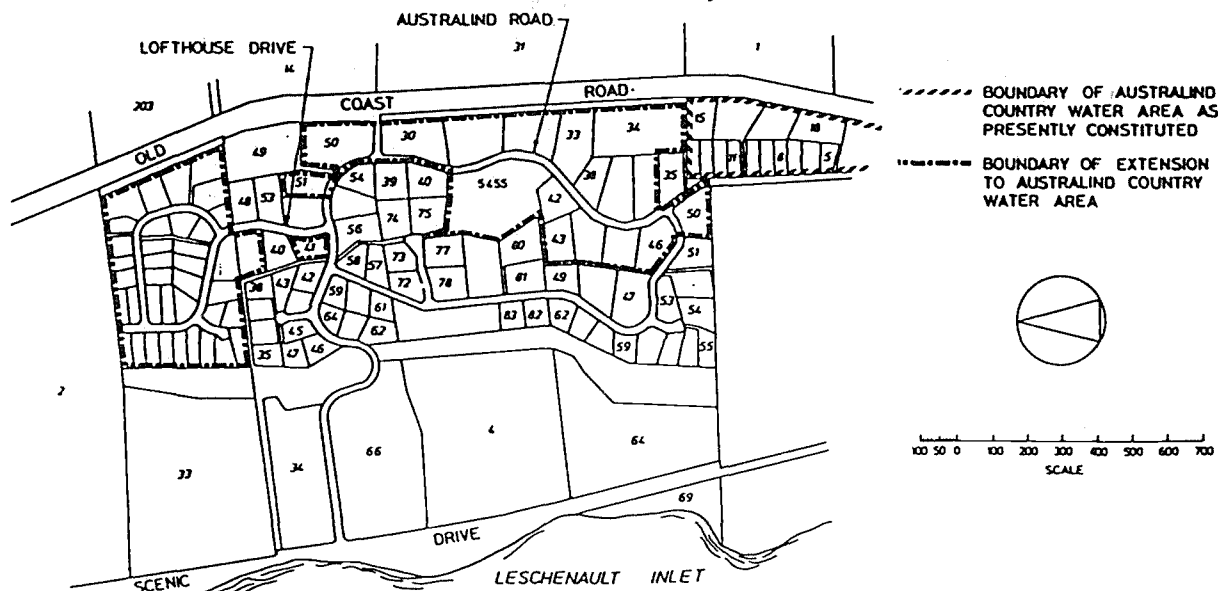

City of Nedlands

Model By-laws Series "A"

WHEREAS under the provision of the Health Act 1911 (as amended) a Local Authority may make or adopt by-laws, and may later, amend or repeal any by-laws, so made or adopted: Now therefore, the City of Nedlands being a Local Authority within the meaning of the Act and having adopted the model By-laws described as Series "A" as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act 1954, in the *Government Gazette* on 17 July 1963, doth hereby resolve and determine that the said adopted by-laws shall be amended as follows.

The City of Nedlands being a local authority under the provisions of the abovementioned Act, does hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by that Act and all other powers enabling it to make and publish the following by-laws.

1. In these by-laws the Model By-laws Series "A" as amended from time to time adopted by the City of Nedlands by resolution published in the *Government Gazette* of 15 October 1964, and amended from time to time are referred to as "the principal by-laws".

2. The principal by-laws are amended by deleting each of the following by-laws and the heading thereto—

- By-law 69 of Part I.
- By-law 17 of Part II.
- By-law 19 of Part III.
- By-law 25 of Part IV.
- By-law 23 of Part V.
- By-law 21 of Part VI.
- By-law 73 of Part VII.
- By-law 19 of Part IX.

and substituting for each of those by-laws the following by-law and heading—

Recovery of Expenses

In addition to the penalty prescribed by the Act, any expense incurred by the local authority in consequence of a breach or non-observance of a by-law contained in this Part, or in the execution of work directed to be executed by a person and not executed by him shall be paid by the person committing the breach or non-observance or failing to execute the work.

