AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 9th day of June 1987, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued—

Local Government Act 1960

ORDER IN COUNCIL

L & S Corres. 1294/983.

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act 1960, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than 10 years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriageway and footpaths of the public street and whereas the Shire of York has requested that certain lands named and described in the schedule hereunder, which have been reserved for a street within its municipal district be declared a public street; now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be a public street, and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

Road No. 17646 (Forbes Street). A strip of land 15.09 metres wide, commencing at the northeastern side of a surveyed road (Ulster Road) and extending as surveyed northeastward along the northwestern boundaries of Lots 1 to 8 inclusive of York Sub Lot 15 (Office of Titles Plan 96) and onward to and along the northwestern boundaries of

Lots 9, 10 and 11 of the said Sub Lot, Lot 12 of Sub Lots 15 and 13 and Lots 13, 14 and 15 of Sub Lot 13 (Plan 96) to terminate at the southwestern side of a surveyed road (Dinsdale Street).

Road No. 17647 (Barratt Street). A strip of land 15.09 metres wide, commencing at a line in prolongation north-eastward of the northwestern boundary of Lot 84 of York Sub Lot S19 (Office of Titles Plan 96) and extending as surveyed southeastward along the northeastern boundary of the said Lot and onward to and along the northeastern boundaries of Lots 76 and 83 of the said Sub Lot to terminate at the northwestern side of a surveyed road (Henry Street).

Road No. 17648 (Mansfield Street). A strip of land 15.09 metres wide, widening at its commencement, commencing at the northeastern side of a surveyed road (Ulster Street) and extending as surveyed northeastward along the northwestern boundaries of Lots 57 to 63 inclusive of York Sub Lot 16 (Office of Titles Plan 96) onward to and along the northwestern boundaries of Lots 70, 71 and 72 of Sub Lot 16, Lot 73 of Sub Lots 16 and S19 and Lots 74, 75 and 76 of Sub Lot S19 (Plan 96) to terminate at the southwestern side of a surveyed road (Barratt Street) (described above).

Road No. 17649 (Trigg Street). A strip of land 15.09 metres wide, commencing at the southeastern side of Road No. 17648 (Mansfield Street) (described above) and extending as surveyed southeastward along the northeastern boundaries of Lots 63 and 64 of York Sub Lot 16 (Office of Titles Plan 96) onward to and along the northeastern boundaries of Lots 53, 38 and 8 of Sub Lot 15 (Plan 96) to terminate at a line in prolongation northeastward at the southeastern boundary of the said Lot 8.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY ACT 1984

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY (STATUTORY EXCEPTIONS) REGULATIONS 1987

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Equal Opportunity (Statutory Exceptions) Regulations 1987*.

Commencement

2. These regulations shall come into operation on 6 July 1987.

Definition

3. In these regulations, "the Act" means the *Equal Opportunity Act 1984*.

Statutory exceptions

4. Notwithstanding section 69 (2), the provisions of section 69 (1) shall continue in force on and after the expiration of 2 years after the coming into operation of section 69 of the Act—

(a) in relation to—

(i) the *Pearling Act 1912*;

(ii) the *Child Welfare Act 1947*; and

(iii) except in so far as paragraph (b) provides, the *Factories and Shops Act 1963*, until otherwise prescribed;

(b) in relation to—

(i) the *Factories (Health and Safety) Regulations*;

(ii) the *Shops and Warehouses (Health, Safety and Welfare) Regulations*;

(iii) the *Factories (Lead Materials) Regulations 1971*; and

(iv) the *Factories (Welfare) Regulations*,

until 8 January 1988;

and

(c) in relation to orders or awards of a court or tribunal of the State to which section 69 (1) (e) applies, until 8 November 1987.

LAND TAX ASSESSMENT ACT 1976

Notice to all Owners of Land or Property in W.A.

A Land Tax return for land owned at midnight on 30 June 1987 must be lodged no later than 31 July 1987.

Penalty for Non Compliance—10% Additional Tax

1. A return is not required where an owner has lodged a return in a previous year and his land holdings have since remained unchanged unless—

(a) the usage of land has altered (e.g. a previously exempt residential property is not now used as the ordinary place of residence of all the owners); or

(b) the land has since been subdivided.

