the following regulations are inserted—

##### Rear marking plates

" 311. All vehicles or combinations of vehicles exceeding 12 tonnes gross vehicle mass, except route service omnibuses, shall be fitted, in the manner set out in regulation 312, unless otherwise approved by the Board in writing, with 2 rear marking plates which comply with regulation 313.

##### Installation

312. (1) Rear marking plates shall be mounted at the rear of the vehicle and shall face rearwards.

(2) Rear marking plates shall be securely attached to the vehicle so that no part of the marking projects beyond the outermost part of the vehicle on either side.

(3) The lower edge of every rear marking plate shall be horizontal and at a height of not more than 1.5 m nor less than 400 mm above the ground and each plate shall be the same height above the ground as each other plate.

(4) Rear marking plates shall lie within 20° of a transverse vertical plane through the longitudinal axis of the vehicle.

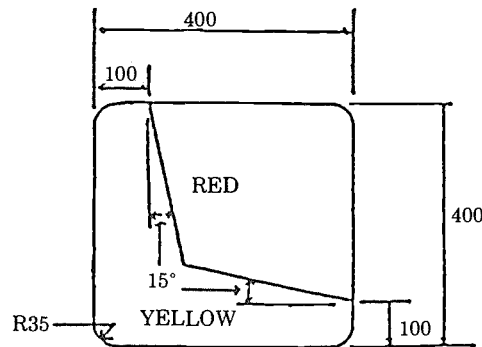
(5) The outer edges of the rear marking plates shall be within 150 mm of the outer edge of the vehicle where practicable or as near as possible to the outer edge of the vehicle in all other cases.

(6) Rear marking plates shall be fitted so that the yellow portions appear on the outer and lower edges.



**Specifications**

313. (1) The dimensions and colours of rear marking plates shall be in accordance with the figure set out hereunder—



Dimensions in mm

General tolerance on all dimensions  $\pm 5$  mm or  $\pm 50$

A yellow margin of up to 5 mm thickness is allowed on the outside edges of the red (if required for ease of manufacture).

(2) The surface of the rear marking plate shall be of retro-reflective material within photometric performance and durability not less than that required for Class 2 material by Australian Standard 1906, Part 1-1976 as amended in March 1977 and published on 1 April 1977.

(3) Each rear marking plate—

- (a) Shall bear the name of the manufacturer and a statement identifying the class of the material used and the standard to which it is manufactured; and
- (b) may have the words "DO NOT OVERTAKE TURNING VEHICLE" in black lettering in the yellow portion of the marker plate.

(4) Rear marking plates are not reflectors for the purposes of these regulations. "

WESTERN AUSTRALIAN MEAT MARKETING CORPORATION (ELECTIONS)  
AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1987

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

**Citation**

"

**Regulation 7 repealed and a regulation substituted**

9. Regulation 7 of the principal regulations is repealed and the following regulation is substituted—

**Notice of elections**

" 7. (1) Subject to the appointment of a returning officer by the Minister, which it shall be the duty of the Chairman of the Corporation to request, for the purpose of every election of a lamb producer member of the Corporation the Chairman shall, not less than 3 months prior to the expiration of the term of the office of such a member, and not more than 14 days after the occurrence of a casual vacancy in the office of a

lamb producer member, direct the returning officer to fix a day to be the nomination day and the returning officer shall thereupon fix a nomination day and cause a notice of the day to be published in the *Government Gazette* and in at least one newspaper circulating in the State.

(2) The day fixed as nomination day under this regulation shall be not less than 21 days, nor more than 45 days after the latest of the publication of the notice. ”

**Regulation 8 repealed and a regulation substituted**

10. Regulation 8 of the principal regulations is repealed and the following regulation is substituted—

**Lamb producer members—qualification of candidates**

“ 8. A person shall not be eligible to be nominated for election as a lamb producer member of the Corporation unless at the time he is nominated as a candidate he is a prescribed lamb producer and is not—

- (a) of unsound mind within the meaning of the *Mental Health Act 1962*;
- (b) an undischarged bankrupt within the meaning of the *Bankruptcy Act 1892*; or
- (c) a person who has been convicted of an indictable offence for which a sentence of imprisonment for 12 months or more has been imposed. ”

**Regulation 9 amended**

11. Regulation 9 of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) by repealing subregulation (1) and substituting the following subregulation—

“ (1) For the purposes of elections to be held for the election of lamb producer members of the Corporation, the Corporation shall, not less than 21 days prior to the day fixed as nomination day, furnish the returning officer with 2 separate lists, certified under the hand of the Chairman of the Corporation, of—

- (a) the persons; and
  - (b) the partnerships, firms and bodies,
- who are prescribed lamb producers for the time being. ”;

(b) in subregulation (2) by inserting after “prescribed” the following—

“ lamb ”;

(c) in subregulation (4) by inserting after “prescribed” the following—

“ lamb ”;

(d) in subregulation (5) by deleting “producer eligible or” and substituting the following—

“ lamb producer eligible for ”; and

(e) in subregulation (6) by inserting after “prescribed” the following—

“ lamb ”.