(iii) other vehicles in accordance with subregulation (2) (g). ”; and

(i) by deleting "subregulation (1) of this regulation" and substituting the following—

" paragraphs (a), (c) and (d) of subregulation (1) ”; and

(ii) by deleting paragraph (g) and substituting the following paragraph—

" (g) being driven to or from and, where the vehicles have the same owner, carrying another vehicle or vehicles to or from an Agricultural Show, an Agricultural Field Day or a Motor Show, for the purpose of exhibiting the vehicle or vehicles; ”.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

City of Bunbury

Important Information Relating to your Responsibility as a Landholder in the City of Bunbury

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, you are required to carry out fire prevention work on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

This work must be carried out by 14 December 1987 and kept maintained throughout the summer months until 31 March 1988.

An inspection of firebreaks and hazard removal will be carried out in all areas of the City by an authorised Officer.

Persons who fail to comply with the requirements of this order, may be issued with an infringement notice (penalty \$40) or prosecuted with an increased penalty, and additionally, Council may carry out the required work at cost to the owner or occupier.

It is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, if natural features render firebreaks unnecessary, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised Officer not later than 25 November 1987 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised Officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice. If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

Requirements

1. Rural and Townsite Land (includes residential, commercial and industrial)—

- Where the area of the land is 2 024 m² (approximately ½ acre) or less, remove all flammable material on the land except living standing trees, from the whole of the land, and
- Where the area of land exceeds 2 024 m² provide firebreaks at least three metres wide, immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings and haystacks situated on the land. Where several adjoining lots are held or used by the owner-occupier, the firebreaks may be provided inside and along the external boundaries of the group or lot.

2. Special Rural Land: The owners of small rural holdings zoned as Special Rural under Town Planning Schemes must maintain clear of all flammable material, a firebreak not less than three metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land.

3. Fuel and/or Gas Depots: In respect of land owned and/or occupied by you on which is situated any container normally used to contain liquid or gas fuel, including the land on which any ramp or supports are constructed, you shall have the land clear of all flammable material.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

Shire of Albany

1987/88 Firebreak Notice

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Albany

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the Bushfires Act 1954, you are hereby required to have all firebreaks clear of inflammable material, such firebreaks to be not less than three metres in width within that portion of the Shire lying generally north of the dividing line defined hereunder and two metres in width within that portion of the Shire lying generally southwest of the dividing line defined hereunder, and constructed by one or more of the following methods—ploughing, cultivation, scarifying, burning or chemical spraying. In addition you may be required to carry out further works which may be deemed necessary and specified by way of separate written notice forwarded to the address of the owner/occupier as shown on the rate records maintained by the Shire of Albany for the land.

- Land having an area of 2 100 square metres or less

For all land having an area of 2 100 square metres or less—

- A firebreak is not required—however:
- The land will be inspected by the Fire Control Officer appointed by the Shire of Albany and notice may then be served if action is deemed to be necessary to prevent the outbreak or spread of a bushfire on the land;
- Such land is required to be made safe from fire by the reduction of fire hazards.

Compliance with such requirements need not require the removal of all inflammable materials.

2. All other land

(A) You are required to have constructed firebreaks, as specified in this notice—

- Immediately inside all external boundaries of all land exceeding 2 100 square metres in area whether the land be cleared, partly cleared, bulldozed, chained, used for pasture or be undeveloped.
- Immediately surrounding all buildings erected on any land having an area in excess of 2 100 square metres.

(B) You are required, on all land used for and being under crop in the period from 15 November 1987 to 31 March 1988 to—

- Have constructed firebreaks, as specified in this notice immediately inside the external boundary of the land being used for crop and around the standing crop so that the crops are broken up into areas not exceeding approximately 200 hectares, and
- Having standing within the external boundary of all land being used for crop which is then being harvested and at all times that the harvesting of crop is proceeding, suitable operational fire fighting equipment.

All firebreaks as designated above must be prepared on or before 15 November 1987 within that portion of the Shire lying generally north of the dividing line defined hereunder and on or before 15 December 1987 within that portion of the Shire lying generally southwest of the dividing line defined hereunder or within 14 days of the date of your becoming owner or occupier should this be after those dates.

The firebreaks required by this notice are to be maintained clear of inflammable material to and including 30 March 1988.

Take notice that pursuant to clause 33 (4) of the Bushfires Act, where the owner or occupier of land who has received notice fails or neglects to comply with the requisitions of the notice within the time specified, the Shire of Albany, may by its officers and with such servants, workmen and contractors vehicles and machinery as the officers deem fit, enter upon the land and carry out the requisitions of the notice which have not been complied with and pursuant to clause 33 (5) of the Bushfires Act the amount of any costs and expenses incurred may be recovered from you as the owner or occupier of the land.