2. The following classes of land should not be included in a return—

(a) any single lot used solely or principally as the ordinary place of residence of all the owners;

(b) land outside the metropolitan region which does not have a zoning or is zoned "rural" under a town planning scheme and is used solely or principally for a specified business for primary production;

(c) land held as a mining tenement unless it is owned in fee simple;

(d) land owned at 30 June 1986, which is still owned and meets the requirement for exemption or concession as set down in the Land Tax Assessment Act.

NOTE—Owners of land of any of the above four classes are not required to make application in order to obtain an exemption from land tax.

3. Exemption from Land Tax—The owner of any class of land other than those described in (2) above, in respect of which an exemption or concession may be granted and which has been acquired since 30 June 1986, must—

(a) include such land in the return which must be lodged no later than 31 July 1987;

(b) make written application for an exemption or concession for the land concerned, setting down the grounds on which the application is made.

Rules of Trotting

Notice of Amendment

NOTICE is hereby given that at a meeting of committee of Western Australian Trotting Association held at Gloucester Park, East Perth on 16 June 1987, it was resolved by an absolute majority of the committee that the Rules of Trotting be amended as follows.

By inclusion after Rule 107 of the following Rules 108 to 116.

108. Any currently registered owner, licensed person or any person who is able to produce written authorisation from the Controlling Body of that State may claim a horse in accordance with the Rules.
109. Prohibitions—
- (a) No person shall claim his/her own horses, nor shall he/she claim a horse trained or driven by him/her.
 - (b) No person shall claim more than one horse in a race.
 - (c) No qualified owner or his/her agent shall claim a horse for another person.
 - (d) No owner shall cause his/her horse to be claimed directly or indirectly for his/her own account.
 - (e) No person shall offer, or enter into an agreement, to claim or not to claim, or attempt to prevent another person from claiming any horse in a claiming race.
 - (f) No person shall enter a horse against which there is a mortgage, bill of sale, or lien of any kind, unless the written consent of the holder thereof shall be filed with the Secretary of the Club conducting such claiming race.
 - (g) ANY ENTRY IN A CLAIMING RACE CANNOT ACCEPT FOR A SUBSEQUENT RACE UNTIL AFTER THE CLAIMING RACE HAS BEEN CONTESTED.
 - (h) No horse which has been accepted for a claiming race shall be sold or transferred UNLESS claimed from the race in which it is an acceptor.
110. Claiming Procedures—
- (a) Claimant's Credit—The Claimant must have to his/her credit with the Conducting club giving the race an amount equivalent to the specified claiming price plus the requisite fees for transfer of registration.