**Regulation 10 amended**

“ (1) Any prescribed lamb producer, whose name, or the name of the representative of which, does not appear on the list of producers furnished by the Corporation, may apply to have his name or the name of the representative enrolled on the roll of prescribed lamb producers prepared for an election by lodging with the returning officer not less than 7 days before the date fixed for the election an application in Form 2. ”

“ Corporation ”.

14. Regulation 14 of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) in subregulation (1), by deleting “Board” and substituting the following—

(ii) by deleting “producer” and substituting the following—

“ lamb producer ”.

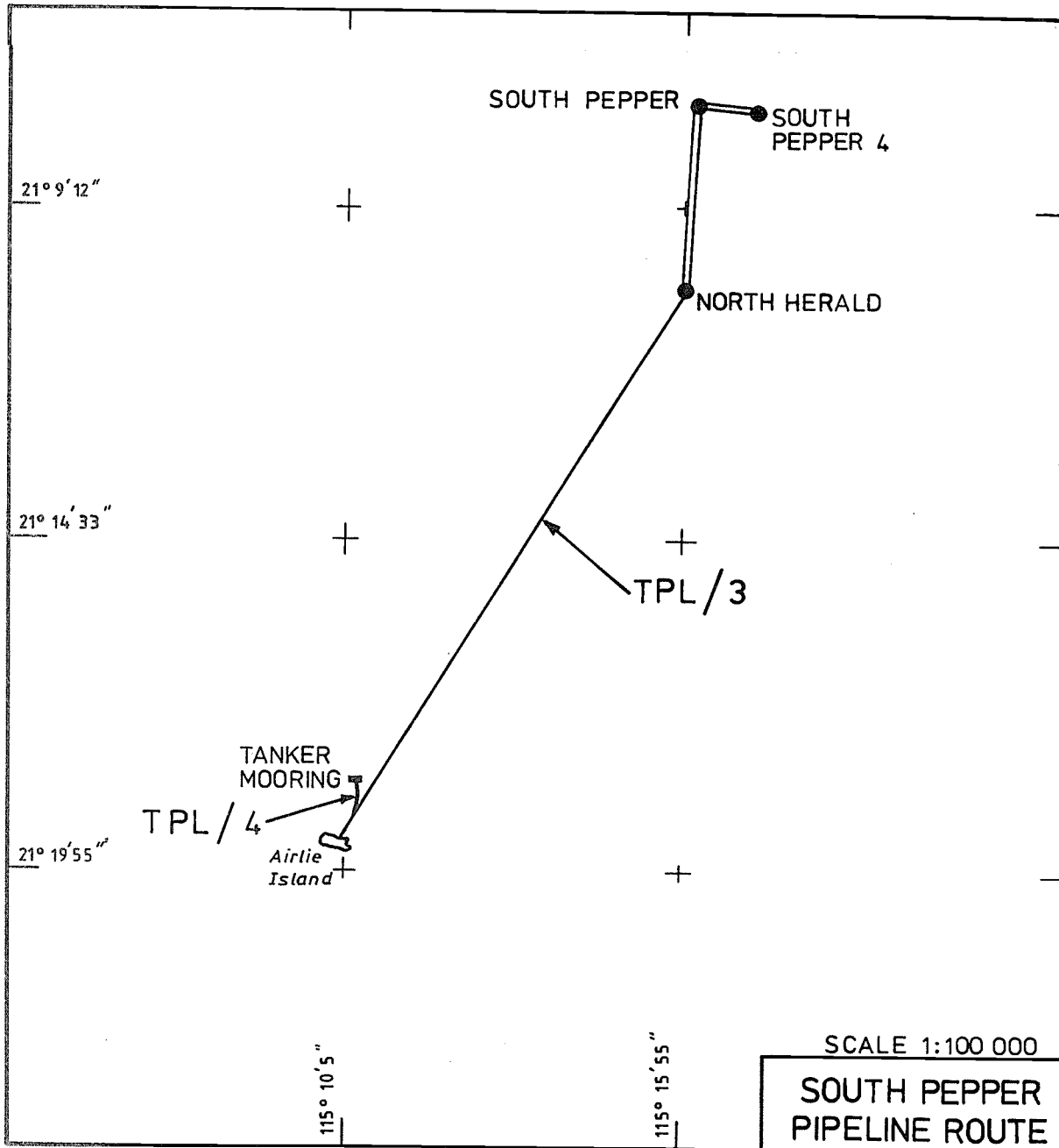

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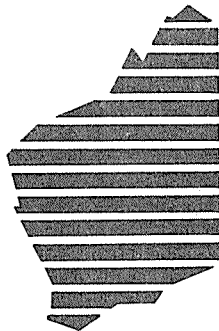