Applications to vary the above Requirements

If it is considered to be impractical for any reason whatever to carry out works as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council of the Shire of Albany or its duly authorised officer no later than 14 days prior to the date by which the firebreaks are required by this notice for permission to provide firebreaks in an alternative position, to take alternative action to abate the fire hazards on the land or to alter or vary this notice in any other way.

Note

Council, or its duly authorised officer will consider approval of other than firebreaks immediately inside the external boundaries where a more suitable alternative can be provided. Approval of such alternatives will only be considered if submitted with the endorsement of the Bush Fire Brigade for the area concerned and will be on a yearly basis. If permission to vary this order is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you must comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine not exceeding \$400 and a person in default is also liable. Whether prosecuted or not, to pay the costs of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bushfires Act.

Lower Kalgan Brigade Area—Optional Perimeter Firebreaks

Owners and/or occupiers of land in the Lower Kalgan Brigade area only have the option of installing perimeter firebreaks on their land for a two year period expiring on 1 July 1989.

This approval is for perimeter firebreaks only and removal of fire hazards around buildings etc. and all other requirements of this notice remain in force.

(Section 33)

Shire of Beverley

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land in the Beverley Municipality.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before 15 October 1987, east of the Great Southern Railway or 30 October 1987 west of the Great Southern Railway to plough, cultivate, scarify or otherwise clear, and therefore maintain free of all inflammable material, until 15 April 1988, firebreaks not less than 2.2 metres wide or as otherwise stipulated in the following positions on the land owned or occupied by you.

1. Inside and within 60.3 metres of the boundary of all cleared land. Uncleared land on boundaries shall either have a firebreak along the boundary or be isolated from the cleared land by the provision of a firebreak.

2. Where the above lands are divided by or abut trafficable public roads or railway reserves, a firebreak shall be provided within 60.3 metres of the boundary of the road or railway reserve.

4. Land, the bush on which has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing or burning, shall be completely surrounded by a firebreak not less than three metres wide. (Note: firebreaks may be provided on adjoining land).

5. Existing gullies, salt lakes, rivers or drains shall not form portion of a firebreak required by this order unless approved by the Shire Council.

6. Rivers: On all river banks a firebreak shall be provided on cleared land as close as is practicable but not further than 60.3 metres from high water mark.

7. Stationary pumps and motors: All grass or other inflammable materials must be cleared from areas where stationary pumps and motors are situated. The cleared land is to extend for a distance of not less than three metres completely surrounding stationary pumps and motors.

8. Fuel Drums: All grass and other inflammable materials must be cleared from areas where fuel drums, either empty or containing fuel are stored. The cleared area is to extend for a distance of at least three metres completely surrounding the fuel drums.

9. Beverley Townsite: On or before 30 November 1987—

(a) All lots with an area of .1012 ha (¼ acre) or less shall be either—

(i) Clear of all inflammable material; or

(ii) Have grass mown to a height no greater than five centimetres.

- (b) All lots with an area greater than .101 2 ha (¼ acre) but no larger than .808 4 ha (two acres) shall be either—
- (i) Clear of all inflammable material; or
 - (ii) Have all fallen timber removed and a firebreak of at least 2.2 metres wide, completely free of all inflammable material provided inside and along all external boundaries.
- (c) All lots or combination of lots which comprise of one holding and having an area greater than .808 4 ha (two acres) shall have a firebreak of 2.2 metres wide free of all inflammable material provided inside and along all external boundaries.

If it is impracticable for any reason to comply with the above requirements of this notice, owners or occupiers should seek Council approval to make necessary adjustments.

Note: The firebreaks will be inspected shortly after the respective completion dates applicable to the various areas and any person failing to comply with this Order at the date of inspection will be prosecuted without further warning.

Notice to all owners and occupiers of land

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act you are hereby required, on or before 31 October 1987 to establish firebreaks clear of all flammable material and thereafter maintain such firebreaks clear of all flammable materials up to and including 15 April 1988.