- (b) Owner's Consent—No declaration may be accepted unless written permission of the owner is filed with the Secretary of the Club at the time of declaration.
 - (c) Programme—The claiming price shall be printed on the programme and all claims shall be for the amount so designated and any horse entered in a claiming race may be claimed for the designated amount.
 - (d) Claim Box—All claims shall be in writing, and must be on the appropriate form obtained from the Club Secretary and verified by him, sealed and deposited at least 15 minutes before the race in a locked box provided for this purpose by the Chairman of Stewards.
 - (e) Opening of Claim Box—No official shall open the said box or give any information on claims filed until after the race. Immediately after the race the claim box shall be opened and the claims, if any, be examined by the Chairman of Stewards.
 - (f) Multiple Claims on Same Horse—Should more than one claim be filed for the same horse, the owner shall be determined by lot by the Chairman of Stewards in the presence of all claimants who elect to be present at such determination.
 - (g) Delivery of Claimed Horses—A horse claimed shall be delivered immediately by the original owner or his/her trainer to the successful claimant upon authorisation of the Chairman of Stewards. Altering or removing the horse's shoes will be considered a violation of this rule. The horse's halter and hobbles must accompany the horse.
 - (h) Refusal to Deliver Claimed Horse—Any person who refuses to deliver a horse claimed in accordance with these rules shall be suspended together with the horse until the delivery is made.
 - (i) Vesting of Title to Claimed Horse—Every horse claimed shall race the event in the interest and for the account of the owner who declared it in the event, but title to the claimed horse shall be vested in the successful claimant from the time the word "go" is given in the first division or race, and the said successful claimant shall become the owner of the horse, whether it be alive or dead or sound or unsound, or injured during the race or after it, provided, however, that the final vesting of title to a claimed horse is subject to the conditions of sub rule (n) of this rule, and in accordance with the statutes providing for the same in the State in which the race is run.
 - (j) Affidavit by Claimant—The Stewards may require any person making a claim for a horse to make affidavit that he/she is claiming the horse for his/her own account and not for any other person. Any person making such declaration wilfully and falsely shall be guilty of a breach of the Australian Rules of Trotting in addition to any penalty to which he/she is liable at law.
 - (k) Return of Claimed Horse to Owner of Stable—No horse claimed out of a claiming race shall be eligible to start in any race in the name of interest of the original owner for 30 days, nor shall such horse remain in the same stable or under the care or management of the first owner unless reclaimed out of another claiming race.
 - (l) Scratched Horse—The successful claimant of a horse programmed to start may, at his/her option, acquire ownership of a claimed horse, even though such claimed horse was scratched and did not start in the claiming race from which it was scratched. Any horse accepted for in a claiming race is eligible to be claimed.
 - (m) In the event of a horse returning a positive swab the claimant may repudiate the claim. In such case after the horse has been returned to the owner, the said owner shall be liable to pay for the care and sustenance whilst in the claimant's possession. The owner shall hold the claimant indemnified against any claim for such care and sustenance and also for any injury or the death of the animal whilst in the care of the claimant which is not the direct result of the negligence of the claimant.
111. Claiming Price—
Subject to the conditions of Rule 3 (m) the registered club shall pay the claiming price to the owner at the time the registration certificate is delivered for presentation to the successful claimant.
112. Claiming Conditions—
Aside from claiming price, conditions and allowances in claiming races may be based only on age and sex. Whenever possible claiming races shall be written to separate horses five years old and up from young horses and to separate males from females.
113. Minimum Price—
No claiming race shall be offered permitting claims for less than the minimum purse offered at that time during the same racing programme.
114. Determination of Claiming Price—
No horse owner shall be prohibited from determining the price for which his/her horse shall be entered.
115. Registration and Assessment Certificate—
The current Registration or Assessment Certificate of all horses entered in claiming races must be on the file with the Secretary of the Club together with a current claiming authorisation form signed by the registered owner or owners and indicating the minimum amount for which the horse may be entered to be claimed must be on file with the controlling body prior to closing of nomination.
116. Penalty for Violation—
Any person violating any of the provisions of these rules may be fined, suspended or disqualified.

Notice of Amendment

NOTICE is hereby given that at a meeting of the Committee of the Western Australian Trotting Association held at Gloucester Park, East Perth, on 16 June 1987 it was resolved by an absolute majority of the Committee that the Rules of Trotting be amended as follows—

By inclusion after Rule 136 of the following 136A—

- (a) Where in the opinion of the Stewards any person licensed under these Rules is under the influence of alcohol or drugs the Stewards may require such licensed person to undergo a test by means of an alco kit breathalyser or any instrument approved by the Road Traffic Authority and any person with a reading equal to or above 0.02 shall be deemed to be under the influence of alcohol and accordingly be deemed to be unfit pursuant to these Rules.
- (b) Where a person licensed under these Rules provides a sample of breath for analysis pursuant to the abovementioned paragraph (a) and the analysis indicates—
 - (i) that there is no alcohol present in the blood of the licensed person; or
 - (ii) that the percentage of alcohol present is such that it does not reasonably explain the conduct, condition or appearance of the licensed person;
 the Stewards and/or Security Officer may require the person to allow a medical practitioner to take a sample of his blood and/or urine for analysis by the Government Chemical Laboratories and any person licensed under the Rules who as a result of the analysis by the Government Chemical Laboratories is found to be under the influence of a drug or drugs shall be deemed to be unfit pursuant to these Rules.
- (c) Any person licensed under these Rules who fails to comply with the requirements of paragraph (a) or (b) abovementioned shall commit an offence against these Rules.