Rural and Special Rural land other than that specified—

- (a) Not less than two metres wide inside and within 120 metres of the external boundaries of the land, and
- (b) not less than two metres wide immediately surrounding any part of the land used for pasture or crop, and
- (c) not less than two metres wide immediately surrounding all buildings, haystacks and fuel ramps situated on the land, and
- (d) not less than two metres wide in such other positions as is necessary to divide land in excess of 120 hectares, each completely surrounded by a firebreak.

Townsites—

- (a) Lots used for grazing purposes or in agricultural pursuits—
 - (i) not less than two metres wide inside and along those portions of the boundaries of all cleared or part cleared land which enjoys common boundaries with land or other owners or with public roads;
 - (ii) not less than two metres wide immediately surrounding all buildings and hay stacks situated on the land.
- (b) All other lots—effective firebreaks around the perimeter of all buildings and inside and along the whole of the boundary of the land cleared of all flammable material to a width not less than two metres.

Special Rural Zone "Bindoon Heights and Lake Chittering Heights"—Land owners may make a contribution of \$20 to Council to instal a firebreak not less than two metres wide on the external boundaries of the Special Rural Zone and in such other places as determined on the Strategic Firebreak Plan as approved by Council. In all other respects the Firebreak Order applies.

Owners not wishing to participate in this scheme shall comply with all the other requirements of this notice.

Other Directions—

- (a) Firebreaks in the situation described hereunder will be accepted as complying with requirements of this notice, so far as it applies to the common boundary between the land of any owner or occupier and the abutting lands referred to hereunder.
Where the land of an owner or occupier abuts on Crown Land or Reserve and the owner or occupier has cleared a firebreak not less than two metres in width on the Crown Land or Reserve along the Common boundary.
- (b) If you cannot comply with the requirements of this notice, write to the Shire Clerk explaining your reasons before 31 October 1987.

If it is considered impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply direct to the Bush Fire Control Officer for the area in which the land is situated not later than 15 October 1987 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions. No such application will be considered unless it is made in writing and adequately describes the land.

When permission has been obtained from the Fire Control Officer to provide firebreaks in alternative positions it is your responsibility to advise the Council in writing that such approval was given.

If permission is not granted you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$40 nor more than \$400 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

2. Townsite Land (land situated within the townsites of Dongara and Port Denison): On or before 31 October 1987 and thereafter up until and including 15 April 1988 you shall—

- 2.1 have the land clear of all inflammable material where the area of land is 1 012 square metres or less.
- 2.2 Have firebreaks not less than two metres in width immediately inside and along all boundaries of land exceeding 1 012 square metres in area.
- 2.3 Have firebreaks not less than two metres in width immediately abutting all buildings situated on land exceeding 1 012 square metres in area.

3. If for any reason it is considered to be impracticable to clear firebreaks or to remove the inflammable material from the land as required by this notice you may apply in writing to the Council or its duly authorised officer on or before 18 September 1987 for permission to provide firebreaks in an alternative position or take alternative action to abate a fire hazard. 1987-1988 Firebreak Order

Notice to all owners and/or occupiers of land within the Shire of Jerramungup

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before 1 November 1987 to clear of all inflammable material firebreaks as stated hereunder and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including 16 April 1988.

1. Prepare firebreaks not less than three metres wide within 200 metres of all neighbours boundaries whether such land is cleared, part cleared or uncleared, except where neighbours jointly agree to maintain a single firebreak. Where this variation is sought a permit is required from the local Fire Control Officer.

1a. Breaks alongside constructed roads optional, except where the land is sown to crop for harvesting. In such cases where crop is sown, prepare a three metre wide break immediately inside the boundary adjoining the crop.

2. Embark on a policy of strategic firebreaks in lieu of property breakdown. The use of farm roads cleared of inflammable material, graded contours, graded dam catchments, all not less than three metres wide, will be accepted. Further use of salt creeks, lakes and naturally bare ground will be allowed so that a ratio of one kilometre of break per 250 hectares exists.

3. Prepare firebreaks not less than three metres wide within 100 metres of and surrounding all buildings, haystacks and fuel dumps.

4. Prepare firebreaks not less than 10 metres wide immediately around the perimeter of any scrub or timber which has been logged, chained or otherwise prepared for burning, within seven days of such work being completed, no area to be greater than 400 hectares.

5. In respect of land within any townsite within the Shire, you shall—

- (a) Where the area is 2 000 square metres or less, remove all inflammable material on the land from the whole of the land.
- (b) Where the area of the land exceeds 2 000 square metres, firebreaks not less than two metres wide shall be prepared immediately inside and along all external boundaries of the land.

Penalty for non-compliance: \$400.

If it is considered to be impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, the approval of the Council must be obtained to clear such firebreaks in an alternative position. Approval to any variation will only be granted where a Bush Fire Control Officer has first signified his approval of the variation.

It is an offence to provide firebreaks on a road reserve without the approval of the Council or Main Roads Department in the case of Declared Main Roads.

Harvesting and motor powered machines
excepting the operation of clover harvester

A person shall not operate any harvesting machine or header in any crop during the prohibited time, unless—

1. One hand-held water filled fire extinguisher (minimum capacity 7.5 litres) is fitted in a readily accessible position on the machine.
2. A readily mobile fire fighting unit of a minimum 400 litres capacity powered by an engine driven pump is in attendance in or adjacent to the entrance of the paddock being harvested; or

A tractor and plough are readily available in or adjacent to the entrance of the paddock being harvested for the purpose of fighting fires.

3. All trucks must carry a hand held fire extinguisher while operating in the paddock during harvesting time.

Regulation 38A—

- (i) Where a Bush Fire Control Officer is of the opinion that the use or operation of any engines, vehicles, plant or machinery during the prohibited burning times or restricted burning times, or both, is likely to cause a bush fire, or would be conducive to the spread of bush fire, the Bush Fire Control Officer may, by notice or direction, prohibit or regulate the carrying out of any activity or operation in a specified area, either absolutely or except in accordance with conditions specified in the notice or direction or without consent of the local Authority or Bush Fire Control Officer.

- (ii) A notice or direction under subregulation (i) of the regulation—

- (a) may be given by wireless broadcast or in writing;
- (b) shall have effect for such periods during the prohibited burning times or restricted burning times, or both, as is specified in the notice or direction;
- (c) may be varied or cancelled by a Bush Fire Control Officer by a subsequent notice or direction in the manner set out in the subregulation.

- (iii) During any period for which a notice or direction under subregulation (i) of this regulation has effect a person shall not, in any area specified in the notice or direction, operate or use any engines, vehicles, plant or machinery contrary to the notice or direction.

- (iv) A person shall, when required by a Local Authority, provide a plough, or other specified machine, appliance or fire fighting equipment in or in the vicinity of any land or paddock where harvesting operations are being carried out.

- (v) In accordance with section (i) above a defined grain storage and/or outloading complex shall mean—

An area not less than 100 metres in diameter cleared of all inflammable material and adjacent to a made road.

Penalty for non-compliance: \$200.

- (b) where the area of land exceeds 2 000 square metres a firebreak of not less than three metres shall be cleared of all inflammable materials inside the external boundaries of the land and immediately surrounding any buildings, fuel deposits or haystacks contained on the land.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

If it is considered impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or remove inflammable materials as required by this notice an application may be made to the Council or its authorised officer not later than 15 October 1987 for permission to provide firebreaks in an alternative position.

If permission is not granted the requirements of this notice shall be complied with.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine not exceeding \$400 and the person in default is liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work.

Trayning

Firebreaks: Pursuant to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required, on or before 1 November 1987 to plough, scarify, cultivate or otherwise clear, and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable material until 31 January 1988 (inclusive) in the following positions and of the following dimensions on the land owned or occupied by you.

GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS ACT 1904

PEMBERTON-NORTHCLIFFE TOURIST RAILWAY ORDER 1987

MADE by the Lieutenant-Governor and Deputy of the Governor in Executive Council under section 66A.

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the *Pemberton-Northcliffe Tourist Railway Order 1987*.

Declaration

2. It is declared that the portion of the railway which is the Pemberton to Northcliffe railway as described in the Schedule hereto, being no longer required for use by The Western Australian Government Railways Commission (hereinafter referred to as "the Commission"), is not, while this Order remains in force, a Government railway for the purposes of the Government Railways Act 1904.

Grant

3. The right to occupy the lands described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the lands") for the purpose of managing, operating and maintaining a tourist railway service thereon is granted to the Pemberton Tramway Co Pty Ltd a Company incorporated in Western Australia and having its registered office at 9 Albert Street, Mosman Park in the State of Western Australia and its successors (hereinafter referred to as "the Operator") upon the conditions set out in this Order.