NOTICE is hereby given that at a meeting of the Committee of the Western Australian Trotting Association held at Gloucester Park, East Perth, on 16 June 1987, it was resolved by an absolute majority of the Committee as follows.

1. That in Part XXXIV—APPEALS of the Rules of Trotting the words "Advisory Members" be deleted throughout that PART and the words "LAY MEMBERS" be inserted in lieu thereof.

2. That Rule 371 be amended by the deletion of the ninth paragraph and the insertion in lieu thereof of the following—

The Lay Members shall be—

- (i) A member of the Committee; and
- (ii) Such other person (not a member of the Committee) whom the Committee considers, having regard to his (or her) experience of trotting, is suitable to act as a Lay Member;
- (iii) Appointed for a term of one year and may be re-appointed.

At the time of appointing the Lay Members the controlling body shall appoint two deputies, one for each of the Lay Members. In the event that a Lay Member is unable or unwilling to sit on the hearing of an appeal, then that Lay Member's deputy shall take the place of the Lay member. If it is not possible for any Lay Member or that Lay Member's deputy to attend upon the hearing of an appeal then any Committee member may be appointed by the controlling body to fill any such casual vacancy on the Tribunal and such Committee member shall have the powers and duties of a Lay Member. In the event of a Lay Member or his or her deputy resigning from the position at any time during the currency of his or her term, then the Controlling body shall appoint a new Lay Member or Deputy (as the case may be) to hold office for the unexpired portion of the resigning Lay Member's deputy's term.

3. Rule 394 be amended by the deletion thereof and in the place thereof be inserted the following—

"Any person including a Steward or Stewards aggrieved by a decision of the Tribunal may apply to the Controlling body for a rehearing by the Committee. The said application shall be in writing, shall be made within fourteen (14) days of the making of the Tribunal's decision and shall include particulars of the grounds relied upon together with such deposit as the Controlling Body shall from time to time prescribe. Upon receipt of an application as aforesaid, the Committee shall determine whether to grant the application for a rehearing and may decide, in its sole discretion, not to allow a rehearing, whereupon the appellant shall be advised of such decision and shall have his deposit returned."

4. That Rule 372 be deleted and in the place thereof there be inserted the following—

"On every matter or thing which the Tribunal is required to decide, determine or rule upon the decision, determination or ruling of the Tribunal shall be that of the majority of the Tribunal members."

HEALTH ACT 1911

Shire of Victoria Plains

WHEREAS, under provisions of the Health Act 1911, a local authority may make or adopt by-laws, and may alter, amend or repeal any by-laws so made or so adopted, now therefore the Shire of Victoria Plains, being a local authority within the meaning of the Act hereby resolves the following.

1. Repeal, the Model By-laws described as Series "A" as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act 1954, in the *Government Gazette* on 9 August 1956 without modifications adopted by the Council by resolution on 15 October 1956 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 22 February 1957.

2. Repeal amendment to 1. adopted by the Council by resolution on 19 February 1962 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 25 May 1962.

3. Repeal amendment to 1. adopted by the Council by resolution on 15 October 1973 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 7 December 1973.

4. Repeal amendment to 1. adopted by the Council by resolution on 16 December 1985 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 27 March 1986.

5. Adopt, the Model By-laws described as Series "A" as reprinted pursuant to the *Reprinting of Regulations Act 1954* in the *Government Gazette* on 17 July 1963 and as amended from time to time with the following modifications—

(a) PART 1—GENERAL SANITARY PROVISIONS

(i) After By-law 1B insert a new By-law 1C to read as follows—

1C—Provision of apparatus for the bacteriolytic treatment of sewerage.

The owner of every house shall provide on the premises an apparatus for the bacteriolytic treatment of sewerage.

(ii) Substitute for By-law 19 a new By-law to read as follows—

METHOD OF DISPOSAL OF RUBBISH

19. (1) No person other than an authorised employee of the Council or a person authorised in writing by the Council shall enter or be on any land or premises used by the Council for the depositing of refuse, garbage or rubbish except for the purposes of depositing of refuse, garbage or rubbish thereon.

(2) The Council may by means of signs indicate the place at which refuse garbage or rubbish may be deposited or the place at which refuse garbage or rubbish of a particular nature may be deposited.