Conditions

4. (1) Term of Occupation—

- (a) The Operator shall have the right to occupy the lands for a period of 25 years (hereinafter referred to as "the licence period") from the date of the making of this Order: Provided that nothing in this Order shall be construed as demonstrating an intention to confer any right title or interest in the lands other than a licence to occupy the lands and to manage, operate and maintain a tourist railway for a period of 25 years or in the event that this Order is revoked before the expiration of 25 years, for that lesser period.
- (b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) of this subsection the Operator shall not carry any fare paying passengers without having a certificate (hereinafter referred to as a "Commission's certificate") obtained from the Commission which is valid and certifies that safe and satisfactory work systems have been implemented.

(2) Insurance—

(a) The Operator shall—

- (i) insure against public risks by taking out a public liability insurance policy through reputable insurance brokers in the joint names of the Operator and the Commission for an indemnity limit of \$20m (with such increases from time to time as the Commission may reasonably require) for any one claim with a cross liability clause in which the insurer agrees to waive all rights of subrogation or action that the insurer may have or acquire against all or any of the persons comprising the insured and for the purpose of which the insurer accepts the term "insured" as applying to each of the persons comprising the insured as if a separate policy of insurance had been issued to each of them (subject to the overall sum insured not being increased thereby);
- (ii) submit a copy of the policy referred to in sub-paragraph (i) of this paragraph to the Commission for approval before entering into a contract of insurance;
- (iii) keep the public risks insurance policy referred to in sub-paragraph (i) of this paragraph current while this Order remains in force and shall obtain and forward a copy of that certificate of currency annually to the Commission.
- (b) The Operator shall not alter or vary the terms of any insurance policy entered into with respect to the tourist railway pursuant to this Order without first obtaining the approval of the Commission to do so.
- (c) The Operator shall be solely responsible for making payments of premiums on the policies of insurance taken out pursuant to this Order.

(3) Appointment of Person to Receive Communications.

The Operator shall within one month of the date of making this Order appoint an officer with whom the Commission may liaise in regard to any matter concerning the tourist railway and thereafter from time to time appoint a replacement for that person so that the appointment is continuous and shall within seven days of making an appointment notify the Commission in writing of the full names and address and telephone number of the person appointed and shall forthwith advise the Commission in writing of any change or changes in such particulars.

(4) Certificate to Operate a Passenger Service on a Tourist Railway—

- (a) A Commission's certificate shall be valid for a period of twelve months from the date shown on the certificate and shall not be renewable.
- (b) Where the operator wishes to operate a tourist railway beyond the currency of a Commission's certificate the Operator shall, not more than eleven months from the date shown on that certificate—
 - (i) arrange for the necessary inspections to be made and investigations to be carried out to facilitate the delivery to the Operator of the documents referred to in paragraph (d) of this sub-section; and
 - (ii) before the Commission's certificate expires, lodge those documents with the Commission.
- (c) The Commission shall not issue the first Commission's certificate until—
 - (i) the Operator has carried out to the satisfaction of the Commission any work, including work required by the Commission, that is necessary to put the tourist railway in a suitable condition for the carriage of passengers using vehicles which the Operator is by this Order authorised to use and has paid to the Commission its charges for any necessary inspections and other things done by the Commission by reason of the provisions of this paragraph;
 - (ii) the Commission has received from the Operator such further information or documentation as the Commission may reasonably require.
- (d) Subsequent to the issue of the first Commission's certificate the commission shall only issue a Commission's certificate to the Operator if it receives the following documents, namely—
 - (i) a certificate signed and dated by a qualified civil engineer previously approved of in writing by the Commission—
 - (A) certifying that at the date shown on the certificate the railway track intended for use for the tourist railway was in a suitable condition for carrying passengers using vehicles which the Operator is by this Order authorised to use and that railway track and centre line structures, if properly maintained, would continue to be suitable for that purpose for a period of twelve months from the date shown on the certificate;
 - (B) fixing the maximum speeds at which each class of vehicle to be used may travel on the railway track;
 - (ii) a certificate signed and dated by a qualified mechanic or mechanical engineer previously approved of in writing by the Commission certifying that at the date shown on the certificate, the rolling stock intended for use by the tourist railway service was suitable rolling stock, and if properly maintained, would continue to be suitable for that purpose for a period of twelve months from the date shown on the certificate;

(iii) such further information or documentation as the Commission may from time to time reasonably require.

(5) Power to Charge Fares etc.—

- (a) The Operator may demand and collect fares from passengers of the tourist railway.
- (b) The Operator may charge for the services provided to persons using the facilities of the tourist railway.
- (c) The Operator shall have complete discretion to determine the amounts to be paid by way of fares and charges.
- (d) While operating the tourist railway the Operator shall not undertake to act as a common carrier, nor permit the tourist railway to be used for the purpose of transporting from place to place for hire or reward any goods, parcels or freight without the consent of the Director General of Transport.

(6) Accidents on Tourist Railway—

- (a) The Operator shall immediately inform the Commission of any accident occurring on the tourist railway which involves loss of life.
- (b) The Operator shall keep a written record of all accidents occurring on the tourist railway which result in the loss of life or personal injury to any person and shall make such record available to the Commission for inspection by its officers and shall without delay give to the Commission such information in its possession as the Commission may require regarding any such accident.
- (c) The Operator shall within seven days of the occurrence of any collision or derailment involving the tourist railway forward to the Commission a detailed written statement reporting the circumstances of that collision or derailment.
- (d) The Operator shall forthwith give to the Commission full written particulars of every claim received by it as a result of loss of life or personal injury to any person or damage to any property arising from the operation of the tourist railway.

(7) Emergency Closure of Tourist Railway.

The Commission may, in cases of emergency or where the likelihood that the safety of the persons managing, operating, maintaining or using the tourist railway will be endangered if the tourist railway is permitted to continue to operate, order the Operator immediately to cease operating the tourist railway for such period of time as the Commission in the interests of safety considers appropriate. The Commission shall as soon as is reasonably possible after ordering the closure consult with the Operator and advise it on the necessary requirements for re-opening the tourist railway.

(8) Fire Danger.

The Operator shall at all times keep the lands clear of fire hazards and without limiting the generality of the provisions of section 13 shall comply with any notice or direction lawfully issued pursuant to the Bush Fires Act 1954.

(9) Preservation of Existing Assets—

- (a) Subject to paragraph (b) of this subsection the Operator shall not without the written consent of the Commissioner:—
 - (i) Remove from the lands or alter any building fence track or other structure of whatever kind or any fixtures or fittings attached thereto situated on the lands;
 - (ii) Carry out any excavation or earthworks on the lands.
- (b) The provisions of paragraph (a) of this sub-section shall not apply to anything necessarily done for the purposes of repair and maintenance or otherwise incidental to the daily routine operation of the tourist railway.
- (c) Before at any time for any reason commencing to carry out excavations or earthworks the Operator shall make all necessary enquiries from the Commission and all other relevant statutory Authorities about the location of underground services and shall only carry out any excavations or earthworks in strict compliance with all stipulated requirements.
- (d) At the expiration or earlier determination of the licence period the Operator shall remove from the lands anything which the Operator has brought onto or constructed upon the lands and which the Commission requires to be removed, the Operator making good all damage occasioned by such removal.

(10) Licence for Other Party's Services.

Where any statutory body or natural person has been or is lawfully authorised or empowered to enter upon the lands in order to carry out works of for any other purpose, the Operator shall permit that statutory body or natural person to enter upon the lands for the purpose of carrying out works or for any other authorised purpose.

(11) Maintenance and Repair.

The Operator shall at all times at the Operator's own expense repair and maintain in good order and condition—

- (i) All buildings passenger facilities embankments cuttings railway track sleepers bridges and all other works equipment fixtures fittings and things under upon and over the lands which are necessary for or associated with the operation of the tourist railway.
- (ii) All existing railway drains constructed on the lands.
- (iii) All culverts on the lands.

(12) Vermin and Noxious Weeds.

The Operator shall at all times at the Operator's own expense keep the lands free of vermin and noxious weeds as required by law.

(13) Compliance with Statutes.

The Operator shall punctually comply with and observe at the Operator's own expense all present and future Statutes (State and Federal) regulations and by-laws and all orders and requirements of any statutory public or other competent authority which relate to the use and occupancy of the lands by the Operator and to all things done thereon by or for the Operator and to all plant machinery vehicles equipment and other things of whatever kind already on or at any time brought onto the lands or any part thereof by or for the Operator and nothing in this Order shall or shall be deemed to exempt the Operator from such compliance.