(3) No person shall deposit any refuse, garbage or rubbish other than at a position on the land designated by an employee of the Council or as indicated by signs or any refuse garbage or rubbish of a particular nature other than in accordance with the signs or the directions of the Council's employee.

(4) No person other than an authorised employee of the Council or a person authorised in writing by the Council shall interfere with or remove any material or thing whatsoever from any land used by the Council for the deposit of refuse, garbage or rubbish.

(5) No person shall light or cause to be burnt any refuse, garbage or rubbish on any land used by the Council for the deposit of refuse, garbage and rubbish except on a site specified by the Council and under such conditions as the Council may impose.

(6) No person shall deposit any car body or other matter not easily compressible on any land under the control of the Council except at a place which is set aside for the purpose and in accordance with such conditions as the Council may from time to time impose.

(7) A person using a vehicle for disposing of material on land set aside by the Council for the depositing of refuse, garbage or rubbish shall cause the vehicle to be removed from the land immediately such vehicle has been emptied of material.

(8) No person shall park a vehicle except for the purpose of unloading the vehicle on land set aside by the Council for the depositing of refuse, garbage or rubbish unless authorised in writing by the Council to do so.

(9) At all times the Council may refuse acceptance of all refuse, garbage or rubbish arising from premises outside the Shire of Victoria Plains.

(10) Every person entering on land used by the Council for the depositing of refuse garbage or rubbish shall obey all reasonable directions and instructions issued by the authorised employees of the Council.

(11) A person who deposits or disposes of any refuse, garbage or rubbish other than at a place set aside by the Council for the purpose, or otherwise than in accordance with these By-laws, commits an offence.

(iii) After By-law 28 insert a new By-law 28A to read as follows—

28A. An owner or occupier of any land within any portion of the Local Authority defined within the boundaries prescribed in Schedule "F" to Section A of Part IX shall not keep or permit to be kept any swine.

(b) PART VII—FOOD

Sale of Food by Itinerant Vendors

By-law 51 (2) is amended by substituting for the amount of ten dollars where it appears in sub-by-law (2) the amount of sixty dollars.

(c) PART IX—OFFENSIVE TRADES

- (i) Add immediately after Schedule "E" to section A, a new Schedule and heading as follows—

Schedule "F"

Prescribed areas within which a Piggery shall not be established

- (1) Bolgart— All that land contained within a circle having a radius of 600 metres described from the intersection of George Street with Albert Street in the townsite of Bolgart.
 - (2) Calingiri— The whole of the townsite of Calingiri or within 500 metres outside the boundary of the townsite of Calingiri.
 - (3) Mogumber— The whole of the townsite of Mogumber or within 500 metres outside the boundary of the townsite of Mogumber.
 - (4) Piawaning— All that land contained within a circle having a radius of 500 metres described from the intersection of Denton Street with the Waddington-Wongan Hills Road in the townsite of Piawaning.
 - (5) Yerecoin— The whole of the townsite of Yerecoin or within 500 metres outside the boundary of the townsite of Yerecoin.
- (ii) Add after the word "access" in line three of By-law 1 of section C, the words, "areas set aside for drainage, waste treatment, waste disposal, and all building used in the operation of the piggery."
- (iii) In By-law 3 of section C—
- (a) Add after the word "shall" where it appears in line three of the commencing paragraph, the words "be constructed in a manner approved by the Local Authority and";
 - (b) Delete the words, "an inspector" where it appears in line four of paragraph (b), and substitute "a health surveyor";
 - (c) Add immediately after paragraph (b), the following paragraph:
 - (c) Waste, effluent, washings and other drainage emanating from or in the piggery shall be disposed of in accordance with the requirements of the Local Authority.
- (iv) In By-Law 4 of section C—
- (a) Delete the words "diseased animals" in line four of paragraph (a) and substitute "any animal".
 - (b) Delete the whole of paragraph (c) and substitute a new paragraph (c) to read as follows:
 - (c) He shall cause all readily putrescible pig-feed that may be brought upon such premises to be immediately deposited in water tight containers with tight-fitting covers.
 - (c) Delete the whole of paragraph (d) and substitute a new paragraph (d) to read as follows:
 - (d) He shall not receive, or suffer, or permit to be received on such premises any kitchen, slaughter-house, or butchers' wastes or pig-swill.