(14) Type of Vehicles and Numbers of Passengers—

- (a) Unless otherwise authorised by the Commission vehicles used by the Operator for the tourist railways shall—
- (i) Not be powered by any steam operated engine;
 - (ii) have a gross weight per vehicle on rail not exceeding 9 tonnes when fully loaded with fuel and passengers;
 - (iii) when powered be governed to a maximum track speed of 35 kph.
 - (iv) under braking have possible and achievable deceleration of 1.0 m/s^2 from any speed up to the maximum governed speed of 35 kph on level tangent track;
 - (v) be provided with a mechanical fail safe brake capable of stopping and holding the vehicle stationary on 1:60 down grade;
 - (vi) be provided with an adequate horn and headlight.
- (b) The Operator shall not put into service on the tourist railway for the carriage of passengers any vehicle until in respect of that vehicle the Operator has provided to the Commission the written certificate of the manufacturer of that vehicle that it complies with all of the requirements of paragraph (a) of this subsection, such certificate to be signed by a responsible officer of the manufacturer and to be in a form acceptable to the Commission.
- (c) Whilst a vehicle being operated on the tourist railway is in motion all passengers other than the crew shall be seated in the seats provided except that any child under the age of five years may be seated on the lap of an adult not more than one per adult and passenger numbers shall be limited accordingly.

(15) Speed of Vehicles.

The maximum permitted speed for vehicles shall be 35 kph and the speed shall be less when safety so requires or where any lesser maximum speed is fixed by the Commission or in any certificate referred to in paragraph (d) of subsection (4) of this section.

(16) Level Crossings—

- (a) In this Order "Level crossing" shall mean any place where a public or private road or other right of way crosses the tourist railway on the level.
- (b) The Operator shall not without the consent of the Commission close or change or obstruct any level crossings or create or permit the creation of any new level crossings on the lands and shall be responsible for the safe crossing of the Operator's rail vehicles over level crossings and at the Operator's own expense be responsible for the repair and maintenance in a good and safe condition of all level crossings on the lands and, without in any way limiting the generality of the foregoing, shall comply with the requirements of the Commission, including the clearing of vegetation and procedures to be observed by drivers of the Operator's rail vehicles at level crossings.
- (c) The Operator shall of at its own expense convert the red flashing crossing control light signals at the Nannup-Pemberton road level crossing at 170.231 km to manual operation to the satisfaction of the Commission.
- (d) All traffic control devices signs and signals installed to control and warn traffic at level crossings shall be maintained by the Operator at its own expense in good order and condition and so as to comply at all times with the latest applicable Australian Standards the currently applicable Standard being Australian Standard 1742.7—1987: Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices Part 7—Railway Crossings and the Operator shall also at its own expense comply with all directions of the Commission given from time to time to alter or remove any of the existing devices signs and signals, and/or to install additional devices signs and signals,
- (e) The Operator shall during the licence period permit the installation on the lands of such further level crossings as the Commission may from time to time direct.
- (f) The Operator shall ensure that when approaching the Nannup-Pemberton road level crossing at 170.231 km the driver of a vehicle being operated on the tourist railway shall before crossing the road stop his vehicle on the approach side to and clear of the road and shall not cross the road until the red flashing crossing control signals have been switched on and are operating correctly and having crossed over the road shall stop his vehicle clear of the road and switch off the flashing light signals before proceeding; Provided that in the event of a malfunction of the said signals the manual switch controlling the same shall be returned to the "off" position and the driver shall only proceed to cross the road when he has satisfied himself that it is safe to do so and the Operator shall take immediate steps to restore the said signals to proper working order.

(17) Service of Documents—

- (a) The Commission and the Operator may each notify the other in writing of an address within the State of Western Australia for the service upon it of notices and other communications given or made under this Order and may from time to time by notice in writing to the other change such address to another address for service within the said State.
- (b) Any notice or other communication given or made under this Order shall be signed by the party giving it or by that party's representative and may be served by prepaid post addressed to the party for whom the notice or communication is intended at the address for service notified by that party pursuant to paragraph (a) of this subsection and until such notification may be addressed as follows:—