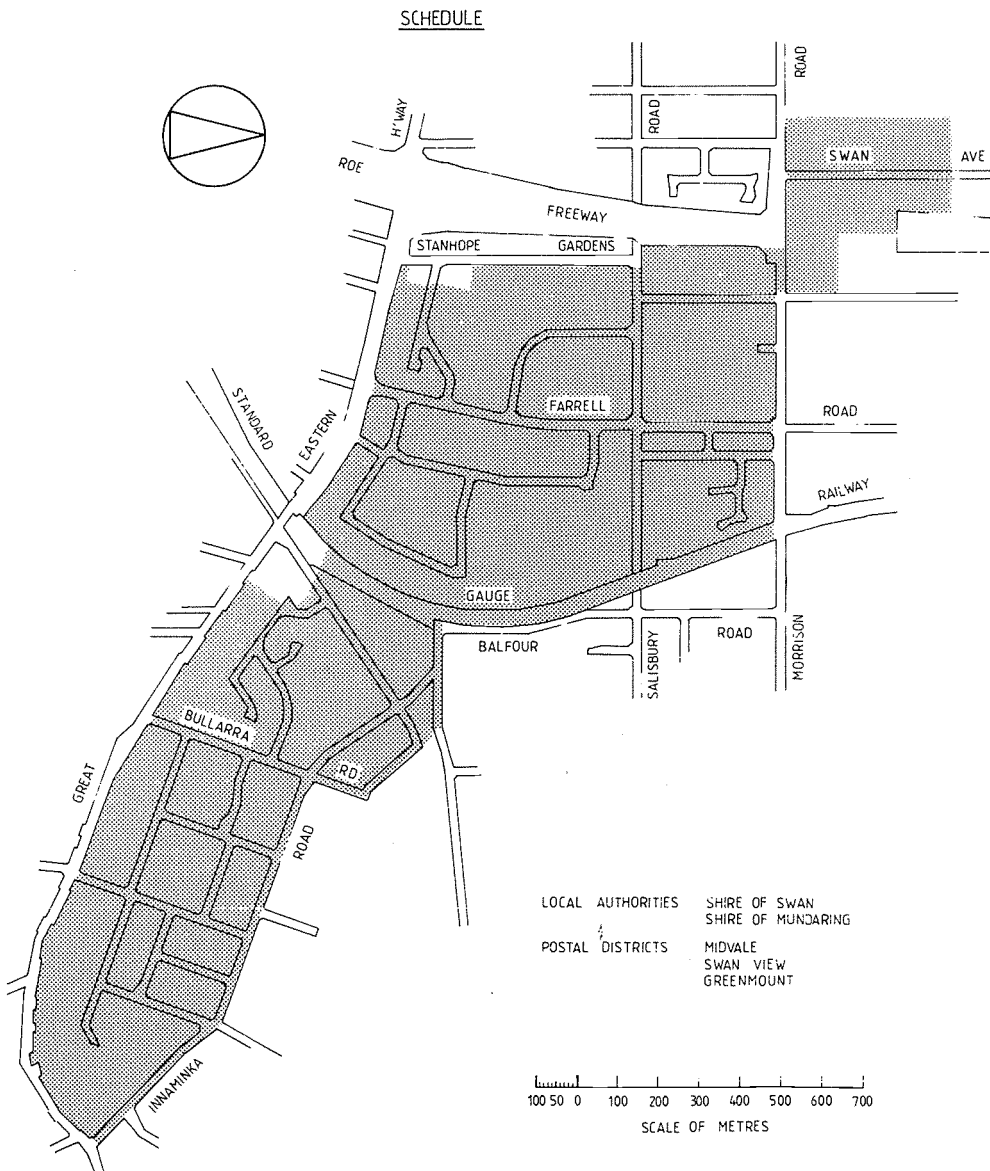

Any person liable for the control of a dog who allows that dog to excrete on any street or public place or on any land within the Municipality without the written consent of the occupier of that land commits an offence unless the excreta is removed forthwith and disposed of either on private land with the written consent of the occupier or in such other manner as the Council may approve.
